CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Center Lauren Okafor helped JMU to a 3-0 week by averaging 14.3 points, 9.0 rebounds, and 2.7 blocks per game. She shot 66.7 percent (16-for-24) from the field and did not commit a turnover in 82 minutes play. At William & Mary, she had a career-high six blocks to go along with 16 points and nine rebounds. She posted her sixth double-double of the year against UNCW, finishing with 14 points and 11 rebounds. She also had 13 points, seven boards, and two blocks at Northeastern. This is the second CAA Player of the Week honor for Okafor this season.

Freshman Ashunae Durant averaged a double-double with 13.0 points and 10.7 rebounds to help the Pride to a 3-0 week. She opened with week with 12 points and 10 rebounds against Northeastern. The guard followed that up with a career night at Drexel, with a 21-point, 17-rebound effort, and hit the game-winning basket. This is the fourth CAA Rookie of the Week award for Durant. She was also named the CAA Player of the Week on December 15.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

All 10 teams hit the hardwood on Sunday to close out their second weekend of CAA play which featured four games in eight days.

- Behind a season-high 27-points by **Zora Stephenson**, **Elon** topped **College of Charleston**, 77-68, at Alumni Gym. Stephenson drained a season-high seven three-pointers. For the Cougars, **Bre Bolden** posted a game-high 29 points.
- **Delaware** knocked down nine free throws in the final minute of play to come from behind and defeat **Northeastern**, 54-48, at the Cabot Center. The Blue Hens **Erika Brown** led all scorers with 18 points while the Huskies received a double-double from **Francesca Sally**.
- **Hofstra** remained perfect in CAA play with a 58-42 win at Towson. The Pride was led by **Elo Edeferioka**, who had 17 points, while the Tigers received 12 points from **Ciara Webb**.
- **James Madison** moved to 4-0 in CAA play while handing **William & Mary** its sixth-straight loss with a 65-43 decision on the road. **Lauren Okafor** tallied a game-high 16 points, nine rebounds, and a career-high six blocks. The Tribe was led by **Jazmen Boone's** 13 points.
- **Jamila Thompson** put together a career day to help **Drexel** edge **UNCW**, 58-53. The Dragons erased a nine-point deficit for the comeback win. Thompson had 12 points and 10 rebounds for her first career double-double. **UNCW's Shatia Cole** had 14 points.

IN THE RPI

Through games on January 11, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 11th in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Four CAA teams were ranked in the top-85. **James Madison** had an RPI of 28 while **Elon** checked in at 74, **Drexel's** RPI stood at 75, and **Hofstra** ranked 84th.
- **James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19 while the CAA has been ranked as high as tenth on several occasions.

IN THE POLLS

- James Madison's run of 16 consecutive weeks of receiving votes in the *Associated Press* Poll came to an end on January 12.
- Entering this week, JMU has been recognized in the *USA Today* Poll every week this season by either receiving votes or a national ranking.
- On December 23, JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll coming in at No. 24.
- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. Their No. 23 ranking was JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).
- The Dukes were also the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 for the ninth consecutive week on January 6.

HOT SHOTS

- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded nine 20-point efforts in 15 games played this season. She also has eight double-doubles. Hines-Allen is averaging 19.1 points and 9.4 rebounds per game on the year.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has posted double-digit rebounds in nine of 15 games this season. She started the year by having double digit boards in her first four games, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt.
- Elon has won five of its last six games, averaging 66.5 points per game while holding opponents to 58.5 points in that span.
- Hofstra has won 10 of the last 12 games, including five double-digit victories. The Pride has also had five overtime games, going 3-2 in those efforts.
- Delaware's **Courtnei Green** had her 19-game double-digit scoring streak snapped on January 11. JMU's **Precious Hall** had her 22-game, double-digit scoring streak snapped on January 9.
- Northeastern's **Samantha DeFreese** has posted double figures in six of the last seven games.
- College of Charleston sophomore **Bre Bolden** has scored in double figures in seven straight games, averaging 17.3 points during that stretch.
- JMU's **Toia Giggetts** registered her 1,000th career point on January 6. She's the second Duke and the third CAA player this season to record 1,000 career points. Teammate **Precious Hall** and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** both hit the milestone earlier this year.
- Drexel is 5-2 in games decided by less than 10 points.
- All six of UNCW's wins this season have come at home.
- Ten of William & Mary's 15 games have been decided by more than 10 points.
- JMU has won 17 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33). The Dukes have played in front of 2,000+ fans in 20 consecutive home outings.

NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on January 11, several CAA players and teams were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is 17th in the nation in scoring (21.1 ppg), sixth in three-point field goals made per game (3.27), and 17th in free throw percentage (.891).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is 16th in the nation in rebounding (11.1 rpg).
- In assists per game, JMU's **Angela Mickens** in fourth (7.7).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is eighth in steals per game (3.5).
- Hofstra's **Kelly Loftus** is 15th in three-pointers made per game (2.93).
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** is 18th in double-doubles (8).
- James Madison is seventh in rebounding margin (+11.5).
- Drexel is seventh in free throw percentage (.774) and 18th in turnovers per game (13.1).

HELPING THEM OUT

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I at the time.
- Seven different CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** had 14 assists against Northeastern on January 6, tying her for the tenth most in CAA single game history.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted 13 assists against Sacred Heart on December 7.
- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** handed out her 300th career assist as part of a 10 helper night at Northeastern on January 9. She had a career-high 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro on November 16.
- Also with 10 assists: **Darius Faulk** (Hofstra) at NJIT on December 9; **Breonn Hughey** (Towson) versus George Mason on December 28; **Amencie Mercier** (Northeastern) at Hofstra on January 6.

BLOCK PARTY

- Two teams have blocked a 11 shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 137 blocks while James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 119. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffey** (112) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (104).

MAKE IT 1,000

James Madison became the third team in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 victories on January 6 with a 74-57 victory over UNCW at the JMU Convocation Center. The only two teams ahead of JMU in program wins are Tennessee and Louisiana Tech. Dukes senior **Toia Giggetts** also recorded her 1,000th career point against the Seahawks that night.

NON-CONFERENCE NOTES

The CAA went a combined 53-57 (.467) against non-conference opponents this season.

- Five teams finished their non-conference slate with a record of .500 or better.
- As a conference, the CAA went 7-2 against Patriot League teams and had a 6-2 mark against Big South teams.
- The CAA picked up a pairs of wins over both the ACC and American Athletic Conference.
- Home courts were defended well by CAA squads with a combined 33-15 record.

THE 40-CLUB

UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.

- The 40 points are tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history and it was the 18th 40-point game in conference history.
- Atkins is the first CAA player to score 40 points since Elena Delle Donne had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.
- It was the seventh 40-point game in NCAA Division I this season.
- It is only the second 40-point game by any UNCW player (men's or women's) in UNCW history.

2015 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® NOMINEES

Two CAA student-athletes have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team®. William & Mary's **Kyla Kerstetter** and Delaware's **Stephanie Leon** were among 56 NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes to make the list. The prestigious community service award is presented annually by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and Allstate Insurance Company. It recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. From the 93 WBCA nominees across NCAA Divisions I, II, and III, and the NAIA, a distinguished voting panel will select a 10-member team comprised of five student-athletes from the NCAA Division I level and five student-athletes from NCAA Divisions II, III and the NAIA. The final roster of award recipients will be unveiled in February.

WELCOME ELON

The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member Elon University for the 2014-15 season behind fourth-year Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.

- The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.

There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class has 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. Also earning first-team honors were: Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** (14.1 ppg/8.4 rpg), Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** (15.0 ppg/4.0 rpg), and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** (15.8 ppg/5.5 rpg).
- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took part in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- **James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- **Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- **College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- **UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.
- **Northeastern** battled at the FAU Thanksgiving Classic. In the opener, the Huskies were clipped by North Dakota State, 79-72. In the second game, Northeastern fell at host FAU, 81-74.
- **Towson** came up against two feisty opponents at the LIU Brooklyn Turkey Classic. The Tigers fell to Rhode Island, 60-49, on the opening day and suffered a 62-49 loss to La Salle in the finale.

TIP-OFF TIME

The CAA had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by 10 different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32.3).
