Around The NAIA West

British Columbia - UBC, 14-6 in NAIA West play, travels to Salem, Ore. for a big four-game series against the Corban Warriors, who are one game behind the T-Birds. UBC lost three of four at the College of Idaho, who are also a game behind the T-Birds in the race to host the league playoffs. First baseman Bruce Yari, from Waterloo, Ont., is on a tear at the plate. He went 9-of-18 against CI and has had multiple hits in eight of his last ten games.

Lewis-Clark State - The Lewis-Clark State baseball team moved up to No. 2 in the NAIA Coaches' Top 25 this week on the strength of a 10-game winning streak. The Warriors swept Concordia (Ore.) at Harris Field in a four-game series over the weekend, with Cody Lavalli providing some fireworks with a walk-off homer to win the second game of Saturday's doubleheader. LCSC has now been ranked in 131 consecutive editions of the NAIA Top 25 and have been in the top 10 for 19 consecutive weeks. LCSC (28-5, 17-3 NAIA West) will head to Simpson this weekend to battle the Red Hawks in northern California.

Menlo - Menlo senior right hander Daniel Chavez became just the second pitcher in Menlo College baseball history to throw a no-hitter and the first to do so in a nine inning game when he shut out Simpson on Friday afternoon. Chavez struck out four and induced nine ground outs in the no-hit effort and lowered his season ERA to 1.73. The Oaks also eclipsed the .500 mark for the first time since March 1 with the four-game sweep of the Red Hawks. Menlo 22-21, travels to Klamath Falls this weekend for a four game tilt with Oregon Tech.

Oregon Tech - The Hustlin' Owls will look to snap a 12 game NAIA West losing streak as they host Menlo College for a 4-game series starting Saturday at Kiger Stadium.
