NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

Towson has the only game of the night as the Tigers travel to local rival Loyola University Maryland, looking to snap a three-game skid. Thursday's game will be 41st all-time meeting between the Tigers and Greyhounds.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

The CAA went 2-0 on Wednesday night.

- **James Madison** used a 16-3 second half run to blow by A-10 foe Richmond, 79-68, at the JMU Convocation Center. The Dukes held the Spiders to 29.2 percent shooting from beyond the arc on the night. Junior **Precious Hall** led the way with 27 points on 10-for-24 shooting. Junior guard **Angela Mickens** scored a career-high 13 points while **Lauren Okafor** tallied 14 points. Senior forward **Toia Giggetts** led the way on the glass with nine rebounds.
- **Delaware** posted its 700th program victory by posting a 69-58 comeback win at Temple. Sophomore **Erika Brown** led Delaware by tying a career-high with 23 points. The guard sparked a second half comeback by scoring eight points in the first three minutes of the stanza to put the Blue Hens ahead to stay. Delaware went up by as much as 13 and never relinquished a double-figure margin in the final four minutes. Junior **Courtnei Green** chipped in with 19 points while senior **Stephanie Leon** had a career-best nine rebounds in addition to four blocked shots. Freshman **Makeda Nicholas** added 10 points.

NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on December 2, several CAA players were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is tenth in the nation in scoring (24.2 ppg) and fourth in free throw percentage (.966).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is fifth in the nation in rebounding (13.7 rpg).
- In assists per game, JMU's **Angela Mickens** is fourth (7.5) while Elon's **Essence Baucom** is tenth (6.6).
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** is tenth in the country in double-doubles with four.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** is 22nd in assist-turnover ratio (3.17).

IN THE POLLS

James Madison dropped out of this week's *USA Today* Coaches Poll but is still receiving votes (71).

- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since the 2009-10 season when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).
- No. 23 is JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- The Dukes also received votes in the *Associated Press* Poll released on December 1. Dating back to last season, it is the 11th consecutive week in which the Dukes have received votes in the poll.
- JMU is also the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 for the third consecutive week. Elon is also receiving votes in the same poll which was released on December 2.

IN THE RPI

Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-85 of the NCAA Division I RPI Rankings released on December 2. James Madison had a RPI of 39 while Drexel's RPI was 73 and Elon's RPI stood at 81.

2015 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® NOMINEES

Two CAA student-athletes have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team®. William & Mary's **Kyla Kerstetter** and Delaware's **Stephanie Leon** were among 56 NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes to make the list. The prestigious community service award is presented annually by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and Allstate Insurance Company. It recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. From the 93 WBCA nominees across NCAA Divisions I, II, and III, and the NAIA, a distinguished voting panel will select a 10-member team comprised of five student-athletes from the NCAA Division I level and five student-athletes from NCAA Divisions II, III and the NAIA. The final roster of award recipients will be unveiled in February.

PUT IT ON PAUSE

Three teams have an extended period of time between games due to final exams.

- **Northeastern** has 13 days between games, resuming action on December 13 at Maine.
- **College of Charleston** also has 13 days off, getting back to action on December 14 at USF.
- **UNCW** has 14 days between games and is back at it on December 17 when it hosts Richmond.

HOT SHOTS

- The CAA is 31-30 against non-conference opponents so far this season, including a 5-2 mark against Patriot League teams and a 4-0 mark against MAAC teams.
- Home has been good to the CAA as teams are a combined 23-7 on their home courts.
- Delaware posted its 700th program victory at Temple on December 3.
- Drexel Head Coach **Denise Dillon** is three wins away from the 200th of her career.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** posted double-digit rebounds in her first four games this season, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt, and in five of seven games this season.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded four double-doubles in seven games this season. Hines-Allen is averaging 17.6 points and 10.6 rebounds per game.
- Since returning to the lineup three games ago, senior **A'lece Mark** is averaging 19.0 points and 8.3 rebounds with five steals.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** is riding 16-game, double-digit scoring streak. Hall has 993 career points, seven shy of her 1,000th.
- UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** had her double-digit streak stopped at 14 games after scoring nine points on November 29.
- William & Mary sophomore **Marlena Tremba**, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Year, has scored in double-figures in 29 of her 36 career games as member of the Tribe.
- JMU has won 14 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33).
- Three out of Hofstra's seven games have gone to overtime.
- Northeastern has had at least three Huskies score at least 10 points in every game this season.
- Elon opened the year at 4-0 for the first time under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith** and the first time since the 1997-98 campaign.
- The Phoenix is holding opponents to just 35.4 percent shooting and just 23.9 percent shooting from long range.

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I this season.
- Two CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- James Madison guard **Angela Mickens** dished out 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. It is the third-highest single game total in NCAA Division I this season.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- **James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- **Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- **College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- **UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.
- **Northeastern** battled at the FAU Thanksgiving Classic. In the opener, the Huskies were clipped by North Dakota State, 79-72. In the second game, Northeastern fell at host FAU, 81-74.
- **Towson** came up against two feisty opponents at the LIU Brooklyn Turkey Classic. The Tigers fell to Rhode Island, 60-49, on the opening day and suffered a 62-49 loss to La Salle in the finale.

WELCOME ELON

The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member Elon University for the 2014-15 season behind fourth-year Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.

- The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.
- Senior forward **Sam Coffey** and sophomore guard **Lauren Brown**, who was named to the SoCon All-Rookie squad, are also back adding to the solid mix of veterans and experienced youth.

WELCOME COACHES

The CAA is proud to introduce two new head coaches to the league.

- Northeastern will be led by **Kelly Cole**, the former Boston College and Harvard assistant who brings more than 20 years of coaching experience with her. She made 11 trips to the postseason, eight of those to the NCAA Tournament.
- At the College of Charleston, **Candice M. Jackson** will begin her first season as a collegiate head coach after spending the past three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Duke University.

TOP SCORERS RETURN

Twelve of the top-20 scorers from a year ago will return for the 2014-15 campaign.

- That group is headlined by James Madison's **Precious Hall** (15.4 ppg) and **Toia Giggetts** (14.1 ppg) and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.8 ppg).

TOP HONOREES RETURN

Six All-CAA honorees return for the 2014-15 campaign, including CAA Rookie of the Year Marlena Tremba of William & Mary.

- All-CAA Second Team members **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts**, both of JMU, return along with Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen**, and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins**.
- All-CAA Third Team honorees **A'lece Mark** of Northeastern and **Rachel Pearson** of Drexel are also back.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class will have 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. Also earning first-team honors were: Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** (14.1 ppg/8.4 rpg), Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** (15.0 ppg/4.0 rpg), and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** (15.8 ppg/5.5 rpg).
- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

The CAA had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by ten different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32./3).

CAA POSTSEASON SNAPSHOT - 2014

- For the ninth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason. It was the 14th consecutive season in which the a representative in the WNIT and just the second season overall for a CAA team to participate in the WBI.
- Over 29 seasons of CAA women's basketball, teams have accumulated 68 victories in postseason action. The CAA posted an impressive 11-3 postseason record in 2013 and since the 2012 postseason the CAA has compiled a 23-14 postseason mark.
- James Madison was selected as the 11-seed in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament in the Lincoln Regional. The Dukes upset #6 Gonzaga, 72-63, to advance to the second round but fell to host #3 Texas A&M, 85-69.
- For three straight years the CAA has had a team advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- In the past 29 seasons, CAA teams have made appearances in 13 Sweet 16's, two Elite 8's and one Final Four – including an appearance in the NCAA National Championship Game.
- The second-seeded College of Charleston Cougars defeated #7 USC Upstate, 85-71, in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) and #3 Northern Kentucky, 60-54. The Cougars completed their highly-successful season in a 78-74 loss to visiting #4 Stephen F. Austin of the West Region portion of the Final Four.
- Delaware fell to Rutgers, 65-61, in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT).
- In 2013, the CAA saw two teams reach milestones in the postseason as Delaware reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in school history, while Drexel was crowned the 2013 WNIT Champions.

HOT SHOTS: 2013-14 EDITION

- **National Statistical Rankings (Final):** James Madison ranked in the top 20 in seven categories, while Drexel is ranked in three and Delaware in two. James Madison finished second in the nation in three-point field goal defense (25.4), sixth in scoring margin (19), seventh in field-goal percentage defense (34.8), eighth in rebounding margin (10.2), 10th in scoring defense (55.9) and blocked shots per game (5.8) and 14th in winning percentage (82.9). Drexel ranked among the top 6 in turnovers per game (3rd, 11.8) and assist/turnover ratio (6th, 1.38). JMU's Kirby Burkholder completed her senior campaign ranked among the top 10 in two categories - 9th in 3-pt FG per game (3.14) and 10th in FT% (89.3). Full list on page 7 of this report.
- **Non-Conference Record:** CAA teams went 55-66 (.455) against non-conference opponents during the 2013-14 season.
- **RPI Ratings:** In the final RPI ratings posted, the league ranked 13th among the conferences. James Madison led the CAA with a RPI of 38.
- **Almost Perfect:** James Madison opened conference play this season with an unbeaten record of 13-0 before College of Charleston made their mark by grabbing one from JMU in South Carolina on Feb. 27. The Dukes led the CAA with a 15-1 record.
