# COMMISSIONER TOM YEAGER



**T**om Yeager is in his 26th year as the only commissioner in the history of the Colonial Athletic Association. He is currently the longest-tenured commissioner of a Division I conference.

Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has spearheaded the addition of six new members since 2000, transforming what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a conference with a presence in virtually all of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. Those additions have positioned the CAA in five of the nation's top nine media markets from Boston to Atlanta while enhancing the league's reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 23 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past five years, with 43 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths. The CAA has had three different teams win first-round NCAA Tournament games over the past five years and George Mason advanced to the Final Four in 2006. In women's basketball, the CAA placed a league-record three teams in the 2007 NCAA Tournament and had a pair of teams selected to the NCAA's in 2009.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 21 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. In 2009-10, the CAA honored more than 1,700 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 19 members of his staff.

Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. Currently, he is a member of the Board of Directors for the NCAA's college football and men's basketball officiating LLCs. Yeager recently completed a three-year term as chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and is the chair of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year prior to joining the NCAA staff. In November 2009, Yeager received Springfield's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Yeager, 60, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

Coming off the celebration of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association has built a reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically.

The CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 20 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2009-10, the CAA had more than 1,700 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 28 teams in 15 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2010.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Atlanta (8), Washington, D.C. (9) and Baltimore (25). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.

The CAA currently sponsors 23 sports with the addition of a football league in 2007 and women's rowing in 2009. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2009-10, 20 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 32 student-athletes received All-America honors.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with a league-record six teams advancing to postseason play in 2009-10. Conference champion Old Dominion made its third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last six years and knocked off Notre Dame in the first round.

Northeastern and William and Mary received berths in the NIT. VCU posted five straight victories and captured the CBI championship. Hofstra also took part in the CBI and George Mason played in the CIT. In 2006, George Mason captured the nation's imagination by becoming the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team.

A league-record seven CAA women's basketball teams advanced to postseason play in 2009-10. James Madison represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament

## THE CAA ON TELEVISION

The Colonial Athletic Association will feature its most extensive television package in league history in 2010-11. CAA action can be seen regularly on regional sports networks such as Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as The Comcast Network. The conference will also have several national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and the ESPN Regional network. Other affiliates such as MSG, FOX Sports New York, Cox Communications in Fairfax and Norfolk Va., Time-Warner Cable in Wilmington, N.C., and WSKY-TV in Hampton Roads are regular carriers of CAA Basketball.

after capturing its first CAA championship since 1989. Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, Old Dominion and VCU participated in the WNIT, with VCU advancing to the third round. Towson took part in the WBI. ODU, which won an NCAA-record 17 straight CAA titles from 1992-2008, boasts three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. Three women's soccer teams have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in two of the past three seasons and at least one men's soccer team has advanced to the final 16 of the NCAA Championship in five of the last eight years. In men's cross country, William & Mary placed fifth nationally as a team in 2009 and had three runners earn All-America status. In the pool, George Mason's Ashley Danner finished as the runner-up in the 100 breaststroke at the 2010 NCAA Championship and received All-America honors along with Towson's Meredith Budner. The CAA has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship in nine of the last 13 years and has had at least 12 players selected in the last eight Major League Baseball drafts. The conference also boasts numerous All-Americans in tennis, golf, track and field, women's lacrosse and wrestling.



Commissioner Tom Yeager presented Drexel University with the 2009 CAA Blood Challenge trophy. The Blood Challenge resulted in 4,373 productive units of blood last year and the event has raised over 22,101 units of blood over the past eight years.



CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

## COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the 12 colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.



The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all 12 universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:

### UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the “best and brightest” undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 12 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. This year’s conference will be held at Northeastern University. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

### VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted “visiting academic status” at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

### INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.

### RESOURCE SHARING

The 12 institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools -- that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

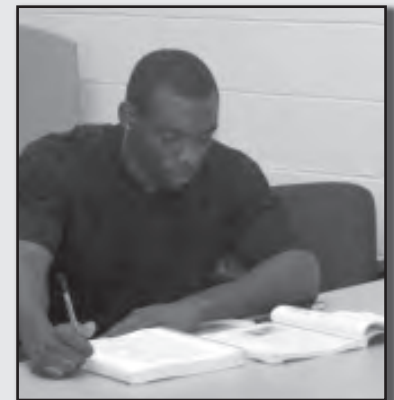
### UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share “best practices” in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA “alternative spring break” will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

### ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the 12 institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

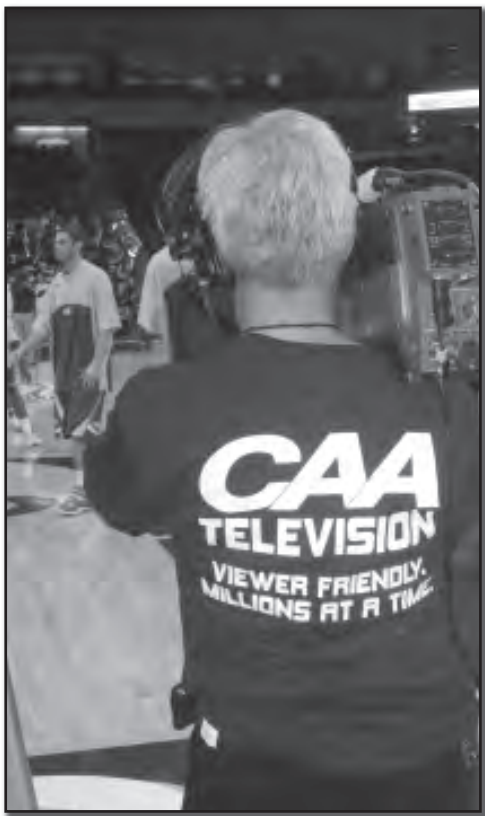

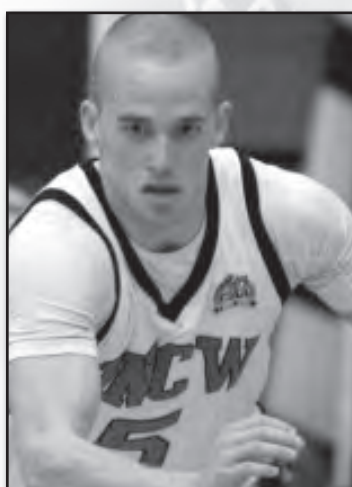

# 2010-11 CAA MEN'S YEARBOOK



**DELAWARE**

With a deep and experienced roster, coach Monte' Ross could have his best team at Delaware. One of the league's top backcourts is led by senior Jawan Carter, who earned second-team All-CAA honors after ranking among the top three in the conference in scoring (18.2 ppg) and assists (4.9 apg). He is joined by a pair of three-year starters in double-digit scorer Alphonso Dawson (12.1 ppg) and veteran point guard Brian Johnson (10.0 ppg, 5.0 apg), who is back after missing last year with a knee injury. Senior guard D.J. Boney (5.7 ppg) made 23 starts a year ago. The Hens' frontline should be improved after gaining valuable playing experience last year. Junior Hakim McCullar (5.1 ppg) and sophomores Kelvin McNeil (6.0 ppg, 6.2 rpg) and Jamelle Hagins (5.4 ppg, 5.3 rpg) each made at least 17 starts and sophomore Josh Brinkley (5.1 ppg) showed potential.

**CHARLES JENKINS****DREXEL**

Drexel returns four starters from a squad that posted double-digit wins in CAA play for the seventh time in nine years under coach Bruiser Flint. The Dragons feature one of the league's top three-point shooters in sophomore guard Chris Fouch (11.3 ppg), who became the first Drexel player to earn CAA Rookie of the Year honors last season. The Dragons have a pair of returning starters in the backcourt with senior Gerald Colds (9.3 ppg) and sophomore Derrick Thomas (6.4 ppg). They will be joined by freshman point guard Frantz Massenat. Leading Drexel up front is junior forward Samme Givens, who has been one of the CAA's top rebounders (8.3 rpg) for the past two years and can provide scoring (8.3 ppg) in the post. Daryl McCoy (1.3 ppg, 4.1 rpg) made 28 starts as a rookie and possesses size and strength. Freshman Dartaye Ruffin could also make an impact.

**GEORGE MASON**

George Mason should be among the contenders for the CAA title once again as coach Jim Larranaga returns all five starters from last year's 17-15 squad. Two-time all-conference guard Cam Long (12.2 ppg) is the leader of a veteran backcourt which also includes junior Andre Cornelius (9.4 ppg), who shot a CAA-best 43.3% from 3-point range, and senior Isaiah Tate (4.4 ppg). Junior forward Ryan Pearson was among the CAA's top 20 in scoring (11.9 ppg) and rebounding (6.4 rpg) in his first year as a starter, while classmate Mike Morrison (8.5 ppg, 5.9 rpg) showed the potential to become one of the league's top inside players. Versatile sophomore forward Luke Hancock (7.7 ppg) made the CAA All-Rookie team last year and sophomore Johnny Williams (2.6 ppg) saw significant time in the post. Freshman Bryon Allen is expected to make an immediate impact in the Patriots' backcourt.

**GEORGIA STATE**

There will be plenty of new faces at Georgia State, where coach Rod Barnes must replace his top five scorers from last season. The Panthers' lone returning starter is senior Marques Johnson (2.6 ppg), who dished out 73 assists from the point guard spot. Also returning in the backcourt is junior Jihad Ali, who tallied double figures three times last February and is GSU's top returning scorer (5.4 ppg). Junior James Fields (3.3 ppg) and senior Dante Curry (2.2 ppg) provide depth at guard. Up front, the Panthers are hoping 6-foot-10 sophomore James Vincent can develop into a force inside. Seven new players have been added to the roster and many of them will get immediate playing time. Freshman Devonta White brings quickness and scoring ability to the point guard spot. Freshman Harold Doby and 6-foot-10 JUCO transfer Eric Buckner will challenge for starting spots in the frontcourt.

**HOFSTRA**

New head coach Mo Cassara looks to continue the success at a Hofstra program that has won 19 or more games in five of the last six seasons. The Pride will build around multi-talented senior guard Charles Jenkins, who ranked 20th in the nation in scoring (20.6 ppg) and received CAA Player of the Year honors in 2010. He will be joined in the lineup by fellow seniors Nathaniel Lester (8.0 ppg) and 6-foot-10 Greg Washington (6.6 ppg, 6.2 rpg), who blocked a school-record 92 shots and made the CAA All-Defensive team a year ago. Sophomore guard Yves Jules (1.7 ppg) and sophomore forward David Imes (1.2 ppg) should take on more prominent roles. Two newcomers are expected to challenge for starting spots. Junior guard Mike Moore averaged 12.8 ppg at Fordham in 2008-09 and JUCO transfer Dwan McMillan could take over at point guard.

**JAMES MADISON**

James Madison is primed to make a significant move up the CAA standings in its third season under coach Matt Brady. Senior post player Denzel Bowles led the league in scoring (20.8 ppg), rebounding (9.2 rpg) and FG percentage (59.4%) and earned 2nd team All-CAA honors in his first year with the Dukes. He's complemented by junior Julius Wells, who made the All-CAA third team after hitting 91 treys and ranking fourth in the league in scoring (16.3 ppg). JMU will get a big lift from the return of sophomore point guard Devon Moore (10.7 ppg) and sophomore forward Andrey Semenov (6.3 ppg), who both red-shirted due to injury last season. Senior guard Ben Louis and sophomore forward Trevon Flores started more than 20 games a year ago and provide experience. JUCO transfers Rayshawn Goins and James Millen could also make an impact along with freshman guard Chad Jackson.

**DENZEL BOWLES**

## UNC WILMINGTON

New head coach Buzz Peterson hopes to return UNC Wilmington to prominence in the CAA. Three starters are back for the Seahawks, including senior point guard Chad Tomko, who was among league leaders in scoring (12.8 ppg), assists (4.3 apg) and steals (1.6 spg) for the second year in a row. Senior backcourt mate Ahmad Grant knocked down 43 treys in his first year at UNCW and contributed 8.1 ppg. Guards Darryl Felder (3.8 ppg) and Trevor DeLoach (4.3 ppg) will also challenge for starting spots. The top returnee in the Seahawks' frontcourt is sophomore Keith Rendleman, who scored 5.9 ppg and ranked third among all CAA rookies in rebounding (6.1 rpg) last year. Six-foot-11 sophomore Matt Wilson was limited by injuries a year ago, but should contribute more in the post. JUCO transfer guard Matthew Wallace and three freshmen should compete for playing time.

## NORTHEASTERN

Coach Bill Coen has guided Northeastern to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time since 1987, but must replace three starters from last year's 20-win squad. The Huskies' attack will revolve around senior point guard Chaiison Allen, who received 1st team All-CAA honors in 2010 after ranking among league leaders in scoring (13.6 ppg), assists (3.6 apg) and steals (1.5 spg). Also back in the lineup is sophomore wing Alwayne Bigby (3.2), who earned a reputation as an excellent defender. Sophomore forward Kauri Black (2.3 ppg) and sophomore guard Joel Smith (1.9 ppg) were key reserves a year ago, but will challenge for starting jobs this season. Anchoring the post is 6-foot-11 senior Vinny Lima (1.2 ppg), who has the ability to score from 3-point range. Two freshmen – 6-foot-8 Alex Bates and 6-foot-10 Ryan Pierson – should also contribute for the Huskies inside.

## OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion is looking to continue the momentum from last year's 27-9 campaign that included a CAA championship and a first-round upset of Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament. The pieces are in place as coach Blaine Taylor returns four starters and several top reserves. The Monarchs feature a formidable frontline led by senior Ben Finney (8.8 ppg, 5.8 rpg), who made the All-CAA third team in 2010, and senior Frank Hassell, who averaged 9.2 ppg and was eighth in the league in rebounding (6.7 rpg). Also back up front are senior Keyon Carter (7.4 ppg) and post players Chris Cooper and Nick Wright. Senior Darius James (7.0 ppg, 3.3 apg) is a three-year starter at point guard and is joined in the backcourt by CAA All-Defensive team member Kent Bazemore (8.4 ppg, 1.9 spg). Three-point specialist Trian Iliadis (3.1 ppg) and point guard Marquel DeLancey also return.

## TOWSON

Coach Pat Kennedy feels his Towson squad is ready to break into the CAA's upper echelon with four returning starters and several talented newcomers. Senior Robert Nwankwo, who averaged 9.9 ppg and made the All-Defensive team after ranking among CAA leaders in rebounding (8.9 rpg) and blocks (3.1 bpg), headlines an impressive frontcourt. Sophomore Isaiah Philmore (6.4 ppg), a returning starter at forward, will be joined up front by 6-foot-8 Maryland transfer Braxton Dupree and 6-foot-9 redshirt freshman Eriqum Gumbs. Junior Troy Franklin (8.3 ppg, 3.7 apg) returns as the Tigers' starting point guard and will be flanked in the backcourt by junior RaShawn Polk (9.2 ppg), who averaged 15.5 ppg over Towson's final seven games last year. Senior guards Brian Morris (2.4 ppg) and Josh Brown (4.5 ppg) started double-digit contests last year and give the Tigers experience and depth off the bench.

## VCU

VCU capped an impressive 27-9 season by capturing the CBI Championship in its first year under coach Shaka Smart. Expectations are high once again with four starters and several top reserves returning. Senior guard Joey Rodriguez (12.8 ppg) is back to run the attack after dishing out 208 assists and earning second-team All-CAA honors. He's joined in the backcourt by defensive stalwart Ed Nixon (7.9 ppg) and three-point specialist Brandon Rozzell (8.8 ppg), who shot 42.3% from beyond the arc last year. Up front, junior Bradford Burgess developed into a double-digit scorer (10.4 ppg) and senior Jamie Skeen (8.1 ppg) provided offense in the post in his first year with the Rams. Sophomore guards Darius Theus (2.7 ppg) and Troy Daniels (2.2 ppg) will also contribute. VCU has added a highly-touted recruiting class, led by junior forward Toby Veal and freshman forward Juvonte Reddic.

## WILLIAM & MARY

William and Mary is coming off one of its most successful seasons in school history. Coach Tony Shaver returns two starters from a 22-11 squad that advanced to the CAA championship game for the second time in three years and earned an NIT berth for the first time since 1983. The Tribe will build around junior forward Quinn McDowell, who earned 3rd team All-CAA honors after averaging 13.9 ppg and shooting 42.6% from 3-point range. Senior forward Marcus Kitts (7.0 ppg) had a breakout year and finished 10th in the CAA in rebounding (6.3 rpg). Three-point threat JohnMark Ludwick (4.1 ppg) and sophomore Kyle Gaillard (2.8 ppg) will also battle for a starting spot. Junior Kendrix Brown (2.5 ppg) and sophomore Matt Rum (2.7 ppg) are the top returnees in the backcourt and should earn starting roles. Freshmen Fred Heldring, Julian Boatner and Brandon Britt will contribute.

**MAJORITY OF STARTERS RETURN:** CAA teams welcome back 66.7% of their starters (40-of-60) from a year ago. Delaware and George Mason return their entire starting fives, while Drexel, James Madison, Old Dominion, Towson and VCU each have four starters back.

**NINE ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREES ARE BACK:** Nine players who earned All-CAA honors in 2009-10 are back this season. Leading the list are a pair of first-team all-conference honorees – Hofstra senior guard Charles Jenkins, who was the CAA Player of the Year, and Northeastern senior guard Chaiison Allen. Four players return from the All-CAA second team – James Madison senior forward Denzel Bowles, Delaware senior guard Jawan Carter, George Mason senior guard Cam Long and VCU senior guard Joey Rodriguez. Back from the All-CAA third team are Old Dominion senior guard/forward Ben Finney, William and Mary junior guard/forward Quinn McDowell and James Madison junior forward Julius Wells.

**MORE ON JENKINS:** Along with earning CAA Player of the Year honors, Hofstra guard Charles Jenkins received the Haggerty Award as the top player in Metropolitan New York for the second year in a row and was named an honorable mention All-American. Jenkins was one of only five players in Division I to average at least 20 points (20.6 ppg), four rebounds (4.5 rpg) and three assists (3.9 apg) per game last season. Jenkins enters his final season with 1,767 career points and is on pace to become Hofstra's all-time leading scorer and one of the top five scorers in CAA history.

**BOWLES CLAIMS TRIPLE CROWN:** James Madison senior forward Denzel Bowles made quite an impression in his first year in the CAA, becoming the first player to ever lead the league in scoring (20.8 ppg), rebounding (9.2 rpg) and field goal percentage (59.4%) in the same year. The Texas A&M transfer, who became eligible in mid-December, tallied double figures in all 25 games he played in and recorded 12 double-doubles.

**ODU RIDING 23-GAME HOME COURT WINNING STREAK:** Old Dominion enters the 2010-11 season with the fourth-longest home winning streak in the nation at 23 games. The Monarchs' home court streak ranks behind only Kansas (59), Siena (38) and Xavier (24). ODU was a perfect 15-0 at the Constant Center last year.

ODU has won 23 straight games at the Constant Convocation Center.

**LEAGUE-RECORD SIX CAA TEAMS IN POSTSEASON PLAY:**

A league-record six CAA men's basketball teams earned postseason berths last year, topping the previous high of five set in 2008-09. Old Dominion, which earned a #11 seed in the South Region of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship, upset #6 Notre Dame 51-50 in the first round before falling to Baylor, 76-68. The Monarchs became the third different CAA team in the last five years to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Northeastern and William & Mary were chosen for the NIT, with the 5th-seeded Huskies falling 59-57 at #4 Connecticut and the 5th-seeded Tribe losing 80-72 at #4 North Carolina. VCU went 5-0 and captured the CBI championship with a pair of victories over Saint Louis in the finals. Hofstra also competed in the CBI, but lost to IUPUI in the first round. George Mason participated in the CIT, but fell in overtime to Fairfield in the opening round.

**POSTSEASON SUCCESS:** CAA teams have combined to win 24 games in postseason play over the last five years. During that five-year period, the conference has had a team reach the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament (George Mason – 2006) and the NIT (Old Dominion – 2006) and has had squads capture championships of the College Basketball Invitational (VCU – 2010) and the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (Old Dominion – 2009).

**NEW HEAD COACHES AT HOFSTRA, UNCW:** Two CAA schools will have new head coaches this season. UNC Wilmington hired Buzz Peterson, who has previously served as head coach at Appalachian State, Tulsa, Tennessee and Coastal Carolina. Peterson has guided four different teams to five post-season appearances. He replaces Benny Moss, who was reassigned within the athletic department last January. Hofstra hired Mo Cassara to replace Tom Pecora, who took the head coaching job at Fordham. Cassara spent the past four seasons as an assistant coach at Boston College and previously was the head coach at Division III Clark University for two years.

**QUALITY FROM TOP TO BOTTOM:** Over the past five years, nine of the CAA's 12 teams have participated in postseason play.

## TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

### 1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
  - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

### 2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

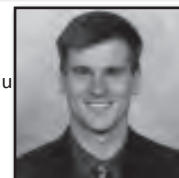

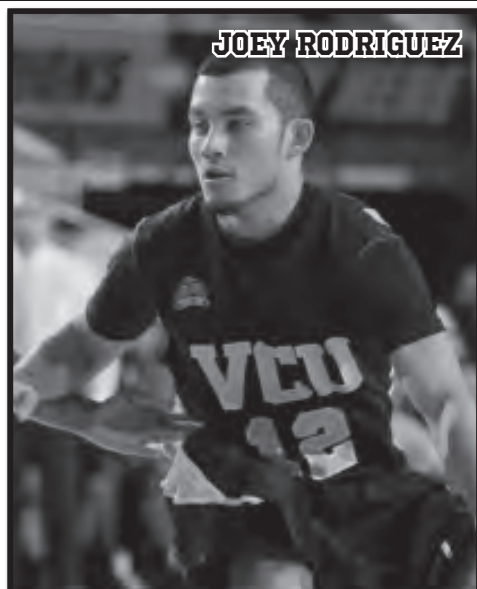

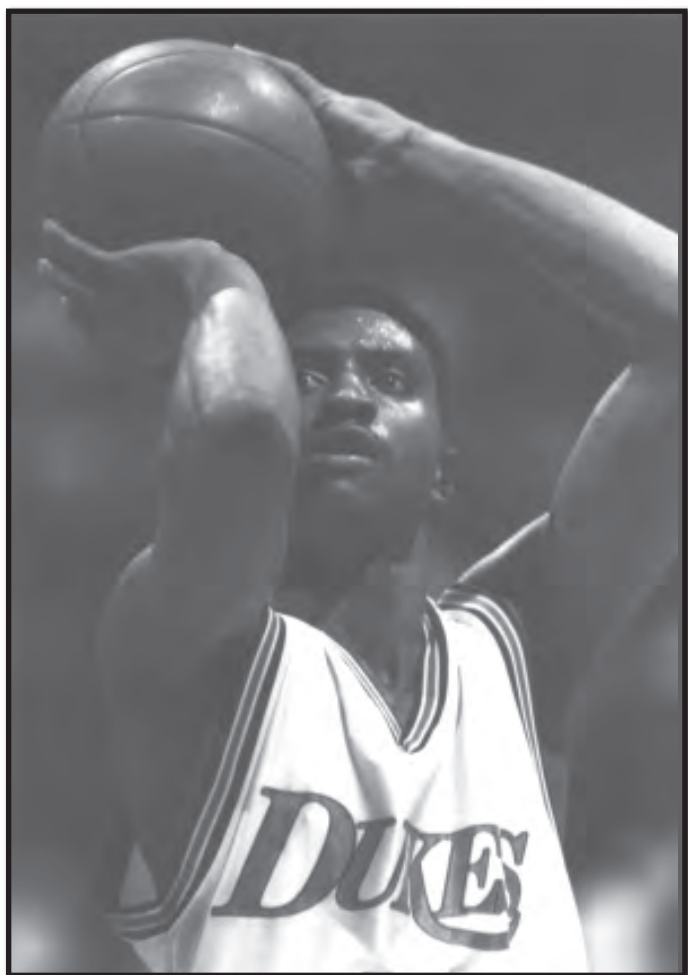

## PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### CHARLES JENKINS, Hofstra

Hofstra junior Charles Jenkins was selected as the 2010 CAA men's basketball Player of the Year, becoming the second Pride player to win the award in the past four years. Jenkins ranked second in the CAA and 20th in the nation in scoring with 20.6 ppg and was also among the top 10 in the conference in assists, steals, FG percentage, 3-point FG percentage and FT percentage. He scored 20 or more points 21 times last season and reached double figures in Hofstra's final 25 games.



## COACH OF THE YEAR

### TONY SHAVER, William & Mary

William and Mary's Tony Shaver earned CAA Coach of the Year honors for the second time after guiding the Tribe to a 22-11 overall record and a 12-6 third-place finish in the conference. W&M reached the CAA championship game for the second time in the past three seasons and received its first postseason berth since 1983 in the NIT. The Tribe's 22 overall wins were the most since 1949-50 and their 12 CAA victories were the second-most in school history.



## ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

### CHRIS FOUCH, Drexel

Drexel guard Chris Fouch garnered CAA Rookie of the Year accolades, becoming the first Dragons' player to win the award. The freshman averaged 11.3 ppg, which ranked 19th in the CAA and was the best of any rookie in the conference. Fouch was also among the CAA's top long-range shooters, draining a team-best 64 three-pointers while shooting 37.9% from beyond the arc. He scored double figures in 10 of Drexel's final 12 contests.



## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### LARRY SANDERS, VCU

VCU forward Larry Sanders was chosen as the CAA Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season. The 6-foot-11 junior ranked second in the CAA with 90 blocked shots and was 18th in the nation with 2.6 blocks per game. He finished his three-year Rams' career ranked fourth on the CAA's career rejections list with 277. Sanders was also dominant on the glass, ranking second in the conference with 9.1 rebounds per game.



## DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

### DAVID SCHNEIDER, William & Mary

Senior David Schneider became the first William & Mary player to receive the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, which is presented annually to a basketball player who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship." The Tribe guard earned second-team All-CAA honors in 2009-10 after averaging a team-best 15.5 ppg and also ranking among the league's top 15 in rebounding, steals and 3-pointers.

As part of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association honored Silver Anniversary teams in 21 championship sports. Chosen by a panel of current and former head coaches, the 25-member teams featured the "best of the best" in the conference's storied history.

The 25th Anniversary men's basketball team included 16 former CAA Players of the Year, seven NBA draft picks, and several players who were key performers during some of the conference's greatest moments in the NCAA Tournament.



Six CAA teams advanced to postseason play for the first time in conference history in 2009-10. The CAA had at least one team in all four post-season tournaments (NCAA, NIT, CBI & CIT), with Old Dominion upsetting Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament and VCU winning the CBI championship. The CAA has won 24 postseason games over the past five seasons, highlighted by George Mason's run to the NCAA Final Four in 2006. Here's a year-by-year look at the CAA's postseason results.

The 2006 post-season was unquestionably the finest in CAA men's basketball history. Four teams – George Mason, Hofstra, UNC Wilmington and Old Dominion - advanced to post-season play and the conference made its mark on the national scene. The Patriots became the first CAA team to advance to the NCAA Final Four, the Monarchs were the first league member to reach the NIT semifinals and the Pride made the quarterfinals of the NIT. Here is a look at that incredible 21-day stretch of Madness.

**MARCH 11 – SELECTION SUNDAY** - Four CAA men's basketball teams receive post-season berths for the second year in a row. CAA champion UNC Wilmington earns a #9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, which is the highest for a CAA team since 1986. George Mason becomes the CAA's first at-large selection in 20 years and is awarded a #11 seed. The conference also places two teams in the NIT with Hofstra getting a #3 seed and Old Dominion a #5 seed in the same region.

**MARCH 15** – Behind a career-high tying 28 points from senior guard Isaiah Hunter and 16 from forward Arnaud Dahi, Old Dominion never trails and posts an impressive 79-61 road victory at Colorado in the first round of the NIT. The Monarchs led by just four at the break, but drained 5-of-6 from three-point range and made 19-of-24 at the free throw line in the second half to blow the game open. It was the first time that ODU had won a first-round NIT game on the road.

**MARCH 16** – Junior Loren Stokes scored a team-high 23 points and backcourt mate Antoine Agudio added 21 as Hofstra cruised past Nebraska 73-62 for its first post-season victory in school history. The Pride broke open a tie game with an 11-0 run late in the first half and never let the Huskers get closer than eight after that. UNC Wilmington dropped a heartbreaking 88-85 overtime decision to George Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. The Seahawks hit 11 of their first 13 shots in the second half to open a 64-48 lead, but the Colonials responded with a 19-0 run. In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 10 ties, UNCW led by four in overtime before GW scored the final seven points. Junior guard T.J. Carter poured in a team-high 25 points to pace the Seahawks.



**MARCH 17** – George Mason won its first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off 6th-seeded Michigan State 75-65 in Dayton, Ohio. Sophomore guard Folarin Campbell scored a team-high 21 points on perfect 8-for-8 FG shooting and forward Will Thomas posted a double-double with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mason was ahead just 52-51 with 6:41 to go, but reeled off 10 unanswered points and never let the Spartans get closer than six the rest of the way.

**MARCH 19** – George Mason became the first CAA team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 1988 with a 65-60 upset of 3rd-seeded North Carolina in Dayton, Ohio. The Patriots fell behind 16-2 early, but rallied to within 27-20 at the break and scored the first eight points of the second half to grab the lead. Senior Lamar Butler, who tallied 16 of his team-high 18 points in the second half, hit two free throws to give Mason a 56-54 lead with 2:52 to go and nailed a key jumper with 1:06 left. The Patriots made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds to seal the win.

**MARCH 20** – Hofstra and Old Dominion become the first CAA teams to ever advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT as the Pride pulls out a 77-75 overtime victory at Saint Joseph's and the Monarchs hold off Manhattan 70-66. Senior forward Aurimas Kieza's layup with 19 seconds to go in overtime was the game-winner for the Pride, who got 24 points from Antoine Agudio and 22 from Loren Stokes. ODU guard Brandon Johnson and forward Valdas Vasylius each nailed a pair of free throws in the final 11 seconds to preserve the Monarchs' win over Manhattan. Senior forward Alex Loughton scored a team-high 20 points and grabbed nine boards.



**MARCH 22** – Before a national television audience on ESPN 2, Old Dominion defeated Hofstra 61-51 to move on to the NIT semifinals for the first time. The Pride, which had their 21-game home court winning streak snapped, led 30-24 at the break and upped the margin to eight early in the second half. The Monarchs rallied behind senior Isaiah Hunter, who scored 19 of his career-high 29 points in the second half, including back-to-back treys that gave ODU its first lead with 9:05 left. Hofstra was within two with 2:15 to go but didn't score the rest of the way and the Monarchs sealed the win by making 8-of-10 free throws.

**MARCH 24** – George Mason led from start to finish in beating 7th-seeded Wichita State 63-55 in the NCAA Regional Semifinals in Washington, D.C. The Patriots opened the game on a 9-0 run with a 3-pointer by Lamar Butler and back-to-back treys from Folarin Campbell. Mason went on to bury 7-of-11 from beyond the arc in the first half and led 35-19 at the break. The Patriots pushed the margin to 19 with 17:21 left and never let the Shockers get closer than seven. Campbell finished with 16 points, while Butler and Tony Skinn added 14.

**MARCH 26** – George Mason became the first team in CAA history to advance to the NCAA Final Four, shocking top-seeded Connecticut 86-84 in overtime in Washington, D.C. The Patriots trailed by nine at the break, but shot 56% in the second half, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to stage a remarkable comeback. Mason grabbed its first lead, 52-51, on a Lamar Butler trey with 11:10 to go and was up 74-70 with 18 seconds left in regulation after a pair of Butler free throws. UConn forced overtime with a layup at the buzzer, but the Patriots made 5-of-6 from the floor and never trailed in overtime. Mason went ahead 86-81 with 25 seconds to go, but had to survive

a missed 3-point attempt by the Huskies as the horn sounded. All five Patriots scored in double figures, led by senior forward Jai Lewis with 20 points and Butler with 19. Will Thomas recorded his second straight double-double with 19 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.

**MARCH 28** – Old Dominion struggled offensively and fell 66-43 to top-seeded Michigan in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden. The Monarchs were down 21-14 with 12:14 left in the first half, but didn't score for the rest of the period. Sophomore Brian Henderson nailed three straight 3-pointers to bring ODU within 35-33 early in the second half, but the Monarchs could never move ahead. Henderson finished with a team-high 11 points and Drew Williamson added 10.

**APRIL 1** – George Mason's Cinderella season came to an end as the Patriots lost to eventual national champion Florida 73-57 in the national semifinals in Indianapolis, Ind. Mason was down just 31-26 at halftime, but the Gators hit three straight treys to open the second period and never let Mason any closer than nine the rest of the way. Seniors Tony Skinn and Jai Lewis each scored 13 points for the Patriots, who were the first mid-major squad since 1979 and the first #11 seed since 1986 to reach the Final Four. Mason would finish the 2005-06 season ranked #8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest national ranking ever for a CAA team.



Prior to George Mason's run to the Final Four in 2006, the CAA was known as a giant killer for pulling some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The list of CAA victims reads like a "Who's Who" of college basketball – Georgetown, Syracuse and Villanova from the Big East, Auburn, LSU and South Carolina from the SEC, Ohio State and Indiana from the Big 10, Southern California from the Pac 10 and Georgia Tech from the ACC. The tradition has continued in recent years as VCU upset perennial power Duke in 2007 and Old Dominion beat Notre Dame in 2010. Since 1981, CAA squads have posted 18 wins over higher-seeded teams and 21 victories overall. Here's a brief look at the "bracket busters":

### 1981

#### #10 James Madison 61, #7 Georgetown 55

James Madison makes its first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance and defeats Georgetown 61-55 in Providence, R.I. Linton Townes, Charles Fisher and Steve Blackmon combined for 45 points in the victory. Two days later, the Dukes appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time, but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

### 1982

#### #9 James Madison 55, #8 Ohio State 48

The Dukes receive an at-large bid and defeat Ohio State, 55-48, in Charlotte, N.C. The Dukes scored 14 straight points in the second half and overcame an eight-point deficit. Dan Ruland scored 18 points and Linton Townes added 12 points and nine rebounds. JMU lost to eventual national champion North Carolina, 52-50 in the second round.

### 1983

#### #10 James Madison 57, #7 West Virginia 50

JMU records a first-round win for the third consecutive season, beating West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C.. Charles Fisher scored a team-high 13 points, including the 1,000 point of his career, to lead the Dukes. JMU lost to North Carolina in the second round for the second straight season.

### 1984

#### #12 Richmond 72, #5 Auburn 71

After defeating Rider 89-65 at the Palestra to make the field of 48, the Spiders got 26 points from John Newman and shocked Auburn 72-71 in the NCAA first round in Charlotte, N.C. Bill Flye added 19 points for UR, which overcame a 23-point, 17-rebound effort by future NBA star Charles Barkley.

### 1985

#### #13 Navy 78, #4 Louisiana State 55

For the fifth consecutive season, an ECAC-South member pulls the first round upset. Vernon Butler pours in a team-high 20 points and David Robinson grabs 18 rebounds as Navy thrashes LSU 78-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

### 1986

#### #7 Navy 97, #2 Syracuse 85

After getting 30 points and 12 rebounds in a first-round win over Tulsa, CAA Player of the Year David Robinson tallies 35 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocks as Navy dominates Syracuse 97-85 on its home court at the Carrier Dome to reach the Sweet 16. The Middies then sink #14-seed Cleveland State 71-70 on a Robinson one-hander in the lane with five seconds left to earn a berth in the Elite 8. Navy falls to Duke in the Regional finals.

### 1988

#### #13 Richmond 72, #4 Indiana 69

Richmond held Indiana scoreless for the last 2:40 and knocked the defending national champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 triumph in Hartford, Conn. Rodney Rice scored a team-high 21 points, including a jumper with less than a minute to play that put the Spiders ahead to stay.

#### #13 Richmond 59, #5 Georgia Tech 55

Richmond earned its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16 as Peter Woolfolk tallied 27 points and nine rebounds in a 59-55 upset of Georgia Tech. The Spiders' defense limited the high-scoring Yellow Jackets to 5-of-22 shooting from 3-point range.

### 1991

#### #15 Richmond 73, #2 Syracuse 69

In what the Washington Post calls "one of the greatest upsets in college basketball history," Richmond becomes the first #15 seed to drop a #2 seed with a 73-69 win over Syracuse in College Park, Md. The Spiders never trailed and sealed the game when freshman Eugene Burroughs hit two free throws with 21 seconds left. Curtis Blair scored a team-high 18 points and Terry Connolly added 14 points off the bench.

### 1995

#### #14 Old Dominion 89, #3 Villanova 81 (3 OT)

In perhaps the most exciting game in conference history, the Monarchs survive three overtimes and defeat Kerry Kittles and Big East champion Villanova, 89-81. CAA Player of the Year Petey Sessoms scores a career-high tying 35 points, including seven in the third OT. Before the night is over, most of the 15,100 fans in Albany's Knickerbocker Arena are chanting "O-D-U."

### 1998

#### #14 Richmond 62, #3 South Carolina 61

The Spiders freshened their image as NCAA Tournament upset specialists with a 62-61 win over South Carolina in Washington, D.C. Richmond gets 24 points from CAA Player of the Year Jarod Stevenson and holds the Gamecocks scoreless over the final 1:16 for the victory.

### 2002

#### #13 UNC Wilmington 93, #4 Southern Cal 89 (ot)

UNC Wilmington pulls the biggest upset in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, defeating Southern Cal 93-89 in overtime. Six Seahawks score in double figures, including senior reserve Stewart Hare who punctuates the victory with a mammoth two-handed dunk in the final minute. It's the first NCAA Tournament win for UNCW and the school's first victory over a ranked opponent.

### 2007

#### #11 VCU 79, #6 Duke 77

Eric Maynor scores a team-high 22 points, including a 15-foot jumper with 1.8 seconds left, as VCU rallies for a 79-77 victory over Duke in Buffalo, N.Y. The Rams trail by seven with eight minutes remaining before grabbing a 72-71 lead on a Jesse Pellot-Rosa jumper. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for VCU since 1985. The Rams rally from a 19-point deficit to force overtime against Pitt in the NCAA second round before suffering an 84-79 setback.

### 2010

#### #11 Old Dominion 51, #6 Notre Dame 50

Old Dominion rallies from an eight-point second-half deficit to knock off Notre Dame, 51-50, in New Orleans, La. The Monarchs took a 48-46 lead on Gerald Lee's jumper with 1:26 left and Keyon Carter sank a pair of crucial free throws with 10 seconds to go. The Irish missed a game-tying 3-pointer to give ODU its first NCAA Tournament victory since 1995. Frank Hassell had a team-high 15 points and nine rebounds and Carter added 11 points off the bench.

## DELAWARE

Optimism abounds at Delaware, where the Blue Hens look to build on the success they achieved during last year's 20-win season that included a bid to the Women's NIT. Coach Tina Martin's team is headlined by 2010 All-American and CAA Player and Rookie of the Year Elena Delle Donne, who leads a young but talented squad that returns four starters. The nation's third-leading scorer and the league's second-best rebounder in 2009-10 with nearly 27 points and nine rebounds, Delle Donne will be joined in the frontcourt by classmate Danielle Parker (5.4 ppg/5.5 rpg) and junior center Jasmine Gibson (2.6ppg/2.4rpg), in addition to the team's lone newcomer, rookie center Kelsey Buchanan. Returning in the backcourt for the Hens are junior guards Jocelyn Bailey (5.0 ppg/4.4 rpg) and Kayla Miller (3.5 ppg/3.1apg). Also expected to make an impact this season is sophomore guard Lauren Carra, who came off the bench to contribute 6.0 ppg last year.

## DREXEL

Drexel will rely on an experienced core of four starters in its quest to capture a second conference title in three years and make a third straight post-season appearance. The top returnees in the Dragons' veteran lineup are a pair of double-digit scorers in junior guard Kamile Nacickaite (11.6ppg/4.5rpg) and senior guard Jasmina Rosseel (10.3 ppg/3.0 rpg). They each averaged two treys per game for a Drexel squad that led the league from behind the arc with 6.5 threes per contest. Joining the dynamic duo in the backcourt are junior Marisa Crane (5.9 ppg/4.3 apg) and sophomore Hollie Mershon (2.5 ppg), whose versatility on the floor should earn her a more prominent role in 2010-11. Up front for the Dragons will be junior Tyler Hale (5.1 ppg/4.0 rpg) and sophomore Taylor Wootton (2.7 ppg), who coach Denise Dillon hopes can help fill the shoes of departed star Gabriela Marginean.

## GEORGE MASON

George Mason welcomes back all five starters to a veteran squad that has the potential to make a move up the CAA standings this season. Leading the charge for the Patriots will be senior guard Brittany Poindexter, whose 11.8 ppg paced the team and ranked in the league's top 10 last year. Joining Poindexter in the backcourt will be senior Ashleigh Braxton (8.5 ppg/3.7 rpg) and versatile sophomore Amber Easter, who was named to the CAA All-Rookie squad after averaging 11.1 ppg and nearly six boards per contest. Senior center Angelee LaTouche (4.6 ppg/6.1 rpg) and sophomore Janaa Pickard (3.1 ppg), the league's second-leading shot blocker a year ago, will give Mason a strong presence in the frontcourt. Sophomore guard Rahneeka Saunders will also be counted on to spark the squad on both ends of the court after she tallied team-highs in steals (53) and assists (79) last season.

## GEORGIA STATE

Georgia State anticipates much success with the arrival of first-year coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener, a proven winner most recently at the helm of East Carolina. She takes the reins of a Panther program that welcomes back six letterwinners and a pair of starters this season. GSU will feature a formidable frontcourt with the return of senior Angelique Burttts (10.2 ppg/4.6 rpg) and junior Chan Harris, who is back from an injury-plagued 2009-10 season in which she contributed 11.0 ppg and 6.2 rpg in six games. Sophomore Cody Paulk (1.7 ppg) and transfer Letecia Davenport will also be expected to step in up front. In the backcourt, senior Traci Haltiwanger (3.6 ppg/1.7 rpg) and junior Tiffany Anderson are the most experienced returnees. The Panthers have added JUCO transfer Lanajia Ernest and talented freshman Kendra Long to help in the backcourt.

## HOFSTRA

Hofstra looks to continue its winning ways in 2010-11 after capping off last year's 20-win campaign by advancing to the second round of the WNIT. Coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey welcomes back a trio of starters and six reserves. Sophomore standout Shante Evans shined for the Pride last season, pouring in 13.3 ppg and grabbing 9.5 rpg en route to earning All-CAA Second Team and All-Rookie Team honors. Junior center Marie Malone (4.5 ppg/4.2 rpg) joins Evans to form a solid presence up front. Hofstra is blessed with an experienced core of guards. Junior Candice Bellocchio, who contributed 7.9 ppg and dished out a league-best 4.7 apg, will run the point with junior Nicole Capurso (9.7 ppg) and sophomore Candace Bond (2.7 ppg/3.4 rpg) on the wings. Capurso knocked down a team-high 58 three-pointers a year ago.

## JAMES MADISON

James Madison captured its first CAA title since 1989 last season and advanced to postseason play for the fifth year in a row. The Dukes are primed for another run at the conference crown with the return of 10 letterwinners, including four starters and several top reserves. All America guard Dawn Evans, the nation's fifth leading scorer a year ago, earned All-CAA First Team accolades after scoring 24.6 ppg and finding her teammates for nearly five assists per outing. Helping Evans' cause in the backcourt will be CAA-All Rookie selection Tarik Hislop (5.2 ppg/6.6 rpg) and classmate Nikki Newman (4.9 rpg). Veteran Kiara Francisco (4.8 ppg) will give the Dukes additional depth on the exterior. Seniors Lauren Jimenez (9.0 ppg/5.0 rpg) and Jalissa Taylor (5.2 ppg/6.6 rpg) provide a strong presence in the post, while the league's third-leading shot blocker, Kanita Shepherd (4.5 ppg/1.0 bpg), provides defensive prowess.

## UNC WILMINGTON

There is great anticipation at UNC Wilmington as first-year head coach Cynthia Cooper-Dyke attempts to move the Seahawks to the top of the CAA standings. Among the team's nine letterwinners back this season are a pair of returning starters. Senior forward Brittany Blackwell, who netted all-conference honors for the third consecutive season, ranked in the league's top 10 in both scoring (12.9 ppg) and rebounding (7.7 rpg) last year. Teaming up with Blackwell in the frontcourt will be senior Martha White (9.4 ppg), who ranked seventh in the league in blocked shots, and classmate Treasure Johnson (6.5 ppg). Sophomore Jessica Freeman (6.5 ppg) and junior Kristen Hanzer (4.9 ppg) will anchor a Seahawk backcourt that will be bolstered by a trio of rookie guards. Junior Julia Finlay and sophomore Brittany Gamby give the Seahawks added depth on the wings.

(3.8 ppg) and Jaleesa Dryver (3.0 ppg). Back to play in the post for the Tigers will be 6-2 senior Dovile Miliauskaite (3.1 ppg/3.4 rpg), who will get help underneath from classmate Jessica Haywood.

## VCU

Following three straight 20-win campaigns and a third consecutive trip to the postseason, VCU coach Beth Cunningham looks to sustain her program's recent success with a pair of returning starters and several top returnees. Junior forward Courtney Hurt earned third-team All-CAA honors after ranking 10th in the league in scoring (13.7 ppg) and fifth in rebounding (7.7 rpg). Sophomore Daphne Adebayo will see increased playing time in the post, while the Rams also receive help from a new face in JUCO product Sonia Johnson. Directing VCU's guard play will be junior Jennifer Lane, who netted nearly

five points to go with 3.3 assists per contest last year. Senior Jessica Taylor (2.9 ppg) and sophomore Robyn Hobson (1.2 ppg) will receive added roles in the backcourt alongside Lane. The Rams are also expecting a big year from JUCO transfer Andrea Barbour.

## NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern seeks to build on the progress it has established in four years under coach Daynia La-Force Mann. The Huskies welcome back a pair of returning starters in juniors Kashaia Cannon (7.5 ppg) and Jamie Conroy (6.3 ppg). Cannon was lights out from three-point land for an NU squad that tied a school record with 193 treys last season, shooting 35.2% overall from behind the arc and knocking down 41% of her long-range attempts in conference play. Unselfish Conroy found her teammates for a team-high 101 assists and was second on the squad with 44 steals. Sophomores Deanna Kerkhof (3.8 ppg) and Afreyea Tolbert (2.1 ppg) will be expected to play more prominent roles in the backcourt, while the same will be true for classmate Rachael Pecota (4.7 ppg) up front.

## WILLIAM & MARY

There is plenty of experience at William & Mary, where coach Debbie Taylor returns a strong nucleus 10 letterwinners, including four starters. The Tribe's top returnee is junior Taysha Pye, who secured second team all-conference honors after finishing the year as the league's seventh-leading scorer with 16.4 ppg. Juniors Janine Aldridge (8.6 ppg) and Katherine DeHenzel (7.0 ppg), along with versatile sophomore Taylor Hilton (5.6 ppg/4.4 rpg), combine with Pye to provide the Tribe with one of the most lethal backcourts in the league. W&M also expects to be strong in the frontcourt thanks to the return of sophomore standout Emily Correal, who collected

## OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion finished atop the CAA regular-season standings a year ago on the way to its 18th postseason appearance in the last 19 years. The Lady Monarchs have high expectations this year as legendary coach Wendy Larry welcomes back four starters and a number of top reserves. ODU's three leading scorers are back, including senior Jasmine Parker, who contributed 11.1 points and 2.4 steals per game en route to earning All-CAA Second Team and All-Defensive Team accolades. All-CAA Third Team selection Shadasia Green (10.7 ppg/5.3 rpg) will team up with senior Kquanise Byrd (3.9 ppg) and sophomore Jackie Cook (4.8 ppg) to offer ODU a solid presence in the backcourt. Junior Tia Lewis (11.2 ppg/7.6 rpg) anchors the post after ranking among league leaders in scoring and rebounding. She will be joined by classmate Mairi Buchan (4.8 ppg).

Senior Simona Petronyte (3.8 ppg), who finished second on the team in three-pointers a year ago, is the lone starter among a squad of veteran reserves that punched the program's first postseason ticket in 40 years last season in the WBI. Joining Petronyte in the backcourt and helping fill the gap left by departed star Shanae Baker-Brice are seniors Charmonique Watt

**HUNGRY FOR MORE:** Eight players who earned All-CAA honors are back, including All-America honorees Elena Delle Donne from Delaware and Dawn Evans of James Madison. The CAA teams also return 65% of their starters from a year ago.

**TOP GUNS:** Two of the top five scorers in the nation return in the CAA. Delaware forward Elena Delle Donne, 2010 CAA Player and Rookie of the Year, and James Madison guard Dawn Evans finished the 2009-10 season averaging 26.7 and 24.6 points per game, respectively. The CAA returns 13 of the season's top 20 scorers and 10 of the top 20 rebounders. The conference also welcomes back eight of the top 10 leaders in assists.

**TWO CAA PLAYERS ADDED TO WADE TROPHY WATCH LIST:**

Colonial Athletic Association women's basketball standouts Elena Delle Donne of Delaware and Dawn Evans of James Madison were added to the 2010-11 Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) State Farm® Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year pre-season watch list. Delle Donne, one of only four sophomores to earn a spot on the list, led Delaware to a 21-12 record and a berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) as a freshman. The Blue Hens' forward was named the CAA Player and Rookie of the Year and became the first player in UD history to earn All-America honors when she garnered third team Associated Press and honorable mention Women's Basketball Coaches Association accolades. Evans, a senior guard at JMU, was also a member of the Wade Trophy watch list in 2009-10. She ranked fifth in the nation in scoring with 24.6 points per game, was third nationally in three-pointers per game (3.6) and also was third in the CAA with 4.6 assists per game last season. Evans, who received honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press, was also among the candidates for the Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy.

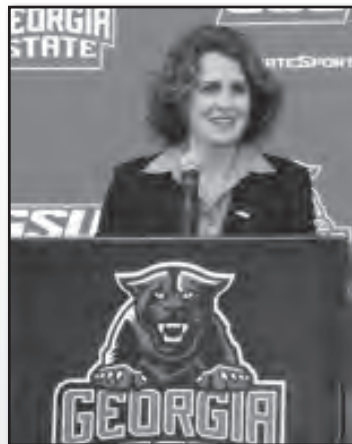


All 12 teams made at least one television appearance in 2009-10.

**INCREASE OF INTEREST:** The 2010 CAA Women's Basketball Championship welcomed 11,022 fans over the four day event, which was the most the tournament has seen since 2003 when Old Dominion hosted and entertained 11,536 spectators. The championship game was in front of 3,385 fans, which is the highest recorded attendance in the last decade.

**TWO NEW HEAD COACHES WELCOMED TO THE LEAGUE:**

Two CAA schools will have new head coaches this season. UNC Wilmington hired Cynthia Cooper-Dyke, who has previously served as head coach at Prairie View A&M. The former college great, Olympic gold medalist and Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Most Valuable Player was enshrined into the James Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on August 13 in Springfield, Mass. She replaces Ann Hancock. Georgia State hired Sharon Baldwin-Tener to replace Lea Henry. Baldwin-Tener had spent the past eight seasons at East Carolina and previously was the head coach Mercer and Life.

**RECORD-HIGH SEVEN TEAMS IN POSTSEASON PLAY:**

For the first time in conference history, the Colonial Athletic Association sent seven women's basketball teams to the postseason. James Madison earned a bid in the NCAA Women's Basketball tournament, while Old Dominion, Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and VCU earned bids to the Women's National Invitation Tournament and Towson played in the Women's Basketball Invitational. For the fifth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason and for the 10th consecutive season the CAA had a representative in the WNIT. The CAA was just one of four conferences to see five teams in the WNIT. The Big Ten, Big East and Atlantic 10 also saw five conference teams advance to the postseason event.

**TV EXPOSURE:** The CAA surpassed its all-time record of 25 game (2007-08) with 27 games aired during the 2009-10 season. All 12 teams made at least one television appearance. The CAA women's basketball television package has aired over 20 games for at least the last three seasons.

It will be the first time that The Show Place Arena has served as host of the CAA women's championship. All games in the four-day, 11-game tournament will be played at the 5,000-seat arena, with the winner earning an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The CAA has continued to enhance its reputation as one of the nation's top women's basketball conferences with at least three teams advancing to post-season play in each of the last five years, including a league-record three teams in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship.

Tournament play tips off at Noon on Thursday, March 10 and continues through Sunday, March 13 with the crowning of the 2011 champion.

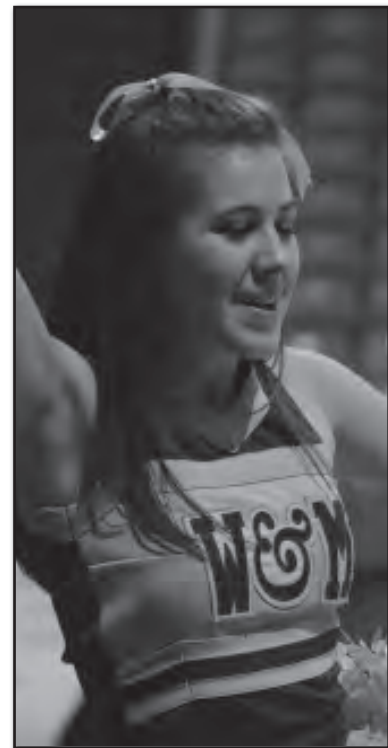

## TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

### 1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
  - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

### 2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

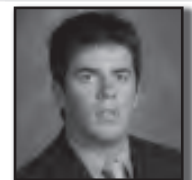

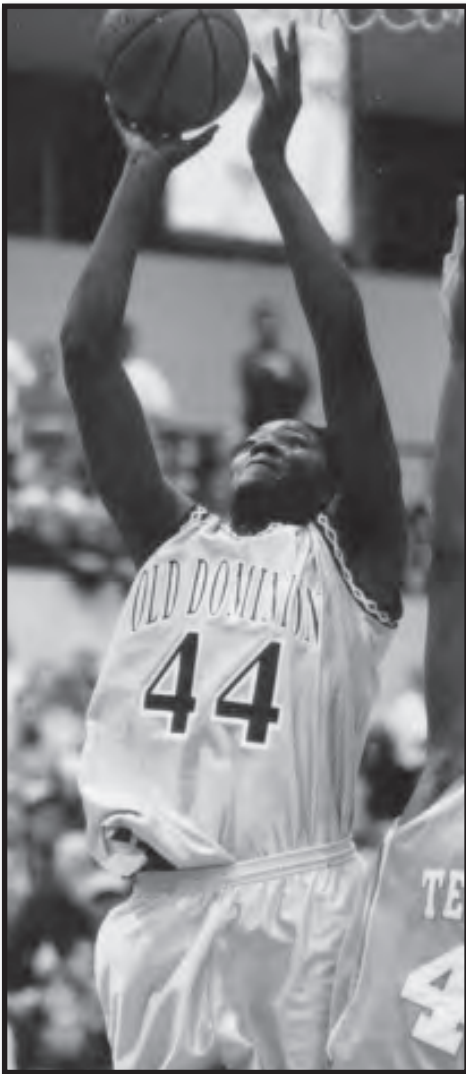

## PLAYER & ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

### ELENA DELLE DONNE, Delaware

Delaware's Elena Delle Donne became just the second player in conference history to earn CAA Player and Rookie of the Year accolades in the same season. She joined Old Dominion's Lucienne Berthieu, who earned both honors in 1999. The freshman forward/guard from Delaware led the conference and ranked third in the nation in scoring with 26.7 points per game. She scored a conference- and school-record 774 points during her freshman campaign. Delle Donne also topped the conference in free throw percentage (89.8%) and ranked second in three-point (41.3%) percentage. She broke numerous records during the 2009-10 season, including her CAA-record 54-point performance against James Madison on Feb. 18.



## COACH OF THE YEAR

### WENDY LARRY, Old Dominion

Old Dominion's Wendy Larry guided the Lady Monarchs to their 15th CAA regular-season title with a 14-4 record. ODU started the season just 3-10 overall, but reeled off eight straight victories and captured 16 of its final 21 contests. Larry is the winningest coach in CAA history with a career mark of 539-192. The Coach of the Year honor was the eighth for Larry, the most by any CAA coach.



## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### KITA WALLER, VCU

VCU's Kita Waller was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year after leading the conference with 2.6 steals per outing. The senior guard led her team with 69 steals to help the Rams rank second in the league with 10.4 steals per game. Waller is VCU's first Defensive Player of the Year since Rochelle Lockett won the award for the third straight time in 2002.



## DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

### GABRIELA MARGINEAN, Drexel • BRITTANY GRAHAM, Georgia State

Drexel's Gabriela Marginean and Georgia State's Brittany Graham were the second co-winners the Dean Ehlers Leadership award, which is presented annually to the women's basketball student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, and sportsmanship in conjunction with her academic athletic achievement." Marginean, a senior forward, is the league's all-time scoring leader with 2,519 points, while Graham, a senior guard, was Georgia State's premiere three-point shooter with 46 treys last season.

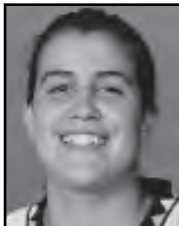

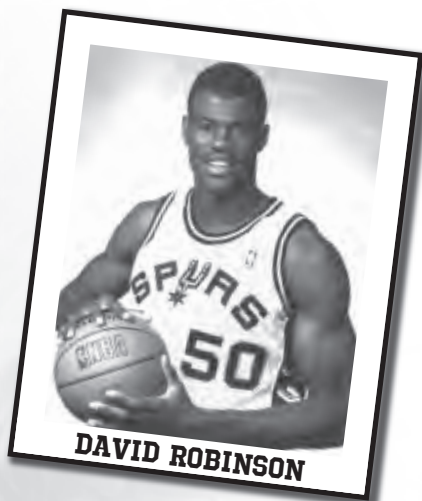

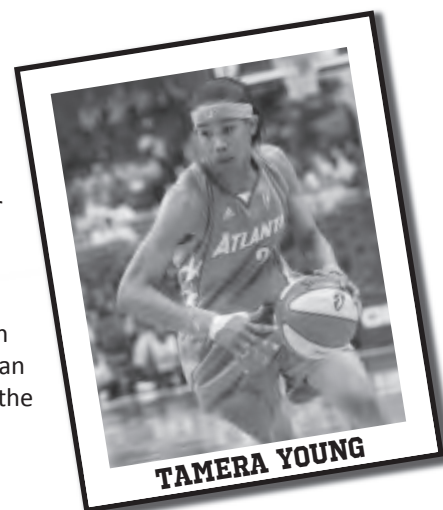
