UAB WINS THE 2020 RYAN C-USA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

UAB combined a strong defensive effort with a workhorse running back and big passing plays to create victory at Marshall, as the Blazers became Conference USA Champions for the second time in three seasons with a 22-13 win over the Thundering Herd in the 2020 Ryan C-USA Football Championship.

UAB senior RB Spencer Brown was named MVP after he carried 30 times for 149 vards. Six of his runs resulted in first downs. Brown becomes the first player in C-USA Championship history to be named MVP twice, as he also won the award after UAB won the 2018 Championship Game at Middle Tennessee.

The Blazers defense a Marshall that came in averaging 424.6 yards of total offense per game to just 268 total yards. UAB would allow just eight passes to be completed in 24 attempts, recording seven quarterback hurries, one interception and six pass breakups. The defensive effort was a true team effort, with six different players recording a defended pass and seven different players registering a QB hurry.

The big play passing came in the form of a tandem between junior QB Tyler Johnston III and junior WR Trae Shropshire. The duo connected five times, producing 180 yards and one TD. Shropshire established a new Championship record for yards per catch at 36.0, reeling in passes of 71, 39, 38, 17 and 15 yards.

Grant Wells threw a pair of TD passes for Marshall and junior RB Brenden Knox ran 17 times for 67 yards.

HUFF TAKES OVER AS HEAD COACH OF MARSHALL

Marshall has announced that University of Alabama associate head coach/running backs coach Charles **Huff** has been named the Thundering Herd's next head football coach.

Huff just finished his second year with the Alabama Crimson Tide and helped lead the team to a victory in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship vs. Ohio State.

Huff joined Alabama in 2019 after one season (2018) as the assistant head coach, run-game coordinator and running backs coach at Mississippi State University. He boasts 17 years of coaching experience on both the NFL and college levels, with stops at Penn State University (2014-17), Western Michigan University (2013), the NFL's Buffalo Bills (2012), Vanderbilt University (2011), Hampton University (2010). University of Maryland (2009) and Tennessee State University (2006-08).

Huff graduated in 2005 from Hampton University, where he served as a team captain, starting 12 games at center as a senior in 2005. He also played guard, fullback and tight end in his career.

SOUTHERN MISS NAMES WILL HALL HEAD COACH

Southern Miss has announced the hiring of Will Hall as the school's 22nd football coach.

Hall, a native of Amory, Miss., heads to Southern Miss after serving the last two years as offensive coordinator at Tulane.

His assistant coaching stops included Presbyterian (2004/quarterbacks), Henderson State (2005/ quarterbacks), Southwest Baptist (2006/offensive coordinator), Arkansas-Monticello (2007/offensive coordinator), West Alabama (2008-10/offensive coordinator), Louisiana-Lafayette (2017/offensive coordinator and quarterbacks) and Memphis (2018/ associate head coach and tight ends).

As a collegiate head coach that included Gulf South Conference schools West Alabama (2011-13) and West Georgia (2014-16), Hall produced a combined record of 56-21. He oversaw three GSC championship squads as well as earning two GSC coach of the year accolades. His teams played in four Division II playoffs and his UWG squads of 2014 and 2015 reached the semifinals

MARSHALL DEFENSE LOCKS DOWN

Marshall led the FBS in scoring defense this season at 13.0 points per game and allowed an average of 279.4 total yards per game, which ranked No. 2 in the nation behind Army. The Thundering Herd), placed fifth in rushing defense (95.5 yards per game), and 11th in passing defense (183.9 per game).

DEFENDING IN PARADISE

Florida Atlantic displayed a stingy defense this season, ranking ninth nationally in scoring defense, allowing 17.4 points per game. Senior LB Leighton McCarthy is tied for fifth in the FBS with 1.13 sacks per game (9.0 total) and had 12.5 tackles for loss in eight games. Redshirt freshman DE Jaylen Joyner had 6.0 sacks and the Owls had 25 as a team in nine games (2.78 per game).

A SINCERE PERFORMER

UTSA sophomore RB Sincere McCormick finished second in the FBS with a school-record 1,467 rushing yards on 249 attempts (5.9 avg) this season. In the 49-17 victory over North Texas on Nov. 28., he broke his own school record for rushing yards in a game with 251 and two touchdowns on 23 attempts. McCormick's 251-yard showing was the best by any C-USA player this season and he owns five of the league's top nine rushing performances in 2020. McCormick posted a league-high seven 100-yard games on the season and he has 10 in his career, both program records.

TOPS STOP THE PASS

WKU ranked second in C-USA and eighth nationally in passing defense this season, allowing 177.3 yards through the air per game. The Hilltoppers allowed only 16 passing touchdowns in 12 games. WKU's defense led the FBS in pass breakups with 62 and ranked third in passes defended with 68. Senior DB Dionte Ruffin tied for eighth individually with 12 passes defended on the season.

WHAT BROWN HAS DONE AT UAB

Senior RB Spencer Brown is one of two active players with 4,000 career rushing yards (4,011), joined by Clemson's Travis Etienne. He averaged 111.1 rushing yards per game this season with 889 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns in eight games. Brown was second in the league with six 100-vard rushing games this season, giving him 19 in his career (tied for 8th in C-USA history). UAB's record holder in total touchdowns with 42, he moved into a tie for 10th on C-USA's all-time rushing TD list with 41. Brown became the player in C-USA History to be named Championship Game MVP twice after he carried 30 times for 149 yards in the 22-13 win at Marshall on

DYNAMIC DARDEN

North Texas senior WR Jaelon Darden finished second in the FBS in receiving touchdowns (19) behind Heisman Trophy winner Devonta Smith of Alabama (20), despite not playing more than a month due to a bye and three game postponements. Against UTEP on Dec. 3, he hauled in eight passes for 173 yards and four touchdowns, marking his 10th straight game with at least one touchdown catch, dating back to the 2019 season finale. Darden posted his third game with three or more touchdowns game of the season - and his 19 TD catches on the season, which is a new single-season program record and two shy of the C-USA single-season record. He caught 74 passes for 1,190 yards and has five games this season with 100-plus yards receiving. Darden set a new program record for career receptions with 230 and receiving yards with 2,782 and is the program's new career touchdown leader with 38.

O'HARA'S OFFENSE

Middle Tennessee redshirt junior QB Asher O'Hara, who became the second QB in program history to rush for 1,000 yards last season, currently ranks fourth nationally in rushing yards among QBs with 601. He leads in C-USA in total offense, averaging 284.6 yards per game, with 12 passing touchdowns and seven rushing scores. in nine games, O'Hara accounted for 77.8% (2,561) of the team's total yards (3,293) with 1,960 yards passing and 601 yards on the ground. In 2019, O'Hara accounted for 75% of the Blue Raiders total yards.

RICE RECORDS GET UPDATED

With its 20-0 win at No. 15 Marshall on Dec. 5, Rice ended a number of lengthy streaks:

- Defeated a ranked opponent for the first time since
- a 27-14 win vs No. 21 BYU on Nov. 11, 1997 (30 games).
- Defeated a ranked opponent on the road for the first time since a 20-7 win at No. 8 Baylor on Oct. 12, 1991 (32 games).
- Shut out a ranked opponent for the first time since a 7-0 victory over No. 16 Texas on Oct. 22, 1960.

The Owls have not been scored upon in the first guarter in their four games this season. Senior LB Blaze Alldredge (10 tackles, one interception, one PBU) was named C-USA Defensive Player of the week for his efforts.

C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has announced the league's bowl lineup that will span the six-year cycle from 2020-25.

The conference is guaranteed seven bowl appearances in each year of the new cycle and will have associations with up to 16 different

As part of the new bowl cycle, C-USA will annually send teams to the Bahamas Bowl against a Mid-American Conference opponent, and to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, against a Sun Belt Conference school. The league has participated in all six Bahamas Bowls and has placed a team in the New Orleans Bowl 14 times in its first 18 years.

As previously announced, the league will continue its relationship with the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl. C-USA is guaranteed to send a team to the Shreveport, Louisiana-based bowl in 2021 and 2025, while holding a secondary agreement with the bowl in the other years of the cycle.

C-USA will also continue its long-standing relationship with the SoFi Hawai'i Bowl. The league is set to participate in the Honolulubased game in 2020, 2022 and 2024.

The conference's remaining guaranteed selections in the cycle (either four or five per season) will include the LendingTree Bowl (Mobile, Alabama) or from among 11 games which are owned and operated by ESPN Events.

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the CFP bowls if it produces the highest rated champion from among the American Athletic, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2020-21 season, the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 30), Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Jan. 1), PlayStation Fiesta Bowl (Jan. 2) and Capital One Orange Bowl (Jan. 2), will host its regular bowl games, while the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1) and Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1) will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 11 in Miami, Florida.
