LA GRANDE, Ore. - While Concordia opened up the season a few weeks ago in Canada, the majority of the Cascade Conference tips off this week across the Pacific Northwest.

Warner Pacific, Evergreen and Northwest will head across the border to Canada this weekend to open their respective seasons. Evergreen and Northwest will be in Kamloops at a tournament hosted by Thompson Rivers while WPC travels to a trio of Canadian schools.

Eastern Oregon hosts New Hope Christian for a pair while College of Idaho heads to Montana Western to take on the Bulldogs and Rocky Mountain.

A trio of exhibitions round out the week with Northwest Christian playing at Oregon, Concordia at Seattle Pacific and Corban at Oregon State.

Around The Cascade Conference

College of Idaho - Coyotes open up the 2013-14 season in Dillon, Mont. this weekend at the Finny Memorial Classic against the top-two preseason teams in the Frontier Conference (Montana Western and Rocky Mountain)...Yotes expect to have three new players in the starting line-up for the game.

Concordia - Adam Herman, a third-team NAIA All-American last season, was voted the 2013-14 Cascade Collegiate Conference Preseason Player of the Year. Herman averaged 22.4 points per game and 9.6 rebounds per game last season.

Corban - The 2013-14 season is about to tip-off for second-year head coach Steve Masten and the Warriors, as Corban opens play in less than a week against NCAA Division I member Oregon State University in an exhibition contest inside Gill Coliseum. Corban welcomes back preseason all-conference selection Jordan Carter for his third full season as a Warrior after he suffered a season-ending knee injury five games into the 2012-13 season. Masten and his coaching staff have added nine new faces to this year's squad, including a pair of junior college transfers and seven freshman.

Eastern Oregon - EOU will be led by former player and Alum Jared Barrett this season. He replaces Isaac Williams. The Mountaineers open up its season this Friday against New Hope Christian College.

Evergreen - The Geoducks open up the 2013-14 season this weekend in Kamloops, B.C., taking on UBC-Okanagan and Thompson Rivers. Evergreen was picked 10th in the CCC preseason coaches poll.

Northwest - The Eagles head north of the border to Kamloops, B.C. and two games at Thompson Rivers University. The Eagles take on TRU on Friday and then play the University of British Columbia-Okanagan on Saturday. UBCO is located in Kelowna, B.C.

Northwest Christian - NCU will open the season with an exhibition at NCAA Division I no. 18 University of Oregon on Sunday. Head Coach Luke Jackson will lead the Beacons against his former team. The Northwest Christian roster also boasts a pair of former Ducks in Coleton Baker and Austin Kuemper. The game will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Network, with subsequent rebroadcasts to follow during the week.

Oregon Tech - The Hustlin' Owls will play Pacific Union on November 3rd at 5:00 pm as Head Coach Danny Miles looks to win game #988.

Southern Oregon - Southern Oregon has improved its Cascade Conference standing three straight years and is expected to continue that trend all the way to the top this season. The Raiders, who return all five starters and 15 of 17 players overall, were No. 1 in the CCC preseason coaches' poll while Eric Thompson, David Sturner and Kyle Tedder were preseason all-conference picks. Their alumni game is scheduled for Saturday and they'll open their regular season Nov. 2 against Pacific Union.

Warner Pacific - The CCC defending champion Knights head to Canada for their first contests of the season. WP will face Trinity Western, British Columbia, and Victoria this weekend.
