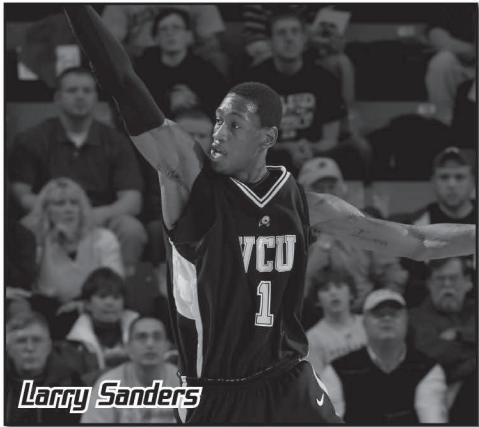

COMMISSIONER TOM YEAGER



The Colonial Athletic Association celebrates its 25th year in 2009-10, all of which have come under the guidance and leadership of Commissioner Tom Yeager. Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has spearheaded the addition of six new members since 2000, transforming what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a conference with a presence in virtually all of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. Those additions have positioned the CAA in five of the nation's top nine media markets from Boston to Atlanta while enhancing the league's reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 23 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past four years, with 30 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths. A pair of CAA men's basketball teams have made the NCAA Tournament field in two of the past four years, with George Mason reaching the Final Four in 2006. The CAA placed a league-record three teams in the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship in 2007.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Sears Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. In 2008-09, the CAA honored more than 1,700 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 19 members of his staff.

Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. He recently completed a three-year term as chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and is the chair of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year prior to joining the NCAA staff. In November 2009, Yeager received Springfield's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Yeager, 59, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

The Colonial Athletic Association celebrates its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10 with memories of a proud and storied past and visions of an exciting future.

Regarded as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences, the CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2008-09, the CAA had more than 1,700 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference ranked in the top 10 in the nation in 12 of its 23 sports in the latest APR report released by the NCAA.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Atlanta (8), Washington, D.C. (9) and Baltimore (27). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.

The CAA currently sponsors 23 sports with the addition of a 12-team football league in 2007 and women's rowing in 2009. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2008-09, 28 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 45 student-athletes received All-America honors.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with a league-record five teams advancing to postseason play in 2008-09. Conference champion VCU made its third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last six years, while George Mason reached the postseason for the seventh time in a decade in the NIT. Old Dominion, making its fifth straight postseason trip, captured the inaugural CIT championship, while James Madison made the CIT semifinals. Northeastern reached the quarterfinals of the CBI. In 2006, George Mason captured the nation's imagination by becoming the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team.

The CAA has had at least three women's basketball teams participate in post-season play for the past four seasons. Drexel captured its first CAA championship in 2009 and was joined in the NCAA Tournament by VCU, giving the league multiple teams in the Big Dance for the second time in three years. James

THE CAA ON TELEVISION

The Colonial Athletic Association will feature its most extensive television package in league history in 2009-10. CAA action can be seen regularly on regional sports networks such as Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as The Comcast Network. The conference will also have several national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and the ESPN Regional network. Other affiliates such as MSG, FOX Sports New York, Cox Communications in Fairfax and Norfolk Va., Time-Warner Cable in Wilmington, N.C., and WSKY-TV in Hampton Roads are regular carriers of CAA Basketball.

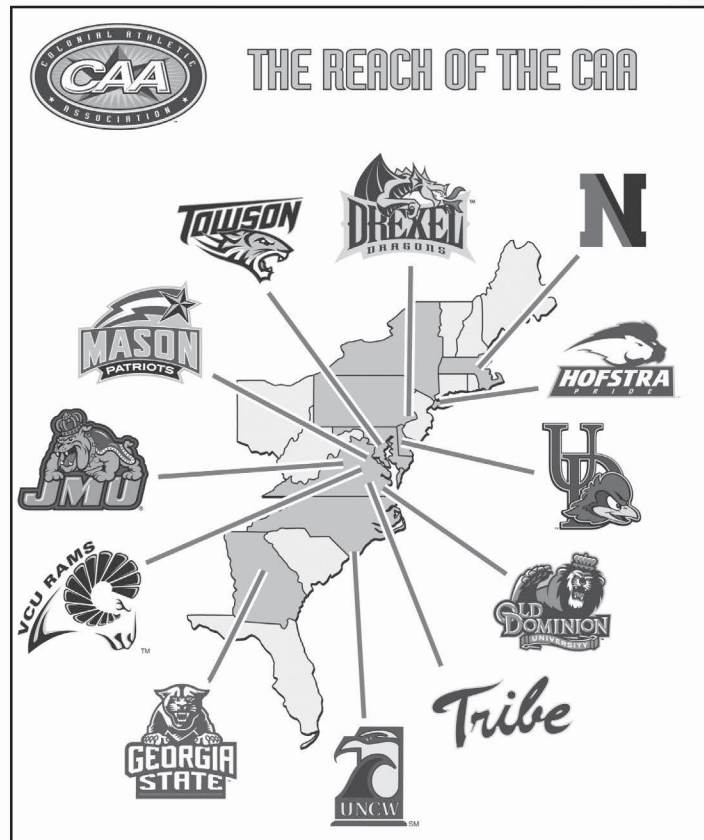
Madison earned a post-season berth for the fourth year in a row in the WNIT. Perennial power Old Dominion, which has won three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997, claimed an NCAA-record 17 straight CAA titles before seeing its incredible streak come to an end last year.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. Three women's soccer teams have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the past two seasons and at least one men's soccer team has advanced to the final 16 of the NCAA Championship in five of the last seven years. In men's cross country, William & Mary placed 16th nationally as a team in 2008 and Georgia State's Mark Steeds earned All-America status after a 12th-place individual effort. On the mat, ODU's Ryan Williams was one of three wrestling All-Americans after finishing as the national runner-up at 141 pounds. The CAA has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship in nine of the last 12 years and has had 12 or more players selected in the last seven Major League Baseball drafts. The conference also boasts numerous All-Americans in tennis, golf, track and field and swimming and diving.



Drexel University won the 2008 CAA Blood Challenge. The Blood Challenge resulted in 3,632 productive units of blood last year and the event has raised over 17,000 units of blood over the past seven years.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11

sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

Celebrating its 25th Anniversary, the CAA takes great pride in producing student-athletes who stand out on the playing field and in the classroom.

COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the 12 colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.

The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all 12 universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the "best and brightest" undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 12 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. This year's conference will be held at Northeastern University. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted "visiting academic status" at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.



RESOURCE SHARING

The 12 institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools -- that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

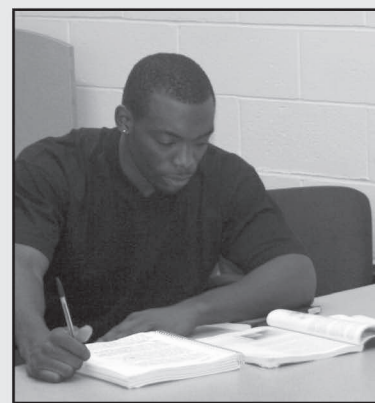
UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share "best practices" in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA "alternative spring break" will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the 12 institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

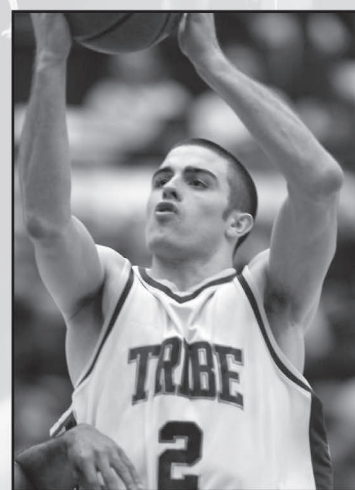
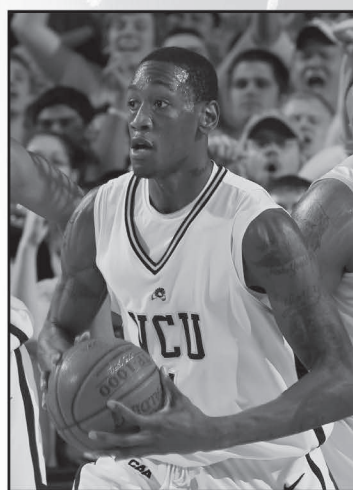
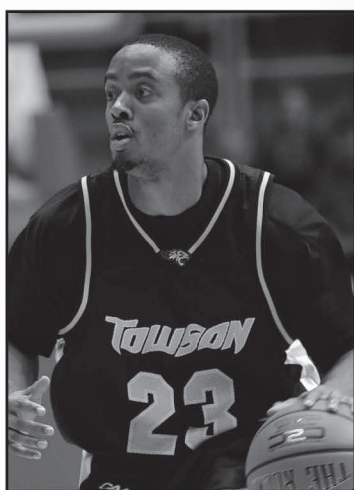
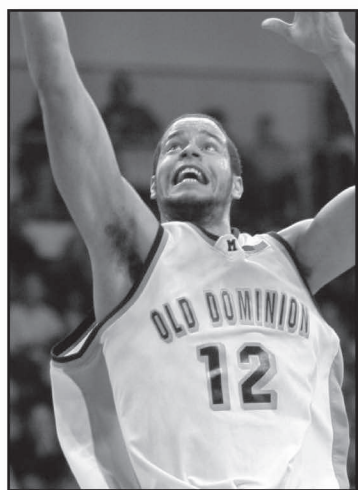
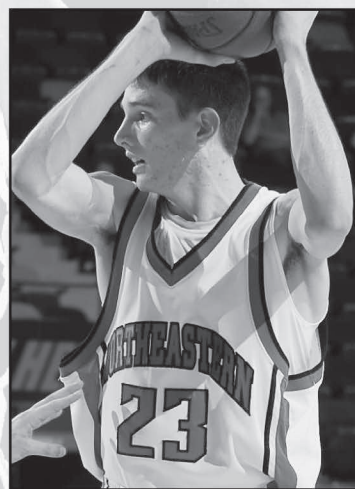
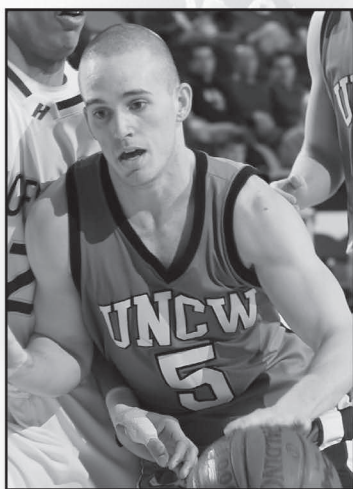
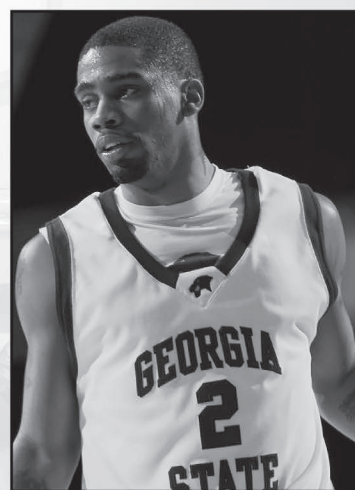
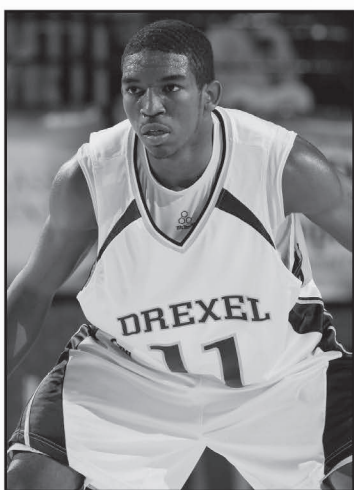
Towson's Randall Cooper received a NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 2009. The scholarships are awarded to student-athletes who excel academically and athletically and who are in their final year of intercollegiate athletics competition.

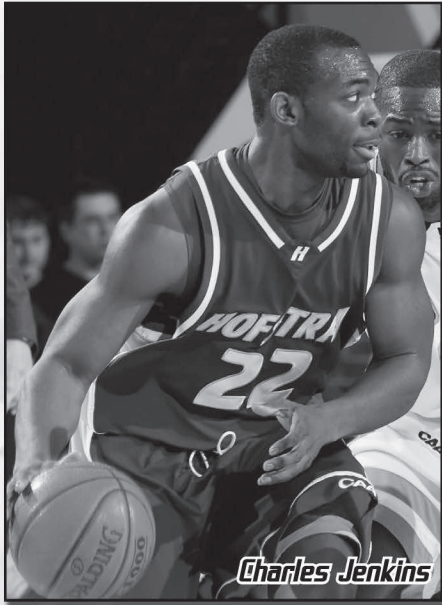

DELAWARE

Additional size and depth should translate into more wins at Delaware, which is coming off a 13-19 campaign. Fourth-year coach Monte' Ross returns a veteran backcourt led by juniors Jawan Carter and Alphonso Dawson. Carter ranked sixth in the CAA in scoring (15.0 ppg) in his first year with the squad, while Dawson was ninth in the league in scoring (14.1 ppg) and grabbed 5.3 rebounds per game. Unfortunately, starting point guard Brian Johnson (10.0 ppg/5.0 apg) will miss the season due

to a knee injury. Providing backcourt depth are D.J. Boney (4.3 ppg) and Edwin Santiago (2.3 ppg). There will be plenty of new faces up front. Sophomore center Adam Pegg (1.6 ppg) is the lone returnee and he is expected to see his minutes increase significantly. Joining him will be 6-foot-8 Rhode Island transfer Hakim McCullar, red-shirt freshman Kelvin McNeil and true freshmen Malcolm Hawkins and Josh Brinkley.

DREXEL

After exceeding pre-season expectations with a 10-8 CAA mark a year ago, Drexel and coach Bruiser Flint look to build on that success with four starters and two key reserves returning. Junior Jamie Harris (8.1 ppg/3.0 apg) made big strides in his second season as the Dragons' point guard, and he will be joined by junior Gerald Colds, who averaged 9.0 ppg and scored double digits 11 times. Senior Evan Neisler (7.8 ppg/6.9 rpg), who was fifth in the CAA in rebounding, is a returning starter up front along with senior Kenny Tribbett (2.7 ppg/3.1 rpg). Drexel also welcomes back 6-foot-8 senior Leon Spencer (6.5 ppg/4.9 rpg), who made a significant impact in his first year at Drexel, and sophomore Samme Givens (5.6 ppg/6.8 rpg), who was sixth in the league in rebounding and earned CAA All-Rookie team honors. Guard Chris Fouch tops a list of four incoming freshmen.

GEORGE MASON

George Mason is coming off an impressive 22-11 campaign that included its seventh post-season appearance in the past decade under coach Jim Larranaga. Junior guard Cam Long (11.7 ppg/4.8 rpg) is coming off a breakout season in which he led the Patriots in scoring and assists and earned 3rd-team All-CAA honors. Also back are sophomore point guard Andre Cornelius (5.5 ppg) and junior Isaiah Tate (1.9 ppg). Louis Birdsong (6.4 ppg/3.5 rpg), the team's lone senior, enters his third season as a starter in the post. Joining him at forward are CAA All-Rookie team member Ryan Pearson (7.0 ppg/3.6 rpg) and 6-foot-9 Mike Morrison (4.0 ppg), who both showed outstanding potential in their freshmen season. Mason has brought in a six-member freshmen class that has received national acclaim and is expected to have an immediate impact. Leading that group are wing Luke Hancock, forward Johnny Williams and guard Sherrod Wright.

GEORGIA STATE

Georgia State closed last season with momentum as coach Rod Barnes guided his squad to seven wins in its final 11 games. The Panthers are primed to continue that run with three returning starters and a talented class of newcomers. Senior guard Joe Dukes made the All-CAA third team after ranking among the league's top 15 in scoring (12.8 ppg), assists (4.3 apg) and steals. He'll be joined in the backcourt by senior Trae Goldston (10.8 ppg), who was among league leaders with 64 three-pointers last season. Junior Dante Curry (6.9 ppg) and sophomore James Fields (2.3 ppg) provide depth. Up front, Georgia State features four seniors who each averaged at least 10 minutes per game. Trey Hampton (4.4 ppg) and Xavier Hansbro (4.9 ppg) were frequent starters, while Ousman Krubally (2.9 ppg) and Kevin Lott (2.2 ppg) also contributed. Among the Panthers' newcomers is N.C. State transfer Marques Johnson.

HOFSTRA

Hofstra has posted four 20-win campaigns in the past five years under coach Tom Pecora, and the pieces are in place for continued success this season. Leading the Pride is junior guard Charles Jenkins, who was one of six players nationally to average at least 19 points (19.7 ppg), four rebounds (4.8 rpg) and four assists (4.3 apg) per game. The 1st team All-CAA pick received the Haggerty Award as the top player in Metropolitan New York. Also back are junior guard Nathaniel Lester (6.6 ppg), who contributed 10.7 ppg over his final 13 contests, and senior Cornelius Vines (10.5 ppg), who nailed a team-high 72 treys. Up front, junior Greg Washington (5.6 ppg/5.6 rpg) blocked a school-record 68 shots and made the CAA All-Defensive team. Senior Miklos Szabo (4.1 ppg/5.1 rpg) showed the ability to score inside and from 3-point range. Guard Chaz Williams and forward Halil Kanacevic lead a group of seven newcomers.

JAMES MADISON

James Madison made huge strides in coach Matt Brady's first year, recording its most victories (21-15) since 1992-93 and reaching post-season play for the first time since 1994. Three of the Dukes' four returning starters are in the backcourt. Senior Pierre Curtis (9.3 ppg) finished strong, scoring double digits in seven of his last 10 games. Sophomore Julius Wells was named CAA Rookie of the Year after ranking among the league's top 20 in scoring (11.6 ppg), rebounding (5.5 rpg) and 3-pointers (78). Guard Devon Moore joined Wells on the CAA All-Rookie squad after contributing 10.7 ppg and 92 assists. Junior Ben Louis (2.9 ppg) provides backcourt depth. JMU's frontline will become solid in December when senior Dazzmond Thornton (6.0 ppg/3.2 rpg) returns from shoulder surgery and 6-foot-10 Texas A&M transfer Denzel Bowles becomes eligible. Until then, sophomore Andrey Semenov (8.2 ppg) will team with senior Matt Parker and freshman Trevon Flores.

UNC WILMINGTON

A lack of size and depth resulted in a disappointing 2008-09 season at UNC Wilmington, but coach Benny Moss is optimistic that the Seahawks can turn things around. Junior guard Chad Tomko earned 3rd-team All-CAA honors after ranking among the league's top five in scoring (15.6 ppg), assists (4.4 apg) and steals. Backcourt mate Johnny Wolf made 64 treys and was 10th in the CAA in scoring (13.9 ppg) in his first year at UNCW. Providing depth at guard are Darryl Felder (4.1 ppg), Josh Sheets (2.9 ppg) and Darion Jeralds (2.1 ppg). The Seahawks' frontcourt is led by junior Dominique Lacy (10.4 ppg/5.9 rpg), who scored double figures 16 times last year. Senior swingman Montez Downey (8.5 ppg/2.7 rpg) is also back. Five newcomers should see immediate playing time - East Carolina transfer John Fields, JUCO transfers Jeremy Basnight, Ahmad Grant and Trevor Deloach and redshirt freshman center Will Ohuaregbe.

NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern should be back in contention for a CAA title as coach Bill Coen returns four starters from last season's 19-13 squad that earned a post-season victory for the first time since 1984. The Huskies are led by senior guard Matt Janning, who earned 1st team All-CAA and NABC All-District accolades after scoring a team-best 14.7 ppg. Junior Chaiison Allen (10.4 ppg/5.2 rpg), a member of the CAA All-Defensive team, joins him in the backcourt for the third straight season. Returning up front is senior Manny Adako (11.3 ppg), a 3rd-team All-CAA pick who shot 57% from the floor. Senior Nkem Ojougboh (7.4 ppg/4.6 rpg) is back as the Huskies' starting center. Providing experienced depth are senior guard Baptiste Bataille (3.5 ppg) and junior forward Vinny Lima (1.8 ppg). The Huskies have added seven freshmen to the roster. Wing Alwayne Bigby and 6-foot-11 forward Dinko Marshavelski could make an impact.

OLD DOMINION

With all five starters and several top reserves returning from last year's 25-10 squad that captured the inaugural CIT championship, Old Dominion is among the favorites to win the CAA championship. Topping the list of returnees for coach Blaine Taylor is senior center Gerald Lee, who averaged 15.5 points and 5.7 rebounds to earn a spot on the All-CAA first team. Flanking him up front are multi-talented junior Ben Finney (9.9 ppg/6.0 rpg) and junior Frank Hassell (7.5 ppg/5.3 rpg), who was named MVP of the CIT after posting three straight double-doubles. Junior Darius James (6.9 ppg/4.5 apg) returns for his third year as the Monarchs' starting point guard. Backcourt mate Marsharee Neely (7.1 ppg) averaged 15.0 ppg in the final two CIT games. ODU has plenty of firepower off the bench with junior forward Keyon Carter (7.9 ppg/4.6 rpg), sophomore guard Kent Bazemore (4.5 ppg) and redshirt freshman Nick Wright.



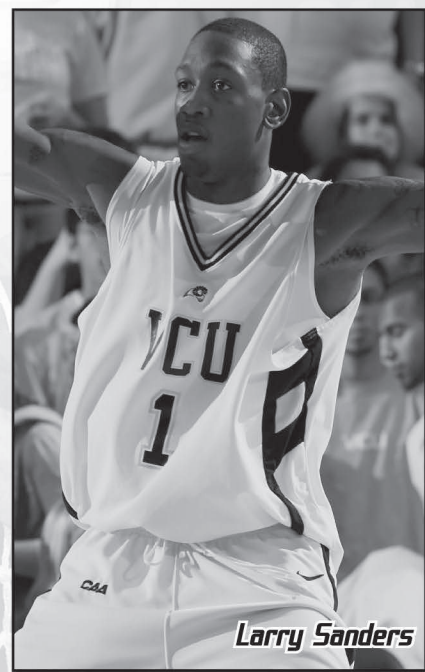

TOWSON

Towson closed last season by becoming the first #11 seed to reach the CAA Tournament semifinals. Coach Pat Kennedy looks to continue that momentum with eight returning lettermen, including five who started at least 17 games. Senior guard Josh Thornton is the Tigers' top returning scorer (10.9 ppg) after ranking second in the CAA with 80 three-pointers. Towson features a pair of capable ball-handlers in speedy sophomore Troy Franklin (8.4 ppg/4.2 apg) and junior Brian Morris (5.1 ppg/3.9 apg). Junior forward Jarrel Smith (9.8 ppg) recorded three double-doubles a year ago and leads the frontcourt returnees. Junior Robert Nwankwo (4.4 ppg/5.4 rpg), who was second on the team in rebounding and blocked shots, and senior Calvin Lee (5.8 ppg), provide size in the post. Also back is wing David Brewster (4.6 ppg). Towson has added a talented recruiting class, which is highlighted by freshman Isaiah Philmore and JUCO transfer RaShawn Polk.

VCU

New head coach Shaka Smart takes over a VCU program that has averaged 25 wins and claimed a pair of CAA titles over the past three seasons. While the Rams must replace two-time Player of the Year Eric Maynor, four starters and four top reserves return. VCU can build around 6-foot-11 junior Larry Sanders (11.3 ppg/8.6 rpg), a 2nd team All-CAA selection who posted 11 double-doubles and ranked ninth nationally in blocks. Senior Kirill Pishchalnikov (5.2 ppg/4.6 rpg) joins him in the post, while CAA All-Rookie honoree Bradford Burgess (7.4 ppg) returns at small forward. Senior T.J. Gwynn provides depth and Wake Forest transfer Jamie Skeen becomes eligible in December. Junior Joey Rodriguez (9.4 ppg), who shot a league-best 41.6% on threes, leads the backcourt returnees along with juniors Brandon Rozzell (6.6 ppg) and Ed Nixon (4.0 ppg). Marist transfer Jay Gavin, the 2008 MAAC Rookie of the Year, should make an immediate impact.

WILLIAM & MARY

William & Mary took a step back last season following a run to the 2008 CAA championship game. However, coach Tony Shaver should get the Tribe to bounce back with four returning starters. Senior guard David Schneider, a 3rd team All-CAA selection, ranked eighth in the league in scoring (14.1 ppg) last season and drained 73 treys. Backcourt mate Kendrix Brown (3.7 ppg) showed great potential running the point as a freshman and senior Sean McCurdy (4.1 ppg) provides depth. The Tribe is solid at the forward spots. Senior Danny Sumner (13.4 ppg/4.4 rpg) topped the 20-point mark five times and can be an explosive scorer, while sophomore Quinn McDowell (9.3 ppg/4.4 rpg) made the CAA All-Rookie team after a solid all-around season. Junior Marcus Kitts (3.8 ppg) and senior Steven Hess will battle for time in the post. Forward JohnMark Ludwick, a transfer from UT San Antonio, will see immediate playing time.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

ERIC MAYNOR, VCU

VCU senior Eric Maynor was chosen as the CAA men's basketball Player of the Year for the second consecutive season after leading the Rams to their third straight CAA regular-season title and second tournament championship in three years. The 6-foot-3 guard became only the second player in CAA history to lead the conference in scoring (22.4 ppg) and assists (6.2 apg) and he was also among the league's top 10 in field goal, free throw and 3-point percentage. A 2nd-team All-America selection by SI.com, Maynor finished his career as VCU's all-time leader in scoring (1,953 pts) and assists (674).



COACH OF THE YEAR

BRUISER FLINT, Drexel

Drexel's Bruiser Flint received CAA Coach of the Year honors for the third time in eight seasons as head coach of the Dragons. Picked to finish at the bottom of the conference in pre-season polls, Flint guided Drexel to a 15-14 overall mark and a 10-8 record in CAA play. The Dragons reeled off seven consecutive conference victories in January. Flint joined Richmond's Dick Tarrant as the only three-time winners of the CAA Coach of the Year award.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

JULIUS WELLS, James Madison

James Madison's Julius Wells was selected as the CAA Rookie of the Year after ranking 16th in the conference in scoring with 11.6 points per game. The 6-foot-5 forward tallied double figures in 23 of his 36 contests and topped the 20-point mark five times. He also led the Dukes and was 13th in the CAA in rebounding (5.5 rpg). Wells drained 78 three-pointers, which was the second-highest total ever for a JMU freshman.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Sanders also made his presence felt on the boards, ranking second in the league with 8.6 rebounds per game. He was also second in the CAA with 11 double-doubles.

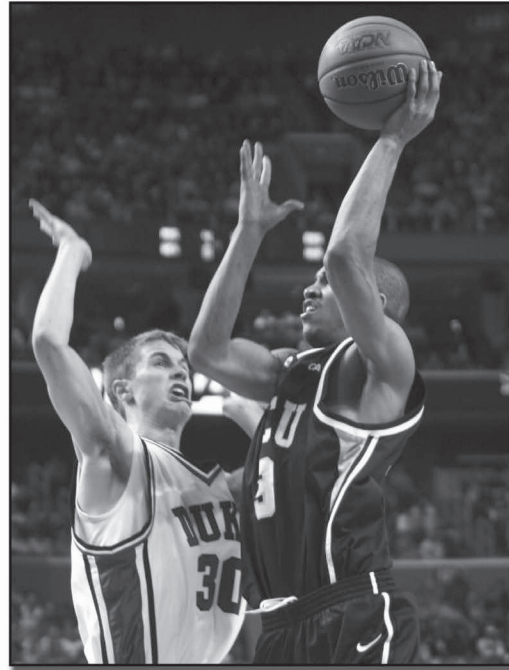

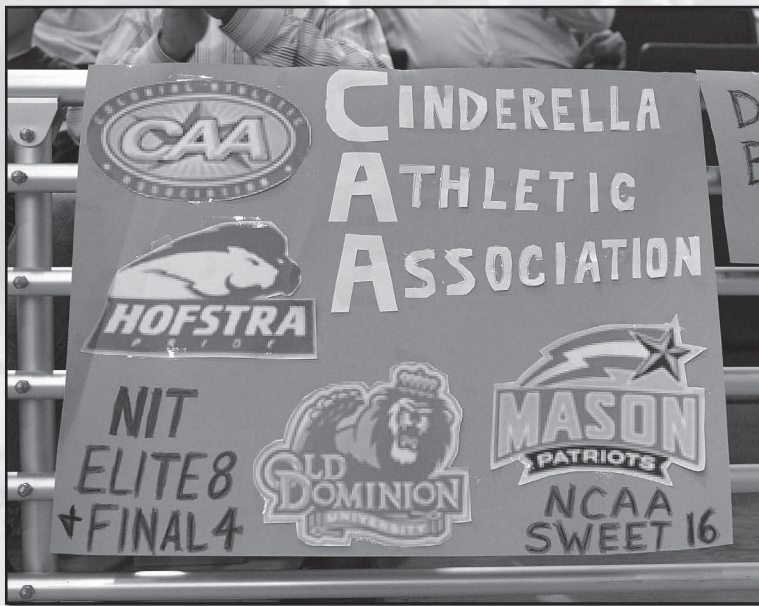
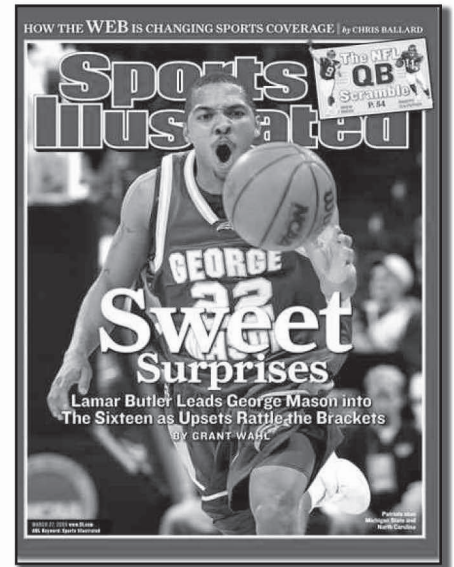

The 2006 post-season was unquestionably the finest in CAA men's basketball history. Four teams – George Mason, Hofstra, UNC Wilmington and Old Dominion - advanced to post-season play and the conference made its mark on the national scene. The Patriots became the first CAA team to advance to the NCAA Final Four, the Monarchs were the first league member to reach the NIT semifinals and the Pride made the quarterfinals of the NIT. Here is a look at that incredible 21-day stretch of Madness.

MARCH 11 - SELECTION SUNDAY - Four CAA men's basketball teams receive post-season berths for the second year in a row. CAA champion UNC Wilmington earns a #9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, which is the highest for a CAA team since 1986. George Mason becomes the CAA's first at-large selection in 20 years and is awarded a #11 seed. The conference also places two teams in the NIT with Hofstra getting a #3 seed and Old Dominion a #5 seed in the same region.

MARCH 15 - Behind a career-high tying 28 points from senior guard Isaiah Hunter and 16 from forward Arnaud Dahi, Old Dominion never trails and posts an impressive 79-61 road victory at Colorado in the first round of the NIT. The Monarchs led by just four at the break, but drained 5-of-6 from three-point range and made 19-of-24 at the free throw line in the second half to blow the game open. It was the first time that ODU had won a first-round NIT game on the road.

MARCH 16 - Junior Loren Stokes scored a team-high 23 points and backcourt mate Antoine Agudio added 21 as Hofstra cruised past Nebraska 73-62 for its first post-season victory in school history. The Pride broke open a tie game with an 11-0 run late in the first half and never let the Huskers get closer than eight after that. UNC Wilmington dropped a heartbreaking 88-85 overtime decision to George Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. The Seahawks hit 11 of their first 13 shots in the second half to open a 64-48 lead, but the Colonials responded with a 19-0 run. In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 10 ties, UNCW led by four in overtime before GW scored the final seven points. Junior guard T.J. Carter poured in a team-high 25 points to pace the Seahawks.



MARCH 17 - George Mason won its first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off 6th-seeded Michigan State 75-65 in Dayton, Ohio. Sophomore guard Folarin Campbell scored a team-high 21 points on perfect 8-for-8 FG shooting and forward Will Thomas posted a double-double with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mason was ahead just 52-51 with 6:41 to go, but reeled off 10 unanswered points and never let the Spartans get closer than six the rest of the way.

MARCH 19 - George Mason became the first CAA team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 1988 with a 65-60 upset of 3rd-seeded North Carolina in Dayton, Ohio. The Patriots fell behind 16-2 early, but rallied to within 27-20 at the break and scored the first eight points of the second half to grab the lead. Senior Lamar Butler, who tallied 16 of his team-high 18 points in the second half, hit two free throws to give Mason a 56-54 lead with 2:52 to go and nailed a key jumper with 1:06 left. The Patriots made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds to seal the win.

MARCH 20 - Hofstra and Old Dominion become the first CAA teams to ever advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT as the Pride pulls out a 77-75 overtime victory at Saint Joseph's and the Monarchs hold off Manhattan 70-66. Senior forward Aurimas Kieza's layup with 19 seconds to go in overtime was the game-winner for the Pride, who got 24 points from Antoine Agudio and 22 from Loren Stokes. ODU guard Brandon Johnson and forward Valdas Vasylius each nailed a pair of free throws in the final 11 seconds to preserve the Monarchs' win over Manhattan. Senior forward Alex Loughton scored a team-high 20 points and grabbed nine boards.



MARCH 22 – Before a national television audience on ESPN 2, Old Dominion defeated Hofstra 61-51 to move on to the NIT semifinals for the first time. The Pride, which had their 21-game home court winning streak snapped, led 30-24 at the break and upped the margin to eight early in the second half. The Monarchs rallied behind senior Isaiah Hunter, who scored 19 of his career-high 29 points in the second half, including back-to-back treys that gave ODU its first lead with 9:05 left. Hofstra was within two with 2:15 to go but didn't score the rest of the way and the Monarchs sealed the win by making 8-of-10 free throws.

MARCH 24 – George Mason led from start to finish in beating 7th-seeded Wichita State 63-55 in the NCAA Regional Semifinals in Washington, D.C. The Patriots opened the game on a 9-0 run with a 3-pointer by Lamar Butler and back-to-back treys from Folarin Campbell. Mason went on to bury 7-of-11 from beyond the arc in the first half and led 35-19 at the break. The Patriots pushed the margin to 19 with 17:21 left and never let the Shockers get closer than seven. Campbell finished with 16 points, while Butler and Tony Skinn added 14.

MARCH 26 – George Mason became the first team in CAA history to advance to the NCAA Final Four, shocking top-seeded Connecticut 86-84 in overtime in Washington, D.C. The Patriots trailed by nine at the break, but shot 56% in the second half, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to stage a remarkable comeback. Mason grabbed its first lead, 52-51, on a Lamar Butler trey with 11:10 to go and was up 74-70 with 18 seconds left in regulation after a pair of Butler free throws. UConn forced overtime with a layup at the buzzer, but the Patriots made 5-of-6 from the floor and never trailed in overtime. Mason went ahead 86-81 with 25 seconds to go, but had to survive

a missed 3-point attempt by the Huskies as the horn sounded. All five Patriots scored in double figures, led by senior forward Jai Lewis with 20 points and Butler with 19. Will Thomas recorded his second straight double-double with 19 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.

MARCH 28 – Old Dominion struggled offensively and fell 66-43 to top-seeded Michigan in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden. The Monarchs were down 21-14 with 12:14 left in the first half, but didn't score for the rest of the period. Sophomore Brian Henderson nailed three straight 3-pointers to bring ODU within 35-33 early in the second half, but the Monarchs could never move ahead. Henderson finished with a team-high 11 points and Drew Williamson added 10.

APRIL 1 – George Mason's Cinderella season came to an end as the Patriots lost to eventual national champion Florida 73-57 in the national semifinals in Indianapolis, Ind. Mason was down just 31-26 at halftime, but the Gators hit three straight treys to open the second period and never let Mason any closer than nine the rest of the way. Seniors Tony Skinn and Jai Lewis each scored 13 points for the Patriots, who were the first mid-major squad since 1979 and the first #11 seed since 1986 to reach the Final Four. Mason would finish the 2005-06 season ranked #8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest national ranking ever for a CAA team.



Prior to George Mason's run to the Final Four in 2006, the CAA was known as a giant killer for pulling some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The list of CAA victims reads like a "Who's Who" of college basketball – Georgetown, Syracuse and Villanova from the Big East, Auburn, LSU and South Carolina from the SEC, Ohio State and Indiana from the Big 10, Southern California from the Pac 10 and Georgia Tech from the ACC. The tradition continued in 2007 as VCU upset perennial national power Duke. Since 1981, CAA squads have posted 17 wins over higher-seeded teams and 20 victories overall. Here's a brief look at the "bracket busters":

1981

#10 James Madison 61, #7 Georgetown 55

James Madison makes its first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance and defeats Georgetown 61-55 in Providence, R.I. Linton Townes, Charles Fisher and Steve Blackmon combined for 45 points in the victory. Two days later, the Dukes appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time, but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

1982

#9 James Madison 55, #8 Ohio State 48

The Dukes receive an at-large bid and defeat Ohio State, 55-48, in Charlotte, N.C. The Dukes scored 14 straight points in the second half and overcame an eight-point deficit. Dan Ruland scored 18 points and Linton Townes added 12 points and nine rebounds. JMU lost to eventual national champion North Carolina, 52-50 in the second round.

1983

#10 James Madison 57, #7 West Virginia 50

JMU records a first-round win for the third consecutive season, beating West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C.. Charles Fisher scored a team-high 13 points, including the 1,000 point of his career, to lead the Dukes. JMU lost to North Carolina in the second round for the second straight season.

1984

#12 Richmond 72, #5 Auburn 71

After defeating Rider 89-65 at the Palestra to make the field of 48, the Spiders got 26 points from John Newman and shocked Auburn 72-71 in the NCAA first round in Charlotte, N.C. Bill Flye added 19 points for UR, which overcame a 23-point, 17-rebound effort by future NBA star Charles Barkley.

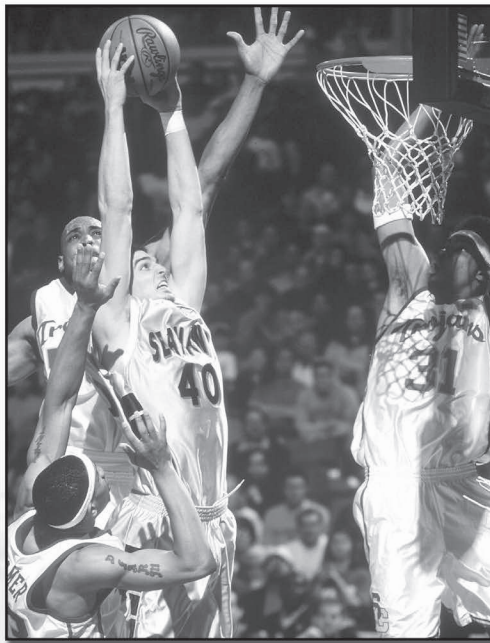
#13 Navy 78, #4 Louisiana State 55

For the fifth consecutive season, an ECAC-South member pulls the first round upset. Vernon Butler pours in a team-high 20 points and David Robinson grabs 18 rebounds as Navy thrashes LSU 78-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

1986

#7 Navy 97, #2 Syracuse 85

After getting 30 points and 12 rebounds in a first-round win over Tulsa, CAA Player of the Year David Robinson tallies 35 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocks as Navy dominates Syracuse 97-85 on its home court at the Carrier Dome to reach the Sweet 16. The Middies then sink #14-seed Cleveland State 71-70 on a Robinson one-hander in the lane with five seconds left to earn a berth in the Elite 8. Navy falls to Duke in the Regional finals.

1988

#13 Richmond 72, #4 Indiana 69

Richmond held Indiana scoreless for the last 2:40 and knocked the defending national champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 triumph in Hartford, Conn. Rodney Rice scored a team-high 21 points, including a jumper with less than a minute to play that put the Spiders ahead to stay.

#13 Richmond 59, #5 Georgia Tech 55

Richmond earned its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16 as Peter Woolfolk tallied 27 points and nine rebounds in a 59-55 upset of Georgia Tech. The Spiders' defense limited the high-scoring Yellow Jackets to 5-of-22 shooting from 3-point range.

1991

#15 Richmond 73, #2 Syracuse 69

In what the Washington Post calls "one of the greatest upsets in college basketball history," Richmond becomes the first #15 seed to drop a #2 seed with a 73-69 win over Syracuse in College Park, Md. The Spiders never trailed

and sealed the game when freshman Eugene Burroughs hit two free throws with 21 seconds left. Curtis Blair scored a team-high 18 points and Terry Connolly added 14 points off the bench.

1995

#14 Old Dominion 89, #3 Villanova 81 (3 OT)

In perhaps the most exciting game in conference history, the Monarchs survive three overtimes and defeat Kerry Kittles and Big East champion Villanova, 89-81. CAA Player of the Year Petey Sessoms scores a career-high tying 35 points, including seven in the third OT. Before the night is over, most of the 15,100 fans in Albany's Knickerbocker Arena are chanting "O-D-U."

1998

#14 Richmond 62, #3 South Carolina 61

The Spiders freshened their image as NCAA Tournament upset specialists with a 62-61 win over South Carolina in Washington, D.C. Richmond gets 24 points from CAA Player of the Year Jarod Stevenson and holds the Gamecocks scoreless over the final 1:16 for the victory.

Six Seahawks score in double figures, including senior reserve Stewart Hare who punctuates the victory with a mammoth two-handed dunk in the final minute. It's the first NCAA Tournament win for UNCW and the school's first victory over a ranked opponent.

2007

#11 VCU 79, #6 Duke 77

Eric Maynor scores a team-high 22 points, including a 15-foot jumper with 1.8 seconds left, as VCU rallies for a 79-77 victory over Duke in Buffalo, N.Y. The Rams trail by seven with eight minutes remaining before grabbing a 72-71 lead on a Jesse Pellot-Rosa jumper. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for VCU since 1985. The Rams rally from a 19-point deficit to force overtime against Pitt in the NCAA second round before suffering an 84-79 setback.

DELAWARE

Delaware could vault back into contention for the CAA title as head coach Tina Martin returns all five starters and welcomes an outstanding class of newcomers. Topping the list of returnees is junior guard Tesia Harris, who earned 3rd team All-CAA honors after contributing 13.6 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. Junior Vanessa Kabongo was the Hens' second-leading scorer (10.8 ppg) last season and she will again be joined in the backcourt by the team's lone senior, Corinthia Benison (9.3 ppg). Back up front for Delaware are junior Ariene Jenkins (8.6 ppg/8.1 rpg), who was 7th in the CAA in rebounding, and junior Eva Riddick (3.1 ppg/4.7 rpg). The Hens will be helped by the addition of forward Danielle Parker, who missed most last season with an injury, George Washington transfer Kayla Miller, and freshman Elena Delle Donne, who was one of the nation's top prep players.

DREXEL

Drexel looks to build on the momentum from last year's 24-9 campaign that included its first CAA championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. Head coach Denise Dillon has eight letterwinners back from that squad, including a pair of all-conference performers. Senior forward Gabriela Marginean (23.3 ppg/7.4 rpg) was named the CAA Player of the Year after ranking third in the nation in scoring. The Wooden Award candidate enters her final season on pace to become the CAA's all-time leading scorer. Junior guard Jasmina Rosseel earned third-team All-CAA accolades a year ago after contributing 10.8 ppg and draining a school-record 90 three-pointers. Drexel's other returning starter is senior forward Jennifer Stjarnstrom (2.1 ppg). Expected to step into more prominent roles this season are sophomore guards Kamile Nacickaite (5.7 ppg/3.4 rpg) and Marisa Crane (3.8 ppg) and sophomore forward Tyler Hale (2.9 ppg/3.5 rpg).

GEORGE MASON

George Mason showed progress in its first year under coach Jeri Porter and the Patriots hope to continue that improvement this season. Four starters return and several newcomers should make an immediate contribution. Leading the Patriots is junior guard Brittany Poindexter, who scored a team-best 10.2 points per game and was second in rebounding (5.6 rpg) last season. Joining her in the backcourt are junior Brittany Eley (8.9 ppg/3.5 rpg) and senior Rashauna Hobbs (6.6 ppg), who knocked down a team-best 45 three-pointers. Sophomore Becky Cox (6.3 ppg) completes the returnees at guard after dishing out a team-high 73 assists in her rookie campaign. Up front, Rachel Robinson (2.9 ppg/3.4 rpg) made 16 starts last year as a freshman. The Patriots are expecting big things from 6-foot-2 center Angelee LaTouche, a JUCO transfer, and junior guard Ashleigh Braxton, a transfer from Pittsburgh.

GEORGIA STATE

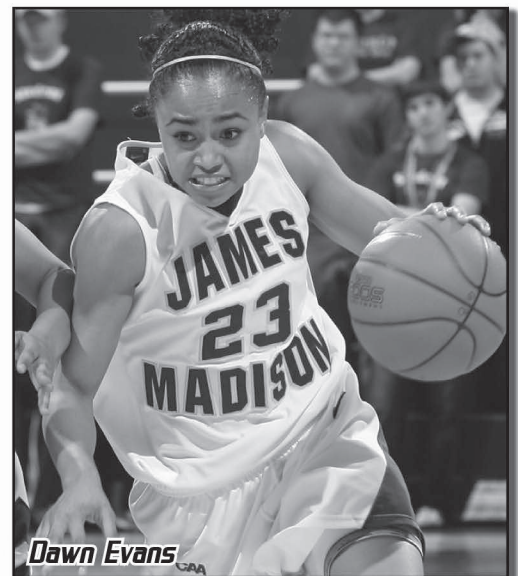
There is optimism at Georgia State, where coach Lea Henry has four starters and seven of her top nine scorers back. The Panthers will get a boost from the return of senior forward Danyzell McKeller, who was leading the team in scoring (12.5 ppg) and rebounding (6.0 rpg) before missing nine games towards the end of the season with a knee injury. Junior forward Chandra Harris (8.6 ppg/5.0 rpg), who averaged 11.4 ppg over State's final 13 games, and post player Shay Rawls (2.4 ppg/4.2 rpg) are also back. JUCO All-America forward Angelique Burtt should make an impact. The Panthers welcome back a pair of guards who made the CAA All-Rookie squad. Crystal Johnson (8.1 ppg) topped the league in assists (5.5 apg), while Jylisa Williams led all CAA freshmen in scoring (10.8 ppg) and made 71 steals. Senior Brittany Graham (5.0 ppg) drained a team-high 40 treys last year and will be joined by junior Traci Haltiwanger as a threat from beyond the arc.

HOFSTRA

Hofstra has the potential to improve on last year's 16-14 mark as coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey returns nine players, including three starters. The Pride should be imposing up front. Senior center Jess Fuller earned 2nd team All-CAA honors last season after ranking among the league's top 15 in scoring (11.8 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg), and blocking a school-record 97 shots. Forward Joelle Connelly (9.1 ppg/6.2 rpg), who added 59 rejections, was named the CAA Rookie of the Year in 2009. Joining them up front is West Virginia transfer Marie Malone. Senior Sam Brigham (8.5 ppg) provides a veteran presence in the backcourt. She is joined by CAA All-Rookie selection Nicole Capurso (10.3 ppg), who made a team-high 43 treys. Sophomore Candice Bellocchio (8.9 ppg) was the Pride's starting point guard last season before an injury and should return as a healthy starter in 2009-10, while junior Aamira Terry (4.0 ppg) provides depth.

JAMES MADISON

James Madison has won 24 or more games and reached postseason play in each of the past four seasons, and coach Kenny Brooks hopes to continue that success. The Dukes will build around junior guard Dawn Evans, who received 1st team All-CAA accolades after draining a school-record 92 treys and ranking second in the nation in scoring (23.8 ppg). Evans has eclipsed the 1,000-point mark (1,143) in only two seasons. Joining her in the backcourt is senior Sarah Williams (9.3 ppg), who hit 56 threes a year ago. Providing backcourt depth are junior Courtney Hamner (6.3 ppg) and sophomore Brittany Crowell (4.5 ppg). Up front, JMU welcomes back junior post player Jalissa Taylor (7.1 ppg/6.5 rpg), who was 13th in the CAA in rebounding. Junior center Lauren Jimenez (8.8 ppg/5.9 rpg) is also expected to return after suffering a season-ending knee injury last February.

UNC WILMINGTON

UNC Wilmington could be primed for a big season as coach Ann Hancock returns 11 of 12 letterwinners from last year's 16-15 squad. Back to lead the Seahawks is junior wing Brittany Blackwell, who earned 2nd team All-CAA honors for the second year in a row after ranking among the top 10 in the league in scoring (13.8 ppg) and rebounding (8.3 rpg). Also returning up front are junior center Martha White (5.9 ppg) and junior forward Treasure Johnson (5.6 ppg). Senior guard Greta Luksyte (11.0 ppg), who hit a team-high 34 treys and made the All-CAA third team a year ago, is the top returnee in a veteran backcourt. Also back in the starting lineup are senior Candace Walker (6.0 ppg/5.2 rpg) and junior Sheronda McLean (2.6 ppg). Senior Whitney Simmons (4.6 ppg) and sophomore Kristen Hanzer (2.9 ppg) provide depth.

NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern will try to make a move up the CAA standings as coach Daynia La-Force Mann welcomes back 11 letterwinners, including three starters. The Huskies feature a pair of veteran frontcourt players. Senior forward Kim Carr ranked second on the team in scoring (10.6 ppg) and rebounding (5.7 rpg), while senior forward Kendra Walton (8.6 ppg) made a team-high 48 treys and topped NU with 6.1 boards per contest. Junior forward Tiffany Crews also made eight starts last season. Four sophomores are expected to lead the Northeastern backcourt. Brittany Wilson earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team after averaging 8.3 points and 5.5 rebounds last season. Also returning are Kashaia Cannon (3.8 ppg) and Dani Iervolino (2.2 ppg), who combined to make 44 three-pointers, and Jamie Conroy, who made four starts at point guard as a freshman.

OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion's incredible streak of 17 consecutive CAA championships came to an end last season, but legendary head coach Wendy Larry is expected to have the Lady Monarchs back in the title hunt this year. ODU's top returnee is senior forward Jessica Canady, a 2nd team All-CAA selection who contributed 12.6 points and ranked second in the league in rebounding (9.6 rpg) despite a thumb injury. Center Mairi Buchan (5.2 ppg/3.3 rpg) made 10 starts in a solid freshman season. Expected to make a major impact is sophomore center Tia Lewis, who earned Conference USA Freshman of the Year honors in 2007-08 while at UCF. The Lady Monarchs' backcourt will be led by junior Jasmine Parker (10.2 ppg), who hit a team-high 53 treys a year ago, and junior Shadasia Green (9.3 ppg/6.0 rpg), who had four games with 10 or more rebounds last season.

TOWSON

Towson has averaged over 18 victories during the past three seasons under coach Joe Mathews, and the Tigers should be strong again with 11 of 13 letterwinners back. Towson features one of the CAA's top guards in senior Shanae Baker-Brice, who scored 17.0 ppg and led the league in steals (3.0 spg) to garner 1st team all-conference honors. Also back are junior guards Omara Parker (7.2 ppg) and Simona Petronyte (4.8 ppg), who combined to make 26 starts last season. The Tigers return three senior starters in the frontcourt. Katrina Wheeler received All-CAA third team accolades after scoring 9.7 ppg and ranking fifth in the league in rebounding (8.4 rpg). Joining her once again are Kandace Davis (5.9 ppg/6.8 rpg) and Haliene Snowden (5.5 ppg/3.4 rpg). Providing frontcourt depth is junior forward Dovile Miliaustkaite (3.4 ppg/3.9 rpg).

VCU

VCU is coming off its most successful season in school history, posting a 26-7 record and earning a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the first time. Coach Beth Cunningham returns 10 letterwinners and three starters from that squad. Senior guard La'Tavia Rorie ranked among the CAA's top 20 in scoring (10.4 ppg) and assists (2.9 apg) last season. Joining her in the backcourt are senior Kita Waller (9.3 ppg), who led the team with 68 steals, and sophomore Jennifer Lane (5.0 ppg), who dished out 120 assists in her rookie year. The Rams have holes to fill up front, but welcome back senior D'Andra Moss (9.9 ppg/5.9 rpg), who missed the final 11 games last season due to a knee injury. Sophomore Courtney Hurt (4.4 ppg/4.5 rpg) and senior Stephanie Solomon could step into more prominent roles in the post.

WILLIAM & MARY

There is excitement at William & Mary where coach Debbie Taylor returns an experienced roster of 11 letterwinners. The Tribe will build around senior forward Tiffany Benson (12.0 ppg/11.5 rpg), who earned 2nd team All-CAA and CAA Defensive Player of the Year honors after leading the league in rebounding and blocking a school-record 85 shots. She is expected to receive help in the post from highly-touted freshmen Emily Correal and Jaclyn McKenna. The Tribe is loaded with experience at guard. Sophomore Taysha Pye (9.9 ppg/4.2 rpg) was named to the CAA All-Rookie team after averaging 19.6 ppg over the final nine regular-season games. Senior Kelly Heath (8.0 ppg) shot 41.2% from 3-point range, while sophomore Janine Aldridge (7.8 ppg) knocked down a team-high 55 treys. Sharing point guard duties will be Katherine DeHenzel and Katy Oblinger (4.3 ppg), who are both returning from season-ending injuries.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

As part of its 25th Anniversary, the Colonial Athletic Association is honoring Silver Anniversary teams in 21 championship sports. Chosen by a panel of current and former head coaches, the 25-member teams feature the “best of the best” in the conference’s storied history.

The 25th Anniversary women’s basketball team includes 17 former CAA Players of the Year, eight WNBA draft picks and several players who were key performers during some of the conference’s greatest moments in the NCAA Tournament.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

GABRIELA MARGINEAN, Drexel

Gabriela Marginean became the first Drexel player to earn CAA Player of the Year accolades after ranking second in the conference and fourth in the nation in scoring with 23.3 points per game. The junior forward scored a league-record 769 points in leading Drexel to the CAA regular-season and tournament titles. Marginean also ranked ninth in the conference with a team-high 7.4 rebounds per game. She led the CAA and ranked sixth in Division I in free throw percentage (89.0%) and was sixth in the league in field goal percentage (48.4%).



COACH OF THE YEAR

DENISE DILLON, Drexel

Drexel's Denise Dillon guided the Dragons to their first CAA championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. The Dragons, who also captured the league's regular-season title with a 16-2 mark, reached the 20-win plateau (24-9) for the first time since 1989-90 and closed the regular season on a 13-game winning streak. The CAA Coach of the Year honor is the second for Dillon in the past five seasons.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

JOELLE CONNELLY, Hofstra

Hofstra's Joelle Connelly was the first Pride player to earn CAA Rookie of the Year honors. The 6-foot-3 center averaged 9.1 points per game and led all CAA freshmen in rebounding with 6.2 per contest. She connected on better than 51 percent of her shots from the floor to rank third in the league in field goal percentage, and her 59 blocked shots were the third-most in the CAA.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

TIFFANY BENSON, William & Mary

William & Mary's Tiffany Benson was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year after topping the conference and ranking eighth in the nation with 11.5 rebounds per game. During her junior season, the forward grabbed 10 or more boards in 22 of her 31 contests and her 357 total rebounds were the third-most in a season in CAA history. Benson was also second in the CAA and 14th in Division I in blocked shots with 2.7 per game. Her 85 total rejections were the third-most in a season in conference history.



DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

ANDREA PETERSON, Drexel • JEN NUZZO, Old Dominion

ODU's Jen Nuzzo and Drexel's Andrea Peterson were the first co-winners the Dean Ehlers Leadership award, which is presented annually to the women's basketball student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, and sportsmanship in conjunction with her academic athletic achievement." Nuzzo started all 30 games in the ODU backcourt and contributed 6.8 points per game, while Peterson also started all 33 games for Drexel at point guard and averaged 5.8 ppg with a team-high 101 assists.

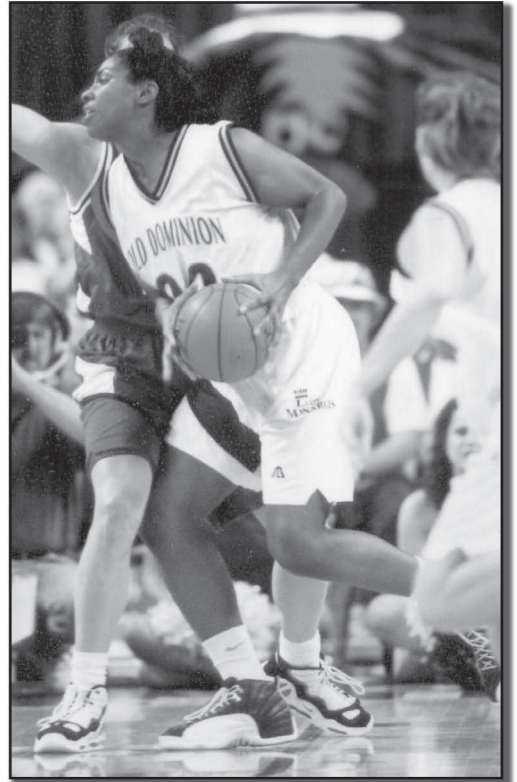

1996 CAA Champions
Old Dominion Lady Monarchs

For the fourth consecutive season, three CAA women's basketball teams advanced to postseason play. Drexel captured its first CAA championship and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The Dragons knocked off Old Dominion in the semifinals, ending the Lady Monarchs' NCAA-record streak of 17 straight conference titles, and then beat host James Madison in the finals. VCU also made the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history after earning an at-large berth. It marked the second time in the past three seasons that the CAA sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament. James Madison received a spot in the WNIT, marking the fourth consecutive year that the Dukes reached postseason play. JMU edged American 61-59 to advance to the second round.
