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Colonial Athletic Association founded 1985

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Tom Yeager is in his 24th year as the only commissioner to lead the Colonial Athletic Association. Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has spearheaded the addition of six new members since 2000, transforming what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a conference with a presence in virtually all of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. Those additions have positioned the CAA in five of the nation's top nine media markets from Boston to Atlanta while enhancing the league's reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past three years, with 22 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths. Two CAA men's basketball teams have made the NCAA Tournament field in two of the past three years, with George Mason reaching the Final Four in 2006. The CAA placed a league-record three teams in the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship in 2007.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Sears Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. In 2007-08, the CAA honored more than 1,700 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 18 members of his staff.

Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. He recently completed a three-year term as chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and is a member of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year.

Yeager, 58, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

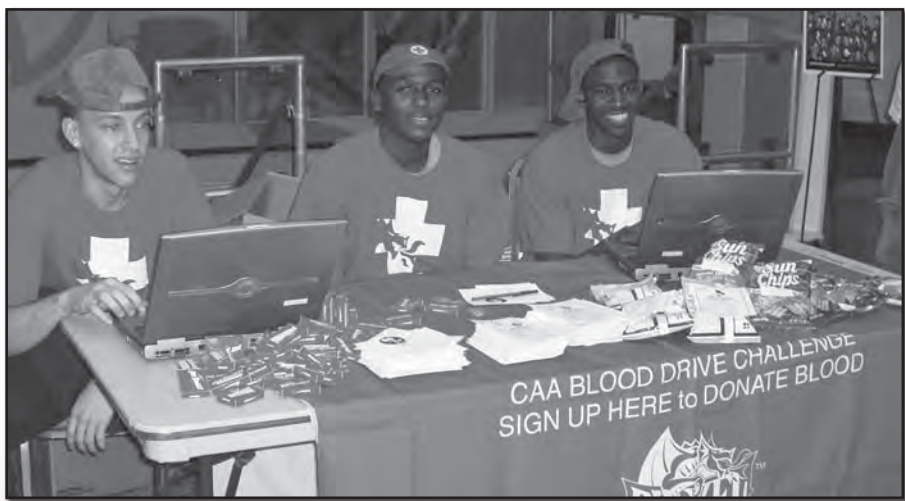


COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

With more than two decades of success athletically and academically, the Colonial Athletic Association has established a reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

The CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2007-08, the CAA had five ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans and more than 1,700 of our 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 26 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Atlanta (8), Washington, D.C. (9) and Baltimore (26). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.



Drexel University won the 2007 CAA Blood Challenge. The Blood Challenge resulted in 3,399 productive units of blood last year and the event has raised over 14,000 units of blood over the past six years.

THE CAA ON TELEVISION

The Colonial Athletic Association will feature its most extensive television package in league history in 2008-09. CAA action can be seen regularly on regional sports networks such as Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as CN8, the Comcast Network. The conference will also have several national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and the ESPN Regional network. Other affiliates such as MSG, FOX Sports New York, Cox Communications in Fairfax and Norfolk Va., Time-Warner Cable in Wilmington, N.C., and WSKY-TV in Hampton Roads are regular carriers of CAA Basketball.

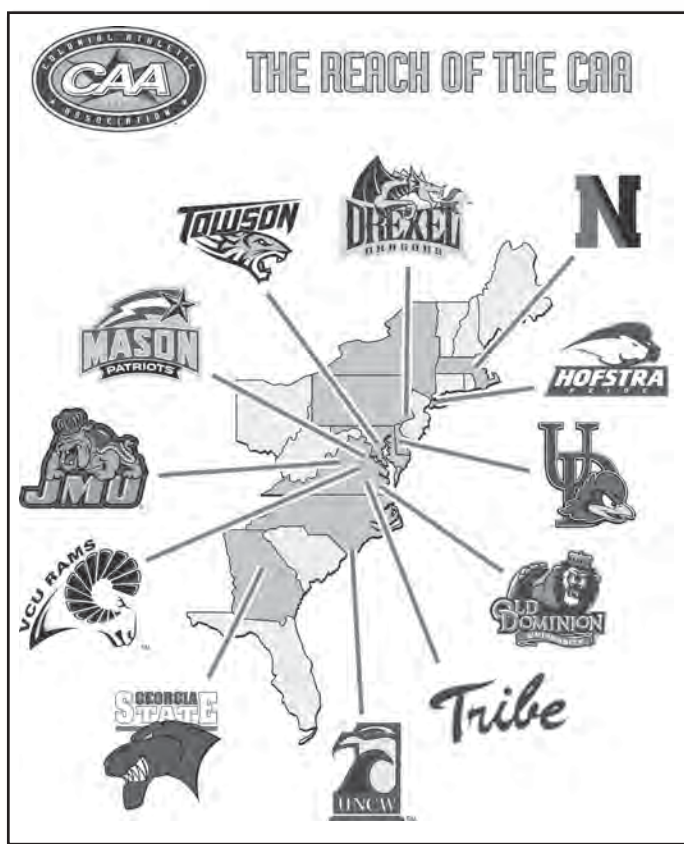

The CAA currently sponsors 22 sports with the addition of a 12-team football league in 2007. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2007-08, 26 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 46 student-athletes received All-America honors.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with at least three teams advancing to post-season play for the past five years. Last season, conference champion George Mason earned its third NCAA Tournament trip since 2001, VCU received its fourth post-season berth in five seasons with a spot in the NIT and Old Dominion reached the quarterfinals of the inaugural CBI for its fourth consecutive postseason appearance. In 2006, George Mason became the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team.

The CAA has also had at least three women's basketball teams participate in post-season play for the past three years. Perennial power Old Dominion, which has won three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997, captured its 17th consecutive



CAA title last season and reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2002. James Madison made its third consecutive post-season appearance and advanced to the third round of the WNIT, while VCU advanced to the second round of the WNIT in just its second post-season trip in school history.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. For the first time, three women's soccer teams reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2007 and at least one men's soccer team has advanced to the final 16 of the NCAA Championship in five of the last six years. Hofstra finished 15th overall at the NCAA Wrestling Championship and William & Mary placed 15th nationally in men's cross country. In baseball, the CAA had 23 players chosen in the 2008 Major League draft, which was the second-highest total in league history. Hofstra won its NCAA-record

11th-straight conference title in softball and reached the NCAA regional finals. Individually, the W&M women's tennis duo of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship in 2008 to earn All-America status for the second straight season, and Georgia State golfer Joel Sjöholm placed 13th overall at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league

added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

From all-star athletes to Nobel Prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the 12 colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.

The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all 12 universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the "best and brightest" undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 12 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. This year's conference will be held at Northeastern University. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted "visiting academic status" at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.



RESOURCE SHARING

The 12 institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools -- that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share "best practices" in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA "alternative spring break" will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the 12 institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

2008-09 CAA PREVIEW

MAJORITY OF STARTERS ARE BACK: CAA men's basketball teams return 65% of their starters from a year ago, with 10 of the league's 12 squads bringing back at least three regulars. Northeastern is the only team to welcome back its entire starting five, while Delaware, Hofstra, James Madison and Old Dominion each have four starters back. Statistically, the CAA returns five of its top 10 in scoring and rebounding.

MAYNOR HEADLINES GROUP OF ALL-CAA RETURNEES: Seven players who received all-conference recognition last season are back in 2008-09, including VCU senior guard Eric Maynor, who was the CAA Player of the Year. Maynor led the league in assists (5.5 apg) and was second in the conference in scoring (17.9 ppg). A pair of players return from the All-CAA second team – Northeastern junior guard Matt Janning and Old Dominion junior forward Gerald Lee. Janning was the league's third-leading scorer with 16.1 ppg, while Lee contributed 12.9 points and 5.8 rebounds per contest. Four of the six members of last season's All-CAA third team return – Delaware senior guard Marc Egerson (13.4 ppg/6.9 rpg), Towson senior forward Junior Hairston (12.0 ppg/8.9 rpg), James Madison senior guard Abdulai Jalloh (15.5 ppg/5.5 rpg) and Georgia State senior guard Leonard Mendez (16.0 ppg/70 3-pts).

FIVE STRAIGHT YEARS WITH AT LEAST THREE IN POST-SEASON: The CAA has sent at least three teams to post-season play for each of the past five years. Last season, the conference had three teams participate in three different tournaments. CAA champion George Mason earned an NCAA Tournament berth for the fourth time in the past decade, VCU made its fourth post-season appearance in the last five

years as a participant in the MasterCard NIT and Old Dominion reached the post-season for the fourth straight season, advancing to the quarterfinals of the inaugural College Basketball Invitational.

JMU HIRES MATT BRADY AS NEW HEAD COACH: James Madison will be the only CAA team with a new head coach this season as Matt Brady replaces Dean Keener. Brady was the head coach at Marist for the past four years, where he guided the Red Foxes to a 73-50 overall record. Under his guidance, Marist went 25-9 in 2006-07 and won its first MAAC regular-season title. Prior to coming to Marist, Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons, including a stint at Saint Joseph's from 1993-2004.



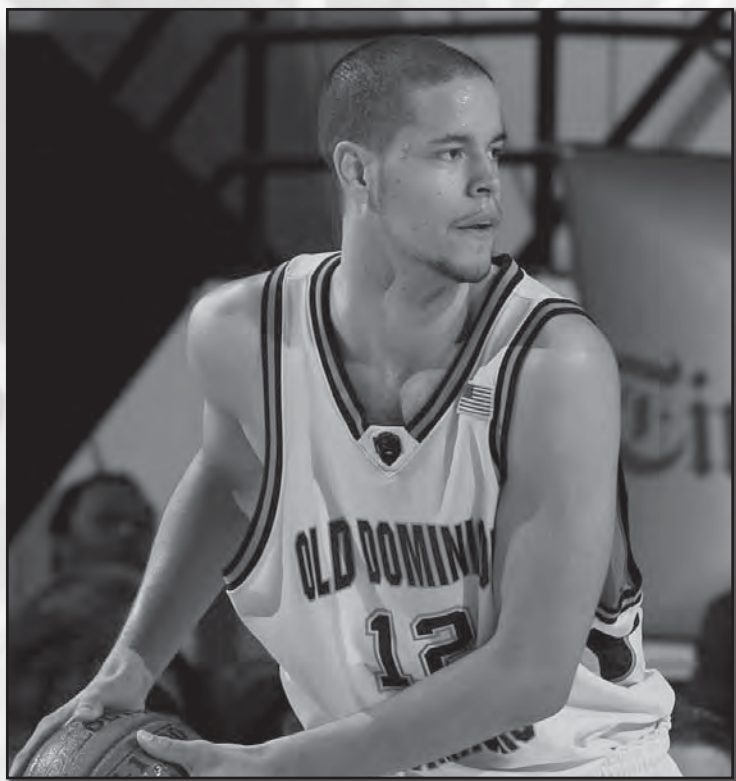

FOUR CAA TEAMS RANKED AMONG NATION'S WINNINGEST PROGRAMS: Four CAA teams rank among the top 56 Division I programs in the nation in winning percentage over the past four seasons (2005-08). VCU leads the way at #25 with a .703 winning percentage (90-38), followed by Old Dominion at #32 (.696/94-41), Hofstra at #53 (.648/81-44) and George Mason at #56 (.641/84-47). Over the past two years, VCU is ranked 12th nationally in winning percentage with its 52-15 mark (.776).

BALANCED LEAGUE: The CAA showed incredible balance last season with all 12 teams winning at least five conference games for the first time since 2001-02 when the conference only had 10 members. Seven teams finished at least .500 (9-9) in CAA play for only the second time (2003-04) in conference history.

TRANSFERS COULD MAKE MAJOR IMPACT: Eleven transfers from Division I schools will be eligible to play in the CAA this season and most are expected to make a significant impact. Georgia State will add five transfers, while Towson has three and Delaware, UNC Wilmington and William & Mary each have one.

VCU, MASON AMONG TOP 60 IN FINAL NCAA RPI: A pair of CAA teams were ranked among the top 60 in the final NCAA RPI last season. VCU was the top conference team at #54, while George Mason was close behind at #59. The CAA was ranked #13 among the nation's 31 Division I conferences. Both squads were also ranked in the final CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll with the Rams coming in at #10 and the Patriots at #16.

MORE ON MAYNOR: VCU senior guard Eric Maynor will try to put the finishing touches on what has already been an outstanding career. The 2007-08 CAA Player of the Year was one of 16 finalists for the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top collegiate point guard last season and earned honorable mention All-America accolades from the Associated Press. He was also named to the NABC District 4 first team, the CollegiateInsider Mid-Major All-America squad and the CollegeHoops.net High Major All-America second team.

FANS FLOCK TO CAA TOURNAMENT: For the second year in a row, more than 42,000 fans attended the CAA Men's Basketball Championship at the Richmond Coliseum in Richmond, Va. A sellout crowd of 11,200 was on hand for Sunday's semifinal contests and more than 9,000 were in attendance for Monday night's championship game.



DOUBLE DIGIT STREAKS ALIVE: Three CAA players will be looking to extend impressive double-figure scoring streaks when the season gets underway. Northeastern guard Matt Janning is riding a 19-game streak of scoring double digits, while VCU guard Eric Maynor has tallied double figures in 16 straight games and Hofstra guard Charles Jenkins has a 15-game streak.

BACK FOR MORE: The CAA had four freshmen recognized nationally for their performances last season and each is hoping to build on that success. Hofstra guard Charles Jenkins, the CAA Rookie of the Year, was named to the CollegeHoops.net High Major Freshman All-America team and to CollegiateInsider's Freshman Mid-Major All-America squad. VCU forward Larry Sanders joined Jenkins on CI's Freshman All-America squad, while Delaware guard Alphonso Dawson and UNC Wilmington guard Chad Tomko received honorable mention on the CollegeHoops.net freshman All-America team.

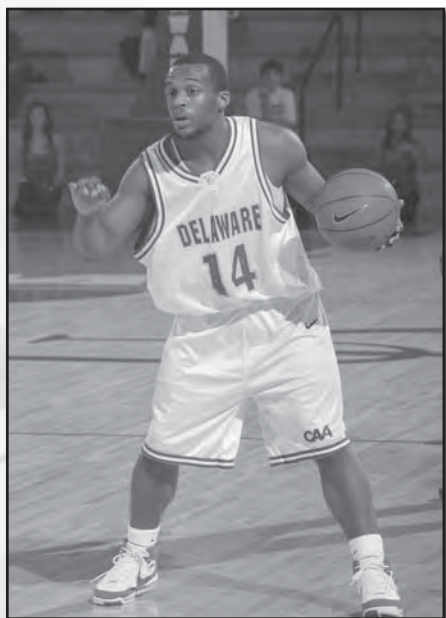

HOME SWEET HOME: Home teams posted a 71-37 (.657) record in CAA play last season, with VCU, UNC Wilmington and George Mason going 8-1. All 12 teams won at least four of their nine conference contests at home. However, VCU (7-2) and Old Dominion (5-4) were the only teams to have winning records on the road in CAA play. In non-conference action, CAA teams combined for an impressive 43-17 (.717) record on their home floors.

GREAT GROUP OF COACHES: The CAA features a tremendous group of coaches who have had a great deal of success on the hardwood. The conference's 12 coaches have combined for more than 2,200 career victories and own 127 years of head coaching experience. Six CAA coaches have 150 or more career coaching victories including three with over 400 wins—Towson's Pat Kennedy (461), William & Mary's Tony Shaver (413) and George Mason's Jim Larranaga (404).

PECORA PARTICIPATES IN OPERATION HARDWOOD: Hofstra's Tom Pecora was one of six active men's basketball coaches who visited troops in the Persian Gulf as part of Operation Hardwood V. The event featured a week-long basketball tournament and championship game with some of the best military players stationed overseas. The coaches toured military vessels and spent time with wounded service members. Also participating were Manhattan's Barry Rohrsen, DePaul's Jerry Wainwright, Dayton's Brian Gregory, Texas-Pan American's Tom Schuberth and American's Jeff Jones.

DELAWARE

Delaware made big strides in its second season under head coach Monte' Ross and the pieces are in place to continue the climb up the league standings. Leading a group of four returning starters is senior guard Marc Egerson, who earned 3rd team All-CAA honors after contributing 13.4 points and a team-high 6.9 rebounds per game in his first year at UD. Junior Brian Johnson, who has started 62 consecutive games at point guard, ranked second in the CAA in assists (5.2 apg) last season. Joining him in the backcourt is Al-

phonso Dawson, who made the CAA All-Rookie squad after scoring 11.0 ppg. Saint Joseph's transfer Jawan Carter will challenge for a starting guard spot, and sophomores Edwin Santiago (4.8 ppg) and D.J. Boney (4.1 ppg) provide depth. Anchoring the post is senior Jim Ledsome, who was a solid rebounder (4.9 rpg) and shot blocker (32 blks) in his first season at UD.

DREXEL

Drexel has advanced to post-season play in four of the past six seasons, but will try to bounce back after slipping to 12-20 a year ago. The strength for coach Bruiser Flint's squad will be in the backcourt where a pair of starters return. Senior Tramayne Hawthorne is coming off a breakout season which saw him average 11.2 points per game, drain 81 treys and make a team-high 60 steals. Senior Scott Rodgers added 9.2 points per game and joined Hawthorne among the league's top 10 in thefts (1.5 spg). Also back at guard are 3-point specialist Gerald Colds (6.5 ppg) and Jamie Harris (2.5 ppg), who combined to start 28 games in their rookie seasons. Drexel has holes to fill up front, but will be looking for increased contributions from a trio of juniors - Kenny Tribbett (2.3 ppg), Evan Neisler (3.3 ppg/3.0 rpg) and Yannick Formbor (1.4 ppg).

GEORGE MASON

George Mason continued its success under coach Jim Larranaga, capturing the 2008 CAA championship and making its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance in the past decade. The Patriots welcome back eight lettermen, including three starters, from that 23-11 squad. Senior guard John Vaughan, an outstanding scorer and defender, poured in 12.3 ppg last season, while senior backcourt mate Dre Smith drained a team-high 66 treys and added 8.4 ppg. Also back at guard is talented sophomore Cam Long (4.1 ppg, 55 assists). At forward, junior Louis Birdsong (6.1 ppg/3.9 rpg) was solid in his first year as a starter, while senior Chris Fleming provides experience. The Patriots will get a boost from the return of senior Darryl Monroe, who contributed 6.1 ppg and 3.9 rpg as a starter in 2006-07 before missing last season with a foot injury. Six-foot-10 forward Vlad Moldoveanu (2.3 ppg) showed great promise during his rookie campaign.

GEORGIA STATE

Georgia State could be primed for a big move up the CAA standings in its second season under coach Rod Barnes. Five Division I transfers join a trio of returning starters to give the Panthers a great chance to improve on last year's mark. Senior guard Leonard Mendez earned 3rd team All-CAA honors a year ago after pouring in a team-high 16.0 ppg and draining 70 three-pointers. Junior guard Trae Goldston added 9.3 ppg and hit 57 treys in his first year as a starter. Joining them in the backcourt are Wake Forest transfer Joe Dukes and South Florida transfer Dante' Curry. Senior forward Rashad Chase is a three-year starter who scored 7.5 ppg and ranked fifth in the league in rebounding (7.6 rpg). Also back is junior Kevin Lott (4.6 ppg). Adding firepower up front will be Ole Miss transfers Trey Hampton and Xavier Hansboro and Mississippi State transfer Bernard Rimmer.

HOFSTRA

Hofstra's streak of three straight 20-win seasons and post-season appearances came to an end last year, but coach Tom Pecora is looking to have the Pride back among the league's title contenders. Leading a group of four returning starters is sophomore guard Charles Jenkins, who was named CAA Rookie of the Year after scoring double figures in 27 of 29 games and averaging 15.0 ppg. Senior Greg Johnson is back at the point after dishing out 107 assists and wing Nathaniel Lester is coming off a solid rookie year (6.3 ppg). JUCO transfer guards Tony Dennison and Cornelius Vines should also make an impact. Hofstra has a deep and experienced frontcourt led by seniors Darren Townes, who was 7th in the CAA in rebounding (6.7 rpg), and Dane Johnson (6.4 ppg/5.4 rpg). Adding depth are veterans Mike Davis-Sabb and Arminas Urbutis (3.9 ppg), along with 6-foot-10 Greg Washington, who blocked 43 shots.

JAMES MADISON

Matt Brady takes over as head coach at James Madison with the goal of returning the Dukes to CAA prominence. He will have a veteran group to work with as four starters, including three double-figure scorers, are back. Senior guard Abdulai Jalloh was the only player to rank among the conference's top 15 in scoring (15.5 ppg), rebounding (5.5 rpg), assists and steals last season and earned 3rd team All-CAA honors. He is joined by junior Pierre Curtis (10.0 ppg/4.2 apg), who begins his third year as JMU's point guard. Leading the way up front is senior Juwann James, who contributed 12.8 ppg and 5.8 rpg a year ago and has already tallied more than 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in his career. Senior forward Kyle Swanson (9.4 ppg) provides scoring from the perimeter. Forward Dazzmond Thornton (4.7 ppg) and guard Heiden Ratner (5.9 ppg) should also play key roles.

UNC WILMINGTON

UNC Wilmington won 20 games and recorded the nation's biggest turnaround in its second season under coach Benny Moss. The Seahawks face the task of replacing their top four scorers and rebounders, but will feature a talented, young squad. The lone returning starter is sophomore point guard Chad Tomko, who contributed 8.6 ppg and earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team. Junior Johnny Wolf, a transfer from Xavier, is expected to take over as a starter at shooting guard. UNCW will benefit from the return of red-shirt sophomore Darryl Felder (3.9 ppg), and juniors Darion Jeralds and Josh Sheets provide backcourt depth. The Seahawks lack experience inside, but are hoping for big years from junior Montez Downey (2.3 ppg) and high-flying sophomore Dominique Lacy (4.7 ppg). Six-foot-10 sophomore Jason Aycock should see increased playing time and UNCW is hoping for contributions from several freshmen.

NORTHEASTERN

All five starters and several top reserves are back at Northeastern, where coach Bill Coen's squad is expected to contend for a CAA championship. The Huskies feature one of the league's premier players in junior guard Matt Janning, a 2nd team All-CAA pick who averaged 16.1 ppg last season and scored double figures in his final 19 contests. He is joined in the backcourt by Chaiison Allen, who scored 9.2 ppg and made a team-high 63 steals to earn CAA All-Rookie honors. Three-point threat Baptiste Bataille (2.8 ppg) provides depth. Junior Manny Adako (10.6 ppg) leads an experienced group of frontcourt players that also includes seniors Chris Alvarez (3.1 ppg) and Eugene Spates (6.8 ppg). Junior center Nkem Ojougbo scored 9.9 ppg and was among CAA leaders in rebounding (6.4 rpg) in his first season at NU. Six-foot-10 Vinny Lima (2.8 ppg) showed promise after joining the team last January.

OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion is riding a streak of four consecutive post-season appearances under coach Blaine Taylor and the Monarchs have the talent in place to continue that run. Four starters are back from last year's 18-16 squad, led by junior center Gerald Lee, who garnered 2nd team All-CAA honors after averaging 12.9 ppg and 5.9 rpg. He is joined by sophomore forwards Ben Finney (7.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg) and Frank Hassell (5.3 ppg, 5.0 rpg), who earned starting spots midway through last season and could be ready for breakout years. Also returning up front are senior Jonathan Adams (6.0 ppg) and sophomore Keyon Carter. Back to run the Monarchs' attack is sophomore Darius James, who scored 6.9 ppg and dished out 73 assists in his rookie campaign. Among the contenders for the starting job at the shooting guard spot are junior Marsharee Neely (3.0 ppg) and redshirt freshman Kent Bazemore.

TOWSON

Towson has its sights set on contending for a CAA title with the deepest and most talented squad in head coach Pat Kennedy's tenure. Leading a group of three returning starters is junior guard Josh Thornton, who averaged a team-high 13.2 ppg and drained 67 treys in just 22 games. Richmond transfer Brian Morris is the favorite to become the Tigers' starting point guard. Seniors Rocky Coleman (5.9 ppg), Tim Crossin (4.1 ppg) and Vernon Carr provide plenty of depth. In the frontcourt, senior Junior Hairston was a 3rd team All-CAA pick after contributing 12.0 points and a team-high 8.9 rebounds per game despite a nagging back injury. Colorado State transfer Jarrel Smith, redshirt freshman Ricardo Brown and JUCO transfer Calvin Lee should also see action at forward. Returning starter Tony Durant (8.7 ppg, 4.3 rpg) and redshirt senior Tommy Breaux give the Tigers a strong post presence.

VCU

VCU looks to continue its tremendous success under head coach Anthony Grant, which has resulted in 52 wins, back-to-back CAA regular-season titles and a pair of post-season appearances over the last two years. The Rams welcome back three starters from last year's 24-8 squad, led by senior guard Eric Maynor, who earned CAA Player of the Year and honorable mention All-America honors after averaging 17.9 ppg and leading the league in assists (5.5 apg). He will be joined in the backcourt by sophomores Joey Rodriguez (5.1 ppg), Brandon Rozzell (2.5 ppg) and Ed Nixon. Anchoring the middle is 6-10 sophomore Larry Sanders (4.9 ppg, 5.2 rpg), who blocked a league-high 95 shots and was named to the CAA's All-Rookie and All-Defensive teams. The Rams have several options at the forward spots with sophomore Lance Kears (3.9 ppg) and juniors T.J. Gwynn (3.4 ppg), Kirill Pischalnikov and Franck Ndongo.

WILLIAM & MARY

William & Mary is coming off a breakout season that resulted in the team's most victories in a decade and a first-ever appearance in the CAA championship game. Three starters return for head coach Tony Shaver, including junior floor general David Schneider, who was among the Tribe's leaders in scoring (10.9 ppg), rebounding (4.5 apg) and assists (3.8 apg). He will likely be joined in the backcourt by Arkansas transfer Sean McCurdy. On the wing, junior Danny Sumner averaged 10.5 ppg last season and developed into one of the CAA's top forwards. Also back up front are senior Chris Darnell (4.4 ppg), sophomore Marcus Kitts (2.4 ppg) and junior Alex Smith (5.5 ppg), who sat out last year due to injury. Senior Peter Stein is back for his third season as a starter in the post after tallying 7.9 points and a team-high 4.8 rebounds per game last year.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
- i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

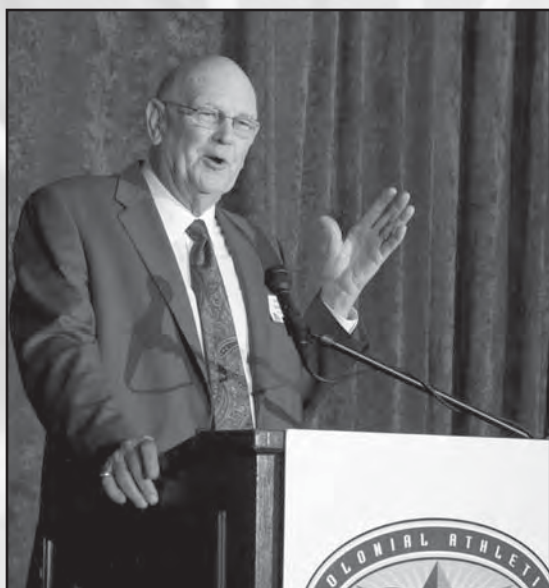

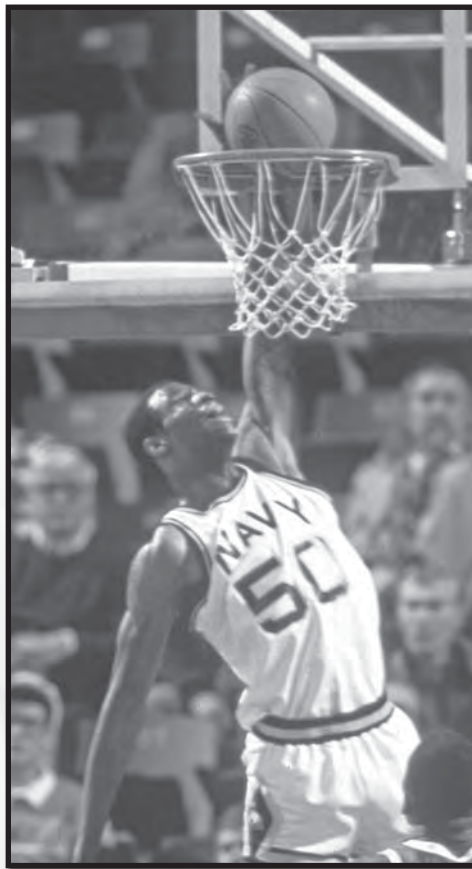

2008 AWARD WINNERS



PLAYER OF THE YEAR

ERIC MAYNOR, VCU

VCU junior Eric Maynor was selected as the CAA Men's Basketball Player of the Year after leading VCU to its second straight regular-season title. The 6-foot-2 guard was second in the CAA in scoring with 17.9 ppg, and led the conference and was 38th nationally in assists with 5.5 apg. A two-time first-team All-CAA selection, Maynor also ranked among the top 15 in the conference in field goal, free throw and 3-point field goal percentage. Maynor was one of 16 finalists for the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top collegiate point guard.



COACH OF THE YEAR

TONY SHAVER, William & Mary

William & Mary's Tony Shaver earned CAA Coach of the Year honors for the first time in his five seasons as head coach of the Tribe. W&M recorded 10 conference wins, which was the second-highest total in school history, and the Tribe's 17 overall victories were the most at the College in a decade. W&M went on to reach the CAA championship game for the first time ever after winning three straight CAA Tournament games on their final possession.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

CHARLES JENKINS, Hofstra

Hofstra's Charles Jenkins was chosen as the CAA Rookie of the Year, becoming the third Pride player to win the award in the past seven seasons. The 6-foot-3 guard led all CAA freshmen and ranked 10th overall in the conference in scoring with 15.0 ppg. Jenkins tallied double figures in 27 of his 29 contests, including a streak of 15 in a row to close the season. He was also selected as the Metropolitan New York Rookie of the Year.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

BRANDON JOHNSON, Old Dominion

Senior Brandon Johnson became the first Old Dominion player to receive CAA Defensive Player of the Year honors. The 6-foot-1 guard led the league and ranked sixth nationally with 2.7 steals per game, and his 91 total thefts were the second-highest season total in conference history. Johnson finished his career ranked third on the CAA's all-time steals list with 238.



DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

TODD HENDLEY, UNC Wilmington

UNC Wilmington senior Todd Hendley was selected as the recipient of the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, which is presented annually to a basketball player who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship through his academic and athletic achievement. Hendley ranked among the CAA's top 20 in scoring (12.5 ppg) and rebounding (5.1 rpg) in 2007-08 and eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his career.

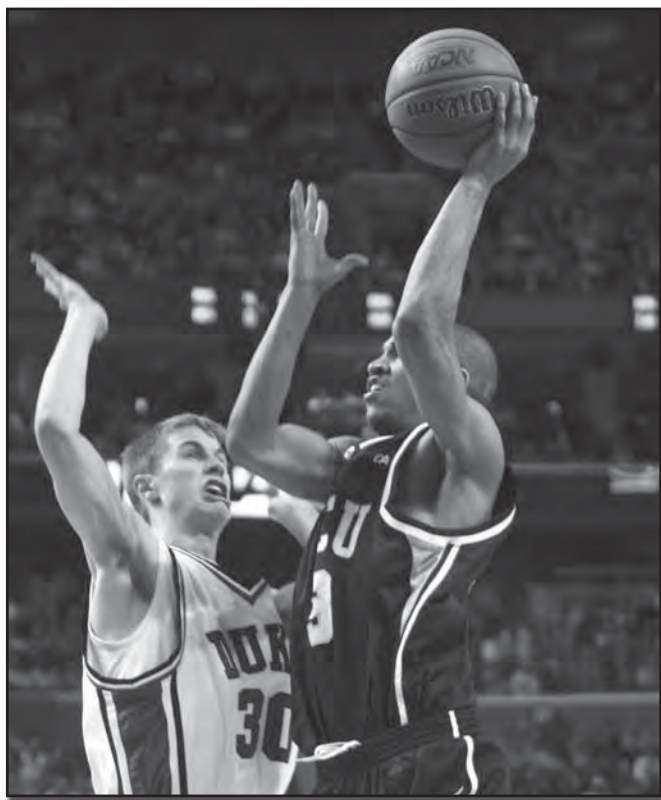

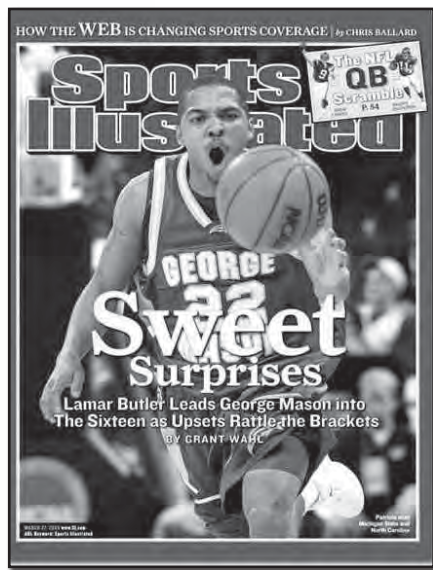

The 2006 post-season was unquestionably the finest in CAA men's basketball history. Four teams – George Mason, Hofstra, UNC Wilmington and Old Dominion – advanced to post-season play and the conference made its mark on the national scene. The Patriots became the first CAA team to advance to the NCAA Final Four, the Monarchs were the first league member to reach the NIT semifinals and the Pride made the quarterfinals of the NIT. Here is a look at that incredible 21-day stretch of Madness.

MARCH 11 – SELECTION SUNDAY - Four CAA men's basketball teams receive post-season berths for the second year in a row. CAA champion UNC Wilmington earns a #9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, which is the highest for a CAA team since 1986. George Mason becomes the CAA's first at-large selection in 20 years and is awarded a #11 seed. The conference also places two teams in the NIT with Hofstra getting a #3 seed and Old Dominion a #5 seed in the same region.

MARCH 15 – Behind a career-high tying 28 points from senior guard Isaiah Hunter and 16 from forward Arnaud Dahi, Old Dominion never trails and posts an impressive 79-61 road victory at Colorado in the first round of the NIT. The Monarchs led by just four at the break, but drained 5-of-6 from three-point range and made 19-of-24 at the free throw line in the second half to blow the game open. It was the first time that ODU had won a first-round NIT game on the road.

MARCH 16 – Junior Loren Stokes scored a team-high 23 points and backcourt mate Antoine Agudio added 21 as Hofstra cruised past Nebraska 73-62 for its first post-season victory in school history. The Pride broke open a tie game with an 11-0 run late in the first half and never let the Huskers get closer than eight after that. UNC Wilmington dropped a heartbreaking 88-85 overtime decision to George Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. The Seahawks hit 11 of their first 13 shots in the second half to open a 64-48 lead, but the Colonials responded with a 19-0 run. In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 10 ties, UNCW led by four in overtime before GW scored the final seven points. Junior guard T.J. Carter poured in a team-high 25 points to pace the Seahawks.



MARCH 17 – George Mason won its first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off 6th-seeded Michigan State 75-65 in Dayton, Ohio. Sophomore guard Folarin Campbell scored a team-high 21 points on perfect 8-for-8 FG shooting and forward Will Thomas posted a double-double with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mason was ahead just 52-51 with 6:41 to go, but reeled off 10 unanswered points and never let the Spartans get closer than six the rest of the way.

MARCH 19 – George Mason became the first CAA team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 1988 with a 65-60 upset of 3rd-seeded North Carolina in Dayton, Ohio. The Patriots fell behind 16-2 early, but rallied to within 27-20 at the break and scored the first eight points of the second half to grab the lead. Senior Lamar Butler, who tallied 16 of his team-high 18 points in the second half, hit two free throws to give Mason a 56-54 lead with 2:52 to go and nailed a key jumper with 1:06 left. The Patriots made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds to seal the win.

MARCH 20 – Hofstra and Old Dominion become the first CAA teams to ever advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT as the Pride pulls out a 77-75 overtime victory at Saint Joseph's and the Monarchs hold off Manhattan 70-66. Senior forward Aurimas Kieza's layup with 19 seconds to go in overtime was the game-winner for the Pride, who got 24 points from Antoine Agudio and 22 from Loren Stokes. ODU guard Brandon Johnson and forward Valdas Vasylius each nailed a pair of free throws in the final 11 seconds to preserve the Monarchs' win over Manhattan. Senior forward Alex Loughton scored a team-high 20 points and grabbed nine boards.



MARCH 22 – Before a national television audience on ESPN 2, Old Dominion defeated Hofstra 61-51 to move on to the NIT semifinals for the first time. The Pride, which had their 21-game home court winning streak snapped, led 30-24 at the break and upped the margin to eight early in the second half. The Monarchs rallied behind senior Isaiah Hunter, who scored 19 of his career-high 29 points in the second half, including back-to-back treys that gave ODU its first lead with 9:05 left. Hofstra was within two with 2:15 to go but didn't score the rest of the way and the Monarchs sealed the win by making 8-of-10 free throws.

MARCH 24 – George Mason led from start to finish in beating 7th-seeded Wichita State 63-55 in the NCAA Regional Semifinals in Washington, D.C. The Patriots opened the game on a 9-0 run with a 3-pointer by Lamar Butler and back-to-back treys from Folarin Campbell. Mason went on to bury 7-of-11 from beyond the arc in the first half and led 35-19 at the break. The Patriots pushed the margin to 19 with 17:21 left and never let the Shockers get closer than seven. Campbell finished with 16 points, while Butler and Tony Skinn added 14.

MARCH 26 – George Mason became the first team in CAA history to advance to the NCAA Final Four, shocking top-seeded Connecticut 86-84 in overtime in Washington, D.C. The Patriots trailed by nine at the break, but shot 56% in the second half, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to stage a remarkable comeback. Mason grabbed its first lead, 52-51, on a Lamar Butler trey with 11:10 to go and was up 74-70 with 18 seconds left in regulation after a pair of Butler free throws. UConn forced overtime with a layup at the buzzer, but the Patriots made 5-of-6 from the floor and never trailed in overtime. Mason went ahead 86-81 with 25 seconds to go, but had to survive

a missed 3-point attempt by the Huskies as the horn sounded. All five Patriots scored in double figures, led by senior forward Jai Lewis with 20 points and Butler with 19. Will Thomas recorded his second straight double-double with 19 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.

MARCH 28 – Old Dominion struggled offensively and fell 66-43 to top-seeded Michigan in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden. The Monarchs were down 21-14 with 12:14 left in the first half, but didn't score for the rest of the period. Sophomore Brian Henderson nailed three straight 3-pointers to bring ODU within 35-33 early in the second half, but the Monarchs could never move ahead. Henderson finished with a team-high 11 points and Drew Williamson added 10.

APRIL 1 – George Mason's Cinderella season came to an end as the Patriots lost to eventual national champion Florida 73-57 in the national semifinals in Indianapolis, Ind. Mason was down just 31-26 at halftime, but the Gators hit three straight treys to open the second period and never let Mason any closer than nine the rest of the way. Seniors Tony Skinn and Jai Lewis each scored 13 points for the Patriots, who were the first mid-major squad since 1979 and the first #11 seed since 1986 to reach the Final Four. Mason would finish the 2005-06 season ranked #8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest national ranking ever for a CAA team.





NCAA SHOCKERS

Prior to George Mason's run to the Final Four in 2006, the CAA was known as a giant killer for pulling some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The list of CAA victims reads like a "Who's Who" of college basketball — Georgetown, Syracuse and Villanova from the Big East, Auburn, LSU and South Carolina from the SEC, Ohio State and Indiana from the Big 10, Southern California from the Pac 10 and Georgia Tech from the ACC. The tradition continued in 2007 as VCU upset perennial national power Duke. Since 1981, CAA squads have posted 17 wins over higher-seeded teams and 20 victories overall. Here's a brief look at the "bracket busters":

1981

#10 James Madison 61, #7 Georgetown 55

James Madison makes its first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance and defeats Georgetown 61-55 in Providence, R.I. Linton Townes, Charles Fisher and Steve Blackmon combined for 45 points in the victory. Two days later, the Dukes appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time, but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

1982

#9 James Madison 55, #8 Ohio State 48

The Dukes receive an at-large bid and defeat Ohio State, 55-48, in Charlotte, N.C. The Dukes scored 14 straight points in the second half and overcame an eight-point deficit. Dan Ruland scored 18 points and Linton Townes added 12 points and nine rebounds. JMU lost to eventual national champion North Carolina, 52-50 in the second round.

1983

#10 James Madison 57, #7 West Virginia 50

JMU records a first-round win for the third consecutive season, beating West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C.. Charles Fisher scored a team-high 13 points, including the 1,000 point of his career, to lead the Dukes. JMU lost to North Carolina in the second round for the second straight season.

1984

#12 Richmond 72, #5 Auburn 71

After defeating Rider 89-65 at the Palestra to make the field of 48, the Spiders got 26 points from John Newman and shocked Auburn 72-71 in the NCAA first round in Charlotte, N.C. Bill Flye added 19 points for UR, which overcame a 23-point, 17-rebound effort by future NBA star Charles Barkley.

1985

#13 Navy 78, #4 Louisiana State 55

For the fifth consecutive season, an ECAC-South member pulls the first round upset. Vernon Butler pours in a team-high 20 points and David Robinson grabs 18 rebounds as Navy thrashes LSU 78-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

1986

#7 Navy 97, #2 Syracuse 85

After getting 30 points and 12 rebounds in a first-round win over Tulsa, CAA Player of the Year David Robinson tallies 35 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocks as Navy dominates Syracuse 97-85 on its home court at the Carrier Dome to reach the Sweet 16. The Middies then sink #14-seed Cleveland State 71-70 on a Robinson one-hander in the lane with five seconds left to earn a berth in the Elite 8. Navy falls to Duke in the Regional finals.

1988

#13 Richmond 72, #4 Indiana 69

Richmond held Indiana scoreless for the last 2:40 and knocked the defending national champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 triumph in Hartford, Conn. Rodney Rice scored a team-high 21 points, including a jumper with less than a minute to play that put the Spiders ahead to stay.

#13 Richmond 59, #5 Georgia Tech 55

Richmond earned its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16 as Peter Woolfolk tallied 27 points and nine rebounds in a 59-55 upset of Georgia Tech. The Spiders' defense limited the high-scoring Yellow Jackets to 5-of-22 shooting from 3-point range.

1991

#15 Richmond 73, #2 Syracuse 69

In what the Washington Post calls "one of the greatest upsets in college basketball history," Richmond becomes the first #15 seed to drop a #2 seed with a 73-69 win over Syracuse in College Park, Md. The Spiders never trailed and sealed the game when freshman Eugene Burroughs hit two free throws with 21 seconds left. Curtis Blair scored a team-high 18 points and Terry Connolly added 14 points off the bench.

1995

#14 Old Dominion 89, #3 Villanova 81 (3 OT)

In perhaps the most exciting game in conference history, the Monarchs survive three overtimes and defeat Kerry Kittles and Big East champion Villanova, 89-81. CAA Player of the Year Petey Sessoms scores a career-high tying 35 points, including seven in the third OT. Before the night is over, most of the 15,100 fans in Albany's Knickerbocker Arena are chanting "O-D-U."

1998

#14 Richmond 62, #3 South Carolina 61

The Spiders freshened their image as NCAA Tournament upset specialists with a 62-61 win over South Carolina in Washington, D.C. Richmond gets 24 points from CAA Player of the Year Jarod Stevenson and holds the Gamecocks scoreless over the final 1:16 for the victory.

2002

#13 UNC Wilmington 93, #4 Southern Cal 89 (ot)

UNC Wilmington pulls the biggest upset in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, defeating Southern Cal 93-89 in overtime. Six Seahawks score in double figures, including senior reserve Stewart Hare who punctuates the victory with a mammoth two-handed dunk in the final minute. It's the first NCAA Tournament win for UNCW and the school's first victory over a ranked opponent.

2007

#11 VCU 79, #6 Duke 77

Eric Maynor scores a team-high 22 points, including a 15-foot jumper with 1.8 seconds left, as VCU rallies for a 79-77 victory over Duke in Buffalo, N.Y. The Rams trail by seven with eight minutes remaining before grabbing a 72-71 lead on a Jesse Pellot-Rosa jumper. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for VCU since 1985. The Rams rally from a 19-point deficit to force overtime against Pitt in the NCAA second round before suffering an 84-79 setback.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS IN THE NCAA: Old Dominion captured its 17th straight CAA title, danced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and finished with a 31-5 record in 2007-08. It was the Lady Monarchs' best record since the 1996-97 season when they advanced to the national championship game. ODU, which was seeded fifth in the Greensboro Regional, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time since 2002 by defeating Liberty and Virginia before falling to Connecticut in the Regional semifinals. Four of the Lady Monarchs' five losses came against teams that reached the 2008 Final Four (Connecticut, Stanford, Tennessee). The Lady Monarchs spent 18 weeks in the Top 25 polls and finished the season ranked 10th.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS IN THE WNIT: James Madison and VCU were selected to the Women's National Invitation Tournament, making it the third consecutive season that at least three CAA teams continued in the postseason. JMU received an automatic bid to the WNIT and VCU earned a postseason berth for just the second time in school history with an at-large bid to the WNIT. The Dukes reached the third round with a win over Radford at home and an overtime victory at Indiana. VCU defeated Charlotte on the road for their first postseason victory since 1995. It was the first time in CAA history that



two different teams won WNIT games in the same season.

PLENTY OF TALENT RETURNING: CAA teams welcome back 67% of their starters from a year ago, including seven players who earned All-CAA honors. Drexel's Gabriela Marginean is the lone first-team all-conference returnee, while UNC Wilmington's Brittany Blackwell, Old Dominion's Tiffany Green and VCU's Quanitra Hollingsworth are back from the second team. Returning third-team members include Jessica Canady of Old Dominion, Brittany Hollins of Georgia State and Sahsha Taylor of UNC Wilmington.

RETURNING STAT LEADERS: The CAA will return six of last season's top 10 scorers and seven of the top 10 rebounders. The league also welcomes back seven of the top eight assist leaders and five of the top eight leaders in thefts. Drexel's Gabriela Marginean leads all returning scorers after averaging 19.0 points per game a year ago, while Quanitra Hollingsworth from VCU is the top leader on the boards after averaging 9.5 rebounds per outing.

CAA NO. 11 IN RPI RANKING: The CAA completed the season ranked 11th among the nation's 31 Division I conferences in women's basketball according to the RPI report compiled by Collegiate Basketball News. Old Dominion led the conference at #9, while James Madison and VCU followed at #45 and #51 respectively.

ODU CAPTURES 17TH STRAIGHT CAA TITLE: Old Dominion edged VCU, 71-64, in another thrilling title game to capture its NCAA-record 17th consecutive CAA championship. The Lady Monarchs have never lost a CAA tournament game since joining the league back in 1991-92. With the win, ODU advanced to its 25th NCAA Tournament, which is tied with Louisiana Tech for the second-most appearances in Division I behind only Tennessee. The Lady Monarchs have won 20 or more games during all 17 seasons as a CAA member.

Old Dominion will aim for its 18th straight CAA Championship.



TV EXPOSURE: CAA women's basketball increased its television exposure with 25 games on the air in 2007-08. All 12 teams made at least one television appearance. The CAA women's basketball semifinals (CN8) and championship (Comcast SportsNet) games were included in the 2007-08 season package. The 25 games broadcast for CAA women's basketball is an all-time best in the history of the league.

GEORGE MASON HIRES JERI PORTER AS NEW HEAD COACH: George Mason will be the only CAA team with a new head coach this season as Jeri Porter replaces Debbie Taneyhill. Porter was the head coach at Radford for the past six seasons, where she guided the Highlanders to a 93-85 overall record. Prior to that, she spent four years at the helm of the North Alabama program finishing with a 64-43 mark.

HOME SWEET HOME: Old Dominion is the only CAA team that did not lose a contest on its home court last season. The Lady Monarchs' 26-game home winning streak is tied for the best in the nation with Hartford. Earlier last season, James Madison owned the longest current winning streak in the nation on

their home court with 30 victories dating back to the 2005-06 campaign, but it was spoiled by nationally-ranked Maryland on Dec. 20, 2007.

DREXEL'S MARGINEAN TIES FASTEST PLAYER TO REACH 1,000 POINTS: Drexel forward Gabriela Marginean collected the 1,000th point of her career against Towson on Feb. 28, 2008 and tied ODU's Clarisse Machanguana for the fastest in the CAA to reach the career milestone in just 58 games.

MOST IMPROVED SQUADS: Four CAA teams were among the top 25 most improved squads in Division I women's basketball last season. Northeastern topped the league with a 10-game turnaround, going 14-16 last year in the second season under coach Daynia La-Force Mann after going 4-26 in 2006-07. UNC Wilmington (9), Drexel (8.5), and VCU (7) also ranked among the top 25 most improved squads.

WINNING BIG & SETTING RECORDS: Four CAA teams completed the 2007-08 season with 22 or more victories. Over the past three seasons, 12 CAA squads have eclipsed the 22-win total. Old Dominion finished last season with 31 victories, the most wins since 1996-97 when the Lady Monarchs won 35 contests. ODU was followed by VCU's school-record 26 wins, James Madison's 24 and Towson's school-record 22 victories.

Northeastern head coach Daynia La-Force Mann guided the Huskies to the fourth best turnaround record in the nation from 2006-07 to 2007-08.

DELAWARE

After recording seven 20-win seasons and making six post-season appearances in the past nine years under head coach Tina Martin, Delaware slipped to 7-24 a year ago. The Blue Hens are hoping to rebound in 2008-09 as six players who started at least nine games are back. Sophomore Vanessa Kabongo (6.6 ppg) and junior Corinthia Benson (6.6 ppg) lead a deep Delaware backcourt. Also returning at the guard spot is lone senior Ethlynn Thomas (2.5 ppg) as well as sophomore Tesia Harris (5.5 ppg). At forward, sophomore Ariene Jenkins is coming off an impressive rookie campaign in which she averaged 5.3 points and a team-high 5.1 rebounds per game. Returning in the post are 6-foot-4 junior Farrah Ferguson (2.0 ppg, 3.5 rpg) and sophomore Eva Riddick.

DREXEL

Drexel turned in its best CAA performance ever last season, going 13-5 and finishing in a tie for third place. Head coach Denise Dillon hopes to build on that momentum as eight letterwinners return. The Dragons feature one of the CAA's premier players in junior forward Gabriela Marginean, who averaged 19.0 ppg and 7.1 rpg and earned first-team all-conference accolades. She is joined up front by senior Nicole Hester, who contributed 7.1 ppg in her first season back after overcoming Hodgkin's Lymphoma. Drexel's backcourt will get a boost from the return of senior Andrea Peterson, who missed most of last year due to injury. Sophomore guard Jasmina Rosseel scored 9.0 ppg and earned CAA All-Rookie team honors. Providing depth are forwards Brooke Cornish and Jennifer Stjarnstrom along with guard Alison Lupariello.

GEORGE MASON

First-year head coach Jeri Porter will try to get George Mason back on the winning track following a 9-21 campaign last season. The Patriots have to replace their top two scorers, but there is plenty of experience with five returning players who started at least 12 games a year ago. Junior guard Rashauna Hobbs contributed 5.7 ppg and drained a team-high 39 three-pointers. Also returning in the backcourt are sophomores Brittany Eley (5.1 ppg) and Brittany Poindexter (4.2 ppg). Senior Jessica Smith, who averaged 4.1 ppg, and sophomore Eugenia Broadus, who chipped in 4.5 ppg, are back as starters in the frontcourt. Challenging for increased playing time will be senior forwards Chynelle Rogers (2.6 ppg) and Whitney Ward (2.6 ppg), who combined to make 11 starts in 2007-08.

GEORGIA STATE

Expectations are high at Georgia State where coach Lea Henry returns all five starters and has brought in a talented recruiting class. The Panthers will build around senior guard Brittany Hollins, who earned 3rd team All-CAA and CAA All-Defensive team honors after ranking among the league's top 10 in scoring (13.2 ppg), assists (4.6 apg) and steals (2.7 spg). Point guard Monica Mann (4.3 ppg, 3.7 apg) and 3-point threat Traci Haltiwanger (7.0 ppg) are also back, and State has added freshman guard Jylisa Williams, who was the Georgia 5A Player of the Year. The frontcourt appears solid with junior Danyell McKeller, who was State's second-leading scorer (10.9 ppg), and junior Shay Rawls, who was third in the CAA in rebounding (8.3 rpg). They will be joined by JUCO All-American Dana Olsen.

HOFSTRA

After winning a school-record 26 games and reaching the WNIT quarterfinals in 2006-

07, Hofstra struggled with a young squad last season. However, the Pride should bounce back this year as coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey returns all five starters. Leading that group is junior guard Sam Brigham, who poured in a team-high 10.4 ppg in her first year as a starter. Senior Niki Williams (7.5 ppg, 3.7 apg) is a two-year starter at the point, and Hofstra also returns Candice Bellochhio (6.5 ppg) and Natty Fripp (7.1 ppg) in the backcourt. Up front, sophomore forward Britne' Rodgers earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie squad after contributing 9.4 ppg and 5.0 rpg. Center Jess Fuller, who averaged 11.2 ppg before being sidelined by an injury, is back along with forward Kristina Campbell.

JAMES MADISON

James Madison has advanced to post-season play for the past three years and has averaged 25 wins over that period. Coach Kenny Brooks looks to continue that success with six returning letterwinners. Guard Dawn Evans made the CAA All-Rookie team after averaging 13.5 points, ranking sixth in the CAA in assists (3.8 apg) and draining a league-high 85 three-pointers. She will likely be joined in the backcourt by sophomore Courtney Hamner (4.0 ppg). Senior Kisha Stokes, who tallied 8.5 ppg and ranked eighth in the league in rebounding (7.6 rpg), returns to the starting lineup on the wing. Anchoring the post will be sophomore Lauren Jimenez, who contributed 6.8 ppg off the bench, and senior Nina Uqdah, who made 16 starts and was 17th in the league in rebounding (6.0 rpg).

UNC WILMINGTON

UNC Wilmington posted its most overall wins in five years with a 17-14 mark last season and coach Ann Hancock's squad should be strong once again with four returning starters. The Seahawks are led by sophomore forward Brittany Blackwell, who topped UNCW in scoring (14.4 ppg) and rebounding (7.7 rpg) and earned CAA Rookie of the Year and 2nd team All-CAA honors. She is joined up front by senior forward Sahsha Taylor, who made the All-CAA third team after contributing 13.4 ppg and 5.9 rpg. Junior Greta Luksyte is the top returnee in the Seahawks' backcourt after averaging 11.2 ppg and nailing a team-high 43 treys. Also returning at guard is junior Candace Walker (6.5 ppg, 6.8 rpg). Providing depth are wing Treasure Johnson (4.6 ppg) and guard Sheronda McLean.

NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern recorded the nation's fourth biggest turnaround last season, improving from 4-26 to 14-16 in its second year under coach Daynia La-Force Mann. The Huskies hope to continue that upward trend as eight letterwinners are back. Senior Ashlee Feldman is a two-year starter at guard who averaged 8.6 ppg and ranked among CAA leaders with 64 three-pointers. Joining her in the backcourt will be sophomore Jasmine Crew, who chipped in 8.2 ppg as a reserve last year. Junior Kim Carr (5.9 ppg) returns to the starting lineup at forward. Also back up front is junior forward Kendra Walton, who is the Huskies' top returning scorer (9.9 ppg) and rebounder (5.7 rpg). Forwards Tiffany Crews and Mia Mayberry are expected to see increased playing time in their second year on the squad.

OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion continued its CAA dominance under coach Wendy Larry last season, posting a 31-5 record, winning its NCAA-record 17th straight conference title and advancing to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time since 2002. The Lady Monarchs are strong inside with 2nd team All-CAA pick Tiffany Green, who averaged 11.4 points, 7.6 rebounds and a league-high 1.9 blocks, and 3rd team All-CAA selection Jessica Canady, who added 11.0 ppg and 6.5 rpg while leading the

conference in FG percentage (56.5%). Sophomore Sierra Little could also see time up front. Back to run the ODU attack is senior Jazzmin Walters, who scored 7.5 ppg and dished out a league-high 179 assists. She is joined in the backcourt by CAA All-Rookie selection Jasmine Parker (6.4 ppg) and veteran Jen Nuzzo (3.8 ppg).

TOWSON

Towson will try to build on the best season in school history which included 22 overall victories and the Tigers' first-ever trip to the CAA semifinals. Leading a list of four returning starters for coach Joe Mathews is junior guard Shanae Baker-Brice, who earned 3rd team All-CAA honors after averaging 11.7 ppg and ranking among the league's top 10 in assists (4.2 apg) and steals (2.0 spg). Senior guard Alis Freeman (6.1 ppg) is a three-year starter who was also among CAA leaders in assists and thefts. At forward, junior Kandace Davis netted 8.3 ppg and was fifth in the CAA in rebounding (7.9 rpg) and junior Haliena Snowden added 6.4 ppg and 4.6 rpg. Providing depth up front are sophomore Dovile Miliauskaitė (4.9 ppg) and Georgetown transfer Katrina Wheeler.

VCU

VCU is coming off a record-setting 26-8 campaign that included a first-ever trip to the CAA championship game and a victory in the WNIT. Three starters are back for coach Beth Cunningham, including senior center Quanitra Hollingsworth, who averaged 13.3 ppg and 9.5 rpg and made the All-CAA second team despite missing the final 11 games due to an injury. Flanking her at the forward spots are senior Radoslava Bachvarova (8.1 ppg) and junior D'Andra Moss, who was 16th in the CAA in rebounding (6.0 rpg) as a reserve. VCU also has experience in the backcourt with juniors Kita Waller (9.7 ppg) and Kita Waller (9.6 ppg, 4.5 rpg). The duo combined to drain 81 three-pointers a year ago. Sophomore guards Ebony Patterson and Jessica Taylor will see increased roles.

WILLIAM & MARY

William & Mary has averaged 16 victories over the past three seasons and coach Debbie Taylor is hoping for more success this year. Topping a group of three returning starters is senior guard Courtney Portell, who averaged 8.6 ppg and knocked down a school-record 72 three-pointers. Junior guard Kelly Heath made 11 starts a year ago and netted 7.2 ppg, while guard Katherine DeHenzel (4.2 ppg) earned a starting job in her rookie season. Junior forward Tiffany Benson (8.3 ppg) ranked fourth in the CAA in rebounding (8.1 rpg) and second in blocks (1.8 bpg) to land a spot on the league's All-Defensive squad. Also returning are senior wing Dani Kell (4.7 ppg), juniors Lindsey Moller and Robyn Barton and sophomore Katy Oblinger, who all made starts a year ago.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

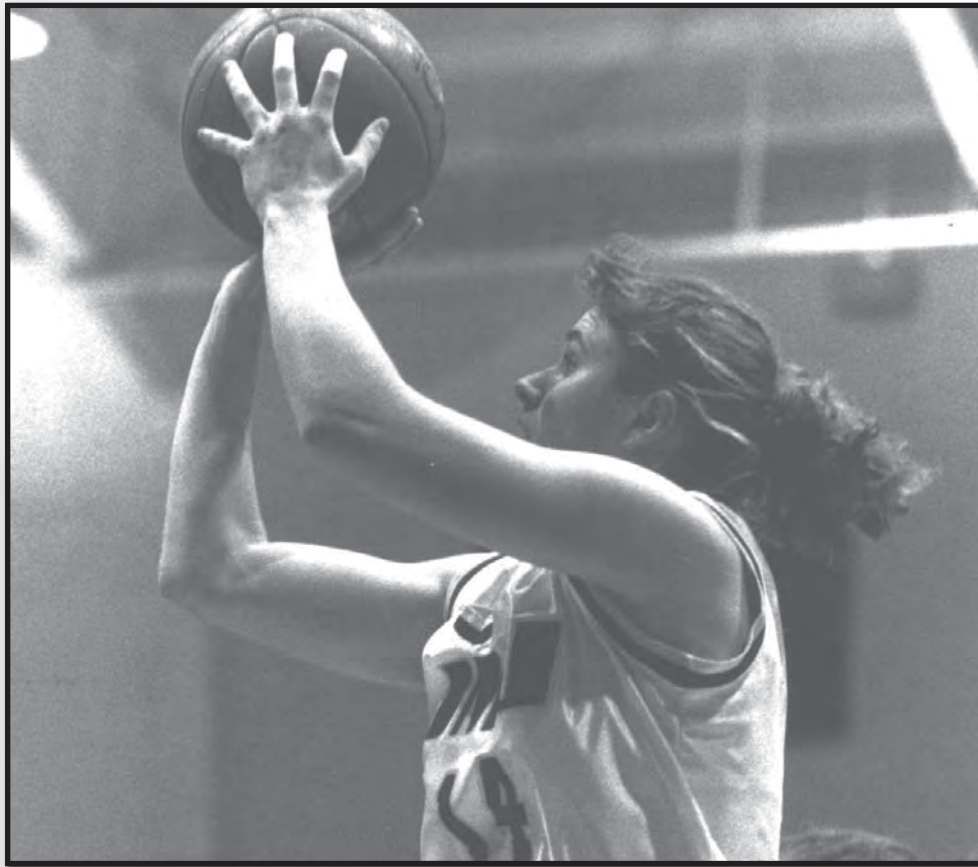

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

TAMERA YOUNG, James Madison

James Madison guard Tamera Young was named the CAA Player of the Year after averaging 20.4 points and 10.4 rebounds per game. She became the conference's all-time leading scorer with 2,121 points and also set the JMU career mark for points. Young led the league in both scoring and rebounding last season. It was the second consecutive season the CAA Player of the Year has come from James Madison as Meredith Alexis received the honor last season.



COACH OF THE YEAR

WENDY LARRY, Old Dominion

Old Dominion's Wendy Larry earned CAA Coach of the Year honors for the seventh time after guiding the Lady Monarchs to a stellar 17-1 mark in CAA regular-season play. The Lady Monarchs went on to win their NCAA-record 17th consecutive CAA tournament title and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2002. ODU was ranked #10 in the final *Associated Press* Top 25 Poll and finished the year with a 31-5 overall record.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

BRITTANY BLACKWELL, UNC Wilmington

UNC Wilmington's Brittany Blackwell earned CAA Rookie of the Year honors after leading the Seahawks in scoring and rebounding. She led the conference's freshmen with 14.4 points per game and 7.7 rebounds per game, while scoring double-figures in 25 of her 29 contests and connecting on 51.2 percent of her shots from the floor. Blackwell is the second UNC Wilmington player to earn CAA rookie of the Year honors in the last four years.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

KYLE DEHAVEN, Delaware

Delaware senior guard Kyle DeHaven received the CAA Defensive Player of Year award for the second time in her career. She led the league with 133 steals, which ranks fourth in CAA history, and finished tops in Division I with 4.6 thefts per game last season. Her 431 career steals rank second on the conference's all-time list. DeHaven also led the Blue Hens in scoring with 10.6 points per game and dished out a team-best 105 assists.



DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

KYRA KAYLOR, William & Mary

William & Mary forward Kyra Kaylor received the prestigious Dean Ehlers Leadership Award. The Ehlers Award is presented annually to the women's basketball student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship through her academic and athletic achievement." Kaylor, who earned all-conference honors for the fourth straight year, led William & Mary and ranked among the leagues top five with 14.4 points and 8.4 rebounds per game. She ranks fourth on the CAA's career rebounding list with 1,124 and is third on the league's all-time scoring chart with 1,873 career points.

POSTSEASON RESULTS

For the third consecutive season, three CAA women's basketball teams advanced to the postseason. Old Dominion captured its 17th straight CAA title and made its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Monarchs danced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA's with victories over Liberty and Virginia before falling to Connecticut in the Regional semifinals. James Madison and VCU represented the CAA in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Dukes of JMU received an automatic bid to the WNIT and VCU earned a postseason berth for just the second time in school history with an at-large bid to the WNIT. The Dukes reached the third round with a win over Radford at home and an overtime victory at Indiana. VCU defeated Charlotte on the road for their first postseason victory since 1995. It was the first time in CAA history that two different teams won WNIT games in the same season.
