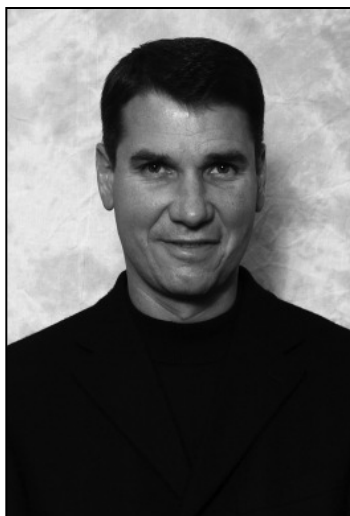

# MEN'S HEAD COACH

## BRAD BARBARICK



In his 14th season at the helm of the Cavaliers, Brad Barbarick's tenure which has seen CU basketball become a regionally and nationally recognized intercollegiate program. Since taking over as head coach in 1994, Barbarick has steadily transformed the Cavs into one of the top programs in the Cascade Collegiate Conference.

Among his accomplishments are 11 consecutive appearances in the Cascade Conference postseason tournament and a pair of conference championships in 2000 and 2003. The 2000 squad finished with a 24-8 record and advanced to the "Sweet 16" at the NAIA Division II National Tournament.

Barbarick's 202 victories in his first 13 seasons are a Concordia career record. The Cavaliers have had 19 All-Conference players, 3 NAIA All-Americans, and 6 NAIA Academic All-Americans during Barbarick's tenure.

Brad's ministerial approach to his job has also been a key to Concordia's consistent basketball success. The Barbarick family lives just two blocks from the CU campus, and is actively involved in both campus life and the Cavalier athletic department. Brad has been married 17 years to the former Dana Sims, and they are parents of three children: twin daughters Emily and Megan (12), and son Zachary (8).

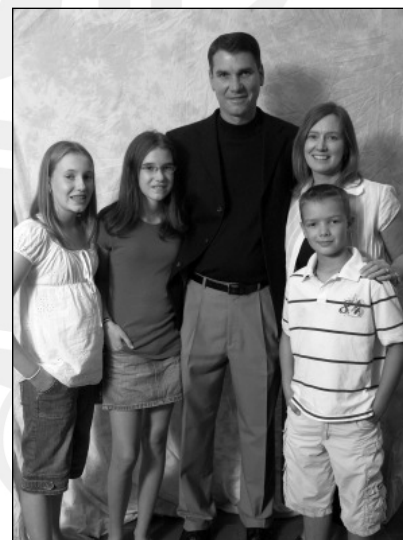
Barbarick is a graduate of Santa Ynez High School in Santa Ynez, California, and received his bachelor's degree from Columbia Christian College in Portland. He added a master's degree in secondary

education, with an emphasis in exercise and sport science, from Western Oregon State College (now University) and Oregon State University.

Brad began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Columbia Christian in the 1988 season, then served as an assistant at Mt. Hood Community College, Western Oregon and Concordia before taking the CU head coaching position.

Brad is the founder, owner, and director of the Rip City Hoop Camp, one of the most popular summer camps in the region, which completed its 16th year in the summer of 2006.

He has also served as the director, or as a staff member, at camps run by John Wooden, Pat Riley, Don Nelson, George Karl, Mike Dunleavy, Jim Harrick, A.C. Green, and at the Superstar Invitational Basketball Camp.

# WOMEN'S HEAD COACH

## AARON CHRISTIAN



In his second season at Concordia, **Aaron Christian** will look to continue transforming the Cavalier women's basketball program. The 32-year-old Christian arrived to CU from Clark College, where he was the head coach for two seasons.

This is the second time that Aaron has been a part of the Concordia University staff as he served as a men's assistant coach under Brad Barbarick for the 2000-01 season.

Prior to his position at Clark, Christian served as a men's assistant coach at the University of California at Davis, Butte College (Oroville, California), and Pierce College (Lakewood, Washington). He also spent one season as Director of Basketball Operations at Portland State University.

Christian received his bachelor's degree from Pacific Lutheran University in 1997, and was an assistant boy's basketball coach at Fife High School for four years while he was a PLU student. He went on to earn his master's degree in education/athletic administration

from Washington State University in 2000, and was the video coordinator for the Cougars' men's basketball program for two seasons.

Christian is also the co-founder and Associate Executive Director of Win the Tip!, a basketball coaches network. He has served as an instructor at more than two dozen basketball camps across the country, including UCLA, Gonzaga, the University of Connecticut, the University of California, Washington State University, Rip City Hoop Camp, A.C. Green Hoop Camp, Brian Grant Hoop Camp and the West Coast All-Star Camp.

Aaron and his wife of nine years, Julie, live in Vancouver and have a son Evan, who was born in the summer of 2006.

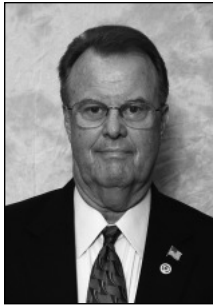

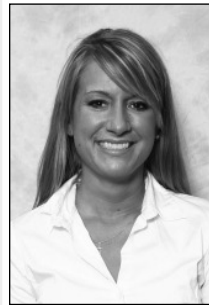

Joe was CU's starting point guard in the 1994-95 season and his 17 assists in one game set a Concordia single-game record. A 1995 graduate, Joe was a Cavalier assistant from 1998-2000, serving as the head junior varsity coach as well. He has also coached at North Marion High School and Warrenton High School. Joe returned to CU for the 2005-06 season from southern California, where he

worked with Los Angeles Clippers shooting coach Neil O'Schlay, and conducted individual workouts for NBA players, including Brian Grant, Chris Wilcox, Jason Kapono and Chris Kaman.

In her second season with the Cavs, **Christine Nelson** joined the Cavalier staff from Yelm (Washington) High School, where she was a teacher and coach for eight years, serving as the school's head volleyball coach, a junior varsity girls basketball and C boys basketball coach while at the school. Nelson earned her master's in education from Lesley University in Cambridge, Massachusetts.



Originally from Seattle, Wash., **Darcy Madison** joins the Cavalier women's basketball coaching staff after graduating from CU in 2007 with a degree in secondary education/physical education. A two-year basketball player for the Cavs during the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons, Madison was the team's leading scorer and captain as a senior. After graduating, Madison coached high school basketball at Evergreen High School in Vancouver, Wash., where she currently resides.

# 2007-08 PREVIEW

## YOUTH MOVEMENT KEY TO CAVS SUCCESS IN 07-08

CAVALLIER BASKETBALL

Every year coaches have to find ways to balance the loss of players due to graduation. For Concordia head coach **Brad Barbarick**, the task has increased exponentially as the coaching staff is faced with the challenge of substituting six seniors with six freshmen; turning over nearly half the roster to rookies.

Among the departed, the Cavs will be without its top three scorers from a season ago in **Ernie Rama**, **Jim Bertelson** and all-conference selection **Alex Hartman**. Combined, the trio accounted for over 40 points per game for over half of the team's offensive output.

Charged with guiding the team through the growing pains will be this year's senior class of **Jesse Alvarez**, **Cody Aker** and **Ryan Johnson**.

"This is a group that has outstanding leadership with our seniors," Barbarick said. "All three of our seniors are mature, team-oriented players that will put their own egos aside to benefit the team."

With that in mind, Barbarick stated, "One of the keys will still be how our young guys progress through the season."

### Guards

Leading the club on and off the court, Alvarez returns as the starter at the point guard position after seeing action in all 29 of the team's contests and nabbing starting nods on 23 occasions. A true protector of the basketball, Alvarez finished the season with an amazing 136 assists compared to 46 turnovers in 646 minutes of court time.

"He's a winner," Barbarick said. "He's not the biggest or the fastest out there, but Jesse has a very high basketball IQ. He thinks the game very well and has the greatest hands of any point guard I have ever coached."

Playing alongside Alvarez, **Desmond Meray** will look to provide a scoring punch for the Cavs after sitting out all of last year due to injury.

An excellent defender and a slasher with the ball, Meray averaged 7.9 points per game two seasons ago while shooting a respectable 50.5 percent from the floor.

"Desmond is a very quick, athletic guard that can really get to the basket," Barbarick said. "We will need him to knock down shots and be a leader for us on the perimeter defensively."

Returner **Ryan Murray** gives the Cavs a second option at both spots with his ability as a long-ranged threat.

"His role is going to be to provide an offensive spark," Barbarick said.

Rounding out the position group is junior **Eric Hamilton**, sophomore **Connor Hamblton**, sophomore transfer **Steven Vaughan** and true freshman **Trevor Schwanz**.

"Hamilton has paid his dues with the program and will look for more opportunities to contribute after working hard in the offseason. Vaughan is a newcomer that can get to the free throw line by drawing contact."

Hamblton appeared in eight games as a freshman last season and has worked to improve his strength with an

aim to become a fixture in the rotation.

The Cavs received its first blow of the season when **Dustin Hiebert**, a 6-foot-6 shooting ace, was lost for the year after sustaining an injury in practice.

### Forwards

A three-year contributor, Aker brings over 50 games of starting experience to the squad. Last season, Aker nearly double his scoring rate from his sophomore campaign with 8.7 points per game, while securing 5.3 rebounds per game.

"Cody is extraordinary it making big plays. He is also our best interior defender. He creates havoc with his energy," Barbarick said.

A fellow senior, Johnson returns for his second season with the Cavs after posting 6.9 points and 3.7 rebounds per game last season. Johnson possesses the versatility to play center when necessary but also can step out and shoot the three.

Paired with the seniors, freshmen **Sergio Rosario** and **Jason Yecny** will immediately jump in when called upon while learning the system in their first season.

The coaching staff regarded Rosario as a good finisher around the basket but can also pull up for a mid-range jumper while Yecny was described as an outstanding jumper with deceptive athleticism that can be used to guard a variety of opponents.

### Centers

The reigning conference Freshman of the Year, Ochs will look to build upon an outstanding season after leading the team in rebounds at 6.6 boards per game. Ochs also led the squad by shooting 53.8 percent from the floor while averaging 5.6 points per game.

"Matt has a tremendous nose for the ball. He pursues well by understanding how shots come off the rim and by puts himself in perfect position," Barbarick said.

Joining Ochs in the middle will be freshmen **Daniel Scheetz** and **Richard Smith**.

A two-time prep high jump champion, Scheetz has a tremendous shot-blocking presence while Smith brings inside toughness and intensity to the team.

## SENIOR-LADEN SQUAD PUSHES CAVS TO SIXTH SPOT IN CCC

CAVALIER BASKETBALL

Coming off a disappointing 12-18 season in 2005-06, the five seniors on the Concordia men's basketball team put it on their shoulders to reverse the outcome totals in their final season in the Navy and White.

Led by the quintet, with each member registering significant minutes in the team's 11-player rotation, the Cavaliers increased its win total by four with a 16-13 season culminating in a first-round loss in the Cascade Collegiate Conference tournament.

Staying on campus proved to be a key for the group as CU managed a 11-5 record while protecting their home court inside the Cavalier Gymnasium, including a stellar 6-1 mark in non-conference action.

Providing the offensive punch for Concordia, the senior trio of **Alex Hartman**, **Ernie Rama** and **Jim Bertelson** accounted for 49.5 percent of the team's scoring with a combined 1,122 points.

Opening the year at home against future CCC foe Northwest Christian, a second-half barrage after a tie at intermission sparked the Cavs to five straight wins to start the season.

An immediate rematch with the Beacons, this time in Eugene, Ore., turned out to be a more difficult task via a one-point victory with the aid of 49 combined points from Hartman and Rama.

Concordia would tack on home wins against Cal Baptist, Cal State-East Bay and Walla Walla College before venturing out on the road again.

The change of venues quickly altered the course of the season as CU dropped four straight, three of which were by seven points or less.

After a win at Multnomah Bible College on Dec. 14 and a loss at home against Albertson on Dec. 19, Concordia seemed to right the ship with five wins in the next six matches to move to 11-7 on the season.

Starting the stretch with the team's first conference win, a 71-69 battle against Eastern Oregon, CU followed with a 23-point bashing of Pacific Lutheran and an 11-point comeback win at Corban College to enter the heart of the conference schedule with additional momentum.

An eight-point blip to start the new year at Northwest on Jan. 5, Concordia followed with two additional wins including a 73-53 outcome against Evergreen State behind a sea-

son-high 17 points from **Ryan Johnson**.

With six players scoring in double figures, CU easily dispatched Cascade 90-68 on Jan. 13 before finishing the season with four wins and six losses, all via two-game streaks.

After defeats against Eastern Oregon and Albertson, CU managed wins versus Corban and Evergreen before another set of back-to-back losses.

Resting at 14-11 entering the final portion of the regular season, the Cavs once again reeled in consecutive wins with Hartman supplying 25 points in a 103-79 win against Cascade on Feb. 10 and 31 points against Southern Oregon on Feb. 16.

A five-point loss in the finale against Oregon Tech guaranteed the Owls the No. 1 seed in the CCC tournament but made no impact on the Cavs No. 6 seed where they would face No. 3 Northwest in Kirkland, Wash.

The Eagles would make it a three-game sweep of the Cavs with an 80-68 win to advance to the league semifinals and ending the season for the Navy and White.

After averaging 19.6 points and 5.7 rebounds

per game, Hartman was named to the all-CCC team while freshman **Matt Ochs** was honored as the league's Freshman of the Year.

Also honored for their efforts, **Cody Aker** earned a spot on the conference's All-Defensive team and **Jesse Alvarez** was recognized as an NAIA Scholar Athlete for his work in the classroom.

## VETERAN AND ROOKIE MIX GIVES CAVALIERS A DANGEROUS SQUAD

CAVALIER BASKETBALL

Almost by definition, transitions aren't supposed to be easy journeys. In the first year of the **Aaron Christian** era at Concordia, the Cavaliers faced several challenges throughout the season on the way to a 9-22 record. But with all five starters returning and a handful of talented rookie additions, the 2007-08 edition of the team will look to surprise some folks in the Cascade Collegiate Conference.

"Last year our team had a lot of adversity," Christian said. "I was very proud of how our players handled the season and we all know that this has made us stronger."

It is easy to find optimism for the Cavaliers this season as the team returns its top four scorers and six of its top seven rebounders.

In all, the six returners tallied 115 starts a year ago, providing valuable on-court experience to ease the integration of the five-member freshmen class.

Looked upon to take the lead will

be the senior trio of **Denise Benedict**, **Kelsey Schaefer** and **Angie Woolhiser**. While juniors **Maryam Razavi**, the team's leading scorer last season, and **Joyce Oniah**, the conference's Freshman of the Year two years ago, will also provide a wealth of playing time to the team's young roster.

"The key will be to play consistently and have our players play to their roles and bring their individual strengths to the table," Christian said.

### Guards

Returning to the court as the team's point guard, Benedict has averaged more than 10 points per game in three years and 75 starts while wearing the Navy and White. Last season, Benedict hit career highs in field goal and free throw percentages while also upping her rebound numbers to just over five per game; almost double her average as a sophomore.

"A captain on the team, Denise works hard every day," Christian said. "She has the ability to attack the basket and to play quality on-ball defense."

In her first season with the Cavaliers, Razavi paced the team with 12.2 points per game. A consistent presence on offense, Razavi had a streak of 11 straight games in double figures to wind down the season, including the team's top two outputs of the season with 22-point efforts.

"Razavi's a great pure

shooter," Christian said. "She has good shooting form and a good release. She is a player that wants to continue to better her fundamental skills and that has shown in her improved defensive abilities."

Joining the two upperclassmen will be **Haley Roth** and **Madison Steinmetz**. Roth combines excellent ball handling abilities with decent range from the outside while Steinmetz brings the ability to run the floor and create shots within the paint.

### Forwards

Just like at the guard position, the Cavaliers will feature a pair of veterans paired with a pair of true freshmen.

After playing for Christian at Clark College, Schaefer turned in 26 starting nods in 31 contests for Concordia last season, averaging 5.8 points and 3.1 rebounds per game for the Cavs.

In her third season at CU, Woolhiser increased her totals in virtually every category from her first to her second season, highlighted by a team-leading 84.4 percent conversion rate at the free throw line.

"Kelsey understands what our philosophy is and what we are trying to instill here," Christian said. "A phenomenal athlete, she is our best overall defender that can rattle the opponents best player."

Rounding out the group is a pair of Washington products in **Danielle Clauson** and **Rachel Bristow**.

Clauson possesses a knack for finishing around the basket with either hand and Bristow arrives with strong defensive instincts in the inside and a high shooting percentage from long range.

### Centers

Giving the Cavs three options at the center position will be junior Oniah, sophomore **Ann Snodderly** and freshman **Sarah Eischen**.

After coming off an outstanding freshman season, Oniah returned with 7.6 points and 5.7 rebounds per game as a sophomore last season.

"Joyce isn't afraid of contact. She can jump out of the gym and has the ability to take over a game," Christian said.

The lone sophomore on the club, Snodderly was the league's leading shot blocker as a freshman last season. Also an effective scorer, the 6-foot-4 Snodderly registered 9.0 points per game as a rookie.

Coming to campus with tenacity on the boards and a variety of post moves around the basket, the coaching staff feels that Eischen has tremendous potential once she adjusts to the college game.

## LATE-SEASON RALLY PUSHES CAVS INTO CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

After opening the season at home with a 97-22 throttling of Walla Walla College on Nov. 7, things were looking good for the Concordia women's basketball team in head coach **Aaron Christian's** debut season with the Navy and White, but a five-game skid following that match quickly halted any momentum the Cavs might have enjoyed early in the season.

But although the team struggled with consistency for much of the year, a year in which 11 different players received starting nods, the women's hoops squad rallied in the final stretch of the season to secure a spot in the Cascade Collegiate Conference tournament.

With a balanced attack in the opener, which resulted in four Cavaliers reaching double figures in scoring, including a game-high 20 by **Ashley Baker**, Concordia easily handled Walla Walla College to start the year off with a victory.

On the road in Eugene, Ore., a week later, future conference foe Northwest Christian held the Cavs to 18 first-half points before a 61-44 win at the Morse Event Center.

Slow starts stymied Concordia in each of the next four matches before a trip to College Place, Wash., provided the team with a much-needed boost with another victory over Walla Walla, this time encouraged by six players in double figures for a 103-25 gap.

Sitting at 2-5, Concordia entered conference play at Oregon Tech on Dec. 1. Down six at the half, the Navy and White could not overcome the deficit, despite 12 points and 16 rebounds by **Ann Snodder-**

**ly** for the freshman's first career double double.

Continuing the same road trip a day later, CU would record its first league win of the season with a 65-59 rally at Southern Oregon. Down six at the break, **Denise Benedict** sparked the Cavalier offense with 17 points, 10 rebounds and five assists.

Hosting Lewis & Clark on Dec. 5, Benedict, Snodderly and the rest of the Cavs would record their first consecutive wins of the season, downing the Pioneers 58-53 to inch closer to the .500 mark with a 4-6 record.

Shooting for three straight, Concordia erased a six-point lead in the final minutes in a road game at Linfield College only to see the win escape their grasp by a successful Wildcat free throw with 16 seconds remaining.

The after effects of the Linfield heartbreaker started an eight-game slide for the Cavs, four of which ended within seven points.

Entering a new year, the Cavaliers saw new signs of life with a pair of close defeats on the road against conference foes.

Rejuvenated, Concordia toppled Northwest Christian in a rematch game on Jan. 9 and followed suit with home victories against Warner Pacific on Jan. 12 and Cascade on Jan. 13 for the team's first three-game streak.

Pushing the pace for the Cavs, **Maryam Razavi** scored a game-high 20 points in the Cascade win.

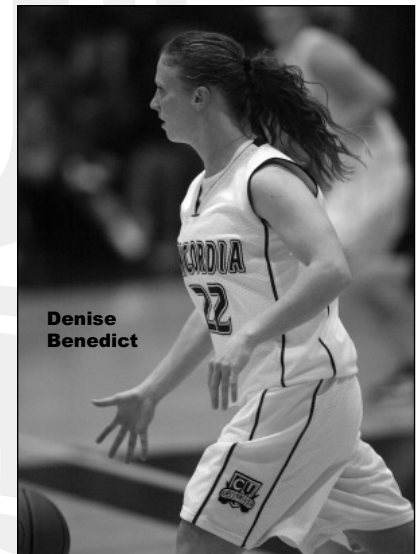
The streak would immediately be matched in the opposite fashion when CU

faced the top three squads in the CCC, starting with a 52-76 setback at Eastern Oregon on Jan. 19.

Fighting for the final CCC playoff spots, Concordia avenged two earlier conference losses with three-point triumphs over The Evergreen State on Feb. 2 and against Northwest on Feb. 3.

Warner Pacific would get its revenge on the Cavs in a 73-54 home win on Feb. 9 and Cascade followed suit the next day with a two-point escape despite 22 points by Razavi.

After seizing the eighth seed to the conference tournament, Concordia's season would come to an end with an 80-50 defeat against regular season and eventual tourney champion Corban on Feb. 20.

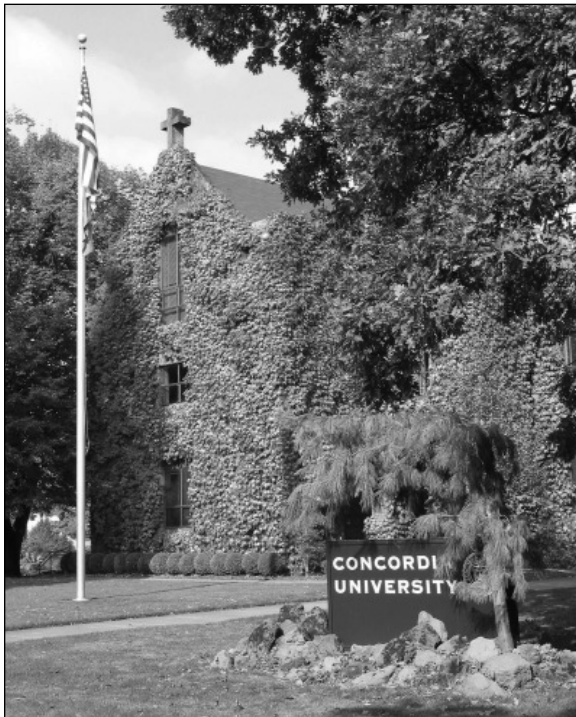

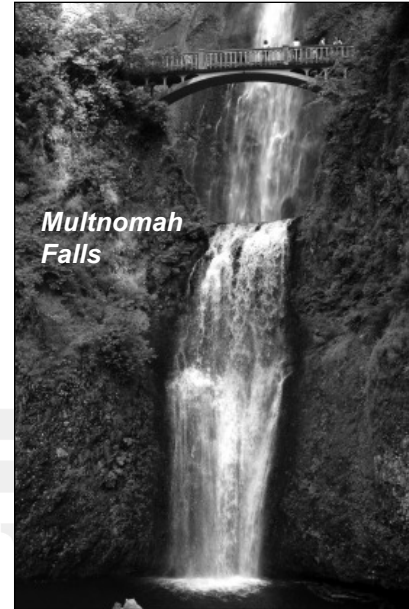

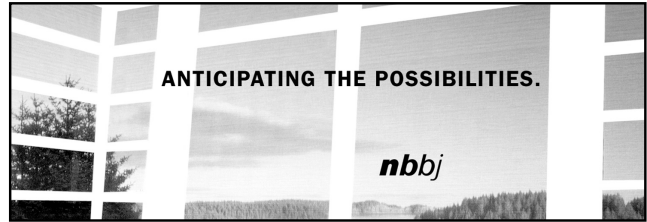
