## NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

### TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

There are five games on the docket on Sunday afternoon, including a televised contest.

- **Delaware (8-10; 3-4 CAA) at Drexel (11-7; 5-2 CAA):** The Dragons return home for the first time in three games to host rival Delaware. The two teams split games last season and both are coming off wins in their last CAA game.
- **Hofstra (12-6; 5-2 CAA) at William & Mary (7-11; 1-6 CAA):** William & Mary begins a two-game home stand while Hofstra begins a two-game road swing on Sunday. Both the Pride and the Tribe look to get back into the win column.
- **Towson (8-11; 4-3 CAA) at UNCW (7-11; 3-4 CAA):** The Seahawks will attempt to maintain their winning ways at home by hosting the Tigers. All seven of UNCW's victories this season have come at Trask Coliseum. Towson has taken four out its last six games.
- **College of Charleston (4-14; 2-5 CAA) at James Madison (16-2; 7-0 CAA):** The Dukes are looking for their eighth CAA win of the season and their 20th consecutive home win as the Cougars visit the JMU Convocation Center.
- **Northeastern (4-13; 1-6 CAA) at Elon (11-7; 4-3 CAA):** The Huskies and the Phoenix will tip-off the CAA women's basketball television package on the American Sports Network (ASN) with their contest. Northeastern has split its last two games while Elon has won four of its last six contests.

### LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

There were five games on the slate for Thursday.

- Four Dragons scored in double figures as **Drexel** topped **Hofstra**, 63-56, in the regular season series finale between the two programs. **Alexis Smith** had a season-high 16 points to lead Drexel. For the Pride, **Elo Edeferioka** and **Ashunae Durant** each had double-doubles.
- **Towson** held off **Northeastern** for the 65-61 win. The Tigers set a program record with 12 three-pointers, seven of which came from senior **Ciara Webb**, who finished with a career-best 27 points. **Francesca Sally** recorded a double-double and **Kazzidy Stewart** tied her season high of 16 points for the Huskies.
- **UNCW** surged out to a 20-point lead in the first half and held off a late charge by **Elon** to earn a 76-68 victory. Senior guard **Kelva Atkins** had a game-high 22 points while **Naqaiyyah Teague** scored 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds for the Seahawks. **Zora Stephenson** had 15 points for the Phoenix. As a team, Elon had 11 three-pointers on the night.
- **Delaware** had its best offensive effort this season as the Blue Hens defeated the **College of Charleston**, 80-49. Five Blue Hens scored in double figures, led by sophomore **Erika Brown** who tallied 19 points. **Jackie Luna-Castro** led the Cougars with 14 points.
- **James Madison** tied a program record with 12 three-pointers as the Dukes rolled to a 92-50 win over **William & Mary**. Junior **Precious Hall** led the Dukes with 25 points on 10-of-16 shooting, including five three-pointers. Sophomore **Da'Lishia Griffin** had a career-high 16 rebounds to lead the Dukes on the glass while junior **Angela Mickens** dished out a team-high 11 assists. **Jazmen Boone** notched a team-high 16 points for the Tribe.

### #CAAHOOPS PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - JANUARY 19

- James Madison center **Lauren Okafor** picked up her second-straight CAA Player of the Week honor after averaging a double-double with 17.0 points and 10.0 rebounds to help the Dukes to a 2-0 week. Okafor shot 77.8 percent (14-for-18) from the floor and averaged 2.5 blocks per game. Against Elon, she notched her seventh double-double of the year with 17 points and 14 rebounds to go along with three blocks. Against Drexel, she was a perfect 7-of-7 from the floor and finished with 17 points to extend her double-digit scoring streak to six games.
- William & Mary center **Abby Rendle** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week after averaging 15.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, and 2.5 blocks to help the Tribe to a 1-1 week. She was nearly perfect from the field over two games, shooting 83.3 percent (15-for-18). Rendle had a career-day in the Tribe's win against Delaware tallying 16 points and seven rebounds. She was also named the Corvias ECAC Women's Basketball South Co-Rookie of the Week for her efforts.

### NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on January 22, several CAA players and teams were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is 17th in the nation in scoring (21.2 ppg) and third in three-point field goals made per game (3.28).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is 25th in the nation in rebounding (10.4 rpg) and 14th in field goal percentage (.576).
- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** in fourth in assists per game (7.7) and 16th in assist-turnover ratio (2.67).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is sixth in steals per game (3.41).
- Elon's **Zora Stephenson** is 13th in three-pointers made per game (3.00) while Hofstra's **Kelly Loftus** is 15th (2.94).
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** is 21st in double-doubles (9).
- James Madison is eighth in rebounding margin (+11.2) and 22nd in scoring margin (+14.6).
- Drexel is 12th in free throw percentage (.761) and is 29th in scoring defense (56.1ppg).
- Delaware is 23rd in three-point field goal percentage (.367).

### IN THE RPI

Through games on January 22, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 12th in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-100. **James Madison** had an RPI of 22 while **Drexel's** RPI stood at 65, and **Elon** checked in at 93.
- James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19 while the CAA has been ranked as high as tenth on several occasions.

### HOT SHOTS

- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** became the fourth player in the CAA this season to hit the 1,000 career point milestone. Hines-Allen has 1,006 points (767 points as a Tiger/239 points at Virginia Tech). Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** is next on the list with 973 career points. James Madison's **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts** and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** reached the milestone earlier this year.
- It was raining threes on January 22, as James Madison and Towson set program records with 12 three-pointers while Elon had 11 trifectas.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded nine 20-point efforts in 19 games played this season. She also has nine double-doubles to lead all CAA players. Hines-Allen is averaging 18.2 points and 9.2 rebounds per game on the year.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has posted double-digit rebounds in nine of 18 games this season. She started the year by having double digit boards in her first four games, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt.
- Northeastern's **Samantha DeFreese** has posted double figures in five of the last six games, which includes three 20-point efforts.
- Elon's **Zora Stephenson** is averaging 16.0 points per game over the last four games.
- Delaware's **Hannah Jardine** has scored in double figures in each of the last six games while **Erika Brown** has scored in double digits in each of the last four.
- Five Blue Hens scored in double figures against College of Charleston on January 22, the first time that's happened since the 2005 CAA Tournament.
- College of Charleston sophomore **Bre Bolden** has had at least one steal in 20 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Drexel is 8-2 in games decided by 10 points or less.
- All seven of UNCW's wins this season have come at home. The Seahawks are 0-7 on the road and are on a 13-game skid on the road dating back to last season.
- William & Mary has had seven games decided by three points or less and are 3-4 of those contests. Twelve of the Tribe's 18 games have been decided by less than 10 points this season.
- JMU has won 19 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33). The Dukes have played in front of 2,000+ fans in 22 consecutive home outings, including 5,009 fans on January 18.

## IN THE POLLS

James Madison received votes in this week's *USA Today* Coaches Poll. JMU has been recognized in the *USA Today* Poll every week this season by either receiving votes or a national ranking.

- The Dukes were also the second-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 on January 20, ending a streak of nine consecutive weeks in the top spot. Hofstra received votes in the *College Insider* Poll as well.
- James Madison's run of 16 consecutive weeks of receiving votes in the *Associated Press* Poll came to an end on January 12.
- On December 23, JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll coming in at No. 24.
- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. Their No. 23 ranking was JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).

## BLOCK PARTY

- Hofstra had 13 blocks against UNCW on January 18, tying the fifth most in CAA single game history.
- The Pride are one of three teams to have blocked 11+ shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- Forward **Anjie White** tied a CAA season high with seven blocks against UNCW on January 18.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 137 blocks while James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 128. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffer** (114) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (105).

**HELPING THEM OUT**

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I at the time.
- Eight different CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** had 14 assists against Northeastern on January 6, tying her for the tenth most in CAA single game history.

- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** handed out her 300th career assist as part of a 10 helper night at Northeastern on January 9. She had a career-high 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29 and 11 against William & Mary on January 22.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro on November 16.
- Drexel senior **Jamila Thompson** dished out 12 assists at William & Mary on January 15.
- Also with 10 assists: **Darius Faulk** (Hofstra) at NJIT; **Breonn Hughey** (Towson) versus George Mason; **Amencie Mercier** (Northeastern) at Hofstra on January 6.

**MAKE IT 1,000**

James Madison became the third team in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 victories on January 6 with a 74-57 victory over UNCW at the JMU Convocation Center. The only two teams ahead of JMU in program wins are Tennessee and Louisiana Tech. Dukes senior **Toia Giggetts** also recorded her 1,000th career point against the Seahawks that night.

**NON-CONFERENCE NOTES**

The CAA went a combined 53-57 (.467) against non-conference opponents this season.

- Five teams finished their non-conference slate with a record of .500 or better.
- As a conference, the CAA went 7-2 against Patriot League teams and had a 6-2 mark against Big South teams.
- The CAA picked up a pairs of wins over both the ACC and American Athletic Conference.
- Home courts were defended well by CAA squads with a combined 33-15 record.

**THE 40-CLUB**

UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.

- The 40 points are tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history and it was the 18th 40-point game in conference history.
- Atkins is the first CAA player to score 40 points since Elena Delle Donne had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.
- It was the seventh 40-point game in NCAA Division I this season.

It is only the second 40-point game by any UNCW player (men's or women's) in UNCW history.

**USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - 1/13**

In addition to her CAA Rookie of the Week honor, Hofstra guard **Ashunae Durant** was selected as the National Freshman of the Week by the USBWA. Durant averaged a double-double with 13.0 points and 10.7 rebounds to help the Pride to a 3-0 week. The stretch included a 21-point, 17-rebound effort in the win at Drexel

- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

## CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took part in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

## THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.

- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by 10 different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32.3).
