2012 GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE BASEBALL RELEASE

FOUR GSC TEAMS READY FOR NCAA SOUTH REGIONAL

Birmingham, AL—For the second consecutive season and 10th overall time, the GSC advanced four teams to the NCAA Division II Baseball Tournament.

The GSC shoots for its 33rd NCAA Regional Baseball Title this week and accounted for more than half of the regional field which begins play on Thursday, May 17th and wraps up on Monday, May 21st. Sunshine State Champion and No. 1 seed Tampa is set to host the eight-team South Region Tournament. Fans can find out more about the event by visiting the [official web page](#) for the regional.

GSC Champion Delta State (40-12) collected the No. 2 seed after going 5-1 in last week's Conference Tournament.

Defending NCAA Champion West Florida (34-17) earned the right to defend its crown, claiming the No. 4 seed. **No. 6 seed Alabama-Huntsville** (31-22) returned to the NCAA post-season for the first time since 2001, while **North Alabama** (39-16) enters as the No. 7 seed for the second straight season.

UWF opens up the action at the UT Baseball Field on Thursday at 9:00 am (Central), battling No. 5 seed Nova Southeastern (33-13). While the Argonauts and NSU both hail from the Sunshine State, Thursday marks the first-ever meeting between the schools. UWF returns to the NCAA post-season for the third year in a row, fourth time overall. The defending Division II Champions are 10-5 all-time in NCAA action and enter with a five-game winning streak. West Florida is 3-9 versus the South Region field this season.

Game Three on Thursday features UAH and No. 3 seed Lynn at 3:30 pm. The Chargers advanced to Championship Tuesday of the GSC Tournament before falling in the Title Game to Delta State. Alabama-Huntsville is 6-8 in its four previous NCAA post-season appearances, going 2-2 in its last event in 2001. UAH entered 2012 with a 1-0 all-time edge against Lynn, but fell to 1-4 after dropping four matchups in Boca Raton earlier this season. The Chargers are 9-11 versus the South Region field this season.

DSU and UNA wrap up Day One at 6:45 pm. The matchup marks the fifth between the squads this season after the Statesmen took two-of-three in Florence during the regular season followed by a 4-0 triumph in the GSC Tournament's final day. DSU owns a 43-38 all-time lead over UNA.

Delta State leads the GSC with 24 overall NCAA appearances and the Statesmen make their first post-season field since hosting in 2008. DSU has built a 67-46 record dating back to 1972 and has won nine Regional Titles. Delta State hoisted the NCAA Championship trophy in 2004 after also claiming the GSC Title that same season. DSU is 12-4 versus the South Regional field.

North Alabama punched its second consecutive NCAA ticket and 12th overall. The Lions opened last year's Regional Tournament with two victories only to drop their final two contests. UNA is 14-22 in regional play dating back to 1984. UNA is 5-6 versus the South Regional field this season.

2012 GSC BASEBALL TOURNAMENT RECAPS**DAY ONE--FRIDAY, MAY 4**

A pair of upsets kicked off the 2012 Gulf South Conference Baseball Championship Tournament Sponsored By Raymond James/Morgan Keegan at State Mutual Stadium.

No. 7 seed West Georgia (23-23) opened the Tournament with an upset, cruising past No. 2 seed West Alabama (28-21), 10-3. UWA lit the scoreboard first with a run in the bottom of the third inning, but the Wolves' offense plated 10 runs in the next two innings. Six UWG runners crossed home in the top of the fourth as Tanner Drennen and Keith Borger each laced two-RBI doubles. The Tigers answered with two runs in the bottom of the fourth, but West Georgia's bats remained hot in the top of the fifth with four runs and the visitors never looked back. Starter Max Aeschlimann upped his record to 6-5 on the year allowing four hits and fanning four batters in six innings. The victory was UWG's first in the GSC Tournament since 1998.

No. 6 seed West Florida (32-16) jumped out to an early 3-0 lead, but could not hold on down the stretch as No. 3 seed Alabama-Huntsville (29-20) advanced, 4-3. UWF struck for three runs in the top of the first capped by a bases-loaded walk. UAH inched closer with a single run in the fifth and seventh innings and grabbed its first lead of the game in the bottom of the eighth. Justin Riddle laced what proved to be the game-winning, two-run double with one out in the bottom of the eighth. Cody Barrett came in and hurled his seventh save of the year, while starter Johnny Shuttlesworth tossed eight innings and collected his fifth victory. UAH earned its first win in a GSC Tournament opener since 2003.

No. 1 seed Delta State (36-11) used a five-run fifth inning to fend off No. 8 seed Christian Brothers' (11-36) upset bid. CBU entered the bottom of the fifth with a 2-0 lead after plating runs in the third and fifth frames. DSU's bats final caught fire in the fifth via two RBI-singles and Brent Langston's two-run double. The Buccaneers did not go away, notching a run in the seventh and ninth innings. CBU had runners at third and second with two outs but reliever Brandon Hardin slammed the door with a strike out. Josh Branstetter posted the win on the mound, stretching his record to 5-3.

No. 4 seed North Alabama (36-15) left 17 runners on base, while No. 5 seed Valdosta State (27-17) scored three unanswered runs en route to a 4-1 upset in the final game of the day. VSU opened the scoring in the top of the second, only to see UNA tie matters in the bottom of the fifth. The Blazers scored what proved to be the game-winning run in the top of the eighth on Chaz Bagwell's suicide squeeze bunt which plated Bryant Hayman. Valdosta State put the game away behind a two-run ninth inning and withstood two walks to ice the triumph in the bottom of the frame. VSU starter Pete Whittingslow recorded the win on the mound, his sixth of the season, fanning seven in 7.1 innings of work.

Day Two of the 2012 GSC Tournament starts tomorrow with an elimination game between West Alabama and West Florida at 10:00 am (Eastern). Alabama-Huntsville and West Georgia follow at 1:00 pm, while Christian Brothers and North Alabama face in the other elimination contest at 4:30 pm. The night cap starts at 7:30 pm between Delta State and Valdosta State.

DAY TWO--SATURDAY, MAY 5

Offensive explosions headlined Day Two of 2012 Gulf South Conference Baseball Championship Tournament at State Mutual Stadium, Home of the Rome Braves.

No. 6 seed West Florida (33-16) used a complete-game shutout by Drew Bryson to oust No. 2 seed West Alabama (28-22) from the Tournament, 2-0. Bryson and UWA starter Nick Bolleter were locked in a pitcher's dual in the first four innings until UWF grabbed a 2-0 lead via Eric Sauls' ground out scored a run and Korey Domenick singled-in the insurance score. Bryson ruled the mound the rest of the way for the Argonauts, walking one batter and fanning four in his first shutout of the season.

No. 3 seed Alabama-Huntsville (30-20) and No. 7 seed West Georgia (23-24) combined for 26 hits as UAH scored eight unanswered runs to pull away from UWG down the stretch, 11-3. The Chargers grabbed a 3-1 edge in the top of the second capped by an RBI-single by Justin Pearson. The Wolves tied matters with a run in the third and fourth frames, only to see Alabama-Huntsville plate its first of its eight-run rally in the sixth when Justin Riddle cracked the Tournament's first homerun over the left field fence. UAH held its one-run lead heading into the eighth until the Chargers scored two runs and added five more in the ninth. Alabama-Huntsville is 2-0 in the Tournament for the first time since 2001.

No. 4 seed North Alabama's (37-15) offense woke up in the second elimination game of the day, tying the GSC Tournament record for hits in a game en route to a 19-1 rout of No. 8 seed Christian Brothers (11-36). The Lions tallied 24 hits, tying the Tournament record set by Valdosta State in 2004. UNA plated at least one run in the first four innings, capped by a 13-run fourth inning. North Alabama entered the fourth with a 5-0 lead before advancing 13 consecutive hitters with two outs. Starting pitcher Johnny Hornbuckle was dominant on the mound, recording his seventh victory while scattering two hits in five innings of work. Second baseman Michael Schmidt led all players with four RBI and a 3-for-4 effort at the dish.

No. 1 seed Delta State (37-11) remained undefeated in the Tournament, cruising past No. 5 seed Valdosta State (27-18) in the nightcap, 11-2. DSU sprinted out of the gates, reeling off 11 total runs in the first four innings. The Blazers grabbed their lone lead of the game in the bottom of the second inning via Christian Glisson's two-run homerun. The Statesmen dominated the rest of the contest, plating three runs in the second and six more in the third. Ben Kingsley paced the Statesmen offense with three RBI on a 2-for-4 effort at the plate. Starter Colton Mitchell remained perfect on the season, running his record to 8-0 by fanning eight batters in seven innings.

Day Three of the 2012 GSC Tournament starts tomorrow with an elimination game between North Alabama and West Georgia at 11:00 am (Eastern). West Florida and Valdosta State follow with the other elimination contest at 2:00 pm, while the night cap starts at 5:00 pm between undefeated Alabama-Huntsville and Delta State.

DAY THREE--SUNDAY, MAY 6

Four teams weathered two storms during Day Three of the 2012 Gulf South Conference Baseball Championship Tournament at State Mutual Stadium, Home of the Rome Braves.

Mother Nature made her presence felt before the first pitch could be thrown, forcing a 40-minute rain delay followed by a 30-minute lightning delay in the final game of the day. Alabama-Huntsville enters tomorrow as the undefeated team, while Delta State, North Alabama and West Florida seek to avoid elimination.

No. 4 seed North Alabama (38-15) avoided elimination and put an end to No. 7 seed West Georgia's (23-25) season thanks to 5-1 win in the first contest. UNA jumped out to a 3-0 lead by plating one run in the bottom of the first inning and adding two more in the fifth. UWG plated one run in the top of the sixth and advanced multiple runners seventh and eighth frames, but could not take advantage. The Lions snuffed out the Wolves timely hits by turning double plays in key situations. Jake Sloan went 2-for-4 at the plate, driving in two runs, while starting pitcher Michael Watkins collected the win in seven innings of work.

No. 6 seed West Florida (37-13) invoked the 10-run rule for the second time in the Tournament, avoiding elimination via a 10-0 shutout of No. 4 seed Valdosta State (27-19). UWF broke it open early, racking up seven runs in the top of the second inning and adding another score in the eighth. The Argonauts pushed the lead to double-digits in the sixth with two more runs. Three UWF players laced multiple hits, highlighted by Garrett Flynn's 3-for-4, two-RBI effort. Starting pitcher Jake Stephens was masterful on the mound, allowing just two hits and fanning six in his first shutout of the season.

No. 3 seed Alabama-Huntsville (31-20) put the brakes on No. 1 seed Delta State's (37-12) momentum in the nightcap, scoring five runs in the final three innings en route to an 8-4 triumph. The rivals traded punches throughout the first five innings as UAH scored three unanswered runs only to see DSU take a 4-3 edge after five innings. A 30 minute lightning delay halted the Statesmen's momentum and the Chargers' offense came out swinging in the final three frames. Alabama-Huntsville's Ty Chancellor went 4-for-4 at the dish and rang up three RBI, while starter David Kendrick posted his sixth win on the mound. UAH is 3-0 in GSC Tournament play for the first time since 1998 when the Chargers dropped two games in the final day.

Day Four of the 2012 GSC Tournament starts tomorrow with West Florida versus Delta State in an elimination contest at 11:00 am (Eastern), followed by Alabama-Huntsville and North Alabama at 2:00 pm.

DAY FOUR--MONDAY, MAY 7

Day Four of the 2012 Gulf South Conference Baseball Championship Tournament saw another weather delay and an extra-inning thriller at State Mutual Stadium, Home of the Rome Braves.

Three teams are still alive heading into Championship Tuesday after Alabama-Huntsville (31-21) suffered its first loss of the Tournament. Delta State (38-12) and North Alabama (38-15) face off in the first game tomorrow at 11:00 am (Eastern) with the winner moving on to play UAH for the 2012 GSC Title approximately 2:00 pm.

No. 1 seed Delta State (40-11) bounced back from yesterday's loss, ousting No. 6 seed West Florida (44-8), 6-2 in the first game of the day. DSU did not wait long to grab a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning behind a pair of RBI singles. UWF tied matters with two runs in the top of the third, but the Statesmen retook the lead for good with five runs in the bottom of the third. Delta State took advantage of a walk and two hit batters to set up the five-run frame which was capped by Ben Kingsley's two-run single. DSU starter Ricky Withers ruled the mound, collecting the complete-game win while fanning nine batters.

In-state rivals No. 3 seed Alabama-Huntsville and No. 4 seed North Alabama withstood a two-hour, 14-minute weather delay in an 11-inning thriller in the second game of the day. UNA took an 8-3 lead in the bottom of the sixth inning, but Mother Nature had other plans as lightning followed by heavy rainfall moved into the area. The squads traded leads in the first three innings until the Lions answered UAH's three-run third inning with three runs of their own in the bottom of the frame. The Chargers returned from the weather delay with a purpose, tying the game with two runs in the seventh and three more in the eighth after Jon McKinney's three-run homerun. Neither squad could put the game away in the next inning, forcing the first extra-inning contest of the Tournament. North Alabama preserved its post-season hopes in the bottom of the 11th thanks to Josh Doyle's walk-off RBI single. UNA third baseman Andrew Almon led the offense, going 4-for-6 with three RBI and three runs scored.

Alabama-Huntsville plays for its second GSC Title, first since 2001, against either Delta State or North Alabama. DSU is an 11-time Conference Champion, while UNA has hoisted the trophy five times.

CHAMPIONSHIP DAY--TUESDAY, MAY 8

Delta State University earned its 12th Gulf South Conference Baseball Championship here today at State Mutual Stadium in Rome, GA.

Delta State (40-12) entered as the Tournament's top seed, but the Statesmen needed two victories on Tuesday to secure its first Title since 2008. DSU opened the day with a 4-0 shutout of North Alabama and secured the Championship with a 14-8 triumph over Alabama Huntsville. DSU upped its all-time record in the Tournament to 67-40 and also collected the league's automatic berth to next week's NCAA South Regional Tournament.

Delta State advanced to the Title Game after blanking No. 4 seed North Alabama (39-16), 4-0, in the first game of the day. DSU rode the arm of starting pitcher Josh Branstetter who pitched a complete-game four hitter behind six strikeouts. Catcher Jon Carnahan accounted for the Statesmen's first three runs, lacing a RBI-single in the first inning and a two-RBI double in the third. First baseman Brent Langston completed the scoring in the fourth when he homered over the left field fence.

DSU saved its best for last, tying a GSC Tournament record with 24 total hits en route to a 14-8 win over No. 3 seed Alabama-Huntsville (31-22). The Statesmen seemed to run away with things early, plating seven runs in the first four innings, but UAH closed the gap to 7-3 with three runs in the bottom of the fifth. Delta State closed the door in the final four frames, outscoring the Chargers 7-5. Sam Kidd, Michael Vinson and Jon Carnahan each laced three RBIs in the game led by Kidd's 4-for-6 effort. Starting pitcher Jordan Moore collected his seventh win of the season on the mound, fanning five batters in 5.0 innings of work.
