GSC GOES 6-1 IN WEEK ONE

The Gulf South Conference sprinted out of the starting gates in 2014, posting a 6-1 record in the opening week of the 2014 season.

Five GSC squads earned important Division II Super Region 2 victories led by four wins versus Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference members.

Shorter University celebrated its first game as an official GSC member by kicking off 2014 with a 28-24 home triumph over SIAC foe Paine College. The visiting Lions tried to mount a game-winning drive in the final two minutes, but Jordan Shaw's interception sealed the win for the Hawks.

Valdosta State also began its home schedule on a positive note, topping Albany State, 38-10. VSU's "Black Swarm" defense led the way, forcing five ASU turnovers that led to three Blazers' touchdowns.

Delta State and **West Alabama** fought off weather-delays on the road to complete the GSC's sweep versus the SIAC. DSU breezed past Fort Valley State, 56-13, scoring 56 unanswered points after the Golden Rams hit pay dirt on the game's opening possession. West Alabama kicked off the Brett Gilliland Era with a win, overcoming a two-hour weather delay to secure a 44-20 victory over nearby rival Stillman.

West Georgia secured the GSC's perfect in-region record by giving new head coach Will Hall a win in his first game at the helm. The Wolves ran past visiting Mars Hill, rushing for 392 yards en route to a 38-26 decision.

Florida Tech's offense rolled up 531 yards of total offense in a 54-126 victory at in-state Division I-FCS Stetson, led by a six touchdown effort by freshman quarterback Mark Cato.

Mississippi College traveled to nearby rival Belhaven on Saturday. The Choctaws trailed BU by just six points entering the final 15 minutes, but the Blazers scored 12 unanswered points in the fourth quarter resulting in a 32-14 final.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Florida Tech quarterback Mark Cato

Cato turned-in a breakout performance in his first career game, having a hand in six of the Panthers' seven touchdowns in Saturday's 54-12 victory at Stetson. The Alachua, Fla. native was 7-for-15 through the air for 191 yards and four touchdowns and posted an efficiency rating of 228.3. Cato did not stop there, ranking second on the team in rushing, compiling 63 yards on 19 carries with two TDs. His first pass attempt resulted in a 69-yard touchdown that set the school-record for the longest scoring pass in a game. Cato became FIT's first-ever GSC Offensive winner since joining the league in 2013.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Georgia linebacker Tyrell Adams

Adams secured UWG's first Defensive honor since 2012 after spearheading the Wolves' defense in a 38-26 home victory over in-region Mars Hill. The senior racked up a game-high tying seven total tackles led by three solo stops and three tackles for a loss of 15 yards. The Atlanta, Ga. native also posted two sacks for 14 yards, forced one fumble and recorded one quarterback hurry.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State punter/placekicker Anthony Pistelli

Pistelli turned-in a stellar performance in all four phases of VSU's kicking game in the Blazers' 38-10 home win over in-state, in-region rival Albany State. The sophomore opened the scoring at 2:10 in the first quarter, booting a career-high 45-yard field goal on his lone attempt of the day. The Thomasville, Ga. native was a perfect 5-for-5 on point-after attempts and he booted seven kickoffs for 444 yards (63.9 avg.) and one touchback. Lastly, Pistelli was called upon to punt in the second half, booming two balls for 100 yards and a touchback headlined by a 62-yarder in his first career attempt.



FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Game Breakdown: GSC-TV flips the switch on the 10th edition of its annual television package when **No. 5 North Alabama** travels to future league member **Mississippi College**.

MC returns to the GSC landscape after leaving the league as part of its reclassification to Division III in 1996. The Choctaws will play a full GSC schedule for two seasons before they will earn an official return in 2016-17.

UNA and MC rekindle their rivalry with the all-time series up for grabs. Saturday marks the 30th meeting in a series that is tied, 14-14-2. The Lions owned the end of the series by claiming four in a row from 1992-95, while the Choctaws claimed six of seven contests from 1985-91. Robinson-Hale Stadium has not been much of an advantage for Mississippi College against North Alabama with the Lions earning nine wins in 15 meetings. UNA is 9-9 in GSC-TV contests dating back to 2005.
