# Baruch Captures Fifth Straight Title

The CUNYAC Con Edison Men's Volleyball Final featured a new match-up for the first time since 2004; #1 Baruch versus #3 York. After completing a stunning upset, York was looking for their first title since 1996 when they took down the Bearcats. On the opposite end, the #7 nationally ranked squad at the time, Baruch, was looking for their fifth consecutive championship and eighth in school history.

The Bearcats of Baruch were dominant in the first set with an early 8-1 lead. Short runs closed the gap to as little as 15-9, but Baruch would not look back, and found themselves with a quick 25-11 win in the set. The Bearcats had an unbelievable .565 hitting percentage in the first game with rookie Scott Standing racking up 12 assists.

The second set would prove to be a closer contest. After a long period of back and forth action, the Bearcats went on a 4-point run to bring the score to 13-9. Baruch went on to expand their lead to 19-13, but back came the Cardinals. A 6-1 run by York showed that they came to play, but would not be enough to overtake the Bearcats. Baruch would finish the set off 25-20 to take a commanding 2-0 lead.

Just one set from victory, the Bearcats opened the third set with a quick two point lead. York was not going to go easy, keeping it close until a massive 15-2 run by the Bearcats all but sealed their fifth straight championship. The final set would end 25-10 in favor of Baruch.

"We had a loss against NYU a little while ago and it really helped us," said Head Coach Allison Stack. "We learned that we can beat anybody but anybody can beat us and it helped us."

After hitting a miraculous .571 in the championship game, Baruch's Jack McKee was named the Tournament MVP for the second consecutive year.

"I can't ask for a better team or a better coach," said McKee. "We have a tradition to win the championship and I am glad I was able to keep it alive."

The victory gave Baruch CUNYAC's NCAA Tournament Automatic Qualification.

After McKee, the All-Tournament Team was rounded out by Scott Standing (Baruch), Brady Ambro (Baruch), Edner Geffard (York), Avinash Thomas (York), Braien Otsla (Hunter), and David Dimitruk (Brooklyn).

# CUNYAC SEMIFINAL RECAPS

## Semifinal 1: #3 York Cardinals 3, #2 Hunter Hawks 2

At the Nat Holman Gymnasium in the upper west side of Manhattan, the #3 Cardinals of York upset the #2 Hunter Hawks, 3-2. Hunter had taken the two match-ups during the regular season but it would be York that prevailed when it counted. With the win, the Cardinals broke a streak of eight straight Baruch vs. Hunter finals, and advanced to the big game for the first time since 2004.

The first set began to look like an upset was in reach. Back-and-forth play kept the game close, until a series of three attacking errors by Hunter gave York an 11-7 lead. Hunter chipped away to get within one point but York went on a small run to provide the breathing room they needed, as they eventually took the set 25-21.

These teams were closely matched and set two showed just how close. Hunter began with a lead through the first 14 points as the higher seed showed control. Up until Hunter lead 24-22, the Hawks looked like they would knot the match at 1-1; but back came the Cardinals. York would tie the game at 24-24 and from there, every serve, set, and attack had the crowd holding their breath. They went point-for-point until a smart play by 2011 Rookie of the Year Edner Geffard, gave the Cardinals the lead at 32-31. An attacking error by the Hawks then gave York the set and the commanding 2-0 lead.

The third set was more of the same, as the two teams went back-and-forth until the Hawks 4-point run gave them an 18-13 lead. The lead would stay at about five points until, Hunter reached the 24-point mark once again with a 24-19 lead. Again, back came the Cardinals with a run that brought the set to 24-23. A kill by Matthew NG would seal the deal for Hunter, resulting in the match standing at 2-1.

Hunter came out strong in the fourth set with a 5-1 run, but the Hawks would not look back for the rest of the set. York would only score four points the rest of the set, as Hunter dominated their way to a 25-5 victory, that brought the game even at 2-2.

The fifth set would be the difference maker. Hunter had the momentum, but it was the Cardinals that came out with an early 4-1 lead. Short runs by the Hawks wouldn't be enough to overtake the York lead and so, the Cardinals would advance 3-2, after the 15-9 fifth set victory.

## Semifinal 2: #1 Baruch Bearcats 3, #4 Brooklyn Bulldogs 0

The top-seeded Baruch Bearcats swept the #4 seed Brooklyn Bulldogs 25-13, 25-16, and 25-18 in a semifinals match at CCNY's Nat Holman Gymnasium. Baruch, ranked seventh in the nation at the time, has now made the Championship game every year since 2004.

The Bearcats got off to an early 8-2 lead in the first set and would not look back. A combination of strong kills and Brooklyn attack errors opened the doors for Baruch, as they finished the set on a 9-4 run. Freshman Scott Standring recorded 11 assists and senior Martin Joksimovik had four kills.

The second set saw both teams exchanging points until Baruch was able to string three consecutive points to take a 12-7 lead. Brooklyn would fight back and trim the lead to 15-11. However, the Bearcats responded by recording the next six points. They would go on to win the second set 25-16. Baruch was led by junior Jack McKee.

The third and final set started off similar as the second, with both teams trading points. The score remained close the entire set, as the Bulldogs would not go away easy. Ultimately, strong play by junior Steven Coniglio helped Baruch win the last set 25-18 and advance to the final game.

For the Bulldogs, sophomore David Dimitruk picked up a team-high eight kills while junior Timothy Hui recorded 12 assists and six digs. As a team, Brooklyn was able to muster up 24 kills, 24 assists and 17 digs.

On Baruch's side, Standring racked up an impressive 31 assists, three kills, three digs, and one ace. Coniglio and Joksimovik added 11 and 10 kills, respectively. Overall, the Bearcats hit a remarkable .465 and now move on to face the York Cardinals in the CUNYAC Championship game.

# CUNYAC QUARTERFINAL RECAPS

## Quarterfinal 1: #1 Baruch Bearcats 3, #8 Medgar Evers Cougars 0

The Baruch Bearcats swept the Cougars of Medgar Evers College in a CUNYAC/Con Edison Championship Tournament quarterfinal match played on Tuesday night in the ARC Arena.

The Bearcats posted a 25-2, 25-8, 25-10 victory to advance to the semifinal round at CCNY's Nat Holman Gymnasium.

Yanni Malo led the attack this evening against Medgar Evers, hitting .600 with seven kills. Brian Monaghan, also hitting .600, had four kills, while Brian Coniglio dished out 16 assists in the playoff victory. Christopher Welsh of Medgar Evers led the Cougars with four kills and two digs.

## Quarterfinal 2: #2 Hunter Hawks 3, #7 John Jay Bloodhounds 0

Nino Holt led the Hawks with 12 kills and Stanley Martinez recorded a game-high 29 assists, as Hunter cruised through the quarterfinals round of the 2013 CUNYAC Championships defeating John Jay 3-0 (25-18, 25-10, 25-10) on Tuesday, April 9th.

Hunter netted a team total of 39 kills and 32 defensive digs in their win over John Jay. Nino Holt led the offensive attack, hitting double-figures with 12 kills, while Braien Otslaadded had seven kills, and Moshood Jinad had six kills. Stanley Martinez controlled the momentum setting up his Hawks with 29 assists and leading the defense with 10 digs.

The Hawks advance to the semifinal round of the CUNYAC Championships which was held on Friday, April 12th at CCNY. Hunter will play against the winner of #3 York and #6 Lehman.

## Quarterfinal 3: #3 York Cardinals 3, #6 Lehman Lightning 0

The York College men's volleyball team disposed of Lehman College in the quarterfinal round of the CUNYAC Men's Volleyball Championships by a score of 3-0 (25-15, 25-22, 25-18).

With the win, York advances to the semifinal round, which was held at the City College of New York on Friday, April 12. It is the fifth straight season they have reached the semifinals. The Cardinals, who are the #3 seed in the tournament, will battle second-seeded Hunter College, who knocked off John Jay College in the quarterfinal round.

The Cardinals had a solid all-around effort to defeat Lehman for the third time this season. York hit .191 on the night with 10.5 blocks, while holding the Lightning to a .041 hitting percentage on the evening.

Leszek Stankiewicz and Edner Geffrard led the way with nine kills apiece. Geffrard added four blocks on defense and Stankiewicz chipped in three. Avinash Thomas finished with six kills and ten assists, and Jhonnattan Fernandez had six kills and five digs. Sebastien Francois also contributed with seven kills.

## Quarterfinal 4: #4 Brooklyn Bulldogs 3, #5 CCNY Beavers 1

The #4 seeded Brooklyn College Men's Volleyball team won an exhilarating 3-1 (26-24, 27-25, 36-38, 25-22) match in the quarterfinals round of the CUNYAC Championships at the West Quad Center, over the #5 seeded Beavers of the City College of New York (CCNY).

With the win, BC improves to 13-11 overall on the season and advances to the semifinals round of the CUNYAC Championships for the second straight season. The Bulldogs took on the top-seeded Bearcats of Baruch College on April 12th, at Nat Holman Gymnasium on the campus of CCNY. Baruch defeated #8 Medgar Evers College in their quarterfinal meeting.

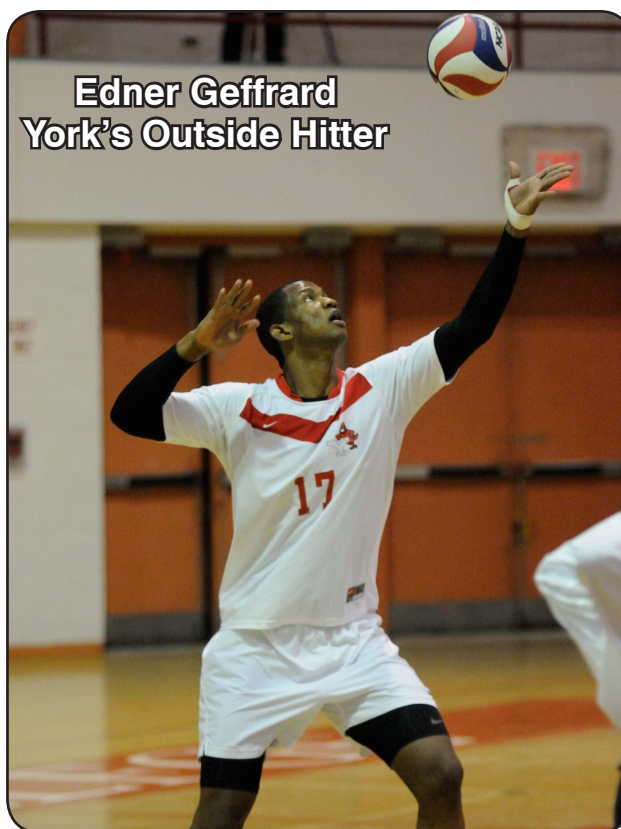
All four sets on the night saw tight, back-and-forth action. Overall, BC and CCNY totaled 42 ties and 17 lead changes in the match.

After Brooklyn edged out 26-24 and 27-25 wins in the first and second sets, respectively; the set of the match would come in the third, which saw CCNY pull out an incredible 38-36 win, to force a fourth set, which the Bulldogs would win 25-22 to punch their ticket to the semifinals.

Freshman Serhan Akturk contributed with 12 digs, while senior Christopher Valverde chipped in with 25 assists.

For CCNY, Brian Yik Lim recorded a double-double with 13 kills and 14 digs, while Derell Williams added 10 kills. Anthony Reyes paced the offense with a match-high 32 assists, while Bobby Xihe Xie and Bryan Hu finished with 15 and 13 digs, respectively.

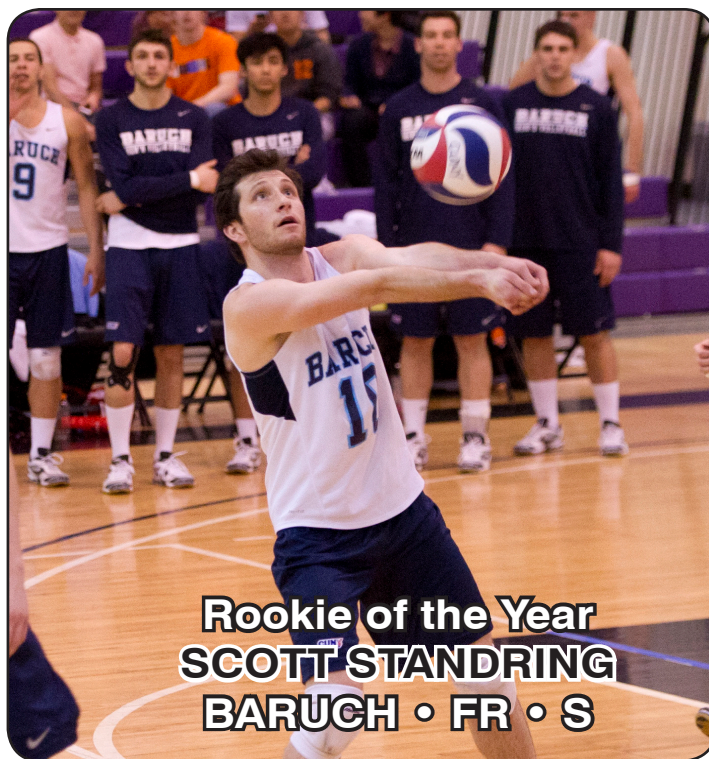

The Baruch Bearcats suffered a heart-breaking 5-set loss to #1 ranked Springfield College Pride in the semifinals of the 2013 NCAA Championship in Rochester, New York.

The loss ended the Bearcats' outstanding season with a 34-6 record, while the Pride won their 25th straight match to improve to 31-3.

The Bearcats stumbled out of the gate and were down 2-0 following 25-22, 25-18 scores. Despite the strong play by the Pride, the Bearcats never lost their composure and came back with strong serving, hitting and blocking to tie the match at 2-2 with 25-18, 25-22 scores.

They hit .355 in the third set and .323 in the fourth to surprise their opponent from Massachusetts.

The Pride started the fifth set by jumping out to a 4-0 lead, but the Bearcats would slowly battle back to get as close as 11-10, on a kill by Jack McKee. The Pride would later lead 14-12 with match point, but the Bearcats got close again, at 14-13 on a service error.

Unfortunately, the Pride finished the exciting match with a kill to return to play in the championship against the weekend's host, #2 ranked Nazareth College.

They must be an active member of the team, traveling and a designated member of the squad size at the championship. All ties are broken by the number of credits completed.

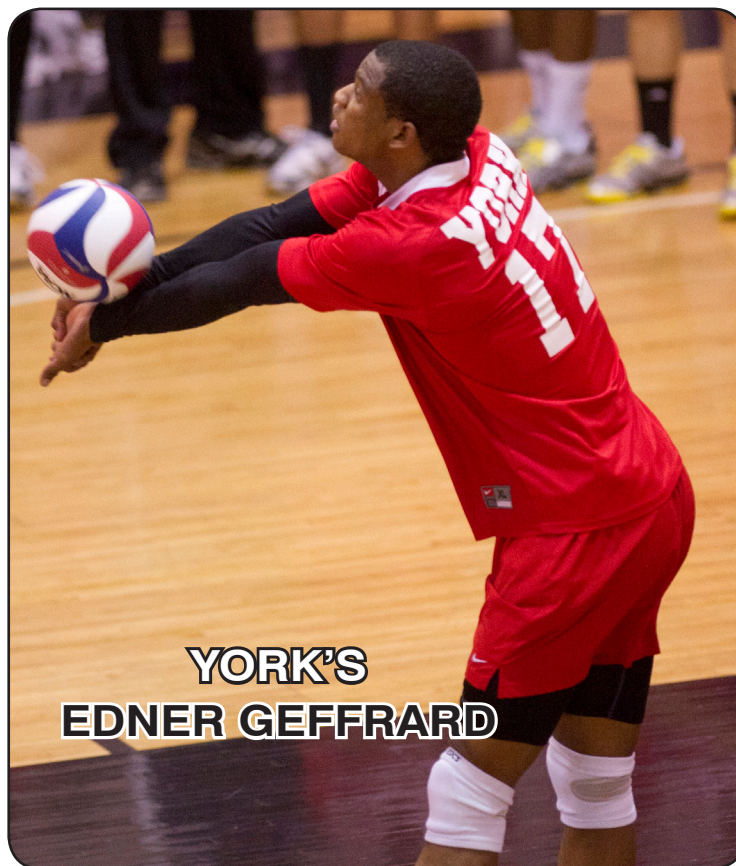
Ramapo came out strong, taking the first set convincingly thanks to strong defensive play. The Roadrunners jumped out to a 15-9 lead and were never threatened.
