**ACTIONS TAKEN ON PROPOSALS SUBJECT TO THE
OVERRIDE PROCESS**

During its July 14, 2011, telephone conference, the Football Championship Subdivision Governance Committee reviewed its legislative decision regarding Proposal No. 2010-83 (Awards, Benefits and Expenses -- Expenses Provided by the Institution for Practice and Competition -- Nonpermissible -- Lodging in Conjunction with a Regular-Season Home Contest -- Championship Subdivision Football). The committee reversed its previous action of adopting Proposal No. 2010-83.

As a result of the committee's action, Proposal No. 2010-83 is defeated, pending review by the Presidential Advisory Group. This action is not final until the PAG and BOD review them on August 11, 2011.

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17.9.2.1.3 Limit on Number of Participants -- Championship Subdivision. In championship subdivision football, there shall be a limit of **95** student-athletes who may engage in practice activities prior to the institution's first day of classes or the institution's first contest, whichever occurs earlier.

[NOTE: This is an increase from 90 to 95 participants]

**CAA SPONSORED PROPOSAL TO ALLOW FCS FOOTBALL
PLAYERS TO ENGAGE IN FIVE YEARS OF COMPETITION.**

Proposal Intent: In FCS Football, to permit a student-athlete to engage in five seasons of competition within five years of the student-athlete's initial full-time enrollment provided the student athlete will utilize at least two seasons of competition at the certifying institution.

NOTE: The CAA has sponsored this proposal in the 2011-12 legislative cycle. No action is determined until this proposal completes the legislative cycle in January or April 2012. If adopted, the effective date would be August 1, 2012.

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NONRECRUITED STUDENT-ATHLETE RECEIVING INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID. FBS/FCS (EFFECTIVE DATE: AUGUST 1, 2011)

A student-athlete not recruited (per Bylaw 15.02.8) by the institution who receives institutional financial aid (based in any degree on athletics ability) after beginning football practice becomes a counter but need not be counted as an initial counter until the next academic year if the institution has reached its initial limit for the year in question. However, the student-athlete shall be considered in the total counter limit for the academic year in which the aid was first received. *(Revised: 1/15/11 effective 8/1/11)*

CAA FOOTBALL INTRACONFERENCE TRANSFER RULE

Any football student-athlete who transfers from one Conference institution to another is not eligible for athletic financial aid during the year of residency. An appeal of this rule to the Board of Directors for extenuating circumstances may be requested by the Director of Athletics of the institution to which the student-athlete intends to transfer.

CAA NONQUALIFIER RULE

Since the median of each institution's freshman class academic profile far exceeds the NCAA minimum standards for freshman eligibility, if a recruited nonqualifier enrolls at a member institution directly from high school, the individual will not be eligible to represent the institution in Football. The institution, through the chief executive officer, may appeal in instances of special circumstances for relief from this legislation.
