DAN **VANHOOREN** Men's Basketball Head Coach 17th SEASON

Dan Vanhooren joined the Dinos in May 2000 and is the seventh head coach of the men's basketball program at the University of Calgary.

Since he took over the program, Vanhooren's Dinos have made a steady climb into elite status in CIS basketball. In just four years, he took a program that had not enjoyed a winning season in nearly a decade all the way to the conference title and within two points of the national final in 2004. It was Calgary's first Canada West championship since 1993, and their first-round victory at the Final 8 in Halifax was the Dinos' first national quarterfinal win in 38 years. The two-point semifinal loss came at the hands of the Carleton Ravens, who went on to win the CIS title.

In 2008 he coached the Dinos to their best conference record since 1976 (18-4) and played host to the Canada West Final Four in front of a sold-out Jack Simpson Gym. Eight years later, the Dinos won their sixth Canada West Championship and went on to compete in the national finals for the first time since 1966 against the Carleton Ravens. The Dinos finished with a silver medal.

Vanhooren moved to Calgary following a four-year stint as head coach of Medicine Hat College. In 2000, he coached the Rattlers to a bronze medal finish and was named the ACAC south coach of the year.

He played varsity basketball at the University of Alberta under the legendary Don Horwood. After three seasons with the Golden Bears, Vanhooren graduated with a Bachelor of Physical Education in 1993 and moved to graduate studies at the University of British Columbia. While attending UBC he worked for the NBA's Vancouver Grizzlies in their inaugural season, and he received his Master's of Human Kinetics in 1996.

Vanhooren is a certified NCCP Level III coach.






Mambi Diawara




Thomas Cooper


Jasdeep Gill




Dallas Karch




Max Eisele




Jhony Verrone


Sasha Pojuzina




Mitch Ligertwood




Jeff Rodenhutskors



"I actually can't remember losing a game against Lars," the new Dinos guard said. "I knew a lot of guys from that team and Lars was a key factor, especially in their last year."

"No friendship in the game right," Schlueter said. "Play as hard as you can and hope the better one wins."

and always had his eye on one day playing in the NCAA, Schlueter joined the Dinos and immediately made an impact, winning Canada West Rookie of the Year in 2015 and being named a third team all-star

last season as the Dinos won the conference championship and made it to the CIS final.

"We were just kidding always about it, that we would play with each other again," Eisele said. "He kept telling me how good it is over here and I was never really convinced"

"Then last year it became a little bit more serious."

Schlueter brought up the idea to head coach Dan Vanhooren, "Dan was really into the idea about bringing Max [to Canada] and he was getting more and more used to playing here," Schlueter said. "It worked out perfectly."

When Eisele touched down this summer, Schlueter greeted him at the airport before training that same day. And just as Schlueter got accustomed to a new school, city and country when he arrived, Eisele is doing the same — albeit — not alone.

Expectations are high for the Dinos as they look to repeat as conference champions and return to the national championship game. For Schlueter, that means taking on more of a leadership role.

"Just leading by example, try to do as best I can, keep people accountable, that's all stuff that I have to do and it's what people expect of me," he said.

While the third-year sharpshooter keeps people accountable, he and Eisele have also been keeping opponents — and sometimes teammates — guessing at times.

"I can tell him things in German and nobody knows what we're doing," Eisele said. "You can really show the opponent something you want to do, but say the exact opposite and it might work out, it's always fun to get messages in your game to play out your defender."

"I actually like everything about it, it's the full experience I hoped it would be," Eisele said. "The campus life, you've got so many opportunities to do something, I was talking to Dallas (Karch) about it and I asked — is it even possible to do everything during those five years?"

Then in the preseason, the moment they kidded and thought about for years came to be, as they suited up for the same team once again.

"I talked to Lars about it in the warmup, like this is actually happening," Eisele said, as the team would go on to beat Windsor 99-64. "I like our players, I like the intensity in practice, it's amazing, because we have so much competition, everybody just goes 100 per cent."

"Our teammates are getting annoyed already, like hey, it's just English in practice," Schlueter added.

Now that the days of competing against each other are over, they now share a common goal.

"We have such a deep group, we can sub people on and off the court without any interruptions, it's really great to see," Schlueter said. "I think we're capable of going all the way this year."

"I'm a person who hates to lose, I've always played on teams with great chances to win," Eisele said. "Every guy on our team, they're all winners who compete to win."

The Dinos make their fifth appearance at the Final 8 under Vanhooren in 2017, reaching the semifinal round in each of their previous trips: 2004, 2009, 2010, and 2016, as well as the national final in 2016 – their first gold medal game since 1966.

Under his leadership, the Dinos have captured three of their six Canada West titles: 2004, 2009, and 2016. Vanhooren captured his first career Canada West coach of the year award in 2014-15.
