### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

#### Scott Eatherton • Northeastern

Sr., F, 6-8, 234 - Hershey, Pa./Hershey  
Eatherton averaged 19.0 points and 6.7 rebounds in Northeastern's 3-0 week which included a road victory at ACC foe Florida State (76-73) and wins over Navy (68-44) and defending MAAC champion Manhattan (65-51) to capture the Hall of Fame Tipoff Tournament. The senior forward scored 16 points at FSU, tallied a team-high 19 points and eight boards vs. Navy and finished with a season-best 22 points, eight rebounds and three blocks against Manhattan. He was named tournament MVP for his efforts. For the week, Eatherton shot 60.6% from the floor and hit 17-of-20 from the free throw line.

#### Elijah Bryant • Elon

Fr., G, 6-4, 225 - Gwinnett, Ga./New Hampton School (N.H.)  
Bryant scored a career-high 16 points and grabbed six rebounds in Elon's narrow 68-67 overtime loss at unbeaten Northwestern. The freshman guard, who has scored double digits in all three games, was 7-of-15 from the floor and also made two steals against the Big Ten foe.

## CONFERENCE NOTES:

**IMPRESSIVE WEEK IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY:** CAA teams have combined for an impressive 19-11 record against non-conference competition over the past eight days, with **Towson** (4-0), **Northeastern** (3-0), **William & Mary** (3-0), **James Madison** (3-0) and **UNCW** (2-0) all going undefeated during that stretch. For the season, the CAA improved to 23-17 (.575) in non-conference play. Nine of the 17 losses have come against teams from the Power 5 conferences (#8 Virginia, #17 Miami, #18 Florida, Colorado, Alabama, N.C. State, Texas A&M, USC and Northwestern) and another was against defending national champ and #24 UConn.

**HOT STARTS: Northeastern** is off to a 4-0 start for just the fourth time in its Division I history and the first time since 2005-06. The Huskies, who received one vote in this week's *Associated Press* Top 25 poll, won 76-73 at Florida State on Nov. 18, which was the program's first victory ever over an ACC school. NU also captured its first in-season tournament since 2009 when it beat Navy (68-44) and Manhattan (65-51) to take the Hall of Fame Tipoff title. **Towson** (4-1) is off to its best start since 1989-90. The Tigers held three straight opponents (Morgan State, Central Connecticut and Bethune-Cookman) under 50 points for the first time in school history. **Hofstra's** 3-1 start is its best since the 2008-09 squad began 7-1, **William & Mary** is 3-1 for the second time in the last three years and **James Madison** is 3-1 for the first time since 2010-11.

**RECORD-SETTING WEEK FOR UNCW:** It was a record-setting offensive week for **UNCW** in its back-to-back road wins over UNCG (84-72) and VMI (110-93). The Seahawks shot a school-record 65.3% from the floor at UNCG, including a 10-of-16 effort from three-point range. At VMI, UNCW scored its most points since 2009, including a school-record 84 points in the paint. The Seahawks had three players score more than 20 points - Freddie Jackson (26), Cedrick Williams (23), Addison Spruill (20) - for the first time since March 5, 1994.

**HOFSTRA'S GREEN FILLS THE STAT SHEET:** Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green** averaged 21.7 points, 5.7 assists and 4.0 rebounds in the Pride's 2-1 week. The highly touted Niagara transfer scored a season-best 24 points and tied a career-high with 11 assists in a 93-71 win over Wagner on Sunday and also netted 22 points in a victory over Long Island rival Stony Brook. For the season, Green ranks second in the CAA in scoring (19.8 ppg) and first in assists (6.5 apg). He has committed just four turnovers in 140 minutes of action.

**ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS FOR DREXEL'S LEE:** Drexel's **Damion Lee** was named to the All-Tournament team at the Charleston Classic. The junior guard, who averaged 23.0 ppg over the three contests, hit 8-of-11 threes and scored 32 points in a two-point loss to USC and tallied 24 of his team-high 28 points in the second half as the Dragons rallied past Cornell. Lee also became the 29th player in school history to reach 1,000 career points.

**ELON'S SAMSON SHINES AT NORTHWESTERN:** Elon junior guard **Tanner Samson** scored a career-high 24 points as Elon dropped a 68-67 overtime decision at unbeaten Northwestern last Saturday. Samson drained 8-of-13 from 3-point range, which tied for the second-most treys in the program's Division I history. Samson is averaging a team-high 15.0 ppg for the season and all 13 of his made field goals (13-26) have come from beyond the arc.

**HUSKIES RANKED #22 IN MID-MAJOR POLL:** **Northeastern** is ranked #22 in the Nov. 24 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. **Hofstra** (7 pts), **Towson** (5 pts) and **William & Mary** (4 pts) were among others receiving votes.

**NORTHEASTERN PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE:** Northeastern, which returns four starters and welcomes back All-CAA forward Quincy Ford from an injury, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2014-15 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Huskies were followed in the voting by William & Mary, Hofstra, Drexel, James Madison, College of Charleston, Towson,

defending champion Delaware, UNCW and CAA newcomer Elon.

**W&M'S THORNTON HEADLINES PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM:** William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches. Thornton received first-team All-CAA accolades last season after averaging a team-best 18.7 points per game and knocking down a league-high 93 three-pointers. Joining Thornton on the preseason All-CAA first team are Northeastern senior forward **Scott Eatherton** (15.9 ppg, 10.2 rpg), who was the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year and a 2nd-team All-CAA pick, Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green**, a transfer from Niagara who was 1st-team All-MAAC in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg, Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, but missed most of last season with a knee injury, and James Madison junior guard **Andre Nation**, who earned 3rd-team All-CAA accolades after averaging 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. A complete listing of the preseason All-CAA teams can be found in this release.

**LOTS OF NEW STARTERS:** The CAA's 10 teams return just 44% (22-of-50) of their starters from a year ago. Preseason favorite Northeastern welcomes back four starters, while Hofstra and UNCW each return three. The league's remaining seven teams have no more than two regulars back in the lineup. In addition, only eight of the CAA's top 20 scorers are back in 2014-15 and nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

**W&M'S THORNTON ON HENSON AWARD WATCH LIST:** William & Mary senior guard Marcus Thornton has been placed on the Watch List for the Lou Henson Award, which is given to the top mid-major player in the nation by CollegeInsider.com. Thornton is ranked seventh on the Tribe's all-time scoring list with 1,577 points and he's fourth among all active NCAA Division I players in three-pointers made with 230.

**ELON JOINS THE CAA:** The CAA welcomes Elon University to the conference this season. The Phoenix are coming off a solid 18-14 campaign in 2013-14, which included an 11-5 mark in the Southern Conference. Elon has averaged 18 victories over the past three seasons under coach **Matt Matheny**, and the Phoenix earned a postseason berth in the CIT in 2013. They are 33-11 at home over the past three years. **College of Charleston** begins its second year as a CAA member and the conference will have 10 members for the first time since 2004-05.

**TWO NEW COACHES IN THE CAA:** There are two new coaches in the CAA this season as **Earl Grant** takes over at College of Charleston and **Kevin Keatts** begins his first year at UNCW. Grant, who is a native of Charleston, spent the past four seasons as an assistant under former CAA Coach of the Year Brad Brownell at Clemson. He also was an assistant for six seasons under Gregg Marshall, with the last three coming at Wichita State. Keatts coached the past three seasons under Rick Pitino at Louisville, where the Cardinals went to two NCAA Final Fours and won the national championship in 2013. Prior to Louisville, he compiled a 263-17 record over 10 seasons at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

**PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS:** CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS:** CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

**CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO BALTIMORE:** The CAA Men's Basketball Championship returns to Baltimore's Royal Farms Arena on March 6-9. It's the

second year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore. Nearly 20,000 fans attended last year's tournament. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

**OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE:** The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have at least 90 televised games, including 10 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 22 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. The CAA will also have 17 men's games aired by the league's newest television partner, the American Sports Network. In addition, CAA fans will be able to watch hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's new digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference game.

**LEE, FORD RETURN TO ACTION:** The CAA welcomes back a pair of standout performers who were granted an extra year of eligibility by the NCAA after suffering injuries a year ago. Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, played in only five games before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off against Arizona last November. Northeastern junior forward **Quincy Ford**, who was a member of the All-CAA third team in 2012-13 after averaging 12.2 ppg and 5.8 rpg, saw action in only two games last year before undergoing season-ending back surgery.

**IMPACT TRANSFERS:** Several CAA teams are expected to be impacted by transfers from Division I schools. Hofstra has added guard **Juan'ya Green** and guard/forward **Ameen Tanksley** from Niagara, along with guard **Brian Bernardi** from SMU. Green averaged 16.5 ppg and was a first-team All-MAAC selection, while Tanksley scored 11.2 ppg in 2012-13. Towson picked up guard **A.J. Astroth** from Vanderbilt, forward **Alex Gavrilovic** from Dayton and guard **Josh Ivory**, who began his career at Cleveland State.
