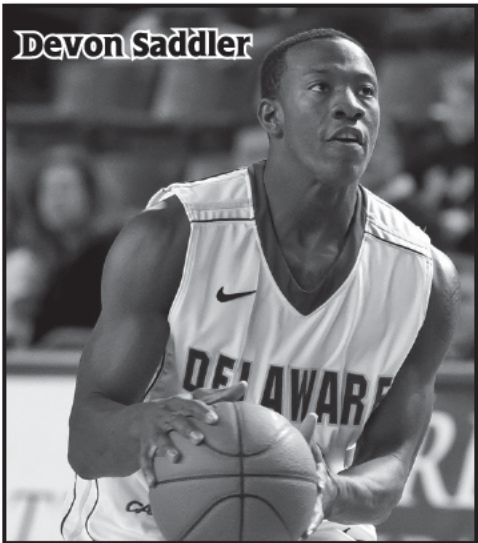

**T**om Yeager is in his 28th year as the only commissioner in the history of the Colonial Athletic Association. He is currently the longest-tenured commissioner of a Division I conference.

Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has transformed what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a league with a presence in virtually all of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. With the addition of six new members over the past decade, the CAA has positioned itself in five of the nation's top nine media markets from Boston to Atlanta and has enhanced its reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 23 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past seven years, with 65 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths. The CAA has seen two men's basketball teams advance to the NCAA Final Four (George Mason – 2006, VCU – 2011) over the past six seasons and the conference had three teams selected to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time in 2011. In women's basketball, the CAA placed a league-record three teams in the 2007 NCAA Tournament and had a pair of teams selected to the NCAA's in 2009.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 23 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. In 2011-12, the CAA honored more than 1,900 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 20 members of his staff.

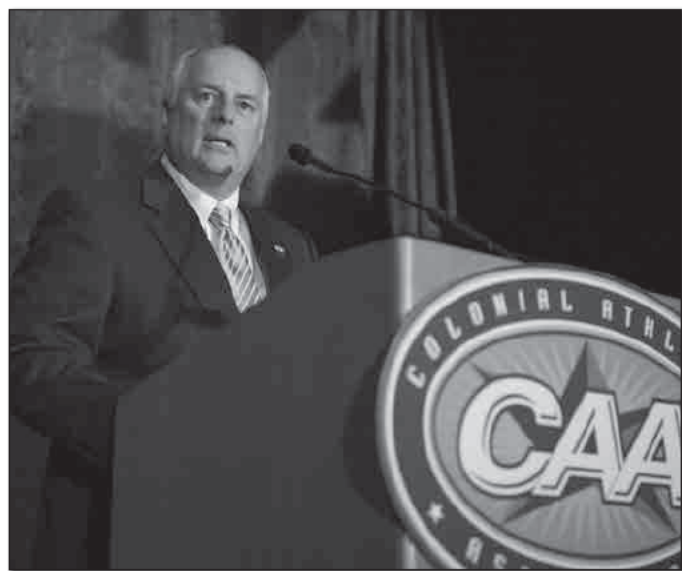
Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. Currently, he is a member of the Board of Directors for the NCAA's college football and men's basketball officiating LLCs. Yeager is a former chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and the former chair of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year prior to joining the NCAA staff. In November 2009, Yeager received Springfield's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Yeager, 62, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

The Colonial Athletic Association has built a reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically.

The CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 22 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2011-12, more than 1,900 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 19 teams in 13 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2012.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 30 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (8), Atlanta (9) and Baltimore (27). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 23 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2011-12, 24 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 51 student-athletes received All-America honors in 16 different sports.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with two teams – George Mason (2006) and VCU (2011) – advancing to the NCAA Final Four over the past six years. Three CAA teams earned NCAA Tournament berths for the first time in 2011 as conference champion Old Dominion was joined by VCU and George Mason. VCU knocked off USC, Georgetown, Purdue, Florida State and top-seeded Kansas, while Mason defeated Villanova. In 2006, George Mason captured the nation's imagination by becoming the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, posting victories over Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way.

At least five CAA teams have reached postseason play for the past four years.



## THE CAA ON TELEVISION

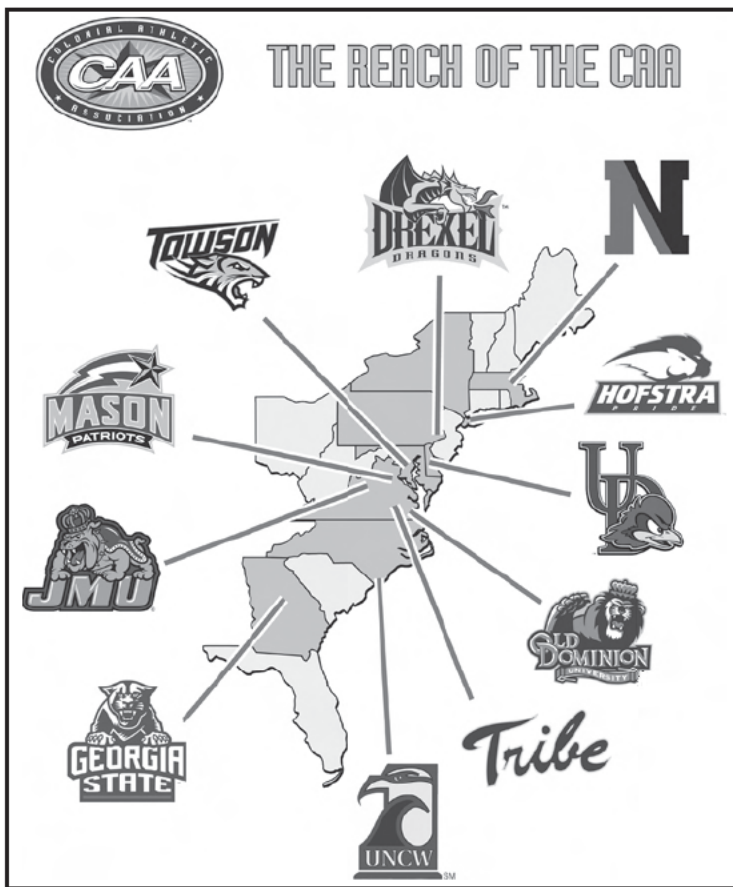
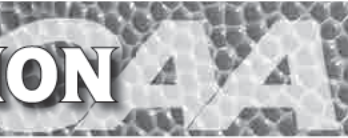
The Colonial Athletic Association will feature one of the most extensive television packages in league history in 2012-13. The conference will have 18 national telecasts on the NBC Sports Network and will have more than 30 games televised regionally by Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as The Comcast Network. The CAA will also have national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN3. Other affiliates such as MSG, FOX Sports New York, Cox Communications in Fairfax and Norfolk Va., WECT in Wilmington, N.C., and WSKY in Hampton Roads are regular carriers of CAA Basketball.

The CAA has also had great success in women's basketball, with six teams making the postseason in 2011-12. Conference champion Delaware advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time and was ranked #7 in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll. James Madison beat two ACC and two Big East teams to reach the championship game of the WNIT. Drexel, Hofstra, UNCW and VCU joined the Dukes in the WNIT. Old Dominion, which won an NCAA-record 17 straight CAA titles from 1992-2008, boasts three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981 and ODU reached the national semifinals in 2011. Four men's soccer teams earned NCAA Tournament berths last season and James Madison became the seventh CAA team to reach the final 16 of the event in the past decade. Hofstra's softball team won the Los Angeles Regional and became the first CAA squad to advance to the NCAA Super Regionals. At least two women's soccer teams have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in three of the past five seasons. William & Mary's men's cross country squad has made the NCAA Championship in 12 of the past 13 years. In the pool, George Mason's Ashley Danner finished second in the 100 breaststroke and fifth in the 200 breaststroke at the 2012 NCAA Championship and received All-America honors. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. On the track, Mason's David Verburg placed fourth in the 400 meters at the NCAA Championship. The CAA has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship in nine of the last 15 years and has had

at least 12 players selected in the eight of the last 10 Major League Baseball drafts. The conference also boasts numerous All-Americans in lacrosse, tennis, golf, women's lacrosse and wrestling.

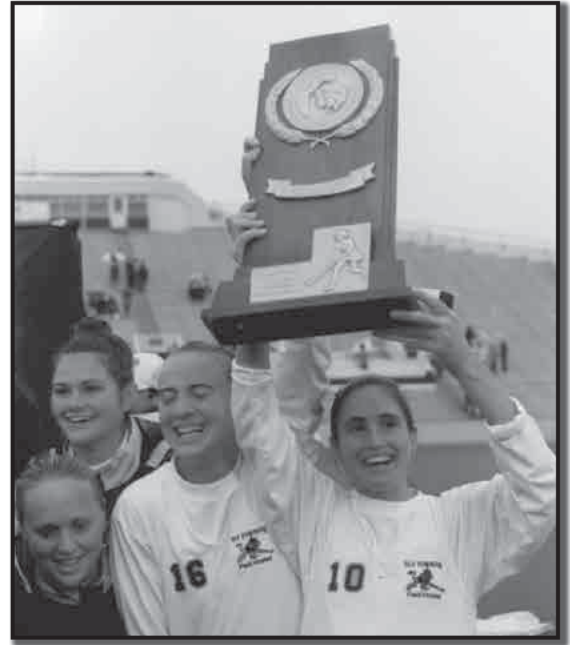
CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs that have been established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

## COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the 11 colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.



The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all 11 universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:

### UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the "best and brightest" undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 11 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. This year's conference will be held at Northeastern University. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

### VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted "visiting academic status" at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

### INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.

### RESOURCE SHARING

The 11 institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools – that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

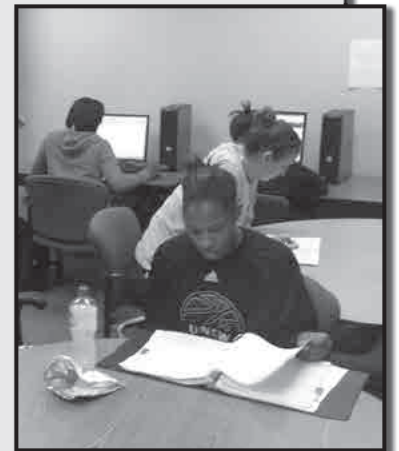
### UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share "best practices" in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA "alternative spring break" will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

### ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the 11 institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

# 2012-13 CAA TEAM OUTLOOKS **CAA**

## DELAWARE

Delaware will be among the favorites for the CAA title as the Blue Hens return four starters from last year's 18-14 team that advanced to post-season play for the first time since 2000. Junior guard Devon Saddler earned second-team All-CAA honors after ranking second in the league and 27th in the nation in scoring with 18.8 ppg. Joining him in the backcourt are sophomore Jarvis Threatt (10.7 ppg), who averaged 19.6 ppg over UD's final eight games and made the CAA All-Rookie squad, and sophomore Kyle Anderson (8.9 ppg), who knocked down a team-high 68 treys. In the frontcourt, senior Jamelle Hagins was a second-team All-CAA pick after scoring 12.4 ppg and ranking among the top 10 in the nation in rebounding (11.1 rpg/5th) and blocked shots (3.0 bpg/9th). Senior forward Josh Brinkley (8.7 ppg/4.7 rpg) is also back and UD adds 6-foot-8 junior Carl Baptiste, a transfer from Saint Joseph's.

Drexel is coming off a record-setting 29-7 campaign that included winning its first CAA regular-season title and advancing to the NIT quarterfinals. With all but one letterman returning, the Dragons should be strong once again. Junior point guard Frantz Massenat earned first-team All-CAA and Mid-Major All-America honors after scoring a team-high 13.7 ppg and leading the CAA in assists (4.8 apg) and 3-point FG percentage (45%). He is flanked on the wings by sophomore Damion Lee (12.0 ppg), who was the 2012 CAA Rookie of the Year, and senior Derrick Thomas (8.1 ppg), who will be a fourth-year starter. Senior guard Chris Fouch (10.8 ppg) made the All-CAA third team in 2010-11 and is a prolific 3-point shooter. There is also size and experience up front with senior Daryl McCoy (4.3 ppg, 6.7 rpg) and junior Dartaye Ruffin (5.6 ppg, 4.9 rpg). Redshirt freshman Tavon Allen should see significant action.

## DREXEL

## GEORGE MASON

George Mason posted an impressive 24-9 record in its first season under Coach Paul Hewitt. While the Patriots must replace their top two scorers, plenty of experienced players return. Junior guard Sherrod Wright (9.6 ppg) scored double figures in seven of Mason's final eight games and is poised for a breakout season. He'll be joined in the backcourt by junior Vertrail Vaughns (8.8 ppg), who made a team-high 42 threes a year ago, and junior point guard Bryon Allen (7.5 ppg), who ranked fifth in the CAA in assists (3.7 apg). Sophomores Corey Edwards (2.5 ppg) and Vaughn Gray (3.4 ppg) saw significant playing time as rookies and should again contribute. There will be a battle for starting spots in the frontcourt with junior Jonathan Arledge (4.3 ppg, 3.1 rpg), sophomore Erik Copes (3.3 ppg, 3.7 rpg) and junior Johnny Williams, who missed last season due to injury, being the top contenders.

Georgia State made huge strides in its first year under Coach Ron Hunter, recording the second-most wins (22) in school history, reaching postseason play for the first time in a decade and posting its best finish ever in the CAA. The Panthers will continue to feature an aggressive defense that limited opponents to just 38% FG shooting and averaged 9.5 steals per game, but newcomers are expected to provide much of the offense. Junior point guard Devonta White, who was among the CAA's top 15 in scoring (12.9 ppg), assists (2.9 apg) and steals (1.8 spg) is GSU's lone returning starter. Freshmen RJ Hunter and David Travers are the favorites to join him in the backcourt. Virginia Tech transfer Manny Atkins should make an immediate impact at the forward spot along with freshman Markus Crider. Returning in the post is 6-foot-10 senior James Vincent (3.2 ppg, 2.0 bpg).

## HOFSTRA

Injuries and several close losses resulted in Hofstra slipping back in the CAA standings a year ago, but the Pride should be improved with a mix of three returning starters and promising newcomers. Back to run the point for Hofstra is senior Stevie Mejia (6.0 ppg), who averaged 11.8 ppg over his final five games last season. Sophomore Taran Buie, a transfer from Penn State, is expected to start at shooting guard. Freshman Dallas Anglin should also see action in his rookie year. Up front, senior David Imes (7.0 ppg, 5.4 rpg) is a two-year starter who missed the final five games last season due to injury. Hofstra is hoping for a big impact from 6-foot-7 junior Jamal Coombs-McDaniel, who was a solid contributor on UConn's national championship team in 2011. Also returning in the post are junior Stephen Nwaukoni (4.6 ppg, 5.3 rpg) and sophomore Moussa Kone (3.2 ppg).

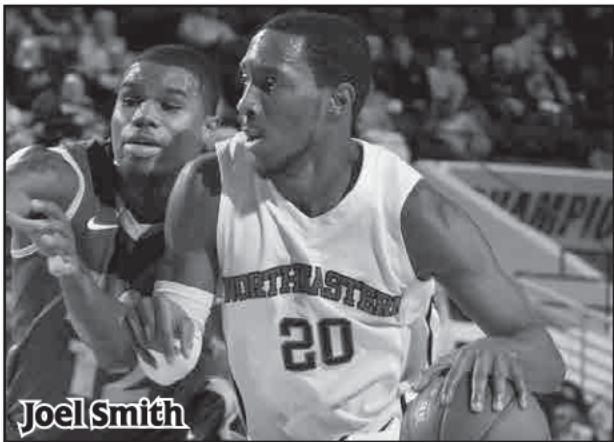

Davis, who ranked fourth in the CAA in scoring (15.9 ppg) and reached the 20-point mark 11 times in his first year with the team. Senior Devon Moore (8.8 ppg, 4.2 apg) is already among the school's all-time assists leaders and begins his fourth season as JMU's starting point guard. Senior forward Andrey Semenov (10.2 ppg, 4.8 rpg) shot 44% from three last season and provides toughness on both ends of the floor. The Dukes will get a big lift from the return of senior post player Rayshawn Goins (9.7 ppg/6.8 rpg in '10-11), who missed last season with a shoulder injury. Sophomore forward Enoch Hood (5.4 ppg) and guard Arman Marks (4.6 ppg) made good contributions in their rookie years.

UNCW is optimistic that a blend of seven returning lettermen with a host of talented newcomers will lead to more victories in 2012-13. The Seahawks feature one of the league's top players in senior forward Keith Rendleman, who earned first-team All-CAA honors after ranking among the top six in the conference in scoring (15.3 ppg), rebounding (10.0 rpg) and FG percentage (53%). He's joined up front by sophomore Cedrick Williams (5.5 ppg), who made 25 starts and led all CAA rookies in rebounding (5.7 rpg) a year ago. Senior Matt Wilson provides size and experience. Tanner Milson (5.5 ppg), who hit 38 threes last season, and Freddie Jackson (3.4 ppg) are the top backcourt returnees. Red-shirt freshman Craig Ponder, who suffered a season-ending injury early last season, is back at the point. Among the top newcomers are Rutgers transfer guard Tyree Graham, JUCO guard Chris Dixon and redshirt freshman forward Luke Hager.

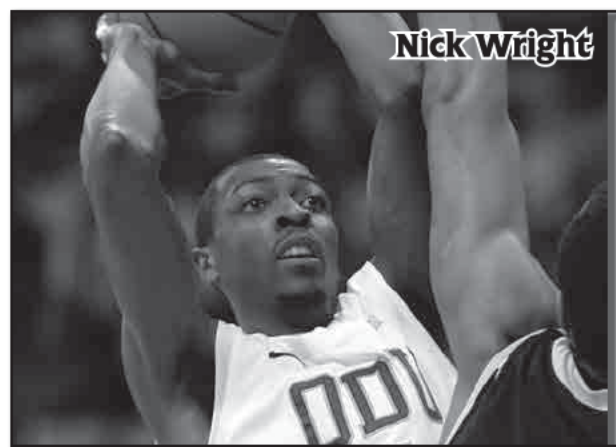

Smith was 13th in the CAA in scoring (12.9 ppg) and knocked down a team-high 72 threes. At forward, Quincy Ford earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team after averaging 11.5 ppg and 5.0 rpg while also leading the Huskies in steals (60) and blocks (31). 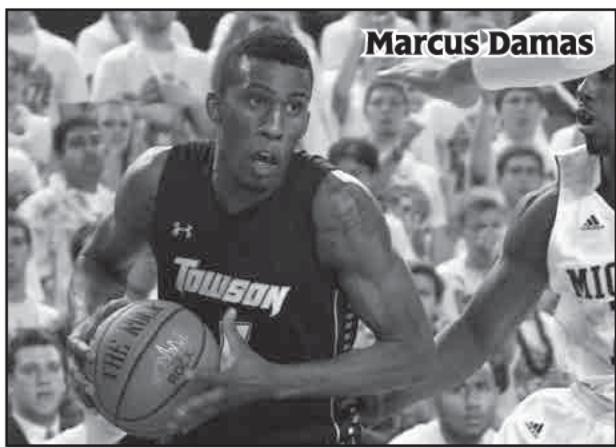


## OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion continued its run of success last season with a 22-14 record and an eighth consecutive postseason appearance. The Monarchs will have a different look with only two returning starters, but plenty of talent is on hand. Senior forward Nick Wright (8.4 ppg, 5.2 rpg) is ODU's most experienced player. He will be joined inside by 6-foot-9 senior transfer DeShawn Painter, who contributed 6.2 ppg and 4.9 rpg at N.C. State last season. Back on the wing is sophomore Richard Ross (4.3 ppg, 3.9 rpg), who contributes in several phases of the game. In the backcourt, sophomore Dimitri Batten (8.0 ppg) showed the potential to become one of the league's top performers. Junior guard Donte Hill (7.6 ppg) earned a starting spot in his first season after transferring from Clemson. Among the freshmen who could see immediate action are guards Keenan Palmore and Aaron Bacote and forward Ekene Anachebe.

Towson enters the second season of its rebuilding process under Coach Pat Skerry with the majority of its roster made up of newcomers who will provide a significant upgrade in talent. The Tigers return only three lettermen, but two were starters. Junior forward Marcus Damas ranked among the top 20 in the CAA in scoring (12.5 ppg) and rebounding (5.3 rpg), while sophomore guard Kris Walden contributed 6.6 ppg and led the squad in assists (3.2 apg) and steals (1.3 spg). Three Division I transfers are expected to have an immediate impact in the frontcourt. Jerrelle Benimon, a 6-8 junior from Georgetown, provides scoring and rebounding at power forward. Mike Burwell, a 6-6 junior from USF, is a strong shooter from the wing. At center is 6-9 Bilal Dixon, who made 68 starts over three seasons at Providence. Freshmen Jerome Hairston, Timajh Parker-Rivera and Barrington Alston and junior Rafriel Guthrie will see action.

## WILLIAM & MARY

Expect William & Mary to bounce back from a difficult 2011-12 season as 11 letterwinners return, including five of the team's top six scorers. Leading a deep and talented backcourt is sophomore Marcus Thornton, who made the CAA All-Rookie squad after scoring double figures 18 times and averaging 11.1 ppg. Joining him will be junior Brandon Britt (9.0 ppg), who made the 2011 All-Rookie team. Senior Matt Rum (6.3 ppg) and junior Julian Boatner (4.4 ppg) are skilled three-point shooters. The Tribe's top inside threat is junior Tim Rusthoven (10.3 ppg, 6.6 rpg), who scored double digits in 10 of W&M's final 14 games and is a 55% career FG shooter. The Tribe will benefit from the return of junior wing Kyle Gaillard (5.8 ppg), who missed last season with a knee injury. Adding frontcourt depth are junior Fred Heldring and sophomore Tom Schalk. Freshman wing Terry Tarpey should contribute.

**All-CAA Returnees:** The CAA welcomes back five players who earned all-conference honors in 2011-12. Returning from the All-CAA first team are Drexel guard Frantz Massenat and UNCW forward Keith Rendleman. Back from the second team are Delaware guard Devon Saddler and Blue Hens' forward Jamelle Hagins. Northeastern guard Jonathan Lee was a third-team honoree in 2012.

**Majority Of Starters Are Back:** The CAA's 11 teams return 56% (31-of-55) of their starters from a year ago. Delaware, Drexel and Northeastern each have four regulars returning, while Hofstra, James Madison, UNCW and William & Mary have three starters back. In addition, 10 of the CAA's top 20 scorers will be back in 2012-13 as will nine of the top 20 players in rebounding.

**New TV Deal:** As part of its new five-year agreement with the NBC Sports Group, the CAA will have 18 men's basketball games televised nationally on the NBC Sports Network this season, including the semifinals and finals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship. In addition, 26 games will be televised by the Comcast SportsNet regional networks, including the quarterfinals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship.

**Tournament Draws Sellout Crowds:** The 2012 CAA Men's Basketball Championship set a new tournament attendance record with 47,833 fans, breaking the mark of 46,544 set in 2011. For the first time ever, three sessions - the second quarterfinal session, the semifinals and the finals - were played before sellout crowds of 11,200. It was the fifth straight year that attendance has exceeded 42,000.

**Postseason Success:** CAA teams have combined to win 36 games in postseason play since 2006, including 13 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that seven-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT. The CAA has had at least five teams reach postseason play for the past four years.

**CAA In The Final Four:** Only five other conferences (Big East, SEC, Big Ten, ACC, Pac-12) have had more NCAA Final Four appearances over the past seven years than the CAA. The CAA has also had at least one team post an NCAA Tournament victory in five of the past seven years.

**Piling Up The Wins:** For the first time ever, the CAA had five teams with 22 or more wins in 2011-12 as Drexel (29), VCU (29), George Mason (24), Georgia State (22) and Old Dominion (22) all hit the mark. The 29 wins by Drexel were a school record and the second-most ever for a CAA team, trailing only Navy's 30 in 1985-86.

**Tough Defense:** The CAA featured some of the top defensive teams in the nation last season. Four teams - Drexel (56.1 ppg/5th), Georgia State (58.9 ppg/11th), VCU (59.8 ppg/19th) and Old Dominion (62.1 ppg/50th) were ranked among the nation's top 50 in scoring defense, while GSU (38.0%/4th), Drexel (39.2%/17th), George Mason (39.3%/18th), Delaware (39.3%/20th) and ODU (40.2%/30th) were among the top 30 nationally in FG percentage defense. Drexel was 7th in the nation (29.0%) in 3-point FG% defense, while GSU was 4th (9.3 spg) and ODU was 10th (8.8 spg) in steals.

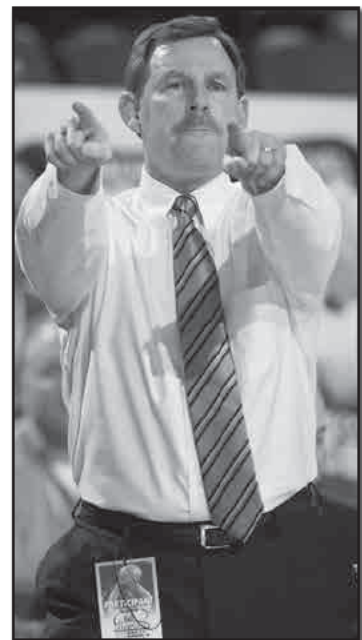

## TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

### 1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
  - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

### 2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

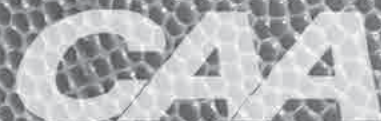
- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

- Ranked third on the team in scoring last season with 10.3 ppg. Talled double figures in 10 of W&M's last 14 games.
- Led the Tribe in rebounding with 6.6 rpg. Grabbed 10+ boards four times and posted three double-doubles.
- Shot a team-best 54.5% from the floor and also led W&M in blocked shots (21).

### MARCUS THORNTON • So. • G

- Selected to the CAA All-Rookie team in 2011-12.
- Ranked second on the team and 23rd in the CAA in scoring with 11.1 ppg. Scored double figures in 18 of 32 games and topped the 20-point plateau three times.
- Poured in a career-high 28 points on 10-of-12 FG shooting (5-of-6 from 3) against VCU, which was the most points by a W&M freshman since 2005.



# 2012 CAA AWARD WINNERS



## PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### **RYAN PEARSON, George Mason**

George Mason's Ryan Pearson was selected as the 2012 CAA men's basketball Player of the Year, becoming the first Patriots' player to receive the award since George Evans in 2001. The senior forward was the league's third-leading scorer with 17.0 points per game and tallied double figures 27 times. He also ranked fifth in the conference in rebounding (8.2 rpg) and seventh in field goal percentage (50.3%). His 12 double-doubles were the fifth-most in the CAA. Pearson finished his George Mason career ranked fifth all-time in scoring with 1,626 points and ninth all-time in rebounding with 806 caroms.



## COACH OF THE YEAR

### **BRUISER FLINT, Drexel**

Drexel's Bruiser Flint received CAA Coach of the Year honors for the fourth time in 2012. He guided the Dragons to their most victories in school history with a 29-7 overall mark and capped the season by reaching the NIT quarterfinals. Drexel won its final 16 conference games to earn its first CAA regular-season title and put together a school-record 19-game winning streak from Jan. 4-March 5. Flint's four CAA Coach of the Year awards are tied for the most in conference history.



## ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

### **DAMION LEE, Drexel**

Damion Lee became the second Drexel player to earn CAA Rookie of the Year accolades. The freshman guard was the Dragons' second-leading scorer with 12.0 points per game and also ranked second on the team in steals (30), fourth in rebounding (4.4 rpg) and fourth in assists (62). He scored double figures 22 times, including a team-high 20 points in the CAA championship game which landed him a spot on the all-tournament team. Lee made 63 three-pointers and shot 37.5% from beyond the arc.



## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### **KENT BAZEMORE, Old Dominion**

Old Dominion's Kent Bazemore was chosen as the CAA Defensive Player of the Year for the second year in a row. The senior guard ranked second in the CAA and 26th in the nation with 2.1 steals per game and his 74 steals were the 10th-highest season total in league history. The first-team All-CAA honoree was also fifth in the conference in scoring (15.4 ppg), 10th in assists (3.1 apg) and 14th in rebounding (6.1 rpg). Bazemore ranks second on the CAA's all-time steals list with 250.



## DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

### **JIHAD ALI, Georgia State & QUINN MCDOWELL, William & Mary**

Georgia State senior guard Jihad Ali and William & Mary senior forward Quinn McDowell were chosen as co-recipients of the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, which is presented annually to a basketball player who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship." Ali was GSU's second-leading scorer with 12.5 points per game and ranked ninth in the CAA in steals (1.6 spg) and 15th in rebounding (6.0 rpg). McDowell averaged a team-high 12.5 points per game and was the Tribe's second-leading rebounder (4.8 rpg). He became the fourth player in W&M history with more than 1,500 points and 500 rebounds in a career.

As part of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association honored Silver Anniversary teams in 21 championship sports. Chosen by a panel of current and former head coaches, the 25-member teams featured the "best of the best" in the conference's storied history.

The 25th Anniversary men's basketball team included 16 former CAA Players of the Year, seven NBA draft picks, and several players who were key performers during some of the conference's greatest moments in the NCAA Tournament.



The CAA has had at least five teams participate in postseason play for the past four years. League teams have won 36 postseason games over the past seven seasons, including 13 victories in the NCAA Tournament. Highlighting that success has been a pair of Final Four teams - George Mason (2006) and VCU (2011). CAA teams have also won the CBI and CIT during that time period. # 2006 FINAL FOUR: GEORGE MASON

The CAA had two teams advance to the NCAA Final Four in a five-year period with George Mason in 2006 and VCU in 2011. The accomplishment places the CAA in elite company as only five other conferences have made more Final Four appearances than the CAA since 2006. There were many similarities in the two runs. Both the Rams and Patriots were at-large selections and played their opening game in Dayton, Ohio, both received #11 seeds in the tournament, and both had to upset #1 seeds in the regional finals to reach the Final Four. Here's a game-by-game look at each team's Road to the Final Four!



## #11 George Mason 75, #6 Michigan State 65 • March 17, 2006 – First Round – Dayton, Ohio

George Mason won its first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off 6th-seeded Michigan State, 75-65. Sophomore guard Folarin Campbell scored a team-high 21 points on perfect 8-for-8 FG shooting and forward Will Thomas posted a double-double with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Mason was ahead just 52-51 with 6:41 to go, but reeled off 10 unanswered points and never let the Spartans get closer than six points the rest of the way.

## #11 George Mason 65, #3 North Carolina 60 • March 19, 2006 – Second Round – Dayton, Ohio

George Mason became the first CAA team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 1988 with a 65-60 upset of 3rd-seeded North Carolina. The Patriots fell behind 16-2 early, but rallied to within 27-20 at the break and then scored the first eight points of the second half to grab the lead. Senior guard Lamar Butler, who tallied 16 of his team-high 18 points in the second half, hit two free throws to give Mason a 56-54 lead with 2:52 to go and nailed a key jumper with 1:06 left. The Patriots made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds to seal the win.

## #11 George Mason 63, #7 Wichita State 55 • March 24, 2006 – Sweet 16 – Washington, D.C.

George Mason led from start to finish in beating 7th-seeded Wichita State, 63-55, to advance to the Elite Eight. The Patriots opened the game on a 9-0 run with a three-pointer by Lamar Butler and back-to-back treys from Folarin Campbell. Mason went on to bury 7-of-11 shots from beyond the arc in the first half and led 35-19 at the break. The Patriots pushed the margin to 19 with 17:21 left and never let the Shockers get closer than seven the rest of the way. Campbell finished with 16 points while Butler and Tony Skinn added 14.

## #11 George Mason 86, #1 Connecticut 84 (ot) • March 26, 2006 – Elite 8 – Washington, D.C.

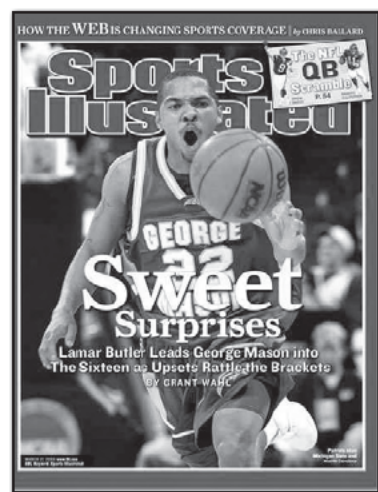
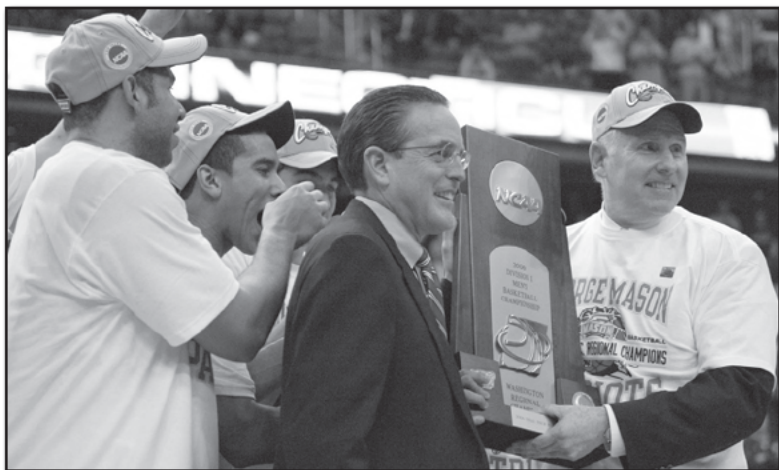
George Mason became the first team in CAA history to advance to the NCAA Final Four by shocking top-seeded Connecticut, 86-84 in overtime. The Patriots trailed by nine at the break but shot 56% in the second half, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to stage a remarkable comeback. Mason grabbed its first lead, 52-51, on a Lamar Butler trey with 11:10 to go and was up 74-70 with 18 seconds left in regulation after a pair of Butler free throws. UConn forced overtime with a layup at the buzzer, but the Patriots made 5-of-6 from the floor and never trailed in overtime. Mason went ahead 86-81 with 25 seconds to go, but had to survive a missed 3-point attempt by the Huskies as the horn sounded. All five Patriots' starters scored in double figures, led by senior forward Jai Lewis with 20 points and Butler with 19. Will Thomas recorded his second straight double-double with 19 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.



squad since 1979 and the first #11 seed since 1986 to reach the Final Four. The Patriots would finish the season ranked #8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll.

## #3 Florida 73, #11 George Mason 58 • April 1, 2006 – National Semifinals – Indianapolis, Ind.

George Mason's Cinderella season came to an end as the Patriots lost to eventual national champion Florida, 73-57, at the NCAA Final Four. Mason trailed just 31-26 at halftime, but the Gators hit three straight treys to open the second period and never let the Patriots get closer than nine points the rest of the way. Seniors Tony Skinn and Jai Lewis each scored 13 points for Mason, which was the first mid-major





**#11 VCU 59, #11 USC 46 • March 16, 2011 – First Four – Dayton, Ohio**

VCU turned in a stellar defensive effort and defeated USC, 59-46, in the inaugural First Four. The contest was tied 22-22 at the break, but Jamie Skeen opened the second half with a three-pointer and the Rams never trailed after that. VCU drained six treys over the final 20 minutes and converted numerous second-chance points. Skeen finished with a team-high 16 points and nine rebounds and junior Bradford Burgess added nine points and a 10 boards.

**#11 VCU 74, #6 Georgetown 56 • March 18, 2011 – Second Round – Chicago, Ill.**

VCU made 12 three-pointers and dominated 6th-seeded Georgetown, 74-56, to record two wins in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Senior Brandon Rozzell hit 6-of-10 from beyond the arc and scored a team-high 26 points, while guard Joey Rodriguez contributed 17 points and seven assists. VCU trailed 19-18 midway through

the first half when Rozzell made a three that put the Rams in front for good. VCU was ahead 35-24 at the break and then opened the second half on a 14-4 run to put the game away. The Rams' defense forced the Hoyas into 17 turnovers.

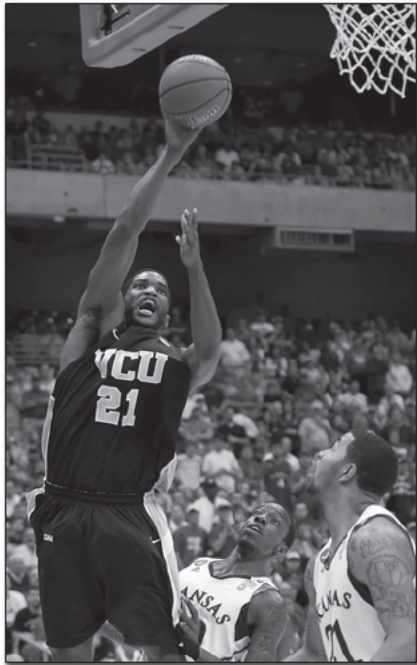


**#11 VCU 94, #3 Purdue 76 • March 20, 2011 – Third Round – Chicago, Ill.**

VCU recorded its third victory in five days, cruising past 3rd-seeded Purdue 94-76 to advance to the Sweet 16 for the first time ever. Led by 23 points and eight rebounds from Bradford Burgess, the Rams had six players score in double figures for the first time in three years. Guard Joey Rodriguez posted a double-double with 12 points, 11 assists and no turnovers. Trailing 18-13, VCU went on a 23-6 run and eventually took a 42-32 advantage into halftime. The Rams hit 7-of-8 shots to start the second half and pushed their lead to 67-48 with 11 minutes to go. VCU shot 57% for the game and had 26 assists with only four turnovers.

**#11 VCU 72, #10 Florida State 71 (ot) • March 25, 2011 – Sweet 16 – San Antonio, Texas**

Bradford Burgess made a layup off an inbounds pass with 7.1 seconds left and Jamie Skeen blocked a shot at the buzzer, giving VCU a 72-71 overtime victory against 10th-seeded Florida State. The Rams led 36-31 at the half and held a 57-49 cushion with 10:17 to play before the Seminoles rallied to send the game into overtime at 65-65. VCU trailed 71-70 when Burgess converted off the inbounds play for the last of his team-high 26 points. The Rams shot 45.3% from the floor, including 12-of-26 from 3-point range. Brandon Rozzell chipped in 16 points off the bench and Skeen had 11 points and eight boards.



**#11 VCU 71, #1 Kansas 61 • March 27, 2011 – Elite 8 – San Antonio, Texas**

Senior Jamie Skeen scored 26 points as VCU delivered the biggest upset of the NCAA Tournament by knocking off #1 Kansas, 71-61, to advance to the NCAA Final Four. The Rams became just the third #11 seed to reach the Final Four. VCU stormed out of the gates, hitting 9-of-12 from 3-point range in the first half to open up a 41-27 advantage at the break. The Jayhawks rallied to within 46-44 with 13:11 left, but the Rams responded with a 10-2 run to regain control. Brandon Rozzell added 12 points but it was VCU's defense that stole the show. The Rams held Kansas to a season-low 61 points on 36% FG shooting, including 2-of-21 on three-pointers.

**#8 Butler 70, #11 VCU 62 • April 2, 2011 – National Semifinals – Houston, Texas**

VCU's amazing run to the Final Four came to an end with a 70-62 setback to 8th-seeded Butler. Jamie Skeen was spectacular for the Rams with a game-high 27 points and Bradford Burgess contributed 15 points and nine rebounds. The Rams used an early 15-2 run to build an eight-point lead, but the

Bulldogs rallied to grab a 34-26 advantage at the break. VCU scored 10 of the first 12 points in the second half to move back in front 38-36 with 15:16 remaining, but Butler clamped down defensively and regained control. The Rams finished with a school-record tying 28 victories and were ranked #6 in the final ESPN/USA Today poll, which was the highest final ranking ever for a CAA team.



In addition to the Final Four runs made by George Mason in 2006 and VCU in 2011, the CAA has been known as a giant killer for pulling some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The list of CAA victims reads like a "Who's Who" of college basketball – Georgetown, Notre Dame, Syracuse and Villanova from the Big East, Auburn, LSU and South Carolina from the SEC, Ohio State and Indiana from the Big 10, Duke and Georgia Tech from the ACC and USC from the Pac 12. Since 1981, CAA squads have posted 23 wins over higher-seeded teams and 28 victories overall. Here's a brief look at the "bracket busters":

### 1981

#### #10 James Madison 61, #7 Georgetown 55

James Madison makes its first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance and defeats Georgetown 61-55 in Providence, R.I. Linton Townes, Charles Fisher and Steve Blackmon combined for 45 points in the victory. Two days later, the Dukes appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time, but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

### 1982

#### #9 James Madison 55, #8 Ohio State 48

The Dukes receive an at-large bid and defeat Ohio State, 55-48, in Charlotte, N.C. The Dukes scored 14 straight points in the second half and overcame an eight-point deficit. Dan Ruland scored 18 points and Linton Townes added 12 points and nine rebounds. JMU lost to eventual national champion North Carolina, 52-50 in the second round.

### 1983

#### #10 James Madison 57, #7 West Virginia 50

JMU records a first-round win for the third consecutive season, beating West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C.. Charles Fisher scored a team-high 13 points, including the 1,000 point of his career, to lead the Dukes. JMU lost to North Carolina in the second round for the second straight season.

### 1984

#### #12 Richmond 72, #5 Auburn 71

After defeating Rider 89-65 at the Palestra to make the field of 48, the Spiders got 26 points from John Newman and shocked Auburn 72-71 in the NCAA first round in Charlotte, N.C. Bill Flye added 19 points for UR, which overcame a 23-point, 17-rebound effort by future NBA star Charles Barkley.

### 1985

#### #13 Navy 78, #4 Louisiana State 55

For the fifth consecutive season, an ECAC-South member pulls the first round upset. Vernon Butler pours in a team-high 20 points and David Robinson grabs 18 rebounds as Navy thrashes LSU 78-55 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

After getting 30 points and 12 rebounds in a first-round win over Tulsa, CAA Player of the Year David Robinson tallies 35 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocks as Navy dominates Syracuse 97-85 on its home court at the Carrier Dome to reach the Sweet 16. The Middies then sink #14-seed Cleveland State 71-70 on a Robinson one-hander in the lane with five seconds left to earn a berth in the Elite 8. Navy falls to Duke in the Regional finals.

### 1988

#### #13 Richmond 72, #4 Indiana 69

Richmond held Indiana scoreless for the last 2:40 and knocked the defending national champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 triumph in Hartford, Conn. Rodney Rice scored a team-high 21 points, including a jumper with less than a minute to play that put the Spiders ahead to stay.

#### #13 Richmond 59, #5 Georgia Tech 55

Richmond earned its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16 as Peter Woolfolk tallied 27 points and nine rebounds in a 59-55 upset of Georgia Tech. The Spiders' defense limited the high-scoring Yellow Jackets to 5-of-22 shooting from 3-point range.



## 1991

### #15 Richmond 73, #2 Syracuse 69

In what the Washington Post calls “one of the greatest upsets in college basketball history,” Richmond becomes the first #15 seed to drop a #2 seed with a 73-69 win over Syracuse in College Park, Md. The Spiders never trailed and sealed the game when freshman Eugene Burroughs hit two free throws with 21 seconds left. Curtis Blair scored a team-high 18 points and Terry Connolly added 14 points off the bench.

## 1995

### #14 Old Dominion 89, #3 Villanova 81 (3 OT)

In perhaps the most exciting game in conference history, the Monarchs survive three overtimes and defeat Kerry Kittles and Big East champion Villanova, 89-81. CAA Player of the Year Petey Sessoms scores a career-high tying 35 points, including seven in the third OT. Before the night is over, most of the 15,100 fans in Albany’s Knickerbocker Arena are chanting “O-D-U.”

## 1998

### #14 Richmond 62, #3 South Carolina 61

The Spiders freshened their image as NCAA Tournament upset specialists with a 62-61 win over South Carolina in Washington, D.C. Richmond gets 24 points from CAA Player of the Year Jarod Stevenson and holds the Gamecocks scoreless over the final 1:16 for the victory.

## 2002

### #13 UNCW 93, #4 Southern Cal 89 (ot)

UNCW pulls the biggest upset in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, defeating Southern Cal 93-89 in overtime. Six Seahawks score in double figures, including senior reserve Stewart Hare who punctuates the victory with a mammoth dunk in the final minute. It’s the first NCAA Tournament win for UNCW and the school’s first victory over a ranked opponent.

## 2007

### #11 VCU 79, #6 Duke 77

Eric Maynor scores a team-high 22 points, including a 15-foot jumper with 1.8 seconds left, as VCU rallies for a 79-77 victory over Duke in Buffalo, N.Y. The Rams trailed by seven with 8:00 remaining before grabbing a 72-71 lead on a Jesse Pellot-Rosa jumper. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for VCU since 1985. The Rams rallied from a 19-point deficit to force overtime against Pitt in the NCAA second round before suffering an 84-79 setback.

## 2010

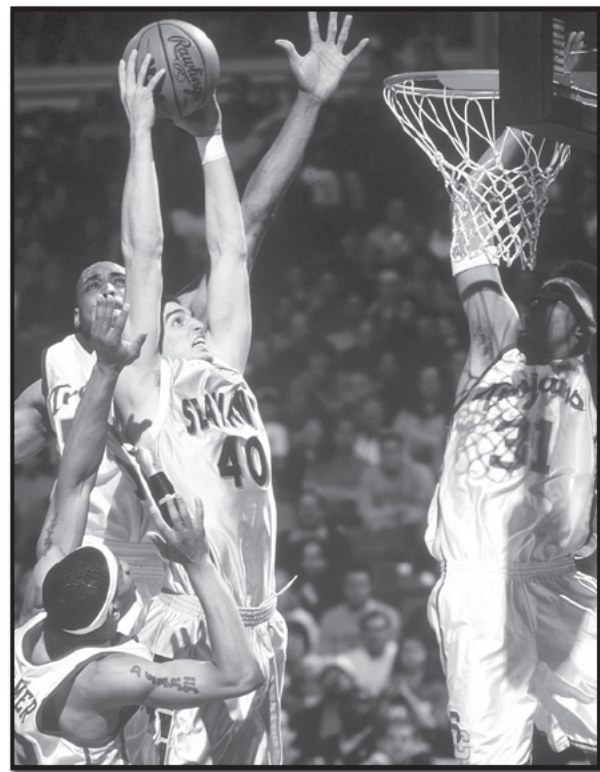
### #11 Old Dominion 51, #6 Notre Dame 50

ODU rallies from an eight-point second-half deficit to knock off Notre Dame, 51-50, in New Orleans, La. The Monarchs took a 48-46 lead on Gerald Lee’s jumper with 1:26 left and Keyon Carter sank a pair of crucial free throws with 10 seconds to go. The Irish missed a game-tying 3-pointer to give ODU its first NCAA Tournament victory since 1995. Frank Hassell had a team-high 15 points and nine rebounds and Carter added 11 points off the bench.

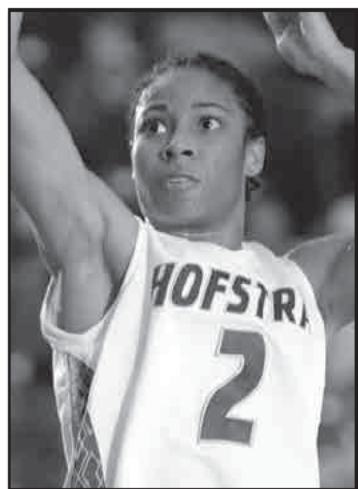
### #12 VCU 62, #5 Wichita State 59

# 2012-13 CAA TEAM OUTLOOKS **CAA**

## DELAWARE

Coming off the best season in school history, the Blue Hens welcome back all five starters from a squad that captured their first CAA title, advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and set a school record with 31 wins. Head coach Tina Martin will again rely on senior All-America forward Elena Delle Donne, who led the nation in scoring with 28.1 points per game and added a team-best 10.3 rebounds per contest to earn CAA Player of the Year honors for the second time in her career. She will be joined in the frontcourt by classmate Danielle Parker (8.6 ppg), who ranked eighth in the CAA in rebounding (7.5 rpg). The Blue Hens' backcourt is led by two-time All-CAA senior guard Lauren Carra (10.2 ppg), senior guard Trumae Lucas (6.8 ppg) and junior guard Akeema Richards (6.2 ppg). Senior guard Kayla Miller (2.2 ppg) provides depth in the backcourt, while junior center Kelsey Buchanan (3.4 ppg/2.3 rpg) assists in the post.

Mershon, a versatile guard/forward, is DU's top returning scorer and ranked ninth in the CAA averaging 14.5 ppg. Mershon is an excellent outside shooter who knocked down 56 treys a year ago. Joining Wootton in the backcourt will be senior guard Fiona Flanagan, who added 4.1 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. Head coach Jeri Porter returns three starters to a Patriots' squad which has the potential to make a move up the CAA standings after finishing 15-16 overall and 8-10 in the CAA in 2011-12. Senior guard/forward Amber Easter, who posted nine double-doubles last season, is George Mason's top returning scorer (12.0 ppg) and rebounder (7.0 rpg). She will be joined in the backcourt by classmate Rahneeka Saunders, who added 7.5 points per contest. Saunders dished out a team-best 4.0 assists per game, ranking fifth in the CAA. Redshirt junior forward Janaa Pickard helps on both ends of the floor as she contributed 8.5 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. She also ranked third in the CAA with 54 blocked shots. Junior guard Christine Weithman, who chipped in 4.4 points per game, and senior forward Joyous Tharrington (4.0 ppg) should provide depth after seeing ample time in nearly every outing a year ago.

Newcomers Maryam Dogo and Kesheria McNeil will battle for starting spots.

Evans, a two-time All-CAA first team and two-time honorable mention All-America honoree, ranked fourth in the CAA in scoring (19.2 ppg) and second in rebounding (10.5 rpg) last season. Bond (7.8 ppg/5.4 rpg) led the league in steals with 2.7 per outing. Sophomore guard Andreana Thomas (4.2 ppg) will step into the starting spot at point guard as the Pride graduated Candice Bellocchio, who led the league in assists in her final two seasons. Providing depth in the frontcourt is senior Deven Green (3.3 ppg) and junior Anma Onyeuku (3.3 ppg), while Annie Payton and Onyesonam Nolisa should contribute to the backcourt. 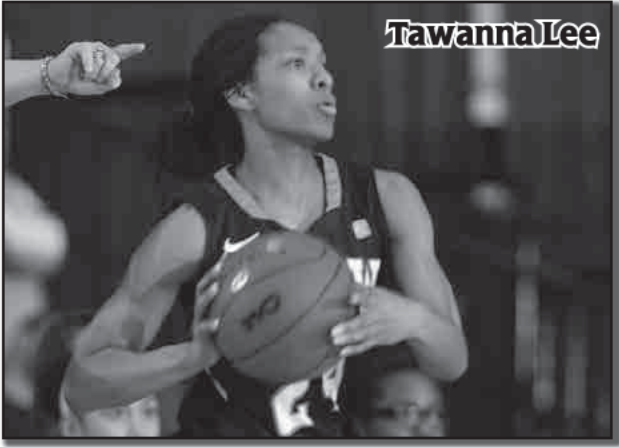

Garrett and Lee are the squad's top returning scorers as they each averaged 9.8 points per game last season. Garrett also led the team in rebounding (7.5 rpg) while Lee dished out 115 assists and is the only returning player that started every outing for UNCW in 2011-12. McGowen (4.9 ppg/5.9 rpg) made 17 starts in the post and shot 52.4% from the floor. Old Dominion returns seven letterwinners, including three starters, and has added five newcomers as head coach Karen Barefoot begins her second season at the helm of the Lady Monarchs. Senior guard Jackie Cook, the squad's top returning scorer (9.9 ppg) and rebounder (4.5 rpg), will team-up with sophomore guard Ashley Betz-White (8.1 ppg) to provide a strong presence in the backcourt for ODU. Betz-White, who was named CAA Rookie of the Year in 2012, led the Lady Monarchs in assists (3.4 apg). Senior Mairi Buchan (7.0 ppg) started in 17 outings and will head up the frontcourt for Old Dominion. Sophomores Shakeva Richards, Tiffany Minor, Queen Tiye Jackson and Shae Kelley, a transfer, should contribute in the frontcourt in conjunction with Buchan. 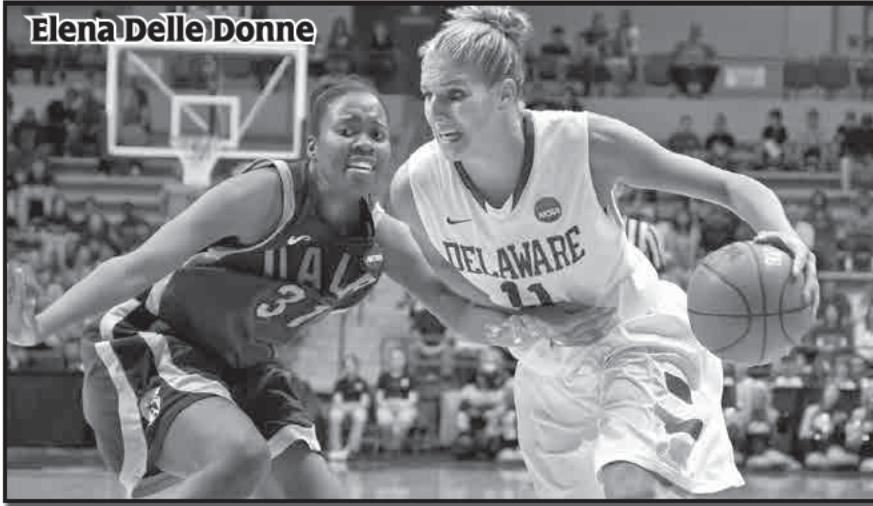
## WILLIAM & MARY

**Returning Award Winners:** Eight of the 16 players who received all-conference honors in 2011-12 return this season. Back from the All-CAA first team are Delaware's Elena Delle Donne and Hofstra's Shante Evans, who each earned All-America accolades. Three of the CAA All-Defensive team members will return, including CAA Defensive Player of the Year Nikki Newman of JMU. All but one member of the All-CAA third team is back. CAA teams also return 60% of their starters from a year ago. Delaware, for the second straight year, welcomes back its entire starting lineup, while James Madison and William & Mary each have four regulars returning.

**Encore, Encore:** Twenty of the CAA's top 30 scorers from last season are back in 2012-13, as are 12 of the top 20 in rebounding and eight of the top 12 in assists. Delaware senior forward/guard Elena Della Donne led the nation in scoring with 28.1 points per game, while Hofstra's Shante Evans was ranked 15th nationally in rebounding (10.5 rpg) and returns as the league's top rebounder.

### UNCW Names Adell Harris Head Coach:

Former Wake Forest standout and Tusculum College head coach Adell Harris was named the 10th coach in UNCW's women's basketball history. Harris, 31, takes over the Seahawk program after a successful three-year stint as head coach of the Pioneers, guiding the NCAA Division II school to a 61-30 overall record, back-to-back South Atlantic Conference Tournament championships (2010 & 2011) and three straight appearances to the NCAA Tournament. Harris replaces Cynthia Cooper-Dyke who resigned to take a head coaching position at Texas State University. Cooper-Dyke posted a 44-22 overall record, including a school-record 24 victories in 2010-11, and back-to-back trips to the postseason.



### Six Teams Dance In Postseason Play For the Third Straight Season:

The CAA saw six teams advance to the postseason, including conference champion Delaware. The 3rd-seeded Blue Hens, who participated in postseason play for the third straight season, defeated Arkansas-Little Rock in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and then fell to Kansas. Drexel, Hofstra, James Madison, UNCW and VCU were invited to the Women's National Invitation Tournament. JMU advanced to the WNIT Championship game with victories over Davidson, Wake Forest, South Florida, Virginia and Syracuse before falling to Oklahoma State. VCU earned a pair of victories over Bowling Green and St. Joseph's before falling to the WNIT defending champs Toledo, while Drexel defeated Fairfield in its fourth straight postseason appearance. Hofstra made its fourth appearance in the past

seven years and UNCW made its second straight appearance. It was the seventh consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason and for the 12th consecutive season the CAA had a representative in the WNIT, as the CAA was just one of three conferences to see five teams in the event.

### 2013 CAA Women's Basketball Championship, Welcome Back:

The 2013 CAA Women's Basketball Championship will return to The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md., for the third straight season. The 2012 outing was the second time that The Show Place Arena had served as host of the CAA women's championship. The Show Place was the first neutral site since 1998 for the CAA women's championship. Nearly 16,000 fans have attended the CAA Women's Basketball Championship at the Show Place Arena over the past two years.



**Growing Exposure:** The CAA surpassed its all-time record with a total of 43 games televised during the 2011-12 season, including the CAA tournament semifinal and championship games. All 12 teams made at least one television appearance. The CAA women's basketball television package has aired over 20 games for at least the last four seasons. The CAA also enjoyed a record amount of exposure through new media efforts.

## TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

### 1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

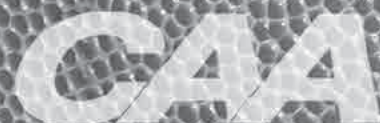
- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
  - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

### 2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

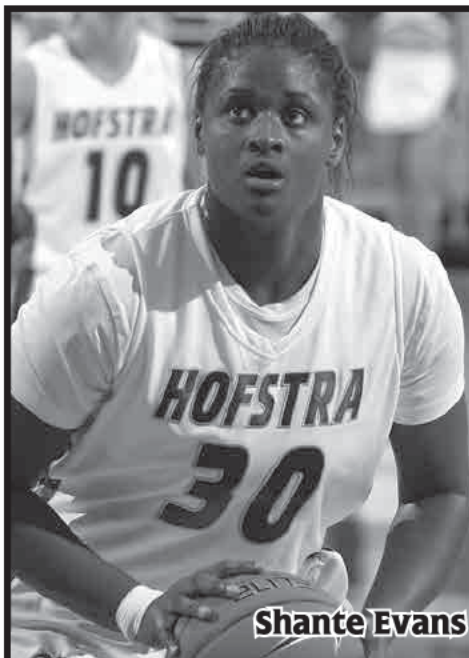

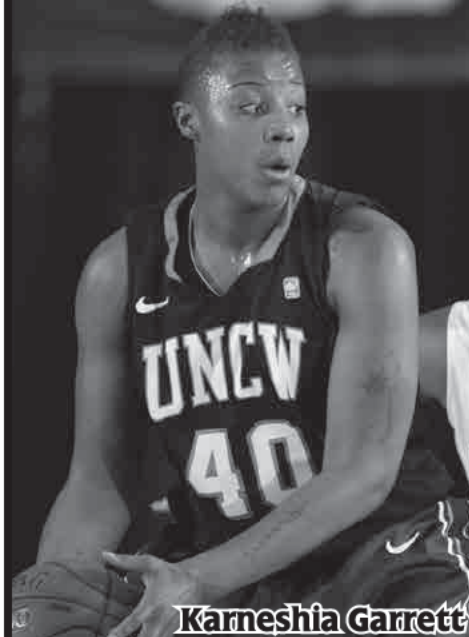

## COACH OF THE YEAR

### TINA MARTIN, Delaware

Tina Martin guided the Blue Hens to their best season in school history in 2011-12 with a 31-2 overall record and a perfect 18-0 mark in CAA play. Martin's squad broke the school record for wins in a season and Delaware earned a top-10 national ranking for the first time in program history. The Blue Hens captured the CAA women's basketball championship for the first time ever and also recorded their first victory in the NCAA Tournament. The CAA Coach of the Year honor was the second of Martin's career.



## ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

### ASHLEY BETZ-WHITE, Old Dominion

Old Dominion's Ashley Betz-White was honored as the 2012 CAA Rookie of the Year. The freshman guard, who was the only Lady Monarch to start all 32 games, finished the season ranked ninth in the CAA in assists (3.4 apg). She was just the sixth freshman in ODU history to record more than 100 assists in her rookie campaign. Betz-White led all CAA freshmen in scoring with 8.1 points per game, which included three 20-point efforts. The Mechanicsburg, Pa., native became the fifth Lady Monarch to be named Rookie of the Year and the first since 1999-2000.



## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### NIKKI NEWMAN, James Madison

Nikki Newman became the first James Madison player to earn the CAA Defensive Player of the Year award. The junior guard/forward, who was often given the assignment of guarding the opponent's top scorer, led the Dukes and ranked seventh in the conference with 7.8 rebounds per game. She was also eighth in the CAA in blocked shots (1.4 bpg) and made 58 steals. Newman helped the Dukes lead the league in field-goal percentage defense (34.0%) and rank third in scoring defense (56.9 ppg).



## DEAN EHLERS LEADERSHIP AWARD

### CANDICE BELLOCCHIO, Hofstra

Candice Bellocchio was the recipient of the Dean Ehlers Leadership award, which is presented annually to the women's basketball student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, and sportsmanship in conjunction with her academic athletic achievement." Bellocchio, a senior guard, started all 31 games for the Pride and led the league with 6.2 assists per game. She was fourth on the team in scoring, averaging 9.1 points per game.

**A**s part of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association honored Silver Anniversary teams in 21 championship sports. Chosen by a panel of current and former head coaches, the 25-member teams featured the "best of the best" in the conference's storied history.

The 25th Anniversary women's basketball team included 17 former CAA Players of the Year, eight WNBA draft picks and several players who were key performers during some of the conference's greatest moments in the NCAA Tournament.



For the sixth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason and for the 11th consecutive season the CAA had a representative in the WNIT. James Madison captured its sixth CAA championship and reached the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in school history. The Dukes, who reached postseason play for the sixth consecutive year, fell 86-72 to Oklahoma in the first round. Delaware, Drexel, UNCW, Old Dominion, and VCU received spots in the WNIT, with the Seahawks advancing to the second round.

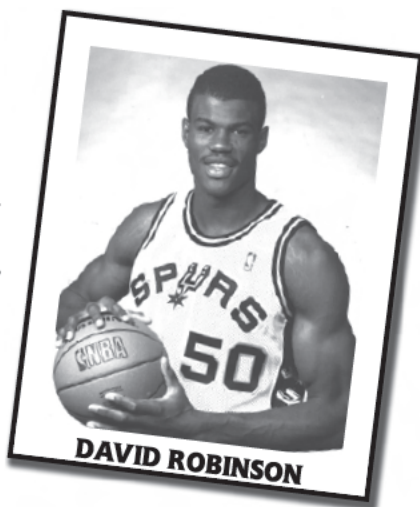

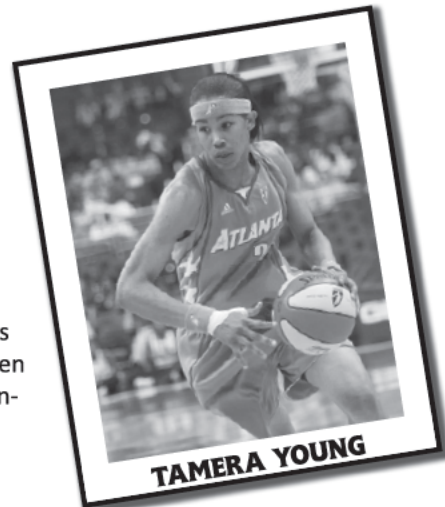

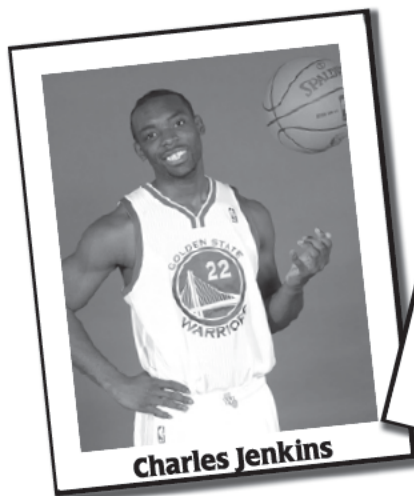
