GSC FOOTBALL SQUADS ON WRONG END OF CLOSE SHAVES

The Gulf South Conference saw itself on the wrong end of close contests against non-conference opponents in Week Two, settling for a 1-5 record.

West Georgia (2-0) was the lone Conference member to bring home a victory, easing past in-region, SIAC foe Miles at home, 31-7. UWG moved to 2-0 on the season via its second straight win over a Super Regional Two team.

The remaining five contests saw GSC squads lose by an average of 5.6 points, led by a pair of near upsets at NCAA Division I-FCS opponents.

No. 24 North Alabama (1-1) drove in-state NCAA DI-FCS rival Jacksonville State to the brink on Saturday night, only to see the Gamecocks outlast the Lions in double-overtime, 24-21. UNA forced overtime when **Lee Mayhall** caught the game-tying touchdown with 13 seconds left to play. JSU secured the triumph in the second extra frame when North Alabama missed a 37-yard field goal in the final possession.

No. 16 West Alabama (1-1) traveled to No. 18 NCAA DI-FCS McNeese State for a first-ever match up, challenging the Cowboys by rolling up 565 total yards in a 44-42 decision. UWA led MSU late in the fourth quarter, 42-38, but the hosts posted the go-ahead TD with 46 ticks on the clock.

Delta State (1-1) took part in the Lone Star Football Festival for the first time on Friday. DSU set a school record with 110 total plays, but the Statesmen found themselves on the wrong end of a shootout after the final whistle blew, 45-37.

New league member Florida Tech (1-1) traveled to Newberry for its first-ever contest versus a fellow Division II opponent. FIT led on two occasions and trailed by just two points in the final 10 minutes, but the Panthers' offense lost traction, resulting in a 23-19 setback.

Provisional GSC member Shorter (0-2) hosted Game Three of the GSC-TV LIVE Game of the Week package on Thursday against in-region, SAC member Mars Hill. Severe weather caused the first-ever delay in GSC-TV history with just under 12 minutes remaining in regulation and SU holding a 30-26 edge. The teams returned to field after an hour delay and MHU dominated the restart by scoring 15 unanswered points en route to a 41-30 final.



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Alabama quarterback Kyle Caldwell (JR, 5-7, 165, Dadeville, AL)

Caldwell takes home his first-ever award after leading UWA to a near-upset at Division I-FCS McNeese State, 44-42. The junior completed 13-of-20 passes (65.0 percent) for 300 yards and three touchdowns despite splitting time with fellow signal caller Gary Johnston. The Dadeville, AL native tossed two TDs in the first quarter, firing a 75-yard score on the first play of the game and then tossing a 26-yarder at 7:40. Caldwell also threw a 57 yard TD on the Tigers' first play in the second half.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

North Alabama defensive lineman Shaquille Smith (JR, 6-2, 265, Jackson, MS)

Smith collects his first career laurel, spearheading the Lions' defense in a 24-21 near-upset at Division I-FCS Jacksonville State. The junior logged six tackles led by five solo stops and racked up three tackles for a loss of 13 yards and one sack for an eight-yard loss. One of the Jackson, MS native's tackles for loss came in JSU's end zone, resulting in a two-point safety just 10 seconds into the second quarter. Smith did not stop there, blocking a Gamecocks' field goal attempt at 2:45 in the opening frame.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Florida Tech placekicker/punter Brion Ashley (FR, 6-4, 205, Port Charlotte, FL)

Ashley becomes the first-ever Florida Tech player to garner GSC Football weekly accolades. The freshman scored FIT's first six points in the Panthers' 23-19 road setback to Newberry, going 2-for-2 on field goal attempts. The Port Charlotte, FL native lit the scoreboard first when he booted a 35-yard field goal on the team's opening drive and he gave his squad a 6-3 lead at 8:37 in the second quarter via a 24-yarder. Ashley also handled the punting duties, kicking six punts for 217 yards (36.2 avg.) including a long of 45 yards.

The race for the 2013 Gulf South Conference Football Championship begins this week as six schools kickoff their respective league slates.

GSC-TV LIVE takes Thursday night off this week, opening the door for **Florida Tech** which hosts **No. 16 West Alabama** in the NCAA Division II Game of the Week, televised by CBS Sports Network. Viewers will watch history in the making, as FIT hosts its first-ever GSC opponent in the first Division II gridiron matchup in the Sunshine State since 1989.

No. 1 Valdosta State returns to the field after a bye-week on Saturday, defending its home turf for the first time this season against **Provisional, in-state GSC member Shorter**. Traditional rivals, **No. 24 North Alabama** and **Delta State**, lock horns for the 57th time on Saturday in Florence with both squads seeking to rebound from losses a week ago.

GSC-TV LIVE Game of the Week action moves to Saturday this week and features another non-conference clash. **West Georgia** hosts Game Four of the 12-game package when Lone Star Conference member No. 25 Midwestern State invades University Stadium.

Game Breakdown: Florida Tech and **No. 16 West Alabama** kick off the 2013 GSC Football league slate on Thursday night in front of a national television audience in the NCAA Division II Game of the Week on CBS Sports Network.

FIT and UWA each seek to get back on the winning track after suffering road losses last week. The Panthers return home for the second time this season after claiming its inaugural football contest two weeks ago against Division I-FCS Stetson, 20-13. The Tigers hope to sooth the wounds left over after a near-upset at McNeese State last Saturday. Florida Tech is the league's first-ever associate new football member. FIT is also the first official addition to the GSC since former members Harding and Ouachita Baptist joined in 2000. OBU was victorious in its GSC opener, while HU lost its first-ever Conference game. West Alabama has lost three in a row on the road dating back to 2012.

Game Breakdown: **No. 24 North Alabama** returns home for the first time in two weeks, hosting **Delta State** which hits the road for the third consecutive time.

The charter GSC members face off in Florence, AL for just the third time in the last eight meetings. The rivals played twice in 2006, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2011 thanks a regular-season clash and a matchup in the NCAA Playoffs.

UNA holds a 31-24-1 all-time lead after putting the brakes on a three-game skid versus DSU in 2012, 20-12. They thrilled the Braly Municipal Stadium faithful in the last battle in 2011 when the Statesmen won in overtime (30-24) in the regular season. North Alabama owns a 17-9 home advantage in the series.

Game Breakdown: The GSC-TV crew returns to the Peach State for the second straight week as West Georgia hosts Lone Star Conference foe, No. 25 Midwestern State, in this week's Saturday edition.

The Wolves have revenge on their minds after falling at MSU in last year's first-ever meeting, 35-17. UWG has sprinted out of the gates this season, notching back-to-back victories over Super Regional Two foes, while the Mustangs dropped their 2013 opener last week to LSC's Tarleton State as part of the Lone Star Football Festival.

West Georgia is 5-10 all-time in GSC-TV action with its last loss coming to LSC member West Texas A&M a year ago. Midwestern State is 1-0 thanks to a win at West Alabama in Game Four last season. The squads also meet as part of the second edition of the "GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge," which features nine games against the two Conferences this year.

@ WEST GEORGIA 31, MILES 7

West Georgia (2-0) claimed its second consecutive victory over an in-region foe, running past SIAC member Miles in UWG's home opener, 31-7.

The Wolves' rushing attack won the day, racking up 296 yards and three touchdowns on 49 total attempts. West Georgia was a bit sluggish out the gates, trailing MC by seven points heading into the second quarter until it exploded for 21 unanswered points in the final 13:59 of the first half.

Running back Quan Jones capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive via a two-yard TD run, followed by **Donovan Jackson's** 48-yard interception return for a touchdown at 12:20. Jones closed out the first-half scoring with another two-yard TD jaunt with 7:52 on the clock.

Neither team lit the scoreboard in the third quarter. **Placekicker Mark Bardenwerper** restarted the scoring just 1:30 into the final 15 minutes by nailing a 35-yard field goal and **running back Seth Hinsley** sewed up the contest by reeling off a 28-yard TD run at 1:42.

Jones recorded his second straight 100-yard performance, dashing for a career-high 139 yards on 23 carries. Jackson's return marked the second game in a row that a Wolves' defender returned an interception for six points. West Georgia increased its all-time lead over Miles to 5-1 after suffering its first-ever loss to the Golden Bears a year ago.

@ JACKSONVILLE STATE 24, #22 NORTH ALABAMA 21 (DOUBLE-OVERTIME)

No. 22 North Alabama (1-1) and former in-state, GSC-rival Jacksonville State entertained a crowd of over 20,000 fans with a thrilling finish as JSU outlasted UNA in double-overtime, 24-22.

The contest featured just three touchdowns starting with JSU's TD on its first play from scrimmage at 12:43 in the first quarter. The Gamecocks stretched their lead to 10-0 at 7:10, while UNA's posted its lone points of the first half on a safety just 10 seconds into the second stanza when **Shaquille Smith** and **Willie Bland** teamed up on a sack in the end zone. A Jacksonville State field goal at 4:54 gave the hosts a 13-2 lead at the break.

Lions' placekicker Michael Schuster cut the deficit to 13-5 as his 49-yard field goal marked the lone points of the third frame. **Quarterback Luke Wingo** ran for a one-yard scoring sneak with 11:04 left to play, only to see JSU's defense force a safety of its own at 8:25. The Gamecocks seemed to have put the game away, grabbing an 18-11 lead with 3:02 on the clock, but UNA engineered a game-tying drive which culminated in a five-yard touchdown catch by **Lee Mayhall** with 13 seconds left.

The rivals traded field goals in the first overtime and JSU added another three points in its second overtime possession. North Alabama drove to the Gamecocks' 20-yard line, but the Lions' 37-yard field goal went wide-right, sealing the win for JSU.

North Alabama outgained Jacksonville State offensively, 427-311, and held a five minute advantage in time of possession. **Chris Coffey** ran for a game-high 99 yards on 11 carries, while Mayhall led all receivers with six catches for 53 yards.

@ MCNEESE STATE 44, #12 WEST ALABAMA 42

No. 12 West Alabama (1-1) and Division I-FCS No. 18 McNeese State scored early and often, but UWA could not keep the Cowboys out of the end zone late in the fourth quarter, falling 44-42.

The Tigers lit the scoreboard on the first play of the game when **wide receiver Chad Toocheck** hauled in a 75-yard touchdown catch just 12 seconds into the going. MSU responded on its first offensive series, only to see **West Alabama's Seth Roberts** collect a 26-yard TD strike at 7:40. The Cowboys knotted the score with 1:49 left in the first quarter, but **UWA quarterback Gary Johnston** ran for a one-yard TD at 13:11 in the second frame. McNeese State closed the first half with 10 unanswered points and a 24-21 halftime advantage.

The Tigers pulled back ahead on the first offensive play in the third quarter when Ty Morgan reeled-in a 57-yard touchdown pass at 12:49. MSU tallied a rushing TD at 6:34, but West Alabama rebounded with a just 22 seconds remaining in the quarter after **Kedrick Rhodes'** 29-yard run.

The Cowboys regained a 38-35 edge at 12:58 in the final 15 minutes, only to see Johnston add a two-yard rushing TD at 3:41. McNeese State was able to drive into UWA territory in the waning moments and posted the game-winning touchdown on a fourth-and-four pass.

UWA quarterback Kyle Caldwell completed 13-of-20 passes for 300 yards and three touchdowns. Toocheck caught three passes for 116 yards, while Rhodes led all players with 75 yards on nine carries.

TEXAS A&M-COMMERCE 45, #25 DELTA STATE 37 (FRIDAY, ARLINGTON, TX)

No. 25 Delta State (1-1) set a school record with 110 offensive plays, but the Statesmen could not fight off the turnover bug as Texas A&M-Commerce scored 21 points off DSU miscues in Friday's 45-37 loss at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

The Statesmen drew first blood at 8:40 in the first quarter thanks to **Patrick Bethley's** 40-yard touchdown reception. A&M-Commerce hit for 14 points in less than a two-minute span, and Delta State pulled within four points after **Vince Sciorrotta's** 36-yard field goal as time expired in the quarter.

The Lions added a punt return for a score at 8:48 in the second frame, and DSU closed the first half with a pair of field goals by Sciorrotta from 27 and 34 yards, respectively. Texas A&M-Commerce posted a 28-16 lead after a fumble return for a touchdown, but Delta State rallied to a 30-28 advantage thanks to 16-yard grab by **Casey Osborne** and **D'Juan Bellaire's** five-yard TD run.

The Lions dominated the fourth quarter, scoring the first 17 points and Delta State notched its final score on **Timothy Foy's** one-yard TD run at 1:06.

Quarterback Travis Champion came off the bench to lead DSU by completing 31-of-40 passes for 265 yards and TD.

Osborne caught nine balls for 68 yards and Bethley added 91 yards on seven grabs. DSU's total play mark was the second-highest in a game in GSC history, ranking 17 plays shy of the record set by Harding in 2009.

The loss gave A&M-Commerce a 3-2 advantage in the all-time series.

@ NEWBERRY 23, FLORIDA TECH 19

Florida Tech (1-1) hit the road to battle its first-ever Division II opponent, facing in-region, SAC foe Newberry. The Panthers led 13-7 at the half, but were outscored in the second half, 16-6, en route to a 23-19 setback.

FIT provided the lone points in the opening quarter when **Brion Ashley** connected on a 35-yard field goal at 9:50. Newberry added a touchdown just 1:28 into the second stanza, but the rest of the quarter belonged to the Panthers who entered the locker room with a 13-7 edge. Ashley booted a 24-yard field goal at 8:37, while **defensive back Trai Cadore** returned an interception 100 yards for a TD with 4:13 on the clock. The return marked just the sixth of its kind in GSC history and first since 2009.

The Indians owned the third quarter with 14 unanswered points, but Florida Tech pulled within 21-19 after **Trevor Sand's** 16-yard touchdown run with 9:13 remaining. Newberry's defense forced a safety, giving the hosts a 23-19 edge with 5:54 left to play and they continued to hold FIT offense out of the end zone the rest of the way.

Sand ran for a game-high 64 yards on 14 carries and **Xavier Milton** caught five passes for 53 yards.

MARS HILL 41, @ SHORTER 30 (THURSDAY, GSC-TV)

Shorter (1-1) hosted in-region, SAC foe Mars Hill and the GSC-TV crew on Thursday night. The teams combined for over 1,000 yards of total offense and endured a one-hour weather delay, as SU could not hold on to a fourth-quarter lead, resulting in a 41-30 loss.

The squads traded blows throughout the first four quarters until MHU closed the contest with 21 unanswered points. SU sprinted out of the gates in the first frame led by **quarterback Eric Dodson's** 55-yard scoring rush on the game's first offensive play. The Lions also hit pay dirt on their first possession, only to see the Hawks add Guy Hunt's 32-yard field goal at 8:56 and **Bradley Moon's** one-yard TD plunge at 3:27. The squads traded passing scores in the second stanza, resulting in a 23-14 halftime lead for Shorter.

Mars Hill cut its deficit to three points via the lone points in third quarter, but SU started the final 15 minutes with **Sean Fowler's** six-yard touchdown scamper just eight seconds into the fourth frame. MHU charged back with a TD of its own less than three minutes later and that's when heavy rain and lightning forced an hour-long weather delay. Mars Hill took advantage of the delay, dominating the restart by outscoring the hosts 14-0 in the final 7:59.

Dodson rolled up a game-best 186 yards on 15 carries and also passed for 132 yards and a score. MHU earned a mark of revenge after falling at home to GSC member West Georgia a week ago.
