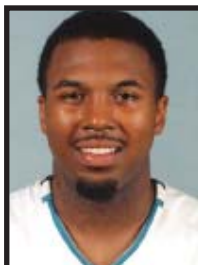
## CAA WEEKLY AWARDS



### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

#### Luke Eddy • Elon

So., G, 6-0, 190 - Charleston, W.Va./George Washington  
Eddy came off the bench to score a career-high 27 points in only 24 minutes in Elon's narrow 78-73 setback at Missouri last Thursday. The sophomore guard poured in 21 second-half points to help the Phoenix erase a 19-point deficit, including a three-pointer with under a minute to play that cut the Tigers' lead to one. Eddy finished 8-of-15 from the floor, including 3-of-5 from three-point range, and was a perfect 8-for-8 at the free throw line.



### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

#### Jordon Talley • UNCW

Fr., G, 6-0, 180 - Richmond, Va./Henrico  
Talley scored a career-high 13 points and dished out three assists in UNCW's 68-57 loss at 4th-ranked Louisville on Sunday. The freshman guard tallied 10 of his points in the second half as the Seahawks rallied to within 52-50 with 6:50 to play. Talley finished 6-of-14 from the floor and made his only three-point attempt while playing a career-high 26 minutes off the bench.

## CONFERENCE NOTES:

**SOLID STARTS:** CAA teams have gotten off to a solid start this season with eight of the league's 10 teams having .500 or better records. **Hofstra's** 7-2 record is its best since the 2008-09 squad also opened 7-2. The Pride is on a four-game winning streak for the first time since 2011. **Towson** (7-3) got off to its best start ever at the Division I level (7-1) before having its seven-game winning streak snapped with road losses at Georgetown and Temple. **Northeastern** recorded five victories in the month of November for the first time in program history, and is now 6-2 after beating Western Michigan on Dec. 6. **James Madison** (6-3) has won six straight home games and two of its three losses this season are to #6 Virginia and #12 Ohio State. **College of Charleston** (5-5) has won three of its last four.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** CAA teams are 46-40 (.535) in non-conference play. Fifteen of the losses have come against teams from the Power 5 conferences, including seven teams who are currently ranked in the top 25 (#2 Duke, #4 Louisville, #6 Virginia, #7 Villanova, #12 Ohio State, #18 Miami and #22 West Virginia).

**MORE ON THE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Making the non-conference winning percentage even more impressive is the fact that CAA teams have played only 34 of their 86 non-conference games (39.5%) at home and the league is a combined 26-8 in those contests. CAA teams have also picked up 12 road victories and are a combined 8-5 in neutral site games.

**TWO CAA TEAMS IN TOP 70 OF RPI:** Two CAA teams are ranked in the top 70 of the latest RPI report produced by Collegiate Basketball News (rpiratings.com) through Dec. 15. **UNCW** is currently ranked #41 in the RPI while **Northeastern** moved up to #64. The CAA is ranked 13th out of the 32 Division I conferences.

**COFC'S CHEALEY SCORES 30 AT CHARLOTTE:** College of Charleston sophomore guard **Joe Chealey** scored a career-high 30 points in a tough 90-85 overtime loss at Charlotte on Tuesday. Chealey made 11-of-18 from the floor, including 7-of-9 from 3-point range, to become the first CofC player since 2012 to reach the 30-point mark. Chealey, whose previous career-high was 18 points, became the fifth CAA player this season to score at least 30.

**UNCW'S JACKSON NAMED TEAM MVP:** UNCW senior guard **Freddie Jackson** was named the team MVP in the Billy Minardi Classic last Sunday as the Seahawks were beaten 68-57 at 4th-ranked Louisville. Jackson topped UNCW with 16 points and seven rebounds in a contest in which the Seahawks trailed by only two (52-50) with 6:50 remaining.

**CAA TEAMS AMONG TOP 10 IN NATIONAL STATS:** Several CAA teams rank among the top 10 nationally in various statistical categories through games of Dec. 14. **Hofstra** is 2nd in Division I in 3-point FG percentage (43.8%) and 8th in 3-pointers per game (9.9 pg). **UNCW** ranks 8th in 3-point percentage (42.5%). **Northeastern** is 6th in free throw percentage (77.1%). **Towson** ranks 8th in rebound margin (+11.1 rpg).

**DOUBLE-DOUBLES FOR TOWSON'S DAVIS:** Towson sophomore forward **John Davis** leads the CAA and is tied for fourth in Division I with six double-doubles this season. Five of them have come in the past six games, including 10 points and 10 rebounds against Georgetown and 11 points and 14 boards at Temple last Wednesday. Davis is averaging 11.3 ppg and leads the CAA in rebounding with 9.7 rpg.

**ELON'S SAMSON CLIMBS 3-POINT LIST:** Elon junior guard **Tanner Samson** has moved up to 7th place on Elon's career three-pointers list with 175 after making two at #2 Duke on Monday. Samson leads the CAA and ranks 8th nationally with 36 three-pointers this season and is shooting 41.9% from beyond the arc.

**W&M's SHAVER NEARS 500 WINS:** William & Mary head coach **Tony Shaver** has 499 career victories and is just one win away from becoming the 86th coach with at least 10 years of Division I experience to win 500 or more games.

**AUTOMATIC AT THE FREE THROW LINE:** Towson junior guard **Four McGlynn** was 4-for-5 at the free throw line at Temple last Wednesday, continuing his near-perfect accuracy. For the season, he is an incredible 49-of-51 (96.1%) at the charity stripe, which ranks third in Division I. Last season, McGlynn led the CAA and ranked sixth nationally in free throw percentage at 91.3%.

**HOFSTRA'S 3-POINT THREATS:** Hofstra features two of the nation's top three-point threats this season. Junior **Ameen Tanksley** is shooting 59.6% from beyond the arc, which ranks third in Division I, and he's 37th nationally with 3.11 threes per game. Sophomore **Brian Bernardi** is 11th nationally with 3.56 treys per game and he's 15th in 3-point percentage (50%). Feeding them the ball is junior **Juan'ya Green**, who is 12th in Division I in assists (6.3 apg) and 28th in assist/turnover ratio.

**HUSKIES RANKED #24 IN MID-MAJOR POLL:** Northeastern was ranked #24 in the Dec. 15 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. **Towson** (29 pts), **Hofstra** (18 pts) and **William & Mary** (3 pts) were among others receiving votes in the poll.

**THREE CAA PLAYERS NOMINATED FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Three CAA men's basketball players - College of Charleston sophomore guard **Canyon Barry**, Hofstra graduate student guard **Dion Nesmith** and UNCW senior forward **Cedrick Williams** - have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team. The prestigious award recognizes student-athletes who have made significant contributions to their communities through volunteerism and civic service.

**NORTHEASTERN KNOCKS OFF FLORIDA STATE:** Preseason CAA favorite Northeastern earned a 76-73 win at Florida State on Nov. 18, which was the program's first victory ever over an ACC school. NU also captured its first in-season tournament since 2009 when it beat Navy (68-44) and Manhattan (65-51) to take the Hall of Fame Tipoff title on Nov. 23.

**W&M'S THORNTON HEADLINES PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM:** William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches. Thornton received first-team All-CAA accolades last season after averaging a team-best 18.7 points per game and knocking down a league-high 93 three-pointers. Joining Thornton on the preseason All-CAA first team are Northeastern senior forward **Scott Eatherton** (15.9 ppg, 10.2 rpg), who was the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year and a 2nd-team All-CAA pick, Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green**, a transfer from Niagara who was 1st-team All-MAAC in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg, Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, but missed most of last season with a knee injury, and James Madison junior guard **Andre Nation**, who earned 3rd-team All-CAA accolades after averaging 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. A complete listing of the preseason All-CAA teams can be found in this release.

**NORTHEASTERN PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE:** Northeastern, which returns four starters and welcomes back All-CAA forward Quincy Ford from an injury, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2014-15 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Huskies were followed in the voting by William & Mary, Hofstra, Drexel, James Madison, College of Charleston, Towson, defending champion Delaware, UNCW and CAA newcomer Elon.

**LOTS OF NEW STARTERS:** The CAA's 10 teams return just 44% (22-of-50) of their starters from a year ago. Preseason favorite Northeastern welcomes back four starters, while Hofstra and UNCW each return three. The league's remaining seven teams have no more

than two regulars back in the lineup. In addition, only eight of the CAA's top 20 scorers are back in 2014-15 and nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

**W&M'S THORNTON ON HENSON AWARD WATCH LIST:** William & Mary senior guard Marcus Thornton has been placed on the Watch List for the Lou Henson Award, which is given to the top mid-major player in the nation by CollegeInsider.com.

**ELON JOINS THE CAA:** The CAA welcomes Elon University to the conference this season. The Phoenix are coming off a solid 18-14 campaign in 2013-14, which included an 11-5 mark in the Southern Conference. Elon has averaged 18 victories over the past three seasons under coach **Matt Matheny**, and the Phoenix earned a postseason berth in the CIT in 2013. They are 33-11 at home over the past three years. **College of Charleston** begins its second year as a CAA member and the conference will have 10 members for the first time since 2004-05.

**TWO NEW COACHES IN THE CAA:** There are two new coaches in the CAA this season as **Earl Grant** takes over at College of Charleston and **Kevin Keatts** begins his first year at UNCW. Grant, who is a native of Charleston, spent the past four seasons as an assistant under former CAA Coach of the Year Brad Brownell at Clemson. He also was an assistant for six seasons under Gregg Marshall, with the last three coming at Wichita State. Keatts coached the past three seasons under Rick Pitino at Louisville, where the Cardinals went to two NCAA Final Fours and won the national championship in 2013. Prior to Louisville, he compiled a 263-17 record over 10 seasons at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

**PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS:** CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS:** CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

**CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO BALTIMORE:** The CAA Men's Basketball Championship returns to Baltimore's Royal Farms Arena on March 6-9. It's the second year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore. Nearly 20,000 fans attended last year's tournament. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

**OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE:** The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have at least 90 televised games, including 10 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 22 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. The CAA will also have 17 men's games aired by the league's newest television partner, the American Sports Network. In addition, CAA fans will be able to watch hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's new digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference game.

**LEE, FORD RETURN TO ACTION:** The CAA welcomes back a pair of standout performers who were granted an extra year of eligibility by the NCAA after suffering injuries a year ago. Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, played in only five games before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off against Arizona last November. Northeastern junior forward **Quincy Ford**, who was a member of the All-CAA third team in 2012-13 after averaging 12.2 ppg and 5.8 rpg, saw action in only two games last year before undergoing season-ending back surgery.

- Beaten 90-85 in OT at Charlotte on Tuesday, ending a 3-game winning streak.
- Sophomore guard Joe Chealey scored a career-high 30 points at Charlotte on 11-of-18 FG shooting, including 7-of-9 from three. It was the most points by a CofC player since Andrew Lawrence in 2012.
- Sophomore Canyon Barry hit 5-of-9 threes and scored a season-best 21 points at Charlotte. Barry also set new career-highs with nine rebounds and six assists.
- CofC went 9-of-12 from 3-point range in the first half at Charlotte and finished with a season-high 16 threes on 26 attempts. The 85 points were also a season best.
- Senior Anthony Stitt scored double figures for the 3rd straight game and 6th time this season with 11 points at Charlotte. He's 21 points shy of 1,000 for his career.
- The Cougars are 5-1 this season when holding opponents under 60 points. The 90 points by Charlotte were the most allowed by the Cougars this year.

**DREXEL**  
**2-7 Overall/0-0 CAA**



- Suffered their third straight setback in an 80-70 loss at Buffalo on Tuesday.
- Junior Damion Lee topped Drexel in scoring for the sixth straight game with 24 points at Buffalo. It was his league-leading fifth 20+-point effort. Lee leads the CAA in scoring (20.7 ppg), ranks 10th in rebounding (5.7 rpg) and is first in steals (1.8 spg).
- Freshman guard Rashann London scored a career-high 17 points at Buffalo on 7-of-9 FG shooting. He also contributed six rebounds and two assists.
- Sophomore Rodney Williams has grabbed 10 or more boards in three of his last five contests and ranks third in the CAA with 8.0 rebounds per game.
- Junior Tavon Allen scored double figures for the fifth time this season with 10 points at Buffalo.
- The Dragons had held 3 of their past 4 opponents under 60 points before giving up a season-high 80 points at Buffalo. DU is 2nd in the CAA in scoring defense (61.0 ppg).

- UD was off last week for exams, but returns to action on Thursday against Temple.
- Sophomore guard Cazmon Hayes has reached double figures in all seven games and leads the Hens in scoring with 15.4 ppg. He has topped UD in points in five of its seven contests.
- Freshman Kory Holden tallied a season-best 15 points against Delaware State on Dec. 7. He leads all CAA freshmen in scoring (11.3 ppg) and ranks 3rd in the CAA in assists with 3.6 apg.
- Freshman Chivarsky Corbett is averaging 13.0 points over his past two games. He posted a season-high 15 points vs. DSU.
- Delaware has struggled offensively, shooting less than 32 percent from the floor in six of its seven contests.
- With senior Kyle Anderson (hand) and junior Marvin King-Davis (hamstring) out with injuries, UD's nine-man rotation includes five freshmen and four sophomores.

**ELON**  
**5-5 Overall/0-0 CAA**



- Fell 75-62 at 2nd-ranked Duke on Monday night. Outscored the Blue Devils 41-39 in the second half.
- Sophomore Luke Eddy scored a team-high 16 points on 7-of-9 FG shooting at Duke for his 7th double-digit effort of the year. He's averaging 19.3 ppg over his last 3 games.
- Junior Tanner Samson hit two threes and added nine points at Duke. Samson leads the CAA with 36 threes this season and ranks 7th on Elon's career 3's list (175).
- Freshman Dmitri Thompson scored eight points on 4-of-5 FG shooting at Duke and also grabbed a team-high five rebounds in just nine minutes of action off the bench.
- Elijah Bryant ranks second among all CAA freshmen in scoring (10.5 ppg). He has tallied double figures in seven games.
