NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

Three games are on the slate for Wednesday night.

- College of Charleston and Head Coach **Candice M. Jackson** head to American Athletic Conference opponent East Carolina in search of their first win of the season.
- Drexel heads to Ivy League foe Princeton as it attempts to move to 2-0 on the season for the first time since 2010-11. It's the lone road game this month for the Dragons.
- UNCW continues action in Trask Coliseum by hosting Big South foe Campbell. The Seahawks also look to improve to 2-0 on the season for the first time since 2010-11.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

The CAA went 1-1 on Tuesday night.

- Hofstra posted its first win of the 2014-15 campaign by topping MAAC foe Fairfield, 66-53, at home. Freshman **Ashunae Durant** tallied a game-high 16 points while sophomore **Kelly Loftus** added 14 points.
- Northeastern battled it out with No. 22/24 Rutgers in a 74-60 road loss to the Big Ten adversary. Three Huskies scored in double-figures, including a game-high 22 points from **Tiffany Montagne** and 13 points from **Samantha DeFreese**.

IN THE POLLS

James Madison was ranked No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll released on November 18.

- It's the first time the Dukes have been ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll since the 2009-10 season when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28). It's also JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- The Dukes also received votes in the *Associated Press* Poll released on November 17. Dating back to last season, it is the ninth consecutive week in which the Dukes have received votes in the AP Poll.
- JMU is also the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25. Delaware is 18th in the same poll.

#CAAHOOPS WEEKLY HONORS - NOV. 17

- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** was named the CAA Player of the Week after averaging a double-double (12.0ppg/15.0rpg) over two games. She also had a career day in the Dukes' upset of UCLA, finishing with 16 points and 16 boards and her 100th career block.
- Delaware's **Chastity Taylor** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week after an impressive collegiate debut in which she came off the bench and tallied 12 points on 5-for-8 shooting, three boards, two assists, and a steal and no turnovers in 18 minutes of action.

HOT SHOTS

- The CAA is 10-7 against non-conference opponents so far this season, including a 1-1 mark against nationally ranked opponents.
- JMU senior **Toia Giggetts** has scored in double figures in 28 consecutive games, tying her for the second-longest streak in program history.
- CAA Preseason Player of the Year **Precious Hall** has made 25 consecutive free throws dating back to the NCAA Tournament. She went 12-for-12 from the free throw line against No. 23 UCLA in the Dukes' season opener.
- UNCW stifled the UNC Pembroke offense in its season opener on November 16, holding UNCP to just 35 points on 13 field goals and .224 shooting. It was the sixth time since 2000-01 season in which the Seahawks held opponents to under 40 points.
- William & Mary sophomore **Marlena Tremba**, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Year, has scored in double-figures in 24 of her 31 career games as member of the Tribe.
- Towson's **Dominique Johnson** posted the first 30-point effort in the CAA this season, finishing with 32 points at Penn State on November 14.
- Delaware out-rebounded Lafayette, 59-35, during its season opener. Three Blue Hens had 10 or more rebounds in that contest.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** dished out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro.
- JMU trailed by as much as 14 points against No. 23 UCLA. It was the 17th time under Head Coach **Kenny Brooks** in which JMU came back from a double-digit deficit to win.
- Elon is 35-10 on their home court, Alumni Gym, under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.
- The Phoenix have been dominant in the paint so far, out-scoring opponents 70-40.
- Delaware's **Alecia Bell** suffered a gruesome leg injury against Marist. The guard underwent surgery on November 17 and is out indefinitely.

CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson opened 2014 Preseason WNIT action with a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State. They will host the first round of consolation play on November 21 at the SECU Arena. St. Francis Brooklyn faces North Dakota State at 4:30 p.m. before the Tigers take on Rider at 6:30 p.m.

- This is the first time the Tigers are taking part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 10-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

IT'S TIP-OFF TIME

The Colonial Athletic Association had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5 on Friday and Sunday.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14, going a combined 4-4 on opening day.
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by ten different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32./3).

WELCOME ELON

The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member Elon University for the 2014-15 season behind fourth-year Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.

- The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.
- Senior forward **Sam Coffey** and sophomore guard **Lauren Brown**, who was named to the SoCon All-Rookie squad, are also back adding to the solid mix of veterans and experienced youth.

- Northeastern will be led by **Kelly Cole**, the former Boston College and Harvard assistant who brings more than 20 years of coaching experience with her. She made 11 trips to the postseason, eight of those to the NCAA Tournament.
- At the College of Charleston, **Candice M. Jackson** will begin her first season as a collegiate head coach after spending the past three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Duke University.

TOP SCORERS RETURN

Twelve of the top-20 scorers from a year ago will return for the 2014-15 campaign.

- That group is headlined by James Madison's **Precious Hall** (15.4 ppg) and **Toia Giggetts** (14.1 ppg) and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.8 ppg).

TOP HONOREES RETURN

Six All-CAA honorees return for the 2014-15 campaign, including CAA Rookie of the Year Marlena Tremba of William & Mary.

- All-CAA Second Team members **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts**, both of JMU, return along with Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen**, and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins**.
- All-CAA Third Team honorees **A'lece Mark** of Northeastern and **Rachel Pearson** of Drexel are also back.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class will have 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. Also earning first-team honors were: Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** (14.1 ppg/8.4 rpg), Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** (15.0 ppg/4.0 rpg), and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** (15.8 ppg/5.5 rpg).
- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 ppg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

CAA POSTSEASON SNAPSHOT - 2014

- For the ninth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason. It was the 14th consecutive season in which the a representative in the WNIT and just the second season overall for a CAA team to participate in the WBI.
- Over 29 seasons of CAA women's basketball, teams have accumulated 68 victories in postseason action. The CAA posted an impressive 11-3 postseason record in 2013 and since the 2012 postseason the CAA has compiled a 23-14 postseason mark.
- James Madison was selected as the 11-seed in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament in the Lincoln Regional. The Dukes upset #6 Gonzaga, 72-63, to advance to the second round but fell to host #3 Texas A&M, 85-69.
- For three straight years the CAA has had a team advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- In the past 29 seasons, CAA teams have made appearances in 13 Sweet 16's, two Elite 8's and one Final Four – including an appearance in the NCAA National Championship Game.
- The second-seeded College of Charleston Cougars defeated #7 USC Upstate, 85-71, in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) and #3 Northern Kentucky, 60-54. The Cougars completed their highly-successful season in a 78-74 loss to visiting #4 Stephen F. Austin of the West Region portion of the Final Four.
- Delaware fell to Rutgers, 65-61, in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT).
- In 2013, the CAA saw two teams reach milestones in the postseason as Delaware reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in school history, while Drexel was crowned the 2013 WNIT Champions.

HOT SHOTS: 2013-14 EDITION

- National Statistical Rankings (Final):** James Madison ranked in the top 20 in seven categories, while Drexel is ranked in three and Delaware in two. James Madison finished second in the nation in three-point field goal defense (25.4), sixth in scoring margin (19), seventh in field-goal percentage defense (34.8), eighth in rebounding margin (10.2), 10th in scoring defense (55.9) and blocked shots per game (5.8) and 14th in winning percentage (82.9). Drexel ranked among the top 6 in turnovers per game (3rd, 11.8) and assist/turnover ratio (6th, 1.38). JMU's Kirby Burkholder completed her senior campaign ranked among the top 10 in two categories - 9th in 3-pt FG per game (3.14) and 10th in FT% (89.3). Full list on page 7 of this report.
- Non-Conference Record:** CAA teams went 55-66 (.455) against non-conference opponents during the 2013-14 season.
