2012 GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE FOOTBALL RELEASE

GSC FOOTBALL SUFFERS NON-CONFERENCE SETBACKS

Birmingham, AL—The second to last week of the 2012 football regular season did not treat the Gulf South Conference well, as the league went 1-3 in non-conference action.

Valdosta State was the lone Conference team to notch a non-conference victory, topping Texas A&M-Kingsville in come-from-behind fashion in Thursday night's GSC-TV telecast. The Blazers put a positive cap on their regular season slate when **freshman running back Cedric O'Neal** ran nine-yards for the game-winning touchdown with just 37 seconds remaining.

North Alabama hosted the second GSC-TV Game of the Week on Saturday, falling to Tarleton State, 38-28. UNA held a 28-27 edge with just over four minutes left in the game, but the Lions gave up 11 unanswered points in the final 1:23.

West Alabama played its second straight road contest, falling at Abilene Christian in overtime, 22-16. UWA forced overtime thanks to a 29-yard field goal by **Ryne Smith** with just 13 seconds left in regulation. ACU hit pay dirt on the first overtime possession but the Wildcats missed the point-after kick. The Tigers could not take advantage on their offensive possession, gaining only six yards on four downs.

Delta State fell behind 19-0 at the University of Indianapolis and could not recover en route to a 33-18 loss. The Statesmen pulled within eight points to start the fourth quarter, but UI posted back-to-back touchdowns to ice the game.

Last but not least, **future GSC member Shorter** registered its first-ever countable league victory, upending in-state rival **West Georgia** in Carrollton, 24-20. UWG held a 20-17 lead with 1:56 left to play, but **SU quarterback Eric Dodson** capped the game-winning drive with a six-yard rushing TD with nine ticks on the clock.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State quarterback **Cayden Cochran** (JR, 6-2, 188, Cashion, OK).

Cochran earns his second consecutive award and his third all-time accolade after leading the Blazers to a 38-31 home win over Texas A&M-Kingsville in Thursday night's GSC-TV contest. The junior completed 24-of-37 passes for 331 yards and four TDs, guiding Valdosta State to its sixth win in a row. The Cashion, OK native tossed three scoring strikes of over 44 yards, led by a 57-yarder during the first five minutes of action.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State defensive end **Tyler Josey** (SR, 6-2, 249, Dublin, GA).

Josey celebrated senior night with a career-best effort in Valdosta State's win over Texas A&M-Kingsville. The Dublin, GA native lived in the Javelinas' backfield, racking up 4.0 sacks for 15 yards, while forcing three fumbles and notching two quarterback hurries. Josey was also responsible for six total tackles, headlined by five solo stops.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State punter/placekicker **Daniel Andersen** (SR, 6-0, 182, Meansville, GA).

Andersen collects his third straight award, fifth of this career, after excelling at both placekicker and punter for the Blazers in their 38-31 home win over Texas A&M-Kingsville. The Meansville, GA native was perfect as a placekicker, nailing his lone field goal attempt from 22 yards and also going 4-for-4 on extra-point attempts. The senior also averaged 35.8 yards per punt, booting five for 179 yards and two inside Kingsville's 20-yard line.

A UWA victory sews up the Tiger's first-ever outright GSC Title and is also important for their NCAA Playoff aspirations.

Two more contests round out the regular season on Saturday. Future **GSC member Shorter** returns home, searching for its second straight GSC victory when **Delta State** enters Barron Stadium. **West Georgia** seeks to even the 10-game GSC-LSC First And Ten Challenge series after journeying west to LSC Champion No. 9 Midwestern State.

The GSC closes the curtain on its 2012 Game of the Week schedule in grand fashion on Thursday night by featuring one of the league's best rivalries between **North Alabama** and **West Alabama** at Tiger Stadium in Livingston, AL.

The rival's battle in front of a GSC-TV audience for the second year in a row after West Alabama claimed a 31-26 home triumph in 2011. UWA is 9-9 all-time in GSC-TV play, while UNA is 7-8 after dropping its last four televised contests.

North Alabama leads the all-time series, 48-16-1, after going 1-1 against UWA last year. The Tigers took a 31-26 home win during the regular season, but the Lions earned revenge in Livingston during the First Round of the 2011 NCAA Playoffs, 48-16-1. The foes have traded victories in their last five matchups dating back to 2008 and UNA is 18-10-1 all-time Livingston.

Statistical Standouts: UWA leads the GSC in scoring defense (16.9), total defense (255.4), rushing offense (225.9), rushing defense (133.0), pass defense (122.4) and pass efficiency defense (81.1). North Alabama ranks second in the GSC in scoring defense (18.9) and pass defense (196.6). Tarleton State places second in the LSC in rushing defense (128.9) and pass offense (259.0).

UWA quarterback Kyle Caldwell places third in the league in passing (135.6), total offense (146.0) and pass efficiency (149.0). **Back-up signal caller Gary Johnston** ranks sixth in rushing (51.5), while **running back Danny Hobbs** is eighth (51.5). Ryne Smith currently holds the NCAA record for consecutive field goals made (24) and he is also No. 2 in the nation in field goals (1.60). **UNA freshman running back Lamonte Thompson** ranks third in rushing (75.7), while **freshman quarterback Luke Wingo** is fourth in total offense (116.2), fifth in passing (90.2) and sixth in pass efficiency (123.2).

Shorter hosts **Delta State** on Saturday hot off its first-ever victory over a GSC school as a future conference member.

SU upended in-state foe West Georgia on the road last week, 24-20, securing the Hawks' first win in the GSC standings. Shorter and DSU enter the final weekend tied for fourth place with 1-3 records. The school's lock horns for the first time ever. The Statesmen are 2-2 on the road this season, while Shorter returns home after a three-game road swing. SU is 2-1 this year at Barron Stadium.

Statistical Standouts: Shorter enters Saturday, averaging 20.2 points per game and 351.9 yards offense, while allowing 337.0 yards per game. DSU is second in the GSC in pass offense (189.7) and third in total offense (376.9), total defense (368.6), rushing defense (157.4) and pass efficiency (121.3).

Delta State quarterback Trevor Wooden leads the Conference in total offense (257.9) and passing (190.0) and is fifth in rushing (67.9). His top target is **Levon Downs** (No. 5 in receptions, 4.1; No. 5 in receiving, 50.3). **Freshman running back Ron-dreaus Truesdale** places 10th in rushing (45.3). **SU quarterback Eric Dodson** is averaging 53.5 rushing yards and 85.5 passing yards. **Running back Bradley Moon** has compiled a team-high 941 yards on 174 attempts.

West Georgia wraps up its 2012 campaign in non-conference action, traveling to No. Midwestern State in the 10th and final GSC-LSC First And Ten Challenge game of the season.

The Gulf South Conference needs a UWG victory to pull even in the series which the Lone Star Conference currently holds a 5-4 advantage. The GSC entered last weekend with a 4-3 edge against the LSC, but West Alabama and North Alabama dropped their respective Challenge games. UWG is 0-1 as part of the Challenge, falling at home to now No. 17 West Texas A&M.

Statistical Standouts: West Georgia is No. 3 in the GSC in scoring offense (29.7) and No. 1 in Division II in fumbles lost (2.00). **UWG signal caller Austin Trainor** places fourth in total offense (112.0) and fourth in passing (92.9). **Running back Seth Hinsley** ranks fourth in rushing (68.0) and teammate **David Bailey** is seventh (54.4).

VALDOSTA, Ga. - Cedric O'Neal scored on an nine-yard run with 37 seconds remaining to lead Valdosta State to a 38-31 victory over Texas A&M-Kingsville Thursday evening at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium.

With the win, Valdosta State completes its 2012 regular season with an 8-2 record and will enter next week's bye week waiting to see where it stands in the NCAA Super Region 2 rankings for the upcoming playoffs. Meanwhile, the Javelinas fall to 5-5 on the year.

The winning score was set up when VSU senior defensive end Tyler Josey, playing on senior night, tracked down TAMUK quarterback Bryan Ehrlich on a fourth down pass attempt and forced a fumble that was recovered by Blazer Chris Pope on the VSU 43 yard line. The sack on the play was Josey's fourth of the evening, tying a Valdosta State single game record, while the forced fumble was his third of the evening.

The Blazer offense needed just eight plays to march down the field for the winning score, six of which came from the legs of O'Neal. The freshman ran for 17 yards on the first play of the drive before picking up three more on a pair of runs in Texas A&M-Kingsville territory. After a 13-yard completion to Quin Roberson moved the ball to the TAMUK 24, O'Neal gained 13 more yards on a rush. Cayden Cochran was brought down for a four-yard loss on a run, but O'Neal gained six back before scoring the go ahead points when he burst through the middle of the line.

The contest was tight throughout as neither team led by more than seven points. TAMUK got on the board first as on its first play from scrimmage, Nate Poppell found Robert Armstrong down the middle of the field for a 94-yard touchdown pass.

VSU came right back as it needed just four plays and 66 seconds to travel 75 yards to even the game at 7-7. After a pair of runs by Austin Scott netted 18 yards and an incomplete pass, Cayden Cochran hooked up with Seantavious Jones for a 57-yard scoring strike that tied the ball game.

The Blazers again used a long pass to grab their first lead on their next drive. After a Texas A&M-Kingsville punt, VSU took over on its own 35, where Cochran found Jones for a six-yard gain. Scott gained 15 yards on a pair of carries to move the ball to the Javelina 44, setting up a 44-yard pass from Cochran to Reginald Lewis that gave Valdosta State a 14-7 lead.

The Javelinas knotted the game at 14-14 when Ehrlich capped off a 13-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run, only to have VSU regain the lead when Gerald Ford scored on a 44-yard pass with 65 seconds remaining before halftime. Matt Stoll kicked a 41-yard field goal 47 seconds later to establish a 24-17 Blazer halftime lead.

Texas A&M-Kingsville regained the lead half way through the third quarter when Ehrlich and Armstrong connected on an 18-yard scoring strike while Daniel Andersen kicked a 22-yard field goal with a little over a minute remaining in the third quarter to even the game at 24-24 heading to the final frame.

Ford put VSU back in front with a four-yard touchdown pass with 10:14 to play, a touchdown that marked his 12th scoring catch of the year, the seventh-best single season total in school history. Ehrlich once again evened the contest when he found Jake Willingham for a six-yard touchdown pass just over two minutes later for the final Javelina points of the game.

Cochran completed 24-of-37 passes for 331 yards and four touchdowns in the game as the Valdosta State offense tallied 473 total yards in the contest. Lewis set new career highs with nine catches and 107 yards while Jones caught five passes for 97 yards and Ford five for 67. O'Neal recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the year as he carried the ball 19 times for 110 yards.

Josey finished the game with six tackles, including the four sacks, three fumble recoveries and two quarterback hurries. Jeremy Grable added 12 tackles while Ryan Smith had 11 and an interception. Chris Pope also tallied double digit tackles with 10 while recovering a fumble and coming up with an interception.

Ehrlich was 12-of-24 passing for 224 yards and two scores while Armstrong caught four passes for 137 yards. Anthony Johnson added 72 yards rushing as the Javelina offense gained 495 total yards in the game, but was hampered by three turnovers. Jeremy Aguilar led the TAMUK defense with 12 stops, including a tackle for loss.

The pairings for the 2012 NCAA Division II playoffs will be made on Sunday, November 11. [Box score](#)

When Dominique Henfield intercepted Dallas Dickey in the end zone to end the third quarter, the Hawks were able to hold the 14-13 lead that they established in the first half.

Shorter was able to recover a muffed punt at the 8-yard line of the Wolves. Troy Postell converted a 32-yard field goal to extend the lead to 17-13.

Dickey was then able to West Georgia on a 12-play, 62-yard touch-down drive that took 6:13 off the clock to retake the lead, 20-17, with under two minutes left in the fourth quarter.

The Hawks (5-5, 1-3 GSC) took possession with at their own 24-yard line needing a field goal to tie the game. A field goal was not the plan for Coach Phil Jones or sophomore quarterback Eric Dodson.

Dodson was able to complete a third down pass to Kareem Hawkins to the Shorter 40-yard line, and three plays later, completed another pass for a first down to Allen Huntley. Hawkins added another 34-yard reception to set up the Hawks on the West Georgia 12-yard line with 30 seconds left.

Nine seconds remained on the clock when Dodson tucked the ball and scored from six yards out for his third rushing score of the game and the eventual game winner.

Shorter's defense held true for the final two plays and the Hawks were able to walk out of University Stadium with a 24-20 victory over nearby rival West Georgia (3-6, 1-4), the first win in Shorter history in Gulf South Conference football action.

"They won't stop," said Jones about his players. "The biggest thing is asking the kids to play hard and they keep on going. The Lord was in it with all our kids."

This was a game that saw Dodson establish a new single season passing mark for the Hawks. He needed 58 yards to set the record and eclipsed that mark easily with his second game of the season over the century mark. He completed 7 of 15 passes for 126 yards.

Dodson now has 855 yards passing on the season, passing the mark previously set in 2005 by Alex Jackson.

"It starts with the guys up front selling out on every play and putting their bodies on the line to protect," said Dodson. "They protected very well today against a very good defense."

Bradley Moon added another game over the century mark to his rushing total, rushing 20 times for 133 yards. Dodson was able to add 54 yards on the ground on 16 carries in addition to the three TDs.

Shorter rushed for 218 yards on the day, helping to take the battle of time of possession, 31:19 to 28:41. The two scoring drives in the first half came on the heels of a 9-play, 67-yard drive and a 6-play, 70-yard drive. The Hawks led 14-13 at the half.

Key for the Hawks was the ability to convert on third down, as they were able to convert 11 of 17 third down attempts.

The Hawks also took advantage of red zone opportunities, scoring on 4 of 5 attempts inside the Wolves' 20-yard line.

Henfield was tops for the defense recording 14 tackles as well as the interception. Demery Hawkins added eight tackles and Laynce Sanders tallied another sack to add to his record setting freshman season, now giving him 8.5 on the year.

Moon now stands at 941 yards rushing and only former Shorter All-American A.J. Cooley has rushed for more yards in a season. Moon will have one more game to gain 59 yards to join Cooley as the only players in Hawks' history to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark in a season.

The Hawks will conclude play next Saturday, November 10, on Senior Day, as GSC rival Delta State comes to Barron Stadium for a 1:30 pm kickoff. [Box score](#)

ABILENE, Texas – Mitchell Gale hit Darrell Cantu-Harkle on a 14-yard swing pass in the first overtime to lift Abilene Christian to a 22-16 upset victory over 13th-ranked West Alabama Saturday at Shotwell Stadium.

The win improved the Wildcats to 6-4. UWA fell to 7-3. The Tigers have a short turnaround, hosting North Alabama Thursday at Tiger Stadium with an opportunity to win the Gulf South Conference title outright.

“We played hard, but we just didn’t play smart all the time,” UWA head coach Will Hall said. “We went for a fake field goal that didn’t work and that wasn’t smart by me and we got an extra point blocked, gave up some long returns and had some turnovers. That is usually a formula to hurt you.”

Abilene Christian built a 13-0 lead and then held off a furious Tiger rally in the second half for the victory. UWA forced the game into overtime when Ryne Smith connected on a 29-yard field goal with 13 seconds left in the fourth quarter. A 63-yard field goal try by ACU’s Ryan Owens on the final play of regulation was short.

Abilene Christian drove to the UWA 17 on its first possession of the game, but had to settle for a 34-yard field goal from Owens to take a 3-0 lead at 9:58 in the first quarter.

UWA was then forced to punt on its first possession and Cantu-Harkless returned it 71 yards to the Tiger 9-yard line. Three plays later Charcandrick West plunged in from a yard out to put Abilene Christian up 10-0 at 5:59 in the first period. That score stood at halftime.

UWA opened the second half by driving 55 yards on just six plays to the Abilene Christian 20, but a fake field goal on fourth and two failed, leaving the Tigers to turn the ball over on downs.

Abilene Christian stretched the lead to 13-0 after three quarters on a 24-yard field goal by Owens with 3:23 left in the period.

After converting a fourth-and-1 on the first play of the fourth period and recovering its own fumble at the ACU 10 yard line a few plays later, the Tigers got on the scoreboard for the first time with 12:34 left to play when Kyle Caldwell found Malik Lofton in the front corner of the ACU end zone for the touchdown.

ACU answered on its next possession with a 41-yard field goal by Owens to extend its lead to 16-7 with 8:42 left.

The Tigers rallied back to score on a 34-yard pass from Caldwell to Chad Toocheck with 6:06 left, but the Wildcats blocked the extra point try to make it a 16-13 ACU lead. The scoring play was set up when Lofton ran for 21 yards on fourth and three to keep the drive alive.

UWA’s defense rose to the occasion again, forcing an ACU punt that led to Smith’s 26th straight field make.

Caldwell’s fourth and six pass to Toocheck fell incomplete on UWA’s overtime possession and Abilene Christian sealed the upset.

“Our kids really played hard. We just didn’t play good enough to win against a good football team on the road. That’s on me as the head football coach,” Hall said. “We rallied there late and then got the extra point blocked. Anytime that happens it will come back to haunt you.”

UWA outgained ACU 395 to 371. Caldwell finished the day 16-for-24 for 165 yards and the two scores. Marcus Brown had four receptions for 35 yards and Gary Johnston led the Tiger ground game with 65 yards on 12 carries.

Mitchell was 24-of-42 for Abilene Christian for 284 yards and one TD. Cantu-Harkle had nine receptions for 113 yards and the game-winning touchdown. **Box score**

FLORENCE, Ala. – After taking a 28-27 lead with just 4:37 left in the game, the University of North Alabama couldn’t hold on as Tarleton State rallied for a 38-28 win at Braly Stadium.

Tarleton (5-4) seemed to have the game in hand, leading 27-14 in the fourth quarter. UNA freshman quarterback Luke Wingo led UNA back, however, with two touchdown drives that he capped with short runs. The second gave UNA a 28-27 lead at the 4:37 mark. The Texans answered quickly with a 10-play, 75-yard drive to regain the lead with 1:23 left. They then added a late field goal for the 38-28 win.

The loss was UNA’s third straight and drops the Lions to 5-4 overall. The Lions gave up 537 yards on defense but did manage 435 yards of offense of their own.

Tarleton State drove for a touchdown on its opening drive as Andre Plata scored on a three-yard run at the 6:20 mark of the first quarter. The Texans marched 65 yards in 16 plays on a drive that took 6:36 off the clock. Blake Barnes added the extra point to make it 7-0.

UNA tied the game with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Luke Wingo to Lee Mayhall at the 3:24 mark of the first quarter. Taylor Pontius added the PAT.

The Lions took their first lead of the night early in the third quarter as back-up quarterback Chris Alexander engineered a seven-play, 91-yard TD drive. Alexander had a career-long 66-yard run for the touchdown. Pontius kick made it 14-7 at 11:50 of the second period.

After UNA downed a punt on Tarleton State’s one-yard line, the Texans quickly tied the game with a 99-yard TD pass from Jake Fenske to Cordell Valentine. Barnes PAT made it 14-14 at 6:37 of the third quarter.

After a UNA turnover, the Texans took the lead just before the half on a 24-yard Barnes field goal to make it 17-14.

Another Barnes field goal, this time from 35 yards, made it 20-14 with 8:40 left in the third quarter, and a 15-yard Zach Henshaw TD run pushed it to 27-14 with 6:01 left in the third.

A 19-yard touchdown run by Wingo with 9:00 left in the game closed the gap to 27-21. It capped a nine-play, 93-yard drive. After a defensive stop, the Lions scored again on a nine-yard Wingo TD run to make it 28-27 with 4:37 left.

Arthur Buckingham pulled in a 22-yard pass from Fenske with 1:23 left in the game and Fenske passed to Jeken Frye for the two-point conversion to make it 35-28. Barnes then kicked a 29-yard field goal with 20 seconds left to make the final count 38-28.

UNA rushed for 223 yards and passed for 212. Wingo was 15-of-26 for 187 yards and one score and he rushed for 36 yards and two TDs. Tarleton had 226 yards rushing and 311 yards passing for 537 total yards. Fenske was 31-of-41 for 311 yards and two TDs.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – The Delta State University Statesmen were unable to overcome 16-0 first half deficit despite outscoring the University of Indianapolis in the second half inside Key Stadium at Kiesel Field on Saturday, Nov. 3.

The Greyhounds (8-2) opened play with a Klay Fietcher 39-yard kick off return to set up a short field. Fietcher capped off the initial drive with a 13-yard scamper for a touchdown to go ahead of the Green-and-White 6-0. Scott Miller's PAT attempt was blocked by Preston Felder, which put an end his 50 consecutive PAT makes.

The Statesmen (3-6) looked to respond on the ensuing drive but the offense stalled out 11 plays later at the UIndy 39 yard line and was forced to punt.

Indianapolis constructed a 13-play 69-yard drive that was cut short by Statesmen linebacker Diego Lubin. Lubin brought down Greyhound running back Fietcher for a 1-yard loss inside the red zone to force a 28-yard field goal by Scott Miller that put the Hounds up 9-0 with 11:02 remaining in the second quarter.

After a 43-yard kickoff return by wide receiver Lavon Downs to put the Statesmen in good field position, the offense was able to move the ball into field goal range giving Andrew Jones a chance to put Green-and-White on the scoreboard at the 5:57 mark in the first half. Jones pushed the 43-yard field goal attempt wide right.

The DSU defense stood tall late in the first half forcing UIndy to punt and allowed the Statesmen a chance to put together a drive before heading into the locker room, but Vince Maida and the Greyhound defense put a stop to the threat by picking off a Spencer Van Brunt pass.

Indianapolis quarterback Chris Miller connected with Mar'Quone Edmonds on a 19-yard pass down the middle, setting up another Mills to Edmonds connection for a 5-yard touchdown strike with 00:30 ticks left on the clock, to put the Hounds up 16-0 at the half.

Van Brunt ended the first half of play going 13-of-19 passing for 73 yards while Downs lead the Statesmen in receiving with five receptions for 52 yards. Richard Freelon led the DSU rushing attack with four carries for 22 yards.

Miller connected on 16-of-22 for 164 yards and a touchdown with Edmonds being on the receiving end of eight passes for 110 yards and a touchdown. Fietcher tallied 27 yards on just nine carries.

UIndy continued its offensive momentum on its first drive of the third quarter, with a Miller to 41-yard field goal, making the score 19-0 with 7:58 remaining in the third quarter.

Delta State finally broke onto the scoreboard with a D.J. Jarrin 20-yard field goal. The field goal came on a 9-play 55-yard drive that was springboarded by an 18-yard rush by Erik Clayton around the right-end to put the Statesmen into the position narrow the Greyhound lead to 19-3 with 3:57 remaining in the third.

The Statesmen defense forced the first three-and-out of the contest on the Hounds ensuing offensive possession and mounted a 9-play 78-yard drive that was capped off by a 12-yard rushing touchdown by Rondreas Truesdale. Van Brunt completed the 2-point conversion to Patrick Bethley closing the UIndy lead down to 19-11 with 14:43 remaining in the fourth.

DSU appeared to gain momentum when Trenton Warren recovered a fumble forced by Rory Island at the UIndy 33 yardline, only to give the ball back to the Hounds on a fumble by Bethley that was forced and recovered by Nick Wehby.

The Green-and-White forced the Greyhounds to a fourth-and-one midway through the fourth quarter but the Hounds made the perfect play call sending tight end Adam Knies streaking down the middle for a 38-yard pass completion. The completion set up the one-yard touchdown run by Fietcher to extend the Indianapolis lead to 26-11 with 8:09 left.

With 2:21 remaining Indianapolis' Fiechter broke out a 61-yard touchdown run up the middle making the score 33-11.

Van Brunt connected with Downs on a 10-yard touchdown strike for his first career touchdown pass as a Statesmen bringing the score to 33-18 with 1:39 left to end the scoring.

Van Brunt finished the night connecting 18-of-34 for 134 and one touchdown, while Downs finished the night with seven receptions for 69 yards and a score.

Mills completed 28-of-37 294 yards and one touchdown with Edmonds hauling in 14 receptions for 169 yards and one touchdown. [Box score](#)
