NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

All 10 teams hit the hardwood on Friday for their third conference game of the year.

- **College of Charleston (3-11; 1-2 CAA) at UNCW (6-8; 2-1 CAA):** The Seahawks and the Cougars had a matinee game at Trask Coliseum where UNCW posted a 69-57 victory. **Kelva Atkins** led the way for UNCW with 21 points while **Naqaiyyah Teague** just missed a double-double with 14 points and nine boards. For CofC, **Bre Bolden** had a double-double.
- **Delaware (5-8; 0-2 CAA) at Towson (5-9; 1-1 CAA):** The Blue Hens take CAA play on the road for the first time this season as they travel to Towson in search of their first CAA win. The Tigers split their first two CAA games, coming off an overtime in over William & Mary.
- **Elon (8-5; 1-1 CAA) at William & Mary (6-7; 0-2 CAA):** The Tribe opens a three-game home stand by hosting the Phoenix on Friday night. William & Mary is coming off a tough overtime loss at Towson while Elon has split its first two CAA games.
- **Hofstra (9-4; 2-0 CAA) at Drexel (8-5; 2-0 CAA):** It will be a battle of undefeated CAA teams in Philadelphia on Friday night as the Pride visits the Dragons. Drexel is 5-0 at home this season while Hofstra is playing the first of three-straight on the road.
- **James Madison (11-2; 2-0 CAA) at Northeastern (3-9; 0-2 CAA):** The 2-0 Dukes take CAA play on the road for the first time this season while the Huskies host their first conference game of the year at the Cabot Center.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

All 10 teams in action were in action on Tuesday night.

- **College of Charleston** picked up their first CAA win of the year by topping **Delaware**, 55-49. Three Cougars were in double digits, including **Bre Bolden** who had 17 points, while **Hannah Jardine** had a double-double for the Blue Hens.
- **Drexel** improved to 2-0 in the CAA by topping **Elon**, 57-47. **Rachel Pearson** had 21 points for the Dragons while **Zora Stephenson** had 12 points for the Phoenix.
- **Hofstra** improved to 2-0 in the CAA by outlasting **Northeastern**, 85-83, in overtime. Three members of the Pride had double-doubles while two Huskies had double-double efforts.
- It was a double milestone night in Harrisonburg, Va. as **James Madison** notched its 1,000th program victory and senior **Toia Giggetts** posted her 1,000th career point in the 74-57 win over **UNCW**. **Precious Hall** and **Lauren Okafor** had double-doubles for the Dukes while **Kelva Atkins** had a team-high 18 points for the Seahawks.
- **Towson** forced overtime and then pulled out a 77-69 win over **William & Mary**. **LaTorri Hines-Allen** and **Dominique Johnson** had 20-point efforts for the Tigers. For the Tribe, **Marlena Tremba** had a game-high 22 points while **Alexandra Masaquel** had a double-double.

#CAAHOOPS WEEKLY HONORS - 1/5

- UNCW sophomore **Ryan Flowers** was named the CAA Player of the Week. She averaged a double-double over three games, posting 13.3 rebounds and 11.7 points on 62.9 percent shooting. Flowers opened the week by tallying a season-high 18 rebounds while scoring 15 points at Florida Atlantic. In the Seahawks' victory over William & Mary, Flowers had 12 points, including the game-winning lay-up with 1.9 seconds left, and 13 rebounds.
- Elon freshman **Malaya Johnson** picked up her second CAA Rookie of the Week honor in the last three weeks. She helped Elon to 3-0 week by averaging 13.7 points and 7.0 rebounds. The center shot 65.4 percent from the field and picked up six blocks, six steals and three assists. In a win over Furman, she posted her first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 boards. She had an 18-point night against Lenoir-Rhyne and had 10 points in Elon's win over Delaware in its CAA opener.

MAKE IT 1,000

James Madison became the third team in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 victories on January 6 with a 74-57 victory over UNCW at the JMU Convocation Center. The only two teams ahead of JMU in program wins are Tennessee and Louisiana Tech. Dukes senior **Toia Giggetts** also recorded her 1,000th career point against the Seahawks that night.

IN THE RPI

Through games on January 8, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 11th in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-75. **James Madison** had an RPI of 27 while **Drexel's** RPI stood at 60 and **Elon** checked in at 81.
- James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19 while the CAA has been ranked as high as tenth on several occasions.

IN THE POLLS

James Madison received votes in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Polls released this week. The Dukes were also the top-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 for the ninth consecutive week.

- Dating back to last season, it is the 16th consecutive week in which the Dukes have received votes in the AP Poll.
- JMU has been recognized in the *USA Today* Poll every week this season by either receiving votes or a national ranking.
- On December 23, JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll coming in at No. 24.
- On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. Their No. 23 ranking was JMU's highest ranking since the final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15.
- On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).

HOT SHOTS

- Ten double-doubles were recorded in the five CAA games played on January 6. Two of those double-doubles were point/assist combinations.
- Hofstra has won eight of the last 10 games, including five double-digit victories. The Pride is holding opponents to just 58.5 points per game during that span.
- Hofstra has had four overtime games this season.
- All six of UNCW's wins this season have come at home.
- Elon posted its first CAA win on January 4, defeating Delaware 60-50 in Newark, Del.
- JMU's **Toia Giggetts** registered her 1,000th career point on January 6. She's the second Duke and the third CAA player this season to record 1,000 career points. Teammate **Precious Hall** and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** both hit the milestone earlier this year.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** posted double-digit rebounds in her first four games this season, including a career-high 19 versus Pitt, and in nine of 13 games this season.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** is riding a conference-best 22-game, double-digit scoring streak.
- Delaware's **Courtnei Green** is on an 18-game double-digit scoring streak, averaging 15.6 ppg.
- Northeastern's **Samantha DeFreese** has posted double figures in four of the last five games.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded eight 20-point efforts in 14 games played. She also has six double-doubles. Hines-Allen is averaging 19.6 points and 9.4 rebounds per game.
- Northeastern has had at least three Huskies score 10+ points in all but three games this season.
- Drexel is 4-1 in games decided by less than 10 points.
- Eight of William & Mary's 13 games have been decided by more than 10 points.
- JMU has won 17 straight games at home dating back December 29, 2013 (Ohio, W, 56-33).

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is eighth in the nation in scoring (22.8 ppg), third in three-point field goals made per game (3.46), and 17th in free throw percentage (.891).
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** is 16th in the nation in rebounding (11.1 rpg).
- In assists per game, JMU's **Angela Mickens** in fourth (7.7).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is eighth in steals per game (3.42).
- Hofstra's **Kelly Loftus** is 12th in three-pointers made per game (3.00).
- James Madison is tenth in rebounding margin (+10.9).
- Drexel is ninth in free throw percentage (.769) and 14th in turnovers per game (12.8).

HELPING THEM OUT

- William & Mary set a school record with 28 assists against Longwood on November 29 for the eighth-highest single game total in NCAA Division I at the time.
- Seven different CAA players have dished out 10+ assists this season.
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** had 14 assists against Northeastern on January 6, tying her for the tenth-highest single game total in CAA history.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted 13 assists against Sacred Heart on December 7.
- James Madison's **Angela Mickens** dished out 13 assists against Pitt on November 23. She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro on November 16.
- Also with 10 assists: **Darius Faulk** (Hofstra) at NJIT on December 9; **Breonn Hughey** (Towson) versus George Mason on December 28; **Amencie Mercier** (Northeastern) at Hofstra on January 6.

BLOCK PARTY

- Two teams have blocked a 11 shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 137 blocks while James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 111. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffey** (110) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (103).

THE 40-CLUB

UNCW guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.

- The 40 points are tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history and it was the 18th 40-point game in conference history.
- Atkins is the first CAA player to score 40 points since Elena Delle Donne had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.
- It was the seventh 40-point game in NCAA Division I this season.
- It is only the second 40-point game by any UNCW player (men's or women's) in UNCW history.

2015 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® NOMINEES

William & Mary's **Kyla Kerstetter** and Delaware's **Stephanie Leon** were among 56 NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes to make the list. It recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class has 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. - Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took part in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- **James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- **Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- **College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- **UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.
- **Northeastern** battled at the FAU Thanksgiving Classic. In the opener, the Huskies were clipped by North Dakota State, 79-72. In the second game, Northeastern fell at host FAU, 81-74.
- **Towson** came up against two feisty opponents at the LIU Brooklyn Turkey Classic. The Tigers fell to Rhode Island, 60-49, on the opening day and suffered a 62-49 loss to La Salle in the finale.

The CAA had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by 10 different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32.3).
