## CONFERENCE NOTES:

**FIVE CAA TEAMS EARN POSTSEASON BERTHS:** Five CAA teams will participate in post-season play, which is the most for the conference since 2011. CAA champion **Northeastern** received a No. 14 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship and will face Notre Dame in second-round action on Thursday. **William & Mary** was seeded No. 7 in the NIT and heads to Tulsa on Tuesday for the first round. Two CAA teams will play in the CIT as **James Madison** travels to USC Upstate on Tuesday and **UNCW** visits Sam Houston State on Wednesday. **Hofstra** hosts Vermont on Wednesday in the first round of the CBI.

**CAA WIN STREAK VS. ACC IN NCAA'S:** CAA teams have won their past three NCAA Tournament games against ACC opponents. VCU beat Florida State (72-71 ot) in 2011, VCU defeated Duke (79-77) in 2007 and George Mason topped North Carolina (65-60) in 2006.

**CAA VS. NOTRE DAME IN NCAA TOURNAMENT:** This is the third meeting in the past eight years between Notre Dame and a CAA team in the NCAA Tournament. The Fighting Irish topped George Mason 68-50 in the first round in 2008, but Old Dominion beat Notre Dame 51-50 in the first round in 2010.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS:** CAA teams have won opening round NCAA Tournament games in six of the last nine years, including four of the past five. Since 2006, CAA teams have compiled a 14-13 record in the NCAA Tournament with two squads reaching the NCAA Final Four.

**PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS:** CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that nine-year period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

**NORTHEASTERN IN POST-SEASON PLAY:** Northeastern is making its eight NCAA Tournament appearance, but first as a member of the CAA and first overall since 1991. The Huskies are 3-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, with its last victory coming in 1984. This is the fourth post-season appearance for NU under coach **Bill Coen**, having played in the NIT in 2010 and 2013 and the CBI in 2009.

**CAA IN THE NIT:** CAA teams have a combined record of 16-33 all-time in the NIT. Recently, Drexel went 2-1 and advanced to the quarterfinals in 2012. CAA members Old Dominion and Hofstra faced off in the 2006 quarterfinals, with the Monarchs winning to advance to Madison Square Garden. **William & Mary** fell 80-72 at North Carolina in 2010 and 85-79 to Virginia Tech in 1983 in its only previous trips to the NIT.

**CAA IN THE CIT:** CAA teams have had great success in the CIT as the league has a combined record of 11-5. In 2009, Old Dominion captured the CIT championship and James Madison advanced to the semifinals. ODU also reached the quarterfinals in 2012 and Towson made it to the quarterfinals last season. **James Madison** is 2-1 all-time in the CIT, while **UNCW** is making its first appearance in the event.

**CAA IN THE CBI:** CAA teams have fared well in the CBI with a combined record of 11-8. VCU went 5-0 and captured the CBI championship in 2010 and George Mason advanced to the championship game in 2013. **Hofstra** suffered first-round setbacks to IUPUI (74-60) in 2010 and Evansville (77-70) in 2011 in its two previous CBI appearances.

**NORTHEASTERN CAPTURES FIRST CAA TITLE:** **Northeastern** shot 59% from the floor, including 12-of-20 from 3-point range, and defeated **William & Mary** 72-61 to capture its first CAA Men's Basketball Championship. Junior **Quincy Ford** paced the Huskies with a season-high 22 points and earned tournament MOP honors. The Huskies also got 15 points from **David Walker**, a career-high tying 13 points from **Caleb Donnelly** and 12 from **Scott Eatherton**. NU opened the game on a 10-0 run and held a 36-26 lead at the half. The Huskies extended the margin to 67-45 with 3:39 left before the Tribe reeled off 16 straight points to close within 67-61 with 36 seconds to go. NU hit 5-of-6 free throws down the stretch to seal the victory. **Marcus Thornton** led W&M with 20 points and **Daniel Dixon** added 15. It was the Tribe's fourth appearance in the CAA title game in the past eight years.

**RECORD-BREAKING NIGHT:** W&M's **Marcus Thornton** tied his career high and broke the CAA Tournament single-game scoring record with 37 points in the Tribe's 92-91 double-overtime victory over Hofstra in the semifinals. Thornton and **Omar Prewitt**, who added a career-best 33 points in the win, became the first teammates with 30+ points in a CAA Tournament game. It was the first two-overtime game in the tournament since 2010.

**FOUR-WAY TIE FOR REGULAR-SEASON TITLE:** For the first time in CAA history, there was a four-way tie for the CAA regular-season title as **James Madison, UNCW, Northeastern** and **William & Mary** all finished 12-6. W&M captured its first regular-season crown since 1997-98, JMU won its first title since 1999-2000, UNCW posted its first regular-season title since 2005-06 and NU claimed its second regular-season championship in the past three years. **It was the first tie for the CAA regular-season championship since 2005-06 and the first time the conference has had more than two teams finish in a first-place tie.**

**HISTORIC BALANCE:** The six conference losses for the CAA regular-season champion were tied for the most in league history. The last time the first-place team in the CAA had more than four setbacks was 1996-97 when Old Dominion and UNCW shared the league title with a 10-6 mark. There were seven teams that finished .500 or better in CAA play.

**THORNTON HEADLINES ALL-CAA TEAMS:** William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** was selected as the CAA Men's Basketball Player of the Year, becoming the first Tribe player to ever receive the honor. Other top honors went to Elon guard **Elijah Bryant** as Rookie of the Year, W&M guard **Terry Tarpey** as Defensive Player of the Year and UNCW's **Kevin Keatts** as Coach of the Year.

**ROAD TEAMS FARE WELL IN CAA PLAY:** Road teams posted a 21-19 mark over the final four weeks and home teams finished just 47-43 (52.2%) in CAA play this season. Seven squads posted winning records in league road games, led by **Hofstra (6-3)** and **James Madison (6-3)**. All 10 teams won at least one conference road contest and eight won three or more. Last season, home teams went 44-28 (61.1%) in CAA play.

**THORNTON BECOMES W&M'S ALL-TIME LEADING SCORER:** William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** became the school's all-time leading scorer on Feb. 25 and now has 2,155 points. He broke the oldest Division I scoring record in the country, which was set by Chet Giermak (2,052 pts) back in 1950. Thornton ranks third among all active NCAA Division I players in career 3-pointers made (321) and he's sixth in career scoring. He's also fourth on the CAA's career treys chart and eighth on the CAA career scoring list.

**DREXEL'S LEE SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY:** Drexel junior guard **Damion Lee**, who leads the CAA and ranks fourth nationally in scoring with 21.4 ppg, went out for the season after suffering a fracture in his right hand on Feb. 21 at Northeastern. Lee finished with 578 points, which is the 8th-highest season total in school history. He also ranks 10th on the Dragons' career scoring list with 1,538 points.

**TWO CAA PLAYERS AMONG TOP 15 IN SCORING:** Two CAA players are among the nation's top 30 in scoring through games of March 15. Drexel's **Damion Lee** is ranked 4th with 21.4 ppg, and W&M's **Marcus Thornton** is 15th with 19.9 ppg. Thornton has scored double figures in 38 consecutive games and Lee has a 24-game streak.

**3-POINT THREATS:** The CAA features several of the nation's top three-point threats this season. W&M sophomore **Daniel Dixon** ranks 3rd in Div. I in 3-pt percentage (46.2%). Elon junior **Tanner Samson** ranks 14th in 3's per game (3.12). W&M senior **Marcus Thornton** is 17th in 3's per game (3.06) and 34th in 3-pt percentage (40.8%). Hofstra sophomore **Brian Bernardi** is 34th in 3's per game (2.82) and 33rd in 3-pt percentage (41.0%).

**MCGLYNN RANKED #5 NATIONALLY IN FT PERCENTAGE:** Towson junior guard **Four McGlynn** is 122-of-133 (91.7%) at the charity stripe, which currently ranks fifth in the nation. Last season, McGlynn led the CAA and ranked sixth nationally in free throw percentage at 91.3%. Drexel junior **Damion Lee** ranks 12th at 88.7%.

**COFC'S BARRY EARNS ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS:** College of Charleston sophomore **Canyon Barry** was named to the Capital One Academic All-America second team. He holds a 4.0 grade point average while majoring in physics and minoring in computer science and mathematics. Barry is only the second CofC men's basketball player to receive Academic All-America accolades.

**GREEN, THORNTON ON AWARDS LISTS:** Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green** and William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** were two of 40 players named to the mid-season watch list for the Lou Henson Award, which is presented to the Division I Mid-Major Player of the Year by CollegeInsider.com. The award will be presented on April 3. Thornton is also one of 16 finalists for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award, which is presented to the nation's top shooting guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** There are only six seniors among the CAA's top 30 in scoring, five seniors among the league's top 20 in rebounding and four seniors among the top 15 in assists. Through games of March 15, there were 12 juniors, 10 sophomores and two freshmen on the list of top 30 scorers, while there were nine juniors, five sophomores and one freshman on the list of top 20 rebounders.

**CLIMBING THE 3-POINT LISTS:** Three CAA players are climbing the career three-point lists at their respective schools. William & Mary senior guard **Marcus Thornton** became the Tribe's career 3-point leader (321) on Jan. 21, passing David Schneider (278). That total also ranks 4th in CAA history. Delaware senior guard **Kyle Anderson** is the Blue Hens' all-time three-point leader (269), passing Mike Ames (228) on Jan. 5. Elon junior guard **Tanner Samson** ranks fourth on Elon's career three-pointers list with 242 and set the school record for 3-pointers in a season with 103, which ranks 3rd in CAA history.

**HOFSTRA'S GREEN FOURTH IN NATION IN MADE FREE THROWS:** Hofstra guard **Juan'ya Green** made 200 free throws this season, which is the 4th-most of any player in Division I. Green ranks sixth in free throws attempted (242). He's shooting an impressive 82.6% from the charity stripe. Green also ranks 9th nationally in assists (6.5 apg).

**CAA TEAMS AMONG NATIONAL STATS LEADERS:** Several CAA teams are ranked in the top 25 nationally in various statistical categories through games of March 15. **William & Mary** ranks 7th nationally in FG percentage (48.9%) and **Northeastern** is 12th (48.6%). **Hofstra** is 15th (8.9 pg) in 3's per game, while the Tribe is 17th in 3's per game (8.8) and 10th in 3-point FG% (40.1%). Hofstra is also 12th in scoring offense (78.4 ppg). **Towson** ranks 3rd in rebound margin (+8.7 rpg).

**DOUBLE TRIPLE-DOUBLES:** Only 12 players have recorded triple-doubles in Division I basketball this season, and two of them are in the CAA. William & Mary junior **Terry Tarpey** had the first triple-double in the 110-year history of Tribe basketball on Jan. 10 when he had 18 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high 10 assists in a win over James Madison. Hofstra junior guard **Juan'ya Green** turned in the first triple-double in Pride program history on Dec. 28 when he had 15 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a victory over LIU Brooklyn.

**CAA IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY:** CAA teams are 58-64 (.475) in non-conference play. Of the 64 losses, 20 have come against teams from the Power 5 conferences, as well as seven teams who are currently ranked in the top 25 (#2 Villanova, #4 Duke, #6 Virginia, #15 North Carolina, #17 Louisville, #20 West Virginia and #22 Georgetown.)

**MORE ON THE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS:** CAA teams played only 49 of their 122 non-conference games (40.2%) at home and the league was a combined 31-18 in those contests. CAA teams also picked up 18 road victories and are a combined 9-7 in neutral site games.

**CAA RANKED 18TH AMONG DIVISION I CONFERENCES:** The CAA is ranked 18th out of the nation's 32 Division I conferences according to the latest RPI report produced by Collegiate Basketball News (rpiratings.com) through March 15. **Northeastern** is ranked #86 in the RPI while **William & Mary** is ranked #93, **UNCW** is #146 and **James Madison** is #148.

**THREE CAA PLAYERS NOMINATED FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Three CAA men's basketball players - College of Charleston sophomore guard **Canyon Barry**, Hofstra graduate student guard **Dion Nesmith** and UNCW senior forward **Cedrick Williams** - have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team. The prestigious award recognizes student-athletes who have made significant contributions to their communities through volunteerism and civic service.
