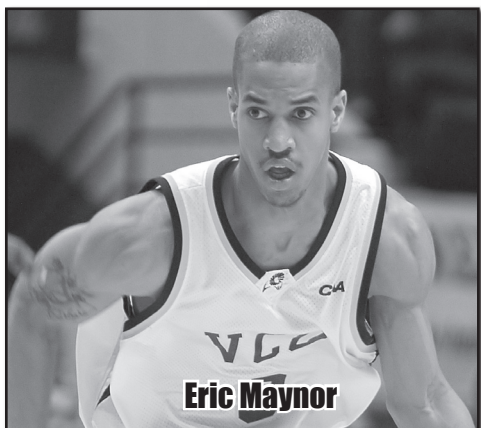

COMMISSIONER TOM YEAGER



Tom Yeager is in his 23rd year as the only commissioner to lead the Colonial Athletic Association. Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has spearheaded the addition of six new members since 2000, transforming what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a conference with a presence in virtually all of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. Those additions have positioned the CAA in five of the nation's top nine media markets from Boston to Atlanta while enhancing the league's reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past two years, with 16 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths. Two CAA men's basketball teams have made the

NCAA Tournament field for the past two years, with George Mason reaching the Final Four in 2006. Last year, the CAA placed a league-record three teams in the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Sears Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. In 2006-07, the CAA honored more than 1,700 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 17 members of his staff.

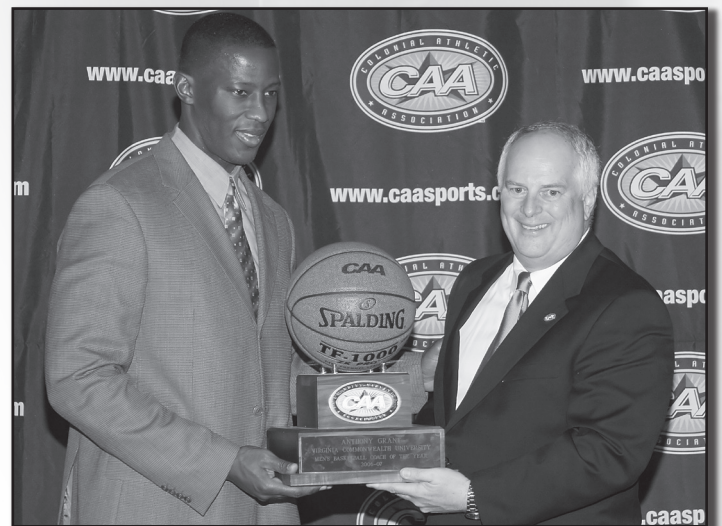
Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. He recently completed a three-year term as chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and is a member of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year.

Yeager, 57, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Coming off another record-setting season, the Colonial Athletic Association continues to enhance its reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

With a geographic footprint stretching from Boston to Atlanta, the CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2006-07, the CAA had six ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans and more than 1,700 of our 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (8), Atlanta (9) and Baltimore (23). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.



Drexel University won the 2006 CAA Blood Challenge. The Blood Challenge resulted in 3,287 productive units of blood last year and the event has raised over 10,000 units of blood over the past five years.

THE CAA ON TELEVISION

The Colonial Athletic Association will feature its most extensive television package in league history in 2007-08. CAA action can be seen regularly on regional sports networks such as Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as CN8, the Comcast Network. The conference will also have several national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and the ESPN Regional network. Other affiliates such as MSG, FOX Sports New York, Cox Communications in Fairfax and Norfolk Va., Time-Warner Cable in Wilmington, N.C., and WSKY-TV in Hampton Roads are regular carriers of CAA Basketball.

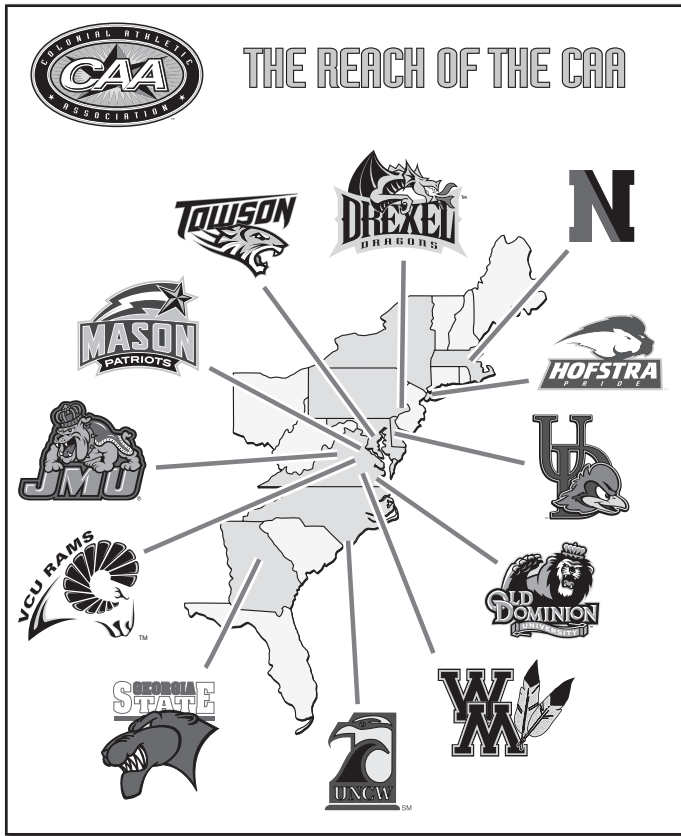

The CAA now sponsors 22 sports with the addition of a 12-team football league in 2007. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2006-07, a league-record 29 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with four teams advancing to post-season play for the past three years. Conference champion VCU pulled the most noted upset of the NCAA first round last season with its 79-77 victory over Duke and Old Dominion became the second CAA team in as many years to receive an NCAA at-large bid. Hofstra returned to the NIT for the third straight season and Drexel made its fourth NIT appearance in the last five years. In 2006, George Mason became the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team.

In women's basketball, the CAA had three teams earn NCAA Tournament berths for the first time and four squads advanced to post-season play for the second straight year. Perennial power Old Dominion, which has captured three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985)



and was national runner-up in 1997, captured its 16th consecutive conference title. James Madison returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996 and Delaware made its second-ever trip to the NCAA's. Hofstra completed its most successful season in school history by advancing to the quarterfinals of the WNIT.

The conference also excels in many other sports. Delaware became the first CAA team to reach the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship in 2007. A league-record four men's soccer teams earned NCAA berths in 2006, with Towson and Old Dominion advancing to the round of 16. A league-high four teams also represented the conference in the NCAA Men's Tennis Championship. William & Mary reached the round of 16 in women's tennis and the Tribe tandem of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic was ranked No. 1 in the nation and reached the finals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. CAA squads have won 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981, which is the

most of any Division I conference. Hofstra finished seventh overall at the NCAA Wrestling Championship and William & Mary finished eighth nationally in men's cross country. In baseball, the league had 17 players chosen in the 2007 Major League Baseball draft. There were 37 CAA student-athletes who received All-America honors.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval

Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

From all-star athletes to Nobel Prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the 12 colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.



The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all 12 universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the "best and brightest" undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 12 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. This year's conference will be held at Northeastern University. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted "visiting academic status" at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.

RESOURCE SHARING

The 12 institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools -- that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share "best practices" in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA "alternative spring break" will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the 12 institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

PLENTY OF TALENT RETURNING: CAA teams welcome back 63% of their starters from a year ago. George Mason has all five starters returning, while Delaware, James Madison and William & Mary have four back. All 12 teams have at least two regulars returning. Statistically, 10 of the league's top 20 in scoring, 12 of the top 20 in rebounding and six of the top 10 in assists are back from a year ago.

SEVEN ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS ARE BACK: Seven players who have received All-CAA honors are back in 2007-08. Hofstra senior guard Antoine Agudio and VCU junior guard Eric Maynor were both first team All-CAA selections last season. Agudio averaged 20.2 ppg and led the conference with 100 three-pointers, while Maynor poured in 13.9 ppg and dished out a league-high 6.4 assists per game. Returning from the All-CAA second team are Delaware senior forward Herb Courtney, Drexel senior forward Frank Elegar and George Mason senior forward Will Thomas. Courtney was fourth in the CAA in scoring (18.1 ppg) and second in rebounding (8.0 rpg) and recorded a league-high 10 double-doubles. Elegar was among the conference's top six in scoring (16.0 ppg), rebounding (6.7 rpg), FG percentage (52.8%) and blocked shots (1.2 bpg). Thomas contributed 13.3 ppg and 6.9 rpg and hit 62.7% of his shots from the floor. Back from last year's All-CAA third team is George Mason senior guard Folarin Campbell, who tallied 13.9 points and 3.8 assists per game, while UNC Wilmington senior guard T.J. Carter, who made the All-CAA third team in 2005-06 before sitting out last season due to hernia surgery, returns after averaging 13.6 ppg.

WORLDWIDE EXPOSURE: Four CAA men's basketball players participated in this summer's Pan American Games in Brazil. VCU junior guard Eric Maynor earned a spot on the United States squad, UNC Wilmington senior center Vladimir Kuljanin made the Canadian national team, Drexel senior forward Frank Elegar represented the U.S. Virgin Islands and William & Mary junior forward Alex Smith was a member of the Panama national team.

CAA SHOWS OVERALL STRENGTH: The CAA has been represented by four different teams in the NCAA Tournament over the past two seasons. George Mason and UNC Wilmington went to the Big Dance in 2006 and VCU and Old Dominion represented the conference in 2007. Outside of the six BCS conferences, only the Missouri Valley has sent more of its members (five) to the NCAA Tournament in the last two seasons. Half of the CAA's 12 teams have earned post-season berths in the past two years with Hofstra having made three straight trips to the NIT and Drexel having gone to the NIT four times in the past five years.

AGUDIO ON NATIONAL SCORING, 3-POINT LISTS: Hofstra senior guard Antoine Agudio enters his final season with 1,664 career points, which is the third-highest total of any returning player in Division I. He also ranks third nationally in career three-pointers with 273. Agudio was third in the CAA and 23rd in Division I in scoring last season with 20.2 ppg. He led the conference with 100 treys, which set a Hofstra record and was the fourth-highest season total in league history. Agudio is on pace to become the all-time leading scorer in Pride history and he has a chance to break the CAA career mark of 371 three-pointers set by UNCW's Brett Blizzard.

CAA PUTS FOUR IN POST-SEASON FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR: A league-record four CAA teams participated in post-season play for the third year in a row, including two teams earning berths in the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season. CAA champion VCU was seeded 11th in the West Region and upset national power Duke 79-77 in the first round before falling 84-79 in overtime to Big East foe Pittsburgh in the second round. Old Dominion received an at-large berth and was seeded #12 in the Midwest Region, but was beaten 57-46 by Butler in the first round. The CAA also placed multiple teams in the NIT for the fourth straight year as Drexel made the field for the fourth time in five years and Hofstra participated in the event for the third straight season.

BUSTIN' THE BRACKETS: CAA teams have made their presence felt on the national stage during the past two seasons. VCU pulled off the most noted upset of the first round in last year's NCAA Tournament by knocking off Duke 79-77 on Eric Maynor's jumper with 1.8 seconds to play. In 2006, George Mason captured the country's attention by becoming the first mid-major team to reach the Final Four since 1979 with victories over Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut. Old Dominion also became the first CAA team to reach the semifinals of the NIT in 2006 and Hofstra reached the quarterfinals.

ELITE COMPANY: The CAA was one of nine Division I conferences that had four teams with 22 or more wins last season. VCU (28-7) was one of 17 Division I squads with at least 28 victories, while Old Dominion (24-9), Drexel (23-9) and Hofstra (22-10) also hit the 22-win mark. Over the past two years, eight CAA teams have eclipsed the 22+ win total.

ROAD WARRIORS: The top four teams in the CAA standings all had winning records on the road last season and were a combined 42-18 (.700). Drexel led the way at 13-4, which included victories at Villanova, Syracuse, Creighton, Hofstra and Saint Joseph's. The 13 wins was tied with Vermont for the most in Division I. VCU had an 11-2 road mark, while Old Dominion was 8-5, including a triumph at Georgetown, and Hofstra was 10-7.

FOUR CAA TEAMS AMONG TOP 75 IN FINAL RPI: The top four teams in the CAA standings were among the top 75 nationally in the final NCAA RPI ratings. VCU led the way at #44, followed by Old Dominion at #45, Drexel at #55 and Hofstra at #75. The CAA was ranked #13 among Division I conferences.

PAIR OF SELLOUTS AT CAA TOURNAMENT: The 2007 CAA Men's Basketball Championship was played before sell-out crowds of 11,200 at the Richmond Coliseum during Sunday's semifinals and Monday's title game for the first time in league history. More than 42,000 fans witnessed the four-day event, which was the most ever for the event.

GEORGIA STATE SELECTS ROD BARNES AS NEW HEAD COACH: Georgia State chose Rod Barnes as its new men's basketball coach. Barnes spent eight seasons (1998-2006) as the head coach at the University of Mississippi where he compiled a 141-109 record and was the Naismith Coach of the Year in 2001. During his eight seasons at Ole Miss, Barnes guided the Rebels to four postseason berths, including a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2001. The 2001 squad won a school-record 27 games and was ranked 9th in the nation. Barnes spent last season as an assistant coach at the University of Oklahoma. He replaces Michael Perry, who was released from his contract after putting together a 62-75 record in five seasons as head coach of the Panthers.

VCU RANKED #29 IN FINAL NATIONAL POLLS: CAA champion VCU was ranked #29 in the country in the final ESPN/USA Today and Associated Press Top 25 polls. The Rams received 25 points in the ESPN/USA Today poll and 53 points in the AP poll. Old Dominion also picked up two points in the final AP rankings.

FOUR CAA TEAMS IN TOP 16 OF MID-MAJOR TOP 25 POLL: Four CAA teams were ranked in the top 16 of the final Collegensider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. VCU led all CAA squads at #4, while Old Dominion was next at #8, followed by Drexel at #11 and Hofstra at #16. The CAA and Missouri Valley led all conferences with four teams ranked in the poll.

VCU'S MAYNOR AMONG NATION'S TOP RETURNEES IN ASSISTS: VCU junior guard Eric Maynor ranked fifth in the nation with 6.4 assists per game last season and is third among players returning in 2007-08. Maynor dished out 224 total assists, which was a VCU season record and the sixth-highest season total in CAA history.

The 2007 CAA championship game was played before a sell-out crowd of 11,200.

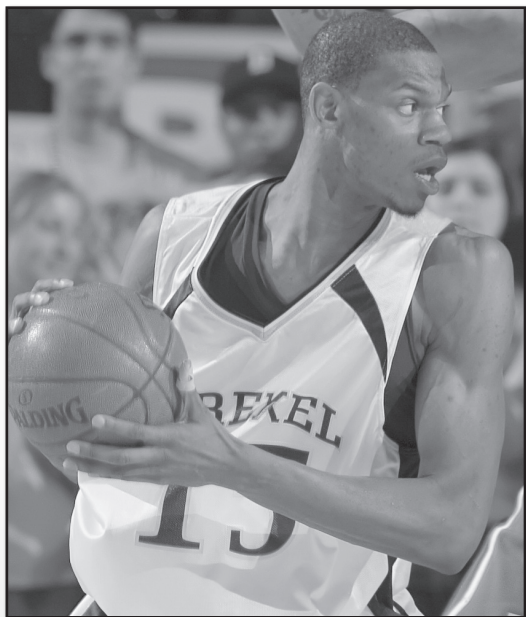




2007-08 CAA TEAM OUTLOOKS

DELAWARE

Monte' Ross heads into the second year of his rebuilding project at Delaware with a Blue Hens' squad that should be much improved. Four starters are back, led by second team All-CAA forward Herb Courtney, who ranked among the league's top five in scoring (18.1 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg) while recording a league-best 10 double-doubles. Senior Sam McMahon (10.4 ppg) is coming off a breakout season in which he scored double figures in the final nine contests. Point guard Brian Johnson (9.6 ppg) made the CAA All-Rookie team after ranking fourth in the league in assists and setting a school record for minutes played. Also returning is senior forward Henry Olawoye. Six newcomers are expected to make an impact for the Hens, including Georgetown transfer Marc Egerson and Nebraska transfer Jim Ledsome who both will be eligible in mid-December.

DREXEL

Coming off its fourth post-season appearance in the past five years, Drexel looks to continue its run of success under head coach Bruiser Flint. The Dragons return eight players from their 23-9 squad that led the nation in road wins a year ago. Senior center Frank Elegar has developed into one of the league's top post players, averaging 16.0 points and 6.7 rebounds per game last season to earn second team All-CAA accolades. He will be joined up front by senior Randy Oveneke, sophomore Kenny Tribbett and Boston College transfer Evan Neisler. Drexel faces the task of replacing a pair of veteran standouts in the backcourt, but juniors Scott Rodgers (8.0 ppg) and Tramayne Hawthorne (7.3 ppg) bring plenty of experience. The Dragons are looking for increased contributions from sophomores Rob Hampton and Lance Feurtado. Freshmen Gerald Colds and Jamie Harris, could battle for the starting point guard spot.

GEORGE MASON

George Mason welcomes back all five starters from last year's 18-15 squad that became the first number six seed in a decade to reach the finals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship. Leading the list of returnees for head coach Jim Larranaga are a pair of veteran all-conference performers in senior forward Will Thomas and senior guard Folarin Campbell. Thomas, a second team All-CAA selection, contributed 13.3 points and 6.9 rebounds per game, while Campbell, a third team All-CAA pick, poured in 13.9 points per game and topped the team in assists. There is plenty of depth in the backcourt with senior Jordan Carter (5.0 ppg), junior Dre Smith (8.0 ppg) and junior sharpshooter John Vaughan (8.3 ppg) returning. Senior Darryl Monroe (6.1 ppg, 3.9 rpg) is a returning starter in the post and there is plenty of experience on the bench with junior Chris Fleming and sophomore Louis Birdsong.

GEORGIA STATE

There is a great deal of excitement at Georgia State, where former Naismith Coach of the Year Rod Barnes takes over the reins of the Panthers' program. Three starters are among nine players returning. Junior guard Leonard Mendez established himself as one of the conference's top backcourt performers last season

after netting 13.8 points per game and draining a league-best 47.5 percent of his shots from beyond the arc. Sophomore guards Trae Goldston and Norman Mitchell will battle for the starting spot at the point. The Panthers feature size and experience up front. Junior forward Rashad Chase (8.5 ppg) is a two-year starter who led the team in rebounding (5.9 rpg) last season. Senior center Deven Dickerson (4.9 ppg, 4.6 rpg) is a good shot-blocker and provides an imposing presence in the post, while senior Justin Billingslea (2.3 ppg) and sophomore Kevin Lott provide depth.

HOFSTRA

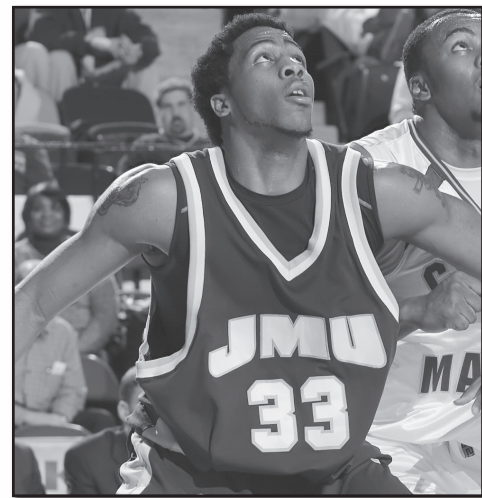
With an average of 23 wins over the past three seasons and three straight trips to the NIT, Hofstra has become a perennial contender for the CAA title. Head coach Tom Pecora faces the difficult task of replacing two-thirds of the nation's high-

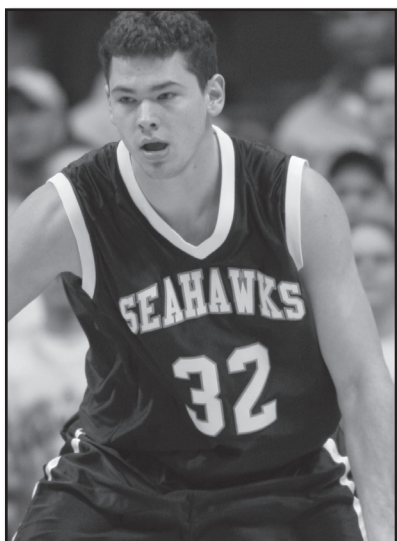
est scoring backcourt, but welcomes back one of the country's premier 3-point shooters in senior guard Antoine Agudio. The first team All-CAA selection, who made 100 treys and averaged 20.2 ppg a year ago, is on pace to become the all-time leading scorer in Hofstra history. He will be joined in the backcourt by junior Greg Johnson, who has seen action in every game over the past two seasons. The Pride is looking for improved production from its frontcourt. Junior forward Mike Davis-Sabb (3.2 ppg, 4.7 rpg), three-point specialist Zygis Sestokas (6.8 ppg) and Arminas Urbutis return. Six-foot-10 newcomers Dane Johnson and Greg Washington should have an impact.

JAMES MADISON

James Madison is primed for a move up the CAA standings with the return of four double-digit scorers and the addition of several promising newcomers. Leading the list of returnees for head coach Dean Keener is junior forward Juwann James, who has ranked among the league's top 20 in scoring (13.0 ppg) and rebounding (5.3 rpg) for the past two seasons. He is joined up front by senior Terrance Carter, who contributed 12.8 ppg and 6.9 rpg in his first year with the Dukes and junior Kyle Swanston (6.5 ppg). Texas Tech transfer Dazzmond Thornton will provide size in the post. JMU looks solid in the backcourt with point guard Pierre Curtis, who averaged 11.4 ppg and made the CAA All-Rookie team last season, and Saint Joseph's transfer Abdulai Jalloh, who was an all-conference performer as a sophomore. Junior Joe Posey is back after nailing a team-high 72 treys a year ago.

UNC WILMINGTON

No team has won more CAA titles over the past decade than UNC Wilmington, and the Seahawks plan to return to that lofty perch after struggling a year ago. Second-year coach Benny Moss will benefit from the return of all-conference guard T.J. Carter, who led the team in scoring (13.6 ppg) and earned CAA Tournament MVP honors as a junior before sitting out last season due to an injury. Three-point specialist Daniel Fountain (10.0 ppg/53 treys) is back for his senior campaign and junior transfer Marlo Davis should

take over at the point. UNCW features two of the conference's top post players in senior forward Todd Hendley, who averaged 11.1 ppg, and senior Vladimir Kuljanin, who tallied 13.6 ppg and a team-best 7.1 rpg while ranking fourth in the nation in FG percentage (66.3%). Swingman Montez Downey also returns to the starting lineup after contributing 8.1 ppg as a rookie.

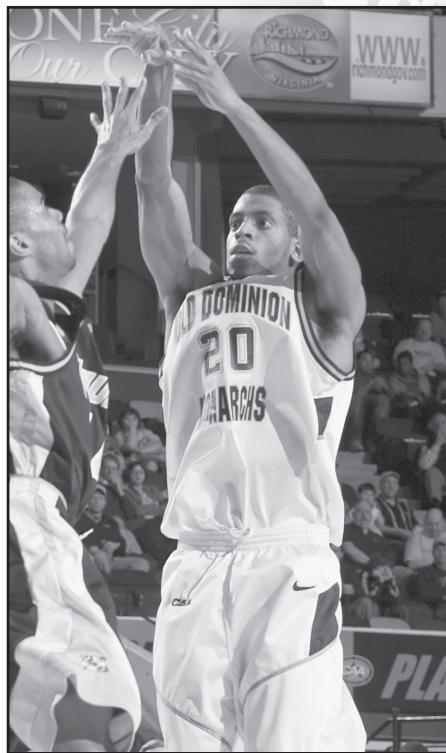
NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern overcame a rough start to win six of its final eight games and record a fifth-place CAA finish last season in its first year under head coach Bill Coen. Helping the Huskies maintain that momentum will be versatile sophomore guard Matt Janing, who earned CAA Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors after tallying 11.6 ppg and 4.5 rpg while dishing out 90 assists. Northeastern also welcomes back a pair of talented 6-8 forwards in sophomore Manny Adako (5.3 ppg/4.0 rpg) and junior Eugene Spates, who scored 7.7 ppg off the bench. Also back is senior post player Mark Washington. The Huskies face the challenge of replacing three senior starters, but should benefit from the addition of 6-foot-8 junior forward Chris Alvarez, a transfer from Dayton and 6-foot-9 sophomore center Nkem Ojougboh, a transfer from UT-San Antonio.

OLD DOMINION

With 75 wins, a pair of NCAA Tournament berths and a run to the NIT Final Four over the past three seasons, coach Blaine Taylor has established Old Dominion as one of the CAA's premier programs. Three four-year standouts are gone, but the Monarchs still have plenty of talent on hand. Senior point guard Brandon Johnson contributed 8.3 ppg and earned a spot on the CAA All-Defensive team after making 69 steals, while senior wing Brian Henderson tallied 9.4 ppg and drained a team-high 55 three-pointers. Up front, sophomore center Gerald Lee (4.2 ppg/3.3 rpg) showed flashes of becoming a dominant inside player and

junior forward Jonathan Adams (3.0 ppg) made 11 starts a year ago. Providing frontcourt depth are 7-3 senior center Sam Harris and redshirt freshmen Frank Hassell and Keyon Carter. Other returnees in the backcourt include senior Abdi Lidonde (4.6 ppg) and sophomore Marsharee Neely.

TOWSON

Towson hopes to continue its steady climb up the CAA standings under head coach Pat Kennedy. With the loss of high-scoring All-CAA guard Gary Neal, the Tigers expect to be more balanced offensively. Running the show will be senior C.C. Williams, who contributed 6.0 ppg and dished out 131 assists in his first season at Towson. Juniors Tim Crossin (3.9 ppg) and Rocky Coleman (3.4 ppg) provide experience in the backcourt and the Tigers should get an immediate boost from transfer guards Vernon Carr and Josh Thornton. Anchoring the post for Towson is 6-9 senior Tommy Breaux, who tallied 5.9 ppg and 4.5 rpg and was an intimidating factor defensively with 65 blocks. Senior Jonathan Pease (4.3 ppg) is a returning starter on the wing and sophomore Rodney Spruill (3.7 ppg) showed promise in his rookie campaign. They will be joined by College of Charleston transfer Junior Hairston.

VCU

VCU's first season under head coach Anthony Grant could not have gone much better with a school-record 28 victories, a CAA regular season and tournament title and a victory over Duke in first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Rams are looking for an encore as six returning lettermen are joined by a highly touted recruiting class. First team All-CAA guard Eric Maynor, who averaged 13.9 points and dished out a school-record 224 assists, burst on to the national scene a year ago with his numerous big plays in the post-season. He will be joined in the backcourt by long-range bomber Jamal Shuler (8.6 ppg/52 treys). The Rams return a pair of starters up front in senior center Wil Fameni (8.9 ppg/5.4 rpg) and senior forward Michael Anderson (6.4 ppg/4.9 rpg). Providing frontcourt depth are CAA All-Rookie selection T.J. Gwynn (4.8 ppg) and sophomore Franck Ndongo.

WILLIAM & MARY

William and Mary recorded its most overall victories in nearly a decade last season and rose to the middle of the CAA standings. Tribe head coach Tony Shaver welcomes back 11 lettermen and four starters from that squad and hopes to continue the momentum. Three-year starting forward Laimis Kisielius poured in 11.3 ppg last season and provides a solid offensive threat. He is joined up front by junior center Peter Stein (5.7 ppg) and junior forward Alex Smith, who contributed 5.5 ppg off the bench. Guard Nathan Mann (9.1 ppg) drained 54 treys a year ago and enters his senior season already ranked among the top three-point shooters in school history. David Schneider (8.1 ppg) returns at the point after a sensational freshman campaign that earned him CAA All-Rookie honors. Senior guard Kyle Carrabine (3.5 ppg) and junior forward Chris Darnell provide experience off the bench.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

LOREN STOKES, Hofstra

Loren Stokes was selected as the CAA Men's Basketball Player of the Year after capping a sensational four-year career with an impressive senior season. The 6-foot-3 guard was second in the CAA and 21st in the nation in scoring with 20.3 ppg, and was also among the top 15 in the conference in rebounding (5.6 rpg) and assists (3.1 apg). A three-time first-team All-CAA selection, Stokes finished his career ranked second at Hofstra and fifth in CAA history with 2,148 points. He is the only player in Pride history to compile over 1,500 points, 600 rebounds, 300 assists and 150 steals in a career.

ANTHONY GRANT, Hofstra

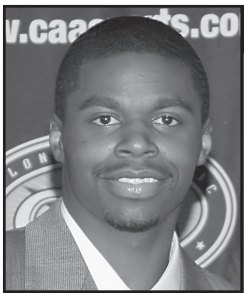

MATT JANNING, Northeastern

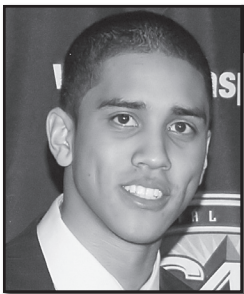

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHAZ CRAWFORD, Drexel

Chaz Crawford became the fourth Drexel player in the past six years to earn CAA Defensive Player of the Year honors. The 6-foot-10 senior led the league and ranked 10th nationally with 3.0 blocked shots per game, and he was also the CAA's leading rebounder with 9.3 rpg. Crawford's 94 blocks were the 7th-highest season total in league history and he ranks second on the CAA's all-time blocks chart with 318.

George Mason senior guard Gabe Norwood was selected as the recipient of the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, which is presented annually to a basketball player who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship through his academic and athletic achievement. Norwood was a four-year letterman and team captain for the Patriots. He saw action in all 33 games as a senior, contributing 3.6 ppg and dishing out 58 assists.

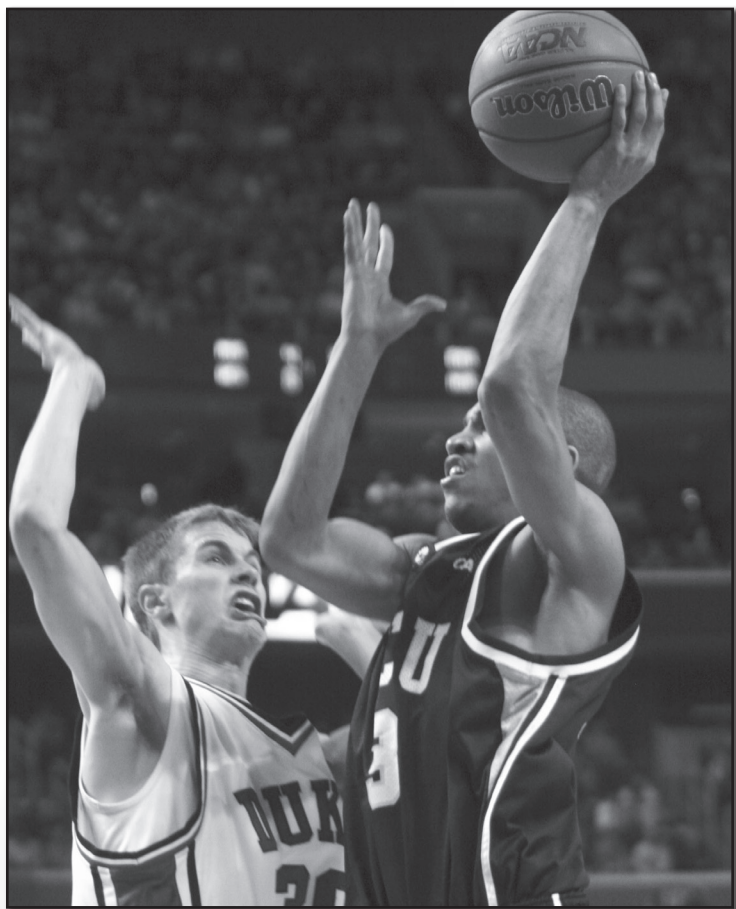

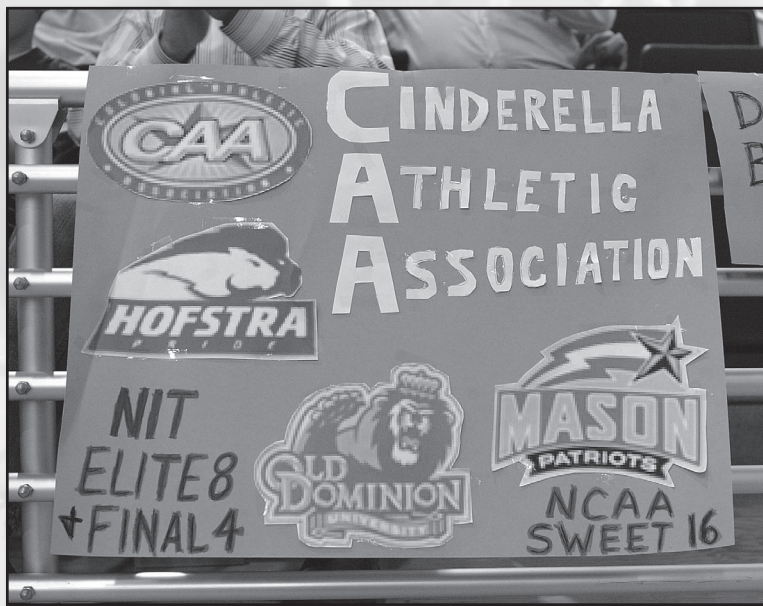
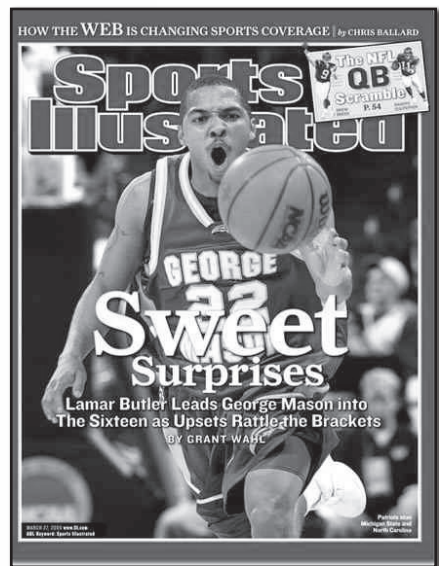
21 DAYS OF MADNESS

The 2006 post-season was unquestionably the finest in CAA men's basketball history. Four teams – George Mason, Hofstra, UNC Wilmington and Old Dominion - advanced to post-season play and the conference made its mark on the national scene. The Patriots became the first CAA team to advance to the NCAA Final Four, the Monarchs were the first league member to reach the NIT semifinals and the Pride made the quarterfinals of the NIT. Here is a look at that incredible 21-day stretch of Madness.

MARCH 11 – SELECTION SUNDAY - Four CAA men's basketball teams receive post-season berths for the second year in a row. CAA champion UNC Wilmington earns a #9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, which is the highest for a CAA team since 1986. George Mason becomes the CAA's first at-large selection in 20 years and is awarded a #11 seed. The conference also places two teams in the NIT with Hofstra getting a #3 seed and Old Dominion a #5 seed in the same region.

MARCH 15 – Behind a career-high tying 28 points from senior guard Isaiah Hunter and 16 from forward Arnaud Dahi, Old Dominion never trails and posts an impressive 79-61 road victory at Colorado in the first round of the NIT. The Monarchs led by just four at the break, but drained 5-of-6 from three-point range and made 19-of-24 at the free throw line in the second half to blow the game open. It was the first time that ODU had won a first-round NIT game on the road.

MARCH 16 – Junior Loren Stokes scored a team-high 23 points and backcourt mate Antoine Agudio added 21 as Hofstra cruised past Nebraska 73-62 for its first post-season victory in school history. The Pride broke open a tie game with an 11-0 run late in the first half and never let the Huskers get closer than eight after that. UNC Wilmington dropped a heartbreaking 88-85 overtime decision to George Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. The Seahawks hit 11 of their first 13 shots in the second half to open a 64-48 lead, but the Colonials responded with a 19-0 run. In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 10 ties, UNCW led by four in overtime before GW scored the final seven points. Junior guard T.J. Carter poured in a team-high 25 points to pace the Seahawks.



MARCH 17 – George Mason won its first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off 6th-seeded Michigan State 75-65 in Dayton, Ohio. Sophomore guard Folarin Campbell scored a team-high 21 points on perfect 8-for-8 FG shooting and forward Will Thomas posted a double-double with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mason was ahead just 52-51 with 6:41 to go, but reeled off 10 unanswered points and never let the Spartans get closer than six the rest of the way.

MARCH 19 – George Mason became the first CAA team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 1988 with a 65-60 upset of 3rd-seeded North Carolina in Dayton, Ohio. The Patriots fell behind 16-2 early, but rallied to within 27-20 at the break and scored the first eight points of the second half to grab the lead. Senior Lamar Butler, who tallied 16 of his team-high 18 points in the second half, hit two free throws to give Mason a 56-54 lead with 2:52 to go and nailed a key jumper with 1:06 left. The Patriots made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds to seal the win.

MARCH 20 – Hofstra and Old Dominion become the first CAA teams to ever advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT as the Pride pulls out a 77-75 overtime victory at Saint Joseph's and the Monarchs hold off Manhattan 70-66. Senior forward Aurimas Kieza's layup with 19 seconds to go in overtime was the game-winner for the Pride, who got 24 points from Antoine Agudio and 22 from Loren Stokes. ODU guard Brandon Johnson and forward Valdas Vasylius each nailed a pair of free throws in the final 11 seconds to preserve the Monarchs' win over Manhattan. Senior forward Alex Loughton scored a team-high 20 points and grabbed nine boards.



MARCH 22 – Before a national television audience on ESPN 2, Old Dominion defeated Hofstra 61-51 to move on to the NIT semifinals for the first time. The Pride, which had their 21-game home court winning streak snapped, led 30-24 at the break and upped the margin to eight early in the second half. The Monarchs rallied behind senior Isaiah Hunter, who scored 19 of his career-high 29 points in the second half, including back-to-back treys that gave ODU its first lead with 9:05 left. Hofstra was within two with 2:15 to go but didn't score the rest of the way and the Monarchs sealed the win by making 8-of-10 free throws.

MARCH 24 – George Mason led from start to finish in beating 7th-seeded Wichita State 63-55 in the NCAA Regional Semifinals in Washington, D.C. The Patriots opened the game on a 9-0 run with a 3-pointer by Lamar Butler and back-to-back treys from Folarin Campbell. Mason went on to bury 7-of-11 from beyond the arc in the first half and led 35-19 at the break. The Patriots pushed the margin to 19 with 17:21 left and never let the Shockers get closer than seven. Campbell finished with 16 points, while Butler and Tony Skinn added 14.

MARCH 26 – George Mason became the first team in CAA history to advance to the NCAA Final Four, shocking top-seeded Connecticut 86-84 in overtime in Washington, D.C. The Patriots trailed by nine at the break, but shot 56% in the second half, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to stage a remarkable comeback. Mason grabbed its first lead, 52-51, on a Lamar Butler trey with 11:10 to go and was up 74-70 with 18 seconds left in regulation after a pair of Butler free throws. UConn forced overtime with a layup at the buzzer, but the Patriots made 5-of-6 from the floor and never trailed in overtime. Mason went ahead 86-81 with 25 seconds to go, but had to survive

a missed 3-point attempt by the Huskies as the horn sounded. Five Patriots scored in double figures, led by senior forward Jai Lewis with 20 points and Butler with 19. Will Thomas recorded his second straight double-double with 19 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.

MARCH 28 – Old Dominion struggled offensively and fell 66-43 to top-seeded Michigan in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden. The Monarchs were down 21-14 with 12:14 left in the first half, but didn't score for the rest of the period. Sophomore Brian Henderson nailed three straight 3-pointers to bring ODU within 35-33 early in the second half, but the Monarchs could never move ahead. Henderson finished with a team-high 11 points and Drew Williamson added 10.

APRIL 1 – George Mason's Cinderella season came to an end as the Patriots lost to eventual national champion Florida 73-57 in the national semifinals in Indianapolis, Ind. Mason was down just 31-26 at halftime, but the Gators hit three straight treys to open the second period and never let Mason any closer than nine the rest of the way. Seniors Tony Skinn and Jai Lewis each scored 13 points for the Patriots, who were the first mid-major squad since 1979 and the first #11 seed since 1986 to reach the Final Four. Mason would finish the 2005-06 season ranked #8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest national ranking ever for a CAA team.





NCAA SHOCKERS

Prior to George Mason's run to the Final Four in 2006, the CAA was known as a giant killer for pulling some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The list of CAA victims reads like a "Who's Who" of college basketball – Georgetown, Syracuse and Villanova from the Big East, Auburn, LSU and South Carolina from the SEC, Ohio State and Indiana from the Big 10, Southern California from the Pac 10 and Georgia Tech from the ACC. The tradition continued last season as VCU upset perennial national power Duke. Since 1981, CAA squads have posted 17 wins over higher-seeded teams and 20 victories overall. Here's a brief look at the "bracket busters":

1981

#10 James Madison 61, #7 Georgetown 55

James Madison makes its first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance and defeats Georgetown 61-55 in Providence, R.I. Linton Townes, Charles Fisher and Steve Blackmon combined for 45 points in the victory. Two days later, the Dukes appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time, but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

1982

#9 James Madison 55, #8 Ohio State 48

The Dukes receive an at-large bid and defeat Ohio State, 55-48, in Charlotte, N.C. The Dukes scored 14 straight points in the second half and overcame an eight-point deficit. Dan Ruland scored 18 points and Linton Townes added 12 points and nine rebounds. JMU lost to eventual national champion North Carolina, 52-50 in the second round.

1983

#10 James Madison 57, #7 West Virginia 50

JMU records a first-round win for the third consecutive season, beating West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C.. Charles Fisher scored a team-high 13 points, including the 1,000 point of his career, to lead the Dukes. JMU lost to North Carolina in the second round for the second straight season.

1984

#12 Richmond 72, #5 Auburn 71

After defeating Rider 89-65 at the Palestra to make the field of 48, the Spiders got 26 points from John Newman and shocked Auburn 72-71 in the NCAA first round in Charlotte, N.C. Bill Flye added 19 points for UR, which overcame a 23-point, 17-rebound effort by future NBA star Charles Barkley.

1985

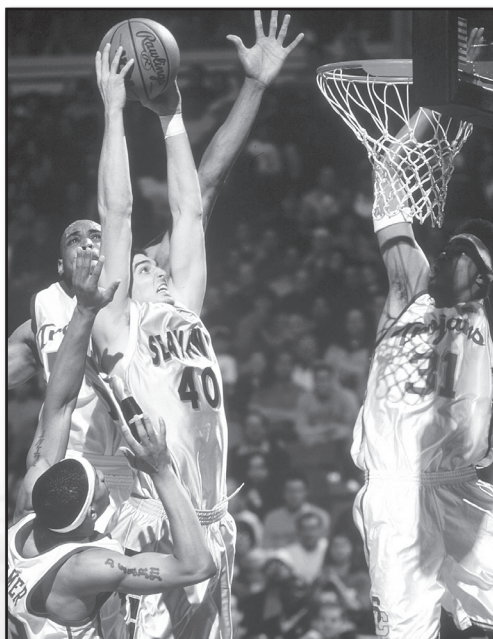
#13 Navy 78, #4 Louisiana State 55

For the fifth consecutive season, an ECAC-South member pulls the first round upset. Vernon Butler pours in a team-high 20 points and David Robinson grabs 18 rebounds as Navy thrashes LSU 78-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

1986

#7 Navy 97, #2 Syracuse 85

After getting 30 points and 12 rebounds in a first-round win over Tulsa, CAA Player of the Year David Robinson tallies 35 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocks as Navy dominates Syracuse 97-85 on its home court at the Carrier Dome to reach the Sweet 16. The Middies then sink #14-seed Cleveland State 71-70 on a Robinson one-hander in the lane with five seconds left to earn a berth in the Elite 8. Navy falls to Duke in the Regional finals.

1988

#13 Richmond 72, #4 Indiana 69

Richmond held Indiana scoreless for the last 2:40 and knocked the defending national champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 triumph in Hartford, Conn. Rodney Rice scored a team-high 21 points, including a jumper with less than a minute to play that put the Spiders ahead to stay.

#13 Richmond 59, #5 Georgia Tech 55

Richmond earned its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16 as Peter Woolfolk tallied 27 points and nine rebounds in a 59-55 upset of Georgia Tech. The Spiders' defense limited the high-scoring Yellow Jackets to 5-of-22 shooting from 3-point range.

1991

#15 Richmond 73, #2 Syracuse 69

In what the Washington Post calls "one of the greatest upsets in college basketball history," Richmond becomes the first #15 seed to drop a #2 seed with a 73-69 win over Syracuse in Col-

lege Park, Md. The Spiders never trailed and sealed the game when freshman Eugene Burroughs hit two free throws with 21 seconds left. Curtis Blair scored a team-high 18 points and Terry Connolly added 14 points off the bench.

1995

#14 Old Dominion 89, #3 Villanova 81 (3 OT)

In perhaps the most exciting game in conference history, the Monarchs survive three overtimes and defeat Kerry Kittles and Big East champion Villanova, 89-81. CAA Player of the Year Petey Sessoms scores a career-high tying 35 points, including seven in the third OT. Before the night is over, most of the 15,100 fans in Albany's Knickerbocker Arena are chanting "O-D-U."

1998

#14 Richmond 62, #3 South Carolina 61

The Spiders freshened their image as NCAA Tournament upset specialists with a 62-61 win over South Carolina in Washington, D.C. Richmond gets 24 points from CAA Player of the Year Jarod Stevenson and holds the Gamecocks scoreless over the final 1:16 for the victory.

2002

#13 UNC Wilmington 93, #4 Southern Cal 89 (ot)

UNC Wilmington pulls the biggest upset in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, defeating Southern Cal 93-89 in overtime. Six Seahawks score in double figures, including senior reserve Stewart Hare who punctuates the victory with a mammoth two-handed dunk in the final minute. It's the first NCAA Tournament win for UNCW and the school's first victory over a ranked opponent.

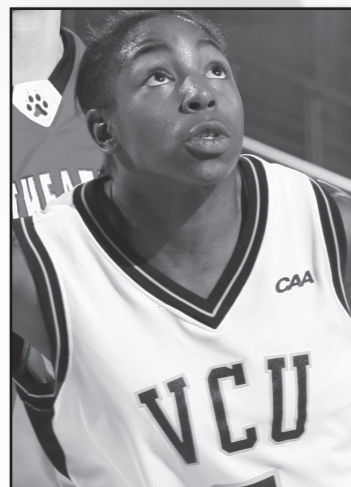
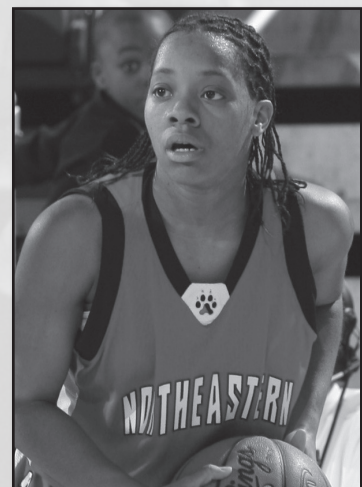
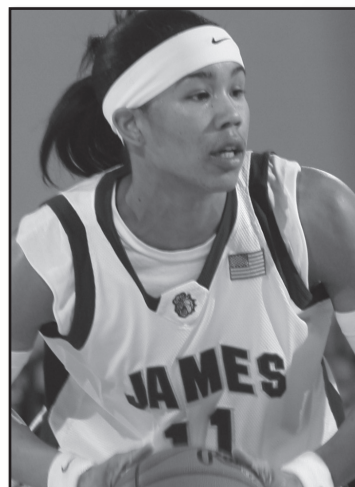
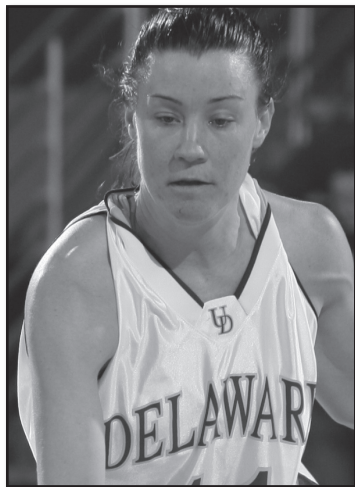
2007

#11 VCU 79, #6 Duke 77

Eric Maynor scores a team-high 22 points, including a 15-foot jumper with 1.8 seconds left, as VCU rallies for a 79-77 victory over Duke in Buffalo, N.Y. The Rams trail by seven with eight minutes remaining before grabbing a 72-71 lead on a Jesse Pellot-Rosa jumper. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for VCU since 1985. The Rams rally from a 19-point deficit to force overtime against Pitt in the NCAA second round before suffering an 84-79 setback.

Old Dominion will aim for its 17th straight CAA Championship.

RETURNING TALENT: Seven of the 15 members from last year's All-CAA teams will return for the 2007-08 season. Three of the five first-team honorees are back: Old Dominion's TJ Jordan, William & Mary's Kyra Kaylor and James Madison's Tamera Young.

TOP STATISTICAL LEADERS RETURN: The CAA should be loaded once again as the conference welcomes back 13 of its top 20 scorers from last season. Also back are 12 of the CAA's top 20 in rebounding and 10 of the top 15 in assists and steals.



Tamera Young and the Dukes have won 26 consecutive home games.

ODU CAPTURES 16TH STRAIGHT CAA TITLE:

Old Dominion edged James Madison 78-70 in another thrilling title game to capture its NCAA record 16th consecutive CAA championship. The Lady Monarchs have never lost a CAA Tournament game since joining the league back in 1991-92. With the win, ODU advanced to its 24th NCAA Tournament, which ranks as the third-most appearances in Division I behind only Tennessee and Louisiana Tech. The Lady Monarchs have won 20 or more games during all 16 seasons as a CAA member.

CAA MAKING HISTORY:

For the first time in CAA history, three women's basketball teams advanced to the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Old Dominion, which earned the CAA's automatic bid, was joined by James Madison and Delaware in the field of 64. Hofstra represented the CAA in the

Women's National Invitation Tournament, which marked the third straight season the CAA had four women's basketball teams advance to postseason play. The Lady Monarchs made their 16th straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 24th overall. James Madison made its seventh NCAA appearance, but first since 1996--the last time the CAA had more than one team in the NCAA Women's Tournament. Delaware made its second trip to the "Big Dance" which was its first since winning the America East automatic bid in 2002. Hofstra made its second straight appearance in the WNIT. Hofstra advanced to the quarterfinals of the WNIT with wins over Seton Hall and South Carolina. The Pride fell to Western Kentucky, 72-54, in the quarterfinals.

CAA NO. 9 IN FINAL RPI RANKING:

The CAA was ranked ninth among the nations Division I conferences in the final NCAA RPI. Old Dominion led the CAA ranked #23, while James Madison followed at #26. Delaware was ranked #34 and Hofstra closed out the four CAA women's basketball teams in the top 48 at #48.

EIGHT STRONG:

Eight CAA women's basketball teams finished the 2006-07 season with a winning record for the first time in conference history. Four teams completed the season with single-digit losses.

FOUR TEAMS WITH AT LEAST 24 WINS:

For the first time in CAA women's history, four teams recorded 24 or more wins last season. James Madison completed the season with a 27-6 mark, Delaware finished with a 26-6 record, Old Dominion went 24-9, while Hofstra wrapped the season up with a 26-8 record.

HOME SWEET HOME:

James Madison completed the regular season with an impressive 13-0 mark at home. The Dukes extended their home court winning streak to 26 games, which is the longest current home winning streak in the nation. The streak dates back to the 2005-06 season, when the Dukes also posted a 13-0 record at home.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

Hofstra stood among the top with 13 true road wins in

2006-07. The Pride tied two other Division I women's basketball teams, including Tennessee and Coppin State.

TV EXPOSURE: CAA women's basketball increased its television exposure with 17 games on the air last season. All 12 teams made at least one television appearance.

2007-08 DEAL WITH THE AMERICA CHANNEL: Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner Tom Yeager announced that the league has entered into an agreement with The America Channel, which will provide live television coverage of a minimum of 18 women's basketball games and several other CAA Championships beginning in the 2007-08 academic year. The America Channel® is a new programming network that will explore and celebrate our communities, campuses, real heroes, and ordinary people who accomplish the extraordinary. The America Channel's SportsLife™ initiative merges life and sport – combining broadcast of over 200 NCAA sports games and matches, with real-life drama about the aspirations, achievements, challenges, adventures, community service, and lifestyles of students and student athletes from numerous NCAA conferences.

MAJORITY OF STARTERS RETURN: CAA teams return 55% (33-of-60) of their starting line-ups from a season ago. Drexel, George Mason, Northeastern, Towson and William & Mary only lost one starter from the 2006-07 season. UNC Wilmington and VCU, which both had all five starters back a year ago, return three starters this season.

TOP 10 IN THE NATION: Old Dominion's TJ Jordan averaged 3.1 three-point field goals per game which ranked her fourth nationally at the completion of the 2006-07 season. Georgia State's Brittany Hollins finished the season ranked fifth in steals, averaging 3.3 per outing.



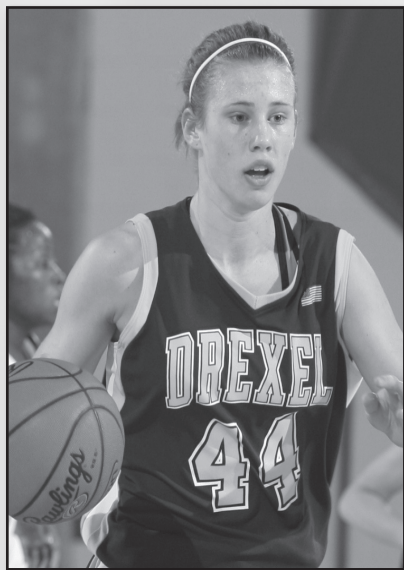

2007-08 CAA TEAM OUTLOOKS

DELAWARE

Delaware continued its tremendous run of success under head coach Tina Martin, posting its seventh 20-win campaign (26-6) in the past eight years and earning its sixth postseason trip since 2001 with an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament. The Blue Hens face the difficult task of replacing four starters. The lone returnee to the starting five is senior forward Courtney Irving, who averaged 7.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game last season. UD also welcomes back senior guard Kyle DeHaven, who scored 8.5 ppg and was named to the CAA All-Defensive Team a year ago after leading the Blue Hens and ranking among national leaders with 3.2 steals per game. Delaware will also look for sophomore center Farrah Ferguson, who averaged 2.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and one blocked shot per game in her rookie campaign, to add depth in the frontcourt for the Blue Hens this season.

DREXEL

Drexel looks to rebound this season as head coach Denise Dillon returns 13 letterwinners, including four starters, from last year's 10-21 squad. The Dragons feature one of the conference's top outside shooters in senior guard Narissa Suber, who already owns the Drexel records for three-pointers made in a game, season and career (243). Suber, who averaged 12.5 ppg, last year, could become the CAA's all-time treys leader. She will be joined in the backcourt by senior Andrea Peterson (4.9

ppg). Leading the Dragons up front is sophomore forward Gabriela Marginean, who earned CAA Rookie of the Year honors last season thanks to her team-best 16.6 points and 8.2 rebounds per contest. Also returning to the starting lineup will be Narissa's twin sister Anora Suber, who scored nearly five points per game. Drexel also welcomes back junior forward Nicole Hester, who was injured in 2006-07, but tallied 8.0 ppg and 5.1 rpg as a sophomore.

GEORGE MASON

Head coach Debbie Taneyhill is confident that George Mason will be much improved in 2007-08 as the Patriots return four starters. Mason's top returnee is senior guard Lateisha Wade, who led the Patriots in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (2.5 apg) and steals in 2006-07. Wade was the team's top scorer in 15 of their 29 contests. She will be joined in the backcourt by senior Casey Quigley, who chipped in 7.8 points per contest. There is also plenty of experience in the frontcourt. Senior Moni Akintunde is a two-year starter who tallied 9.3 points and a team-high 6.5 rebounds per game last season. The Patriots also have 6-foot-1 junior Jessica Smith back in the post where she contributed 4.0 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. Providing depth is junior wing Whitney Ward, who averaged 4.2 points per game off the bench.

GEORGIA STATE

Eight letterwinners are back for a Georgia State squad that posted a solid 15-15 overall mark last year. Veteran head coach Lea Henry welcomes back two key starters. Junior guard Brittany Hollins scored 10.1 points per game, dished out a team-high 157 assists and made a league-best 98 steals to secure a spot on the CAA All-Defensive team last season. She ranked fifth in Division I with 3.3 steals per outing. Also back in the starting lineup is sophomore forward Danyiel McKeller, who scored 8.4 points per game and is among the returning league leaders in rebounds after grabbing 6.3 per game as a freshman. Providing depth in the frontcourt is sophomore RaShay Rawls, who contributed 4.6 points and 6.1 rebounds per game off the bench and senior Vatai Smith, who tallied 3.0 ppg. The Panthers are expecting several newcomers to make an immediate impact.

HOFSTRA

Hofstra is coming off its most successful season in school history, posting a 26-8 overall record and earning its second straight trip to the WNIT. The Pride advanced to the quarterfinals of the WNIT with victories over Seton Hall and South Carolina. Head coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey welcomes back seven letterwinners from that squad, but just one starter in point guard Niki Williams. The junior contributed 4.6 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game last season and will take on more of a leadership role. Sophomore guard Sam Brigham, who earned CAA All-Rookie honors in 2006-07, will likely move into the starting lineup after contributing 4.4 ppg off the bench. The Pride will look for increased production from its only senior guard India Ali, junior guard Natty Fripp (2.6 ppg) and senior forward Linn Quamme. Several newcomers will need to make an impact as the Pride looks to replace four double-digit scorers.

JAMES MADISON

James Madison is coming off a sensational 27-6 season that included a Top 25 national ranking and the team's first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1996. Head coach Kenny Brooks, who garnered CAA Coach of the Year honors last season, will have to replace four starters but can still build around two-time first team All-CAA guard Tamera Young. The senior averaged 16.5 points and 8.0 rebounds per game and also led the team in steals with 68. She is on pace to become JMU's all-time leading scorer. Senior forward Jennifer Brown, who averaged 5.0 points and 5.4 rebounds per outing off the bench a year ago, will step into a more prominent role. Also back is junior forward Kisha Stokes, who chipped in 2.6 ppg and 3.2 rpg. Likely joining Young in the backcourt will be senior guard Jasmin Lawrence, who averaged 2.9 ppg.



UNC WILMINGTON

Head coach Ann Hancock is hoping to move UNC Wilmington up the conference standings with the return of six letterwinners, including three starters, from a squad that went 8-23 overall last season. Junior forward Sahsha Taylor is back to lead the Seahawks after averaging 12.4 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. She was tops on the team in scoring nine times last season. Redshirt sophomore guard Candace Walker, who averaged 6.6 ppg and 4.9 rpg as a freshman, returns to the court after missing the 2006-07 season due to an injury. UNCW has a pair of guards returning to the starting lineup with sophomore Greta Luksyte, who averaged 6.8 points and 2.7 rebounds per game, and junior Shade Smith, who contributed 3.8 points and 3.1 rebounds per outing. The Seahawks also welcome back one of their top reserves in senior guard Stephanie Fernald, who tallied seven points per game. Five newcomers should also battle for playing time.

NORTHEASTERN

Four of five starters are back at Northeastern, which should make strides in the second season under the direction of head coach Daynia La-Force Mann. Three of the four starters averaged double-digit scoring figures last season. Senior guards Shaleyse Smallwood was a third-team All-CAA selection after pouring in 16.0 ppg and dishing out a team-best 4.1 assists per game. Senior guard Lucia Pablos added 13.5 ppg and scored nearly 15 points per game in league play. Also back is junior guard Ashlee Feldman (12.7 ppg), who led the conference in free throw shooting (90.2%) for the second consecutive season and ranked third in the CAA a year ago with 72 three-pointers. Up front, Northeastern returns senior forward Stefanie Hodell, who led the Huskies and was among conference leaders with 8.8 boards per game last year. Providing depth off the bench is forward Kendra Walton, who averaged 5.7 ppg as a freshman.

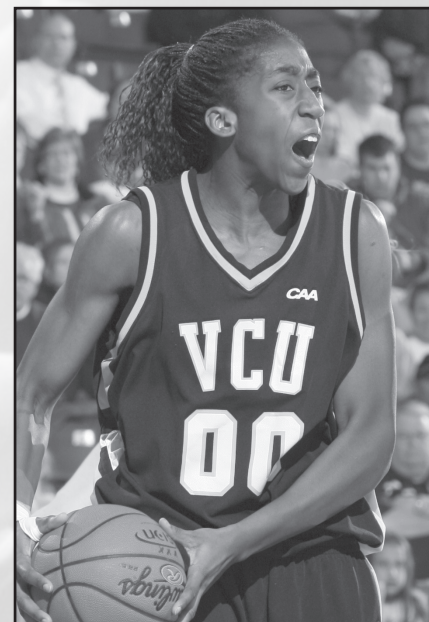

She will be joined in the backcourt by juniors Jazzmin Walters (5.2 ppg/3.1 apg) and Jen Nuzzo. ODU is loaded up front with size and experience. Junior forward Tiffany Green, who scored 8.4 ppg and grabbed a team-best 6.0 rebounds, is the top returnee. Also back are 6-foot-4 senior center Tamera Ransburg (7.7 ppg, 5.6 rpg), senior forward Shahida Williams (7.1 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and senior center Megan Pym (2.7 ppg, 3.0 rpg).

TOWSON

Head coach Joe Mathews returns 10 letterwinners, including four starters, from a Towson team that put together an impressive 17-12 overall mark. Sophomore guard Shanae Baker-Brice, a CAA All-Rookie selection a year ago, led the Tigers in scoring with 13.7 points per game and contributed 91 assists and 76 steals. Senior guard Holly Mahan scored double digits (10.1 ppg), topped the team in rebounding (7.4 rpg) and also led Towson in steals (2.86 spg). Back to run the offense is junior point guard Alis Freeman, who scored 5.1 ppg and dished out a team-high 111 assists. Senior Jamell Beasley, who chipped in 8.8 ppg, can provide offense off the bench. Sophomore forward Kandace Davis is the top returning player up front after contributing 5.0 points and 5.1 rebounds per game. Sophomore forward Ashlee Keown made nine starts in her rookie campaign and could be a regular this year.

VCU

VCU is looking to maintain the momentum from last year's 17-13 season that included a 9-9 CAA mark. Head coach Beth Cunningham welcomes back 10 letterwinners, including three starters. The Rams have one of the league's top frontcourts with senior forward Krystal Vaughn and junior center Quanitra Hollingsworth, who both made the All-CAA second team. Vaughn led VCU in scoring with 15.6 ppg and also grabbed 6.8 rpg.

Hollingsworth added 13.7 points and a team-best 9.4 rebounds per contest while making better than 53 percent of her shots from the floor. Sophomore forward D'Andra Moss, who averaged 6.4 points and 3.2 rebounds per game a year ago, will add depth up front. Senior guard LaKea Jones is the top returnee in the backcourt after scoring 6.0 ppg and distributing a team-best 119 assists. Sophomore La'Tavia Rorie (3.7 ppg, 2.9 rpg) and senior Brittany Pinkney (3.4 ppg, 2.3 rpg) will provide depth in the backcourt.

WILLIAM & MARY

William and Mary is coming off one of the most successful seasons in the program's history, going 19-12 overall and finishing fifth in the CAA with a 10-8 mark. Four starters, including a trio of double-digit scorers, are back for head coach Debbie Taylor. Senior forward Kyra Kaylor led the Tribe in scoring (14.8 ppg) and rebounding (9.2 rpg) to earn first team All-CAA accolades for the second year in a row. Senior wing Devin James had a breakout year in 2006-07, contributing 12.7 points and 6.7 rebounds per game. W&M will also get a lift from the return of junior forward Dani Kell (12.6 ppg), who returns after missing the final 13 games due to an injury. Rounding out the returning starters is forward Tiffany Benson, who received CAA All-Rookie honors after tallying 5.7 ppg and 5.9 rpg while ranking among league leaders in blocked shots (2.2 bpg).

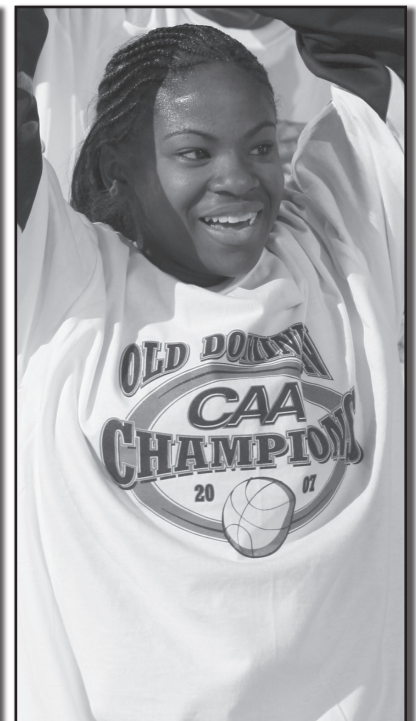

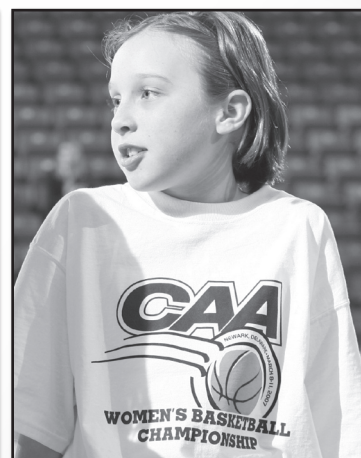

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

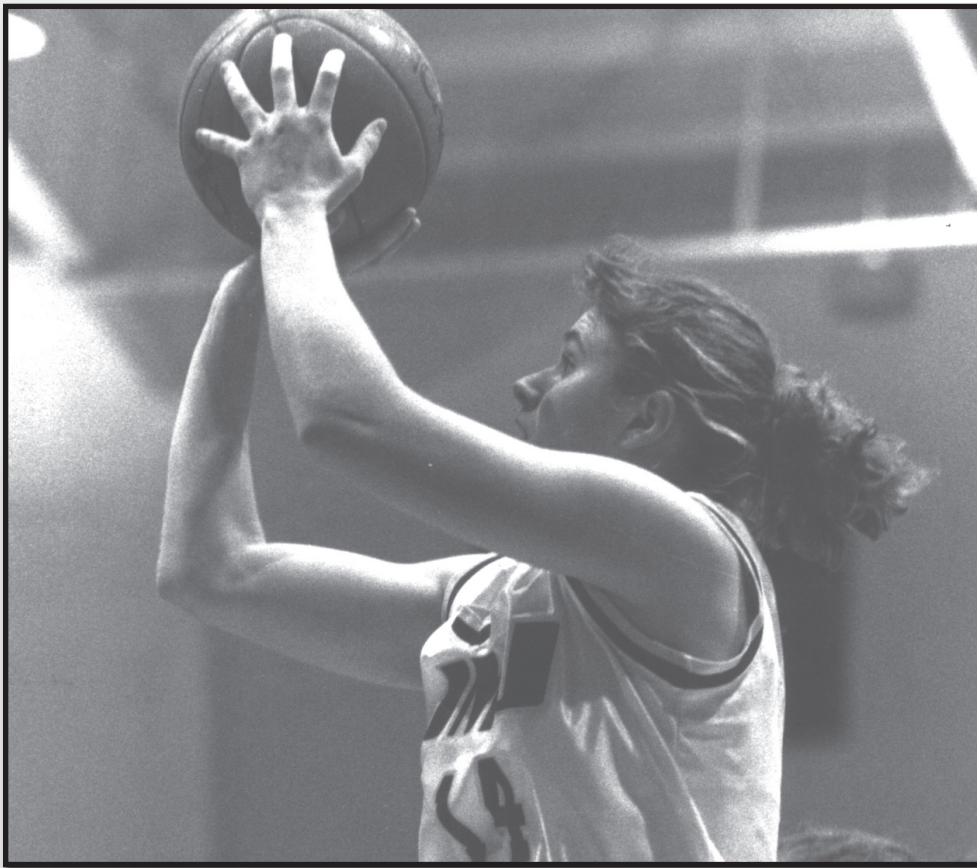

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

MEREDITH ALEXIS, James Madison

James Madison senior center Meredith Alexis was named the CAA Player of the Year after averaging 18.4 points and a league-best 11.6 rebounds per game. She became the conference's all-time leading rebounder with 1,313 and set new all-time marks at JMU for points (1,760), double-doubles (63) and double-figure rebounding games (75). Alexis is the first CAA Player of the Year from JMU since Sydney Beasley in 1988.



COACH OF THE YEAR

KENNY BROOKS, James Madison

James Madison's Kenny Brooks was voted CAA Coach of the Year after guiding the Dukes to a school-record 27 regular-season wins, including a 16-2 mark in conference play. He also led his team to a four-week appearance in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. James Madison completed the regular season with an impressive 13-0 mark at home. In addition, the Dukes extended their home court winning streak to 26 games, which is the longest current home winning streak in the nation, dating back to the 2005-2006 season. The Coach of the Year honor is the first for Brooks.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

GABRIELA MARGINEAN, Drexel

Drexel forward Gabriela Marginean earned CAA Rookie of the Year honors after leading the Dragons in scoring and was fourth in the CAA with 16.6 points per contest. She was in the top eight in rebounding (8.2 rpg) and registered double-figures in all but five games, including her stunning 47-point performance in a five-overtime victory. Marginean is the first Drexel player to garner CAA Rookie of the Year accolades since Catherine Scanlon in 2003.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

TYRESA SMITH, Delaware

Senior guard Tyresa Smith was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season after ranking among the league's best in steals (2.6 spg) and blocked shots. She also was among the top 15 in the conference in rebounding (7.5 rpg), scoring (19.8 ppg), field goal percentage (.441) and free throw percentage (.732). Smith made six or more steals three times this season.



DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

LESLEY DICKINSON, James Madison

James Madison senior guard Lesley Dickinson received the prestigious Dean Ehlers Leadership Award. The Ehlers Award is presented annually to the women's basketball student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship through her academic and athletic achievement." Dickinson, who became the first JMU player to receive the award, averaged 10.8 points per game and shot 88 percent from the line. She holds the JMU all-time career free-throw record with 447 and is second with 1,616 career points.

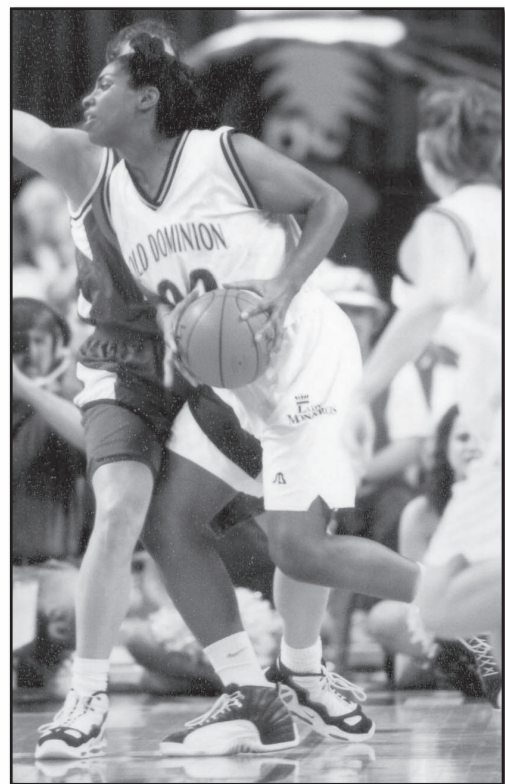

POSTSEASON RESULTS

For the first time in CAA history, three women's basketball teams advanced to the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Old Dominion, which earned the CAA's automatic bid, was joined by James Madison and Delaware in the field of 64. Hofstra represented the CAA in the Women's National Invitation Tournament, which marked the third straight season the CAA had four women's basketball teams advance to postseason play. The Lady Monarchs made their 16th straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 24th overall. James Madison made its seventh NCAA appearance, but first since 1996--the last time the CAA had more than one team in the NCAA Women's Tournament. Delaware made its second trip to the "Big Dance" which was its first since winning the America East automatic bid in 2002. Hofstra made its second straight appearance in the WNIT. Hofstra advanced to the quarterfinals of the WNIT with wins over Seton Hall and South Carolina. The Pride fell to Western Kentucky, 72-54, in the quarterfinals.

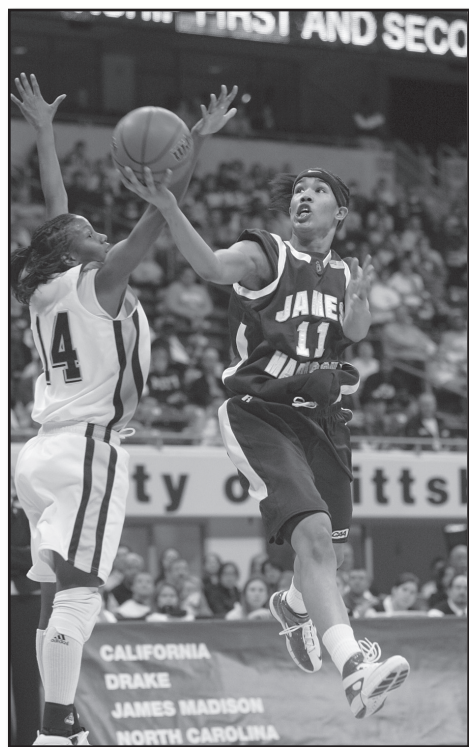
