Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Percy Agyei-Obese | RB | James Madison

Agyei-Obese earned All-America and All-CAA honors after rushing for a league-high 717 yards and 8 TD's in seven games last spring. He ran for 1,216 yards and 19 TD's in 2019 and enters the year among the top 10 in JMU history in career rushing yards (2,374) and rushing TD's (29).



Preseason Defensive Player of the Year Mike Greene | DL | James Madison

Greene was honored as the CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year last spring and received All-America accolades. He contributed 25 tackles, a league-best 10.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and three QB hurries over eight games. Greene had 53 tackles, 11.0 TFL and 7.5 sacks in 2019.

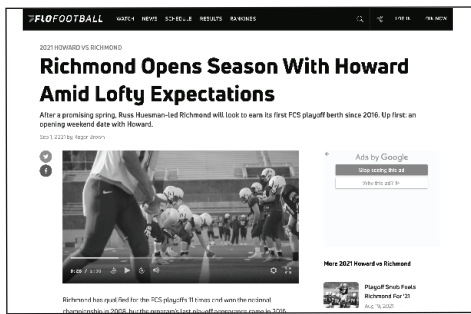

Weekly Awards

CAA Football names Offensive, Defensive, Rookie and Special Teams Players of the Week every Monday morning during the regular season. Winners are chosen from nominations provided by CAA Football media relations personnel and are announced at the beginning of the weekly teleconference. The weekly honors release can be accessed at CAAFootball.com.

Annual Awards

All-CAA Football First, Second and Third Teams, Players of the Year on offense, defense and special teams, Rookies of the Year on offense and defense, and Coach of the Year are selected by a vote of the league’s 12 head coaches at the end of the regular season. The awards will be announced by the CAA Football office on Tuesday, November 23.



CONFERENCE NOTES:

CONFERENCE MATCHUPS KICK OFF SEASON: CAA Football kicks off the 2021 season with a pair of conference matchups on Thursday night. New Hampshire visits Stony Brook at 6 p.m., renewing a series in which the teams have split their past six meetings. Maine hosts Delaware at 7 p.m. on the new turf at Alford Stadium. The Black Bears have won four of the past six meetings, but the Blue Hens beat Maine, 37-0, to open the season last spring.

KEY NON-CONFERENCE CONTESTS ON SATURDAY: Eight CAA teams face non-conference foes to start the year on Saturday. Highlighting the slate is UAlbany heading to perennial FCS power North Dakota State. Four teams play in-state opponents as Villanova goes to Lehigh, Towson meets Morgan State in the Battle of Baltimore, Rhode Island hosts Bryant and William & Mary is at ACC member Virginia. Three other teams face FCS squads at home as Richmond meets Howard, Elon battles Wofford and JMU welcomes Morehead State.

STRONG PERFORMANCE IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: CAA Football teams were 30-9 (.769) against non-conference FCS foes in 2019, which was the best of any conference. The league compiled a 22-9 (.710) record against non-conference FCS competition in 2018 and went 26-6 (.813) in non-conference games against FCS opponents in 2017. During the shortened 2021 spring campaign, CAA teams went 8-3.

SUCCESS AGAINST THE FBS: CAA Football has posted 38 wins over FBS foes in its history and has won at least one game against an FBS team in 11 of the past 13 years. Since 2013, seven different teams (UAlbany, JMU, Maine, New Hampshire, Richmond, Towson and Villanova) have recorded a FBS victory and the league posted multiple wins over FBS opponents in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

FOUR TEAMS RANKED IN FCS TOP 25 POLLS: Four CAA Football teams are ranked in the preseason AFCA Coaches FCS Top 25 poll and three are ranked in the Stats Perform poll. James Madison is #2 and Delaware is #5 in both polls. Villanova is #15 in the AFCA poll and #16 in the Stats Perform poll, while Richmond is #22 in the AFCA poll and received votes in the Stats poll. Three other CAA teams - New Hampshire, Rhode Island and UAlbany - were among others receiving votes.

EIGHT PLAYERS ON WATCH LISTS FOR LEGACY AWARDS: CAA Football had eight players placed on Watch Lists for the Stats Perform Legacy Awards. JMU running back Percy Agyei-Obese, Delaware running back Dejoun Lee, UAlbany running back Karl Mofor and Villanova quarterback Dan Smith are on the watch list for the Payton Award, given to the best offensive player in FCS. JMU defensive tackle Mike Greene, Villanova linebacker Forrest Rhyne, Richmond defensive tackle Kobie Turner and Richmond linebacker Tristan Wheeler are on the watch list for the Buchanan Award, given to the top defensive player in FCS.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA ACCOLADES: CAA Football had 15 players from seven schools earn preseason All-America accolades from Stats Perform. James Madison (Percy Agyei-Obese, Kyle Davis, Liam Fornadel, Mike Greene and Ethan Ratke) led the way with five selections. Delaware (Dejoun Lee, David Kroll and Kedrick Whitehead) had three players recognized, while Richmond (Kobie Turner and Tristan Wheeler) and Villanova (Malik Fisher and Forrest Rhyne) each had two. They were joined by UAlbany's Karl Mofor, New Hampshire's Evan Horn and Stony Brook's Kyle Nunez. Eleven players also received All-America honors from HERO Sports and eight from Phil Steele.

RATKE NEARS FCS CAREER FIELD GOALS MARK: JMU kicker **Ethan Ratke** enters the 2021 season with 72 career field goals, which is three shy of the FCS record held by Montana's Dan Carpenter. Ratke set the CAA record for field goals in a season with 27 in 2019, and broke the league's career mark of 64 set by Towson's Aidan O'Neill last spring. Ratke was 14-for-14 on field goals last spring. He also holds the CAA record for career points scored by a kicker with 392 and is 21 shy of the FCS record of 413 held by Carpenter.



UNH'S MCDONNELL NEARING 100 LEAGUE WINS: New Hampshire coach **Sean McDonnell** enters the season ranked No. 3 on CAA Football's all-time wins list with 98 conference victories. With two more, he would join Villanova's Andy Talley (142) and W&M's Jimmie Laycock (112) as the only coaches to reach the century mark. McDonnell guided UNH to 14 consecutive FCS playoff appearances from 2004-17.

DOMINANT DEFENSE: The CAA had five of the top 15 teams in FCS in total defense (#2 New Hampshire - 222.0 ypg, #4 Delaware - 239.4 ypg, #5 JMU - 243.4 ypg, #11 UAlbany - 272.5 ypg and #13 Richmond - 278.5 ypg) last spring and three of top 10 in scoring defense (#3 Delaware - 14.4 ppg, #8 JMU - 16.5 ppg and #9 Richmond - 17.0 ppg).

JMU FAVORED TO CAPTURE CAA TITLE: James Madison, which is coming off a 7-1 spring season that included its fourth trip to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs in the past five years, was picked to capture the CAA title in 2021 by the league's head coaches and media relations directors. The Dukes got 15 first-place votes and 231 total points to finish ahead of second-place Delaware, which received seven first-place tallies and 222 points. Villanova was picked third, followed by Richmond, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Towson, UAlbany, Maine, Stony Brook, William & Mary and Elon.

JMU'S AGYEI-OBESE, GREENE HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: JMU running back Percy Agyei-Obese was chosen as the CAA Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Dukes' defensive tackle Mike Greene was selected as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the league's head coaches and media relations directors. Delaware all schools with eight players on the preseason all-conference squad, while JMU had seven. A complete list of honorees and all-conference award winners is included in the release.

DEEPEST CONFERENCE IN FCS: No conference has proven to be as strong from top to bottom as CAA Football in recent years. Eleven of the league's 12 teams have participated in the FCS playoffs since 2015.

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 30 straight seasons, and has had at least three teams in the playoff field in 14 of the past 15 years. Ten times in league history at least four teams were chosen. Five teams were picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and the CAA set a record with six teams selected in 2018.

CAA CONTINUES SEMIFINAL STREAK: CAA Football has had a team advance to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs in each of the past eight years - Towson (2013), New Hampshire (2014), Richmond (2015), JMU (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020), Maine (2018) and Delaware (2020) - and 28 semifinalists overall. CAA teams are 12-16 all-time in semifinal contests.

CAA KNOWS THE WAY TO FRISCO: CAA Football has had a team in the FCS championship game 11 times since 2003. Four different schools have combined to win five national titles during that stretch - Delaware (2003), JMU (2004, 2016), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009). Former member UMass also claimed a national title in 1998.

CAA SETS POLICIES RELATED TO COVID: CAA Football announced a new policy relating to games that are unable to be played due to CoVID-related protocols during the 2021 season. Any game that can't be played would be considered a forfeit by the cancelling team. The cancelling team would receive a loss in the conference standings and the opposing team would be awarded a victory. The overall record of both teams would not change per NCAA bylaws. If both teams are unable to play due to CoVID-related circumstances, the game would be considered a no contest and would not be a part of the record of either team.



UALBANY**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Open the season at perennial FCS power North Dakota State on Saturday.
- Karl Mofor ran for a CAA-best 115.0 ypg last spring and topped the conference with 1,290 rushing yards and 10 TD's in 2019.
- Jeff Undercuffler passed for a program-record 3,543 yards in 2019 and his 41 TD passes were the most by a freshman in FCS history and also set a school record.
- Mofor and Undercuffler were both named to the CFPA National Performer of the Year Watch List for 2021.
- UAlbany ranked 11th nationally in total defense last spring, allowing 272.5 ypg.
- Danny Damico led the Great Danes with 34 stops last spring and recorded 109 tackles and 8.0 TFL in 2019.
- Jared Verse was named the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year last spring. He contributed 22 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 4.0 sacks and a forced fumble in just four games.

JAMES MADISON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Host Morehead State in Saturday's opener. The Dukes have won 17 straight games at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- Percy Agyei-Obese led the CAA with 717 rushing yards and 8 TD's in 7 games last spring. He ranks 10th on JMU's career rushing list (2,374 yds) and 6th in rush TD's (29).
- Cole Johnson led FCS in pass efficiency last spring. He threw for 200+ yards in his final five games, including 271 yards vs. SHSU.
- Antwane Wells, Jr. led the CAA with 18.3 yards per catch last spring. He had 18 catches for 332 yards and 4 TD's in the playoffs.
- JMU ranks 5th in FCS in total defense (243.4 ypg) last spring and 8th in scoring defense (16.5 ppg).
- Ethan Ratke owns CAA records for FG's in a season (27) and a career (72) and points by kicking in a career (392).
- Mike Greene led the CAA with 10.5 tackles for loss last spring. He was voted as the CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year.

DELAWARE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Travels to CAA foe Maine on Thursday night. UD defeated the Black Bears, 37-0, in last spring's opener in Newark.
- Nolan Henderson completed 70.7% of his passes last spring, which ranked 3rd in FCS.
- Gene Coleman II led the CAA with 44 receptions for 433 yards last spring, while Thyrick Pitts added 29 catches for 451 yards.
- Dejour Lee was named the CAA Offensive Player of the Year last spring. He was 2nd in the CAA in rushing yards (564) and all-purpose yards (108.9 ypg).
- Delaware's defense allowed just 239.4 ypg last spring, which ranked 4th in FCS, and 14.4 ppg, which was 3rd in FCS.
- The Blue Hens advanced to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs last spring for the first time since 2010.
- Delaware's defense forced 18 turnovers over eight games last spring and was +11 in turnover margin for the season. UD was 2nd in the CAA with 11 interceptions.

MAINE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Face #5 Delaware at home on Thursday night on the new turf at Alford Stadium.
- Joe Fagnano passed for over 230 yards in Maine's final three games last spring and threw for 4 TD's vs. Albany and Stony Brook. He has 25 TD passes in 12 career games.
- Andre Miller led Maine in receptions (21), receiving yards (348) and receiving TD's (6) last spring.
- Freshman Freddie Brock ran for 149 yards on 23 carries (6.5 ypc) in Maine's final two games last spring.
- Jamehl Wiley made 27 tackles in four games last spring, which ranked 2nd on the team. He has started 24 of 29 games in his career.
- Khairi Manns recorded a team-high 8 tackles and a TFL in last spring's finale vs. Villanova and finished with 23 tackles.
- WR Devin Young returns to the lineup after sitting out last spring. He registered a career-high 41 receptions for 593 yards and 4 TD's in 2019.

ELON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Host Wofford on Saturday in its season opener. The two teams last met in the first round of the 2018 FCS playoffs.
- Davis Cheek returns under center after missing last spring due to injury. He ranks 10th among returning FCS quarterbacks with 5,624 career passing yards. He's 3rd in career pass yards and TD passes (34) at EU.
- Jaylan Thomas led the Phoenix with 307 rushing yards last spring. His 1,483 career rushing yards ranks 7th in Elon history.
- Kortez Weeks ranks 8th in Elon history with 1,671 career receiving yards. He made a team-high 43 receptions in 2019.
- Cole Coleman recorded a career-high 17 tackles in last spring's opener vs. Davidson and had 12 in the finale vs. Richmond. He led Elon with 84 stops in 2019.
- Tre'Von Jones contributed a team-high 45 tackles last spring. He also earned pre-season All-CAA recognition in 2021 as a punt returner.

NEW HAMPSHIRE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Travel to Stony Brook on Thursday night for conference opener.
- Bret Edwards will start at QB after returning starter Max Brosmer suffered a knee injury. Edwards started the first game in 2019.
- Carlos Washington, Jr. rushed for 601 yards and 3 TD's in 2019 and also had 28 receptions for 160 yards.
- Sean Coyne caught TD passes of 4 and 18 yards against UAlbany in UNH's lone game last spring.
- UNH's defense limited UAlbany to 224 total yards in their lone game last spring, including just 32 yards on the ground.
- All-America safety Evan Horn is UNH's career leader in tackles (174), interceptions (11) and sacks (7.0).

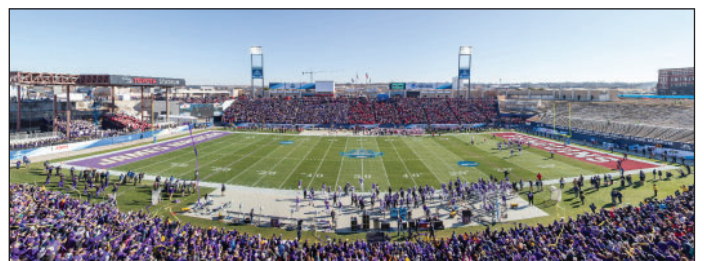
