PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Jerrelle Benimon • Towson

Sr., F, 6-8, 245 - Warrenton, Va./Faquier/Georgetown
Benimon averaged 21.3 points, 10.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in Towson's 2-1 week. The senior forward scored a career-high 32 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in a 75-69 victory over Temple, tallied 21 points, 14 boards and six assists in a 95-75 win over Morgan State and had a team-best 11 points in a loss at Villanova. For the week Benimon shot 46.3% from the floor and was 26-of-31 (83.9%) from the FT line.



CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Canyon Barry • College of Charleston

Fr., G, 6-6, 195 - Colorado Springs, Colo./Cheyenne Mountain
Barry averaged 22.0 points in College of Charleston's 1-1 week. The redshirt freshman guard poured in a career-best 26 points on 11-of-19 FG shooting in the Cougars' 83-82 victory over Charlotte and had a team-high 18 points in a loss to UNC Asheville. He shot 44.4% from the floor for the week and made five 3-pointers.



CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Omar Prewitt • William & Mary

Fr., G/F, 6-6, 180 - Mount Sterling, Ky./Montgomery County
Prewitt averaged 14.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals in W&M's 1-1 week. The freshman contributed a career-high 18 points, six rebounds and four assists in an 84-72 triumph over Liberty and followed with 11 points, six rebounds and three assists in a 79-62 setback at #16 Wichita State. For the week, Prewitt shot 62.5% (10-16) from the floor.

CONFERENCE NOTES:

CAA TEAMS 11-6 LAST WEEK: After a difficult opening weekend, CAA teams rebounded last week with a combined 11-6 record. **College of Charleston** rallied from seven-point deficit with 39 seconds left to defeat Charlotte 83-82 in its home opener last Tuesday, while **Drexel** picked up a 78-70 road win at Missouri Valley member Illinois State. On Wednesday, **UNCW** edged Big South preseason favorite Charleston Southern 80-78 in overtime for its first victory. **Towson** improved to 3-0 for the first time since 1972 after beating Temple 75-69 last Thursday. **James Madison** went 2-1 at the NIU Invitational over the weekend, beating host Northern Illinois and San Jose State.

TRANSFERS MAKE AN IMPACT: Several transfers have made a big impact in the CAA. Delaware's **Davon Usher** (Mississippi Valley State) ranks fifth in the CAA in scoring (16.3 ppg) and sixth in rebounding (8.7 rpg). Hofstra's **Dion Nesmith** (Monmouth) is 7th in the CAA in scoring (16.0 ppg) and the Pride's **Zeke Upshaw** (Illinois State) is 10th (15.3 ppg). Northeastern's **Scott Eatherton** (St. Francis Pa.) is among the league's top 15 in scoring (14.0 ppg/13th), rebounding (10.0 rpg/4th) and FG percentage (59.4%/7th).

ON FIRE FROM 3-POINT RANGE: There were some notable shooting performances from three-point range last week. Northeastern junior **Demetrius Pollard** tied a school record for treys in a game when he hit 8-of-11 in an 83-69 win over Central Connecticut State on Saturday. Pollard finished with a career-high 27 points. Delaware junior **Kyle Anderson** was a perfect 6-for-6 from beyond the arc and netted a career-best 24 points in the Blue Hens' 90-79 victory at Hampton on Sunday. **Hofstra** made 14 three-pointers at #3 Louisville last Tuesday, which is one shy of its school record and was also the most treys allowed by the Cardinals in a game since 2006.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN: Five freshmen are among the top 27 in the CAA in scoring early in the season. CofC's **Canyon Barry** ranks third (18.0 ppg), W&M's **Omar Prewitt** is 11th (14.7 ppg), CofC's **Joe Chealey** is 16th (12.0 ppg), Hofstra's **Jamall Robinson** is 20th (11.3 ppg) and Hofstra's **Chris Jenkins** is 27th (10.0 ppg).

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Nine different CAA players scored 23 or more points in a game last week, with eight of them leading their teams to wins. Towson's **Jerrelle Benimon** led the group with 32 points in a win over Temple, while NU's **Demetrius Pollard** had a career-high 27 points in beating CCSU and Delaware's **Jarvis Threatt** netted 27 points in a triumph over Hampton. Drexel's **Chris Fouch** scored 26 in a win at Illinois State, UNCW's **Cedrick Williams** tallied a career-high 26 points in a victory at Charleston Southern and CofC's **Canyon Barry** had 26 in a victory over Charlotte. Delaware's **Kyle Anderson** posted a career-high 24 points in a win at Hampton, Hofstra's **Dion Nesmith** scored 24 at #3 Louisville and W&M's **Marcus Thornton** contributed 23 points as the Tribe topped Liberty.

THORNTON EXTENDS DOUBLE-DIGIT SCORING STREAK: William & Mary junior guard **Marcus Thornton** has scored double figures in 35 consecutive games, a streak that dates back to his freshman year. He reached double digits in all 30 contests in 2012-13 and is leading the CAA in scoring so far this season with 20.7 ppg.

TOWSON MOVES UP TO 23RD IN MID-MAJOR POLL: Towson, the preseason favorite to capture the CAA title, moved up one spot to #23 in the Colleg Insider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll released on November 11. **College of Charleston**, **Drexel**, **Delaware** and **Northeastern** were among other teams receiving votes in the poll. The Tigers also picked one vote in last week's *Associated Press* Top 25 poll. A new Mid-Major poll will be released later on Monday.

TOWSON PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Towson, which returns four starters from last year's 18-13 team, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2013-14 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Tigers were followed in the voting by Drexel, CAA newcomer College of Charleston

and Delaware. Picked fifth was William & Mary, followed by Northeastern, James Madison, UNCW and Hofstra.

EIGHT ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS RETURN: The CAA welcomes back eight players who earned all-conference honors in 2012-13, including a pair of first-team honorees in Towson forward **Jerrelle Benimon** and Delaware guard **Devon Saddler**. Back from the second team are Drexel guards **Damion Lee** and **Frantz Massenat** and William & Mary guard **Marcus Thornton**. Returning from the third team are Northeastern forward/guard **Quincy Ford**, William & Mary forward **Tim Rusthoven** and Delaware guard **Jarvis Threatt**.

MAJORITY OF STARTERS ARE BACK: The CAA's nine teams return 67% (30-of-45) of their starters from a year ago. College of Charleston, UNCW, Towson and William & Mary have four starters back and four other teams return three regulars. In addition, eight of the CAA's top 15 scorers are back in 2013-14 as are seven of the 15 players in rebounding.

TOWSON'S BENIMON FILLS THE STAT SHEET: Towson forward **Jerrelle Benimon** recorded 20 double-doubles in 31 games last season, which was tied with UNCW's Keith Rendleman for the second-most in the nation. Benimon, the 2013 CAA Player of the Year, ranked third nationally in rebounding (11.2 rpg) and averaged 17.1 points per game.

PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS: CAA teams have combined to win 41 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that eight-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON JOINS THE CAA: The CAA welcomes the College of Charleston to the conference this season. The Cougars are coming off an impressive 24-11 campaign in their first year under coach Doug Wojcik. CofC reached the championship game of the Southern Conference tournament and earned a postseason berth in the CBI. The Cougars return four starters and several top reserves from that squad. Wojcik played in the CAA as the starting point guard at Navy, where he teamed with David Robinson to lead the Midshipmen to the NCAA Elite Eight in 1986. Wojcik holds the CAA career record for assists (714) and was a member of the league's 25th Anniversary team.

MIHALICH TAKES OVER AS HEAD COACH AT HOFSTRA: Hofstra begins its first season under head coach **Joe Mihalich**, who spent the last 15 seasons as head coach at Niagara. Mihalich guided the Purple Eagles to 265 victories, a pair of NCAA Tournament berths and three appearances in the NIT during his tenure. In 2013, he was honored as the MAAC Coach of the Year and the NABC District 1 Coach of the Year after Niagara captured the MAAC regular-season title. Mihalich was also selected as the 2013 Skip Prosser Man of the Year, which honors a coach who not only achieves success on the basketball court, but displays moral integrity off it as well.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS: With James Madison's 68-55 win over LIU Brooklyn in the first round of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship last season, CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last eight years, including the last four in a row. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-12 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

TOWSON POSTS BIGGEST TURNAROUND IN NCAA HISTORY: Towson posted the biggest turnaround in NCAA Division I history last season at +17.5 games after improving from 1-31 in 2011-12 to 18-13. The Tigers' 13 CAA victories and second-place conference finish were their best ever and their 18 overall wins were the most since 1993-94. Towson also had its first CAA Player of the Year (Jerrelle Benimon) and its first CAA Coach of the Year (Pat Skerry).

BENIMON AMONG FINALISTS FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Towson forward **Jerrelle Benimon** is one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, which honors student-athletes who excel on and off the court. Honorees must have noteworthy accomplishments in community, classroom, character and competition. Benimon was the CAA Player of the Year in 2012-13 after averaging 17.1 points and 11.7 rebounds per game.

CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP MOVES TO BALTIMORE: The CAA Men's Basketball Championship moves to the Baltimore Arena in Baltimore, Md. on March 7-10. It's the first year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to Baltimore after having its champion crowned at the Richmond Coliseum for 24 years. More than 400,000 alumni from CAA schools live within 250 miles of Baltimore. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE: The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have more than 80 televised games, including 12 nationally televised contests on the NBC Sports Network and 29 regionally televised games on the Comcast SportsNets. CAA fans will also be able to watch hundreds of other contests through CAA.TV and the digital packages at CAA institutions.

FOUCH, SEMENOV GET SIXTH YEAR: The CAA welcomes back a pair of players who were granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after suffering injuries a year ago. Drexel guard **Chris Fouch**, a former All-CAA performer, averaged 16.7 ppg in three games a year ago before suffering a broken ankle. He's one of the top 3-point shooters in school history with 207 career treys. James Madison forward **Andrey Semenov** was limited to seven games a year ago before being sidelined with a leg injury. He averaged 10.2 ppg and shot 44% from 3-point range in 2011-12.

- Rallied from a 14-point deficit in the final six minutes to edge Charlotte 83-82 last Tuesday but lost 67-58 in overtime to UNC Asheville on Friday.
- Redshirt freshman guard Canyon Barry scored a career-high 26 points on 11-of-19 FG shooting vs. Charlotte and tallied a team-best 18 points against UNCA.
- Senior Willis Hall recorded a double-double (16 pts/10 reb) and hit the game-winning layup with 1.7 seconds to go vs. Charlotte. He added 8 points and 10 boards vs. UNCA.
- Freshman point guard Joe Chealey scored 10 of his career-high 18 points in the final five minutes vs. Charlotte.
- The Cougars hit 12-of-28 from 3-point range vs. Charlotte. Six of those treys came in the final six minutes of the game.
- Junior Adjehi Baru posted his 10th career double-double vs. UNCA with 12 points and a team-high 13 rebounds.

DREXEL

- Had five players score double figures in a 78-70 victory at Illinois State last Tuesday.
- Guard Chris Fouch scored a season-high 26 points at ISU. He was 9-of-14 from the floor, including 3-of-6 from three. He also had six rebounds. Fouch is 6th in career threes (207) and 17th in career pts. (1,231) at DU.
- Senior Frantz Massenat, who had a team-high 20 points in the opener at UCLA, added 12 points and seven assists at ISU.
- Massenat ranks 5th in career assists (418) at Drexel and is on pace to become the third player in school history with 500 assists.
- Junior guard Damion Lee has averaged 14.0 ppg over Drexel's first two games. He's just 77 points shy of 1,000 for his career.
- Junior Kazembe Abif posted his first career double-double at Illinois State with career highs of 13 points and 13 rebounds.
- Head coach Bruiser Flint is one victory shy of 300 for his career and has tied Sam Cozen for the most wins in Drexel history with 213.

- Defeated Hampton 90-79 on Sunday for their first win of the season.
- Junior guard Jarvis Threatt led UD with a season-high 27 points, nine rebounds, a career-best eight assists and four steals at Hampton.
- Junior guard Kyle Anderson was 6-for-6 from 3-point range and scored a career-high 24 points at Hampton. He was 9-of-12 overall from the field.
- Senior forward Carl Baptiste set a career scoring high for the second straight game with 15 points.
- Delaware has reached the 90-point mark in consecutive games for the first time since January, 2006.
- Senior Devon Saddler, who averaged 23.0 ppg in UD's first two games, has been suspended for one month for violating university and team policies. He ranks second on UD's all-time scoring list with 1,716 points.

- Transfer guard/forward Zeke Upshaw added 17 points at Louisville and is averaging 15.3 ppg. Upshaw scored just 100 points in his entire Illinois State career.
- Junior Moussa Kone posted back-to-back doubles in Hofstra's first two games. He tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds vs. Monmouth and had 14 points and 12 boards in a win over FDU.
- Freshman Jamall Robinson added 11 points at Louisville and is averaging 11.3 ppg over his first three collegiate games.
- Hofstra hit 14-of-25 three-pointers at Louisville, which was one shy of the school record of 15.
