CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore Ryan Flowers averaged a double-double over three games, posting 13.3 rebounds and 11.7 points on 62.9 percent shooting. The forward had a pair of double-doubles on the week and hit the game-winning shot in the CAA opener. Flowers opened the week by tallying a season-high 18 rebounds while scoring 15 points at Florida Atlantic. She just missed a double-double at Stetson, finishing with eight points and nine boards. In the Seahawks' victory over William & Mary, Flowers had 12 points, including the game-winning lay-up with 1.9 seconds left, and 13 rebounds in the 63-62 triumph.

Freshman Malaya Johnson helped Elon to 3-0 week by averaging 13.7 points and 7.0 rebounds. The center shot 65.4 percent from the field and picked up six blocks, six steals and three assists. In a win over Furman, she posted her first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 boards. Against Lenoir-Rhyne, she led the team with 18 points, going 7-for-8 from the floor, while collecting two steals and three blocks, both career highs. Johnson helped the Phoenix to the 60-50 victory in their CAA debut at Delaware, by posting 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting with two steals and two rebounds.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

Conference play began on January 4 with all 10 teams in action.

- Hofstra posted a 78-53 win over College of Charleston. The Pride was paced by **Jakelle King-Gilchrist's** 19 points and **Anjie White's** double-double (11 points/11 rebounds). Four Cougars were in double figures including **Jackie Luna-Castro** who had 14 points.
- Elon won its CAA debut, forging a 60-50 win at Delaware. **Zora Stephenson**, **Malaya Johnson**, and **Lauren Brown** all had 10 points apiece for the Phoenix while **Courtnei Green** had 17 points for the Blue Hens.
- Drexel improved to a perfect 5-0 at home this season with a 58-35 win over Northeastern. **Carrie Alexander** posted 16 points for the Dragons while **Francesca Sally** had 10 points for the Huskies.
- James Madison overcame a double-digit deficit and held on for a 67-66 win over Towson thanks to clutch free throw shooting by **Precious Hall**. Hall finished with 13 points while **Lauren Okafor** had 14 for the Dukes. For Towson, **LaTorri Hines-Allen** had 31 points and 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the year.
- Sophomore **Ryan Flowers** made a bucket with 1.9 seconds remaining to lift UNCW to a 63-62 win over William & Mary. Flowers had 13 rebounds and 12 points for the Seahawks while **Kelsey Curtis** had 14 points for the Tribe.

IN THE RPI

Through games on January 4, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 10th, a season best, in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-75. **James Madison** had an RPI of 16 while **Elon's** RPI stood at 60 and **Drexel** checked in at 75.
- **James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19.

NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on January 4, several CAA players and teams were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ninth in the nation in scoring (22.6 ppg), seventh in three-point field goals made per game (3.25), and 16th in free throw percentage (.903).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is 16th in the nation in rebounding (11.1 rpg).
- In assists per game, JMU's **Angela Mickens** in fourth (7.7).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is 10th in steals per game (3.27).
- As a team, Delaware is 12th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.381).
- James Madison is 16th in rebounding margin (+10.2).
- Drexel is ninth in free throw percentage (.771) and 16th in turnovers per game (13.0).

IN THE POLLS

James Madison received votes in the *Associated Press* Poll released on January 5. Dating back to last season, it is the 16th consecutive week in which the Dukes have received votes.

- Last week, JMU received votes in the *USA Today* Poll for the eighth consecutive week of appearing in the poll.
- On December 23, JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll coming in at No. 24 on.
- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. Their No. 23 ranking was JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).
- On December 30, JMU was the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 for the seventh consecutive week.

HOT SHOTS

- Hofstra has won seven of the last nine games, including five double-digit victories. The Pride is holding opponents to just 55.8 points per game during that span.
- Elon has won four of its last five games, including three straight, and is putting up 69.4 points per game on 48.2 percent shooting from the field during that stretch.
- Elon posted its first CAA win on January 4, defeating Delaware 60-50 in Newark, Del.
- James Madison is one win away from the 1,000th in program history.
- JMU's **Toia Giggetts** is sitting on 999 career points. She'll be the second Duke and the third CAA player this season to record 1,000 career points. Teammate **Precious Hall** and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** both hit the milestone earlier this year.
- UNCW's **Ryan Flowers** is averaging a double-double over the last five games (10.4 ppg/12.4 rpg). She has three double-doubles in that span.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** posted double-digit rebounds in her first four games this season, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt, and in eight of 12 games this season.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** is riding a conference-best 21-game, double-digit scoring streak.
- Delaware's **Courtnei Green** is on a 17-game double-digit scoring streak, averaging 15.7 ppg.
- Since returning to the lineup seven games ago, senior **A'lece Mark** is averaging 14.2 points and 6.2 rebounds.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded seven 20-point games in 13 games played. She also has six double-doubles. Hines-Allen is averaging 19.5 points and 9.3 rebounds per game this year.
- Northeastern has had at least three Huskies score 10+ points in all but three games this season.
- Drexel is 4-1 in games decided by less than 10 points.
- Eight of William & Mary's 12 games have been decided by more than 10 points.
- Elon is 38-11 at home under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.
- JMU has won 16 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33).
- College of Charleston had just three home contests this season - a November 16 contest against UNC Greensboro, a December 21 win over Mercer, and a December 30 win over South Carolina Upstate.
- Drexel guard **Meghan Creighton** is out indefinitely with a knee injury which will require surgery.

NON-CONFERENCE NOTES

The CAA went a combined 53-57 (.467) against non-conference opponents this season.

- Five teams finished their non-conference slate with a record of .500 or better.
- As a conference, the CAA went 7-2 against Patriot League teams and had a 6-2 mark against Big South teams.
- The CAA picked up a pairs of wins over both the ACC and American Athletic Conference.
- Home courts were defended well by CAA squads with a combined 33-15 record.

HELPING THEM OUT

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I at the time.
- Five CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted 13 assists against Sacred Heart on December 7.
- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** dished out 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro on November 16.
- Hofstra guard **Darius Faulk** had 10 assists in the win at NJIT on December 9.
- Towson guard **Breonn Hughey** at 10 assists in the win over George Mason on December 28.

BLOCK PARTY

- Two teams have blocked a 11 shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 137 blocks while James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 111. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffey** (110) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (102).

THE 40-CLUB

UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.

- The 40 points are tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history and it was the 18th 40-point game in conference history.
- Atkins is the first CAA player to score 40 points since Elena Delle Donne had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.
- It was the seventh 40-point game in NCAA Division I this season.
- It is only the second 40-point game by any UNCW player (men's or women's) in UNCW history.

2015 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® NOMINEES

Two CAA student-athletes have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team®. William & Mary's **Kyla Kerstetter** and Delaware's **Stephanie Leon** were among 56 NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes to make the list. The prestigious community service award is presented annually by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and Allstate Insurance Company. It recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. - The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.
