IVY LEAGUE IN THE POSTSEASON

PRINCETON PUSHES KENTUCKY TO THE LIMIT, FALLS 59-57 ON LAST-SECOND LAYUP

TAMPA, Fla. -- It's games like this that gave the Princeton men's basketball program its reputation as giant killers, or at least giant scarers. So while the win over UCLA in 1996 will remain alone as Princeton's most stunning NCAA Tournament victory, the 59-57 loss to fourth-seeded Kentucky will stand with others in which the Tigers gave the big names a run in the Big Dance.

Kentucky's Brandon Knight missed his first seven shots and even found himself on the bench in the final minute against Princeton. His confidence could have been shaken. His ego could have been bruised. After all, he was a freshman playing in his first NCAA tournament game. Then again, Knight's no ordinary newcomer. Held scoreless for more than 39 minutes, Knight made a driving layup with two seconds remaining to lift Kentucky to a 59-57 win over 13th-seeded Princeton.

Princeton's four leading scorers on the season were its four leading scorers in the game, with **Dan Mavraides'** 14 points leading all four in double figures. **Douglas Davis** added 13, while **Kareem Maddox** had 12 and **Ian Hummer** 11.

HARVARD FALLS IN NIT FIRST ROUND TO OKLAHOMA STATE

STILLWATER, Okla. -- Kyle Casey led the way with 13 points, while **Keith Wright** and **Laurent Rivard** tallied 10 points apiece, but the Harvard men's basketball team dropped its first-round game of the Postseason National Invitation Tournament (NIT) to Oklahoma State, 71-54, at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Brandyn Curry chipped in with six assists, while **Oliver McNally** scored nine points.

Harvard, which was making the program's first appearance in the NIT, concluded its season with a 23-7 overall record and a share of its first-ever Ivy League title with Princeton.

Led by **Marshall Moses'** 18 points and eight rebounds, Oklahoma State had its highest-scoring first half of the season (41 points) and won an NIT game for the first time since 1997 after suffering three-straight, first-round NIT losses from 2006 to 2008.

2010-11 HIGHLIGHTS

- Yale junior center **Greg Mangano** was the first player in school history to average a double-double for the season since **Chris Dudley** (17.6 ppg, 13.3 rpg) in 1986-87 and the first Ivy player since Harvard's **Kyle Snowden** (15.1 ppg, 11.1 rpg in all games, 14.1 ppg, 10.8 rpg in Ivy games) in 1995-96. In addition, Mangano had a school record 85 blocks, which is the third-most in Ivy history. His 51 blocks in League games is an Ivy record as well.

- The Ivy League boasted multiple teams in the postseason for the third time in four years with Princeton making its 24th appearance in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship and Harvard receiving its first-ever Postseason National Invitation Tournament (NIT) bid. Princeton's 24 NCAA Tournament appearances lead the Ivy League, breaking a tie with Penn.

- Princeton made the 68th NCAA Tournament appearance for an Ivy League team and 54th for the League since the League's first official season (1956-57). Since 1939, Ivy teams have combined for a 40-78 (.339) record in 68 appearances. Since 1957, the Ivy League has a 31-58 (.348) record in 54 appearances.

- Harvard made the Ivy League's ninth Postseason NIT appearance and first for the League since Brown in 2003. League teams have combined for a 8-8 (.500) record in those nine appearances.

- The one-game playoff to determine the League's NCAA Tournament automatic bid recipient was the eighth in Ivy men's basketball history. Princeton has been involved in all eight playoffs, winning four (1963, 1981, 1996 and 2011). Princeton's 63-62 victory was the third one-point win in League playoff history. The Tigers' were on the losing end of previous two -- 1959 (Dartmouth 69, Princeton 68) and 1980 (Penn 50, Princeton 59).

- The League's late-season appearances on ESPN3.com drew a combined 85,017 unique viewers: 13,494 for the March 5 Princeton-Harvard game, 17,074 for the March 8 Princeton-Penn game and 54,449 for the March 12 Harvard-Princeton playoff game.

• Brown freshman guard **Sean McGonagill** was the fourth Bear to be selected Ivy League Rookie of the Year, joining **Mike Waitkus** (1982-83), **Carlos Williams** (1989-90) and **Damon Huffman** (2003-04).

• The League's Player of the Year and four of the five players on each of the first and second teams earning All-Ivy honors return for their respective teams for the 2011-12 season.

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

BROWN

Senior F **Peter Sullivan** completed his career with several Brown milestones: fourth in all-time career scoring (1,361 points) and career free throws (393), seventh in single-season free throws (151) and eighth in career three-pointers (142). Senior G **Adrian Williams** played in 115 career games for the Bears, more than any other player in school history.

COLUMBIA

Columbia finished the 2010-11 season with a 10-4 record at Levien Gymnasium, tying its the best record at home in a season (2006-07). Junior G **Noruwa Agho's** 470 points were the most since **Craig Austin** scored 496 during the 2000-01 campaign. Agho's 119 assists were the most by a Lion in a single season since **Mike Jelinsky's** 145 in the 1990-91 season.

CORNELL

Cornell ended the 2010-11 on a season-long three-game win streak. Sophomore F **Errick Peck** scored in double figures in 16 of his last 21 games, averaging 13.0 points on 96-of-214 shooting (.449) after averaging just 4.2 points on 9-of-39 shooting (.231) over the first six contests. Junior G **Chris Wroblewski** posted at least four assists in 22 of his last 26 contests.

DARTMOUTH

Dartmouth ended the season on an 11-game losing streak, its longest since dropping the final 15 contests in the 2003-04 season. For the second straight year, the Big Green's leading scorer averaged fewer than 10 points (sophomore G **R.J. Griffin** at 9.4 ppg). The last time Dartmouth's scoring leader did not average double figures previously was the 1949-50 season. Senior C **Clive Weeden** played in 109 games during his Big Green career, tying a school record, and also finished among the program's all-time top 10 in blocked shots (68).

HARVARD

Harvard's 23 overall wins and 12 conference wins established new team records. The Crimson went 14-0 at Lavietes Pavilion, a new program best for home wins in a season. Junior F **Keith Wright** scored in double figures in 27 games and started all 30 contests for Harvard during his junior campaign. Wright blocked 54 shots, which rank second in school history for a single season.

PENN

On the Penn all-time scoring list, senior F **Jack Eggleston** finished his career with 1,248 points, while junior G **Zack Rosen** is at 1,121 points and senior G **Tyler Bernardini** is at 1,079 points. Rosen and Bernardini have one year of eligibility left. Eggleston completed his career with exactly 700 rebounds, becoming the first player to grab 700 boards since **Mark Zoller**, who graduated in 2007.

PRINCETON

Princeton's 32 games played this season is the most in school history. A year ago, Princeton played 31 games for the first time. Princeton's back-to-back 20-win seasons (22-9 in 2009-10) were its first since the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons. Head coach **Sydney Johnson** accepted same position at Fairfield on April 4. Johnson finished his tenure with the Tigers with a 66-53 record. He was the third consecutive alumnus to serve as the team's head coach.

YALE

Yale was invited to participate in the 2011 College Basketball Invitational but was forced to decline the invitation with several players travelling overseas during its spring break. The Bulldogs finished fourth or better in Ivy League play for the 11th consecutive season. Yale's 15 wins was its most since the 2005-06 season. Led by junior C **Greg Mangano**, the Bulldogs return four starters for the 2011-12 season.

IVY NOTES

YALE'S VANCISIN EARNS HALL OF FAME HONOR

Joe Vancisin, Yale's all-time winningest men's basketball coach, was elected to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame along with seven other college basketball greats on March 2.

Virginia's **Ralph Sampson** and North Carolina's **James Worthy** headlined the Class of 2011 along with coaches **Bob Knight** and **Eddie Sutton**, players **Cazzie Russell** and **Chris Mullin** and contributor **Eddie Einhorn**. Vancisin coached at Yale for 19 seasons, leading the Bulldogs to two Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. He left Yale in 1975 to become the NABC's executive director for 17 years before his retirement in 1992. Under his leadership, the NABC debuted its college all-star game at the NCAA Final Four, elected its first African-American president in Georgetown's **John Thompson** and adopted a code of ethics.

The Class of 2011 will be inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Sunday, Nov. 20, 2011, at the Midland Theatre in Kansas City as part of a three-day celebration of college basketball. The hall of fame is located in the College Basketball Experience, a world-class entertainment facility that provides a multi-faceted interactive experience for fans of the game. On Nov. 21-22, Missouri, California, Georgia and Notre Dame will compete at Sprint Center in the CBE Classic.

HARVARD'S SANDERS ELECTED TO NAISMITH HALL OF FAME

Former Harvard head coach and Boston Celtics legend **Tom "Satch" Sanders** was elected as a member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2011 on April 4.

Sanders was elected as a contributor from the Veteran's Committee and was among a list of inductees that included former NBA stars **Chris Mullin** and **Dennis Rodman**; ABA/NBA legend **Artis Gilmore**, Stanford women's basketball head coach **Tara VanDerveer**, four-time Olympic gold medalist **Teresa Edwards**, European star **Arvydas Sabonis**, all-time NCAA wins leader **Herb Magee**, coaching legend **Tex Winter**, and former Harlem Globetrotter **Reece "Goose" Tatum**, who will be honored posthumously.

Sanders, a forward who played with the Celtics from 1960-77, won eight National Basketball Association (NBA) Championships during his time in Boston and ranks third in NBA history in championship rings. He averaged 9.6 points per game and 6.3 rebounds per contest during his 13-year playing career. After retiring from the Celtics, Sanders entered the coaching field and served as head coach of the Crimson from 1973-77.

During his stint in Cambridge, Harvard won 40 games and went 27-29 in Ivy League play. The Crimson posted 9-5 conference records in 1973-74 and 1974-75, finishing third in Sanders's second season at the helm. Sanders returned to the NBA in 1977, coaching the Celtics for parts of two seasons.

Sanders is the second member of the Harvard basketball family to have been elected to the Basketball Hall of Fame, as **Edward Wachter**, who coached the Crimson from 1920-33, was enshrined in 1961, and is the 24th person with Ivy League ties to be elected and the first since Dartmouth's **David Gavitt** was enshrined in 2006.

SEVEN BASKETBALL IVIES NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-IVY

Brown's **Peter Sullivan**, Columbia's **Brian Barbour**, Cornell's **Chris Wroblewski**, Dartmouth's **Clive Weeden**, Harvard's **Brandyn Curry**, Penn's **Jack Eggleston** and Yale's **Raffi Mantilla** were among the 80 student-athletes named Academic All-Ivy for the 2010-11 winter season.

IVY PERFECTION

Intriguing research by Princeton Assistant Director of Athletic Communications **Andrew Borders** revealed that Princeton was the 25th team to start 8-0 and the 30th team to start 7-0 in League games. This year's Princeton team was the 11th Tiger team, the first since 1998-99, to be undefeated at the midway point of the League's double round-robin schedule. That 1998-99 Princeton squad ended the season with an 11-3 League mark, good for second place. Of the 30 teams to win their first seven Ivy games, none finished lower than second in the final standings. A deeper look discloses that 25 teams went 8-0, 22 went 9-0, 19 went 10-0 and 16 went 11-0. Even more interesting, 13 teams reached 12-0 and did not falter in their final two games to finish without a loss in 14 Ivy games.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

Both Harvard and Princeton were perfect at home this season. Harvard amassed a 14-0 record at Lavietes Pavilion and has won 17 in a row at home, which is tied for the 10th-longest active streak in the country entering the 2011-12 season. Princeton wrapped up a 12-0 home schedule, tying the 2010-11 team with the 1989-90 and 1997-98 squads for the most games won in Jadwin Gym without a loss in a single season. The 2010-11 Tigers are the sixth team in the 42 full seasons of Jadwin Gym to complete the slate without a loss, following the 1975 (10-0), 1977 (11-0), 1990 (12-0), 1991 (9-0) and 1998 (12-0) teams. Overall, Princeton has won 16 straight at home, tied for the 13th among the active leaders.

"M" MARKS THE MILESTONE

It was a milestone year on the court for Ivy League men's basketball as six players reached 1,000 career points this season. Penn senior forward **Jack Eggleston** was the first to reach the mark on Dec. 22 vs. Delaware. Columbia junior guard **Noruwa Agho** followed, hitting the mark on Jan. 29 at Dartmouth to become the Lions' 24th 1,000-point scorer. Eggleston's teammates, junior guard **Zack Rosen** and senior guard **Tyler Bernardini**, each reached the mark in back-to-back weeks in February becoming the 36th and 37th players in school history to reach 1,000 points. Actually, Rosen had the chance to reach 1,000 in the same game that Princeton junior guard Douglas Davis reached the plateau. Davis passed 1,000 points in the Tigers' Feb. 8 overtime win over Penn. Rosen finished that game at 999 career points and then eclipsed 1,000 in the Quakers' next game on Feb. 11 at Cornell. Princeton senior forward **Dan Mavraides** became the sixth Ivy player this year and 28th Tiger all-time to join the club, scoring his 1,000th point against Harvard on March 5.

2011 IVY LEAGUE MEN'S BASKETBALL PLAYOFF

Junior guard **Douglas Davis** shot Princeton back into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven years with a leaning jump shot at the buzzer to give the Tigers a wild 63-62 win over Harvard in the 2011 Ivy League Men's Basketball Playoff March 12 at Yale's John J. Lee Amphitheater in New Haven, Conn. It was the eighth playoff in Ivy League men's basketball history. Princeton has been involved in all eight playoffs, winning four (1963, 1981, 1996 and 2011). The win evened the Tigers' Ivy playoff record at 4-4 (.500). The Ivy League conducts a playoff in men's basketball when teams tie for the regular-season title to determine League's automatic bid recipient for the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. Harvard and Princeton share the 2010-11 Ivy League title with identical 12-2 records in Ivy play. The two teams split in their season series with Harvard falling to Yale on Feb. 26 and Princeton bested by Brown on Feb. 19.

TITLE HISTORY

Harvard earned a share of its first-ever Ivy League men's basketball title since the League officially began play in 1956-57 with a March 5 win over Princeton. With its March 8 win over Penn, Princeton earned a share of its League-leading 26th Ivy title and its first since the 2003-04 season. This year's Ivy championship ends what is tied for Princeton's longest drought -- six seasons -- between Ivy titles. The Tigers went without a league crown from 1970-75, also a six-season span. Here is a look at the Ivy men's basketball titles by school:

THE 14-GAME TOURNAMENT

In a conference where there is no postseason tournament to determine the automatic bid representative for the NCAA Tournament, the Ivy League's double round-robin conference schedule has been described as the "14-game tournament."

It is a term that has been embraced by many of those in and around the League and to those who cover and follow Ancient Eight teams. The bulk of the "tournament" is played over six weekends from late January to early March in a grueling Friday-Saturday format that have tested the League's best over the years. In 55 Ivy League seasons, only 13 teams have gone a perfect 14-0 in Ivy play. Penn has done it seven times (1969-70, 1970-71, 1992-93, 1993-94, 1994-95, 1999-2000 and 2002-03), Princeton five times (1968-69, 1975-76, 1990-91, 1996-97 and 1997-98) and Cornell once (2007-08).

On the other end of the spectrum, there has been four times that a 10-4 record won the Ivy title. Interestingly, it happened in four-straight seasons from 1983-84 to 1986-87. Penn did it twice in 1984-85 and 1986-87 with identical 13-14 overall records, the most overall losses for an Ivy team to win the League title. Princeton took home the 1983-84 title and Brown did the same in 1985-86 with 10 Ivy wins.

The 2011 playoff marked the eighth time (1958-59, 1962-63, 1968-69, 1979-80, 1980-81, 1995-96, 2001-02, 2010-11) the League's NCAA Tournament representative was decided by a playoff. The playoff following the 2001-02 season was the only three-team playoff in League history which saw Yale defeat Princeton in the first game at The Palestra followed by Penn beating Yale in Easton, Pa., to earn the League's automatic bid.

IVY NOTES

20-WIN SEASONS

The Ivy League has produced two 20-win teams eight times with Harvard and Princeton reaching the plateau this season, marking the first time the feat was accomplished in consecutive seasons. The 2009-10 season marked the first time in Ivy League men's basketball history that three teams reached the 20-win plateau in the same season -- Cornell (29-5), Princeton (22-9) and Harvard (21-8). The Big Red's 27 regular-season wins are the most regular-season victories in Ivy history. Here's the all-time list of seasons with two or more 20-win Ivy teams (*NCAA Tournament team):

EPIC COMEBACK

Feb. 12, 2011 is another date that has been added to the storied history of Ivy League men's basketball. On that Saturday night in Cambridge, Mass., at Lavietes Pavilion, Harvard staged an epic comeback, coming from 22 points down at halftime and 24 points down in the second half, to steal a 85-78 win over Brown.

Harvard's 24-point comeback is tied for the 10th-largest second-half deficit overcome and 14th-largest all-time deficit overcome in NCAA Division I men's basketball history. The feat is also the second-largest deficit overcome by an Ivy League team behind Princeton's 27-point, come-from-behind victory over Penn on Feb. 9, 1999. In that game, Princeton trailed 33-9 at the half and fought back to a 50-49 win. Coming back from down 22 points at halftime is the fourth-largest halftime deficit overcome in Division I history.

Harvard trailed by 22 points, 53-51, at halftime then went down 24 after Brown's **Dockery Walker** connected on a layup at the 19:53 mark in the second half. From that point, Harvard went on a 34-9 run over the next 11:11 to take the lead at 65-64 on a **Brandyn Curry** three-pointer. Brown regained the lead on the next possession on a basket by **Tucker Halpern**. Harvard responded with three-pointer by **Christian Webster** to take a lead that it would not relinquish again. The Crimson extended the lead to 10 points by the 5:00 mark and would not let the Bears any closer than six in the waning minutes.

Harvard shot 68 percent from the floor (17-of-25) and 72.7 percent from long distance (8-of-11) in the second half, outscoring Brown 54-25 to erase the deficit and record one of the greatest comebacks in college basketball history.

OVERTIME STREAK

Penn became just the second Ivy team in League history to play three-straight overtime games. The Quakers went into extras in consecutive games over a six-day period against Harvard on Feb. 5 (83-82 2ot [loss]), Princeton on Feb. 8 (62-59 ot [loss]) and Cornell on Feb. 11 (82-71 ot [loss]). The only other occurrence in League history came during the 1988-89 season when Harvard played three straight overtime games against Cornell on Feb. 17 (75-74 ot [loss]), Columbia on Feb. 18 (82-76 ot [win]) and Brown on Feb. 24 (100-91 ot [win]).

POLL HISTORY

According to CollegePollArchive.com, the Ivy League has had six different teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. Penn leads the way with 78 appearances followed by Princeton (41), Columbia (31), Dartmouth (5), Yale (4) and Cornell (3). The Quakers achieved the Ivies' highest-ever AP ranking, No. 2, in the final 1971-72 poll after a 25-3 season.

Last season, Cornell became the first Ivy team to be ranked in 12 years, breaking into both the AP and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls at No. 25 on Feb. 1, 2010. It was the first time in 59 years Cornell had been ranked in a national poll in men's basketball since its 1950-51 team climbed as high as No. 14 in the AP Poll on Jan. 3. Prior to that, the last Ivy team to appear in the national polls was the 1997-98 Princeton squad that finished No. 8 in the final AP Poll and No. 16 in the final USA Today/NABC Poll. Prior to Cornell's national ranking last season, the last team other than Penn or Princeton to be ranked in the national polls was Columbia in 1969-70, climbing as high at No. 13 during a seven-week run.

For the third-straight season and fourth time in six years, Harvard received votes in the AP Poll. The Crimson received one vote in the Jan. 24, Jan. 31 and Feb. 21 and March 7 polls this season and received a vote in four different AP polls (Nov. 23, Jan. 11, Jan. 18 and Jan. 25) during the 2009-10 season. Harvard received one vote in the March 7 ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll, marking the first time the Crimson received a vote in that poll in program history.

Fresh off its Ivy playoff win over the Crimson, Princeton received three votes in the March 14 ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll for its first mention in the poll since that final No. 16 ranking to close out the 1997-98 season.

BROWN'S LEFFELMAN, CORNELL'S WROBLEWSKI NAMED 2010-11 CAPITAL ONE® ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

Brown senior guard **Garrett Leffelman** and Cornell junior guard **Chris Wroblewski** were named to the 2010-11 Capital One Academic All-America® Men's Basketball Teams, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Leffelman was named to the second team while Wroblewski was selected to the third team. Leffelman and Wroblewski increase the Ivy League all-time total to 35 men's basketball student-athletes who have been named Academic All-America. It marked the third consecutive year and the fifth time in six seasons the Ivy League had at least one student-athlete named Academic All-America. Columbia's **Patrick Foley** was named to the third team following the 2008-09 season and to the first team following the 2009-10 season.

IVY NOTES

NEW FACES, NEW PLACES

The 2010-11 edition of Ivy League men's basketball featured some new faces manning the sidelines in Columbia's **Kyle Smith**, Cornell's **Bill Courtney** and Dartmouth's **Paul Cormier** with Penn's **Jerome Allen** having his first full season at the helm after spending half of last season as the Quakers' interim coach. The four new Ivy head coaches were the tied for the second-most in Division I with the Big East Conference and the Northeast Conference behind the six new mentors in Conference USA.

IVIES IN THE NBA

Former Harvard guard and three-time All-Ivy League selection **Jeremy Lin** became the 47th player in Ivy League history to see time in the National Basketball Association (NBA). Lin is the first Ivy Leaguer to play for an NBA team since Penn's **Matt Maloney** suited up for the Atlanta Hawks and Yale's **Chris Dudley** was a member of the Portland Trail Blazers during the 2002-03 season. Lin joined former Harvard standouts **Saul Mariaschin** (Boston Celtics) and **Edward Smith** (New York Knicks) as Crimson players who have seen time in the NBA. He is the first Asian-American player to play in the league since **Rex Walters** was a member of the Miami Heat in 2000. Lin signed a multi-year, free agent contract with the Golden State Warriors on July 21, 2010, after playing for the Dallas Mavericks in the 2010 Vegas Summer League. During his rookie season, Lin spent some time with the Warriors' D-League affiliate, the Reno Bighorns. He competed in the NBA D-League Showcase and was named to the All-NBA D-League Showcase First Team on Jan. 14. He helped lead the Bighorns to a 2-0 record at the Showcase with averages of 21.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 3.5 steals. Lin was recalled by the Warriors in early February.

DEAN OF THE IVY HARDWOODS

Yale head coach **James Jones** holds the title of dean of the Ivy League coaches, as the 2010-11 season was his 12th season at the helm of the Bulldogs. Jones ended the regular season needing just two more wins to move into the top 10 all-time in overall wins and one more win to elevate into the top five all-time in Ivy wins in League history.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Harvard followed up an impressive 2009-10 season and tied its program record with 11 regular-season non-conference wins during the 2010-11 season. Last season, Cornell set the Ivy League mark for the most overall wins (29), total non-conference wins (16) and regular-season non-conference wins (14) in a season. Cornell's 14 regular-season non-conference wins passed the previous mark of 13 set by Penn's 2001-02 squad. The Big Red's 29 wins trumped the 28 wins by the 1970-71 Penn team. That 1970-71 Quaker squad was undefeated in the regular season with wins against the likes of Rutgers, Ohio State, Syracuse and Villanova along the way. The Quakers ended the season ranked third in the Associated Press Poll and was 28-0 entering the NCAA East Regional Final before losing to Villanova, a team it had beaten by eight points during the regular season. Included in the Quakers' 14 non-conference wins that season were NCAA Tournament wins over Duquesne and South Carolina.

Counting Ivy playoff games as non-League postseason contests, Penn's 2001-02 team that finished 25-7 also won 14 overall non-conference games, making Cornell's mark of 14 the most regular-season non-conference win total in Ivy League men's basketball history. Not far behind the 2009-10 Cornell team and Penn's 1970-71 and 2001-02 teams is another one of the all-time great Ivy teams in Princeton's 1997-98 squad. The Tigers finished their season 27-2, with 13 non-League wins (12 in the regular season) and just one narrow, single-digit regular season loss to No. 2 North Carolina. Princeton ended the season ranked eighth in the AP Poll with wins against Texas, North Carolina State, Rutgers, Wake Forest and UNLV, before falling in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to Michigan State.

LINEUP SHUFFLE

Cornell was among the nation's Division I leaders in multiple starting lineups used during the 2010-11 season. The Big Red used nine different starting fives, which tied for 15th-most among all Division I teams this season.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

With a home loss to Columbia on Jan. 22, Cornell's streak of consecutive conference wins ended at 22 games. The Big Red's streak had ranked among the nation's top 10 entering the 2010-11 season, tying for fourth nationally with Gonzaga of the West Coast Conference and Oakland of the Summit League.

COUSY WATCH LIST

Cornell junior guard **Chris Wroblewski** and Penn junior guard **Zack Rosen** were listed among the initial 66 candidates for the 2011 Bob Cousy Award announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic **Bob Cousy**, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. The original list of 66 was narrowed down to a final 20 on Jan. 12 and was paired down to a final 10 by Feb. 3, and a final five by March 3. The winner of the 2011 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday, April 4 in Houston as part of the NCAA Final Four weekend.

THREE TIMES A CHAMPION

Winning its third-straight Ivy crown in 2009-10, Cornell became the first non-Penn or Princeton team to win the Ivy title in three consecutive seasons. It marked the ninth time the feat occurred as both Penn and Princeton have accomplished it four times each previously. The last two Ivy champions have accounted for the League's last six years of champions as Penn won three-straight titles (2005-07) just prior to the Big Red's championship three-peat.
