Quiet Period: October 1-31

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Staff Interpretation - September 20, 2012 Teams of Prospective Student-Athletes not Organized Under the Auspices of Scholastic Governing Body (I)

The committee confirmed that a team made up of prospective student-athletes (e.g., home school or academy team) that is not organized or administered under the auspices of a scholastic governing body is considered a nonscholastic team.

Staff Interpretation - September 5, 2012 Coach Speaking at Clinic Outside a Contact Period (I)

The academic and membership affairs staff confirmed that it is permissible for a member institution's coach to speak at a coaches' clinic held at a prospective student-athlete's educational institution outside a contact or recruiting period pursuant to the banquets and meeting legislation. The staff further noted that it is not permissible for a member institution's coaching staff to engage in recruiting activities at the clinic, nor is it permissible to attend a coaches' clinic at a prospective student-athlete's educational institution, in any capacity other than a speaker, outside a contact period (or recruiting period in men's basketball).

Staff Interpretation - September 5, 2012 Calculation of Books in Proportion of Summer Financial Aid Received (I)

The academic and membership affairs staff confirmed that when an institution is determining the amount of financial aid a student-athlete may receive during the summer term (i.e., the equivalency value), the institution must include a value for books in computing the value of a full grant for the summer (i.e., \$800 for the entire summer).

Staff Interpretation - September 5, 2012 Financial Aid to Attend an Institution's Summer Term or Summer School Subsequent to Full-Time Enrollment (I)

The academic and membership affairs staff confirmed that an institution that awards athletically related financial aid to a student-athlete to attend the institution's summer term may award the financial aid on the same basis that the institution awarded such aid to the student-athlete during the academic year. Thus, an institution that awards financial aid to a student-athlete during the academic year on an element-by-element basis (i.e., tuition and fees, room and board, books) may award athletically related financial aid to the student-athlete to attend the institution's summer term on the same basis. Further, the staff confirmed that an institution that awards financial aid to a student-athlete during an academic year on a basis unrelated to the value of any element of financial aid (i.e., tuition and fees, room and board, books) must award aid for the summer term based on the student-athlete's equivalency value for the previous academic year.
