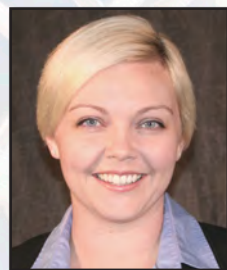

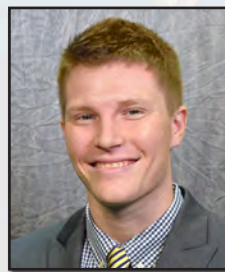

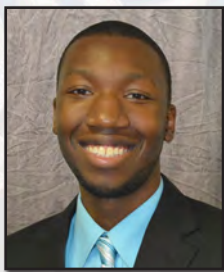

Tom Yeager is in his 29th year as the only commissioner in the history of the Colonial Athletic Association. He is currently the longest-tenured commissioner of a Division I conference.

Working with the conference presidents and athletic directors, Yeager has transformed what was once a Virginia/North Carolina conference into a league with a presence in many of the major metropolitan areas on the East Coast. The CAA footprint, which runs from Boston to Charleston, S.C., encompasses four of the nation's top nine media markets. The growth has enhanced the CAA's reputation as one of the most respected and well-run conferences in the nation.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 men's and women's sports and the conference is rated among the top 10 nationally in many of them. The CAA has seen unprecedented success in basketball over the past eight years, with 72 men's and women's teams earning post-season berths.

The CAA has seen two men's basketball teams advance to the NCAA Final Four since 2006 and the conference had three teams selected to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time in 2011. In women's basketball, the CAA placed a league-record three teams in the 2007 NCAA Tournament and last year had Delaware advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament while Drexel won the WNIT.

The CAA annually ranks among the top 15 in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings, demonstrating the league's all-around excellence. Over the years, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national coaches of the year and 13 national players of the year. The league also boasts five Rhodes Scholar student-athletes, 24 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 13 Honda Award winners. In 2012-13, the CAA honored more than 1,900 student-athletes who achieved a 3.2 grade point average with the Commissioner's Academic Award.

While his job responsibilities are far reaching, Yeager's major duties include negotiation of championship, sponsorship and television contracts, representing the conference with the NCAA and supervising the 20 members of his staff.

Yeager came to the conference office from the NCAA staff in Kansas City, where he was Director of Legislative Services. He joined the NCAA in 1976, spending five years as an investigator in the enforcement department. In 1981, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Legislative Services and in 1984 to Director.

In addition to his duties with the CAA, Yeager is also actively involved with NCAA affairs. Currently, he is a member of the Board of Directors for the NCAA's college football and men's basketball officiating LLCs. Yeager is a former chair of one of the NCAA's most important committees, the Division I Committee on Infractions, which hears and assesses penalties for violations of NCAA rules. Previously he served as a member of the NCAA Council and chaired the NCAA Interpretations Committee for eight years, in addition to serving on numerous other NCAA committees. Well respected by other commissioners, Yeager is also a former executive vice president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and was the chair of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee.

In April, 1994, the National Invitation Tournament recognized Yeager's contributions to college basketball by selecting him as the "NIT Man of the Year" joining a prestigious group of past recipients including John Wooden, Bobby Knight and Vic Bubas.

Yeager is a 1972 graduate of Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in education (1975). As an undergraduate, he was a member of the gymnastics team; as a graduate student, he was an assistant coach for the squad. After earning his first degree, Yeager worked at the YMCA in Allentown, Pa. He then returned to Springfield as a teaching fellow on the physical education faculty. After receiving his master's degree, he remained at Springfield as the assistant director of athletics for the 1975-76 school year prior to joining the NCAA staff. In November 2009, Yeager received Springfield's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Yeager, 63, and his wife Dorcas, also a Springfield graduate, have two children: Kyle and Hallie, both graduates of James Madison University.

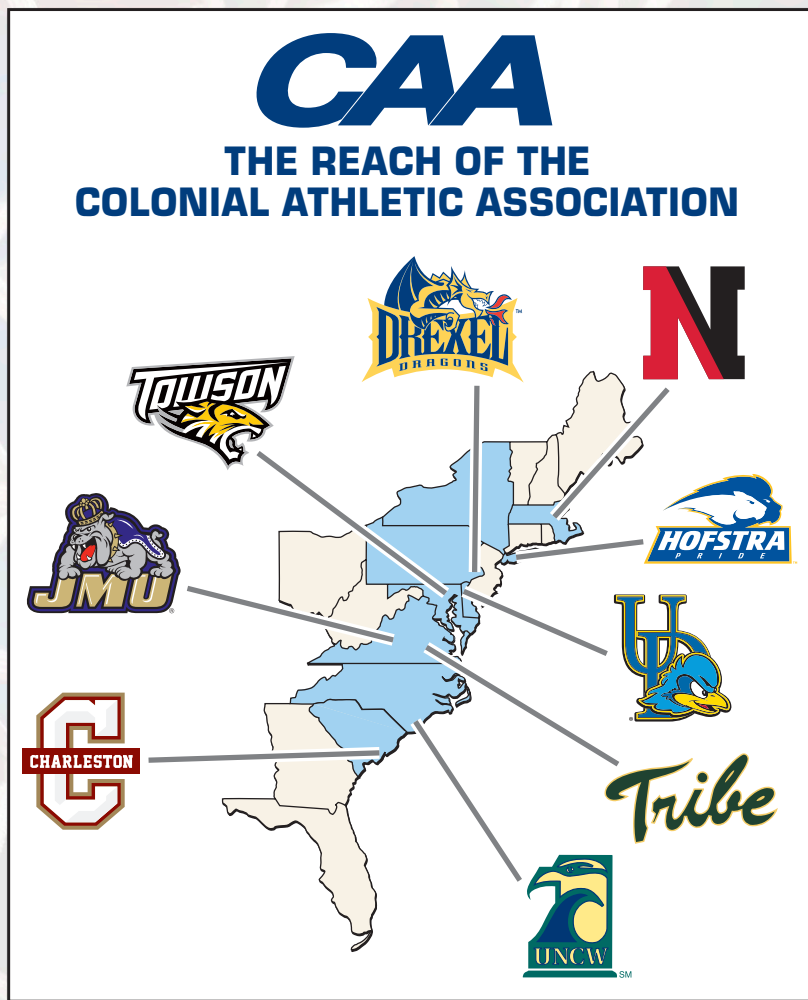
With nearly three decades of success athletically and academically, the Colonial Athletic Association has built a reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

The CAA encompasses many of the nation's largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Charleston, S.C. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 13 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 13 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 23 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2012-13, more than 1,900 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 23 teams in 15 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2013.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes several of the nation's top media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (9) and Baltimore (25). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis and track & field. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2012-13, 27 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 43 student-athletes received All-America honors in 14 different sports.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with two teams – George Mason (2006) and VCU (2011) – advancing to the NCAA Final Four over the past seven years. CAA teams have combined to win 41 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. The CAA has posted at least one NCAA Tournament win in six of the past eight years, including the last four in a row. The conference has seen five or more teams reach postseason play in four of the last five seasons.



In women's basketball, 2013 CAA champion Delaware defeated West Virginia and North Carolina to become the 12th CAA team to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Behind the play of Honda Award winner Elena Delle Donne, the Blue Hens finished the season ranked #13 in the final USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll. Drexel captured the WNIT championship with a 46-43 victory over Utah and James Madison reached the quarterfinals of the WNIT. CAA teams have gone 20-9 in postseason play over the past two years.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. Three men's soccer teams earned NCAA Tournament berths last season and each current member of the conference has reached the NCAA Tournament since 2006. In softball, Hofstra reached the NCAA Super Regionals in 2012 and the CAA placed two teams (Hofstra and James Madison) in the NCAA's for the first time last season. At least two women's soccer teams have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament three times in the past six seasons. William & Mary's men's cross country squad has made the NCAA Championship in 12 of the past 14 years and the women's team had two runners (Elaina Balouris and Emily Stites) earn All-America honors in 2012. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. The CAA sent three teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship in 2013 and has had at least 11 players selected in nine of the last 11 Major League Baseball drafts. The conference also had individuals earn All-America honors in women's lacrosse, track and field and swimming & diving last season and had players nationally ranked in tennis and golf.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university education and life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs that have been established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs, visiting faculty programs and a recent partnership with NBC Learn to provide educational videos to over 8,500 public schools across the United States.

THE CAA ON TELEVISION

The Colonial Athletic Association will again feature an extensive television packages in 2013-14. The conference will have 12 national telecasts on the NBC Sports Network and will have more than 30 games televised regionally by Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, SportsNet New York, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast and Comcast SportsNet New England as well as The Comcast Network. The CAA also had national telecasts on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3, along with the CBS Sports Network, FS1, the Big Ten Network and the Pac 12 Network.

CAA schools are also very active in community service projects. The CAA Blood Challenge, which is held each fall, has raised more than 36,000 units of blood over the past 11 years. The first-ever CAA Food Drive Challenge last winter resulted in over 9,500 pounds of donated food.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when two of its current members- James Madison University and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, George Mason University, the United States Naval Academy and the University

of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new conference. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Old Dominion University joined the CAA in 1991 and was followed by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference in 2005 and the College of Charleston began its first year as a CAA member on July 1, 2013. Elon University will join the conference beginning in 2014-15.

COLONIAL ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

The Colonial Academic Alliance is the academic consortium that links the nine colleges and universities of the Colonial Athletic Association in programs that improve the quality of teaching, learning and research for all.

The Alliance was created by the CAA presidents in 2002 and is administered by the provosts of the member institutions. It is a cooperative effort committed to enhancing all areas of excellence throughout each institution. Interest groups, representing various academic and administrative areas from all nine universities, jointly develop collaborative programs that benefit each member institution.

The Alliance extends its programs to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Its efforts are focused on the following areas:



UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

This annual symposium brings together more than 100 of the “best and brightest” undergraduate students and their faculty mentors from the 11 CAA institutions to share their research findings, develop a sense of academic community, and learn about career and graduate-school opportunities. The Alliance is also exploring the development of summer research opportunities for CAA students.

VISITING ACADEMIC STATUS FOR ATHLETIC TEAMS

Traveling CAA athletic teams have been granted “visiting academic status” at other Alliance institutions, allowing access to institutional libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs. This access will help to minimize the academic disruption caused by traveling to represent the institution in intercollegiate competition.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

CAA institutions have agreed to work together to coordinate study-abroad programs for students at CAA institutions, as well as develop new international programs that open new opportunities for students and faculty.

RESOURCE SHARING

The nine institutions are developing a network of programs and facilities – found only at one of the member schools -- that can be shared by other members of the Alliance.

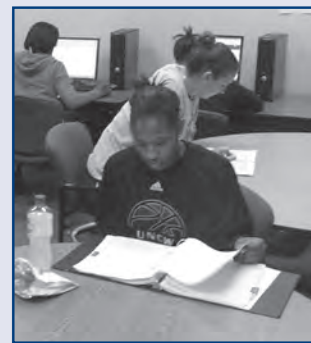
UNIVERSITY LIFE

Alliance members are planning staff exchange programs and other opportunities to share “best practices” in residential life and university life programs. In addition, a CAA “alternative spring break” will put CAA students to work side by side in community service.

ADVANCEMENT AND ALUMNI RELATIONS

Alumni relations directors from the nine institutions recently participated in a benchmarking survey for their programs, and are planning joint alumni events to unite graduates of the CAA schools.

The Colonial Academic Alliance reflects a commitment from the institutions for further excellence in all aspects of university operations. Collectively, these institutions comprise more than 20,000 students and nearly 10,000 full-time faculty, including three Nobel Prize-winning professors. By leveraging the strengths of each institution, the Alliance can build programs that no one college or university could undertake on its own.

The CAA is in the second year of a five-year agreement with the NBC Sports Group, which provides national television coverage of 12 men's basketball games on the NBC Sports Network, including the semifinals and finals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Comcast SportsNet regional networks, which have partnered with the CAA for the past 29 years, will regionally televise 35 additional men's and women's basketball games, including the quarterfinals of the CAA Men's Basketball Championship and the semifinals and finals of the CAA Women's Basketball Championship.

NBC Sports Network is available in more than 80 million homes and features coverage of the Summer and Winter Olympics as well as the National Hockey League, Premier League, Formula One, Major League Soccer, the IZOD Indy Car Series, the Tour de France and major college football and basketball. Comcast Sports Group, which includes CSN Mid-Atlantic, CSN Philadelphia, CSN-New England, The Comcast Network and CSS, consists of 14 regional networks that deliver 2,400 sporting events annually to more than 50 million homes.

The landscape of the CAA stretches along the majority of the East Coast and includes five of the nation's top 30 media markets. The number of television homes in the CAA footprint exceeds 20 million.

In addition, hundreds of men's and women's basketball games are available for viewing through CAA.TV and the websites of the CAA member schools, all promoted globally through the CAA's partnership with NBCSports.com.

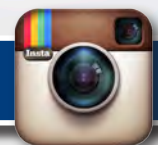

Welcome CofC: The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member College of Charleston for the 2013-14 season. Head coach Natasha Adair, entering her second season with the Cougars, led the team to a 16-16 overall mark a year ago for the third most wins in the last 23 years in program history. The Cougars then earned a postseason berth in the Women's Basketball Invitational and reached the quarterfinals, finishing the 2012-13 season having set 20 new school records. The Cougars welcome back three returning starters in Jillian Brown, Alyssa Frye and Afreyea Tolbert.

Majority Of Starters Are Back: The CAA's nine teams return 51% (23-of-45) of their starters from a year ago. Towson welcomes back four starters, while College of Charleston, Hofstra James Madison and Northeastern each return three starters from a year ago.

Hello My Name Is: The CAA is proud to introduce two new head coaches to the league along with CofC's Natasha Adair. Towson will be led by Niki Reid Geckeler, who came from Howard, while Ed Swanson will direct the Tribe after 23 years at the helm of Sacred Heart University.

Blue Hens Make NCAA Run In 2013: The CAA saw four teams advance to the postseason in 2012-13, including conference champion Delaware. The 6th-seeded Blue Hens, who participated in postseason play for the fourth straight season, advanced to the NCAA Regional Semifinal game after defeating 11th-seeded West Virginia and 3rd-seeded North Carolina on their home court. Delaware's historical run came to an end when it fell to 2nd-seeded Kentucky in Bridgeport. UD was the host of the first and second rounds at the Bob Carpenter Center. It was the first time a CAA member advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 since Old Dominion accomplished the feat in 2008.

Drexel, JMU Challenge WNIT Bracket; Drexel Wins Title: Drexel won the 2013 Women's National Invitation Tournament Championship with victories over Iona, Harvard, Bowling Green, Auburn, Florida and Utah. The Dragons were joined by CAA members, James Madison and Old Dominion in the postseason tournament. The Dukes, who advanced to the WNIT championship game in 2012, earned a trio of victories over North Carolina A&T, N.C. State and Fordham before falling to Florida in 2013. Old Dominion fell to Davidson in its third WNIT appearance. It was the eighth consecutive season at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason and the 13th consecutive season the CAA had a representative in the WNIT postseason tournament.

CAA In the Postseason

Recap: The CAA posted an impressive 11-3 postseason record in 2013 and has compiled a 20-9 postseason mark over the past two years. Over 28 seasons of CAA women's basketball, teams have accumulated 64 victories in postseason action.

Top Honors Return: The league welcomes back the 2012 CAA Defensive Player of the Year Nikki Newman as well as the 2013 CAA Rookie of the Year Precious Hall, both of James Madison. The Dukes also welcome back Kirby Burkholder a 2013 All-CAA first-team honoree, while Towson returns second-team All-CAA member Tanisha McTiller. Also returning from last season's All-CAA squad is third-team honoree Jewel Tunstull from Northeastern.

There's No Place Like The Show Place: The CAA women's basketball tournament returns to The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md., for the 2014 CAA Hoops Championship on March 13-16. It will be the fourth consecutive year that the league has held the tournament at the neutral site, as two different teams have been crowned champions - James Madison and Delaware (2).

The CAA Women's Basketball Championship will be played at The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md., on March 14-17, 2013. It will be the third straight year that The Show Place Arena has served as host of the CAA women's championship. All games in the four-day, eight-game tournament will be played at the 5,000-seat arena, with the winner earning an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The CAA has continued to enhance its reputation as one of the nation's top women's basketball conferences with at least three teams advancing to post-season play in each of the last seven years, including a league-record three teams in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship.

Tournament play tips off on Thursday, March 14 and continues through Sunday, March 17 with the crowning of the 2013 champion. Nearly 16,000 fans have attended the CAA Women's Basketball Championship at the Show Place Arena over the past two years.

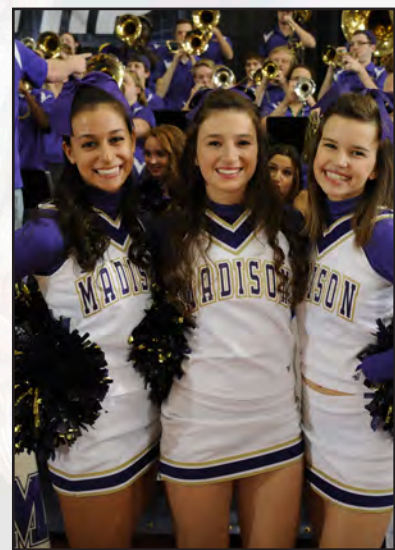

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Men's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

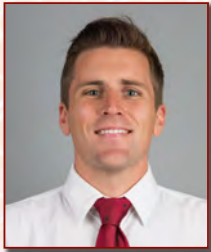

College of Charleston enters its first season in the CAA after spending many years as a member of the Southern Conference. The Cougars and second-year head coach Natasha Adair have high expectations after registering 16 wins last season, which was the third most for the program in the last 23 years. CofC, which earned a postseason berth in the Women's Basketball Invitational and reached the quarterfinals, finished the 2012-13 campaign having set 20 new school records. The team's backcourt should be its strength, returning three capable senior starters in Jillian Brown, Alyssa Frye and Afreyea Tolbert. Frye, who averaged 12.6 points and 3.0 rebounds per game last season, set a new SoCon record for made three pointers (95) and ranked 15th in country in that category. Brown, a three-year starter, is expected to get plenty of teammates involved in the action after she ranked No. 13 in the nation in assists per game (6.4) and added 5.1 points per contest. Tolbert provides balance offensively, (9.7 ppg/5.7 rpg) and is a stout defender. Michaela Hopkins, a 6-foot-5, forward/center (3.9 ppg/3.5 rpg) and guard Jazz Green should also contribute to the Cougars' success in 2013-14.

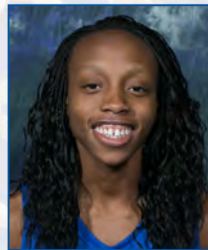

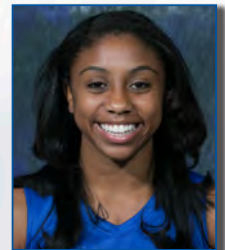

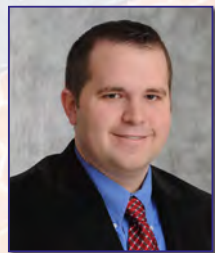

JMU returns three starters – Kirby Burkholder, Precious Hall and Toia Giggetts – who expect to contend for a conference title. The Dukes appeared in the WNIT last season and won three games before falling to the Florida Gators at home in the quarterfinals. Burkholder is a standout senior guard who earned first-team All-CAA recognition in 2012-13 after averaging 15 points and 9.1 rebounds per game. She also ranks second all-time at JMU in made 3-pointers with 181 heading into her senior season. JMU welcomes back Nikki Newman, the 2012 CAA Defender of the Year, who suffered a season-ending injury just nine games in last season. The redshirt senior currently ranks second all-time at JMU in blocked shots with 120. Hall (9.6 ppg/3.1 rpg), who was the 2013 CAA Rookie of the Year, and Giggetts (7.5 ppg/6.4 rpg) will add experience to a group that was selected to finish first in the CAA preseason poll.

As part of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association honored Silver Anniversary teams in 21 championship sports. Chosen by a panel of current and former head coaches, the 25-member teams featured the "best of the best" in the conference's storied history.

The 25th Anniversary women's basketball team included 17 former CAA Players of the Year, eight WNBA draft picks and several players who were key performers during some of the conference's greatest moments in the NCAA Tournament.



For the sixth consecutive season, at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason and for the 11th consecutive season the CAA had a representative in the WNIT. James Madison captured its sixth CAA championship and reached the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in school history. The Dukes, who reached postseason play for the sixth consecutive year, fell 86-72 to Oklahoma in the first round. Delaware, Drexel, UNCW, Old Dominion, and VCU received spots in the WNIT, with the Seahawks advancing to the second round.

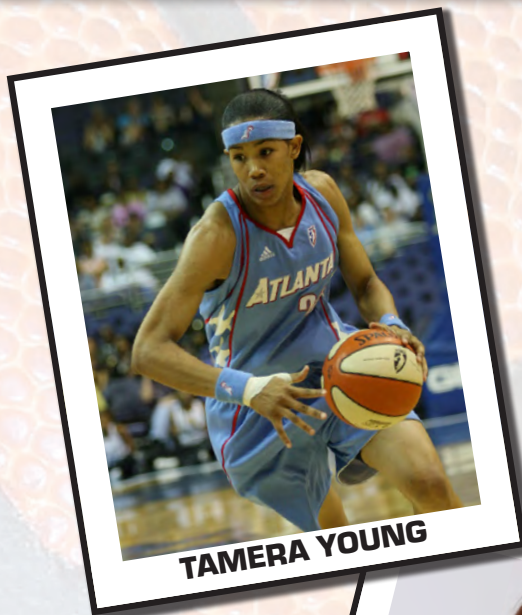
