Cortland Continues Cortaca Jug Streak, Earns ECAC Bowl Bid in 2013

The Cortland football team entered its 2013 Cortaca Jug game at Ithaca looking for its fourth straight win over the Bombers — a feat the Red Dragons had not accomplished since a five-year streak from 1955-59.

Trailing 24-21 with less than three minutes left, Cortland started its final drive from its own 25-yard line. Five plays later, junior quarterback **Tyler Hughes** lofted a deep pass down the left sideline. Junior wide receiver **John Babin** out-jumped a defender, made the catch and raced into the end zone for a 41-yard touchdown with just more than a minute left, giving Cortland a 28-24 victory.

Babin caught two touchdown passes in the game, and he earned All-America honors for the season after making 82 receptions — a school record - for 1,278 yards and 13 scores. With one season remaining, Babin already is Cortland's career leader with 2,486 receiving yards and 30 touchdowns and ranks second with 155 catches.

Babin was joined on the All-East team by junior safety **Andrew Tolosi**, sophomore cornerback **Ke'shaun Stallworth** and sophomore kick returner **Dylan Peebles**, while freshman linebacker **Tristan Laurore** was named the ECAC South and New Jersey Athletic Conference Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tolosi broke a school single-season record with six forced fumbles.

Senior kicker **Nick Daley** and Babin each earned All-ECAC recognition. Daley also competed in the D3 Football Senior Classic and made a 23-yard field goal for what proved to be the winning points as the North defeated the South, 10-7.

Head coach **Dan MacNeill's** squad finished 6-5 overall (6-4 in the regular season) and earned a berth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division III North Central Bowl for the program's 19th postseason appearance.



John Babin earned All-America honors after setting school single-season records with 82 catches for 1,278 yards in 2013. In three seasons, Babin has caught 155 passes for 2,486 yards and 30 touchdowns. He is Cortland's career leader in receiving touchdowns and yardage and is second in receptions.



Linebacker Tristan Laurore led the Red Dragons with 99 tackles during his freshman season. He was named both the ECAC Division III South Region and the New Jersey Athletic Conference Defensive Rookie of the Year.



Cortland won the Cortaca Jug rivalry game at Ithaca College, 28-24, on a 41-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Hughes to John Babin with 1:08 remaining. The Red Dragons have beaten the Bombers four straight years for their longest winning streak in the series since five consecutive victories from 1955-59.

Coaching Staff



Dan MacNeill,
Head Coach

Dan MacNeill begins his 18th season as SUNY Cortland's head football coach in 2014. His teams are a combined 114-61 and have made 12 postseason appearances, including five NCAA tournament showings. He ranks first at Cortland in both career victories and career winning percentage (.651).

In 2013, MacNeill led Cortland to a 6-5 record and a berth in the ECAC Div. III North Central Bowl. In 2012, he led Cortland to a 9-2 record and the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs to tie for ninth place nationally. The Red Dragons won the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) title with a 7-0 mark - the sixth time in eight years that the Red Dragons finished at least tied for first in the conference standings. MacNeill was named the NJAC Coach of the Year for the second time.

In 2011, his Red Dragon squad finished 9-2 overall, tied for second in the NJAC and won the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Div. III Southeast Bowl. In 2010, he led Cortland to a 10-2 record and the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. His squad earned an NCAA automatic berth after tying for the NJAC title with an 8-1 mark.

In 2008, MacNeill guided the Red Dragons to one of the best seasons in school history. Cortland finished 11-2, including two victories in the NCAA Division III playoffs before falling at eventual national champion Mount Union in the quarterfinals. Both the 11 wins and the quarterfinal appearance matched school records. Cortland was recognized as the top Division III team in the East by winning both the Lambert Trophy and the ECAC Team of the Year awards. Cortland won the 2008 NJAC title with a 9-0 record. MacNeill was chosen as the NJAC Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for Liberty Mutual Division III National Coach of the Year honors.

In 2007, MacNeill's squad finished 8-3 and won the ECAC Division III Northeast Bowl. The previous fall, he guided the Red Dragons to a 9-2 record and an ECAC Division III Northeast Bowl bid. Cortland failed to receive an NCAA berth despite a 9-1 regular-season mark. In 2005, MacNeill led the Red Dragons to a 7-2 regular-season record. Cortland earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Division III playoffs and finished the season 7-3. Cortland's other NCAA appearance under MacNeill came during an 8-3 campaign in his first season in 1997.

In 2002, MacNeill led the Red Dragons to a 9-2 mark and the ECAC Division III Northwest title. The team also placed second in the NJAC with a 4-2 record. In 2003, Cortland finished the regular season with a 5-4 mark before losing in the ECAC Northwest championship game.

Among MacNeill's other highlights at Cortland are a 32-31 win over nationally second-ranked and eventual national semifinalist Rowan University in the 2001 season and a 10-7 record against rival Ithaca College in the annual "Cortaca Jug" game.

MacNeill has coached 25 All-Americans, 79 All-East and 67 All-ECAC players at Cortland. Those players included two Gagliardi Trophy national Player of the Year finalists – defensive tackle Adam Haas in 2006 and quarterback Dan Pitcher in 2011 – along

with 1997 ECAC Upstate New York Player of the Year Omar Darling and 2007 ECAC Southeast Rookie of the Year Brian Haas.

In addition, MacNeill's players have earned 191 All-NJAC honors since the program joined the league in 2000, highlighted by the selection of Adam Haas as the 2005 NJAC Defensive Player of the Year, Bryan Wiley as the 2009 NJAC Defensive Player of the Year, Justin Autera as the 2010 NJAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year and Dan Pitcher as the 2011 NJAC Offensive Player of the Year.

An assistant coach at Division I-AA Villanova University from 1984-96, MacNeill is Cortland's 11th head coach since the school's modern era of football began in 1924. MacNeill served as linebackers coach at Villanova and was the team's defensive coordinator from 1988-96.

One of the nation's top defensive coaches, MacNeill's charges consistently ranked among the best defensive teams in the Yankee Conference. His 1991 squad finished the year first nationally in scoring defense, second in total defense and fifth in rushing defense while leading the Yankee Conference in every defensive category. The Wildcats placed first nationally in rushing defense in 1992. In 1996, Villanova finished 8-4 and earned a berth in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

While at Villanova, MacNeill coached three AFCA/Kodak First Team All-Americans, one Associated Press All-American, six first team All-Yankee Conference performers, six first team All-ECAC selections and one player who went on to the NFL. He received a master's degree in educational administration from Villanova in 1994.

A 1979 Cortland graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, MacNeill was a four-year Red Dragon letterwinner and three-year starter at linebacker and defensive tackle. He served as a team tri-captain during his senior campaign in 1978. In his last varsity game against Southern Connecticut State, he was credited with 11 unassisted tackles and three quarterback sacks.

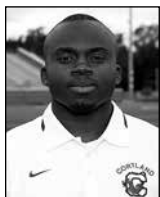
MacNeill began his football coaching career as an assistant at Port Byron (N.Y.) Central High School from 1980 to 1982, prior to being named as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College. He coached Ithaca's junior varsity team in 1982 and was in charge of the Bombers' receivers in 1983.

A native of Walton, N.Y., MacNeill was an all-league defensive end at Walton Central High School as a senior in 1974. MacNeill and his wife, Sherrie, have two daughters — Mikayla and Maura.

2014 Assistant Football Coaches



Tunde Agboke – Defensive Coordinator/Def. Line

Tunde Agboke joins the Cortland staff in 2014 as the team's defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. He spent the last three seasons at Marist College, where he coached defensive linemen for three years and was the special teams coordinator for one year.

In 2013, Marist won the Pioneer Conference Championship and set a school record for wins in a season. Agboke coached All-America defensive end Terrence Fede, who was chosen in the 2014 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins as Marist's first-ever NFL draft selection. During Agboke's three seasons, Marist ranked in the top 10 four times and the top 20 four times in NCAA FCS in defensive categories. In all, his defensive linemen at Marist earned a combined 10 all-conference selections.

Agboke coached the defensive line at Shippensburg University in 2010, and the previous season was in the New Jersey Athletic Conference as a linebackers coach at William Paterson. His players earned two all-league awards at each school.

Agboke began his playing career as a redshirt safety at the University of Kentucky for one season before transferring to Southeast Missouri State. At SMS, he was a three-year starter at linebacker and a two-year captain. A Dean's List student, he earned the 2005 Ohio Valley Conference Medal of Honor for maintaining at least a 3.25 grade point average in season. He is a native of Houston, Texas, and was born in Lagos, Nigeria.



Bill Castro – Offensive Line/ Strength and Conditioning

Bill Castro enters his second season as the Red Dragons' offensive line coach in 2014 after assisting with that position in 2012. He is also the team's strength and conditioning coach.

The Washingtonville, N.Y., native was a two-time All-America and four-year letterwinning offensive lineman for the Red Dragons from 2008-11. As a senior, he was a team captain and he earned second-team All-America honors and was a first-team All-East, All-ECAC and All-NJAC selection. He competed in the D3 Football Senior Classic in Salem, Va., and anchored an offensive line that allowed only nine sacks in 11 games.

In 2010, Castro was an honorable mention All-America and first-team All-East and All-NJAC honoree. He helped the Red Dragons finish 10-2 and advance to the NCAA second round. Castro also started all 11 games for Cortland as a sophomore in 2009.

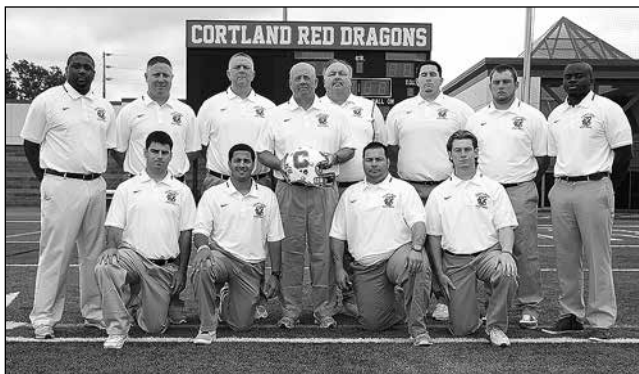
Bill is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist through the National Strength and Conditioning Association.



Larry Czarnecki – Tight Ends

Larry Czarnecki works with Cortland's tight ends in 2014 as he continues a long-standing coaching career with the Red Dragons.

Czarnecki served as Cortland's offensive coordinator from 2001-04 and was the team's defensive coordinator and interior defensive line coach

from 1999-2000. He was Cortland's head football coach from 1983-85 after working as the team's defensive line coach in 1978 and defensive coordinator from 1979-82.

A former Cortland track and field head coach, Czarnecki was named the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) Men's Track and Field Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002 after guiding the Red Dragons to two outdoor league titles. In 1999, Czarnecki earned SUNYAC Women's Track and Field "Coach of the Year" honors after leading the Red Dragons to indoor and outdoor league titles and a 12th-place outdoor national finish. Czarnecki served as Cortland's assistant track and field coach from 1978-85, working with the Red Dragons' field event athletes. He was the program's interim head coach in 1981.

Czarnecki received a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education from Ithaca College in 1976 and his master's degree in the same field the following year. He returned to his alma mater in 1986 as an assistant football and track and field coach. He worked with the Bombers' football squad until 1996, coaching the offensive line on squads that won NCAA Division III titles in 1988 and 1991.

Czarnecki was a standout defensive tackle at Ithaca, earning Kodak and Associated Press First Team All-America honors. He was named the ECAC Division III Football "Player of the Year" as a senior captain in 1975. He led the Bombers to Lambert Trophies and appearances in the NCAA Division III championship games in his junior and senior seasons. Czarnecki also competed on Ithaca's Track and Field club team and played semi-pro football with the Scranton Stars (1976-78) and Binghamton Jets (1979-80).



Kevin Gorman – Linebackers

Kevin Gorman joins Cortland's coaching staff in 2014 as the team's linebackers coach. He graduated in 2014 from Juniata College, where he played four seasons at middle linebacker. He earned first-team All-Centennial Conference honors as a senior and was a second-team all-league choice in both his sophomore and junior years. Gorman led the Eagles in tackles each of those three seasons.

A native of Waverly, N.Y., Gorman graduated from Waverly High School in 2010. He was a first-team all-state running back in 2009 and a first-team all-state linebacker in 2008. Gorman also competed scholastically in basketball and baseball.

Coaching Staff



Maurice Hart – Defensive Backs

Maurice Hart enters his first season as Cortland's defensive backs coach. He comes to Cortland from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, where he coached the Engineers' defensive backs in 2013. Under his tutelage, RPI led the Liberty League in interceptions and ranked 62nd nationally in Div. III in passing

efficiency defense.

The previous season, Hart coached cornerbacks at Emporia State University in Kansas. The program led the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association and ranked fifth nationally in interceptions and finished the 2012 season with a school-record 10 wins and a Kanza Bowl championship. Hart also coached defensive backs at Ellsworth Community College in 2011.

Hart earned a bachelor's degree from North Carolina Central University in 2010 while serving as a coaching intern. He played three seasons at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita, Calif., where he ranked among the top safeties in the national junior college ranks. He earned two All-Western State Conference awards and his teams won two bowl games. The Durham, N.C., native started his playing career as a defensive back at Western Michigan University.



Tom Murphy – Running Backs/Punters and Kickers

Tom Murphy returns for his fifth season on the Cortland staff in 2014. He will coach the team's running backs as well as the punters and kickers for the third straight year after coaching outside linebackers in 2010 and 2011. The Cortland native coached the varsity football and modified boys' lacrosse teams at Cortland High School from 2006-

09 and also coached junior varsity football and lacrosse and modified boys' basketball from 2000-01.

Murphy graduated from Mansfield University in 1996 with a degree in criminal justice administration. He played four seasons on the offensive line for the Division II Mountaineers from 1990-93 and was a forward on the basketball team during the 1994-95 season. Murphy also spent time as an assistant on the Mansfield basketball staff from 1995-96. A 1990 Cortland High alumnus, Murphy earned all-league honors in football, basketball and lacrosse on the scholastic level. Murphy and his wife, Judie, have three children – Adrianna (11), Kaedyn (9) and Thomas (6).



Nate Pagan – Wide Receivers/Kick & Punt Returners

Nate Pagan enters his second season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2014 as an assistant working with the team's wide receivers, kick returners and punt returners. He also will coordinate the punt team this fall.

In his first season at Cortland, Pagan coached All-America receiver John Babin and all-region kick returner Dylan Peebles. In the spring of 2014, Pagan was chosen as a match in Cortland's "Get in the Game" Bone Marrow Registry and went through the donation process this past summer.

Pagan graduated from West Chester University of Pennsylvania in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in liberal studies/professional studies – health and coaching. He played defensive back and wide receiver and returned kicks for the Division II Golden Rams as a three-year letter winner after playing one season at Clarion University in 2008.

At West Chester, Pagan was named the 2010 Offensive Scout Team Player of the Year, and then earned a scholarship in 2011. He played in 10 games in both his junior and senior seasons, and he was recognized on the WCU Athletic Director Academic Honor Roll six semesters from 2009-12.

A Lancaster, Pa., native, Pagan graduated from Manheim Township High School in 2008. He played football and basketball scholastically and was named the school's Student-Athlete of the Year as a senior. Also in his senior season, Pagan was selected as the Lancaster/Lebanon League Wide Receiver of the Year and was the conference's basketball Defensive Player of the Year.



Jon Rocha – Assistant Defensive Backs

Jon Rocha joins the Cortland football coaching staff in 2014 and will assist with the team's defensive backs.

A native of Kalamazoo, Mich., Rocha is currently a full-time student at Cortland enrolled in the school's coaching program. He graduated from Portage

Northern High School in 1999 and played two seasons of scholastic football. A veteran of the United States Marine Corps, Rocha is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Marine Corps League. Rocha has two children – Jon Jr. (11) and Arianna (7).



Greg Roskos – Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

Greg Roskos begins his sixth year as Cortland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2014. Under his guidance, the Red Dragons have ranked in the top three in the New Jersey Athletic Conference in scoring offense each of the last four years and in the top three in total offense each of the past three seasons.

Roskos came to Cortland from the University of Minnesota, where he was an assistant quarterbacks and quality control coach. The Golden Gophers were selected for the Insight Bowl in 2008, the second of his two seasons with the program.

In 2005 and 2006, Roskos served as a graduate assistant offensive coach at the University of Toledo. The Rockets finished 9-3 and won the GMAC Bowl in 2005. Roskos also was an assistant secondary coach at Patriot League champion and NCAA Division I-AA qualifier Lafayette College in 2004 and was linebackers coach in 2003 for a Muhlenberg College squad that won the Centennial Conference and played in the NCAA Division III tournament.

About SUNY Cortland

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, more than 7,000 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-eight departments with a faculty of more than 500 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 75 undergraduate majors and 92 undergraduate minors, concentrations and options from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 32 traditional and modern buildings. Sixteen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for approximately 3,000 students. Cortland also operates its Outdoor Education Center at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, the Hoxie Gorge Nature Preserve outside Cortland, and the Brauer Education Center on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The Cortland athletic program placed 23rd nationally out of approximately 440 colleges and universities in the 2013-14 all-sport Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Division III standings. Cortland is the only New York

school and one of only six nationwide to finish in the top 25 each of the last 19 years. Since 1989, the Red Dragons have captured 15 NCAA Division III team titles.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The state-of-the-art on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the *New York Times* called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center, opened in 1973, features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; the Alumni Ice Arena, a facility which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena; racquetball and squash courts; a wrestling room; modern athletic training facilities; and the Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams play on the Jets Field with its plush, natural-grass surface. T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests, also is utilized by the soccer teams. Additionally, the College has 22 outdoor tennis courts and two outdoor basketball courts and boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball) as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields.
