CAA TIP-OFF WEEKEND

The tip-off of the 2014-15 CAA men's basketball season continues on Sunday with a pair of contests.

Preseason conference favorite Northeastern starts its season at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday as it challenges city rival Boston University at TD Garden in a game televised by NESN. Elon is also back in action against Charlotte at 5:30 p.m. in an American Sports Network broadcast.

CAA teams went 3-4 in Friday night's opening contests. College of Charleston rolled to a 75-40 road victory over in-state foe Furman in the first game for new head coach Earl Grant. Seniors Anthony Stitt and Adjehi Baru combined for 35 points to pace the Cougars. Elon picked up its first victory as a CAA member by rallying past Florida Atlantic 64-58. Tony Sabato scored a career-high 14 points for the Phoenix. Hofstra dominated Jacksonville 94-61. SMU transfer Brian Bernardi hit 6-of-8 threes and poured in a team-high 22 points for the Pride and Niagara transfer Ameen Tanksley added 16 points in only 24 minutes.

Two of the CAA's four setbacks came to teams ranked in the top 10 nationally and a third came to a team receiving votes in the Top 25. William & Mary got 15 points from Omar Prewitt but fell 68-45 at No. 7 Florida. Playing before its first sell-out crowd in 20 years, JMU dropped a 79-51 decision to No. 9 Florida despite 15 points from freshman Hari Hall. Junior Tavon Allen scored 16 points off the bench in Drexel's 65-48 loss at Pac 12 foe Colorado, while Towson was led by Four McGlynn's 15 points in an 82-54 loss at SEC member Alabama.

On Saturday, UNCW was beaten 76-56 at Old Dominion in its first game under Coach Kevin Keatts.

Defending CAA champion Delaware is the final team to start the 2014-15 campaign as the Blue Hens visit Liberty on Monday night. The 7 p.m. contest can be seen on MASN and ESPN3.

CONFERENCE NOTES:

NORTHEASTERN PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Northeastern, which returns four starters and welcomes back All-CAA forward Quincy Ford from an injury, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2014-15 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Huskies were followed in the voting by William & Mary, Hofstra, Drexel, James Madison, College of Charleston, Towson, defending champion Delaware, UNCW and CAA newcomer Elon.

W&M'S THORNTON HEADLINES PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches. Thornton received first-team All-CAA accolades last season after averaging a team-best 18.7 points per game and knocking down a league-high 93 three-pointers. Joining Thornton on the preseason All-CAA first team are Northeastern senior forward **Scott Eatherton** (15.9 ppg, 10.2 rpg), who was the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year and a 2nd-team All-CAA pick, Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green**, a transfer from Niagara who was 1st-team All-MAAC in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg, Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, but missed most of last season with a knee injury, and James Madison junior guard **Andre Nation**, who earned 3rd-team All-CAA accolades after averaging 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. A complete listing of the preseason All-CAA teams can be found in this release.

LOTS OF NEW STARTERS: The CAA's 10 teams return just 44% (22-of-50) of their starters from a year ago. Preseason favorite Northeastern welcomes back four starters, while Hofstra and UNCW each return three. The league's remaining seven teams have no more than two regulars back in the lineup. In addition, only eight of the CAA's top 20 scorers are back in 2014-15 and nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

W&M'S THORNTON ON HENSON AWARD WATCH LIST: William & Mary senior guard Marcus Thornton has been placed on the Watch List for the Lou Henson Award, which is given to the top mid-major player in the nation by Colleg Insider.com. Thornton enters the season ranked seventh on the Tribe's all-time scoring list with 1,519 points and he's fourth among all active NCAA Division I players in three-pointers made with 223.

NU'S EATHERTON FILLS THE STAT SHEET: Northeastern forward **Scott Eatherton** recorded 19 double-doubles in 32 games last season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the nation. Eatherton ranked 12th in the nation in rebounding (10.2 rpg), eighth in the CAA in scoring (15.9 ppg) and first in the conference in blocked shots (57).

ELON JOINS THE CAA: The CAA welcomes Elon University to the conference this season. The Phoenix are coming off a solid 18-14 campaign in 2013-14, which included an 11-5 mark in the Southern Conference. Elon has averaged 18 victories over the past three seasons under coach **Matt Matheny**, and the Phoenix earned a postseason berth in the CIT in 2013. They are 33-11 at home over the past three years. **College of Charleston** begins its second year as a CAA member and the conference will have 10 members for the first time since 2004-05.

TWO NEW COACHES IN THE CAA: There will be two new coaches in the CAA this season as **Earl Grant** takes over at College of Charleston and **Kevin Keatts** begins his first year at UNCW. Grant, who is a native of Charleston, spent the past four seasons as an assistant under former CAA Coach of the Year Brad Brownell at Clemson. He also was an assistant for six seasons under Gregg Marshall, with the last three coming at Wichita State. Keatts coached the past three seasons under Rick Pitino at Louisville, where the Cardinals went to two NCAA Final Fours and won the national championship in 2013. Prior to Louisville, he compiled a 263-17 record over 10 seasons at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS: CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS: CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

FIVE TEAMS RECEIVE VOTES IN MID-MAJOR POLL: Five CAA teams received votes in the preseason CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. **Northeastern** was the highest-ranked squad with 63 points, followed by **Delaware** (27 pts), **William & Mary** (26 pts), **Hofstra** (13 pts) and **Towson** (6 pts).

CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO BALTIMORE: The CAA Men's Basketball Championship returns to Baltimore's Royal Farms Arena on March 6-9. It's the second year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore. Nearly 20,000 fans attended last year's tournament. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE: The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have at least 90 televised games, including 10 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 22 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. The CAA will also have 17 men's games aired by the league's newest television partner, the American Sports Network. In addition, CAA fans will be able to watch hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's new digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference game.

LEE, FORD RETURN TO ACTION: The CAA welcomes back a pair of standout performers who were granted an extra year of eligibility by the NCAA after suffering injuries a year ago. Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, played in only five games before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off against Arizona last November. Northeastern junior forward **Quincy Ford**, who was a member of the All-CAA third team in 2012-13 after averaging 12.2 ppg and 5.8 rpg, saw action in only two games last year before undergoing season-ending back surgery.

IMPACT TRANSFERS: Several CAA teams are expected to be impacted by transfers from Division I schools. Hofstra has added guard **Juan'ya Green** and guard/forward **Ameen Tanksley** from Niagara, along with guard **Brian Bernardi** from SMU. Green averaged 16.5 ppg and was a first-team All-MAAC selection, while Tanksley scored 11.2 ppg in 2012-13. Towson picked up guard **A.J. Astroth** from Vanderbilt, forward **Alex Gavrilovic** from Dayton and guard **Josh Ivory**, who began his career at Cleveland State.

- Senior guard Anthony Stitt poured in a team-high 19 points at Furman on 7-of-11 FG shooting. He knocked down 3-of-5 three-pointers.
- Senior forward Adjehi Baru contributed 16 points on 8-of-10 FG shooting and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds at Furman. Baru was a member of the CAA All-Defensive team last season.
- Freshman Donovan Gilmore came off the bench to score 12 points in just 17 minutes. He was 6-of-8 from the floor.
- CofC shot 52.5% from the floor at Furman, including 11-of-21 from 3-point range. Six different Cougars hit a trey.
- The Cougars dished out 20 assists on 31 field goals at Furman. Sophomore Joe Chealey led the way with a career-high tying seven helpers.

- Dropped a 65-48 decision at Pac 12 foe Colorado on Friday. The Dragons were within seven with 13 minutes to go.
- Junior guard Damion Lee, who averaged 17.1 ppg in 2012-13, returned to action after suffering a season-ending knee injury last November. He scored 12 points and made two steals at Colorado.
- Sophomore forward Rodney Williams, who made the CAA All-Rookie team last season, had eight points and a team-high seven rebounds at Colorado.
- Junior guard Tavon Allen came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points at Colorado. He ranked 14th in the CAA in scoring last season with 11.7 ppg and scored double digits 16 times.
- Sophomore guard Major Canady, who started 14 games last year, suffered a season-ending ankle injury in preseason practice.
- Drexel has finished .500 or better in CAA play for the past six years, which is the longest active streak in the league.

- Captured their first CAA regular-season and tournament titles last year and made their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999.
- The Blue Hens have averaged 20.7 wins over the past three seasons. The 25 victories in 2013-14 matched the 2nd-most ever.
- Senior guard Kyle Anderson, who is a three-year starter, will miss the start of the season after having hand surgery. He averaged 11.0 ppg last season, ranked 3rd in the CAA with 85 treys and was 6th in 3-point% (37.6%).
- Anderson enters the season ranked second on UD's career 3-pointers list (215) and needs 14 more to break the school record.
- Junior forward Marvin King-Davis made 19 starts last season and contributed 5.1 ppg and 3.7 rpg. He shot 49% from the floor.
- UD must replace four starters who combined to average 68.2 ppg last season. Three of them earned All-CAA honors, including all-time leading scorer Devon Saddler.

- Junior forward Tony Sabato scored a career-high and team-high 14 points on 6-of-9 FG shooting against FAU.
- Junior guard Tanner Samson hit 2-of-3 treys and scored 10 points in the FAU win. Of his 86 made field goals last season, 79 came from 3-point range. Samson shot an impressive 43.4% from beyond the arc.
- Sophomore Luke Eddy started at point guard against Furman and contributed 13 points with two steals. His 3-pointer with 8:35 left gave Elon a 52-49 lead.
- Freshman guard Elijah Bryant came off the bench to score 10 points in 19 minutes in his collegiate debut.
- Elon limited FAU to 38% FG shooting. The Phoenix were 9-1 last season when holding opponents under 40%.
- Elon now has a 34-11 record at Alumni Gym over the past three-plus seasons.

- SMU transfer Brian Bernardi scored a team-high 22 points in 26 minutes in his Hofstra debut. He drained 6-of-8 threes, which was one shy of the school record.
- Niagara transfer Ameen Tanksley scored 16 points on 7-of-11 FG shooting in his first game with the Pride.
- Guard Juan'ya Green, a transfer from Niagara, had 14 points and nine assists in his first Hofstra game. Green made the All-MAAC first team in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg. He had 1,131 points, 310 assists and 126 steals in his first two years at Niagara.
- Junior forward Malik Nichols tallied 15 points on 6-of-8 FG shooting in his first game at Hofstra.
- The Pride shot 56% from the floor and hit 8-of-18 treys against Jacksonville.

- Junior guard Craig Ponder added 14 points against ODU and made four of the Seahawks' eight steals.
- Junior forward Dylan Sherwood came off the bench to score 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting from 3-point range.
- Senior guard Freddie Jackson contributed 11 points and five boards vs. ODU. He reached double digits 10 times last season.
- Cedrick Williams, who was held to three points and two rebounds at ODU, ranks 10th in career rebounds (570) and second in career blocked shots (133) at UNCW.

JAMES MADISON**0-1 Overall/0-0 CAA**

- Fell 79-51 to 9th-ranked Virginia in their opening game on Friday.
- A capacity crowd of 6,782 packed the JMU Convocation Center for the home opener. It was the Dukes' first sellout crowd since a victory over Purdue on Dec. 3, 1994.
- Freshman forward Hari Hall came off the bench to score a team-high 15 points. He drained 4-of-7 from three-point range.
- Sophomore guard Jackson Kent tallied 14 points against Virginia. He was 5-of-9 from the floor and made a pair of treys.
- Freshman Joey McLean contributed eight points, four rebounds and four assists.
- Junior guard Andre Nation, who was named to the preseason All-CAA first team, will miss the first five games due to a team suspension. Nation averaged 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per game last season.
- JMU has reached the 21-win mark in three of Matt Brady's six seasons as head coach.

NORTHEASTERN**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAA**

- Preseason favorite to win the CAA title as four of the team's top five starters are back along with redshirt junior Quincy Ford.
- Senior forward Scott Eatherton averaged 15.9 ppg and 10.2 rpg last season and posted 19 double-doubles. He had a league-high 57 blocks, was named CAA Def. Player of the Year, and made the All-CAA 2nd team.
- Junior Quincy Ford returns after missing most of last season with a back injury. Ford averaged 12.2 ppg and 5.8 rpg in 2012-13 and was a 3rd-team All-CAA pick.
- Junior guard David Walker was NU's second-leading scorer (11.4 ppg) last season and was chosen to the CAA All-Defensive team after ranking 2nd in the league in steals.
- Senior forward Reggie Spencer is a three-year starter who was 8th in the CAA in rebounding (5.9 rpg) and added 9.2 ppg.
- Guard T.J. Williams was named to the CAA All-Rookie squad last year after contributing 6.9 ppg with 59 assists.
