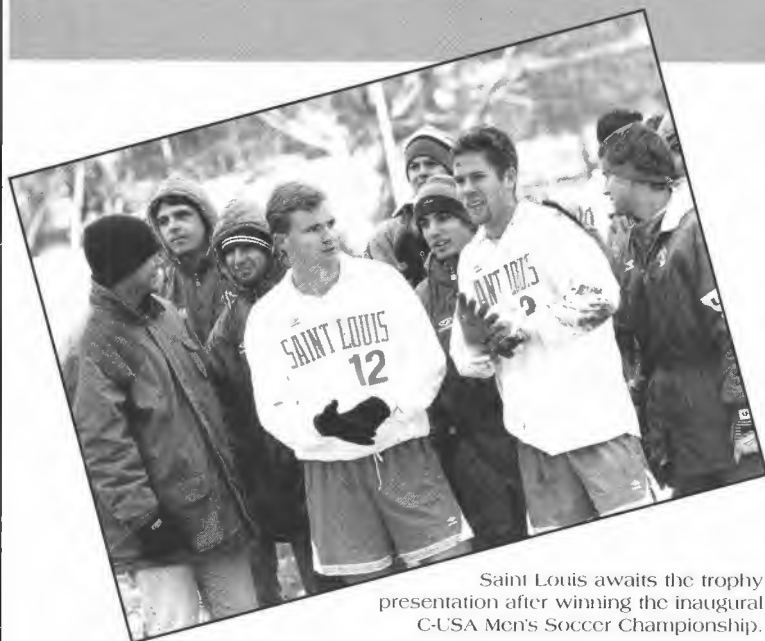

# CONFERENCE USA

**C**onference USA (C-USA), one of the nation's newest intercollegiate athletic conferences, has blasted off to a great start in its inaugural season of competition. C-USA consists of 12 universities and spans 12 states across the United States, more than any other Division I-A conference.

Conference USA is comprised of UAB, Cincinnati, DePaul, Houston, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, UNC Charlotte, Saint Louis, South Florida, Southern Mississippi and Tulane. Eleven of the institutions began athletic participation in 1995, while Houston will join competition this fall.

The conference officially unveiled its name, logo and commissioner on April 24, 1995, at Harry Caray's Restaurant in Chicago. Michael Slive was named the first commissioner of Conference USA by the presidents of the 12 institutions.

Conference USA sponsors 18 sports, including Division I-A football, which begins this fall.

The league sponsors championship competition in the following men's sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, and track and field (indoor and outdoor). C-USA also will sponsor the following women's sports: basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, track and field (indoor and outdoor), and volleyball. Rifle is a combined sport. The league's championship competition is enhanced by NCAA automatic bids to the C-USA tournament champion in volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's soccer and baseball.

Beginning in August, six member institutions (Cincinnati, Houston, Louisville, Memphis, Southern Mississippi, and Tulane) will compete for the first Conference USA football championship. Each school will play five conference games, with the regular season champion earning an automatic bid to the St. Jude Liberty Bowl. Conference USA also

has a five-year football television contract with Liberty/Fox Sports.

In men's basketball, Conference USA is comprised of three divisions (Red, White and Blue). The 1996 men's basketball season produced six postseason teams (4 NCAA and 2 NIT), and by season's end, C-USA was ranked as the

fourth best conference in the nation by the RPI. The conference will embark on its second season of a six-year basketball television agreement with Creative Sports and ESPN.

Women's basketball, which also has a three-division format, is coming off a memorable first season, as well. Four C-USA teams earned NCAA Tournament bids, the third highest among

Division I conferences. Women's basketball, along with volleyball, soccer and baseball, will enjoy significant television exposure throughout the upcoming year.

Other C-USA accomplishments during the inaugural season included Saint Louis making its 35th appearance in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship, Louisville making its sixth straight

NCAA volleyball appearance, South Florida advancing to the NCAA Volleyball Championship for the second time in three years and Saint Louis making its first-ever postseason volleyball appearance at the National Invitational Volleyball Championship. South Florida and Tulane made appearances in the NCAA Baseball Championship. The Memphis women's golf team made its first trip to the NCAA Championship and the league had several NCAA competitors in track and field, tennis and golf.

The presidents of the 12 member institutions serve as Conference USA's Board of Directors, chaired by Dr. Joseph Steger of Cincinnati. C-USA has been

designated one of eight conferences that will have direct representation on the Division I Board of Directors in the new NCAA governance structure.

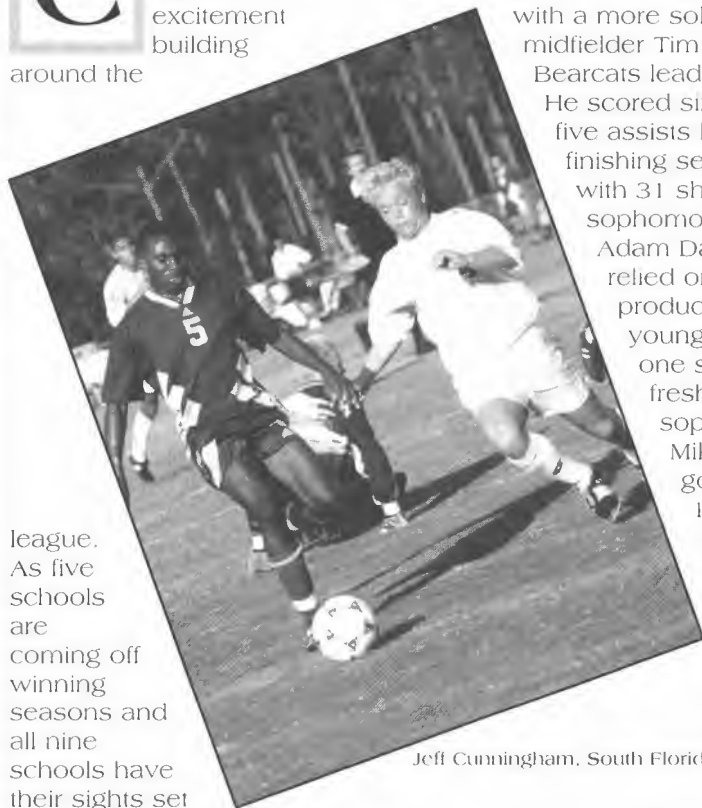

# 1996 PREVIEW

**C**onference USA begins its second season of men's soccer this fall with excitement building around the

league. As five schools are coming off winning seasons and all nine schools have their sights set on continued improvement, C-USA is ready to gain even greater national prominence in its second campaign.

At **UAB**, head coach Mike Getman has the Blazers geared toward a third consecutive regular season conference championship. Senior goalkeeper Loukas Papaconstantinou is already UAB's all-time leader in saves and is coming off a 10 shutout campaign in 1995. Midfielder Brian Corcoran is the Blazers leading returning scorer (6 goals, 6 assists, 18 points), while a pair of second team All-Conference honorees, Joe Mattachione and Danny Ziannis, return to the backfield to assist Papaconstantinou. Getman also welcomes the addition of a pair of high school All-Americans, Owen Blake and Erik Kuster. The non-conference schedule features several challenges, including Wake Forest, Indiana, UNC Greensboro and College of Charleston.

After a .500 finish in league play last year, first year head coach Jeff Cook is aiming to move

**CINCINNATI** up the conference ladder. The Bearcats will look to combine stronger goal production with a more solid defense. Senior midfielder Tim Hamm is the Bearcats leading returning scorer. He scored six goals and added five assists last season, while finishing second on the team with 31 shots. A pair of sophomores, Ben Czajka and Adam Dabroszi, will also be relied on for increased goal production. UC has a young defense with only one senior and four freshmen and sophomores, but junior Mike Mobley is back in goal after posting a 110-save season last year. Six newcomers also highlight the Bearcats' list.

**DE PAUL** is hoping to regain its 1994 form, when the Blue Demons posted a school-record

12 wins. DePaul is striving to improve its defense, along with adding some offensive consistency. In the Blue Demons' seven wins last year, they scored 24 goals, compared to four in their other 11 matches. Head coach John Barrett is hoping that the return of back Kevin Bateman, a Conference USA All-Freshman choice, will help the defense. Offensively, Barrett would like to see junior forward Dan Stokes return to the production of his freshman season, when he compiled six goals and 18 points.

Chris Timlin and Ryan Rogers are expected to share time in net for DePaul.

Improving the offense is the key to victory for **LOUISVILLE**, where Tony Colavecchia takes over as head coach after a successful stint at Southern Indiana. Despite the presence of several talented scorers, the Cardinals were able to produce just 20 goals last season, and were shutout nine times. With the return of second team All-Conference performer Antonio Azcona and third team selection Michael Kim, improvement should be evident. Junior goalkeeper Bill Krahel logged all but 107 minutes of U of L's season in goal and led C-USA in saves with 125.

Despite a 9-8-4 finish last season, **MARQUETTE** was close to making a possible run at postseason play. The Golden Eagles had four ties, including one with eventual national champion Wisconsin, and lost six games by only one goal. Head coach Steve Adlard is expecting those close matches to turn into victories this time around, returning MU to its nationally-ranked 1994 form. Several key performers return to help MU's effort, including goalkeeper Jim Welch, who enjoyed a strong

freshman season in which he recorded a 1.20 GAA and six shutouts. Midfielder Billy Solberg (five goals and 13 points) and forward Brian Lehky (four goals and 11 points) lead the offensive attack,

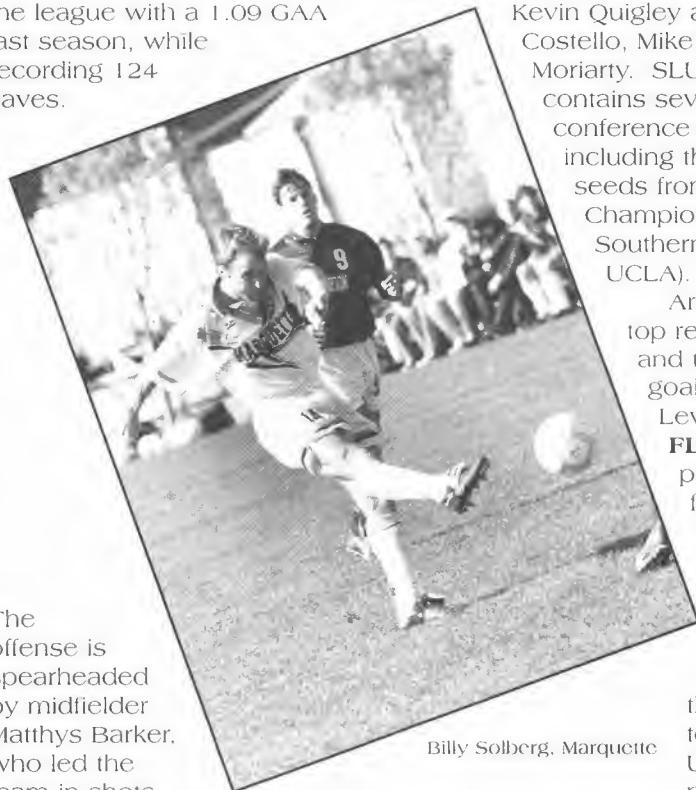

while Scott Ziemba, who earned *Soccer America* Team of the Week honors last season, anchors the defense.

Head coach Chris Bartels expects an improvement in defense as **MEMPHIS** looks to return to its winning ways of the previous four seasons. Leading scorer Fergal Forde is back at the midfield position after scoring nine goals last season. He is joined up front by brothers Ramon and Rolando Aguillon, who combined for 16 points in 1995. Three different players shared time in goal last season for the Tigers, but UM is anticipating the arrival of freshman Brian Covey, a member of the Western District Olympic Development team for the past six seasons.

**UNC CHARLOTTE** head coach John Tart is aiming to lead the 49ers to their fourth NCAA appearance in the last six years. Last season, UNCC was close to a repeat NCAA trip, as six of its eight losses came by just one goal, while five were at the hands of ranked teams. Leading this year's club is first team All-Conference USA performer Jon Busch, back in the net after leading the league with a 1.09 GAA last season, while recording 124 saves.

The offense is spearheaded by midfielder Matthys Barker, who led the team in shots (37), assists (8) and points (22)

last year. A talented sophomore class includes striker Christian Lund and midfielders David Hughes and Joe Sherwood.

Seeking its 11th consecutive NCAA appearance, **SAINT LOUIS** must replace first team All-American and Missouri Athletic Club National Player of the Year Matt McKeon. Several talented players are ready to step in for head coach Joe Clarke, including 1995 preseason Conference USA Freshman of the Year Mark Filla. The forward was off to a great start in 1995 (12 points in six games) before severe facial injuries cut his season short. Conference USA Freshman of the Year and first team All-C-USA selection Jacob Thomas joins four other returning All-Conference performers, including

midfielder Kevin Quigley and backs Ken Costello, Mike Moriarty and Pat Moriarty. SLU's schedule contains several non-conference challenges, including three of the top four seeds from last year's NCAA Championship (Virginia, Southern Methodist and UCLA).

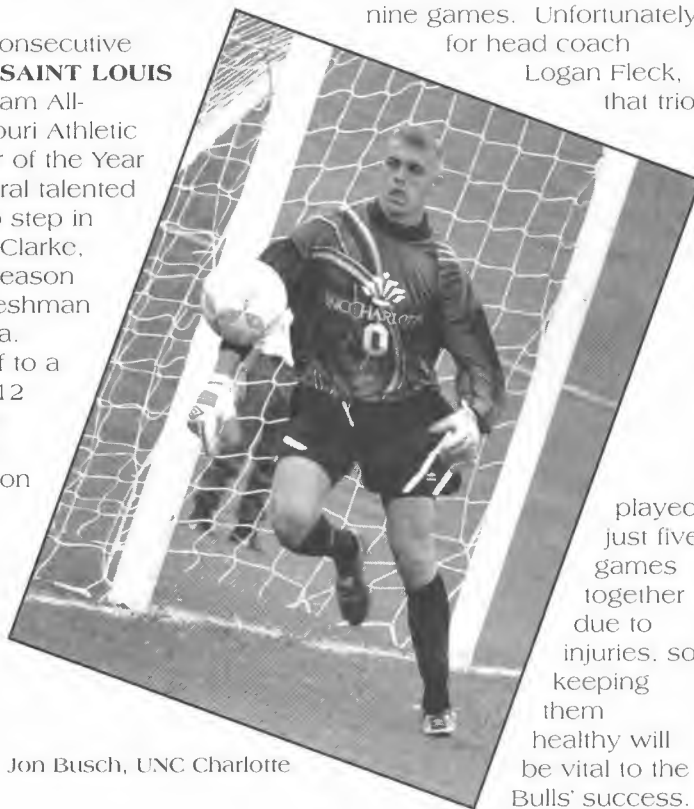
Armed with its six top returning scorers and two-year starting goalkeeper Chris

Lewis, **SOUTH FLORIDA** is prepared to be a factor in the 1996 conference race.

Thomas Holmen capped off a strong debut season by being named to the All-Freshman team after leading USF in scoring with nine goals and 20 points. Midfielder Mike Mekelburg

scored eight goals and finished with 19 points, while forward Jeff Cunningham added 12 points in nine games. Unfortunately for head coach

Logan Fleck, that trio

played just five games together due to injuries, so keeping them healthy will be vital to the Bulls' success. Lewis tended

goal for all but 34 minutes of the season, recording four shutouts and surrendering just 20 goals all season.

The Conference championship takes on a new look this year with the No. 8 and No. 9 seeds meeting for a play-in game at the higher seed on Tuesday, November 5. The first round of the championship will take place at campus sites on Tuesday, November 12, with the winner of the play-in game playing at the No. 1 seed, the No. 7 seed at the No. 2 seed, the No. 6 seed at the No. 3 seed and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed.

The four winners of the first round games will meet the following weekend at the site of the highest remaining seed. The semifinals will be played on Friday, November 15, with the championship game slated for Sunday, November 17. The championship matchup will be televised by Liberty/Fox Sports, with the winner receiving the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.



## UAB

- ★ UAB matched its school-record for victories last season with 15.
- ★ The Blazers finished last season ranked sixth in the South Region
- ★ UAB enters the 1996 season with a 14-game home winning streak and is unbeaten at home in its last 22 matches, dating back to 1993.
- ★ The Blazers are unbeaten in their last 13 regular season conference matches, dating back to a 4-0 loss to Marquette on September 16, 1994.
- ★ Senior goalkeeper Loukas Papaconstantinou is UAB's all-time leader in saves with 276. He posted a 0.38 GAA in conference matches and recorded 10 shutouts on the season.
- ★ UAB signed a pair of high school All-Americans in this year's recruiting class. Forward Owen Blake of Birmingham was named one of *Soccer America's* Super 11 recruits and is a member of the Olympic Development Program (ODP) South Region. Forward Erik Kuster was an All-State player at Christian Brothers High School in St. Louis, and is a member of the Midwest Region ODP team.

## CINCINNATI

- ★ Jeff Cook begins his first season at the helm of the Bearcats after serving as an assistant coach at Dartmouth the past two seasons. Prior to that, he served as the head coach of Wheaton College, a Division III school in Wheaton, Mass., where he directed the Lions to a 31-22-5 record and a pair of ECAC Tournament appearances in 1992 and 1993.
- ★ Junior goalkeeper Mike Mobley has recorded 200 saves in his first two seasons at UC. He recorded 110 last season, including a league-best 45 in conference matches.
- ★ Sophomore defender Brad Ruzzo is the only returning Bearcat that played all 21 matches last season.

## DE PAUL

- ★ DePaul had a pair of backs, Kevin Bateman and Bryan Pearce, named to Conference USA's All-Freshman team last season.
- ★ The Blue Demons scored 24 goals in their seven victories (3.43 avg.), compared to four in their other 11 matches (0.36).

- ★ DePaul posted six non-conference wins last year, the second-highest total in C-USA.
- ★ Six of the Blue Demons first eight games are at home, with the exception being a trip to Raleigh, N.C., for the North Carolina State adidas Tournament.

## LOUISVILLE

- ★ Tony Colavecchia begins his first season as head coach after a successful stint as the head coach at Southern Indiana, where he led the Eagles to a national ranking as a Division II team and a regional ranking as a Division I team. He posted a 68-25-9 record while USI was a Division II school and was 29-27-4 in three years at Division I. In 1995, USI achieved a No. 10 ranking in the Great Lakes Region.
- ★ Senior midfielder Antonio Azcona ranks fourth on the all-time U of L scoring list with 37 points and needs just five more goals to move into the top five on the goals scored list.
- ★ Junior goalkeeper Bill Krahel led C-USA in saves last season with 125. He started 19 of 20 games for the Cards and played all but 107 minutes of the season in net.
- ★ Senior forward Jason Richards scored his only two goals last season in Louisville's 3-0 win over DePaul in the Conference USA Championship.

## MARQUETTE

- ★ The Golden Eagles four ties last season matched the school record for ties in a season. Among the ties was a 1-1 finish with eventual national champion Wisconsin on October 22 in Madison.
- ★ Defender Scott Ziemba was a first team GTE Academic All-America in 1995. He also has started all 65 games in his Marquette career.
- ★ Sophomore goalkeeper Jim Welch was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team after registering a 1.14 GAA last season, the fourth-lowest GAA in school history.
- ★ Head coach Steve Adlard needs just two victories to reach 100 in his career.
- ★ Senior midfielder Billy Solberg has been a first team All-Conference selection the past two years.
- ★ Marquette has posted a 19-7-2 (.714) home record in the three-year history of Valley Fields.



## MEMPHIS

- ★ Senior forward Fergal Forde needs just five points to move into fifth place on the Tigers career scoring list. He has 21 career goals and 10 assists for 52 points.
- ★ The Tigers are 55-18-7 (.730) at home since Chris Bartels became head coach in 1988.
- ★ Memphis' 1996 roster features eight players from five other countries. This list includes three freshmen - John Hormazabal, Philip Thiele and Eric Munoz- from Edmonton, Alberta.
- ★ Freshman goalkeeper Brian Covey was a member of the Western District Olympic Development team from 1988-1994, the state ODP team from 1988-95 and the Under-17 National Poll in 1991 and 1992. He helped lead his Houston (Tenn.) High School team to state titles in 1993, 1994 and 1996.

## UNC CHARLOTTE

- ★ The 49ers have been ranked in the Top 25 at some point in each of the last five seasons, including a No. 4 finish in the final 1994 ISAA poll.
- ★ Junior goalkeeper Jon Busch allowed one goal or less in 16 of the 49ers 22 matches last season, finishing with a 1.09 GAA. He was also named Most Outstanding Goalkeeper of the Conference USA Championship.
- ★ Junior midfielder Matthys Barker led the 49ers in points (22) and assists (8) last season.
- ★ Despite finishing with a 5-3 conference record last season, UNCC outscored its C-USA opponents 23-11. Overall, UNCC outscored its opponents 39-24.
- ★ Six of the 49ers eight losses in 1995 came by just one goal, five were to teams that were ranked at some point and the eight teams that defeated UNCC had a winning percentage of more than .700.

## SAINT LOUIS

- ★ The 1995 season marked the Billikens 10th consecutive NCAA appearance and 35th overall. Saint Louis, ranked No. 11 at the time, lost at No. 4 SMU in overtime.
- ★ The Billikens finished 1995 ranked No. 3 in the Midwest Region, No. 11 in the nation by *Soccer News* and No. 16 by the ISAA and *Soccer America*.

- ★ Saint Louis finished second in the nation in average attendance last season, drawing 26,503 fans over 10 home dates for an average of 2,650.
- ★ Saint Louis reached the 500 victory total faster than any NCAA Division I soccer program in history when they defeated South Florida, 4-0, last September. The Billikens join San Francisco, Pennsylvania, Penn State and UCLA in accomplishing this feat.
- ★ The Billikens list just four seniors on their roster, compared to 16 freshmen and sophomores.
- ★ Five of Saint Louis' six losses last season came to ranked teams and five of the six were by one goal.
- ★ The Billikens schedule sees them facing three of the top four seeds from last season's NCAA Championship (Virginia, UCLA and Southern Methodist). Absent from SLU's schedule for the first time in 25 years is the annual Bronze Boot Match with SIU-Edwardsville.

## SOUTH FLORIDA

- ★ Senior back Todd Denault was a member of the USA National B team for the second straight season this past summer. The National B team played exhibition games against Olympic teams from other countries.
- ★ Senior midfielder Mike Mekelburg and senior back Carlton Williams were chosen as members of the South Team at the Olympic Sports Festival in August in San Antonio, Texas.
- ★ The Bulls return players that scored all but two of the team's goals last season, including their top three scorers - Thomas Holmen (nine goals), Mike Mekelburg (eight goals) and Jeff Cunningham (five goals in nine games). The Bulls were 4-1 in games the three started together last season, producing six goals in those matches.
- ★ Freshman forward/midfielder Brian Waltrip was considered the top prep player in Florida and was among the top 50 recruits nationally.
- ★ South Florida posted its 300th victory last season and now owns an all-time record of 302-143-36 (.665).
- ★ The Bulls outshot their opponents last season, 222-118.



# PRESEASON POLL

**S**aint Louis has been chosen as the favorite in the 1996 Conference USA preseason men's soccer poll in a vote taken by the league's nine head coaches. Sophomore forward Mark Filla, the 1995 preseason choice for conference Freshman of the Year before injuries cut his season short, has been selected as the 1996 preseason Player of the Year. UAB forward Erik Kuster has been named the preseason Freshman of the Year.

Saint Louis, the 1995 C-USA Tournament champion, is seeking its 11th consecutive NCAA appearance and record 36th overall. In addition to Filla, who scored 12 points in six games last season, SLU teammates Mike Moriarty and Kevin Quigley were named to the preseason All-Conference team.

Defending regular season champion UAB was slated to finish second. The Blazers placed three players on the preseason All-Conference team: junior midfielder Brian Corcoran, junior defender Joe Mattachione and senior goalkeeper Loukas Papaconstantinou.

South Florida and Marquette were picked third and fourth, respectively. Junior forward Jeff Cunningham and senior back Todd Denault are the Bulls selections on the All-Conference team, while the Golden Eagles are represented by senior midfielder Billy Solberg.

UNC Charlotte was chosen to finish fifth, followed by Memphis. The 49ers junior goalkeeper Jon Busch was named to the All-Conference team, along with Tiger senior midfielder Fergal Forde.

Rounding out the poll is Cincinnati seventh, and DePaul and Louisville tied for eighth. Cincinnati and Louisville feature the league's two new head coaches, Jeff Cook and Tony Colavecchia, while DePaul is poised to return to its 1994 form, when it won a school-record 12 games.

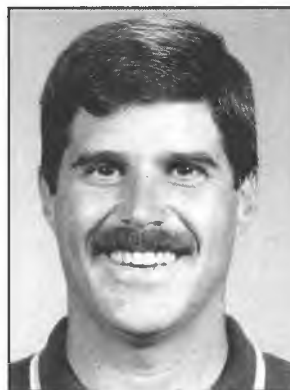

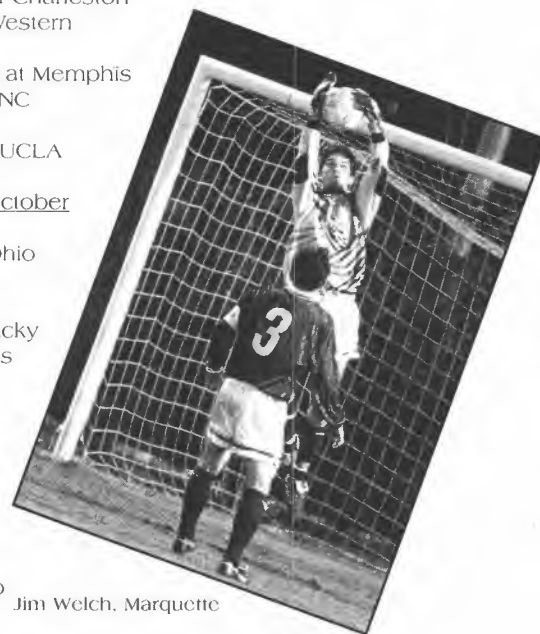

### 1996 C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Conference USA's Men's Soccer Championship will have a new format in 1996. The revised nine-team format will consist of a play-in game between the No. 9 and No. 8 seeds on Tuesday, November 5, at the site of the higher-seeded team. The first round of the championship will take place at campus sites on Tuesday, November 12, with the winner of the play-in game playing at the No. 1 seed, the No. 7 seed at the No. 2 seed, the No. 6 seed at the No. 3 seed and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed.

The four winners of the first round games will meet the following weekend at the site of the highest remaining seed. The semifinals will be played on Friday, November 15, with the championship game slated for Sunday, November 17. The championship match will be televised by Liberty/Fox Sports.

### 1996 NCAA MEN'S SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

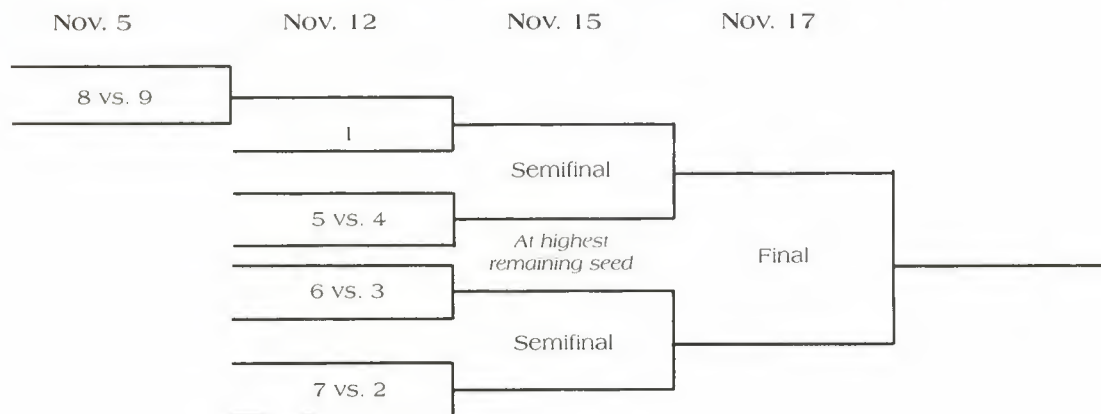
The winner of the 1996 C-USA Men's Soccer Championship will receive the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.

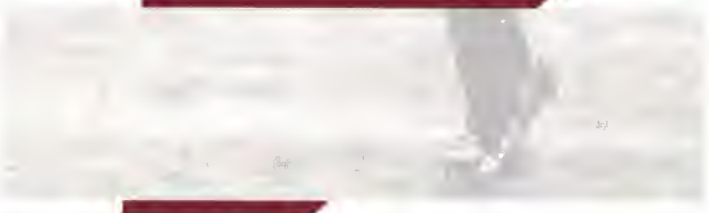
First, Second and Quarterfinal Round games will be held at campus sites, beginning November 22nd.
