Lewis-Clark State - The No. 2 Lewis-Clark-State Warriors will play host to the College of Idaho Yotes this weekend at Harris Field. These two in-state rivals were scheduled to play during the Guardian Tournament in Lewiston to open the 2014 season, but the weather intervened. LCSC has won 28 of the past 33 games against the Yotes, including five of six during the 2013 campaign. Reigning Red Lion Player of the Week Jake Shirley leads the Warriors in batting average (.400), runs (17), hits (20), RBI (15) and is tied for the team lead in doubles (four).
