## NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

### TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

It's the last day of 2014 and the last day of non-conference play for the CAA as four teams take to the court.

- **UNCW** continues its stay in Florida as the Seahawks face Stetson in a game that will air live on ESPN3.
- **Towson** looks to make it two straight wins as it hosts A-10 foe George Washington.
- **Northeastern** makes the short trip over to Chestnut Hill to take on Boston College.
- The final non-conference game of the 2014-15 season belongs to **Elon** as the Phoenix host Lenoir-Rhyne at 2 p.m.

### LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

- Hofstra had its four-game winning streak snapped with a tough 60-43 loss at Virginia Tech. Junior **Asia Jackson** contributed a team-high 11 points off the bench while junior **Darius Faulk** scored seven points. Sophomore forward **Elo Edeferioka** had seven rebounds.
- Senior **Erin Hall** hit a pair of free throws with five seconds left to help seal a 61-60 win for **College of Charleston** over South Carolina Upstate. **Jackie Luna-Castro** led the Cougars with 16 points while **Bre Bolden** and **Christy Hewatt** each tallied 14 points.

### #CAAHOOPS PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - 12/29

- Drexel University guard **Rachel Pearson** was named the CAA Player of the Week. The junior led Drexel with a career-high 25 points in the 71-54 win over Miami (Ohio) at the Cavalier Classic. Pearson was 6-for-10 from three-point range, matching a season high. Overall, she was 7-for-12 from the field and a perfect 5-for-5 from the free throw line. She also had five rebounds and three steals in 34 minutes of action.
- Towson University guard **Breonn Hughey** earned Rookie of the Week honors. The freshman had a huge game in the 72-70 win over George Mason, posting her first career double-double. She finished with a career-high 11 points and a career-high 10 assists. Hughey went 4-for-9 from the field and 3-for-5 from three-point range. She also had three rebounds, two assists, and just two turnovers in 39 minutes of action.

### IN THE RPI

Through games on December 30, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 10th, a season best, in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-100. **James Madison** had an RPI of 11 while **Elon's** RPI stood at 69 and **Drexel** checked in at 75.
- **James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19.

### NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on December 29, several CAA players and teams were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is seventh in the nation in scoring (23.5 ppg), sixth in three-point field goals made per game (3.45), and 10th in free throw percentage (.926).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is 15th in the nation in rebounding (11.4 rpg).
- In assists per game, JMU's **Angela Mickens** is fourth (7.5).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is 18th in steals per game (3.11).
- As a team, Delaware is 21st in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.381).
- James Madison is 19th in rebounding margin (+10.2).

### IN THE POLLS

James Madison received votes in both national polls this week.

- The Dukes received votes in the *Associated Press* Poll released on December 29. Dating back to last season, it is the 15th consecutive week in which the Dukes have received votes.
- JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll on December 23 coming in at No. 24 on. JMU has appeared in the *USA Today* Poll each week of the 2014-15 season.
- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. Their No. 23 ranking was JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).
- On December 30, JMU was the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 for the seventh consecutive week.

### HOT SHOTS

- The CAA is 52-54 against non-conference opponents this season, including a 7-2 mark against Patriot League teams and a 6-2 mark against Big South teams.
- Home has been good to the CAA as teams are a combined 32-14 on their home courts.
- Drexel Head Coach **Denise Dillon** picked up her 200th career victory on December 28 in the 71-54 win over Miami (Ohio).
- James Madison is two wins away from the 1,000th in program history.
- Hofstra has won six of the last eight games, including four double-digit victories. The Pride is holding opponents to just 56.1 points per game during that span.
- Northeastern has had at least three Huskies score 10+ points in all but one game this season.
- UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** posted her 1,000th career point against Charleston Southern on December 20. Atkins finished the day with a career-high 40 points to go along with 10 rebounds.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** posted double-digit rebounds in her first four games this season, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt, and in seven of 11 games this season.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded six 20-point games in 11 starts. She also has five double-doubles. Hines-Allen is averaging 18.8 points and 9.9 rebounds per game this year.
- Since returning to the lineup seven games ago, senior **A'lece Mark** is averaging 14.9 points and 6.7 rebounds with six steals.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** is riding a conference-best 20-game, double-digit scoring streak.
- Elon is 37-11 at home under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.
- JMU has won 15 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33).
- College of Charleston had just three home contests this season - a November 16 contest against UNC Greensboro, a December 21 win over Mercer, and a December 30 win over South Carolina Upstate.
- Drexel guard **Meghan Creighton** is out indefinitely with a knee injury which will require surgery.

## THE 40-CLUB

UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.

- The 40 points are tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history and it was the 18th 40-point game in conference history.
- Atkins is the first CAA player to score 40 points since Elena Delle Donne had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.
- It is the seventh 40-point game in NCAA Division I this season.
- It is only the second 40-point game by any UNCW player (men's or women's) in UNCW history.

## HELPING THEM OUT

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I at the time.
- Five CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted 13 assists against Sacred Heart on December 7.
- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** dished out 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro on November 16.
- Hofstra guard **Darius Faulk** had 10 assists in the win at NJIT on December 9.
- Towson guard **Breonn Hughey** at 10 assists in the win over George Mason on December 28.

## BLOCK PARTY

- Two teams have blocked a 11 shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 137 blocks while James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 111. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffey** (109) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (101).

The prestigious community service award is presented annually by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and Allstate Insurance Company. It recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. The final roster of award recipients will be unveiled in February.

## WELCOME ELON

The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member Elon University for the 2014-15 season behind fourth-year Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.

- The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.
- Senior forward **Sam Coffey** and sophomore guard **Lauren Brown**, who was named to the SoCon All-Rookie squad, are also back adding to the solid mix of veterans and experienced youth.

## WELCOME COACHES

The CAA is proud to introduce two new head coaches to the league.

- Northeastern is led by **Kelly Cole**, the former Boston College and Harvard assistant who brings more than 20 years of coaching experience with her. She made 11 trips to the postseason, eight of those to the NCAA Tournament.
- At the College of Charleston, **Candice M. Jackson** is in her first season as a collegiate head coach after spending the past three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Duke University.

## TOP SCORERS RETURN

Twelve of the top-20 scorers from a year ago will return for the 2014-15 campaign.

## TOP HONOREES RETURN

Six All-CAA honorees return for the 2014-15 campaign, including CAA Rookie of the Year Marlena Tremba of William & Mary.

- All-CAA Second Team members **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts**, both of JMU, return along with Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen**, and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins**.
- All-CAA Third Teamers Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** and Drexel's **Rachel Pearson** are back.

## YOUTH MOVEMENT

There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class will have 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

## CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. Also earning first-team honors were: Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** (14.1 ppg/8.4 rpg), Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** (15.0 ppg/4.0 rpg), and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** (15.8 ppg/5.5 rpg).
- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmen Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

## CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

## THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- **James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- **Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- **College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- **UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.
- **Northeastern** battled at the FAU Thanksgiving Classic. In the opener, the Huskies were clipped by North Dakota State, 79-72. In the second game, Northeastern fell at host FAU, 81-74.
- **Towson** came up against two feisty opponents at the LIU Brooklyn Turkey Classic. The Tigers fell to Rhode Island, 60-49, on the opening day and suffered a 62-49 loss to La Salle in the finale.

## TIP-OFF TIME

The CAA had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by ten different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32./3).

## CAA POSTSEASON SNAPSHOT - 2014

- For the ninth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason. It was the 14th consecutive season in which the a representative in the WNIT and just the second season overall for a CAA team to participate in the WBI.
- Over 29 seasons of CAA women's basketball, teams have accumulated 68 victories in postseason action. The CAA posted an impressive 11-3 postseason record in 2013 and since the 2012 postseason the CAA has compiled a 23-14 postseason mark.
- James Madison was selected as the 11-seed in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament in the Lincoln Regional. The Dukes upset #6 Gonzaga, 72-63, to advance to the second round but fell to host #3 Texas A&M, 85-69.
- For three straight years the CAA has had a team advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- In the past 29 seasons, CAA teams have made appearances in 13 Sweet 16's, two Elite 8's and one Final Four – including an appearance in the NCAA National Championship Game.
- The second-seeded College of Charleston Cougars defeated #7 USC Upstate, 85-71, in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) and #3 Northern Kentucky, 60-54. The Cougars completed their highly-successful season in a 78-74 loss to visiting #4 Stephen F. Austin of the West Region portion of the Final Four.
- Delaware fell to Rutgers, 65-61, in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT).

## HOT SHOTS: 2013-14 EDITION

- **National Statistical Rankings (Final):** James Madison ranked in the top 20 in seven categories, while Drexel is ranked in three and Delaware in two. James Madison finished second in the nation in three-point field goal defense (25.4), sixth in scoring margin (19), seventh in field-goal percentage defense (34.8), eighth in rebounding margin (10.2), 10th in scoring defense (55.9) and blocked shots per game (5.8) and 14th in winning percentage (82.9). Drexel ranked among the top 6 in turnovers per game (3rd, 11.8) and assist/turnover ratio (6th, 1.38). JMU's Kirby Burkholder completed her senior campaign ranked among the top 10 in two categories - 9th in 3-pt FG per game (3.14) and 10th in FT% (89.3). Full list on page 7 of this report.
- **Non-Conference Record:** CAA teams went 55-66 (.455) against non-conference opponents during the 2013-14 season.
- **RPI Ratings:** In the final RPI ratings posted, the league ranked 13th among the conferences. James Madison led the CAA with a RPI of 38.
- **Almost Perfect:** James Madison opened conference play this season with an unbeaten record of 13-0 before College of Charleston made their mark by grabbing one from JMU in South Carolina on Feb. 27. The Dukes led the CAA with a 15-1 record.
