NEWS & NOTES FROM AROUND THE CAA

TODAY IN #CAAHOOPS

The final Sunday of conference play features five key match-ups, including two on the American Sports Network (ASN).

- **UNCW (12-15; 8-8 CAA) at College of Charleston (5-22; 3-13 CAA):** The Seahawks and the Cougars will square off on ASN. UNCW has won four of its last five and are coming off a pair of back-to-back overtime wins and are in a tie for fifth in the CAA standings. In their first meeting of the season on January 9, UNCW picked up a 69-57 win over the Cougars.
- **Elon (16-11; 9-7 CAA) at Hofstra (18-9; 11-5 CAA):** The Pride has won five straight and is coming off a huge road win at JMU. A win today would keep Hofstra in the top three in the CAA standings. Elon, meanwhile, looks to get back into the win column to maintain its spot in the top four. In their first meeting on February 15, Hofstra eked out a 55-53 win.
- **Northeastern (4-22; 1-15 CAA) at William & Mary (13-14; 7-9 CAA):** The Tribe looks to get stay in the win column after while the Huskies seeing their first CAA road win. The first meeting of the year between the two squads went to double overtime as William & Mary posted a 72-66 win on February 1.
- **James Madison (24-3; 15-1 CAA) at Delaware (13-14; 8-8 CAA):** The Dukes are fresh off a win against Northeastern which gave them the 2015 CAA Regular Season Championship. The Blue Hens, meanwhile, are trying to snap a three-game skid and remain in the top-six in the CAA standings. The two teams met two weeks ago with James Madison posting a 94-64 win.
- **Towson (10-18; 6-10 CAA) at Drexel (17-9; 11-4 CAA):** The Tigers and the Dragons will play the second game of the day on ASN. Towson looks to snap a four-game skid while Drexel has won four straight games. On February 15, Drexel posted a 66-52 victory over Towson.

LAST TIME OUT IN #CAAHOOPS

- **Drexel** held on for a 54-51 win over **Elon** on Friday night at the Daskalakis Athletic Center, clinching no worse than the No. 3 seed in the upcoming CAA Championship in the process. The Dragons led the entire second half, but saw a 10-point lead slip down to one with just 19 seconds remaining before holding on for their fourth straight win. **Sarah Curran** scored 17 points to lead all scorers; thirteen of those came after halftime as she helped power the Dragons down the stretch. For **Elon**, **Jenifer Rhodes** had a team-high 10 points.
- **James Madison** won the 2015 CAA Regular Season Championship outright with an 82-47 win over **Northeastern**. The Dukes received 18 point efforts from both **Precious Hall** and **Jazmon Gwathmey** while **Lauren Okafor** had a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds. For **Northeastern**, **Samantha DeFreese** posted 18 points.

#CAACHAMPS PRIMER

The 2015 CAA Women's Basketball Championship will be held March 12-15 at The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md.

- Official seeding and tournament pairings will be announced via *CAASports.com* upon the conclusion of regular season play on March 4. James Madison, however, has clinched the top seed in the tournament and the CAA Regular Season Championship.
- The top six teams in the standings earn a first round bye.
- The quarterfinals will be broadcast live on the American Sports Network (ASN).
- The semifinals and final will be broadcast live on Comcast SportsNet.
- It is the fifth consecutive season in which the CAA Championship has been held at The Show Place and will be held there through 2016.

THE 40-40 CLUB

UNCW has had two players score 40 points this season. Only three Seahawks total (both men's and women's) have hit that mark in UNCW history.

- Sophomore **Brie Mobley** scored 46 points in the Seahawks' overtime win over Delaware on February 26, setting both UNCW and Trask Coliseum records.
 - Mobley's 46 points were the most in the NCAA this season and the fourth-most in CAA single game history.
 - Mobley went 19-for-26 from the floor setting the CAA record for field goals made. The previous mark was 18 and held by three players, most recently Delaware's **Elena Delle Donne**.
 - It was the 19th 40-point game in conference history.
 - Mobley was featured on *ESPN SportsCenter's* Three Stars segment.
- Guard **Kelva Atkins** scored 40 points against Charleston Southern on December 20, tying a then-school record and setting a Trask Coliseum scoring record.
 - The 40 points were tied for the tenth most in CAA single game history
 - Atkins had become the first CAA player to score 40 points since **Elena Delle Donne** had 42 against Hofstra on February 16, 2012.

#CAAHOOPS WEEKLY HONORS - FEBRUARY 24

- **CAA Player of the Week:** Senior **Jackie Schluth** averaged 17.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, and 3.0 assists per game to lead Drexel to a pair of road wins. The forward also shot 60 percent (15-for-25) for the week. At the College of Charleston, Schluth matched a career high with 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting while adding nine rebounds, two assists, and a block.
- **CAA Player of the Week:** Redshirt sophomore forward **Anjie White** averaged 14.0 points on 52.6 percent shooting and 6.0 rebounds per game to help Hofstra to a 2-0 week. In the win over nationally-ranked James Madison, White put the Pride ahead to stay by sinking a pair of tie-breaking free throws with 40 seconds left. She finished the game with 13 points, including a perfect 5-for-5 effort at the free throw line, and four rebounds.
- **CAA Rookie of the Week:** Guard **Shay Burnett** averaged 11.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 3.5 assists to help Elon to a 2-0 week. At Northeastern, Burnett tallied 10 points. She then posted her second double-double of the season (13pts/10reb) while adding five assists and two steals at William & Mary. Burnett has been named the CAA Rookie of the Week three times this season.
- **CAA Rookie of the Week:** Forward **Ashunae Durant** came off the bench to average 12.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 23.5 minutes in Hofstra's 2-0 week. Durant, who has scored in double figures in nine straight games, began the week with 13 points against Towson. In the win over nationally-ranked JMU, Durant tallied 12 points, six rebounds, and two blocks. She hit a pair of crucial free throws down the stretch to help seal the win. Durant has been named the CAA Rookie of the Week six times and the CAA Player of the Week once this season.

NANCY LIEBERMAN AWARD FINALIST

James Madison point guard **Angela Mickens** has been named as a finalist for Nancy Lieberman Award by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The award recognizes the top point guard in NCAA Division I.

- Mickens is one of 15 points guards in the country to be recognized. The other finalists are: **Niya Johnson** (Baylor), **Brittany Boyd** (Cal), **Damika Martinez** (Iona), **Samantha Logic** (Iowa), **Nikki Moody** (Iowa State), **Almesha Jones** (Morehead State), **Lindsay Allen** (Notre Dame), **Kelsey Mitchell** (Ohio State), **Sydney Wiese** (Oregon State), **Brianna Kiesel** (Pitt), **Syessense Davis** (Rutgers), **Natasha Cloud** (Saint Joseph's), **Moriah Jefferson** (UConn), **Tay'ler Mingo** (Wright State)
- The junior is fourth in assists (7.5g) and 10th in assist-turnover ratio (2.74).
- Mickens is also fourth in the CAA in steals (2.2/g) and fifth in minutes played (34.5/g).
- With her 203 assists this year, she's checked into CAA's top-10 single season performance chart.
- Mickens is the CAA career active leader in assists (395).

NATIONAL NOTICE

Through games played on February 27, several CAA players and teams were among the national statistical leaders.

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is 18th in the nation in scoring (20.9 ppg) and fourth in three-point field goals made per game (3.19).
- JMU's **Angela Mickens** is fourth in assists (7.5g) and 10th in assist-turnover ratio (2.74).
- College of Charleston's **Bre Bolden** is eighth in steals per game (3.27).
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** is 23rd in double-doubles (13).
- James Madison is 12th in rebounding margin (+9.9), 13th in scoring margin (+16.9), and 20th in scoring offense (76.1/g).
- Drexel is the national leader in free throw percentage (.781).
- Delaware is 18th in three-point field goal percentage (.365).
- William & Mary is eighth in steals per game (11.6).

IN THE POLLS

James Madison fell out of Top-25 in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls but still received votes this week.

- Associated Press Poll:** Last week, JMU's No. 23 ranking was the first time it has been ranked in the poll since 2009. The Dukes received votes in all but three weeks this season. James Madison's run of 16 consecutive weeks of receiving votes in the *Associated Press* Poll came to an end on January 12.
- USA Today Coaches Poll:** Last week, JMU's ranking of No. 21 was the highest this season and the highest since final poll of the 1990-91 season when they checked in at No. 15. JMU has been recognized in the *USA Today* Poll every week this season by either receiving votes or a national ranking. On December 23, JMU checked back into the *USA Today* Coaches Poll coming in at No. 24. On November 25, the Dukes checked in at No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. On November 18, the Dukes were ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for the first time since 2009-10 when they held at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks (December 14-28).
- College Insider Mid-Major Top-25 Poll:** The Dukes were the fourth-ranked team in the *College Insider* Mid-Major Top-25 on February 24. JMU spent nine consecutive weeks in the top spot. Hofstra checked into the No. 25 spot while Drexel received votes as well.

Through games on February 27, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as a whole was ranked 13th in the RPI ratings released by *Collegiate Basketball News*.

- Three CAA teams were ranked in the top-100. **James Madison** had an RPI of 28 while **Drexel's** RPI stood at 60, and **Hofstra** checked in at 90.
- **James Madison** had a season-best RPI of five on December 19 while the CAA has been ranked as high as tenth on several occasions.

HOT SHOTS

- Elon has 599 program wins, one shy of the 600-win milestone.
- Hofstra topped James Madison on February 22, marking only the second time in program in history in which the Pride posted a win over a ranked opponent. The last time was in 2006 when they defeated Michigan State.
- The Pride is in the middle of a five-game winning streak, averaging 60.2 points per game while holding opponents to 53.2 points. Hofstra is being led by **Anjie White** who is averaging 15.4 points and 6.8 rebounds during that stretch.
- Drexel has scored 60 or more points in eight of its last 10 games, after reaching that figure five times in the first 17 games.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** has recorded 12 20-point efforts in 27 games played this season. She also has 13 double-doubles to lead all CAA players. Hines-Allen is averaging 17.2 points and 9.7 rebounds per game on the year.
- James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has posted double-digit rebounds in 14 of 27 games.
- Northeastern's **Samantha DeFreese** has posted double figures in 12 of the last 14 games, which includes five 20-point efforts.
- College of Charleston sophomore **Bre Bolden** has had at least one steal in 28 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- William & Mary guard **Jenna Green** has at least one assist in all but one game this season.

2015 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® HONORS

Delaware's **Stephanie Leon** was one of five NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes to be named to the 2015 Allstate WBCA Goodworks Team.

- A two-year team captain, Leon has committed her free time to volunteering with more than 10 community organizations ranging from elementary schools to churches and environmental agencies during her four years at Delaware. Upon graduation, she will join Teach for America. Leon was also the 2014 recipient of the CAA's Dean Ehlers Award.
- The Allstate WBCA Good Works Team recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities. In total, 93 student-athletes across all NCAA Divisions and the NAIA, including William & Mary's **Kyla Kerstetter**, were nominated for this award.

NAISMITH TROPHY MIDSEASON 30

- James Madison guard **Precious Hall** was named to the Naismith Trophy Women's Midseason 30 List, presented by AT&T. The award recognizes the top players in NCAA Division I women's basketball. The 10 national semifinalists will be announced on March 6.
- Hall is 18th nationally in scoring (20.9 ppg) and fourth in three-point field goals made (3.19/g).
- In addition to scoring, she's third in the CAA in free throw percentage (.800) and is fourth in three-point field goal percentage (.381).
- The junior is the CAA's active career leader in scoring with 1,385 points and field goals made (448). She's also among the active career leaders in assists (195), steals (125), and three-pointers made (186).

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

For the second straight season, Elon's **Sam Coffer** has been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 3 First Team. Coffer, a senior forward, holds a 3.89 GPA in biochemistry. Earning All-District Academic First Team honors qualifies her for Academic All-America consideration.

HOME SWEET HOME

Home courts have been defended well this season by all 10 CAA teams.

- Overall, CAA teams are 75-52 at home this season.
- In league play, the home teams are 42-36.
- James Madison had its 21-game winning streak at the Convocation Center halted on February 22. The streak began on December 29, 2013 and the Dukes had opened the year 11-0 at home. The Dukes have played in front of 2,000+ fans in 25 consecutive home outings, including 5,009 fans on January 18.
- Drexel is 9-3 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center.
- Ten of UNCW's 12 wins this season have come at home.
- Elon, under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**, is 40-15 at Alumni Gym.

She also had 10 assists at Vanderbilt on December 29, 11 against William & Mary on January 22, and 12 at Towson on February 12.
- College of Charleston guard **Shiclasia Brown** handed out 11 assists against UNC Greensboro.
- Drexel senior **Jamila Thompson** dished out 12 assists at William & Mary on January 15.
- Also with 10 assists: **Darius Faulk** (Hofstra) at NJIT; **Breonn Hughey** (Towson) versus George Mason and Drexel's **Amencie Mercier** (Northeastern) at Hofstra on January 6.

BLOCK PARTY

- Hofstra had 13 blocks against UNCW on Jan. 18, tying the fifth most in CAA single game history.
- The Pride are one of three teams to have blocked 11+ shots in a single game this season. Towson had 11 at Loyola University Maryland on December 4. Three days later, Elon swatted away 11 shots at NC State.
- Forward **Anjie White** tied a CAA season high with seven blocks against UNCW on January 18.
- William & Mary rookie **Abby Rendle** swatted seven shots against Richmond on December 28.
- Individually, four players have blocked 100+ shots for their careers. James Madison's **Lauren Okafor** has 142 while College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** has 139 blocks. They are followed by Elon's **Sam Coffey** (126) and JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey** (116).

MAKE IT 1,000

- James Madison became the third team in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 victories on January 6 with a 74-57 victory over UNCW at the JMU Convocation Center. The only two teams ahead of JMU in program wins are Tennessee and Louisiana Tech. Dukes senior **Toia Giggetts** also recorded her 1,000th career point against the Seahawks that night.
- Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** became the fifth player in the CAA this season to reach 1,000 career points, doing so against Towson on February 8.
- Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** became the fourth player in the CAA this season to hit the 1,000 career point milestone. Hines-Allen has 1,142 points (903 points as a Tiger/239 points at Virginia Tech).
- James Madison's **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts** and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** reached the milestone earlier this year.

NON-CONFERENCE NOTES

The CAA went a combined 53-57 (.467) against non-conference opponents this season.

- Five teams finished their non-conference slate with a record of .500 or better.
- As a conference, the CAA went 7-2 against Patriot League teams and had a 6-2 mark against Big South teams.
- The CAA picked up a pairs of wins over both the ACC and American Athletic Conference.
- Home courts were defended well by CAA squads with a combined 33-15 record.

USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - 1/13

In addition to her CAA Rookie of the Week honor, Hofstra guard **Ashunae Durant** was selected as the National Freshman of the Week by the USBWA. Durant averaged a double-double with 13.0 points and 10.7 rebounds to help the Pride to a 3-0 week. The stretch included a 21-point, 17-rebound effort in the win at Drexel.

WELCOME ELON

The Colonial Athletic Association welcomes new member Elon University for the 2014-15 season behind fourth-year Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**.

- The Phoenix picked up 15 wins, including 10 victories in the SoCon, last year. Elon returns four of its five starters from one year ago, including second-leading scorer **Zora Stephenson** and SoCon Freshman of the Year **Jenifer Rhodes**.
- Senior forward **Sam Coffey** and sophomore guard **Lauren Brown**, who was named to the SoCon All-Rookie squad, are also back adding to the solid mix of veterans and experienced youth.

WELCOME COACHES

The CAA is proud to introduce two new head coaches to the league.

- Northeastern is led by **Kelly Cole**, the former Boston College and Harvard assistant who brings more than 20 years of coaching experience with her. She made 11 trips to the postseason, eight of those to the NCAA Tournament.
- At the College of Charleston, **Candice M. Jackson** is in her first season as a collegiate head coach after spending the past three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Duke University.

TOP HONOREES RETURN

Six All-CAA honorees return for the 2014-15 campaign, including CAA Rookie of the Year **Marlena Tremba** of William & Mary.

- All-CAA Second Team members **Precious Hall** and **Toia Giggetts**, both of JMU, return along with Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen**, and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins**.
- All-CAA Third Teamers Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** and Drexel's **Rachel Pearson** are back.

TOP SCORERS RETURN

Twelve of the top-20 scorers from a year ago return for the 2014-15 campaign.

- That group is headlined by James Madison's **Precious Hall** (15.4 ppg) and **Toia Giggetts** (14.1 ppg) and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.8 ppg).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

There's a bit of a youth movement in the CAA this year as 55.8 percent of the 145 women's basketball players are underclassmen. The rookie class has 42 members, including 36 true rookies, while there is a 38-member sophomore class with four redshirts.

CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- James Madison University junior **Precious Hall** was selected as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the Preseason All-CAA First Team by JMU teammate **Toia Giggetts**. Also earning first-team honors were: Towson's **LaTorri Hines-Allen** (14.1 ppg/8.4 rpg), Northeastern's **A'lece Mark** (15.0 ppg/4.0 rpg), and UNCW's **Kelva Atkins** (15.8 ppg/5.5 rpg).
- Voted to the Preseason All-CAA Second Team were: JMU's **Jazmon Gwathmey**, Delaware's **Courtnei Green**, Drexel's **Rachel Pearson**, College of Charleston's **Mikaela Hopkins** (8.6 ppg/2.3 bpg), and William & Mary's **Marlena Tremba** (13.2 ppg/2.1 apg).
- Receiving an honorable mention were: Delaware's **Joy Caracciolo**, Hofstra's **Elo Edeferioka**, Towson's **Dominique Johnson**, and UNCW's **Brie Mobley**.
- James Madison was picked to repeat as champions while Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, and Towson rounded out the top five teams in the league.

CAA IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Towson took part in the 2014 Preseason WNIT.

- In opening round action, the Tigers suffered a tough 71-64 loss at Penn State.
- Towson played host to a consolation pod at SECU Arena. The Tigers topped Rider, 53-51, on November 21 before falling to North Dakota, 54-52, the following day to conclude play.
- It was the first time the Tigers took part in the event since the 2009 campaign. During that campaign Towson fell to West Virginia, but posted victories over Winthrop (56-46) and North Carolina A&T (74-49).
- The last time a CAA squad took part in the Preseason WNIT was in 2012 when Delaware participated. The Blue Hens won their opening round game over Sam Houston State (63-31) before falling to Georgetown and Duquesne.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 11-14 in Preseason WNIT action.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

Six CAA squads played in tournaments over the Thanksgiving holiday.

- **James Madison** split games at the San Juan Shootout. In the opener, the Dukes fell to undefeated No. 10/8 Maryland, 80-64. They rebounded with a 84-60 victory over Houston in their finale.
- **Hofstra** advanced to the championship game of the Hofstra Thanksgiving Tournament but fell to (RV) Western Kentucky, 70-65, in overtime. In the opening game, the Pride posted a 61-58 overtime victory over Northern Iowa.
- **College of Charleston** faced some tough competition at the Gulf Coast Showcase, falling to No. 3 UConn, (RV) Minnesota, and Villanova.
- **UNCW** hosted the UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic at Trask Coliseum. In the opener, the Seahawks could not stop a late run by North Florida, falling 55-41. In the second game, UNCW fell to Western Carolina, 64-53.
- **Northeastern** battled at the FAU Thanksgiving Classic. In the opener, the Huskies were clipped by North Dakota State, 79-72. In the second game, Northeastern fell at host FAU, 81-74.
- **Towson** came up against two feisty opponents at the LIU Brooklyn Turkey Classic. The Tigers fell to Rhode Island, 60-49, on the opening day and suffered a 62-49 loss to La Salle in the finale.

TIP-OFF TIME

The CAA had a good showing during the opening weekend of play, going a combined 9-5.

- Eight of the 10 CAA squads got the 2014-15 campaign started on November 14
- Eight of the 10 teams opened action on their home courts and went a combined 6-2.
- There were two overtime contests which resulted in a win by JMU and a loss by Hofstra.
- Northeastern posted the first win of the season by clipping Boston University, 75-74, in the Cabot Center. It was also the first collegiate victory for Head Coach **Kelly Cole**.
- James Madison rallied from behind to upset No. 23 UCLA, 91-87, in overtime at the JMU Convocation Center.
- Elon picked up its first win as a member of the CAA by topping Anderson, 77-72.
- Ten double-doubles were registered by 10 different players during the opening weekend.
- During opening weekend, CAA teams out-scored opponents by a margin of 5.8 points per game (69.9/64.1) and out-rebounded opponents by 11.1 boards per game (43.4/32.3).
