PLAYERS OF THE WEEK (WEEK 10)
OFFENSE
RB DEWAYNE MCBRIDE

Sophomore, Starke, Florida

McBride rushed into the UAB record book on Saturday with 14 carries for a career-high 210 yards and four touchdowns to lead UAB to a 52-38 victory over Louisiana Tech. His 210 rushing yards were the seventh-most in school history, while his four touchdowns were the second-most rushing touchdowns in a single game. He averaged 15 yards per carry in the process. McBride now has 837 rushing yards and eight touchdowns this season, while averaging 7.0 yards per carry.

DEFENSE
DB BEANIE BISHOP, WKU

Sophomore, Louisville, Kentucky

Bishop had a career performance with two interceptions - including a 43-yard pick-six - in WKU's 48-21 victory over Middle Tennessee. The two interceptions were the first two in the Louisville native's career. Bishop became only the third Conference USA defender this season with two interceptions in a game, and the first since September 18. Bishop had two of the Hilltoppers' six interceptions on the day, which set the team's FBS Era (since 2009) program record and ranks second for a single game in C-USA history. Bishop returned his second interception 29 yards (to go along with the 43-yard touchdown made for a total of 72 return yards) to set up another WKU touchdown. For the game, the Hilltoppers forced the Blue Raiders into seven turnovers, while scoring 31 points off those turnovers. Bishop also added two tackles on defense and two kickoff returns for 48 yards on special teams.

SPECIAL TEAMS
KR JAYDEN HARRISON, MARSHALL

Redshirt Sophomore, Antioch, Tennessee

Harrison set the tone for Marshall when he took the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown in the Thundering Herd's 28-13 win at Florida Atlantic on Saturday. The play was the third time Marshall returned the opening kick for a touchdown, following Keith Baxter at Chattanooga in 1987 (89 yards) and Keion Davis at Miami (Ohio) in 2017 (99 yards). It was also tied for the third-longest kick return in program history.



QUICK HITTERS

A LOOK AT WEEK 11

As the regular season winds down, all 14 Conference USA teams are in action again in Week 11, all of which are conference matchups, and all of which are on Saturday. WKU and Rice open Saturday's C-USA action at 1 p.m. CT in Houston on **ESPN+**. There are then five C-USA games kicking off in the 2:30 p.m. CT window, highlighted by UAB traveling to Huntington, West Virginia, to battle Marshall in a matchup of two 4-1 teams in conference play on **CBS Sports Network**. AP No. 15 UTSA returns home to host Southern Miss from the Alamodome on **ESPN+**, also at 2:30 p.m. CT in their quest to reach the 10-0 plateau and continue taking steps towards a potential West Division title. The final game of the day for Conference USA teams kicks off at 3 p.m. CT, as North Texas hosts UTEP in Denton, also on **ESPN+**.

WKU (5-4, 4-1 C-USA) has won four straight since opening the season at 1-4, and the Hilltoppers are in a tie atop the East Division with Marshall. They travel to Houston at 1 p.m. CT to take on Rice (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) live on **ESPN+**. WKU won comfortably last week at home against rival Middle Tennessee, 48-21, on the strength of seven forced turnovers (six of which were interceptions). The nation's leading passer, **QB Bailey Zappe**, totaled five touchdowns (four through the air) in the win, while the nation's leading **WR Jerreth Sterns**, hauled in 11 more catches for 110 yards, surpassing the 100-catch mark for the season (104), a new program record. Rice, has dropped two straight, both in overtime, since the big road win at UAB on Oct. 23, and fell 31-24 in overtime last week on the road at Charlotte despite RB Ari Broussard's best efforts. The Rice running back carried 20 times for 186 yards and two scores.

UAB (6-3, 4-1 C-USA), hits the road with a trip to Huntington, West Virginia, to battle one of the two East Division leaders, Marshall (6-3, 4-1 C-USA), at 2:30 p.m. CT on **CBS Sports Network**. UAB stormed back from an early 21-7 deficit at home against Louisiana Tech to pick up a 52-38 win over the Bulldogs. Blazers **RB DeWayne McBride** had a career-high 210 yards and four touchdowns on just 14 carries (15.0 yards per carry) in the win. Marshall picked up an impressive 28-13 win on the road down in Boca Raton over Florida Atlantic, ending the Owls' 12-game home winning streak. Thundering Herd **RB Rasheen Ali** was the story again for Marshall on the offensive side of the ball, as he carried 18 times for 90 yards and two more scores. Ali is tied for the national lead in rushing touchdowns with 17 in nine appearances.

Middle Tennessee (4-5, 2-3 C-USA) returns home to Murfreesboro to host FIU (1-8, 0-5 C-USA) with a 2:30 p.m. CT kickoff on **ESPN3**. The Blue Raiders fell in their rivalry clash at WKU last week, 48-21, and struggled offensively without **QB Chase Cunningham**, who missed the game due to injury. Middle Tennessee quarterbacks threw six interceptions and the Blue Raiders turned it over seven times in the loss. They are, however, two wins shy of a sixth win and bowl eligibility as they welcome the Panthers, who have dropped eight straight. FIU fell at home to Old Dominion last week, 47-24.

Florida Atlantic (5-4, 3-2 C-USA) travels north to Norfolk, Virginia, to take on Old Dominion (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) at 2:30 p.m. CT on **ESPN+**. The Monarchs are

fresh off a comfortable 47-24 win at FIU last week, ODU's second straight victory. **RB Blake Watson** had a big day for the Monarchs, carrying 28 times for 158 yards and two scores. FAU fell 28-13 at home, head coach Willie Taggart's first loss at home as the Owls' head man. **RB Johnny Ford** was the only component of the FAU offense that really got going against the Herd, as Ford carried 13 times for 138 yards in a losing effort.

AP No. 15 UTSA (9-0, 5-0 C-USA) returns home to host Southern Miss (1-8, 0-5 C-USA) at 2:30 p.m. CT on **ESPN+** in a battle of teams on the opposite ends of the spectrum. The Roadrunners put in a strong performance last week in front of a national audience in the late game on ESPN2, comfortably defeating UTEP 44-23 in El Paso in front of a crowd of 31,000+ behind another big performance by UTSA's big three offensively - **QB Frank Harris**, **RB Sincere McCormick** and **WR Zakhari Franklin**. The Golden Eagles dropped their eighth consecutive game, falling 38-14 at home to North Texas last week.

Charlotte (5-4, 3-2 C-USA) enters the week in search of win No. 6 on the season, and the 49ers travel to Ruston, Louisiana, to take on Louisiana Tech (2-7, 1-4 C-USA) at 2:30 p.m. CT on **Stadium**. Charlotte had an exciting overtime win on homecoming against the visiting Rice Owls, 31-24. **QB Chris Reynolds** returned to action after missing the previous week due to injury, and the program's all-time leading passer completed 20-29 passes for 292 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions, including the game-winner in overtime to freshman **WR Elijah Spencer**, from 25 yards out, his second touchdown grab on the day. The pair had hooked up in the final 1:14 to send the game to overtime as well, knotting things at 24-24. Louisiana Tech started fast in Birmingham, but ultimately ran out of gas in their upset bid over UAB, falling 52-38. Freshman **QB J.D. Head** earned his first collegiate start, filling in for the injured **Austin Kendall**.

North Texas (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) returns home to host UTEP (6-3, 3-2 C-USA) at 3 p.m. CT on **ESPN+**. The Mean Green picked up their second win in as many weeks, keeping their bowl eligibility hopes alive, beating Southern Miss 38-14 in Hattiesburg on the strength of a pair of defensive touchdowns. UTEP has dropped two straight, and fell 44-23 at home last week to UTSA.

UTSA CLIMBS IN POLLS

UTSA moved up in both of the major polls following their win at UTEP last week. The Roadrunners come in at No. 15 in the Associated Press Top 25 (up one spot) and No. 16 in the USA Today AFCA Coaches Poll (up two spots). UTSA is one of just four undefeated teams remaining in the FBS, and returns home to the Alamodome for a West Division showdown against Southern Miss on Saturday on ESPN+ at 2:30 p.m. CT. UTSA was the lone undefeated team absent from the first edition of the College Football Playoff rankings last week and will find out if they enter the committee's top 25 when the new rankings are released Tuesday night.

ROADRUNNERS STAY PERFECT

UTSA showcased its program on the national stage on ESPN2 late Saturday night, taking down UTEP 44-23 at the Sun Bowl in El Paso. **QB Frank Harris**

totaled four touchdowns (two passing and two rushing), while **RB Sincere McCormick** carried 21 times for 169 yards and a touchdown and **WR Zakhari Franklin** hauled in 10 catches for 114 yards and two scores in the win. The Roadrunners are now 9-0, and one of just four unbeaten teams at the FBS level.

MCBRIDE'S BIG DAY CARRIES UAB

UAB **RB DeWayne McBride** had a monster day for the Blazers, as they knocked off Louisiana Tech 52-31 on Saturday. McBride had 14 carries for 210 yards (15.0 yards per carry) and a career-high four touchdowns. It marked the third time this season a C-USA player has had four rushing scores in a game (Rice's **Jordan Myers** vs. Texas Southern on 9/25 and Marshall's **Rasheen Ali** at Navy on 9/4). UAB is now 4-1 in league play and still controls its own destiny in the West Division.

TWO DEFENSIVE TDs LEAD UNT

North Texas scored 38 unanswered points after falling behind 14-0 early, to knock off Southern Miss, 38-14 in Hattiesburg Saturday afternoon. It marked UNT's second consecutive win, and helped keep the Mean Green's bowl eligibility hopes alive, as they improved to 3-6. The defense scored a pair of touchdowns in the win, a **Grayson Murphy** 37-yard fumble return for a score and a 43-yard scoop and score by **LB KD Davis**.

WKU'S 6 INTs CARRY HILLTOPPERS TO RIVALRY WIN

WKU intercepted six passes in a rivalry win at home over Middle Tennessee, 48-21 on Saturday. The six picks tied for the second-most in a single game in Conference USA history, and were the most by WKU since they rose to the FBS level in 2009.

WATSON LIFTS ODU TO WIN IN MIAMI

ODU **RB Blake Watson** had a big day for the Monarchs, who picked up their second straight win, knocking off FIU 47-14 in Miami. Watson carried 28 times for 158 yards and two scores in the win.

ZAPPE CONTINUES TO CHUCK IT

WKU **QB Bailey Zappe**, who leads the nation in passing yards per game (409.8), was fantastic again last week for the Hilltoppers as they picked up their fourth straight win, knocking off rival Middle Tennessee 48-21 at home. Zappe completed 29-50 passes for 281 yards and five total touchdowns (one rushing) with no interceptions. Zappe has completed 69.8% of his passes (308-441), which is 13th nationally, for 3,688 yards with 37 touchdowns (leads the FBS) and just six interceptions. He also has two rushing touchdowns on the season. Zappe has surpassed the 365-yard passing mark in eight of nine games this year for WKU.

QUICK HITTERS

JERRETH STERNS STAYS HOT

WKU **WR Jerreth Sterns** is the FBS leader in several categories entering Week 11. The former Houston Baptist wideout is the national leader in receiving yards per game (141.8) and in receptions per game (11.6). Sterns has caught a program-record 104 passes (leads the FBS) for 1,276 yards (leads the FBS) and 11 touchdowns (tied for the most in the FBS) in nine games in 2021.

He hauled in 11 passes for 110 yards last week in a win over Middle Tennessee. Sterns has caught 81 passes for 916 yards and seven scores in his past **SIX** games.

Sterns is now tied for eighth in C-USA history for most receptions in a single season, through just nine appearances.

AERIAL ASSAULT IN C-USA

Conference USA has been the home of some of the most prolific passing attacks in the FBS through the first 10 weeks of the 2021 season. Four C-USA quarterbacks rank in the top-20 nationally in passing yardage per game - WKU's **Bailey Zappe** leads the FBS (409.8), Marshall's **Grant Wells** is 10th (317.6), FIU's **Max Bortenschlager** is 18th (274.3) and Louisiana Tech's **Austin Kendall** is 20th (267.7).

Additionally, four C-USA signal-callers rank inside the top-25 nationally in passing touchdowns - Zappe leads the FBS (37), Charlotte's **Chris Reynolds** 18th (19), UTSA's **Frank Harris** is 20th (18) and Bortenschlager is 23rd (17).

Zappe (69.8%), Harris (67.8%) and Wells (67.2%) rank 13th, 22nd and 24th, respectively in completion percentage among FBS quarterbacks as well.

C-USA quarterbacks also rank 3-4-5 nationally in yards per completion - Bortenschlager (17.51), UTEP's **Gavin Hardison** (16.71) and UAB's **Dylan Hopkins** (15.84).

C-USA RECEIVERS LIGHTING IT UP

With all the success of the quarterbacks in C-USA, someone has to catch those passes, and in turn, C-USA receivers are all over the national leaderboards. In terms of receiving yards per game, three of the top-25 spots belong to receivers who hail from C-USA programs - WKU's **Jerreth Sterns** leads the way (141.8), followed by UTEP's **Jacob Cowing**, who is 13th (102.6) and FIU's **Tyrese Chambers** (92.9) is 22nd.

Sterns (11), UTSA **WR Zakhari Franklin** (eight), UAB **TE Gerrit Prince** and Chambers (seven) are also inside the top-25 in receiving touchdowns, ranking first, 11th and 23rd respectively.

Big plays are seen all over the field across C-USA, as five pass-catchers rank inside the national top-10 in terms of yards per reception, while a total of eight are inside the top-20 - Chambers leads the nation (23.89), while UAB **WR Trea Shropshire** is third (23.16), UTEP **WR Tyrin Smith** is fifth (22.44), Prince is sixth (22.43), FIU **WR Bryce Singleton** is 9th (20.62), Cowing is 12th (20.07), Louisiana Tech **WR Bub Means** is 17th (19.60) and Marshall **WR Willie Johnson** is 18th (19.41).

If a team is unable to compete in a regular season conference game due to COVID-19, that team will forfeit the contest, which will count as a loss in the conference standings. In this instance, the team that is available to play will be awarded a win in the conference standings.

In the event that both teams are unable to participate due to COVID-19, a no-contest will be declared. Should circumstances within the current scheduling framework allow (e.g. teams sharing an open date later in the schedule), rescheduling may be possible.

Existing tie-breaker procedures for each of the conference's sports will apply to determining champions, division champions and/or seeding within conference championship tournaments, when applicable.

These policies are effective as of Sept. 8, 2021 and will be active until they are rescinded or adjusted by the C-USA Board of Directors.

CONFERENCE USA BOWL PARTNERS**C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS**

Conference USA has announced the league's bowl lineup that will span the six-year cycle from 2020-25.

The conference is guaranteed seven bowl appearances in each year of the new cycle and will have associations with up to 16 different bowls.

As part of the new bowl cycle, C-USA will annually send teams to the Bahamas Bowl against a Mid-American Conference opponent, and to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, against a Sun Belt Conference school. The league has participated in all six Bahamas Bowls and has placed a team in the New Orleans Bowl 15 times in its first 19 years.

As previously announced, the league will continue its relationship with the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl. C-USA is guaranteed to send a team to the Shreveport, Louisiana-based bowl in 2021 and 2025, while holding a secondary agreement with the bowl in the other years of the cycle.

C-USA will also continue its long-standing relationship with the EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl. The league is set to participate in the Honolulu-based game in 2022 and 2024.

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the CFP bowls if it produces the highest rated champion from among the American Athletic, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
