Welcome Message

Welcome to the 2023 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Men's Basketball Tournament.

The CCIW enters 2022-23 as its 77th season of competition, 37th for women's sports.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 59 NCAA Division III National Championships in 13 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

The CCIW added three new associate members for men's wrestling in 2016, including Lakeland University, Concordia University Wisconsin and the Milwaukee School of Engineering. Aurora University began competition in men's wrestling in 2022-23. The University of Chicago (women's lacrosse) and Washington University in St. Louis (football) joined the CCIW as associate members in 2018, while Loras College joined as an associate member when the conference added men's volleyball in 2019. Aurora University, Lakeland and Marian University all joined as associate members for women's bowling last season. Transylvania recently joined as an associate member for men's lacrosse and began competing in the spring of 2022.

The CCIW is in its first season sponsoring women's wrestling in 2022-23 as the league's 26th sport. The CCIW is the first NCAA Division III conference to sponsor women's wrestling. Five schools are participating in CCIW women's wrestling this winter when core members Augustana, Carthage and North Central were joined by Aurora and Lakeland.

The CCIW, which sponsors 26 sports, has carried a long tradition of excellence dating back to its inception in 1946, helping student-athletes grow in their athletic as well as educational experience. The conference looks to continue that tradition and remains dedicated to helping our student-athletes towards success.

On behalf of the CCIW and its member schools, we would like to thank you for your support and hope you enjoy your experience at all conference events.
