Corban - In four league outings totaling 35 innings, senior right-hander Jacob Kopra has allowed only two earned runs and 25 hits while walking just five and striking out 28. His league earned run average is 0.51. For the season Kopra is 6-0 with a 1.38 earned run average.

Lewis-Clark State - The third-ranked Lewis-Clark State Warriors return home to Harris Field this weekend to host Concordia (Ore.) in a four-game NAIA West series. The Warriors enter the weekend 24-5 overall and 13-3 in regional play. LCSC went 9-1 on its recent 10-game road trip thanks in large part to the efforts of senior center fielder and reigning NAIA West Player of the Week Ryan Sells, who hit .455 with three homers and nine RBI last week. The Warriors beat the Cavaliers 8-6 in Portland on March 5 as part of the Porter Park Classic, and won six of the seven matchups between the two teams last year.
