GSC GOES 2-1 AGAINST THE LSC; FIT EARNS FIRST GSC WIN

The Gulf South Conference won two of the three battles against the Lone Star Conference last weekend and newcomer **Florida Tech** made history by recording its *first-ever league triumph*.

All seven GSC members took to the gridiron on Saturday in two Conference battles and three more installments of the 2013 GSC-LSC "First and Ten Challenge."

The GSC evened the series with the Lone Star Conference at 3-3, thanks to two wins on Saturday. **North Alabama** (4-2, 2-1) tallied a 49-17 home victory over Texas A&M-Kingsville in the Arby's GSC-TV Game of the Week. UNA's offense passed for a season-high 245 yards and the Lions' defense intercepted three passes and racked up eight sacks en route to their third straight win.

Delta State (4-2, 2-1) thrilled its home crowd by clipping No. 14 Tarleton State, 38-36, behind **Vince Sciorrotta's** game-winning, 33-yard field goal with seven seconds on the clock. TSU ran a school-record 106 offensive plays, but DSU quarterback Tyler Sullivan made the most of his first-career start, throwing for 422 yards and four touchdowns. Sciorrotta has two last-second, game-winning field goals this year.

Florida Tech (2-5, 1-3) made history at home on Saturday, topping **Provisional GSC member Shorter** (0-7, 0-4), 28-24, for the Panthers' first-ever Conference win. FIT entered the final 15 minutes, trailing 24-7, only to score 21 unanswered points while holding SU scoreless. **Wide receiver Xavier Milton** caught the go-ahead touchdown with 4:30 left to play.

No. 11 Valdosta State (5-1, 3-1) used an impressive debut by **freshman quarterback Kaleb Nobles** to storm back from a 17-0, second-half deficit in a 35-30 triumph at in-state rival **West Georgia** (4-3, 1-2). Nobles came off the bench after starter Cayden Cochran was injured early in the third quarter and sparked the Blazers by completing 19-of-21 passes for 238 yards and four TDs.

No. 21 West Alabama (5-2, 3-0) suffered its first setback in five games, falling at then No. 24 Midwestern State, 45-21, in the third GSC-LSC clash of the day. UWA could not recover from a 28-7 halftime deficit as MSU celebrated its Homecoming by snapping the Tigers' four-game winning streak.



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Delta State quarterback Tyler Sullivan (FR, 6-3, 235, Louisville, MS)

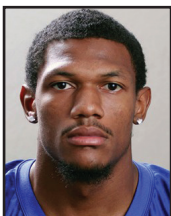
Sullivan is the second different DSU signal caller to claim Offensive honors this year. He earns his first- ever award after leading DSU to a come-from-behind, 38-36 victory over No. 14 Tarleton State in his first career start. The redshirt freshman completed 33-of-49 passes for 422 yards and four touchdowns, while also running for 43 yards on nine carries. The Louisville, MS native engineered the game-winning drive with 1:03 left to play that covered 40 yards on five plays and was capped by the go-ahead, 33-yard field goal with seven seconds on the clock.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Delta State cornerback Trenton Warren (SR, 5-10, 185, Baytown, TX)

Warren is the second Delta State defender to claim laurels this season, spearheading the Statesmen's defense in the win over Tarleton State. The senior racked up a career-best 12 total tackles, including six solo stops, but his biggest contribution came in pass coverage where he nabbed one interception for 11 yards and broke up three passes. Two of the Baytown, TX native's break ups came in DSU's end zone and averted TSU touchdowns.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Georgia kick returner Derick Seward (JR, 5-10, 195, Wheatland, CA)

Seward becomes the second UWG Special Teams winner of the season after taking time out from his running back duties to spark UWG's special teams in a 35-30 home setback to Valdosta State. The junior returned five kickoffs for a GSC season-high 165 yards and a 33.0 average. The Wheatland, CA native returned a kick 93 yards for a touchdown, which cut the Wolves' deficit to 28-24 with 6:06 remaining in the game.

Provisional member Shorter and **Delta State** each play in front of a GSC-TV audience for the second time this season, while SU hosts its second 2013 telecast. The contest will be shown live by CSS, Cox Sports, ESPN3, Mediacom, TV-24 in Anniston, AL and WHCQ-TV 8 in Cleveland, MS.

The GSC's two nationally ranked squads host league rivals on Saturday. **No. 21 West Alabama** puts its perfect GSC record on the line, hosting Homecoming festivities and border-rival **West Georgia**. **No. 11 Valdosta State** returns home for the first time in three weeks when traditional rival **North Alabama** enters Bazemore-Hyder Stadium.

Game Breakdown: Provisional GSC member Shorter hosts its second GSC-TV contest this year and seeks its first victory of the season when **Delta State** enters Barron Stadium on Thursday night.

Both squads are in search of their first 2013 GSC-TV win after SU lost at home to Mars Hill in Game Two and DSU dropped a matchup at West Alabama in Game Six. Overall, the Statesmen are 13-7 all-time in GSC-TV battles, while the Hawks are 0-3.

Shorter ended 2012 on a positive note when it upended Delta State at home in the first-ever meeting, 32-21. SU trailed only once in the contest when DSU grabbed its first lead late in the third quarter, but the Hawks shut the door in the final 15 minutes, hitting for 12 unanswered points. Since the win, Shorter has dropped seven consecutive matchups led by four home setbacks. DSU is 2-1 away from Cleveland after opening the year with two road triumphs before falling at UWA.

Game Breakdown: **No. 11 Valdosta State** and **North Alabama** each seek to remain in the GSC Title hunt, locking horns in Valdosta, GA for the third time in the last four meetings.

VSU and UNA are two of three squads with just one league loss and a victory on Saturday keeps the winner in the GSC Title chase and also strengthens its NCAA post-season hopes. The Lions own a 20-15-1 lead in the all-time series, thanks to five wins in the last seven meetings. North Alabama has made Bazemore-Hyder Stadium a home-away-from-home recently, claiming the last three matchups en route to a 10-8-1 over-all road edge. The last two games have been decided by a touchdown or less as UNA won in Valdosta in 2011, 30-23, and VSU earned a 24-21 decision in Florence a year ago. The Blazers are 3-0 at home in 2013, while the Lions are 1-1 away from home.

Game Breakdown: **West Georgia** takes on its second straight nationally ranked GSC foe when **No. 21 West Alabama** hosts the Wolves for its Homecoming on Saturday.

Both squads seek to return to the win-column after setbacks last week. UWA still controls its own destiny in its attempts to defend the GSC Title by holding a 3-0 league mark, while UWG hopes to even its Conference record at 2-2. West Georgia owns an 18-11 all-time lead over the Tigers, but UWA holds a 9-8 edge in Livingston. The rivals return to Tiger Stadium for the second year in a row after West Alabama recorded its third consecutive home win in 2012, 24-20. While UWA trails all-time, it has found traction recently by winning three in a row and five of the last seven matchups. The Tigers have claimed seven in a row at home dating back to last year, while the Wolves are 2-1 on the road this season.

Lyndon Edwards has never been so happy to miss a tackle.

The Florida Tech linebacker had a chance to stop Shorter University running back B.J. McCoy early in the fourth quarter Saturday, but what happened after McCoy got away ended up changing the whole complexion of the game.

Because waiting for McCoy was Florida Tech linebacker Justin Arcune.

“(The ball) was on his left hand and arm and I just kind of reached around,” Arcune said. “... I just punched it from behind as I was wrapping (him) up.”

The forced fumble, which was recovered by safety Tyler Rosenblatt at the Panthers’ 15-yard line, not only led to a Florida Tech touchdown, it helped spark a dramatic 28-24 come-from-behind victory.

Florida Tech head coach Steve Englehart called Rosenblatt’s fumble recovery the turning point in the game, especially since it came two plays after the Panthers were called for roughing the kicker, which gave the Hawks an automatic first down.

The Panthers would go on to rally from a 17-point deficit to get their first Gulf South Conference victory.

“I’m glad I missed that tackle,” Edwards grinned.

Florida Tech’s defense, which had struggled with Shorter’s triple option offense for the better part of three quarters Saturday, certainly came up big when it had to.

All week long, Englehart had talked about how it was virtually impossible to duplicate what the Hawks would bring to the table and early on, that proved to be the case.

On Shorter’s first five possessions, the Hawks gained 270 yards, and held the ball for 26:24 while building a 24-7 lead.

“People underestimate how fast triple options really move on the field,” Arcune said. “It may not seem that fast from up there (in the stands), but it’s definitely a faster-paced offense and it takes about a quarter or two to catch your mind back up.”

Not only did Florida Tech’s players start to get a better feel for what Shorter was trying to do, the Panthers’ coaching staff made some adjustments as well, including going from a four-man defensive line to a five-man line that made it tougher for the Hawks to execute the dive play that had been so successful early on.

On Shorter’s final five possessions, the Hawks gained 98 yards and had the ball for 13:43.

“They just kept trusting what the coaches were telling them and finally we started getting those tackles, and we started getting those tackles-for-loss,” Englehart said. “It gave our offense energy to go score. We fed off each other. It was a great feeling.”

Linebacker J.J. Sanders led Florida Tech with 15 tackles (including one sack), while Edwards had nine tackles and two sacks.

Arcune was credited with nine tackles, a sack and a forced fumble that gave the Panthers the spark they were looking for as the offense would drive 85 yards for a touchdown and both sides of the ball began to feed off each other in the second half.

“We got a surge of energy because our offense also helped lift us up with that touchdown,” Arcune said. “If you follow a turnover up with a touchdown, that just turns everyone’s mind upside down. We thought, ‘We can do this thing.’ And we came back and we did.”

The fact that Florida Tech was able to overcome a 17-point fourth quarter deficit will only bode well for the Panthers’ future.

“I think it may mature us a lot,” Edwards said. “We had a lot of heart. We kept fighting, and we came together as one unit, not just offense or just defense – the whole team.” [Box score](#)

Kaleb Nobles came on for an injured Cayden Cochran and led No. 12 Valdosta State to touchdowns on each of his first five drives to lead the Blazers to a 35-24 victory over West Georgia in Gulf South Conference football action at University Stadium Saturday.

With the win, VSU improved to 5-1 overall and 3-1 in GSC play while West Georgia fell to 4-3 and 1-2.

Nobles entered the game on Valdosta State’s second drive of the third quarter with VSU trailing 17-0. He proceeded to complete his first 12 passes of the game and finished the contest 19-of-21 for 238 yards and four touchdowns. He threw touchdowns on each of his first four drives, including three to Seantavius Jones, who caught a career-high 11 passes, all from Nobles, for 187 yards.

The Blazers’ first drive under Nobles started with 11:26 to go in the third quarter and saw Valdosta State cover 72 yards on 13 plays. The red-shirt freshman completed all six of his passes on the drive for 43, including the final 13 on a pass to Jones that cut the VSU deficit to 17-7 with 6:47 to play in the quarter. The key play on the drive came when VSU’s Anthony Pistelli made a 44 yard field goal, but West Georgia was flagged for roughing the kicker that gave VSU a first down on the UWG 14.

The Wolves moved the ball into VSU territory on the ensuing drive, but a Quan Jones fumble was recovered by Justin Williams and returned to the UWG 39. Nobles proceeded to go five-for-five for 39 yards on the drive, including a five-yard touchdown pass to Roshmel Young that closed the Blazers to within three points.

After forcing a UWG punt, the Blazers again found the end zone as Nobles and Jones hooked up for the second time. The two hooked up for a pair of catches for 35 yards on the drive. The Blazers were forced into a second field goal attempt, but again saw the Wolves rough Pistelli on a 35-yard try to keep the drive alive. VSU capitalized as Nobles found Jones for a five-yard touchdown to give VSU a 21-17 lead with 13:32 to play in the game.

Kenny Moore intercepted a Dallas Dickey pass on the VSU eight yard line on the next West Georgia drive and VSU capitalized as Nobles and Jones connected for the third time on a 13-yard reception, but the Wolves returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards to keep the score at 28-24.

Valdosta State was forced into a three-and-out on its next drive, but a substitution infraction on a fourth-and-four punt play gave the Blazers a first down. VSU kept the ball on the ground the remainder of the drive as Nobles ran twice for 18 yards while Cedric O’Neal carried the ball four times for 36. O’Neal closed out the drive with a six yard run to put VSU in front 35-30.

West Georgia moved the ball 70 yards for a touchdown on its final drive to pull to within five, but the Blazers recovered the on-side kick attempt and ran out the clock for the victory.

The Valdosta State offense struggled during the first half of play, during which it was shutout for the first time in a half for the first time since September 22, 2007, a span of 74 games and 148 halves. The Blazers managed just five first downs and 101 yards of total offense during the first 30 minutes of play and held on to the ball for just 10:11.

West Georgia took advantage of the VSU offensive struggles to build a 10-0 halftime lead. The Wolves first got on the board on a seven-play, 57-yard drive in which it gained all of their yardage on the ground. Quarterback Dallas Dickey did much of the damage as he gained 43 of the 57 yards, before handing off to Quan Jones for a one-yard touchdown run that put UWG in front 7-0 with 10:31 to play in the first quarter.

A fumble on a punt gave West Georgia the ball on the Blazer end of the field midway through the second quarter, which eventually led to a 20-yard Mark Bardenwerper field goal for the final points of the half.

While VSU struggled offensively in the first half, West Georgia gained 205 yards in the frame, including 145 on the ground. Dickey carried the ball 12 times for 95 of the yards and also completed three of his eight passes for 60 yards.

For the game, Valdosta State tallied 440 yards of offense, including 282 passing and 158 on the ground. O’Neal rushed for 96 yards on 17 carries while Regginald Lewis and Chris Anderson had five catches each.

Chris Pope finished with a game-high 16 tackles to give him 337 for his career; just three behind Jessie Tuggle for second place in the Valdosta State record book for career tackles and just 31 behind the school record of 368 held by current Minnesota Viking Larry Dean. [Box score](#)

The University of North Alabama raced to a 21-0 lead in the first nine minutes of the game and rolled to a 49-17 rout of Texas A&M-Kingsville at Braly Stadium. The win, UNA's third straight, ups the Lions record to 4-2 overall. Kingsville falls to 2-4 with its fourth straight loss.

North Alabama used a balanced offensive attack in the win, rushing for 121 yards and passing for a season-high 245. The Javelinas gained 313 yards but turned the ball over three times.

North Alabama took the opening kickoff and scored five plays later. The Lions then added two more scores for a 21-0 lead with 6:16 left in the first period. UNA led 28-10 at the half and 49-10 late in the fourth quarter before the Javelinas added a late score with 12 seconds left.

UNA quarterback Luke Wingo was 13-of-17 passing for 194 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for a score.

The North Alabama defense recorded eight quarterback sacks and had 15 tackles for loss. The Lions also picked off three passes, recording one for a touchdown.

UNA took the opening kickoff and Wingo hit Korey Jones for a 42-yard gain on the first play from scrimmage. Four plays later Wingo scored on a one-yard run and Will Craig added the PAT to make it 7-0 with 13:21 left in the first quarter.

The Lions drove 69 yards on eight plays on their next possession and Wingo capped the drive with a seven-yard TD pass to Diamond Simons. Craig's PAT made it 14-0 at 7:56 of the first quarter.

A 53-yard punt return by Philbert Martial set up UNA's next score as he took the ball all the way back to the Javelinas four-yard line. Jacob Tucker scored two plays later and Craig's PAT made it 21-0 at 6:16 of the first quarter.

Texas A&M-Kingsville got on the scoreboard at 14:54 of the second quarter on a 44-yard Matt Stohl field goal. A UNA fumble then set up a short Javelina TD-drive. Caleb Bedford bulled in to the end zone from the one-yard line and Stoll's PAT made it 21-10 with just 44 seconds left in the half.

North Alabama put together a quick four-play, 50-yard TD drive before the half. Wingo passed 20-yards to Lee Mayhall for the score and Craig's PAT made it 28-10 with nine seconds left in the half.

Wingo hit Markeldon Washington with a 10-yard touchdown pass at 5:02 of the third quarter to make it 35-10 and UNA's Caleb Massey then picked off a Javelina pass and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown to make it 42-10 with 4:10 left in the quarter.

A one-yard Jamarcus Goodloe touchdown run with 4:42 left in the game made it 49-10.

A 23-yard touchdown pass from TAMUK's Bedford to Robert Armstrong with 12 seconds left to close the scoring. **Box score**

Midwestern State staged its fireworks show for Saturday's Homecoming game against West Alabama at halftime.

As it turned out, the timing of the grand finale was apropos as the 24th-ranked Mustangs built a three-touchdown lead and never looked back on the way to a 45-21 victory over No. 8 West Alabama Saturday at Memorial Stadium.

Keidrick Jackson rushed for 136 yards and three touchdowns as Midwestern State put up 427 total yards on the leading defense in the Gulf South Conference, while limiting the GSC's top offense to 293 yards, 376 yards less than its average.

"We really just got the dog crap beat out of us," West Alabama head coach Will Hall said. "Hats off to Midwestern State and (head coach) Bill Maskill. They whipped us in every phase."

The Mustangs (5-1) continued to dominate Gulf South Conference opponents with their sixth straight win over a GSC opponent and second straight over West Alabama (5-2). The Tigers will try to rebound when West Georgia visits Livingston Saturday at 6 p.m.

"We are humiliated. I am humiliated. I am 100 percent at fault for what happened here tonight," Hall said. "We got outplayed and we got outcoached. It's my fault. We were not ready to play. I take full responsibility for it."

Midwestern State drew first blood when Jake Glover found Derek Lockhart on a 46-yard touchdown pass to open the scoring with 6:27 to play in the first quarter.

Lockhart recovered a Malik Lofton fumbled punt late in the first quarter to set up an eventual 3-yard bootleg TD run by Glover with just 34 seconds gone in the second period and the Mustangs led, 14-0.

West Alabama managed just two first downs and 61 yards total offense while punting four times in the first period.

Kyle Caldwell and Chad Toocheck got West Alabama on the scoreboard, connecting on a 4-yard touchdown pass with 11:38 left in the first half to cap a seven-play, 47-yard drive. Caldwell kept the drive alive by gaining 18 yards on 4th and 1 to the MSU eight.

UWA forced a punt on MSU's next possession, but Caldwell fumbled two plays later and Elijah Winston recovered on the Tiger 13. Two plays after that Glover and Lockhart hooked up again, this time from 12 yards for the score and a 21-7 Mustangs lead.

The Mustangs stretched the lead to 28-7 at the half when Jackson capped an 11-play, 53-yard drive with a 2-yard run with 45 seconds left in the second quarter. Jackson scored again on a 9-yard run to open second half scoring and stretch the MSU lead to 35-7.

Jackson, the leading rusher in Midwestern State football history with 3,596 yards, capped his evening with another 2-yard score to make it 42-14 Mustangs with 11:39 left in the game.

West Alabama scored a pair of touchdowns after there was no doubt about the outcome. Gary Johnston capped a nine-play, 70-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter and Reggie Hall scampered 31 yards for a score with 4:03 to play.

"We have seven days to get ready for West Georgia and we have a lot to fix," Hall said. "We are still in the driver's seat in our conference, but we have a lot to work on to get better."

Caldwell completed 8-of-15 for 90 yards and a touchdown. He also led Tiger rushing with 62 yards on 14 carries. Kedrick Rhodes finished with 58 yards on 12 carries. Toocheck had three receptions for 44 yards for UWA.

Robert Jones and Ricky Willis had 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, to pace the West Alabama defense. Marqui Christian recorded 10 total tackles for Midwestern State.

Glover completed 8-of-15 for 171 yards and the two scores to Lockhart, who finished with three catches for 69 yards for the Mustangs.

Tyler Sullivan and the Delta State (4-2, 2-1 GSC) football team would not be denied Saturday, Oct. 19, as the redshirt freshman quarterback led the Statesmen to a 38-36 upset victory over No. 14 Tarleton State University (5-1, 4-0 LSC) at Parker Field-McCool Stadium, as Vince Sciorrotta nailed a 33-yard game-winning field goal with 7.0 seconds remaining.

Sullivan completed 33-of-49 passes for 422 yards and four touchdowns in his first collegiate start at quarterback.

The victory snapped a seven game road winning streak for the Texans and put the Statesmen back on the winning track heading into the final stretch in Gulf South Conference play.

After trading opening possessions in the game, the Texans took possession on their own 21 following a DSU punt and put together an impressive 16-play driving to DSU's 10-yard line. The Statesmen defense forced a Tarleton State field goal by sophomore kicker Blake Barnes giving the Texans a 3-0 lead with 7:12 remaining in the first quarter.

The Statesmen quickly answered with a 71 yard drive which saw Delta State redshirt freshman quarterback Tyler Sullivan, making the first start of his career, complete five successive passes, the last one hitting sophomore receiver Casey Osborne for a 14 yard touchdown strike giving the Statesmen a 7-3 lead with 4:13 remaining the first.

On the following possession the Texans put together another impressive drive. Taking possession at their own 21, the Texans drove 79 yards on 16 plays ending in a one yard dive by quarterback Jake Fenske giving Tarleton State a 10-7 lead with 13:36 remaining in the second.

The Statesmen were forced to punt on their next possession giving Tarleton State possession on its own 18. On the third play of the Texan drive, Statesman defensive lineman Diego Lubin sacked Texan quarterback Aaron Doyle causing a fumble that was snatched up freshman defensive back Chris Norman and returned three yards for a Statesmen touchdown giving DSU a 14-10 lead with 11:10 left in the first half.

On the ensuing kickoff, Tarleton returner Bubba Tandy raced 61 yards to the Delta State 30. A DSU personal foul tacked on another 15 yards giving the Texans possession on the DSU 15. Four plays later, Fenske found receiver Andre Plata for a four yard touchdown giving the Texans a 17-14 at the 9:48 mark.

On the next Statesmen possession, junior quarterback Mo Fennel fumbled giving Tarleton State possession on the Statesmen three yard line. Texan quarterback Aaron Doyle dove in on the next play from scrimmage giving the Texans a 24-14 lead that they carried into halftime.

The second half started much as the first as the Texans and Statesmen traded possessions before DSU took possession on its own 20 yard line following a TSU punt with 10:23 left in the third quarter. From there, Sullivan engineered a 7 play, 80 yard drive ending in a 52 yard scoring strike to junior receiver Ricky Hunt cutting the Texan lead to 24-21.

The Statesmen defense rose to the occasion, forcing the Texans to punt on their next two possessions. With 2:55 remaining in the third, the Statesmen took possession on their own 20. Sullivan once again looked sharp, completing passes of 24 yards to Osborne and 43 yards to Hunt, before finding senior tight end Reed Faulkner open in the endzone for a nine yard touchdown giving DSU a 28-24 lead going into the fourth quarter.

Tarleton State was able to end its second half scoring drought on the first possession of the fourth quarter. The Texans put together a 12 play, 49 yard drive that ended with a 31 yard field goal by Barnes that cut the Delta State lead to 28-21 with 12 minutes remaining in the game.

The Statesmen answered immediately. Following the ensuing kickoff, the Statesmen took possession on their own 36 and needed just two plays an 17seconds to strike as Sullivan hit receiver Patrick Bethley over the middle for a 64-yard strike extending the Delta State lead to 35-27 with 11:25 remaining.

Tarleton State would not give up, however, as Tandy once again turned in a big kickoff return of 54 yards to the Delta State 28 yard lin3. From there the Texans took five plays before Henshaw rushed to pay dirt from five yards out. The two point conversion attempt failed and the Statesmen held a slim 35-33 lead with 7:35 remaining.

The Statesmen were forced to punt on their next possession giving the Texans possession on their own 33 with 6:42 remaining. Texan quarterback Aaron Doyle engineered an impressive drive of his own completing 7-of-9 passes and rushing for 17 yards on a 16 play drive that ate up 5:28 ending with a 20 yard field goal by Barnes giving TSU the 36-35 lead with 1:10 remaining.

The Statesmen were not to be denied, however as freshman kick returner Michael Davison started the drive by taking the ensuing kickoff and racing to the DSU 44. Sullivan quickly hit Osborne for 13 yards to the TSU 43 with 53.2 seconds left. Sullivan then rushed for 13 yards to the Tarleton 30, as the clock raced toward zero. Sullivan then found Osborne again for 16 yards to the Texan 16 with 11.2 seconds remaining in the game, setting up a 33-yard field goal with 7.0 seconds remaining. Freshman kicker Vince Sciorrotta calmly put the kick through the uprights giving the Statesmen the dramatic 38-36 victory. It was his second game-winning field goal of the season.

On the night, the Statesmen racked up 489 yards of total offense and 24 first downs on 75 plays. Sullivan, a redshirt freshman from Louisville, Miss., was 33-of-49 passing for 422 yards and four touchdowns without an interception.

Bethley lead the receivers with 97 yards and a touchdown on four receptions, Hunt had 96 yards and a touchdown on four catches and Osborne had six catches for 80 yards and a touchdown. Pinkston had five catches for 45 yards.

Sullivan also led in the rushing category as well, carrying the ball nine times for 55 yards. Richard Freelon had five rushes for 28 yards and Timothy Foy had seven rushes for 21 yards.

Hunt and Davison combined for 154 kickoff return yards with Hunt having 90 yards on three returns and Davison with 64 on four returns, including the final return of 25 yards.

Although the Texans recorded a record 106 plays (102 plays set during the 1996 season) the Delta State defense held when it counted. The defense was led by a pair of defensive backs with freshman Jereco Beckwith and junior Richard Nash with an amazing 14 total tackles apiece.

It will be a short week for the Statesmen as they travel to Rome, Ga., for a Thursday, Oct. 24, night game against the Hawks of Shorter University. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. and the game will be televised as the Gulf South Conference TV Live Game of the Week. It will also be featured on the Statesmen Sports Network at 5:30 p.m. with the DSU Alumni Association Statesmen Game Day Report. [Box score](#)
