CONTACT WITH PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES BEFORE OR AFTER INSTITUTIONAL AND NONINSTITUTIONAL CAMPS/CLINICS HELD ON CAMPUS

Educational Column:

July 24, 2008

NCAA Division I institutions should note that according to NCAA Bylaw 13.1.7.2.4, in-person contact with a prospective student-athlete shall not be made on or off the member institution's campus at the site of practice or competition for any athletics event in which the prospect participates outside the permissible contact periods in the sports of football and basketball.

When a prospective student-athlete in the sport of football or basketball participates in an athletics contest or event (including a noninstitutional, private camp or clinic) on a member institution's campus outside of a contact period, it is not permissible for an institutional staff member to have contact with the prospective student-athlete until the calendar day following his or her release from the contest or event.

Further, if a prospective student-athlete is visiting an institution's campus immediately before or after participating in an athletics contest or event on the institution's campus outside of the contact period, the prospective student-athlete must depart the locale of the institution the calendar day before or after the contest or event in order for an authorized institutional staff member to have contact with the prospective student-athlete.

Please note that for the purposes of this legislation, a distinction can be drawn between institutional and noninstitutional camps/clinics. Outside of a contact period, institutional staff members are not permitted to have contact with a prospective student-athlete on the same day as his or her release from a noninstitutional camp/clinic. However, such contact would be permitted on the same day as an institutional camp/clinic, provided the prospective student-athlete has been released. Thus, after an institutional camp/clinic, a prospective student-athlete would not be required to depart the locale of the institution and return to campus the following day for an unofficial or official visit. Similarly, a prospective student-athlete visiting campus on an unofficial or official visit prior to the start of an institutional camp would be permitted to participate in an institutional camp on the same day in which the unofficial or official visit concludes.

Finally, as a reminder, pursuant to Bylaw 13.12.1.3, Division I institutions shall not recruit any prospective student-athlete during his or her participation in an institutional camp/clinic. This prohibition extends to the verbal or written offering of financial aid.

Proposal 2010-59-A-CS, Proposal 2010-59-B-CS, Proposal 2010-59-C: Eligibility- Progress Toward-Degree Requirements- Eligibility for Competition.

BYLAW 13.12.2.3.4-NONINSTITUTIONAL, PRIVATELY OWNED CAMPS/CLINICS--CHAMPIONSHIP SUBDIVISION FOOTBALL

In championship subdivision football, an institution's coach or noncoaching staff member with responsibilities specific to football may be employed (either on a salaried or volunteer basis) in any capacity (e.g., counselor, guest lecturer, consultant) in a noninstitutional, privately owned camp or clinic at any location, provided the camp or clinic is operated in accordance with restrictions applicable to an institutional camp or clinic (e.g., open to any and all entrants, no free or reduced admission to or employment of athletics award winners). However, employment in such a camp or clinic may occur only during the months of June, July and August or any calendar week (Sunday through Saturday) that includes days of those months (e.g., May 28-June

3). *(Adopted: 1/16/10)*

BYLAW 13.12.1.2 LOCATION RESTRICTION- FOOTBALL

In football, an institution's camp or clinic shall be conducted on the institution's campus, within the state in which the institution is located or, if outside the state, within a 50-mile radius of the institution's campus. *(Revised: 4/29/10; for men's basketball camps, a contract signed before 9/17/08 may be honored; for women's basketball camps, a contract signed before 9/16/09 may be honored)*
