Cortland Wins ECAC Southeast Bowl, Retains Cortaca Jug in 2011

Two close losses kept the SUNY Cortland football team from making its third NCAA tournament appearance in four years, but the Red Dragons still enjoyed a 9-2 season that included a second straight Cortaca Jug rivalry game win over Ithaca College.

Cortland tied for second place in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) with a 7-2 record after a five-point loss to league champion Kean and a one-point setback at Montclair State. The Red Dragons finished the regular season on a high note with a 27-3 win at Ithaca, its largest margin of victory on the Bombers' soil since 1955, and wrapped the year with a 14-0 home win versus Albright College in the ECAC Division III Southeast Bowl.

Graduate student quarterback **Dan Pitcher** was a finalist for the Gagliardi Trophy, the Division III national Player of the Year award, after enjoying a record-setting season. Pitcher established school single-season records with 31 touchdown passes and 2,951 total offensive yards and career records with 54 scoring passes and 13 straight games with a touchdown toss.

Pitcher, senior offensive tackle **Bill Castro** and sophomore wide receiver **John Babin** each earned D3Football.com All-America honors. Castro garnered All-America status for the second straight season and played in the annual D3 Football Senior Classic as well as the FCS Senior Scout Bowl. Babin broke school single-season records with 72 receptions for 1,183 yards and 16 touchdowns.

Pitcher, Castro and Babin were All-East region first-team selections, while senior center **Corey Hymes** was chosen to the All-East third team.

In addition, Castro, Babin and senior cornerback **D.J. Romano** were All-ECAC South Region honorees. Romano led the Red Dragons with four interceptions and nine pass breakups and finished tied as Cortland's career leader with 15 interceptions.



John Babin set school single-season receiving records with 72 catches for 1,183 yards and 16 touchdowns. The All-America wide receiver tied a school single-game record with three touchdown receptions on two occasions.



Dan Pitcher earned All-America and Academic All-America honors and was a Gagliardi Trophy finalist after passing for 2,712 yards and a school-record 31 touchdowns. He also holds the school record with 54 career TD throws.

**Dan MacNeill,
Head Coach**

Dan MacNeill begins his 16th season as SUNY Cortland's head football coach in 2012. His teams are a combined 99-54 and have made nine postseason appearances, including four NCAA tournament showings. He ranks first at Cortland with a .647 winning percentage and second in career victories.

In 2011, his Red Dragon squad finished 9-2 overall, tied for second in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) with an 7-2 mark and won the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Div. III Southeast Bowl. In 2010, he led Cortland to a 10-2 record and the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. His squad earned an NCAA automatic berth after tying for the NJAC title with an 8-1 mark — the fifth time in six years from 2005-10 that the Red Dragons finished at least tied for first in the conference standings.

In 2008, MacNeill guided the Red Dragons to one of the best seasons in school history. Cortland finished 11-2, including two victories in the NCAA Division III playoffs before falling at eventual national champion Mount Union in the quarterfinals. Both the 11 wins and the quarterfinal appearance matched school records. Cortland was recognized as the top Division III team in the East by winning both the Lambert Trophy and the ECAC Team of the Year awards.

Cortland won the 2008 NJAC title with a 9-0 record. MacNeill was chosen as the NJAC Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for Liberty Mutual Division III National Coach of the Year honors.

In 2007, MacNeill's squad finished 8-3 and won the ECAC Division III Northeast Bowl. The previous fall, he guided the Red Dragons to a 9-2 record and an ECAC Division III Northeast Bowl bid. Cortland failed to receive an NCAA berth despite a 9-1 regular-season mark.

In 2005, MacNeill led the Red Dragons to a 7-2 regular-season record. Cortland earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Division III playoffs and finished the season 7-3. Cortland's other NCAA appearance under MacNeill came during an 8-3 campaign in his first season in 1997.

In 2002, MacNeill led the Red Dragons to a 9-2 mark and the ECAC Division III Northwest title. The team also placed second in the NJAC with a 4-2 record. In 2003, Cortland finished the regular season with a 5-4 mark before losing in the ECAC Northwest championship game.

Among MacNeill's other highlights at Cortland are a 32-31 win over nationally second-ranked and eventual national semifinalist Rowan University in the 2001 season and eight victories against rival Ithaca College in the annual "Cortaca Jug" game.

MacNeill has coached 23 All-Americans, 70 All-East and 60 All-ECAC players at Cortland. Those players included two Gagliardi Trophy national Player of the Year finalists – defensive tackle Adam Haas in 2006 and quarterback Dan Pitcher in 2011 – along with 1997 ECAC Upstate New York Player of the Year Omar Darling and 2007 ECAC Southeast Rookie of the Year Brian Haas.

In addition, MacNeill's players have earned 164 All-NJAC honors since the program joined the league in 2000, highlighted by the selection of Adam Haas as the 2005 NJAC Defensive Player of the Year, Bryan Wiley as the 2009 NJAC Defensive Player of the Year, Justin Autera as the 2010 NJAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year and Dan Pitcher as the 2011 NJAC Offensive Player of the Year.

An assistant coach at Division I-AA Villanova University from 1984-96, MacNeill is Cortland's 11th head coach since the school's modern era of football began in 1924. MacNeill served as linebackers coach at Villanova and was the team's defensive coordinator from 1988-96.

One of the nation's top defensive coaches, MacNeill's charges consistently ranked among the best defensive teams in the Yankee Conference. His 1991 squad finished the year first nationally in scoring defense, second in total defense and fifth in rushing defense while leading the Yankee Conference in every defensive category. The Wildcats placed first nationally in rushing defense in 1992. In 1996, Villanova finished 8-4 and earned a berth in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

While at Villanova, MacNeill coached three AFCA/Kodak First Team All-Americans, one Associated Press All-American, six first team All-Yankee Conference performers, six first team All-ECAC selections and one player who went on to the NFL. He received a master's degree in educational administration from Villanova in 1994.

A 1979 Cortland graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, MacNeill was a four-year Red Dragon letterwinner and three-year starter at linebacker and defensive tackle. He served as a team tri-captain during his senior campaign in 1978. In his last varsity game against Southern Connecticut State, he was credited with 11 unassisted tackles and three quarterback sacks.

MacNeill began his football coaching career as an assistant at Port Byron (N.Y.) Central High School from 1980 to 1982, prior to being named as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College. He coached Ithaca's junior varsity team in 1982 and was in charge of the Bombers' receivers in 1983.

A native of Walton, N.Y., MacNeill was an all-league defensive end at Walton Central High School as a senior in 1974. MacNeill and his wife, Sherrie, have two daughters — Mikayla and Maura.

2012 Assistant Football Coaches



Ola Adams – Defensive Coordinator/Def. Backs

Ola Adams returns as Cortland's defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach in 2012. He held the same position in 2011 and was an assistant coach on the Red Dragon staff in the 2009 season. In addition, he coached defensive backs at Division II Glenville State (W.V.) in 2010.

Adams graduated from Concord University (W.V.) in 2008 and served as a student coach at the school in the fall of 2008. Adams was a four-year starting free safety for the Division II Mountain Lions from 2004-07. He earned All-West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) honors three times and was named All-Northeast Region twice. During his career, he registered 283 tackles, including two sacks and 14 total for lost yardage, along with seven interceptions, 29 pass breakups, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries.

A native of Reston, Virginia, Adams lettered in football, basketball and track at South Lakes High School.



Bill Castro, Assistant Offensive Line

Two-time All-American Bill Castro joins the Cortland coaching staff in 2012 and will assist with the coaching of the team's offensive linemen.

The Washingtonville, N.Y., native was a four-year offensive lineman for the Red Dragons from 2008-11. As a senior, he earned second-team All-America and honors and was a first-team All-East, All-ECAC and All-NJAC selection. He competed in the D3 Football Senior Classic in Salem, Va., and anchored an offensive line that allowed only nine sacks in 11 games.

In 2010, Castro was an honorable mention All-America and first-team All-East and All-NJAC honoree. He helped the Red Dragons finish 10-2 and advance to the NCAA second round. Castro also started all 11 games for Cortland as a sophomore in 2009.



Colin Clancy, Wide Receivers

Colin Clancy joins the Cortland football coaching staff in 2012 and will work with the team's wide receivers. He also will coach the Red Dragons' kickoff and punt returners.

Clancy graduated from Temple University in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in business and a concentration in entrepreneurship. He played quarterback for the Owls from 2005-09 and was a two-year letterwinner. As a senior, Clancy earned the team's Academic Achievement Award. During the 2011-12 school year, Clancy served as a tight ends coach and video assistant at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. He also has worked on Wall Street as an associate for Alliance Bernstein, a research-driven asset management firm.

Clancy is a native of Stonington, Conn., and graduated from Stonington High School in 2004. He was an all-state selection and established school career records with 39 touchdown passes and 3,700 passing yards. Clancy also played one season at St. Thomas More Prep in Oakdale, Conn., where he set a school record with 19 touchdown throws.



Larry Czarnecki – Tight Ends

Larry Czarnecki works with Cortland's tight ends in 2012 as he continues a long-standing coaching career with the Red Dragons.

Czarnecki served as Cortland's offensive coordinator from 2001-04 and was the team's defensive coordinator and interior defensive line coach from 1999-2000. He was Cortland's head football coach from 1983-85 after working as the team's defensive line coach in 1978 and defensive coordinator from 1979-82.

A former Cortland track and field head coach, Czarnecki was named the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) Men's Track and Field Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002 after guiding the Red Dragons to two outdoor league titles. In 1999, Czarnecki earned SUNYAC Women's Track and Field "Coach of the Year" honors after leading the Red Dragons to indoor and outdoor league titles and a 12th-place outdoor national finish. Czarnecki served as Cortland's assistant track and field coach from 1978-85, working with the Red Dragons' field event athletes. He was the program's interim head coach in 1981.

Czarnecki received a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education from Ithaca College in 1976 and his master's degree in the same field the following year. He returned to his alma mater in 1986 as an assistant football and track and field coach. He worked with the Bombers' football squad until 1996, coaching the offensive line on squads that won NCAA Division III titles in 1988 and 1991.

Czarnecki was a standout defensive tackle at Ithaca, earning Kodak and Associated Press First Team All-America honors. He was named the ECAC Division III Football "Player of the Year" as a senior captain in 1975. He led the Bombers to Lambert Trophies and appearances in the NCAA Division III championship games in his junior and senior seasons. Czarnecki also competed on Ithaca's Track and Field club team and played semi-pro football with the Scranton Stars (1976-78) and Binghamton Jets (1979-80).



Shawn Henry – Assistant Linebackers

Shawn Henry begins his fourth season as a Red Dragon assistant coach in 2012. Henry played two years at Alfred State College and one year at Alfred University. He graduated from Alfred in December 2007 with a bachelor's degree in computer science.

Henry has worked as an assistant coach with Southern Tier Youth Football and has served many years as a coach in the Dansville youth system. He competed in football and track and field at Dansville High School, graduating in 1998.



Tom Murphy – Running Backs/Punters and Kickers

Tom Murphy returns for a third season on the Cortland staff in 2012. He will coach the team's running backs as well as the punters and kickers after coaching outside linebackers in 2010 and 2011. The Cortland native coached the varsity football and modified boys' lacrosse teams at Cortland High

School from 2006-09 and also coached junior varsity football and lacrosse and modified boys' basketball from 2000-01.

Murphy graduated from Mansfield University in 1996 with a degree in criminal justice administration. He played four seasons on the offensive

line for the Division II Mountaineers from 1990-93 and was a forward on the basketball team during the 1994-95 season. Murphy also spent time as an assistant on the Mansfield basketball staff from 1995-96. A 1990 Cortland High alumnus, Murphy earned all-league honors in football, basketball and lacrosse on the scholastic level. Murphy and his wife, Judie, have three children – Adrianna (9), Kaedyn (7) and Thomas (4).



Ben Nagle – Assistant Defensive Line

Former Red Dragon standout Ben Nagle will work with the Cortland football staff in 2012. He will assist with the team's defensive line coaching while completing an internship to earn his bachelor's degree in sport management.

Nagle played at Cortland from 2005-08. As a junior defensive end in 2007, he recorded 73 tackles and team highs of nine sacks and 16.5 total tackles for losses in 11 starts. He earned first-team All-East honors and was the MVP of the ECAC Northeast Bowl after recording four sacks and three forced fumbles in a win over Union. During his senior campaign in 2008, Nagle started all 13 games for the Red Dragon squad that advanced to the NCAA Div. III quarterfinals. He was a third-team All-American and first-team All-East and All-ECAC selection and finished with 72 tackles, 4.5 sacks and 13.5 total tackles for losses.

Following his football career, Nagle played one season for Cortland's men's basketball team during the 2009-10 school year. He started all 27 games and averaged 6.4 points and a team-high 7.6 rebounds per game. Nagle is a Rochester, N.Y., native and a 2005 graduate of Aquinas Institute.



Steve Potter – Offensive Line/ Run Game Coordinator

Steve Potter enters his third season as Cortland's offensive line coach in 2012. Prior to Cortland, the Charleston, W.V., native coached for three years at Bethany College. He coached the offensive line in 2009, the defensive line in 2008 and the running backs in 2007.

Previously, Potter was the varsity offensive and defensive line coach at George Washington High School in Charleston.

Potter played four years and was a three-year letterman along the offensive and defensive lines at Division II institutions West Virginia Tech (2002, 2003) and West Virginia State (2004, 2005). He earned a Bachelor of Arts in political science from West Virginia State in 2007. Potter was also an all-conference player at George Washington High, graduating in 2002.



Greg Roskos – Offensive Coordinator/ Quarterbacks

Greg Roskos begins his fourth year as Cortland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2012. He came to the Red Dragons from the University of Minnesota, where he was an assistant quarterbacks and quality control coach. The Golden Gophers were selected for the Insight Bowl in 2008, the second of his two seasons with the program.

Roskos served as a graduate assistant offensive coach at the University of Toledo in 2005 and 2006. The Rockets finished 9-3 and won the GMAC Bowl in 2005. Roskos also was an assistant secondary coach at Patriot League champion and NCAA Division I-AA qualifier Lafayette College in 2004 and was linebackers coach in 2003 for a Muhlenberg College squad that won the Centennial Conference and played in the NCAA Division III tournament.

Roskos graduated from Bloomsburg University with a bachelor's degree in marketing in 2002. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference selection for the Huskies and was the team's Defensive MVP when they advanced to the 2000 NCAA Division II championship game.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Roskos graduated from West Scranton High School. He currently resides in Cortland with his wife, Rebecca, and their daughters, Gwyneth and Elle.



Bryan Wiley – Defensive Line

Bryan Wiley begins his second season as Cortland's defensive line coach in 2012. A standout defensive lineman, Wiley played at Cortland from 2006-09. As a senior, he was the 2009 New Jersey Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year, a D3football.com first team All-East selection and a first team All-ECAC Southeast honoree after recording 74 tackles and sharing the team lead with 10 sacks. Following that season, he participated in the inaugural Division III Senior Football Classic in Salem, Va.

In his junior season in 2008, Wiley totaled 63 tackles, including a team-best 5.5 sacks, and was an honorable mention All-NJAC choice. He finished his four-year collegiate career with 18 sacks.

Wiley earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Cortland in the summer of 2011. The Cape Vincent, N.Y., native graduated from Thousand Islands Central in 2006. He was a four-year starter and team captain in football, basketball and baseball. He earned all-league and all-region honors in both football and baseball.

SUNY Cortland: Official University Partner of the New York Jets

The New York Jets initially came to SUNY Cortland for their summer training camp in 2009, and in 2010 the team completed the first year of a three-year contract with the College. The team did not conduct its 2011 training camp in Cortland as a result of the NFL lockout but returned to Cortland in 2012. The Jets are scheduled to return in 2013, with an extension beyond that possible.

SUNY Cortland's campus and the city of Cortland were prominently featured nationally in 2010 when the annual HBO television series "Hard Knocks" covered the Jets camp.

"They've opened their arms to us here," said head coach Rex Ryan about Cortland. "Everybody treats us great. This has been a great experience. The way everything is set up - the facilities, the people here. This is really as good as it gets for any type of training camp."

Cortland players have served as interns and have worked with the Jets strength and conditioning staff during some of the camps.

About SUNY Cortland

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, more than 7,200 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-three departments with a faculty of more than 400 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 70 majors and 44 minors from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 31 traditional and modern buildings. Fifteen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for approximately 3,000 students. Cortland also operates its Outdoor Education Center at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, the Hoxie Gorge Nature Preserve outside Cortland, and the Brauer Education Center on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The Cortland athletic program placed 10th nationally out of approximately 440 colleges and universities in the 2011-12 all-sport Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Division III standings. Cortland is the only New York school and one of only five nationwide to finish in the top 20 each of the last 17 years. Since 1989, the Red Dragons have captured 15 NCAA Division III team titles.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The newly-constructed on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the *New York Times* called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center, opened in 1973, features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; the Alumni Ice Arena, a facility which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena; racquetball and squash courts; a wrestling room; modern athletic training facilities; and the state-of-the-art Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams play on T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests and newly installed bleachers. The College also has 22 outdoor tennis courts and two outdoor basketball courts and boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball) as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields.
