### GSC FOOTBALL TEAMS DOMINATE IN WEEK ONE

Gulf South Conference football squads posted an impressive 6-1 record versus non-conference foes in Week One action, led by four in-region wins and two triumphs over Division I-FCS foes.

Week One was also headlined by two GSC-TV Games of the Week which featured contests pitting the GSC and the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC).

**No. 22 North Alabama** (1-0) kicked off the 2013 campaign at home in Thursday night's telecast, breezing past in-state, in-region rival Miles, 42-7. A crowd of over 12,000 fans showed up in Florence, AL as the Lions recorded their 11th straight season-opening win thanks to 331 yards rushing.

**No. 12 West Alabama** (1-0) hosted the second GSC-TV showdown on Saturday morning, coasting by SIAC foe Clark Atlanta, 42-6. UWA scored 42 unanswered points in the first three quarters, led by 21 points in just over a three-minute span in the first frame.

**No. 1 Valdosta State** (1-0) and nearby SIAC rival Fort Valley State meet on neutral ground at Henderson Stadium in Macon, GA on Saturday. VSU rolled up 454 yards of total offense en route to a 36-21 victory, stretching the defending National Champion's winning streak to 11 dating back to 2012.

**West Georgia** (1-0) notched an impressive road win on Saturday, topping in-region, South Atlantic Conference member Mars Hill, 31-21. UWG preserved its perfect record against MHC (3-0) by scoring a touchdown on offense, defense and special teams.

**No. 25 Delta State** (1-0) kicked off the Todd Cooley era with a win, upsetting NCAA Division I-FCS Mississippi Valley State on the road, 24-14. DSU trailed 7-3 at intermission, but sealed the contest in the second half by outscoring the Delta Devils, 21-7. The Statesmen improved to 4-1 all-time against MVSU.

**New league member Florida Tech** (1-0) celebrated its first official football contest with a home victory on Saturday, upsetting Division I-FCS Stetson in dramatic fashion, 20-13. FIT trailed the Hatters by seven points in the last 10 minutes of the game, only to hit for 14 unanswered points. Quarterback Sean Ashley ran for the game-winning, three-yard TD with just 1:09 remaining.

**Provisional league member Shorter** (0-1) could not build on its first quarter success at NCAA Division I-FCS Charleston Southern, falling on the road, 23-15. The Hawks found pay dirt on their opening possession, but CSU scored 23 unanswered points in the rest of the first half.



**OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**North Alabama running back Lamonte Thompson** (SO, 5-8, 180, Florence, AL)

Thompson earns his first career award after leading UNA's rushing attack in a 42-7 home win over in-state, in-region rival Miles in Thursday night's GSC-TV matchup. The sophomore ran for a career-high 189 yards on 14 carries for a 12.5 average and his longest run came on a 69-yard touchdown scamper in the second quarter. The Florence, AL native reeled-off a 38-yard TD with 11 seconds left in the first frame and he also added one catch for 20 yards.



**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**Delta State defensive back Richard Nash** (JR, 5-9, 180, Macon, GA)

Nash garners the first honor of his career, spearheading the Statesmen's defense in a 24-14 upset over Division I-FCS Mississippi Valley State. The junior made a huge impact in his first game at DSU, tying the team-high total for tackles with seven solo stops, while also logging two tackles for a loss of seven yards. The Macon, GA native did not stop there, intercepting a pass with just over a minute remaining, sealing the victory.

**West Georgia defensive back Marcus Sayles** (FR, 5-10, 170, Alpharetta, GA)

Sayles posts his first-ever laurel, playing a key part in UWG's go-ahead, third-quarter touchdown in its 31-21 triumph at in-region Mars Hill. The Wolves trailed MHC 14-10 early in the third frame until the freshman defensive back blocked a Lions' punt that David Singleton then scooped up and returned 19 yards for a TD. The score gave UWG the lead that never relinquished. The Alpharetta, GA native also shined on defense, intercepting a pass and recording two solo tackles and one assisted stop.

Week Two of Gulf South Conference football action takes place over three days as six of its seven teams take the field this week.

Game Three of the GSC-TV LIVE Game of the Week package kicks off the week when **Provisional member Shorter** hosts South Atlantic Conference foe Mars Hill. The televised contest marks the first of two that the Hawks will host at Barron Stadium in Rome, GA this season.

Football is on the menu on Friday afternoon when No. 25 Delta State steps into AT&T Stadium for the first time ever as part of the third annual 2013 Lone Star Football Festival. DSU plays the second game of the day, facing off against Lone Star Conference member Texas A&M-Commerce at 5:00 pm. The matchup also marks the first game of the nine-game GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge. Friday's battle will be televised live locally on Comcast SportsNet Houston.

Saturday's slate includes two in-region Division II clashes and two more versus NCAA Division I-FCS teams. West Georgia seeks to move its in-region record to 2-0 when its hosts Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference rival Miles. Florida Tech journeys north to South Carolina for its first-ever road game versus its first-ever Division II opponent, SAC member Newberry. No. 22 North Alabama rekindles its rivalry on the road with D-I FSC Jacksonville State for the first matchup since the Lions upset the Gamecocks in the last meeting in 2003. No. 12 West Alabama travels to Lake Charles, LA for a tough road test against McNeese State which is ranked No. 18 in the FCS rankings.

**Game Breakdown:** For the third year in a row, a GSC team takes part in the Lone Star Football Festival at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, TX. This season, **No. 25 Delta State** carries the Conference banner against Lone Star Conference foe Texas A&M-Commerce in the second game on Friday.

The Lone Star Football Festival is a three-day event which enters its third year of existence. The GSC is 2-0 in the festival after North Alabama topped Abilene Christian in 2011 (23-17) and Valdosta State defeated Angelo State a year ago (43-10).

DSU and TAMC are tied all-time, 2-2, and face off for the first time since 1994. The squads have traded victories in their four previous matchups with the home team capturing the win. The Lions took the series opener in 1978 (17-6), while the Statesmen earned a 31-19 triumph in 1979. Texas A&M-Commerce posted a 19-14 victory in 1993, only to see Delta State trade the favor via a 19-14 win of its own in 1994. DSU is 4-13 against Texas schools in its 88-year history.

**Game Breakdown:** Former GSC foes knock the dust of their rivalry as **No. 22 North Alabama** goes to DI-FCS Jacksonville State in the 45th meeting and first matchup since 2003.

The UNA/JSU rivalry dates back to 1949 and the squads were both charter members of the GSC in 1971, playing every season until the Gamecocks reclassified to Division I after the 1992 season. Saturday's game marks just the second meeting since JSU's departure when the Lions earned a 28-16 upset win at Jacksonville in 2003. That triumph also snapped a five-game losing streak for UNA at Burgess-Snow Field dating back to 1986 where JSU owns a 14-8-1 advantage. UNA head coach Bobby Wallace is considered one of the best coaches in Division II history, but Wallace seeks his first-ever win at JSU, going winless in his seven previous trips.

**@ NORTH ALABAMA 42, MILES 7 (THURSDAY, GSC-TV)**

**North Alabama** (1-0) helped flip the switch on the 2013 GSC-TV schedule on Thursday night, running past in-state, in-region SIAC foe Miles at home, 42-7.

UNA fell behind quickly when MC's first play from scrimmage resulted in a 75-yard touchdown pass. The Lions controlled the game from then, led by a 21-point first quarter. **Quarterback Luke Wingo** tied the game via a two-yard rushing TD at 8:58 and added what proved to be the game-winning score from nine yards out at 1:47. **Running back Lemonte Thompson** followed Wingo, providing back-to-back rushing touchdowns of his own. Thompson capped the first quarter with a 38-yard scamper with 11 ticks on the clock and sprinted for a 69-yarder at 6:45 in the second quarter.

**Chris Coffey** provided the lone score of the third quarter by capping a nine-play, 58-yard drive with a five-yard TD run at 8:19. **Freshman Philbert Martial** closed out the scoring with 1:57 left to play, returning a punt 50 yards for six points.

Thompson ran for a game-high 189 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries, while Wingo accounted for 201 total yards and two TDs. North Alabama moved to 8-0 all-time versus Miles and recorded its 11th consecutive season-opener.

**@ #16 WEST ALABAMA 42, CLARK ATLANTA 6 (GSC-TV)**

**No. 16 West Alabama** (1-0) made its presence felt early and often in front of a GSC-TV audience at home over in-region SIAC Clark Atlanta, 42-6.

UWA jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the first 11 minutes, beginning with **wide out Seth Roberts'** seven-yard touchdown catch on the Tigers' opening drive. West Alabama lit the scoreboard on the first play of its second drive when **Markeyu Johnson** ran 36 yards untouched for a TD. The defense got into the act with 4:17 left in the first frame after **DeQuan Shockley** returned a fumble 20 yards for six points.

UWA's offense was held in check until the final 32 seconds of the second quarter when **wide receiver Chad Toocheck** hauled-in a 15-yard pass, making the score 28-0 at the break. **Javae Swindell** pounded-in a three-yard TD at 11:07 in the third stanza and Roberts wrapped up the Tigers' scoring at 2:50 thanks to a 41-yard reception. West Alabama's shutout bid fell to the wayside with 10:55 remaining in the game when the Panthers crossed the goal line.

Swindle ran for a game-best 108 yards and one touchdown on 13 carries, while Roberts led all players with three catches for 52 yards and two TDs. **Quarterback Kyle Caldwell** was an efficient 12-for-19 through the air for 148 yards and two scores. West Alabama improved its record over CAU to 2-0 thanks to its second season-opening win over the Panthers.

**#1 VALDOSTA STATE 36, FORT VALLEY STATE 21 (@ MACON, GA)**

**No. 1 Valdosta State** (1-0) and nearby SIAC rival Fort Valley State met at Henderson Stadium in Macon, GA for the third time in the series history on Saturday. VSU's offense picked up where it left off a year ago, rolling up 454 yards en route to a 36-21 victory.

FVSU drew first blood just 56 seconds into the contest, but the Blazers cut the deficit to four when **Jeremy Grable** blocked, then returned, the ensuing point-after kick for two points. Valdosta State ruled the rest of the first quarter behind **wide receiver Reginald Lewis'** 16-yard touchdown grab and **running back Cedric O'Neal's** 69-yard scoring scamper.

The Wildcats added two points of their own via a safety at 13:01 in the second stanza, but Valdosta State responded with 21 unanswered points. **Quarterback Cayden Cochran** ran for a two-yard TD at 8:29 and **wide out Willie Downs** collected a 42-yard scoring strike at 1:16. Downs then opened the second half with a 38-yard touchdown reception just 42 seconds into the going.

Cochran completed 20-of-32 passes for 285 yards and three TDs and also added a rushing score. O'Neal led all rushers with 94 yards on nine attempts, while Downs caught three balls for 97 yards in his VSU debut. Valdosta State improved to 18-3 versus Fort Valley State thanks to its 10th win in a row and third win over FVSU in Macon, GA.

**WEST GEORGIA 31, @ MARS HILL 21**

**West Georgia** (1-0) won its second straight season opener, upending home-standing, in-region Mars Hill, 31-21, thanks to touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams.

MHC lit the scoreboard first on the game's opening drive, but UWG bounced back with 10 straight points. **Mark Bardenwerper** booted a 21-yard field goal at 1:32 and **Rocky Capobianco** returned an interception 18 yards for six points at 1:10. The Lions' defense returned the favor with an interception TD of their own, giving the hosts a 14-10 edge at the break.

The Wolves' special teams struck again just 1:59 into the second half when **David Singleton** scooped up a blocked punt, returning it 19 yards for a touchdown. **Running back Quan Jones** provided the first West Georgia offensive TD, rambling for seven-yards at 7:27 in the third quarter. MHC pulled with three points with 8:44 left to play, but UWG **signal caller Dallas Dickey** sealed the win via a one-yard scoring sneak at 2:38.

Jones ran for a career-high 114 yards on 19 carries. West Georgia remained undefeated all-time versus Mars Hill at 3-0.

**DELTA STATE 24, @ MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE 14**

**Delta State** (1-0) handed new head coach **Todd Cooley** a win in his first game as a Statesmen, by handing in-state NCAA Division I-FCS rival Mississippi Valley State a 24-14 home loss.

Neither team's offense was able to generate points in the first quarter. DSU grabbed a 3-0 edge at 12:25 in the second frame behind **Vince Sciorrotta's** 21-yard field goal. MVSU took a 7-3 lead before halftime, but the Statesmen scored their first touchdown of the season when **wide receiver Casey Osborne** caught a 13-yard pass at 3:17 in the third quarter. Osborne struck again just 2:56 into the final 15 minutes, extending the lead to 17-7 via a 10-yard reception. The Delta Devils pulled within three points at 8:58, but **Timothy Foy** slammed the door after running for a seven-yard TD at 4:04.

Osborne led all players with eight receptions for 102 yards and two touchdowns, while **quarterback Travis Champion** completed 19-of-29 passes for 246 yards in his DSU debut.

**@ FLORIDA TECH 20, STETSON 13**

**Florida Tech** (1-0) began its inaugural football campaign on a positive note, upsetting in-state Division I-FCS Stetson in dramatic fashion at home, 20-13.

The outcome looked bleak early for FIT, trailing the Hatters 10-0 with 4:48 left in the first half. **Brion Ashley** etched his name in Panthers' football history as time expired, providing the program's first-ever points via a 49-yard field goal.

Ashley's 40-yard field goal was the only points of the third quarter and cut FIT's deficit to 10-6. SU retook a seven-point lead with three points at 10:25 in fourth frame, but Florida Tech mounted an exciting comeback. **Xavier Milton** knotted the score, 13-13, thanks to a 26-yard touchdown grab at 6:25 and **quarterback Sean Ashley** guided an 11-play, 82-yard drive that culminated in his go-ahead, three-yard scoring run.

Milton caught 10 passes for 173 yards and a TD, while Ashley connected on 10-of-21 passes for 160 yards. **Running back Jarvis Giles** led all players with 93 yards on 13 carries.

**Shorter's** (1-0) fourth-quarter rally fell short, resulting in a 23-15 setback at NCAA Division I-FCS Charleston Southern.

CSU controlled the next three quarters, building a 23-7 lead in the fourth. The Hawks pulled within eight points with 10:56 left to play via **Roderick Jones'** nine-yard TD run. **Shorter running back Bradley Moon** ran for a game-high 120 yards on 20 carries and Wilson led all players with 50 yards receiving.
