## CAA WEEKLY AWARDS



### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

#### Ameen Tanksley • Hofstra

Jr., F, 6-5, 230 - Philadelphia, Pa./Imhotep Charter

Tanksley averaged 20.5 points and 6.5 rebounds as Hofstra split a pair of road games last week. The junior forward had a game-high 20 points and six rebounds in a narrow 71-70 setback at USF and contributed a season-high 21 points and seven boards in an 86-56 triumph at Jackson State. The junior forward shot 60% (15-25) from the floor, including 10-of-15 (66.7%) from three-point range. Tanksley has drained five treys in three straight games and is 15-of-20 from beyond the arc in that stretch.



### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

#### Marcus Thornton • William & Mary

Sr., G, 6-4, 190 - Upper Marlboro, Md./Bishop McNamara

Thornton averaged 22.0 points as William & Mary went 2-0 last week. The senior guard scored a game-high 19 points in only 26 minutes as the Tribe rolled past Western Illinois 83-49 and followed with a season-best 25 points in a 66-62 win over defending SoCon champ Wofford. The senior guard shot 66.7% (14-21) from the floor, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range, and made 11-of-13 at the free throw line.



### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

#### Elijah Bryant • Elon

Fr., G, 6-4, 225 - Gwinnett, Ga./New Hampton School (N.H.)

Bryant repeats as CAA Rookie of the Week after averaging 12.7 points in Elon's 2-1 week. The freshman scored a team-high 18 points and grabbed six rebounds in a 74-73 win over Morgan State, had 10 points in a 70-68 victory at Miami (Ohio) and also scored 10 in a loss to North Florida. Bryant, who has scored double figures in all six games this season, was named to the Cancun Challenge Mayan Division All-Tournament team.

## CONFERENCE NOTES:

**CONTINUED EXCELLENCE:** Hofstra junior **Ameen Tanksley** and William & Mary senior **Marcus Thornton**, who shared CAA Player of the Week honors, have continued their excellent play this week. Tanksley was a perfect 9-for-9 from the floor, including 5-of-5 from three, and scored a career-high 30 points in the Pride's 88-74 win over Norfolk State on Tuesday. Thornton poured in a career-best 37 points on 14-of-18 FG shooting, including 8-of-11 from three, in the Tribe's narrow 68-67 loss at Richmond on Wednesday. UNCW senior **Freddie Jackson** also had a career night on Wednesday with 33 points on 14-of-16 FG shooting as the Seahawks crushed St. Andrews 105-47.

**HOT STARTS:** Several CAA teams have begun the season in impressive fashion. **Towson** (7-1) is off to its best start since joining Division I in 1979-80 after extending its winning streak to seven with an 84-76 victory over Coppin State on Wednesday. **William & Mary** (5-2) had its five-game winning streak snapped in a tough 68-67 setback at Richmond on Wednesday. **Northeastern** recorded five victories in the month of November for the first time in program history, but dropped to 5-2 after a 60-46 loss at Harvard on Wednesday. **Hofstra's** 5-2 record is the Pride's best since the 2008-09 squad opened the year with a 6-1 mark. **James Madison** (5-2) has won five straight home games and its only two losses this season are to #7 Virginia and #14 Ohio State.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS CONTINUES:** CAA teams were a perfect 4-0 on Tuesday night. For the season, the CAA is 39-28 (.582) in non-conference play. Nearly half (13-of-28) of the losses have come against teams from the Power 5 conferences, including five teams who are currently ranked in the top 25 (#7 Virginia, #10 Villanova, #14 Ohio State, #15 Miami and #16 West Virginia). Another was against defending national champ and #23 UConn.

**MORE ON THE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Making the non-conference winning percentage even more impressive is the fact that CAA teams have played only 26 of their 67 non-conference games (38.8%) at home and the league is a combined 21-5 in those contests. CAA teams have also picked up 10 road victories and are a combined 8-5 in neutral site games.

**DEFENSIVE EXCELLENCE:** Several CAA teams turned in noteworthy defensive performances last week. **Drexel** held Southern Mississippi to just 36 points in a 59-36 win on Sunday, which was the first time since January, 2012 that the Dragons have kept a team under 40 points and was the fewest points scored by the Golden Eagles since 2005. **William & Mary** limited Western Illinois to 26.8% FG shooting in an 83-49 triumph last Tuesday. It was the second-best defensive FG percentage effort for the Tribe in 12 seasons under coach Tony Shaver. **Northeastern** gave up only 16 first-half points in its 57-48 victory over Fairfield last Saturday, which was the fewest points the Huskies have allowed in a first half since Feb. 11, 2009. **Towson** has held opponents under 50 points in four of its seven victories. The Tigers lead the CAA in FG percentage defense (38.3%) and rebounding margin (+12.6 rpg).

**W&M's SHAVER NEARS 500 WINS:** William & Mary head coach **Tony Shaver** has 499 career victories and is just one win away from becoming the 86th coach with at least 10 years of Division I experience to win 500 or more games. The Tribe visits High Point on Saturday.

**AUTOMATIC AT THE FREE THROW LINE:** Towson junior guard **Four McGlynn** was a perfect 13-for-13 at the free throw line in Towson's 77-66 win at UMBC last Saturday. For the season, he is an incredible 43-of-44 (97.7%) at the charity stripe. Last season, McGlynn led the CAA and ranked sixth nationally in free throw percentage at 91.3%.

**ELON WINS TWO AT THE WIRE:** Elon finished 2-2 in the Cancun Challenge, with three of the four games decided by two points or less. The Phoenix rallied from a 19-point second-half deficit to defeat Morgan State 74-73 on **Luke Eddy's** layup with 6.8 seconds to go and edged Miami (Ohio) 70-68 on a tip-in by **Kevin Blake** with 0.7 seconds remaining.

**DREXEL'S LEE TOPS 20 AGAIN:** Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee** scored a team-high 22 points in the Dragons' win over Southern Miss on Sunday, which was his third straight game with 20 or more points. Lee, who has topped the 20-point mark in four of his six contests, leads the CAA in scoring at 21.0 ppg and is shooting 47.6% from 3-point range.

**STEPPING UP AS SOPHOMORES:** James Madison sophomore forwards **Yohanny Dalember** and **Paulius Satkus** set new career highs in back-to-back games last week. Dalember scored a career-best 20 points in the Dukes' 77-71 win over Colgate on Nov. 24 and Satkus followed with career-highs of 21 points and eight rebounds in a 79-72 triumph over Sacred Heart two days later. Dalember is averaging 11.0 ppg and 5.4 rpg this season after averaging 2.3 ppg and 2.5 rpg a year ago, while Satkus is averaging 7.0 ppg and 3.9 rpg this year after contributing 1.6 ppg and 2.0 rpg in 2013-14.

**HUSKIES RANKED #23 IN MID-MAJOR POLL:** **Northeastern** was ranked #23 in the Dec. 1 CollegInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. **William & Mary** (48 pts) was the top team among others receiving votes, while **Hofstra** and **Towson** each received 11 points.

**NORTHEASTERN KNOCKS OFF FLORIDA STATE:** Preseason CAA favorite Northeastern earned a 76-73 win at Florida State on Nov. 18, which was the program's first victory ever over an ACC school. NU also captured its first in-season tournament since 2009 when it beat Navy (68-44) and Manhattan (65-51) to take the Hall of Fame Tipoff title on Nov. 23.

**W&M'S THORNTON HEADLINES PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM:** William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches. Thornton received first-team All-CAA accolades last season after averaging a team-best 18.7 points per game and knocking down a league-high 93 three-pointers. Joining Thornton on the preseason All-CAA first team are Northeastern senior forward **Scott Eatherton** (15.9 ppg, 10.2 rpg), who was the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year and a 2nd-team All-CAA pick, Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green**, a transfer from Niagara who was 1st-team All-MAAC in 2012-13 after averaging 16.5 ppg, Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, but missed most of last season with a knee injury, and James Madison junior guard **Andre Nation**, who earned 3rd-team All-CAA accolades after averaging 15.4 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. A complete listing of the preseason All-CAA teams can be found in this release.

**NORTHEASTERN PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE:** Northeastern, which returns four starters and welcomes back All-CAA forward Quincy Ford from an injury, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2014-15 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Huskies were followed in the voting by William & Mary, Hofstra, Drexel, James Madison, College of Charleston, Towson, defending champion Delaware, UNCW and CAA newcomer Elon.

**LOTS OF NEW STARTERS:** The CAA's 10 teams return just 44% (22-of-50) of their starters from a year ago. Preseason favorite Northeastern welcomes back four starters, while Hofstra and UNCW each return three. The league's remaining seven teams have no more than two regulars back in the lineup. In addition, only eight of the CAA's top 20 scorers are back in 2014-15 and nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

**W&M'S THORNTON ON HENSON AWARD WATCH LIST:** William & Mary senior guard Marcus Thornton has been placed on the Watch List for the Lou Henson Award, which is given to the top mid-major player in the nation by CollegInsider.com.

**ELON JOINS THE CAA:** The CAA welcomes Elon University to the conference this season. The Phoenix are coming off a solid 18-14 campaign in 2013-14, which included an 11-5 mark in the Southern Conference. Elon has averaged 18 victories over the past three sea-

sons under coach **Matt Matheny**, and the Phoenix earned a postseason berth in the CIT in 2013. They are 33-11 at home over the past three years. **College of Charleston** begins its second year as a CAA member and the conference will have 10 members for the first time since 2004-05.

**TWO NEW COACHES IN THE CAA:** There are two new coaches in the CAA this season as **Earl Grant** takes over at College of Charleston and **Kevin Keatts** begins his first year at UNCW. Grant, who is a native of Charleston, spent the past four seasons as an assistant under former CAA Coach of the Year Brad Brownell at Clemson. He also was an assistant for six seasons under Gregg Marshall, with the last three coming at Wichita State. Keatts coached the past three seasons under Rick Pitino at Louisville, where the Cardinals went to two NCAA Final Fours and won the national championship in 2013. Prior to Louisville, he compiled a 263-17 record over 10 seasons at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

**PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS:** CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS:** CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

**CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO BALTIMORE:** The CAA Men's Basketball Championship returns to Baltimore's Royal Farms Arena on March 6-9. It's the second year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore. Nearly 20,000 fans attended last year's tournament. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

**OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE:** The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have at least 90 televised games, including 10 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 22 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. The CAA will also have 17 men's games aired by the league's newest television partner, the American Sports Network. In addition, CAA fans will be able to watch hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's new digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference game.

**LEE, FORD RETURN TO ACTION:** The CAA welcomes back a pair of standout performers who were granted an extra year of eligibility by the NCAA after suffering injuries a year ago. Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who averaged 17.1 ppg and made the All-CAA second team in 2012-13, played in only five games before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off against Arizona last November. Northeastern junior forward **Quincy Ford**, who was a member of the All-CAA third team in 2012-13 after averaging 12.2 ppg and 5.8 rpg, saw action in only two games last year before undergoing season-ending back surgery.

- Freshman Elijah Bryant scored 15 points in only 20 minutes. Bryant leads all CAA freshmen in scoring (13.3 ppg) and has tallied double figures in all seven games.
- Junior Tanner Samson tallied a team-high 17 points in 18 minutes vs. Va.-Lynchburg. He's tied for the CAA lead with 24 treys and is shooting 42.9% from beyond the arc.
