Around The Cascade Conference

College of Idaho - Lady Yotes continue to prepare for their season openers Nov. 1-2 (Montana Western/Carroll)...C of I was picked to share CCC title by the coaches.

Concordia - Senior guard Kelly Huey and last year's co-Freshman of the Year McKenna Daly were named to the CCC Preseason All-CCC Team. Last season Huey averaged 11.3 points per game and 6.0 rebounds per game, while Daly averaged 5.8 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per game.

Corban - Head coach Dave Bale begins his second stint with the Warriors after six years away from the bench on the first day of November at the Spokane Challenge hosted by Eastern Oregon University. The Warriors, who are one year removed from the program's first-ever outright regular season title, return nine players from last year's playoff-qualifying team along with the addition of eight new faces to the Warrior family. Preseason all-conference selection Tara Vanweerdhuizen is a mere nine blocked shots away from setting a new program-record for her career, as she is only the second player in school history to register 200-or-more blocks in a career joining former Warrior player and associate head coach Rosey Ball.

Eastern Oregon - The Mountaineers were picked as Co-Favorites with the CCC. EOU opened the season with a win over Walla Walla on Tuesday night. EOU opens its home schedule on Friday and Saturday against New Hope Christian.

Evergreen - The Geoducks continue to prepare for the 2013-14 season. They take on local rival Saint Martin's in an exhibition on Nov. 5 before hosting Northwest in a non-conference game on Nov. 6.

Northwest - The NU women take a 2 1/2 hour ferry ride to Nanaimo, B.C., on Vancouver Island this weekend to two games against Vancouver Island University.

Northwest Christian - The Beacons will start off the season short-handed. Three members of the women's basketball team are currently in the throes of fall sports competition. Chandler Gabrio is playing with the women's volleyball team while Maddi Bartholomew and Melyssa Weber are with women's soccer.

Oregon Tech - Returns two 1st Team All- CCC Players Karissa Dixon and Kassi Conditt as it opens the season at Humboldt State on Saturday night in Arcata, Calif. It's the first time OIT has played Humboldt since the Lady Owls downed the Jack's 10 years ago 64-54 on December 12th 2003.

Southern Oregon - Senior guard Allison Gida and junior forward Carly Meister were preseason all-conference picks, and Southern Oregon was picked to finish fourth in the CCC preseason coaches' poll. The Raiders, who closed out last season by winning five of six including their first conference tournament win in three years, open their season Nov. 1 against California Maritime.

Warner Pacific - The Warner Pacific women head to Canada for their first contests of the season. WP will face Trinity Western, British Columbia, and Victoria this weekend.
