THE KICKOFF

All eyes will be pointed towards Sacramento this weekend, as No. 3 Weber State and No. 6 Sacramento State face off. The only two teams unbeaten in league play will battle it out at Hornet Stadium on Saturday. The Wildcats and Hornets are both 4-0 in league play and are ranked in the top 10 of the FCS polls. The two losses for each of the teams this season came at the hands of FBS foes.

#ICYMI

Big Sky kickers are leading the FCS in more ways than one. Northern Arizona's Luis Aguilar holds the season-long record for a made field goal this season at 57, while Portland State's Cody Williams and Weber State's Trey Tuttle have both nailed five field goals in a game to lead the FCS.

Northern Arizona's Case Cookus is tied for second in the Big Sky in career touchdown passes with 98. Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams holds the league record at 110 set back in 2014.

The Big Sky has a total of four teams ranked this week in the STATS FCS and AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 polls. Weber State leads the way at No. 3, followed by Sacramento State making its second straight weekly appearance in the top 10 at No. 6. Montana was voted No. 8 and Montana State was slotted No. 14/15. UC Davis and Northern Arizona are both receiving votes.

Co-Offensive Player of the Week • Elijah Dotson, RB, Sacramento State

Dotson broke tackle after tackle to rack up a season-high 176 yards on the ground. He added a career-high-tying three rushing touchdowns in Sacramento State's 38-14 win over Cal Poly. The junior was the catalyst for a Hornet rushing attack which amassed 348 rushing yards and five touchdowns in the game. Dotson registered touchdown runs of 19, 1 and 30 yards in the game. He also led the Hornets with five receptions for 50 yards. The 100-yard rushing performance was the eighth of Dotson's career and the second this season.

Defensive Player of the Week • Carlton Johnson, CB, Southern Utah

The Thunderbirds' Johnson registered a pair of interceptions in Southern Utah's win over visiting Idaho State. On the first play of the game, Johnson intercepted the Bengals' pass and returned it 16 yards to get the Thunderbird sideline fired up. The redshirt freshman went on to record a 51-yard pick-six late in the fourth quarter to help guide Southern Utah to its first conference win of the season.

Special Teams Player of the Week • Trey Tuttle, K, Weber State

Tuttle tied a Weber State school record with five made field goals in the Wildcats' 36-20 win at No. 22 UC Davis. He was a perfect 5 of 5 on field goals and connected on field goals of 38, 38, 20, 27 and 39 yards. Tuttle connected on four-straight field goals during a stretch of the second and third quarters. He was also a perfect 3 of 3 on extra points, giving him 18 points on the day to account for half of Weber State's 36 points. Tuttle added eight kickoffs for an average of 61.4 yards per kick and had two touchbacks. Tuttle's five made field goals is tied for the most of any player in the country this season.

Big Sky Weekly Recap

Week 1: Northern Arizona picked up a 37-23 win in head coach Chris Ball's debut. The Lumberjacks defeated Missouri State to pick up the first Big Sky-Missouri Valley Challenge Series win of the season for the league.
