RED AND GOLD FACES ROUGE ET OR IN TELUS VANIER CUP

Quebec City is a familiar place for the University of Calgary Dinos, who will see their season end on the Université Laval campus for the fourth time in six years as they face the host Rouge et Or in search of their fifth national title. The game kicks off Saturday at 1 p.m. local (11 a.m. MT), live on Sportsnet 360 and Radio-Canada – as the second- and third-ranked teams, both undefeated at 11-0, do battle at TELUS-UL Stadium with the Vanier Cup on the line.

THE MATCH-UP

The Dinos and Rouge et Or both enter the Vanier Cup undefeated, marking just the fifth time in the 49-year history of the championship game that both combatants go in undefeated after 2005 (Laurier vs. Saskatchewan), 1986 (UBC vs. Western), and 1966 (StFX vs. Waterloo Lutheran). Both are looking to become the 14th CIS program to complete an undefeated season, a feat last accomplished by Laval in 2010. It's the fourth meeting in the last six years between the Dinos and Rouge et Or, with Laval taking all three previous meetings.

FULL CIRCLE

The Dinos started the season with an exhibition contest at Laval, falling 35-3 in a game that was tightly contested in the early stages when Calgary had its full starting lineup on the field. Strangely enough, it's the third year in a row and the fifth time in eight years that Laval will face the team they took on in the pre-season for the Vanier Cup, while it's the fourth time in six years that Calgary's season will end on the Laval campus after the 2008 Uteck Bowl, followed by the 2009 and 2010 Vanier Cups.

THE WESTERN FACTOR

The Dinos made it to the Vanier Cup after a dominant 44-3 win last week in the Mitchell Bowl over previously undefeated, No. 1-ranked Western. It stretched the Dinos' all-time record over the Mustangs to 4-1 after previous wins in 1985, 1988, and 1995 – and in all three of those seasons, Calgary captured the Vanier Cup. The 1985 and 1995 Western games came in the national final, while the 1988 Central Bowl win in London, Ont. sent Calgary on to face Saint Mary's for the Vanier Cup at Varsity Stadium in Toronto.

HOME COOKIN'

Saturday's Vanier Cup will be the first road game for the Dinos in 50 days. Calgary finished 4-0 on the road, most recently a 24-12 win over Saskatchewan on Friday, Oct. 4. After the Thanksgiving Day bye, the Dinos finished the regular season with two more home games, followed by three playoff contests to total five consecutive home weekends. Calgary is 38-2 in its last 40 games at McMahon Stadium and gets set to face a team that hasn't lost at home in nearly a decade in Laval. The Dinos are 7-16 on the road all-time in the postseason, with the last away win coming in the 2009 Uteck Bowl in Halifax against Saint Mary's.

THE COACHES

Head coaches Blake Nill and Glen Constantin are certainly no strangers. They have faced off nine times before, including the 2003 and 2010 Vanier Cups – a 14-7 and 29-2 Laval victories, respectively. Nill is 2-7 against Constantin and 2-8 against Laval all-time, with another Vanier Cup loss coming in 1999. The 2003 Vanier Cup came while Nill was the head coach at Saint Mary's University.

In 2009, Nill along with Queen's bench boss Pat Sheahan simultaneously became the first CIS coaches to lead two different programs to Vanier Cup appearances. Nill has another opportunity to become the first CIS coach to WIN Vanier Cup titles with two different programs after winning back-to-back championships in 2001 and 2002 with Saint Mary's. Nill is wrapping up his eighth season as head coach of the Dinos and, since taking over the reins in 2006, has posted an overall record of 47-17, including an 15-6 mark in the playoffs. Nill's Dinos have won six consecutive Hardy Cups, emblematic of the Canada West championship – a new record in Canada West, surpassing a four-year run by Saskatchewan in the 1930s.

COMPLETING THE CYCLE

The Dinos added to their Canada West record, winning their sixth straight Hardy Cup title this year by defeating the Manitoba Bisons. That win completed the cycle for the Dinos, who have beaten a different opponent in each of those six years: Simon Fraser (2008), Saskatchewan (2009), Alberta (2010), UBC (2011), Regina (2012), and Manitoba (2013). Additionally, last week's Mitchell Bowl completed a full Bowl game rotation for the Dinos, who have now played each other conference home and away in national semi-final action over the last six years – finishing with a record of 3-3 along the way.

THE ROAD TO THE VANIER CUP

The Regular Season

Things certainly didn't start out all that well for the Dinos. After losing the vast majority of the starting lineup from the 2012 Mitchell Bowl at McMaster, the Dinos headed to Vancouver to open the season at UBC on Aug. 31. After throwing a touchdown pass in the third quarter of the game, the reigning Canada West MVP, Eric Dzwilewski, came up limping and was removed from the game with a broken foot – an injury from which he has still not returned. Thrust into the starter's role, backup QB Andrew Buckley calmly took the team over and, thanks to the first of many spectacular runs by Mercer Timmis on the season, helped the Dinos score 10 points in the final four minutes of the game to break a 31-31 tie and take a 41-31 win over the Thunderbirds.

A week later, Buckley got his first start and led the Dinos to a 34-27 win on the road at Regina, though Calgary did need to knock away a last-second pass in the end zone to secure the victory. Coming home to face the Saskatchewan Huskies for their home opener, the Dinos scored 15 unanswered points in the third quarter thanks to a pair of Jake Harty touchdowns, thrilling a raucous KICKOFF crowd at McMahon Stadium with a 36-24 win over their longtime rivals. A week later, Buckley threw for 512 yards in a 48-24 win over Manitoba as the Dinos shot out to a 4-0 record at the halfway point.

Timmis scored four touchdowns as the Dinos thumped Alberta 76-21 on the road in week 5, setting up the opportunity for Calgary to clinch first place on Oct. 4 at Saskatchewan – the last time the Dinos played away from McMahon Stadium. Timmis' season-long 80-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter sealed a tight game for the Dinos, who clinched first place with a 24-12 victory and headed into the bye 6-0.

Two weeks later back at home, Timmis became Canada West's single-season touchdown king with three more scores in a 46-27 romp over the Regina Rams. And on Oct. 25, the 2013 Dinos put the finishing touches on their first-ever undefeated season with a 34-17 win over the UBC Thunderbirds.

The Playoffs

For the second year in a row, the Dinos opened the postseason by facing the same team they had beaten the previous week, with both games coming at home. Calgary fell behind early 17-0 in a blizzard to UBC in the semi-final but rallied to take a halftime lead and, ultimately, dispatch the Thunderbirds 42-28. Under much better conditions a week later, the Dinos captured the program's 15th Canada West championship with a 43-28 win over Manitoba, led by a career-high 279-yard performance by Timmis, to earn the right to host the Mitchell Bowl.

The Bowl Game

The Canada West title gave the Dinos the right to host the Centaur Mitchell Bowl, their third home Bowl game in four years after previously hosting the Mitchell in 2010 and 2011. Facing the No. 1-ranked Mustangs for the first time since 1995, the Dinos were dominant throughout the contest, jumping out to a 17-0 lead and keeping the nation's most explosive offence under wraps all day. Western managed just three points on the day in a 44-3 Calgary win that saw the Dinos dominate in every aspect of the game – especially on special teams. They put together two fumble recoveries on punt returns, an 80-yard punt return touchdown by Rashaun Simonise, a blocked field goal, and two fake punts on another cold, snowy day at McMahon Stadium.

Doctor Cassama added a 71-yard interception return touchdown after taking the ball from teammate Brad Friesen, who had picked off the errant pass, while Timmis scored another long TD – this one from 41 yards – to go with his 16-carry, 139-yard rushing performance, earning MVP honours in the Mitchell Bowl. The Dinos out-muscled Western throughout the game, with OUA MVP Will Finch forced to leave the contest due to a hip injury after being held to just 105 passing yards in the game.

THE OFFENCE

Timmis and Buckley are the two main stories on offence, but a young but effective offensive line has flown under the radar for most of the year. Three players – LT Jordan Filippelli, RG Ryan Preuter, and RT Braden Schram – started the season with a combined zero games of CIS experience, yet still managed to open big holes for Timmis and protect Buckley in the pocket. The line is anchored by veterans Sean McEwen and Sukh Chung, both of whom earned conference all-star selection.

Buckley took over from Dzwilewski and put up impressive numbers all season, leading the Dinos to their first-ever undefeated season and, now, a berth in the Vanier Cup. The

kinesiology student, Canada West's nominee for the Russ Jackson award who shared the all-star nod at quarterback, has a pedigree of success coming out of Calgary's Rundle College and has yet to lose a game as a starting quarterback in CIS.

Buckley's receivers were a mix of veteran talent and explosive youth. The reliable Chris Dobko, one of just two fifth-year seniors on the team, broke Don Blair's school record for career receptions and continues to be a go-to inside man for the Dinos. He's joined by the athletic Jake Harty, who had a big game in the Mitchell Bowl. On the outside, Canada West Rookie of the Year Rashaun Simonise has explosive speed.

Timmis, of course, has been the offensive catalyst for the Dinos all season long. He led the nation with 1,157 rushing yards on the year, setting new school and conference records – again, breaking those held by Don Blair – in both rushing (18) and all-purpose (19) touchdowns on the season. Timmis is the Canada West MVP and nominee for the Hec Crighton Trophy.

All-stars: Buckley (QB), Timmis (RB), McEwen (C), Chung (G), Dobko (SB).

THE DEFENCE

Calgary had to replace 10 of 12 starters on defence, and the unit has continued to improve as the season has progressed. Doctor Cassama, who took over Mike Edem's spot at will linebacker, followed in Edem's footsteps to win the Canada West defensive MVP award, while a young defensive line anchored by all-star Tyler Langlais performed admirably for Calgary. In the secondary, halfback Cyril Iwanegbe had a breakout season with 33.5 tackles, while corner Adam Laurensse had a solid first year in CIS, finishing tied for the Canada West lead with four picks.

All-stars: Langlais (DE), Cassama (LB), Spoletini (SLB), Iwanegbe (HB), Laurensse (CB).

THE SPECIAL TEAMS

Calgary's special teams were a huge factor in the Mitchell Bowl, but have also been strong throughout the season. Placekicker Johnny Mark is a two-time All-Canadian (2011, 2012) and was again the most accurate kicker in the conference this year, while Simonise is a threat in the return game.

All-stars: Mark (PK).

THE GAME NOTES

- The athletic teams at the University of Calgary have been officially the DINOS since 1998, when the name was changed from Dinosaurs. References to the Dinosaurs should be limited to teams that competed BEFORE 1998.
- A Dinos win Saturday would be the 46th CIS national championship in the University of Calgary's history and the fifth Vanier cup title since the program started in 1964. Calgary has also captured 136 Canada West conference titles in that span, including 15 conference football championships.
- Only two players remain on the Calgary roster from the 2010 Vanier Cup game against Laval, receiver Chris Dobko and quarterback Eric Dzwilewski. Dobko is the only player that will play in the game, with Dzwilewski – who was named the 2010 CIS rookie of the year in his previous trip to Quebec City – still out with the broken foot he suffered in Week 1 at UBC. Dobko led the Dinos with 54 all-purpose yards in that game, all on kickoff returns.
- One Dinos player was born in Quebec, receiver-turned-defensive-back Élie Bouka. Bouka was born in Laval, Que. and joined the Dinos after starring at Cégep Montmorency.
- The Dinos will wear their road white Nike jerseys in the Vanier Cup. It's the sixth time in their nine appearances the Dinos have worn white, with wins in 1985 and 1988 and losses in 1993, 2009, and 2010.
- The trip to Quebec City is the Dinos' first road trip since Oct. 4 when they defeated Saskatchewan 24-12 in Saskatoon. After the bye week on Thanksgiving, the Dinos played five consecutive games at McMahon Stadium, culminating in last week's Mitchell Bowl win over Western. Kickoff on Saturday will be the first road game for the Dinos in 50 days.
- Calgary is the last team to lose the Vanier Cup to a team playing at home (1993, Toronto; 2010, Laval)
- Nill is the third Dinos coach to lead the team to a Vanier Cup appearance after Mike Lashuk (1975) and Peter Connellan (1983, 1985, 1988, 1993, 1995).

Blake Nill was appointed the fifth Head Coach in Dinos history on Feb. 23, 2006.

An alumnus of the University of Calgary, Blake played football for the Dinos from 1980 through 1982 before turning professional with Montreal in 1983 after being selected 19th overall in the CFL draft. He played in the CFL from 1983-88 with Montreal, Hamilton and Winnipeg. A native of Hanna, Alberta, Nill has 25 years of football experience as an athlete and as a coach.

Blake joined the Dinos after coaching at Saint Mary's University in Halifax, N.S. While coaching the Saint Mary's Huskies he posted a regular season record of 49 wins and 15 losses (77%) and post-season record of 12 wins and five losses (71%). During that time the Huskies were Vanier Cup Champions in 2001 and 2002 and were finalists on two other occasions. He coached the Huskies to a record six consecutive Atlantic University Sport Championships (1999-2004).

Nill won the Frank Tindall Trophy as CIS Coach of the Year in 1999 and was a finalist in 2000, 2001, 2003, and 2009.

He is actively involved in the Canadian University Football Coaches Association (CUFCA), serving as President for several seasons. Blake was instrumental in the implementation of the interlocking schedule between the AUS and the Quebec conference.

Nill started his coaching career in August 1992 as the Defensive Coordinator for St. Francis Xavier, a position he held until joining Saint Mary's in February 1998. From April 1990 through July 1992 Nill served as a youth care worker in Montreal with the Shawbridge Youth Centre and the Alberta Solicitor General in Calgary.

Nill took undergraduate courses at the University of Calgary in both Physical Education and Economics graduating with Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia University in 1989. He graduated from St. Francis Xavier University with a Bachelor of Science and a Masters of Education. In addition, Blake has attained his Level III National Coaching Certification (NCCP).

Blake served as a guest coach with the Calgary Stampeders in 1997 and 1998, the Ottawa Renegades in 2002 and 2003, and the Edmonton Eskimos in 2007. In addition he served as a member of the coaching staff for the Canadian Under-19 team at the Global World Football Challenge held in conjunction with Super Bowl XLI in Florida in January 2007 and coached the linebackers for Team Canada's entry at the IFAF World Junior Football Championships in Canton, Ohio in July 2009.

Centaur Mitchell Bowl – November 16, 2013 Calgary 44 Western 3



CALGARY – The third-ranked University of Calgary Dinos held the top offence in the nation to just three points, capturing Saturday's CIS Mitchell Bowl with a 44-3 victory over the No. 1 Western Mustangs in a national semi-final stunner at McMahon Stadium.

Facing the Mustangs juggernaut that had rolled through the Ontario conference with an average of 57.2 points per game, 647.8 yards of total offence, and 422 passing yards, the Dinos needed an all-out effort in all phases of the game and dominated Western, which managed just a single field goal and 256 yards of offence on the snowy turf in Calgary.

In the battle between the Hec Crighton nominees from Canada West and the OUA in Calgary running back Mercer Timmis and Western pivot Will Finch, it was Timmis who had the upper hand, picking up yet another 100-yard game to finish with 139 yards on 16 carries, including a 41-yard touchdown romp early in the fourth quarter.

Finch, on the other hand, was hassled relentlessly by a physical Calgary defence and was injured in the opening half, favouring his hip throughout the game. After being helped to the dressing room in the late stages of the second quarter, he did reappear in the third at the controls for Western but couldn't get the passing game together, completing just nine of 20 passes for 105 yards and an interception. His replacement, Blake Huggins, fared little better, going 1-11 for 1 yard and one pick.

Calgary's special teams were a huge difference in the game, producing a punt return touchdown, a blocked field goal, and a pair of fake punts to keep drives alive. They also benefitted from eight Western turnovers on the afternoon.

The Dinos jumped out to the early lead in the first quarter thanks to a Johnny Mark field goal after Calgary picked up a Western fumble on the Dinos' first punt of the game – a sign of things to come. The Dinos followed with a six-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off by a 15-yard TD pass from Andrew Buckley to Brett Blaszkowski, then got a spectacular 80-yard punt return touchdown from Canada West rookie of the year Rashaun Simonise to take a 17-0 lead just 10 minutes into the game.

After the teams traded field goals in the second quarter, Calgary took a 20-3 lead into the halftime break.

Jake Harty capped off an 11-play, 80-yard drive midway through the third quarter for Calgary with a 24-yard touchdown pass from Buckley to make it 27-3. Then, early in the fourth, Calgary capitalized on another Western turnover. After the Mustangs gambled on third-and-10 on their own 41-yard line, the Dinos took over – and one play later, Timmis was in the end zone with yet another score in what continues to be a remarkable season for the sophomore from Burlington, Ont.

The Dinos added 10 more points in the fourth quarter to close out the game: a 71-yard interception return major by Canada West defensive MVP Doctor Cassama, followed by another Johnny Mark field goal.

Western turned over the ball eight times in the contest: four fumbles, two interceptions, and twice on downs. Yannick Harou's 17-carry, 87-yard performance was tops for the Mustangs along the ground, while Brian Marshall was Western's top receiver with three catches for 45 yards.

Calgary was led by Timmis' 139-yard rushing effort, with backup Cuong Thai Lieu getting into the act with 93 yards on 12 carries of his own. Buckley had an efficient day, completing 18 of 27 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns, finding Harty seven times for 79 yards while senior slotback Chris Dobko hauled in five catches for 80 yards.

Rookie linebacker Brad Friesen was the top defensive player for the Dinos with eight total tackles, while Pawel Kruba led Western with a seven-tackle outing.

NOTES: Western was only held under 50 points in two previous games this season, setting a CIS record: 32 (OUA semi-final vs. McMaster) and 45 (at Laurier) ... the Dinos return to the Vanier Cup in Quebec City, having played in the game both previous times it was held there (2009, 2010) ... Calgary

improves to 38-2 in its last 40 games at McMahon Stadium ... it was the first game between Calgary and Western since the 1995 Vanier Cup, and the Dinos now hold a 4-1 lead in the all-time series against the Mustangs ... Calgary returns to the Vanier Cup for the ninth time in history, with wins in 1983, 1985, 1988, and 1995 and losses in 1975, 1993, 2009, and 2010 ...

Calgary 43 Manitoba 28



CALGARY – Newly crowned Canada West MVP Mercer Timmis ran for 279 yards as the University of Calgary Dinos captured their sixth consecutive Canada West championship with a 43-28 win over the Manitoba Bisons Saturday in the 77th Hardy Cup.

It was a career day for Timmis, who was named the conference nominee for the Hec Crighton trophy earlier this week. The sophomore running back carried the ball 28 times for 279 yards – a school postseason record – and two touchdowns, accounting for nearly half of the Dinos' 623 yards of total offence in the game. His touchdowns came on a 27-yard romp on Calgary's opening drive of the game and a 33-yard scamper to put the game away in the fourth, giving him 22 total touchdowns in 10 games on the season.

The win gives Calgary its 15th conference championship in football and 136th Canada West title overall.

The Bisons were without star Anthony Coombs for the vast majority of the game, and the lack of his big-play threat hurt the visitors. Still, Manitoba had its opportunities with Kienan LaFrance taking over in the backfield and running for 95 yards, adding 41 yards through the air – including a 21-yard touchdown pass late in the first quarter. But even when the Bisons seemed to get close and looked like they would come within striking distance, Calgary responded with more points to keep the game out of reach.

Timmis' first TD capped a seven-play, 92-yard opening drive for the Dinos, who would add a safety just over a minute later. LaFrance's major in the final seconds of the first quarter brought the Bisons within a pair at 9-7.

Calgary put it out of reach, however, in the final five minutes of the half. IT started with a great catch by Jake Harty behind coverage deep in the end zone for a seven-yard major from Andrew Buckley, followed minutes later by a 57-yard bomb by Buckley to conference rookie of the year Rashaun Simonise. And on the final play of the half, Johnny Mark made a 43-yard field goal to put the Dinos up 26-7 at the break.

Andrew Smith caught his first of two TD passes early in the third quarter as the Bisons converted on a Calgary turnover to pull within a dozen, but the Dinos responded right away when Cuong Thai Lieu bolted 42 yards to the end zone to restore a 19-point advantage. A 37-yard field goal by Mark and Timmis' second major of the day rounded out the scoring for Calgary, while Matt Sawyer and Smith both scored in the fourth for Manitoba from 37 and 13 yards out, respectively.

Jordan Yantz completed 18 of 40 passes for 277 yards, four touchdowns, and two interceptions in a losing cause for Manitoba. Nic Demski was his top target with 85 yards, while Sawyer hauled in a team-high five catches for 76 yards. Yantz added 60 rushing yards as well, leading the Bisons to 421 yards of total offence. Defensively, Ranji Atwall had nine tackles to lead Manitoba, with David Onyemata adding 7.5 more.

For the Dinos, Timmis' 279 yards was certainly the most striking statistic, averaging exactly 10 yards per carry in the contest. Buckley completed 19 of 33 passes for 262 yards and a pair of touchdowns, with reliable fifth-year receiver Chris Dobko catching seven of those for 87 yards – both team highs. Simonise and Jake Harty each had more than 50 yards receiving, while Thai Lieu ran the ball seven times for 57 yards and the major.

Returning to the lineup after missing last week's semi-final, halfback Cyril Iwanegbe led the Dinos with 8.5 tackles, while Adam Laurensse and Thomas Spoletini – both named conference all-stars earlier this week – recorded interceptions on the afternoon.

The Dinos now get set to face the nation's top-ranked team, the undefeated Western Mustangs, in next week's Mitchell Bowl – a daunting task for a young team.

Canada West Semi-Final – November 2, 2013

Calgary 42 UBC 28



CALGARY –After falling victim to a red-hot start by UBC, the third-ranked University of Calgary Dinos overcame 17- and six-point deficits to defeat the Thunderbirds 42-28 in the second of two Canada West semifinals Saturday afternoon at McMahon Stadium.

The victory moves Calgary (8-0, 1-0) into the 77th Hardy Cup, where they will look to extend their run of five consecutive Canada West championships. The Dinos will host Manitoba (5-3, 1-0) for the conference title next Saturday.

It was the third victory in as many games for the Dinos over the Thunderbirds this season, but it was certainly the most hard-fought. UBC blazed out to a 17-0 lead in just over 10 minutes of the first quarter, by far the largest deficit the Dinos faced all season. It started with a 38-yard bomb from Carson Williams to Alex Morrison on UBC's first offensive play of the game to set up a one-yard Greg Bowcott touchdown, which they followed up with a 15-yard field goal by Quinn Van Gylswyk and, then, a 35-yard TD strike from Williams to Josh Kronstrom on the first play after Calgary quarterback Andrew Buckley was intercepted.

But Calgary slowly chipped away, starting with an 8-yard touchdown strike from Buckley to Jake Harty on the final play of the opening quarter. A safety and three Johnny Mark field goals later, the Dinos held an 18-17 lead at half time.

The second half started as the first had, with UBC taking the early momentum. On their second possession of the third quarter, the Thunderbirds started right at midfield. Two runs by Brandon Deschamps later, they were in the end zone with a 24-18 lead.

Again, however, the Dinos would come back – this time for good. Another field goal by Mark brought them within three, and Mercer Timmis finally found the end zone 98 seconds into the fourth to give Calgary the lead for good.

UBC, however, still had some fight left. On the next offensive play, Williams found Patrick Bull for a massive 67-yard gain to set up the Thunderbirds on the Calgary 15-yard line – but only after a touchdown-saving tackle by Dinos linebacker Thomas Spoletini. UBC ended up with only a field goal, however, and Timmis' second major of the night came on the next Calgary drive to put it out of reach.

Buckley rounded out the scoring with a 10-yard touchdown run in the final minute.

The footing was unsteady at best and the yard lines and hash marks were virtually undetectable, but the teams still managed to combine for nearly 900 yards of offence. Deschamps had another big night with 184 yards on 22 carries, while Williams picked up 256 passing yards on just 13 completions in a losing cause for UBC. Bull was the game's top receiver with six catches for 134 yards.

Timmis was hard at work for the Dinos all night, touching the ball 36 times. Of those, 32 came along the ground for 164 yards and two touchdowns, while he added four catches for 44 yards to that total. Buckley completed 22 of 31 passes for 218 yards, along with one touchdown and one interception. His top target was Chris Dobko, who caught eight passes for 78 yards.

Defensively, Yianni Cabylis had a monster night for the Thunderbirds with 15 solo and 16 total tackles, while Bryan Rideout added nine. Calgary's defence was led by Cory Roboch's 9.5 tackles, with Tanner Doll chipping in with 5.5 as well.

Mark had a solid night kicking for Calgary, especially given the snowy field conditions. He went 4-for-4 on field goals from 41, 34, 10, and 30 yards while punting for a 41.8-yard average. Van Gylswyk made good on both his field goal tries and averaged 37.2 yards on six punts.

The only team left standing between the Dinos and their sixth straight conference title are the Manitoba Bisons, who edged Saskatchewan 37-36 in a wild semifinal Friday night in Winnipeg. The Bisons will be the sixth different opponent to face Calgary in the conference final since 2008, and they have an explosive offence that the Dinos will need to be ready for.

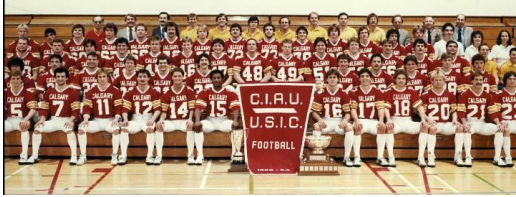
PREVIOUS VANIER CUP APPEARANCES

1975: Ottawa 14 Calgary 9

Ottawa literally grounded out a 14-9 victory over Calgary behind the powerful running of Neil Lumsden, who finished with 169 yards on 27 carries. Lumsden, the Ted Morris winner, failed to score a touchdown but did add two conversions in the winning effort. Ottawa's total of 54 carries, half of them provided by Lumsden, is third in the Vanier Cup record book.

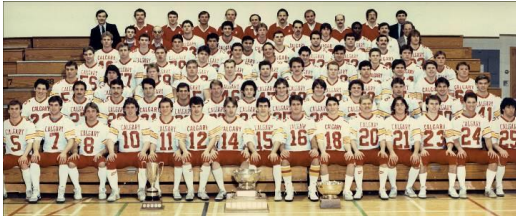
1983: Calgary 31 Queen's 21



Calgary's dynamic duo, Hec Crighton Trophy winner Greg Vavra and Tim Petros, the Ted Morris Trophy recipient, led the Dinosaurus to a 31-

21 victory over Queen's. Petros rushed 25 times for 260 yards, a Vanier Cup record, a Vavra kicked five field goals and extra points (a record) as well as completing 20 out of 37 passes for two TDs and 307 yards. Ross O'Doherty rushed for 135 yards and a TD on 16 carries for Queen's.

1985 – Calgary 25 Western 6



The Calgary Dinosaurus took their second national championship in three years, this time defeating Western 25-6 for the Vanier Cup. A

tough Calgary defence led by Presidents' Trophy winner Darcy Kopp held Western to only 38 yards rushing. Western's Steve Samways compensated with a record 41 passing attempts for 279 yards, but a first quarter TD was all the Mustangs could muster. Calgary's Elio Geremia was selected offensive player of the game based on his one touchdown, 104 yards rushing and two catches for 22 yards.

1988 – Calgary 52 Saint Mary's 23



With Saint Mary's No. 1 quarterback declared medically unfit to play, Bill Scollard, the Huskies' top wide receiver was pressed into action as a

replacement for Hec Crighton trophy winner, Chris Flynn.

For 52 minutes Scollard, who completed 27 of 47 attempts (a Vanier Cup record), kept the Huskies in the game against the University of Calgary Dinosaurus. The Cinderella finish was not to be however. With eight minutes left to play the Huskies, who appeared to have gained the momentum and were moving down field to attempt to tie the game had their hopes dashed when Dave Heaton of the Dinosaurus grabbed an interception and took it 75 yards for a Calgary touchdown and a 38- 23 lead.

Momentum switched to the Dinos who went on to add two more touchdowns for a 52-23 victory and their third Vanier Cup victory in six years. This marked the last Vanier Cup played at Varsity Stadium. 13 Vanier Cup records were broken or tied, the 75 points scored being the highest total to date.

1993 – Toronto 37 Calgary 34

The U of T Varsity Blues captured the 29th Vanier Cup championship in a game to be remembered.

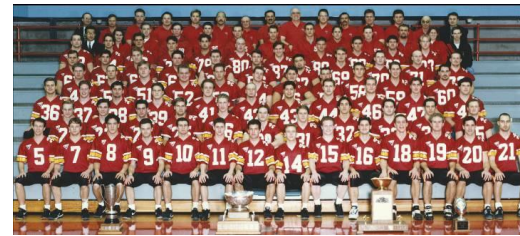
Diminutive Glen McCausland scored on an 81-yard punt return, a Vanier Cup record, to pace Toronto to an exciting 37-34 victory over the Calgary Dinosaurus. Calgary kicker Bruce Parsons could have sent the game into overtime with 10 seconds remaining, but his 22-yard field goal attempt was blocked by the Blues' John Raposo.

The Blues took a 23-7 lead in the third quarter, but Calgary rallied to make it 23-21. It was then that McCausland, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player, took matters into his own hands. The five-foot-six, 165-pound star made a scintillating punt return 28 seconds into the fourth frame for a touchdown. Toronto linebacker Barry McCamus then put the Blues ahead 37-21 at 3:29 when he scored on a 22-yard interception return.

Calgary again rallied, thanks to Chris Lewis' one-yard touchdown run at 7:30 and John Kalin's 13-yard scoring strike to James Buchanan at 12:09. These scores cut Toronto's lead to 37-34. Calgary got the ball at its 45-yard line with less than a minute remaining after a surprising third-down Toronto gamble failed. Kalin guided Calgary to the Toronto 15 prior to Raposo's block.

The win was Toronto's first Vanier Cup title since 1965.

1995 – Calgary 54 Western 24



The SkyDome was no longer the SkyDoom to the University of Calgary Dinosaurus who won a Vanier Cup for the record, or should we say records. A

54-24 victory over the defending champion Western Mustangs put to rest the memory of the team's disheartening loss to Toronto in 1993. Calgary's receiver Don Blair, the 1995 Hec Crighton winner, put on quite a show by breaking two Vanier Cup records with 24 points and four touchdowns.

Western Ontario took an early 7-0 lead at 8:21 of the first quarter on a 17-yard pass from QB Warren Goldie to Tom McConnell, much to the delight of the partisan Mustang crowd of 29,178. Following a field goal by Calgary's Brian Mlachak, the Dinos took the lead and would not relinquish when Blair caught a 13-yard TD from starting QB, Jason Assen, who injured his throwing arm and would only return for the final minute of play. Sasha Blaskovich filled in for an outstanding debut by completing 15 of 22 passes for 294 yards and three touchdowns. Calgary took a 26-10 lead at the half and then put it away in the third quarter scoring majors on each of their three possessions.

The Calgary defence silenced Western's star running back Sean Reade, limiting him to 81 yards on 21 carries. Western was more effective with fullback Jason McKibbin, who ran for 161 yards on 16 carries. Mustang's QB Warren Goldie, playing in his last game after five fabulous seasons, completed 11 of 25 attempts for 143 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions. In the end Calgary recorded the longest field goal, 50 yards, by Mlachak, a record seven touchdowns and 54 points, in addition to the Blair marks.

2009 – Queen's 33 Calgary 31

The Queen's Gaels scored 26 unanswered points to turn a 25-7 halftime deficit into a 33-31 victory over the Calgary Dinos in the 45th Vanier Cup at PEPS Stadium in Quebec City before a standing-room-only crowd of 18,628.

Gaels pivot Danny Brannagan earned the Ted Morris memorial trophy as the game MVP by completing 17 of 33 passes for 286 yards. He threw three touchdown passes and one interception. The Queen's defence generated five turnovers from Calgary, including two interceptions, a blocked field goal, and two fumbles – including one on what could have been the game-winning drive for Calgary late in the fourth quarter.

Erik Glavic amassed 354 passing yards on 23-of-35 passing in the losing effort for the Dinos. Anthony Parker snagged nine passes for 187 yards and a touchdown. On the ground, Matt Walter added 108 yards to the offence on nine carries, including a one-yard touchdown plunge in the first half.

2010 – Laval 29 Calgary 2







In a snow globe-like atmosphere at PEPS Stadium in Quebec City, the Laval Rouge et Or captured a record-tying sixth Vanier Cup title with a 29-2 win over the Calgary Dinos. In the most commanding defensive effort in Vanier Cup history, Laval held the powerful Calgary offence to just 140 yards offence.

Rouge et Or running back Sébastien Lévesque captured the Ted Morris Memorial Trophy as the game's MVP, racking up 168 yards on 30 carries and one touchdown. Calgary quarterback Erik Glavic struggled throughout the game, completing just six of 27 passes for 69 yards and one interception, while his receivers dropped several well-thrown balls in the wet and snowy conditions.
