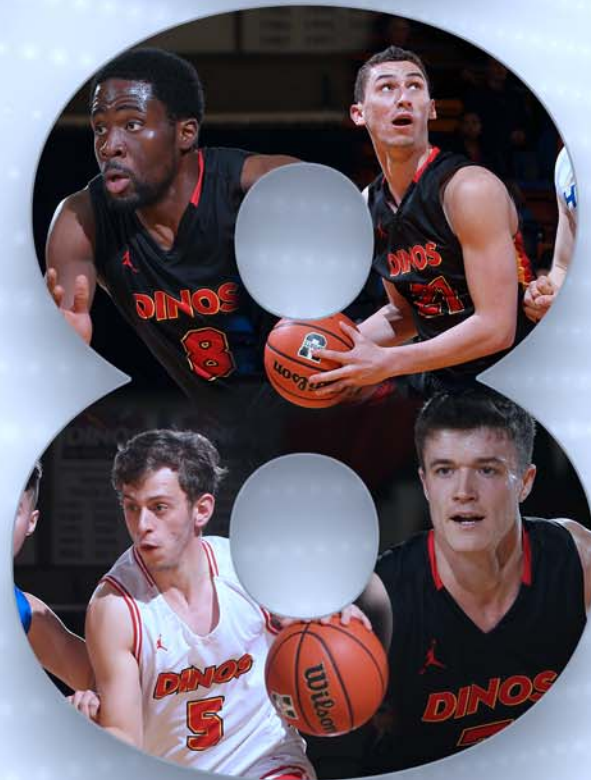

## MEN'S COACHES & SUPPORT



**DAN VANHOOREN**  
*Men's Basketball*  
**Head Coach**  
18<sup>th</sup> SEASON

Dan Vanhooren joined the Dinos in May 2000 and is the seventh head coach of the men's basketball program at the University of Calgary.

Since he took over the program, Vanhooren's Dinos have made a steady climb into elite status in CIS basketball. In just four years, he took a program that had not enjoyed a winning season in nearly a decade all the way to the conference title and within two points of the national final in 2004. It was Calgary's first Canada West championship since 1993, and their first-round victory at the Final 8 in Halifax was the Dinos' first national quarterfinal win in 38 years. The two-point semifinal loss came at the hands of the Carleton Ravens, who went on to win the CIS title.

In 2008 he coached the Dinos to their best conference record since 1976 (18-4) and played host to the Canada West Final Four in front of a sold-out Jack Simpson Gym. Eight years later, the Dinos won their sixth Canada West Championship and went on to compete in the national finals for the first time since 1966 against the Carleton Ravens. The Dinos finished with a silver medal.

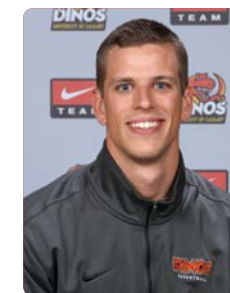
Vanhooren moved to Calgary following a four-year stint as head coach of Medicine Hat College. In 2000, he coached the Rattlers to a bronze medal finish and was named the ACAC south coach of the year.

He played varsity basketball at the University of Alberta under the legendary Don Horwood. After three seasons with the Golden Bears, Vanhooren graduated with a Bachelor of Physical Education in 1993 and moved to graduate studies at the University of British Columbia. While attending UBC he worked for the NBA's Vancouver Grizzlies in their inaugural season, and he received his Master's of Human Kinetics in 1996.

Vanhooren is a certified NCCP Level III coach.

# THE LIGHT

One day, University of Calgary Dinos teammates David Kapinga and Jhony Verrone are talking. Like his demeanor on the court, Verrone is serious, but the often-smiling Kapinga suggests altering his mood.

scoring load left behind after All-Canadian Thomas Cooper's departure, Kapinga will also take on even more of a role, orchestrating the team's small-ball, motion offense and setting the tone for its swarming, intense defense.

## DAVID KAPINGA'S JOURNEY TO CALGARY AND POINT GUARD PROMINENCE

"We're in hotel rooms for free, we're eating at Earl's right now, I'm getting a steak, you know what I mean?" he remembers telling his backcourt mate. "That's when I realized, this is what makes me a leader."

Kapinga has every reason to be so positive. Over the last two seasons, he has quietly turned into one of the best point guards in the conference and was named to Team Canada's FISU team this summer. During the 2016 season, he went from being a walk-on and the team's fourth point guard, to winning the starting role, doubling his scoring average in the playoffs en route to a conference championship and winning Team Player of the Game in the national quarterfinal. Then last season after shooting just under 26 per cent from three-point territory in 2016, he led the conference at 48 per cent, finished second in steals, fourth in assists and fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio. Now as Mambi Diawara is expected to pick up the

He didn't mind Cooper getting tons of attention, nor does he mind the prospect of the same with Diawara.

"I believe that it's a blessing for me to even be here," he said. "So I'm taking every opportunity."

Given his journey, it's easy to understand why.

Kapinga was born in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, growing up as civil war ravaged the country during the late 1990s. His family survived, eventually coming to Canada as refugees when he was five. They mostly lived in Gatineau, in between Ottawa at the beginning and Montreal at the end. With word of the strong economy out west, the family moved to Calgary when he was 12, where they still live today. But the adjustment wasn't easy as the family tried to settle and Kapinga became a leader early.

"My dad raised me to be a father in the family, so I was very, very selfless from a young

age," he said, the second of six children. "I always wanted to make sure that my siblings first had what they needed."

After his uncle introduced him to basketball, his skills developed at the CYDC basketball club and despite his prominent role in the family, he knew basketball would take him elsewhere. He went out on his own to play high school in Kentucky and after two years, played a year of prep at St. Louis Christian Academy. During that season, he went on a recruiting trip to Calgary, but for Kapinga it was more of an opportunity to visit family. When he gave a workout at the Jack Simpson Gymnasium, the most important person to watch new recruits was missing.

"Well the first visit, I wasn't even at," head coach Dan Vanhooren recalled, as it was organized by an assistant. "I saw it on video, which usually doesn't do anybody any justice."

Kapinga's plan was to stay in the States anyway and play Div. 1, so after his year in St. Louis, he enrolled at the NAIA's Union College in Kentucky, with the goal of making an NCAA Div. 1 team. The learning curve was steep and it took time to adapt to the intensity of the environment, but he eventually got accustomed. He had a strong second half and sure enough, Utah Valley was interested and his NCAA dream was in reach. All he needed was his coach to sign release papers.



The answer was no.

"Wait, what?" Kapinga remembers. His coach said he had worked too hard to get him and the only way he would sign is if he returned to Canada.

"Wait, what?" again.

Dismayed at the predicament, he pondered. After four years away, in which time his parents had divorced, maybe it was time. So he came home looking for a team.

He attended some of the runs at MRU, but there was no scholarship available and he wanted to play at the stronger program at Calgary anyway. He called Vanhooren, who was already pleased with his three point guards.

"We were like, okay well you can join the team and we'll see how

it goes," Vanhooren said. At the time when he went to the open gyms, Kapinga was working at PepsiCo., sometimes playing after 15-hour double-shifts. But he was determined.

He performed well in practice and was told he would play the second game of preseason. Another blow came when he was informed he wasn't yet eligible.

"Wait, what?" yet again. "I knew in his (Vanhooren) head, he was expecting me to just go off."

He was given the choice of warming up and sitting or not dressing at all. But after the war, the travel, the struggle of establishing a home, the setback at Union, the 15-hour days, he rejected the fury and took his place on the bench.

"I could see it in his face: okay maybe I do have a good one

here," Kapinga said.

He did have a good one. One point guard left, another got hurt early and during preseason, Kapinga became the starter and has flourished ever since. Whether it's clutch layups and threes on offense, creating absolute havoc for other guards on defense or encouraging his teammates, his coach says he does it all.

"For me, there's nothing but respect," Vanhooren said.

Kapinga is poised for another deep postseason run with a team he says is completely bought in. He thinks of his talk with Verrone in that restaurant, who has since dubbed him "the light."

"That attitude has brought me here, so why change it now?"

## HEAD COACH DAN VANHOOREN

In just four years, he took a program that had not enjoyed a winning season in nearly a decade all the way to the conference title and within two points of the national final in 2004. It was Calgary's first Canada West championship since 1993, and their first-round victory at the Final 8 in Halifax was the Dinos' first national quarter-final win in 38 years. The two-point semifinal loss came at the hands of eventual champion Carleton.

The Dinos make their sixth appearance at the Final 8 under Vanhooren in 2018, reaching the semifinal round in each of their previous trips: 2004, 2009, 2010, and 2016, as well as the national final in 2016 – their first gold medal game since 1966.

Under his leadership, the Dinos have captured four of their seven Canada West titles: 2004, 2009, 2016., and 2018 Vanhooren captured his first career Canada West coach of the year award in 2014-15.
