NIT POSTSEASON FACTS: Colorado makes its 11th National Invitation Tournament (NIT) appearance and second in three seasons. The Buffaloes are the No. 4 seed in one of four eight-team regions.

Colorado defeated No. 5 Dayton 78-73 on March 19, winning its first game in this tournament since 2011 when the Buffaloes won three home games to reach the semifinals in New York. Colorado has won its last five postseason home games.

The Buffaloes are 12-9 all-time in the NIT, winning the title in 1940. Colorado also has a runner-up finish in 1938, a third place showing in 1991 along with its 2011 semifinal appearance.

Overall, this is Colorado's 26th postseason tournament past the conference level. Head coach **Tad Boyle** leads the Buffaloes into their eighth postseason appearance in his nine seasons. Included in that span is a school-record seven-straight appearances from

2011 to 2017. Prior to that seven-year run, no Colorado team had participated in the postseason more than two consecutive years.

Colorado is 49-68 in all-time postseason play, including conference tournaments; 23-26 on the national level (NCAA, NIT, CBI).

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 22-12 overall and finished in a three-way tie for fourth place in the Pac-12 regular season standings with Oregon and Oregon State at 10-8. The fourth place showing marks the Buffaloes' second-best in eight seasons, trailing only the 2012-13 team that tied for third.

This marks the 10th 20-win season in team history and sixth under head coach **Tad Boyle**. Colorado has won 11 of its last 14 since opening the conference season at 2-6.

The Buffaloes recorded double-digit conference wins for the fifth time in eight seasons of the Pac-12 era and the first since 2015-16. Colorado claimed record of .500 or better in conference play (includes Big 12) for the sixth time in nine seasons.

Colorado's 8-2 run in the final 10 games of the regular season is tied for the program's fourth-best in the NCAA Tournament era (since 1938) and the best since 1961-62:

Colorado is averaging 74.0 points per game while shooting 45.6 percent from the field. Defensively the Buffaloes allow 67.7 points a contest while opponents shoot 42.7 percent.

Colorado had an impressive defensive run at the Pac-12 Tournament. The Buffaloes held the opposition to 58.3 points and 36 percent shooting. Colorado also outrebounded its opponents by 41, a margin of 16.3 per game.

Colorado leads the Pac-12 in rebounding defense (31.0 rpg) and rebounding margin (+6.5) while ranking second in free throw percentage (.751), scoring margin (+6.4) and 3-point defense (.316), third in scoring defense, rebounding offense (37.5 rpg) and defensive rebounds (27.3 drpg) and fifth in field goal percentage and offensive rebounds (10.3 orpg).

Sophomore **Tyler Bey** tops Colorado at 13.3 points, 9.8 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game while shooting 54 percent from the field. Bey is averaging 13.0 points and 11.3 rebounds while hitting 26 of 31 from the free throw line in the postseason.

He recorded his 16th double-double of the season, and 18th of his career, with 14 points and 12 rebounds against Dayton. With his 16th double-double he takes over sole possession of the Pac-12 season lead. His 16 double-doubles are 11th on CU's single-season record book and most by a Buffalo since Andre Roberson had 20 in 2011-12.

Bey has recorded double-doubles in 10 of his last 14 games. During that span he had five in a row, the most by a Colorado player since

HISTORICAL NIT FACT: Colorado was the first team, and one of a select few, to play in both the NIT and NCAA tournaments in the same year. In 1940 the Buffaloes won the NIT championship before moving on to their first NCAA appearance, finishing fourth in the West Region in Kansas City. Utah followed in 1944 as did Kentucky in 1949 and the City College of New York in 1950. Rules were instituted shortly thereafter, disallowing teams from playing in both the NIT and NCAA in the same season.

SAME BUILDING, NEW NAME

On July 1, 2018, Colorado's basketball and volleyball home facility was renamed the CU Events Center.

The arena had been known as the Coors Events Center since the 1990-91 season. The 2018-19 season marks the 40th year for Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams in the facility, which opened in the fall of 1979 as the CU Events/Conference Center.

Shaun Vandiver had eight in a row during the 1990-91 season.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard he is second in overall rebounding and defensive boards (7.7 drpg), ninth in field goal shooting and offensive rebounds (2.1 oprg), 10th in blocks and 15th in scoring. Bey ranks 14th in the nation in defensive rebounds, 19th in double-doubles and 21st in overall rebounding.

Sophomore guard **McKinley Wright IV** paces the Buffaloes at 4.8 assists and 1.1 steals per game. Wright is second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg) and third in rebounding (4.9 rpg) and field goal shooting (.495).

Wright has led the Buffaloes in scoring during the postseason at 15.3 points per game. He has shot 44 percent from 3-point range (8-18) over the last four games. Wright has made his last 18 free throw attempts, including all 17 in postseason play.

Wright was selected to the Pac-12 All-Tournament Team after averaging 14.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists over his three games. He led Colorado in scoring against California (18) and Oregon State (17). Wright also shot 43 percent from 3-point range and tied his career-high with four 3-pointers made against Cal.

Wright is third in the Pac-12 in assists while also ranking eighth in free throw percentage (.812), 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.6), 13th in field goal percentage and 16th in scoring.

Wright has scored in double figures in 52 of 65 career games while dishing out at least five assists in 38 contests. He has 893 points for his career (13.7 ppg), ranking 41st on CU's all-time career scoring list.

Junior guard **Shane Gatling** is Colorado's third-leading scorer at 10.1 points per game and leads the Buffaloes in 3-point field goals (58). He is second assists (58) and steals (34).

Gatling had 26 points against UCLA, including a perfect 10 of 10 night from the free throw line. It was his third 20-point game of the season, his top two efforts coming against UCLA (career-high 28 in Los Angeles). His 10 of 10 effort from the line mark career-highs and is the best single-game effort without a miss since Derrick White's 12-of-12 game at Arizona State on Jan. 5, 2017.

Gatling has multiple 3-point field goals in 10 of the last 20 contests. On the Pac-12 charts, Gatling ranks fourth in free throw shooting (.838).

Sophomore wing **D'Shawn Schwartz** is fourth on the team in scoring at 9.1 points per game and fifth in rebounds at 3.8 per contest. He is averaging 12.3 points during postseason play, shooting a team-best 48 percent from 3-point range (12-25).

Schwartz scored 19 points against Dayton, hitting a career-high five 3-point field goals. His 19 points are his second-most in a single game, trailing only the 22 scored against Washington in January.

Schwartz is one of four active Buffs shooting at least 77 percent from the free throw line. He was fourth in the Pac-12 in free throw shooting during conference games at 82.6 percent (38-46).

Junior forward **Lucas Siewert** is fifth on the team in scoring (9.1 ppg) and leads the Buffaloes in 3-point shooting (.355) and is second in rebounding (5.1 rpg) and 3-pointers made (43) and third in assists (54).

Siewert, who scored his 600th career point against Dayton, is averaging 6.0 rebounds during postseason play.

Freshman forward **Evan Battey** averages 8.2 points and is fourth on the team in rebounding at 4.3 per game and second in field goal percentage (.500).

Battey averaged 7.3 points and 4.3 rebounds at the Pac-12 Tournament. He nearly had a double-double in the Pac-12 Quarterfinals against Oregon State with 10 points and nine rebounds.

The win over Oregon State was his 11th game with at least four field goals. In those 11 games with at least four field goals, he has shot 65 percent (54-83).

Battey is second on the team in offensive rebounds with 66, a mark that ranks 11th in the Pac-12 (1.9 orpg). He is also 12th in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage.

Sophomore forward **Alexander Strating** has played in two of the four postseason games and has given the Buffaloes valuable minutes. He has 15 points and four rebounds in 25 minutes while making 6 of 9 from the field. Strating had a career-night against Oregon State in the Pac-12 Quarterfinals. He scored a career-best 10 points, eclipsing his previous high of five scored against the Beavers earlier this season.

Freshman guard **Daylen Kountz** is averaging 5.3 points and is fourth on the team in assists with 44. Kountz had six points and three assists in the win over Dayton. He had three steals at the Pac-12 Tournament, with all three leading to coast-to-coast breakaway dunks.

Freshman guard **Eli Parquet** is averaging 8.6 minutes per game although he's missed the last seven with a knee injury. He was second on the team in blocks during Pac-12 play with eight and has 10 total on the season. Parquet had his first field goal in nine games at Washington State, finishing with three points and two rebounds. Parquet matched personal bests with two steals and two assists in 20 minutes at Washington.

ABOUT THE SPARTANS: Norfolk State is 22-13 overall and the regular season champions of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference with a 14-2 record. The Spartans lost to North Carolina Central, 50-47, in the MEAC Tournament championship game to earn the automatic NIT bid. Seeded eighth, the Spartans knocked off top-seeded Alabama, 80-79 in overtime to advance to the second round. Norfolk State averages 74.1 points while shooting 43.6 percent from the field. Defensively, the Spartans allow 69.3 points per game and had the MEAC's top field goal defense, holding opponents to 40.6 percent. Norfolk State led the MEAC in blocks at 4.3 per game and ranks 33rd nationally with 151 on the season.

Junior guard Nic Thomas leads Norfolk State at 14.4 points per game. An All-MEAC Second Team pick, Thomas tops the Spartans in free throws made and attempted (125-154) and is second on the team in 3-pointers made (83). Senior guard Derrik Jamerson, Jr., is second on the team in scoring at 10.7 points per game. Jamerson leads the nation in 3-point shooting at a blistering 51.4 percent. Joining Thomas on the All-MEAC Second Team, Jamerson is 92 of 179 from 3-point range. Senior forward Jordan Butler tops the Spartans at 6.5 blocks and 2.0 blocks per game while averaging 8.2 points per contest. Junior guard Steven Whitley leads Norfolk State in assists (132) while averaging 9.7 points per game.

Rob Jones is in his sixth season at Norfolk State with a record of 109-95. He was named the 2018-19 MEAC Coach of the Year.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the second meeting between Colorado and Norfolk State and first in postseason play. Colorado won the previous meeting, a 67-56 decision in Boulder on Nov. 27, 1997.

Colorado is 12-0 all-time against MEAC opponents. Colorado's last game against a MEAC opponent was a 95-53 win over Hampton, in Boulder, on Dec. 19, 2015.

ALL-TIME SEASON NUMBERS: Colorado will play its 35th game of the season on Monday, tying the 2013-14 squad for the third most in team history. The Buffaloes' 2010-11 team that made a run to the NIT semifinals has the record at 38 while the 2011-12 Pac-12 Tournament champion squad played 36.

Colorado leads the Pac-12 and ranks 18th in the nation in rebounding margin. The Buffaloes' plus-6.5 advantage on the boards would rank as the third-best in team history. Colorado is second in the Pac-12 in free throw shooting at 75.1 percent, which as of today would rank fourth in school history.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT REVIEW: Colorado reached the semifinals of the 2019 Pac-12 Tournament for the third time and first since 2014.

The Buffaloes were the No. 5 seed at the championship, defeating No. 12 California, 56-51 in the first round on March 13 and No. 4 Oregon State, 73-58, on March 14 before falling in the semis to top-seeded Washington, 66-61 on March 15.

With its semifinal showing, Colorado improved its all-time record to 13-7 at the Pac-12 Tournament.

With Arizona's first round loss to USC, Colorado is now the only school to have won at least one game in each year of the Pac-12 Tournament since the league expanded in 2011-12. The Buffaloes are 8-0 all-time in Pac-12 first round games.

Colorado is 26-42 all-time in conference tournaments. The Buffaloes were 4-20 in the Big Eight Tournament between 1977-96 and 9-15 in the Big 12 Championship between 1997-2011.

Head coach **Tad Boyle** owns more than half of Colorado's all-time conference tournament wins. He is 15-8 in conference tournament action, including a 2-1 mark in Colorado's final year of the Big 12. Boyle is 9-0 as Colorado's head coach in first round conference tournament games.

POSTSEASON AWARDS: Colorado's sophomore tandem of **Tyler Bey** and **McKinley Wright IV** were selected to the 2019 All-Pac-12 Conference Men's Basketball First Team by a vote of league coaches, the conference announced on March 11.

In addition, Wright earned honorable mention to the All-Defensive squad for the second-straight year.

The duo represents Colorado's seventh & eighth All-Pac-12 First Team honorees, and both are first time recipients. It's the second time in eight seasons that the Buffaloes have two first team members. Andre Roberson and Spencer Dinwiddie were on the 2012-13 lead squad. Colorado joins Washington as the only school to have a pair of players (Matisse Thybulle and Jaylen Nowell) on the 10-member first team.

Colorado has had a first or second team All-Conference performer in all eight seasons as a member of the Pac-12. The addition of Bey and Wright give the Buffaloes 11 All-Pac-12 selections overall.

BEY NAMED MOST IMPROVED PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Sophomore forward **Tyler Bey** was named the 2018-19 Pac-12 Conference Most Improved Player of the Year, the league announced on its annual postseason awards show on March 11.

Bey has more than doubled his scoring output from his freshman season and dramatically improved his other numbers, virtually across the board. He averaged 6.1 points and 5.1 rebounds a game as a freshman in 2017-18, then put up team-leading numbers as a second-year Buffalo at 13.3 points and 9.8 rebounds per game.

Bey is Colorado's second Pac-12 Most Improved Player of Year winner in four seasons, joining 2018 NBA Draft pick George King who won the award after his redshirt sophomore season in 2015-16. He is the fourth Buffalo to win a Pac-12 "Player of the Year" type award in eight seasons joining King, Andre Roberson (2012-13 Defensive Player of the Year) and Dominique Collier (2017-18 Sixth Man of the Year).

TEAM AWARDS: **McKinley Wright IV** received the Chauncey Billups Award as the team's Most Valuable Player. The Chauncey Billups MVP Award is one of five voted on by Colorado men's basketball student-athletes. **Tyler Bey** won the Most Improved Player and Best Defender awards, **Evan Battey** was voted Most Inspirational and **Alexander Strating** won the Tebo Family P.A.S.S. Award.

In addition, two statistical champion awards were handed out. Bey won the Stephane Pelle Rebounding Award while Wright earned the Jay Humphries Assist Award.

BEY PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore Tyler Bey was named the Pac-12 Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games played March 6-9.

The Pac-12 Player of the Week award is the first for Bey, and the first this season for the Buffaloes. It's the 10th overall Pac-12 weekly award for Colorado, and first since McKinley Wright IV was honored on Jan. 8, 2018.

Bey averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds last week as the Buffaloes swept UCLA (84-73) and USC (78-67) to land in a tie for fourth place in the final league standings at 10-8. He shot 61 percent from the field (20-33) and recorded a pair of double-doubles.

Bey tied a career-high with 27 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in the win over UCLA. He was 13 of 20 from the floor, setting career and team highs in both categories. In the regular season finale against USC, Bey notched his fifth-straight double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds. He was 7 of 13 from the floor and recorded a block, steal and an assist.

SOLID SHOOTING AT THE LINE: Colorado is 225 of 277 from the

line over the last 12 games (.823) and ranks second in the Pac-12 overall (.752). The Buffaloes are shooting 82 percent in the post-season (68-83) and made 16 of 18 against Dayton.

Colorado hit 80 percent at the Pac-12 Tournament (52-65). The Buffaloes hit 23 of 27 from the line against Oregon State, including a stellar 21 of 23 in the second half.

BEY'S BIG-NUMBER GAMES: Sophomore forward **Tyler Bey** has put up some impressive single-game numbers in several contests this year.

In the home win over UCLA, Bey tied his career-high with 27 points, hitting 13 of 20 from the field. His 13 field goals are the most by a Buff since Askia Booker had 13 at USC in a triple overtime game in Jan. 2015. His 13 field goals and 20 attempts are both the most by a Buffalo at the CU Events Center against a Pac-12 opponent.

Bey had 17 rebounds in the home win over Arizona State; the most by a Buff since Josh Scott had 17 at Oregon on Feb. 18, 2015. He had 16 on the defensive end, the second-most by a Colorado player since 1979-80, when those statistics were first tracked in the program. Andre Roberson had 17 defensive rebounds, 20 overall, against Stanford on Jan. 24, 2013.

Against Oregon, Bey recorded his initial 27-point game with a perfect 9 of 9 from the field along with hitting 9 of 11 from the free throw line. His 9 of 9 performance from the field is the program's best since David Harrison's school-record 10 for 10 against Baylor on Jan 31, 2004.

GOOD ROAD MARKS: Colorado finished the road portion of its regular season schedule at 5-8. It's the third time in seven years the Buffaloes have five true road wins in a season, the other two coming in consecutive years, 2012-13 and 2013-14. Colorado's three Pac-12 road wins are its most since winning three in 2013-14.

Colorado's win at California was its first Pac-12 road win since claiming its first ever win at UCLA on Jan. 13, 2018, ironically by the same score of 68-59. That stopped an eight-game Pac-12 road skid and was also Colorado's first Pac-12 road win at California (1-5). The Buffaloes were just 1-10 on the road in 2017-18.

RARE STREAKS: In the middle of conference action, Colorado had a five-game win streak, its most in conference regular season play in the Pac-12 era and most in a conference season since claiming five in a row during the 2005-06 Big 12 schedule.

For the first time in team history, the Buffaloes climbed back to even, or better, after being four games under .500 in conference play at any point during the season. The Buffaloes were 2-6 after eight games and reached 7-6 during their win streak, finishing off the season at 10-8.

Included in that five-game run are a pair of wins at UCLA and USC, the Buffaloes' second-ever sweep of a Pac-12 road trip. The other came at Oregon (48-47) and Oregon State (72-68), Feb. 7 & 10, 2013.

ROAD HEAVY BUFFS: Colorado and Stanford played four true road games during the nonconference schedule in 2018-19, the most among schools from the Power 5 and Big East Conferences.

Earlier in the season the Buffaloes played a stretch of nine of 11 overall away from home which included five of their first seven Pac-12 games.

Wright's 5.5 assists per game in 2017-18 ranked as the seventh-best single-season average in team history. His current pace, at 5.1 per game, is just a fraction below current record holder Billy Law who averaged 5.3 per game from 1990-92.

Wright has four double-figure assists games each resulting in points-assists double-doubles. His three points-assists double-doubles last year tied the school single-season record previously set by Jay Humphries (1982-83 and '83-84) and Toney Ellis (1976-77). RIGHT AT HOME: Colorado has won 47 of its last 56 and 57 of 67 in the friendly confines of the CU Events Center. In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is a sparkling 127-24 at the CU Events Center (.841). The Buffaloes are 440-175 (.715) all-time at the CEC. Colorado is 14-2 at home this season. The Buffs have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 10 seasons.

MORE ON UCLA ROAD GAME: Colorado's 84 points at UCLA was its most in regulation Pac-12 road game. The Buffaloes have scored more than 84 points in overtime, several times, last in a 91-89 overtime loss at Washington State on Jan. 21, 2017. Colorado's last regulation conference road game with more than 84 points was in its final game in the Big 12, a 95-90 loss at Iowa State on Mar. 2, 2011.

Colorado had a season-high 22 assists, the most since dishing out 25 vs. Stanford at home on Mar. 2, 2017. It's the most on the road since recording 23 at Texas A&M on Feb. 28, 2004.

Colorado's 13 3-pointers marked its second most on the season (14 at Air Force) and the .542 percentage (13-24) was a season high. The Buffaloes had been just 9 of 40 (.225) the previous two games and overall just 29 percent during conference play.

Junior guard **Shane Gatling** had a career and team season-high

28 points at UCLA. He was 7 of 9 from 3-point range; the seven 3-pointers tying for the third most in a single game in team history. It was the 14th time a CU player has made seven in a game, but the first since Richard Roby against Kansas State on Feb. 26, 2005.

NAMON WRIGHT OUT: Senior guard **Namon Wright's** playing career at Colorado has officially come to an end. After a nagging foot injury had sidelined him for all but five minutes since the second game of the Pac-12 season, Wright has elected to have season-ending surgery.

Wright averaged 7.0 points and 2.9 rebounds in 14 games as a senior. He shot 45 percent from the floor and 84 percent from the 3-point line. His final season was highlighted by a CU-personal best 25 points in the season opener against Drake.

At Colorado, Wright played in 44 games averaging 8.8 points and 3.3 rebounds. Combined with his two seasons at Missouri, Wright played in 105 games with 890 points (8.5 ppg) and 121 3-point field goals.

HISTORIC COMEBACK: Colorado fought back from a 17-point first half deficit to defeat New Mexico, 78-75, on Dec. 11 in Albuquerque. The comeback is the third largest in a true road game since 1947 when those records became available. Overall it tied for the seventh largest comeback, regardless of location, in that same time frame.

The Buffaloes trailed by 23 in the first half at Kansas State on Feb. 26, 1955 before claiming a 63-60 win. Colorado was down by 20 at Texas A&M late in the first half on Jan. 28, 1998, before coming back for a 68-67 win.

RARE TRIO-DOUBLE: Colorado had three players record double-doubles in the win over Colorado State.

OFFENSE SOARS AT AIR FORCE: Colorado's 93 points at Air Force was its most in a true road game since scoring 98 in a triple-overtime win at USC on Jan. 29, 2015. It was the most in regulation since a 104-95 loss at Texas on Feb. 9, 2002. The Buffaloes made 14 3-point field goals at Air Force (29 attempts), tying for the fifth-most in a single game in team history and matching their best-ever total on the road. Colorado also had 14 at New Mexico on March 15, 1995, in the Postseason NIT.

Wins over Air Force and Portland marked the first time the Buffaloes have scored 90 or more points in back-to-back games since Jan. 24 & 29, 2015 at home vs. Washington State (90-58) and at USC (98-94, 3OT). One season earlier was the last time the Buffaloes achieved that feat in a pair of regulation games: Nov. 16 & 18, 2013, vs. Jackson State (94-70) and Arkansas State (93-70).

NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS: Colorado finished the nonconference season at 9-3 and is 85-29 (.746) in those games under head coach Tad Boyle including a mark of 38-12 (.760) over the past four seasons.

Colorado's best nonconference record under Boyle is 11-2, achieved twice. First in 2013-14 and then again in 2015-16. Both seasons ended with NCAA Tournament berths. Boyle also had an 11-win nonconference schedule in 2010-11, his first year at Colorado, as the Buffaloes were 11-4 before beginning their final season in the Big 12 Conference.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado was 2-4 against ranked opponents last season highlighted by a sweep of No. 4 (AP)/6 (Coaches) Arizona State and No. 14/16 Arizona, January 4 & 6.

Colorado claimed wins over ranked teams in back-to-back outings for the first time since defeating #9 Missouri in Boulder and No. 21 Kansas State in Manhattan Jan 8 & 12, 2011. It's the first time in program history Colorado has defeated AP Top 15 teams in back-to-back games

Colorado's thrilling 90-81 overtime win Arizona State snapped a three-game skid and was Colorado's highest AP ranked win since defeating No. 3 Texas, 93-80, in Boulder on Feb. 4, 2003.

Colorado's 17 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's eight seasons is by far the best streak in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 17-32, have accounted for 28 percent of wins over ranked opponents (61) since 1949-50.

WALTON TO MISS 2018-19: Redshirt sophomore forward/center Dallas Walton will miss the 2018-19 season after suffering a torn ACL in his right knee in October, during a preseason practice session.

Walton averaged 5.7 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in just under 19 minutes per game as a freshman in 2017-18. He led Colorado with 34 blocked shots, ranking 10th in the Pac-12 Conference. All but seven of his blocks came during conference play, ranking sixth in the league during that span (1.4 bpg).

Walton took a redshirt year in 2016-17 in part to continue his rehabilitation and strength training after experiencing two ACL tears in his left knee in a 10-month span during his junior year of high school

COLORADO, ASU TO MEET IN 2019 PAC-12 CHINA GAME: Colorado will play a nonconference game against Arizona State in China, in November 2019.

The Buffaloes and Sun Devils will meet in the fifth edition of the Pac-12 China Game presented by Alibaba Group. Longtime Pac-12 partner Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC), which operates under China's Ministry of Education, will serve as the co-host for the game.

The matchup between Colorado and Arizona State, tentatively scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 9 and for national broadcast in both the U.S. and China, will not count as a conference contest. The teams are slated to meet only once during the 2019-20 Pac-12 regular season as part of the league's annual 18-game rotation model.

This will be the first time the Pac-12 China game has featured two conference teams. The previous editions, including this year's California-Yale contest, has had one Pac-12 team and one from another NCAA Division I conference.

The Pac-12 China Game is the flagship event of Pac-12 Global, designed to grow the global popularity of Pac-12 athletic programs and universities, fostering cultural exchange through sport, and creating unique educational experiences for Pac-12 student-athletes.

This will be the first intercollegiate regular season event for a Colorado Athletics program in China, or the Eastern Hemisphere for that matter. The Buffaloes have played in a handful of regular season events outside the United States. Both basketball programs have played in Puerto Rico; the men in 1998-99 and the women in 2005-06. Colorado's men's and women's golf teams have both competed Mexico and Puerto Rico, and the women will play a tournament in the Dominican Republic in March 2019.

Many Colorado student-athletes have taken advantage of out-of-season foreign tours or World University Games competitions over the last couple of decades. Nine Buffaloes that would be on next year's roster in China were part of the team's preseason foreign tour to Italy in August 2017.

BUFFS SEVENTH IN PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Pac-12 Conference Preseason Media Poll.

The Buffaloes had 161 points, just behind Arizona State at 165. Oregon was picked to win the 2018-19 Pac-12 title with 288 points and 16 of 25 first place votes. UCLA was second (264) with six first place votes, Washington was third (249) with two first place votes. Arizona picked up the remaining first place vote and was picked fourth overall (205), just two votes ahead of USC.

Colorado returns nine letterwinners to a team that finished 17-15 and tied Arizona State for eighth place in the final 2017-18 Pac-12 standings at 8-10.

BOULDER — Colorado coach **Tad Boyle** had two directives for his Buffaloes in their season opener Tuesday night against Drake: play hard and play with confidence.

The Buffs did both, carving out a 100-71 win over the Bulldogs by utilizing hot shooting, balanced scoring and some solid defense. The 100 points was the most by CU in a season opener since a 113-89 win over Cal State-Northridge in 1990.

CU's effort showed up in the numbers: four players in double-figure scoring, 58.9 percent shooting (33-for-56) from the floor, a 44-29 rebounding edge, just 12 turnovers and 15 assists.

As for the confidence, "That's something you can't teach, you can't coach, but you want your players to have a little bit of swagger in terms of how they feel about themselves when they step on the floor," Boyle said. "You have to have that to be successful in college. You don't want it to be too much, but you want them to believe in what they've worked on over the summer and certainly through the fall. Overall I was pleased with the first game."

Senior **Namon Wright** led the Buffs, coming off the bench to finish with 25 points — his best effort as a Buff — along with eight rebounds. Sophomore **McKinley Wright IV** added 17 points and six assists, junior **Shane Gatling** scored 12 points and junior **Lucas Siewert** chipped in 11. **Tyler Bey** just missed a double-double, finishing with a career-high 14 rebounds and nine points.

Nick Norton led Drake with 18 points.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Bulldogs hit the Buffs early from the 3-point line with three treys in the first six minute and the first half featured eight lead changes before Colorado seized control with a 15-2 run over the last four minutes to take a 45-34 lead at the half.

"Early we got caught asleep a little bit," McKinley Wright said. "They hit two wide-open ones out the gate and we kind of talked about it in the timeout. We did a good job the rest of the way of running them off the 3-point line and making them go in the lane for tough twos."

Namon Wright, who was 5-for-8 from 3-point range, sparked the 15-2 run with seven points, including a 3-pointer. McKinley Wright added a pair of assists and four points in the surge, including a driving layup at the buzzer.

The Buffs then put the game away early in the second half. CU scored the first seven points of the half to bump its cushion to 52-35, and after a Drake timeout, the Buffs quickly bumped the edge into the 20s. Namon Wright had six points in the early surge and the Bulldogs never came closer than 17 again, with CU's big lead hitting 34.

"Having a good point guard, having good teammates, just being confident in shooting the ball when I'm open and just playing defense," Wright said of his game. "A few of the baskets I got from playing defense — getting in the lane or we were running in transition. We were just playing as a team and we were running when we got stops."

After hitting seven 3-pointers in the first half, the Bulldogs managed just four more after intermission.

"Overall we started contesting shots better in the second half," Boyle said. "You can't let a good 3-point shooting team get rhythm and get hot because then you've got your hands full. The 3-point line is a great equalizer in college basketball. We've got to understand that. There's some room for improvement there."

But Boyle also liked the killer instinct his team showed early in the second half, something that wasn't always present last season.

"That's something we lacked a lot last year," McKinley Wright said. "We'd have halftime leads and come out and let the team get right back in the game. This year, our focus is kind of put teams away when we have them down. I think we showed that tonight now we have to keep them going."

BOULDER — Three nights after a runaway win in the season opener, **Tad Boyle's** Colorado Buffaloes found themselves in a nail-biter Friday night against visiting Omaha.

But with their backs to the wall, the Buffs came up with big plays down the stretch to wrap up a 79-75 win at the CU Events Center to improve to 2-0 while Omaha fell to 1-3.

"They found a way to win, they found a way to buck up and get stops when they needed to get stops," Boyle said.

No Colorado play was bigger than **Tyler Bey's** steal, layup and free throw with 29.9 seconds remaining that gave CU a 77-72 lead. Omaha answered with a Zach Jackson 3-pointer to close the gap to two with 17 seconds to go, but Colorado held on down the stretch, with **McKinley Wright IV** clinching the victory with two free throws with 7.4 second on the clock.

CU finished with five players in double-figure scoring, led by **Bey** and **Lucas Siewert** with 16 apiece. **D'Shawn Schwartz** added a career-high 15 points to go with a career-best seven rebounds, McKinley Wright added 13 points and **Namon Wright** chipped in 11.

The Buffs hurt themselves with 16 turnovers, which Omaha converted into 19 points. But the Buffs had a 29-27 edge on the boards and hit 19 of 23 free throw attempts while Omaha was 8-for-12 from the line.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking a 33-29 lead at intermission, Colorado threatened to take control with a 5-0 burst to open the second half. But the Mavericks responded with a 20-10 run to take a 59-58 lead, setting the stage for a see-saw final seven minutes in a game that featured 17 lead changes and 24 ties.

Colorado finally took the lead for good with 2:25 remaining when Siewert followed a **Deleon Brown** miss to give CU a 72-70 lead. But the Mavericks, who shot 53 percent from the field in the second half — including 6-for-10 from 3-point range — kept it close right down to the end.

"They came in and brought it to us," McKinley Wright said. "They gave us their best effort. We weren't great from the start but we found a way to dig it out. A win is a win. We'll take it."

Wright, playing against long-time friend and high school teammate JT Gibson, was not at his best. He had an uncharacteristic five turnovers — the Buffs finished with 16 — and was just 3-for-7 from the field.

But even on an "off" night, Wright still had some game-deciding moments. He hit a huge bucket with 1:51 to go that gave the Buffs a 74-70 lead, then added his two clinching free throws in the final seconds.

Siewert, who had 11 points on a 4-for-4 shooting in CU's 100-71 win over Drake, was 6-for-10 from the floor against the Mavericks, including 4-for-6 from 3-point range for his 16 points. Along with his putback that gave Colorado the lead for good in the final minutes, the CU junior had back-to-back 3-pointers early in the second half that helped end an 8-0 Mavericks run.

The Buffs seemed out of synch for much of the first half, particularly on the offensive end. Colorado had four turnovers in the first five minutes, which the Mavericks gladly converted into eight points en route to building an 11-6 lead.

CU finally found some offensive rhythm and put together a 7-0 run to take the lead, capped by a Siewert 3-pointer, only to hit another lull and allow the Mavs to momentarily regain a 22-21 edge with 7:42 to go in the half.

But two minutes later, the Buffs finally took the lead again when a Namon Wright bucket gave CU a 26-24 lead. Bey added two baskets in the final two minutes — one fueled by a Brown steal and another off a nice pass down the lane from McKinley Wright — to give the Buffs a 33-29 edge at the half.

SAN DIEGO — Freshman **Evan Battey** scored a career-high 18 points and the Colorado Buffaloes had their chances to collect an important road win Tuesday night, but the Buffs fell short in the final minutes, dropping a 70-64 decision to San Diego.

The Buffs led at several junctures of the game, including 61-60 with just 1:56 to go after a pair of free throws from **McKinley Wright IV**.

But Colorado couldn't get a stop on the other end and the Toreros scored six straight points to regain control. A **Shane Gatling** 3-pointer with 22 seconds left pulled Colorado back to within two, 66-64, but USD hit four free throws in the final 20 seconds to put the game away.

Wright added 14 points to go with Battey's 18, but they were the only Colorado players in double figures. The Buffs hurt themselves by hitting just nine of their 15 free throw attempts, with two misses on the front end of one-and-one situations proving costly in the final four minutes. USD, meanwhile, hit 18 of 21 free throw tries, including eight straight in the final minute.

The biggest difference came in second-chance points. The Toreros outrebounded Colorado 41-35, including a 15-10 edge on the offensive boards. San Diego converted those offensive rebounds into 18 points.

CU was also slowed all night by foul trouble, with **Tyler Bey** missing most of the first half with two fouls and fouling out with his fifth in the final minute.

"We lost this game in two areas," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "One I have to get better at as a coach, and that's our execution offensively. We have to execute better than we executed down the stretch. The area the players have to get better in is second shots. They shoot 36 percent, we shoot 42 percent, but they get 15 offensive rebounds. ... It was a game we could have won, I feel like we should have won, and our players feel like that. But the bottom line is we didn't win and we all have to take responsibility for that."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by five at intermission, 35-30, but put together a 12-0 run early in the second half to build a 45-37 lead. Battey had five points in the surge and **Lucas Siewert** added a 3-pointer.

But the Toreros slowly chipped away at the cushion by answering Colorado's run with a 17-6 surge that gave USD a 60-56 edge with just under five minutes to play. The run included a pair of San Diego buckets off of offensive rebounds, as well as a five-point possession.

Colorado answered with a 5-0 burst to take a 61-60 lead, with Wright scoring all five points. USD regained the edge on an Isaih Pineiro dunk with 1:31 to go, and the Buffs then turned it over on their ensuing possession. Bey then fouled Pineiro — his fifth — with 58 seconds remaining and Pineiro hit two free throws to give USD a three-point lead.

Colorado then missed a pair of shots on its next possession and the Toreros put the game away at the free throw line in the final 30 seconds.

The Buffs were hampered by foul trouble for much of the first half, with starters **Bey** and **D'Shawn Schwartz** each playing just seven minutes before being tagged with their second fouls.

The Buffs managed to stay in the game thanks to nine first-half points from Battey, including a pair of 3-pointers. But Battey also drew his second foul with just under four minutes to play, and Lucas Siewert also had two fouls by the end of the half.

Colorado jumped out to a 6-0 lead, but the Toreros quickly came back and turned it into a see-saw game that saw seven ties and seven lead changes in the first half. With Battey, Bey and Schwartz on the bench with two fouls for Colorado, the Toreros scored the last five points of the half in the final minute to take a 35-30 lead at intermission.

BOULDER — D'Shawn Schwartz and McKinley Wright IV each scored 19 points and **Tyler Bey** recorded his 16th double-double of the season Tuesday night to lead the Buffs to a 78-73 win over Dayton in a first-round NIT game at the CU Events Center.

Bey had 14 points and 12 rebounds in the game and Schwartz had two 3-pointers in a decisive 8-0 Colorado run down the stretch as the Buffs won their 11th game in their last 14 outings to improve to 22-12.

Tuesday's game was a see-saw affair that featured 18 lead changes and 10 ties, with the Buffs trailing by as much as eight in the first half and by seven early in the second half. But Colorado finally took the lead for good with 6:26 to go on a **Daylen Kountz** baseline drive and dunk, then extended the cushion to 74-65 with an 8-0 run that Schwartz capped with his fifth 3-pointer of the game.

Schwartz shot 7-for-13 from the field, including a 5-for-8 night from behind the international 3-point line used for NIT games. Wright had nine assists to go with his 19 points while Bey had 10 points and 11 rebounds before halftime.

Bey left the game for several minutes in the second half with a lower leg injury, but returned late in the game to help the Buffs down the stretch.

Obi Toppin led Dayton with 21 points. The Flyers shot 54.5 percent from the field (30-for-55) while CU shot just 44.3 percent (27-for-61). Colorado, however, hit 16 of 18 free throws and had a 34-29 edge on the boards for an 11-4 edge on second-chance points.

"That was a high-level basketball game," CU head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "The people that came tonight and saw that in person left saying 'We saw two good college basketball teams.' ... Great win. Great team win."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs spent much of their night withstanding Dayton runs that were fueled by their hot shooting. The Flyers led by eight early, 23-15, before Colorado came back to take a 37-35 lead at the half; and by seven early in the second half, 50-43, after a 7-0 run.

But each time, the Buffs had an answer. Dayton's last lead came with 6:45 to go when a long 3-pointer gave the Flyers a 63-62 edge.

Kountz, however, delivered a big baseline drive and dunk on CU's next trip down the floor and the Buffs never trailed again.

"I love it when he drives the ball because he drives with aggressiveness, he drives with confidence and he drives to put the ball in the basket," Boyle said. "He puts pressure on defenses off the bounce and when he's got room like that, he'll go up and punch it."

The Flyers managed to stay within striking range for the next minute, trading baskets with Colorado before the Buffs finally put the game away with an 8-0 run. Schwartz started the surge with a 3-pointer before Wright drove the lane for a bucket. Schwartz finished the run with another long trey, and with 2:08 remaining, Colorado had a 74-65 cushion.

"Our guys responded," Boyle said. "I thought McKinley Wright kind of took over offensively there midway through the second half. Big-time players do that. He made some really good ball screen reads, got D'Shawn some open looks. D'Shawn obviously likes the international three better than he likes the college three."

Colorado fell behind early and trailed by as much as eight in the first half, 23-15, after the Flyers hit 10 of their first 13 field goals.

But the Buffs slowly chipped away at the lead, finally putting together a 10-0 run to turn a 30-23 deficit into a 33-30 lead with 2:18 to go. Bey, who had 10 points and 11 rebounds before half, started the run with two free throws, Schwartz added a 3-pointer and **Alexander Strating** scored five points in the run.

Dayton finally ended the run with three points from Toppin before Colorado added four more points and the Flyers got a bucket just before the buzzer to send CU into the locker room with a 37-35 lead.
