PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Scott Eatherton • Northeastern

Sr., F, 6-9, 234 - Hershey, Pa./Hershey

Eatherton averaged 18.5 points, 11.5 rebounds and 3.5 blocks as Northeastern went 1-1 at the Cable Car Classic in California. He posted double-doubles in both games with 20 points, 10 boards and four blocks in a 78-72 victory over host Santa Clara and 17 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks in a 60-58 setback to Cal Poly. For the week, Eatherton shot 66.7% (16-24) from the floor and extended his double-figure scoring streak to nine games.

Hari Hall • James Madison

Fr., F, 6-7, 210 - Jacksonville, Fla./Jean-Ribault

Hall averaged 12.5 points and 3.5 rebounds as James Madison split two games last week. The freshman forward tied his season-high with 15 points and grabbed five boards in a setback to High Point and poured in 10 points in 19 minutes in a road victory at Ball State. For the week, Hall shot 58.3% (7-12) from the floor, drained three treys, and was a perfect 8-for-8 at the free throw line.

CONFERENCE NOTES:

SOLID STARTS: As the non-conference portion of the schedule winds down, seven of the CAA's 10 teams have better than .500 records. **Northeastern** (7-4) has seven wins before Christmas for the first time since 1981-82 and had its best 10-game record since 1985-86. **Hofstra** (7-4) matched its second-best start ever (7-2) as a Division I program. **Towson** (7-5) got off to its best start ever at the Division I level (7-1). **James Madison** (7-5) put together a six-game home winning streak and two of its losses are to #5 Virginia and #21 Ohio State. **UNCW** (5-4) had its best eight-game mark (5-3) since 2007-08. **William & Mary** (6-4) is a perfect 5-0 at home. **Elon** (7-5) has won five of its last seven contests.

CAA IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: CAA teams are 53-56 (.486) in non-conference play. Seventeen of the losses have come against teams from the Power 5 conferences, including six teams who are currently ranked in the top 25 (#2 Duke, #4 Louisville, #5 Virginia, #7 Villanova, #18 West Virginia and #21 Ohio State).

MORE ON THE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS: Making the non-conference winning percentage even more impressive is the fact that CAA teams have played only 43 of their 109 non-conference games (39.4%) at home and the league is a combined 29-14 in those contests. CAA teams have also picked up 16 road victories and are a combined 8-7 in neutral site games.

CAA RANKED 15TH AMONG DIVISION I CONFERENCES: The CAA was ranked 15th out of the nation's 32 Division I conferences according to the latest RPI report produced by Collegiate Basketball News (rpiratings.com) through Dec. 25. **Northeastern** was ranked #100 in the RPI while **William & Mary** was ranked #112 and **UNCW** was #113.

COFC'S CHEALEY SCORES 30 AT CHARLOTTE: College of Charleston sophomore guard **Joe Chealey** scored a career-high 30 points in a tough 90-85 overtime loss at Charlotte on Dec. 16. Chealey made 11-of-18 from the floor, including 7-of-9 from 3-point range, to become the first CofC player since 2012 to reach the 30-point mark. Chealey, whose previous career-high was 18 points, became the fifth CAA player this season to score at least 30.

W&M'S THORNTON ON NATIONAL TOP 10 LISTS: William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** ranks fourth among active Division I players in career 3-pointers made (253) and he's seventh in career scoring (1,712 points). The CAA preseason Player of the Year ranks second in the CAA in scoring (19.3 ppg) this season and has hit 30 treys.

CAA TEAMS AMONG TOP 20 IN NATIONAL STATS: Several CAA teams rank among the top 20 nationally in various statistical categories through games of Dec. 21. **Hofstra** is 4th in Division I in 3-point FG percentage (42.7%), 8th in 3-pointers per game (9.7 pg) and 16th in scoring offense (81.1 ppg). **UNCW** ranks 11th in 3-point percentage (41.4%). **Northeastern** is 16th in free throw percentage (75.1%). **Towson** ranks 9th in rebound margin (+10.5 rpg). **Elon** is 16th in 3-point FG percentage defense (27.2%).

W&M'S SHAVER REACHES 500-WIN MARK: William & Mary head coach **Tony Shaver** recorded his 500th career victory as the Tribe defeated Washington College 86-46 last Friday. Shaver is the 86th coach with at least 10 years of Division I experience to win 500 or more games and is W&M's career victories leader with 142.

MCGLYNN LEADS NATION IN FT PERCENTAGE: Towson junior guard **Four McGlynn** was 3-for-4 at the free throw line at Navy on Monday, continuing his near-perfect accuracy. For the season, he is an incredible 58-of-61 (95.1%) at the charity stripe, **which currently leads the nation**. Last season, McGlynn led the CAA and ranked sixth nationally in free throw percentage at 91.3%.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES FOR TOWSON'S DAVIS: Towson sophomore forward **John Davis** leads the CAA and is tied for 10th in Division I with six double-doubles this season. Five of them have come in the past eight games, including 10 points and 10 rebounds against Georgetown and 11 points and 14 boards at Temple. Davis is averaging 9.9 ppg and is second the CAA in rebounding with 8.6 rpg.

ELON'S SAMSON CLIMBS 3-POINT LIST: Elon junior guard **Tanner Samson** has moved up to 7th place on Elon's career three-pointers list with 180 after making three against Kennesaw State on Monday. Samson leads the CAA and ranks 13th nationally with 41 three-pointers this season and is shooting 40.2% from beyond the arc.

HOFSTRA'S 3-POINT THREATS: Hofstra features two of the nation's top three-point threats this season. Junior **Ameen Tanksley** is shooting 55.4% from beyond the arc, which ranks fourth in Division I, and he's 45th nationally with 2.8 threes per game. Sophomore **Brian Bernardi** is 14th nationally with 3.3 treys per game and he's 15th in 3-point percentage (48.6%). Feeding them the ball is junior **Juan'ya Green**, who is 16th in Division I in assists (6.5 apg) and 29th in assist/turnover ratio.

CAA COACHES TELECONFERENCES BEGIN ON JAN. 6: The CAA weekly coaches teleconference series begins on Tuesday, January 6 and will continue each Tuesday through March 3. More information can be found on page 5 of this release.

THREE TEAMS RECEIVING VOTES IN MID-MAJOR POLL: Three teams were among others receiving votes in the Dec. 22 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. **Northeastern** (20 pts), **Hofstra** (15 pts) and **William & Mary** (3 pts) all got votes in the poll.

THREE CAA PLAYERS NOMINATED FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM: Three CAA men's basketball players - College of Charleston sophomore guard **Canyon Barry**, Hofstra graduate student guard **Dion Nesmith** and UNCW senior forward **Cedrick Williams** - have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team. The prestigious award recognizes student-athletes who have made significant contributions to their communities through volunteerism and civic service.

NORTHEASTERN KNOCKS OFF FLORIDA STATE: Preseason CAA favorite Northeastern earned a 76-73 win at Florida State on Nov. 18, which was the program's first victory ever over an ACC school. NU also captured its first in-season tournament since 2009 when it beat Navy (68-44) and Manhattan (65-51) to take the Hall of Fame Tipoff title on Nov. 23.

W&M'S THORNTON HEADLINES PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches. Thornton received first-team All-CAA accolades last season after averaging a team-best 18.7 points per game and knocking down a league-high 93 three-pointers. Joining Thornton on the preseason All-CAA first team are Northeastern senior forward **Scott Eatherton** (15.9 ppg, 10.2 rpg), who was the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year and a 2nd-team All-CAA pick, Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green**, a transfer from Niagara who was 1st-team All-MAAC in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg, Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, but missed most of last season with a knee injury, and James Madison junior guard **Andre Nation**, who earned 3rd-team All-CAA accolades after averaging 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. A complete listing of the preseason All-CAA teams can be found in this release.

NORTHEASTERN PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Northeastern, which returns four starters and welcomes back All-CAA forward Quincy Ford from an injury, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2014-15 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Huskies were followed in the voting by William & Mary, Hofstra, Drexel, James Madison, College of Charleston, Towson,

defending champion Delaware, UNCW and CAA newcomer Elon.

LOTS OF NEW STARTERS: The CAA's 10 teams return just 44% (22-of-50) of their starters from a year ago. Preseason favorite Northeastern welcomes back four starters, while Hofstra and UNCW each return three. The league's remaining seven teams have no more than two regulars back in the lineup. In addition, only eight of the CAA's top 20 scorers are back in 2014-15 and nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

W&M'S THORNTON ON HENSON AWARD WATCH LIST: William & Mary senior guard Marcus Thornton has been placed on the Watch List for the Lou Henson Award, which is given to the top mid-major player in the nation by Colleg Insider.com.

ELON JOINS THE CAA: The CAA welcomes Elon University to the conference this season. The Phoenix are coming off a solid 18-14 campaign in 2013-14, which included an 11-5 mark in the Southern Conference. Elon has averaged 18 victories over the past three seasons under coach **Matt Matheny**, and the Phoenix earned a postseason berth in the CIT in 2013. They are 33-11 at home over the past three years. **College of Charleston** begins its second year as a CAA member and the conference will have 10 members for the first time since 2004-05.

TWO NEW COACHES IN THE CAA: There are two new coaches in the CAA this season as **Earl Grant** takes over at College of Charleston and **Kevin Keatts** begins his first year at UNCW. Grant, who is a native of Charleston, spent the past four seasons as an assistant under former CAA Coach of the Year Brad Brownell at Clemson. He also was an assistant for six seasons under Gregg Marshall, with the last three coming at Wichita State. Keatts coached the past three seasons under Rick Pitino at Louisville, where the Cardinals went to two NCAA Final Fours and won the national championship in 2013. Prior to Louisville, he compiled a 263-17 record over 10 seasons at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS: CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS: CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO BALTIMORE: The CAA Men's Basketball Championship returns to Baltimore's Royal Farms Arena on March 6-9. It's the second year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore. Nearly 20,000 fans attended last year's tournament. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE: The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have at least 90 televised games, including 10 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 22 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. The CAA will also have 17 men's games aired by the league's newest television partner, the American Sports Network. In addition, CAA fans will be able to watch hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's new digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference game.

- Dropped a 71-47 decision at SEC foe LSU on Monday night. Cougars shot a season-low 28.1% from the floor.
- Anthony Stitt scored a team-high 13 points at LSU, which was his 7th double-digit outing of the season. He's two points shy of 1,000 for his career.
- Sophomore Canyon Barry added 11 points and four steals at LSU. Barry has reached double figures in four straight games and is averaging 16.5 ppg and 6.8 rpg over that stretch.
- Freshman Donovan Gilmore returned to the lineup (illness) at LSU and contributed 10 points and a team-best eight rebounds.
- Sophomore Joe Chealey scored a career-high 30 points at Charlotte on Dec. 16. He made 11-of-18 FG's, including 7-of-9 from three. It was the most points by a CofC player since Andrew Lawrence in 2012. He's averaging 17.3 ppg over his last 4 games.
- The Cougars made a season-high 14 steals at LSU.

- Junior Damion Lee averaged 18.5 ppg last week, including a team-best 24 points at Buffalo. It was his league-leading fifth 20+-point effort. Lee leads the CAA in scoring (19.9 ppg), ranks 13th in rebounding (5.6 rpg) and is 2nd in steals (1.7 spg).
- Freshman Rashann London scored a career-high 17 points at Buffalo on 7-of-9 FG shooting. He also pulled down six rebounds.
- Sophomore Rodney Williams ranks third in the CAA in rebounding (8.0 rpg) and has three games with 10+ boards.
- Junior Tavon Allen hit 3-of-4 treys and scored a team-high 15 points at Penn State.
- Freshman Sammy Mojica scored a career-best 14 points off the bench at PSU. He had scored just 8 points all season prior to that.
- Mohamed Bah set a season-high with 10 points at Penn State and was one shy of his season-best with eight rebounds.

- Senior Kyle Anderson scored 16 points at RMU and became the 32nd player in UD history to reach 1,000 career points. He also hit four treys and moved into 2nd place on the Hens' career 3-pointers list.
- Sophomore Maurice Jeffers set a career-high with 16 points on 5-8 FG shooting at Robert Morris.
- Freshman Chivarsky Corbett poured in a career-high 21 points at RMU. It was his 4th double-digit effort in the past five games.
- Sophomore Cazmon Hayes was held to a season-low 4 points at RMU. He leads the Hens in scoring with 13.9 ppg and has led UD in points in six of its 10 contests.
- Guard Kory Holden returned to action (hamstring) and tallied 13 points and a season-high seven assists. He ranks 3rd in the CAA in assists (4.0 apg).

- Overcame a 15-point first-half deficit to win 67-65 at Kennesaw State on Monday.
- Elijah Bryant hit 4-of-6 threes and scored a career-high 25 points at KSU. He leads all CAA freshmen in scoring (12.5 ppg) and has reached double figures in nine games, including back-to-back 20+-point efforts.
- Junior Tanner Samson added nine points on three treys. Samson leads the CAA with 41 threes this season and ranks 7th on Elon's career 3's list (180).
- Sophomore Luke Eddy, who is averaging 13.0 ppg, sat out the KSU game with a knee injury. He scored 27 points at Missouri and 16 points at Duke.
- Forward Ryan Winters contributed 12 points and six rebounds at KSU, including 5 offensive boards.
- Elon's defense forced KSU into 15 turnovers for the game and held the Owls to 34.6% FG shooting in the 2nd half, including 3-of-14 from three.
